Tonight's GI Stephen Foster H.--which is scheduled for 9:39 p.m. under the Churchill Downs lights and offers a GI Breeders' Cup Classic "Win & You're In" berth--only drew six runners, but it attracted the right six. Among the star-studded field is Wachtel, Brous and Hammer's **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate), who came with a relentless rally up the fence to just edge eventual Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) here a year ago. DEEP FIELD FOR DIANE

Tomorrow's G1 Prix de Diane Longines at Chantilly is an all-French affair, with none of the chief domestic middle-distance fillies missing from a talented cast. Despite featuring only 11, the race's draw is still an important factor and has gone against Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Thani's **Flotilla (Fr)** (Mizzen Mast), as the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner will start from an outside post in nine. Favored by a low berth in that May 12 Longchamp Classic, the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf scorer fares worse than Guineas runner-up **Esoterique (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}), who is one of a trio from the Andre Fabre stable and would be a first for her owner-breeder Baron Edouard de Rothschild if she can turn her draw in four to her advantage on softer ground than she encountered last time. Previously, she beat the Wertheimers' **Silasol (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) and Safsaf Canarias' **Pearlsid (Fr)** (Alhaarth {Ire}) in the G3 Prix Vanteaux over an extended nine-furlong trip at Longchamp Apr. 28 and remains unexposed. Fabre's other pair, **Baltic Baroness (Ger)** (Shamardal) and **Tasaday (Nayef)**, have been drawn on the inside and outside, respectively, with the latter bidding to close a considerable gap to Flotilla and Esoterique after trailing that pair by four lengths and a neck in the Pouliches. **Cont. p5**

While Fort Larned was eighth in last year's Foster, Mott acknowledged that two subsequent defeats at the hand of that runner make him the one Ron the Greek must beat. "I guess after we beat him in the Foster, I thought we were at least as good as he was," said Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott. "But he wound up beating us in both the Whitney and the Breeders' Cup. So our hats are off to him and we've got to try to turn the tables."

Ron the Greek and the other Foster competitors may not be meeting the same Fort Larned that was so tough last year, however. The Janis Whitham homebred's 5-year-old season has gotten off to an extremely rocky start. He dropped pilot Brian Hernandez, Jr. and ran off at the start of the Apr. 13 GII Gulfstream Park H., and was a no-excuse fifth in the GII Oaklawn H. Apr. 13.

Fort Larned's local worktab since his last appearance hints that the bay could be back to his best. Trainer Ian Wilkes was up front about what he expects from his stable star. "Fort Larned has to step up to the plate and become the big dog again," Wilkes offered. "That's what he's got to do."

Mort Fink's 2-1 morning-line favorite **Successful Dan** (Successful Appeal) figures to be out for redemption on several levels. He is the lone runner in this field without an official Grade I victory, having been taken down in the GI Clark H. here in 2010, and he's the older half-brother to last year's runner-up Wise Dan. The injury-plagued homebred traded decisions with Fort Larned last season. He took the GII Alysheba S. here in May before being upset by that runner in Prairie Meadows's GIII Cornhusker H. in June. Sidelined after that with a recurring suspensory injury, the Charlie LoPresti pupil set an easy pace and kept on going in Keeneland's GIII Ben Ali S. last time Apr. 21.

WinStar Farm and Chuck and Maribeth Sandford's **Take Charge Indy** (A.P. Indy) broke a five-race win drought from last March's GI Florida Derby when he thrashed a solid field in this year's Alysheba on the GI Kentucky Oaks undercard May 3. He earned a career-best 109 Beyer Speed Figure for that effort. "His win in the Alysheba was vindication for everyone involved, including the horse," conditioner Pat Byrne said. "It was almost a year to the day when he got hurt running in the [GI Kentucky] Derby and then he came back and ran like that. Numbers wise, his race in the Alysheba was off the charts."

Byrne continued, "I always knew he could be that kind of a horse. You can look back at what I said about him over the winter. I said, 'At the end of the day, this is probably the most talented horse I've ever trained,' and I've had my hands on a couple of good ones." Among the "good ones" Byrne has worked with was

1998 Foster winner and BC Classic winner **Awesome Again**. "I think when it's all said and done, [Take Charge Indy] might be a better horse than **Awesome Again**," Byrne remarked.

Rounding out the field are the last year's 33-1 GI Travers S. dead-heat winner **Golden Ticket** (Speightstown) and **Pool Play** (Silver Deputy), a 36-1 upsetter of this heat two years ago.

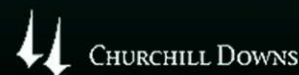

“After Dubai, I said to my son, ‘We’ve been at the top of the mountain,’” Bendoroff reminisced. “There’s no mountain bigger than this. You don’t expect it, and I think when you get it you realize how fortunate and blessed you really are.”

Next Tuesday, Bendoroff may find that there are even higher peaks to ascend upon when Animal Kingdom lines up as the heavy favorite in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. The 5-year-old--now owned by Team Valor International, Australia’s Arrowfield Stud and Darley--will become the first Kentucky Derby winner since Triple Crown champion Omaha in 1936 to race at the world’s oldest

and most prestigious race meeting. What’s more, he looks to become the first Dubai World Cup winner to win at Royal Ascot since Dubai Millennium took the G1 Prince of Wales’s S. in 2000, and the only horse in history to win the Kentucky Derby, Dubai World Cup and one of Royal Ascot’s prestigious contests.

