## SLOP THE STORY IN BELMONT 145

A full field of seemingly well-matched sophomores lines up for today's 145th GI Belmont S., in which track condition and pace could prove deciding factors. Stuart

Janney III and Phipps Stable's GI Kentucky Derby hero **Orb** (Malibu Moon) figures to enjoy similar circumstances to what he did at Churchill Downs, with Tropical Storm Andrea turning "Big Sandy" into "Big Soupy" Friday. The Shug McGaughey trainee was far off an extremely fast pace set by **Palace Malice** (Curlin) in the May 4 "Run for the Roses," and came thundering down the center of a sloppy Churchill Downs track en route to a 2 1/2-length victory over

**Golden Soul** (Perfect Soul {Ire}). **Revolutionary** (War Pass) was third, and the 9-2 morning-line second choice returns to settle the score for the always-dangerous Todd Pletcher/WinStar Farm axis.

Things didn't go nearly as well for Orb two weeks later in the GI Preakness S., however, when the 7-10 chalk could only muster a fourth-place finish behind front-running **Oxbow** (Awesome Again) in Baltimore. The story of that Calumet Farm representative's Triple Crown experience up until this point has been somewhat of a polar opposite to Orb's. Oxbow was part of that supersonic pace in the Derby, but finished best of the runners who were up close to check in sixth. Those who kept the faith in Oxbow and his Hall of Fame trainer/jockey combo of D. Wayne Lukas and Gary Stevens were rewarded to the tune of \$32.80 when the well-bred "grey bay" got somewhat loose and proved not for catching in Baltimore.

Lukas, who's fourth and most recent Belmont win came in 2000 with Commendable (Gone West), also saddles Willis D. Horton's **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song). The longshot was completely stopped when making his run alongside Orb in the Derby, but simply failed to fire when seventh in the Preakness. "The Coach" warned after Wednesday's post position draw that the longer shot of his chances can't be ruled out.

"The thing about Will Take Charge is that he's 17 hands high," the 77-year-old noted. "He's not a start-and-stop type--he's not real nifty. But when he gets a full head of steam and gets rolling--and in this particular race with this configuration of the racetrack and the distance--I think that he's probably a factor."

## 'POINT' LOOKS TOUGH IN MANHATTAN

One race before Shug McGaughey saddles Orb (Malibu Moon), the Hall of Famer will send out Phipps Stable and Stronach Stable's heavily favored **Point of Entry** (Dynaformer) in the GI Woodford Reserve Manhattan H. The homebred strung together four graded stakes victories last season, including three Grade 1s in New York. He took the Man o' War S. easily here last July, and cruised by a similar margin in Saratoga's Sword Dancer Invitational in August. The bay caught yielding going--which appears almost a certainty today--in the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational Sept. 29, and defeated a field that included solid European invader Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and Little Mike (Spanish Steps), who stole the GI Breeders' Cup Turf by a half-length from Point of Entry. The Manhattan chalk bested Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) on seasonal debut in the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. Feb. 9, and was further flattered when that foe aired in the G1 Dubai World Cup. **Cont. p8**

While Orb's connections might be rooting for a fast pace and sloppy conditions, those connected to another son of Malibu Moon, **Freedom Child**, will be looking for the latter, but certainly not the former. The West Point Thoroughbreds, St. Elias Stable and Spendthrift Farm representative did split Orb and Revolutionary in what proved the ultimate key maiden race at the Big A in November, but didn't fully break out until splashing home by 13 1/4 lengths in this venue's GII Peter Pan S. May 11. Unable to make the Derby after a disastrous start led to a last-place run in the Apr. 6 GI Wood Memorial S., the chestnut has been all the rage among those who have seen him in the flesh this week and could be peaking at the right time. The speedster, who worked five furlongs in :59.87 (5/28) here Sunday, does need to

avoid a duel with the likes of Oxbow, Palace Malice and longshot **Frac Daddy** (Scat Daddy), who is drawn one spot inside of Freedom Child on the rail and whose connections have already revealed their intent to go to the lead.

"I don't know that he's a horse who wants to be behind horses--he's got a free-running style," trainer Tom Albertrani said of Freedom Child. "I think he'll probably want to find himself clear into the first turn, whether or not he has to use himself early like he did in the Peter Pan when he broke a little slow. It just depends on how we leave, I suppose. He'll just have to work his way on the inside and see where we end up.

In addition to Revolutionary and Palace Malice, Todd Pletcher sends out the uncoupled Mike Repole-owned trio of **Unlimited Budget** (Street Sense), **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union) and **Midnight Taboo** (Langfuhr). Pletcher and Repole ran second here two years ago with Stay Thirsty (Bernardini).

Pletcher won the 2007 Belmont with filly Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy)--whose blue-and-orange Tabor and Smith colors were similar to those of Repole--and

After a 9 1/2-length debut score in Ozone Park Nov. 9, Unlimited Budget reeled off stakes successes in the Nov. 24 GII Demoiselle, Feb. 23 GIII Rachel Alexandra S. and Mar. 30 GII Fair Grounds Oaks. Up close to a hot pace in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 3, the bay was an even third behind longshot stablemate Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior).

Overanalyze may be the strongest of the Repole trio, having beaten early moving Derby fourth Normandy Invasion (Tapit) in last November's GII Remsen S. and soundly defeating Frac Daddy in the GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 13. He had a trip of his own in the Derby, getting shuffled back to last and encountering more trouble in

the lane before settling for 11th. Midnight Taboo is a decided outsider, coming off a runner-up finish in a muddy 1 1/16-mile optional claimer here May 8.

"Growing up a kid from Queens, I've been watching this race since Woody Stephens won five in a row when I was 13-year-old," Repole said. "It's been 30 years of following this race. It's the biggest race in New York. I love New York, I love racing at Belmont, Aqueduct and Saratoga and it's New York's biggest race, and I'm never going to make a secret how bad I want to win this race."

**Classic Performers...**

**Revolutionary** (War Pass) added his name to a rapidly growing list of WinStar Farm colorbearers that have achieved success in the Triple Crown with a solid third-place finish in this year's GI Kentucky Derby ([video](#)).

Kenny Troutt's operation registered a remarkable feat in 2010, winning two-thirds of the series with two different horses.

Drosselmeyer (Distorted Humor) pulled off a 13-1 upset in that year's GI Belmont S. following Super Saver (Maria's Mon)'s authoritative score on the first Saturday in May.

Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat) also carried WinStar's white silks to a pair of runner-up finishes in the 2006 Derby and Belmont, respectively.

"It's big for Kenny and the farm," WinStar President Elliott Walden said of the outfit's consistent participation and success in the Classics. "We love competing at the top level, and it's always nice to have a horse in it, especially when you feel like you're *really* live. It never gets old. I think it would be the same for Coach Pitino winning the NCAA Tournament this year. Just because he's done it before, doesn't mean that he doesn't want to do it again just as bad."

Walden added, "It's also something the whole farm can get behind, too. That's another part of it that makes it a real bonus for us."

After skipping the GI Preakness S., Revolutionary heads to the Belmont as a fresh horse. The dramatic winner of the GIII Withers S. and GII Louisiana Derby has worked twice since the Derby, completing a pair of easy four-furlong moves at Belmont in :48.55 May 27 and in :48.51 June 2.

"Todd [Pletcher] doesn't get too excited about workouts, but I sensed his enthusiasm following his work at Belmont [May 27]," Walden revealed. "He's done great since the Derby; he's a very athletic and agile horse."

Drawn towards the outside in post nine, Revolutionary was given a 9-2 chance on today's morning-line in the Belmont. He's hit the board in all seven of his previous career starts, including a third-place finish as the heavy chalk behind **Orb** (Malibu Moon) and **Freedom Child** (Malibu Moon) in a salty Aqueduct maiden going a one-turn mile in late November ([video](#)).

"Once you don't win the Derby, it makes it a little easier to bypass the Preakness," Walden explained. "In today's times, trainers like to have a little bit more time between races. Based upon his schedule all spring, he's had five to seven weeks between races, and I feel like the timing is good for him here."

Sent off as the 6-1 second choice in the Derby, Revolutionary was squeezed a bit at the start from his inside post and was quickly guided to the rail by Calvin Borel. He began to

advance on the far turn, was steered off the fence in the stretch, and headed out Normandy Invasion (Tapit) to complete the trifecta, 3 1/2 lengths adrift Orb.

"I thought it was a good effort, without being outstanding," Walden admitted. "He got crossed a little bit at the break, then he settled into a nice spot on the rail. He saved quite a bit of ground, which is good, and it looked like he was OK with the slop. The only thing I would've changed would have been to creep up a bit down the backside and try and make up a little ground there. He had a lot to do turning for home, and typically, the Derby is won by a horse that's first or second at the eighth pole." **Cont. p6**

As Revolutionary proved five weeks ago in Louisville, today's distance of 1 1/2-miles shouldn't be a problem. Produced by GI Alabama S. heroine Runup the Colors (A.P. Indy)--a half-sister to Broodmare of the Year Prospectors Delite (Mr. Prospector)--he hails from the first crop of the ill-fated 2007 champion two-year-old War Pass (Cherokee Run).

Bred in Kentucky by William S. Farish, Revolutionary went through the ring twice. He brought \$80,000 from Valera Stable as a Keeneland September yearling, then changed hands for \$235,000 through the Niall Brennan OBS March consignment after breezing in [:10 2/5](#).

"He was a nice-looking horse," Walden said of Revolutionary's appeal as a juvenile. "I had seen him at Niall Brennan's and had liked him there at the farm. He breezed good without breezing spectacularly, and I liked the bottom side of his family. I thought War Pass had a chance as a stallion, so we took a shot on him."

It took Revolutionary four chances to exit the maiden ranks, but he's certainly done little wrong against graded company since running away with an 8 1/2-length tally over the Big A inner strip Dec. 28.

"I thought we had a big chance in the Derby and he ran well," Walden concluded. "If you're on the board in the Derby, it's hard to be disappointed. At the same time, when your expectations are high, it means that you put more pressure on yourself."

With another live contender in a Triple Crown race, it looks like the pressure will be on once again at 6:36 p.m. today.

**Brooklyn cont.**

On a very rainy day, it would have been fitting to say that Calidoscopio came "from out of the clouds" in the Brooklyn, but that wouldn't have done his late run justice. A veteran group performer in his native Argentina, the bay ventured to Santa Anita under the care of trainer Guillermo Frenkel and promptly blew up the tote to the tune of \$36.40 in the Nov. 2 GII Breeders' Cup Marathon. Subsequently transferred to Mike Puype for a North American campaign, Calidoscopio did little running when fifth in the GIII Tokyo City H. going this distance back in Arcadia Mar. 23. He hadn't run since, and was noticeably dead on the board for this try, going off at 7-1 compared to a 5-2 morning-line quote.

Unhurried from the gate by pilot Aaron Gryder, Calidoscopio loped along at the back of the pack as if he was out for a morning jog, dropping more than 20 lengths off of the pace set by Percussion. He finally started to come alive midway on the home bend, and ran by his foes like they were standing still down the center of the track en route to a comfortable--and improbably--hand-ride success.

"Even though he was still way back, you could see he was in rhythm," said Puype. "In the Breeders' Cup, he did the same thing. He wasn't even in the race and before you know it, he started gobbling up ground. He absolutely just exploded when it was time to do his thing. I think it was the combination of horses coming back and him moving forward. I couldn't be happier."

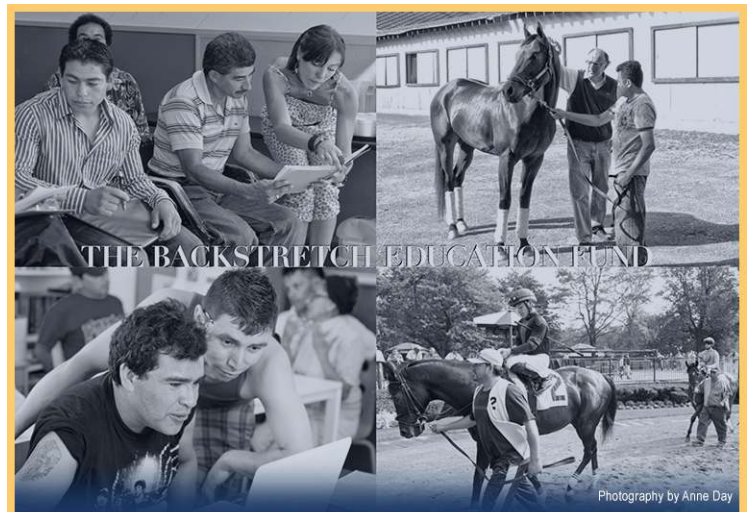

It was going to be a Tom Albertrani exacta either way at the end of this rained-off event, but the order was reversed after deliberation by the stewards in what appeared to be the easiest of takedown calls. Big Screen was quickest from the blocks, and assumed early command while the more-fancied Souper Speedy bided his time off the pace in the three path. Big Screen came to the top of the lane with two lengths or so of cushion after a half in :45.12, but Souper Speedy was inching closer as the only real danger. The latter took a few strides to level out, and was moving better of the two at midstretch, but Big Screen was drifting out markedly despite pilot Irad Ortiz's right-handers. The pair appeared to brush in the shadow of the wire, with Big Screen finishing a neck to the good, a result that surely would have gone the other way if not for the interference.

"Both horses were actually in a good spot if the races came off the turf," said Albertani. "For me, I couldn't separate either one of them before the race. I knew both of them were going to be very, very tough together. I was actually hoping for a dead heat in the final strides. Unfortunately, [Big Screen] got taken down. I had one happy owner for a couple of minutes, and then vice versa. They both ran well."

A 31-1 debut winner in the mud here in October of 2011, Souper Speedy was second in the GII Remsen S. the following month, but hadn't returned to his best in three subsequent efforts. The Live Oak homebred put it all together last time, however, romping by 10 1/2 lengths in a track-and-trip optional claimer, earning 104 Beyer Speed Figure. Reload, whose connections opted for this spot rather than the six-furlong GII True North H. tomorrow, showed early speed, but came up empty.

**NEWS TODAY**

**TRAINER GERARD BUTLER CHARGED BY BHA**

Newmarket trainer Gerard Butler has been charged on seven counts by the British Horseracing Authority over use of the drug "Sungate" after nine horses under his care tested positive for the banned anabolic steroid stanozolol. Butler has admitted using the drug to treat joint injuries, but claims to have received assurances about Sungate from a veterinary practice. The drug is legal in Britain when imported under licence, but its active ingredient is prohibited in horse racing. Butler has been charged with acting in a manner prejudicial to the integrity, proper conduct and/or good reputation of horse racing by administering the steroid. Further charges relate to injecting horses' joints himself, contrary to the rules of racing, and charges of failing to keep a proper record of medical treatments. The date of Butler's BHA disciplinary hearing has yet to be announced.

Point of Entry scratched late out of a potential showdown with Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in Churchill's GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic on Derby after that course came up soggy, and he was not originally expected to run here. Despite the slight change of plans, McGaughey couldn't be more pleased with how his charge is doing and he will run despite the wet conditions. "I'll tell you one thing, there isn't a horse on the grounds training any better than him," McGaughey said. "He's fresh. You can ask [exercise rider] Jenn [Patterson]. I was laughing at her this morning because she had all she could handle. He's about as good as a horse can get." Tom Albertrani and West Point will also get to warm up their cheering voices before the big one as **Twilight Meteor** looks to string together victories. Purchased privately off a pair of victories at Indiana last summer, the bay took some time to pan out, but put it all together when upsetting Calder's GII W. L. McKnight H. at 11-1 Nov. 24. He was fourth in Gulfstream's GII Mac Diarmida S. Feb. 16, but bounced back to annex the GII Pan American S. by four lengths in Hallandale Mar. 23. Mission Approved (With Approval) stole this race at 21-1 over yielding sod two years ago, and **Plainview** will attempt a similar heist here. The reformed claimer made his 5-year-old bow going 1 1/16 miles here May 3, and set quick fractions en route to a commanding score while earning a career-best 98 Beyer Speed Figure. This will be the first time he goes beyond 8 1/2 furlongs since breaking his maiden over nine furlongs of yielding ground at Churchill back in 2010.

Since the Breeders' Cup, Mizdirection boasts a trio of triumphs in Arcadia--in the 6 1/2-furlong GII Monrovia S. Jan. 6, one-mile GII Buena Vista S. Feb. 18, and the Apr. 13 6 1/2-furlong GII Las Cienegas S. This is just the second time the 5-year-old has ventured out of the state of California--she finished a close fourth (promoted to third) in Keeneland's GII Raven Run S. over seven furlongs of Polytrack in 2011. "It's a one-turn mile, and it's a resume race," said Puype of the decision to ship. "It's big money, it's a Grade I, and it has a tough field. It would be a great race to win to increase her value. For us, it's an all-you-can-gain, nothing-you-can-lose race." G. Watts Humphrey Jr.'s **Centre Court** (Smart Strike) has finished no worse than second since switching to the turf in her second career start, and enters off three straight victories. The homebred was part of a 2012 sophomore turf filly class--along with several others here--that took turns beating each other, but she has been too tough to handle since finishing second to **Dayatthespa** (City Zip) in Keeneland's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Oct. 13. The Rusty Arnold trainee got a Grade I of her own last time in the GI Jenny Wiley S. in Lexington Apr. 13. She has never tried less-than-firm turf, but Arnold said, "I don't know how she'll handle it because she's never run on it before, but she'll run. She'll need to run a very good race. Whoever wins the race will have to run a good race. Anybody can win it." Dayatthespa will reportedly scratch if turf conditions are not to trainer Chad Brown's liking. Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) beat Centre Court in last August's GII Lake Placid S., but was sixth with some trouble in the QE II. She resurfaced to spoil **Hungry Island** (More Than Ready)'s title defense in the GII Churchill Downs Distaff Turf Mile on Derby day. Godolphin colorbearer **Better Lucky** (Ghostzapper) was third in last year's QE II before pulling off a 35-1 upset in the Matriarch. She was an even fourth in the Jenny Wiley. Completing the field is Marty Schwartz's **Laugh Out Loud (GB)** (Clodovil {Ire}), a Group 2 winner and Group 1 placed last year. She was 11th last time, off the private purchase and trainer switch from Mick Channon, in Saint-Cloud's G2 Prix du Muguet May 1.

**ZAYAT DUO HARD TO LOOK PAST**

The Zayat Stables coupled entry of **Justin Phillip** (First Samurai) and **Fast Bullet** (Speightstown) provide a powerful one-two punch in Saturday's GII True North H. at Belmont Park. The former, a painful second behind **Caixa Eletronica** (Arromanches) at 13-1 in this race last year, got his act together in his last two at Oaklawn Park, most recently capturing the GIII Count Fleet Sprint H. Apr. 13. **"TDN Rising Star"** **Fast Bullet**, a respectable sixth following a lengthy layoff in last term's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Santa Anita Nov. 3, was last seen running away with a \$62,500 optional tagger at Betfair Hollywood Dec. 6, good for a 109 Beyer. Michael Dubb and Gary Aisquith's **Sage Valley** (Discreet Cat), claimed for \$50,000 off Doug Arnold and trainer Eddie Kenneally out of a third-place finish at the Big A last February, enters with the hot hand. A 6 3/4-length victor of Aqueduct's Mr. Nasty S. at the Big A Nov. 9, Sage Valley showed no signs of rust with a sharp tally in the GIII Maryland Sprint H. on the GI Preakness S. undercard. "We were expecting him to run good, but when you're coming into a graded race and coming off [a long] layoff, you don't know," trainer Rudy Rodriguez said. "We wanted to get him going, because you don't know how long they're going to last. He looks like he's ready to run. He hasn't missed anything. He's here, and he's good, so we'll go. He's a good horse, and the good horses want to run."

Claire Stephenson's Apr. 14 G3 Prix de Fontainebleau winner **Gengis (Fr)** (King's Best) was a head behind Anodin in eighth in the Poulains, while Jean-Claude Rouget saddles a duo headed by Antonio Caro's May 8 Listed Prix du Pont-Neuf scorer **Guajaraz (Fr)** (Rashbag {GB}) and Ecurie I M Fares' **Wire To Wire (Fr)** (Observatory). He drops in trip after fading out of contention late to be third in the G2 Prix Greffulhe over 1 5/16 miles at Saint-Cloud May 4, while two others who make up a fascinating cast are Baron Van Gysel's May 20 Listed Prix de Pontarme runner-up **San Marino Grey (Fr)** (Clodovil {Ire}) and Ecurie la Boetie's unbeaten **Saint Thomas (Fr)** (Dansili {GB}). The latter had the subsequent G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen winner Peace At Last (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) back in fourth in a mile contest at Saint-Cloud last time May 4 and Pascal Bary holds him in high regard.

The evening featured a live auction of unique experiences and 2014 stallion seasons. The emotional highlight of the evening was the presentation to Flay of the third annual Earle I. Mack Thoroughbred Champion Award,

Flay's acceptance speech was an impassioned call for owners to take care of horses for the entire course of their lives.

## GRAND OLD TIME

People filing into New York City's Grand Central Terminal through the 42nd Street entrance on Friday were greeted by a bugle call as part of the New York Racing Association's inaugural Belmont Stakes Fan Festival. The east side of the terminal's Vanderbilt Hall included a miniature racetrack as part of four interactive event zones, and the attention of both commuters and tourists was caught by the familiar notes of "Call to the Post."

The races went off at a fairly steady clip as soon as three entries made their way into the starting gate.

Dillon, a Sponsorship Sales Assistant at NYRA, commented between races. "Belmont is in Manhattan's backyard, but a lot of people don't realize how easy it is to get there, and that it's an affordable thing to do on a Saturday afternoon. We wanted to bring the excitement of the day to a very public and iconic place, so Grand Central fit in really well with our goals. We wanted to be right in front of everybody and interact with customers.

"We're trying to approach a younger audience," Dillon added. "We're taking on new social media initiatives and emphasizing technology--in a sense, we are trying to bring a very old sport into the 21st century. That's what we're trying to accomplish."

The rain that fell steadily throughout the day may have been a boon, according to Dillon.

"I think the rain actually helped because people are eager to get in here and not that eager to get out," he said with a laugh.

The racetrack, complete with an infield that featured the replay of last year's stirring Belmont finish between Union Rags and Paynter, was far and away the most popular of the zones. But those feeling less than limber had other options.

Earlier in the day, contestants competed aboard stuffed horses, but their enthusiasm caused some of the "mounts" to give way, and hobby horses were brought in to substitute. With racecaller Larry Lederman at the microphone, the participants romped around the circuit, much to the delight of onlookers. A pair of friends from England bumped on the far turn, but recovered to finish one-two. There was no claim of foul.

"We were hoping to bring Belmont Park to Manhattan," James

There was also the "Stakes Stampede," which allowed fans to propel a horse on the screen to the finish by running in place on a special mat, as well as the option to take a photo with the background being the Belmont Park winner's circle photo. The photographs could be immediately uploaded to Facebook or Twitter, or simply e-mailed to the fans. In addition to the interactive events, there was also a booth for NYRA Rewards wagering.

"Of course, we have the main attraction here in the track," Dillon said with a smile. "Everyone gets to win a prize."

Racetracks around the country have attempted to bring in new faces with new promotions such as food festivals and fashion contests. Dillon believes this event can also attract new racegoers.

"I think there's a stigma about horse racing that many people think of a guy chomping down on his cigar--the OTB-type crowd--and we're trying to show people that horse racing, and especially the Belmont Stakes, is fun and a great way to spend the day," he summed up. "Belmont is a park, it's 480 acres. It's a great place to picnic with friends and family."

### ASCOT DATE LIKELIER FOR FAIRY

Trainer Ed Dunlop is looking more positively at Royal Ascot as the stage for the return of **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) following the 6-year-old's racecourse spin at Sandown Thursday evening. Cristina Patino's six-time Group 1 winner has been off the track through injury since her success in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown in September and continues to work towards the June 19 G1 Prince of Wales's S. "She worked over a mile with her usual lead horse and everything went according to plan," her conditioner told *PA Sport*. "I would like to [go to Ascot], but we want to be very happy with her, and she will tell us whether she's ready. We haven't made a decision yet. We want to wait another week and it will be a late call. She has the option of a Group 1 against fillies and mares, the Pretty Polly S. at the Curragh, which is 11 days after the Ascot race, so that is in the back of our minds."

### ST NIC BYPASSES ROYAL MEETING

Aidan O'Brien has ruled out a trip to Royal Ascot with Saturday's G1 Coronation Cup hero **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who will instead head straight to the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at the track July 27. Originally pencilled in for the G2 Hardwicke S. at the Royal meeting following his historic third consecutive win in the Epsom contest on Derby day, his trainer ruled out that race yesterday in a statement on Coolmore's website. "St Nicholas Abbey has come out of the race at Epsom really well and we're looking forward to his next run," he said, before confirming that the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner **Magician (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) would be aimed at the June 18 G1 St James's Palace S. at the meeting.

## POST FIRES RACING WRITERS

The *New York Post* yesterday terminated its three horse racing reporters--Ed Fountaine, John DaSilva and Anthony Affrunti--one day before the GI Belmont S. The daily publication will reportedly no longer cover the sport in house and will not have any coverage of the Belmont in Saturday's paper. The cuts are part of a larger movement by the *Post's* parent company, Rupert Murdoch's News Corp., to separate Murdoch's newspaper holdings from other entertainment interests, such as the Fox Network. The *Post's* main competitor, the *New York Daily News*, scaled back its own horse racing coverage earlier this year.