Before Animal Kingdom was a world-beater and an international phenomenon, he was one of about 80 foals frolicking in the pastures of the 700-acre Denali Stud in 2008. This was the result of a long-standing association between Bendoroff and Barry Irwin, chief executive officer of Team Valor International, which bred Animal Kingdom and purchased his dam, Dalicia (Ger), at a German auction for €400,000 in 2005.

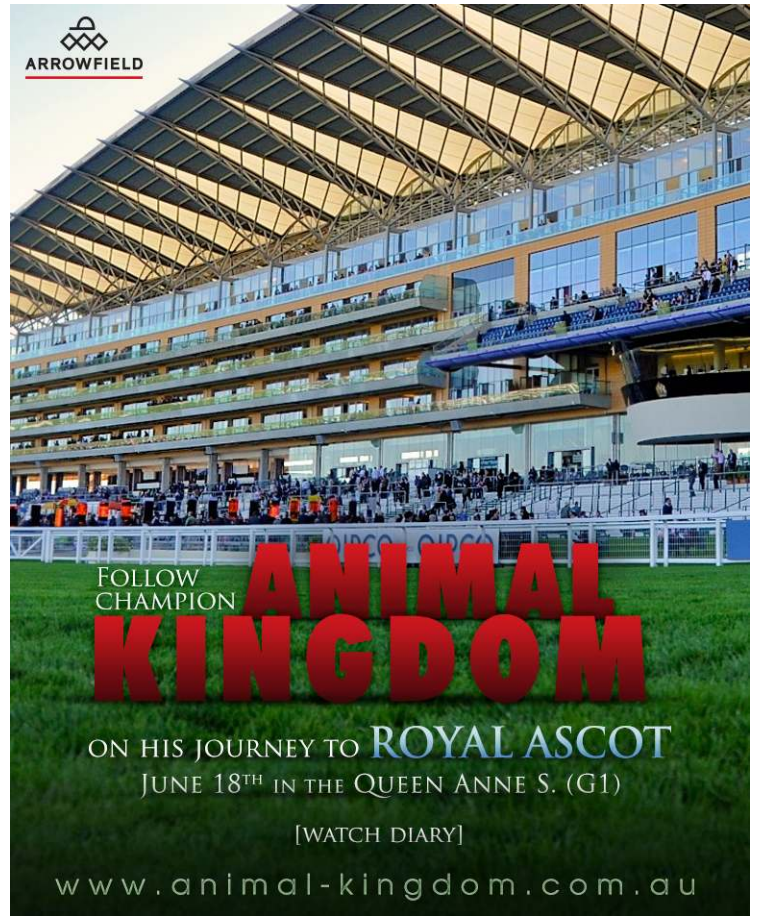

“We’ve both been in the business a long time, and have known each other through the years,” Bendoroff said. “For a couple of reasons we decided to form a strategic alliance and it’s kind of grown from that to today, where he keeps all his breeding stock in Kentucky here.”

Born Mar. 20, 2008, Animal Kingdom was the first foal from Dalicia, and was described by Bendoroff as “a problem-free, straight-forward horse.”

“He’s one of those horses you didn’t know was around because he didn’t need surgeries and he wasn’t getting hurt or needing extra veterinary care. He was just the kind you like.”



In addition to being problem-free, Bendoroff noted that Animal Kingdom always received good grades on conformation.

“He was one that always made a good impression,” he said. “After the Derby, I went back and got my notes--I keep notes on them from when they’re babies from my inspections--and it always said ‘Nice horse.’ If I underline it that’s an emphasis, and I’d written that a lot on his page, just ‘nice horse, nice horse, nice horse.’”

The following year, that nice horse went through the ring at Keeneland September as a means to dissolve the partnership that had bred him. He was purchased for \$100,000 by Team Valor, and Bendoroff decided to get involved with the partnership that was to race him.

“He was always good looking, which I think was reflected in his price,” Bendoroff explained. “\$100,000 for his pedigree in that particular cycle of the market, which wasn’t the best, is a very respectable price.” **Cont. p7**

Later that December, while Animal Kingdom was receiving his early racetrack education with Randy Bradshaw in Ocala, Dalicia was sold to Japan's Shadai Farm in foal to Mr. Greeley for 230,000gns at the Tattersalls December Mare Sale. She has yet to produce another winner, with two foals by that former Gainesway sire to her credit.

Fast forward nearly four years, and Animal Kingdom--now an earner of more than \$8.3 million--looks to complete an unprecedented triple, and retire to his dual-hemisphere breeding career as a Grade/Group 1 winner on dirt, turf and synthetic surfaces on three different continents. Could Bandoroff have ever guessed that the chestnut foal that flew under the radar around his paddocks would progress into one of the highest-rated horses in the world?

"You can't ever guess that from any of them--if I could I'd own 100% of him, because I'd have bought him for myself," Bandoroff quipped. "To think that they're ever going to develop into A, a Kentucky Derby winner, and B, something special, that's the kind of stuff you dream about."

While completing the feat would no doubt be a dream come true, Bandoroff--who attended the Dubai World Cup and will don top hat and tails for the Royal Meeting next week--is remaining realistic about the difficulty of the task ahead of Animal Kingdom.

"This is a very tough thing we're asking of this horse," he noted. "You can read all this stuff about him being the favorite and even money and think all he has to do is show up, but I think you have to remember the fact that it's a straightaway and he's never done it, and the undulating course is also foreign to him. I have full confidence in him, and if he pulls this off it really is going to be an unbelievable testament to his quality."

He continued, "There comes a point in time, at least for me, where what you really want is for the world or the public to acknowledge that that's a good horse. You want it for the horse as much as you want it for anything. Seeing what the world thinks of him is really gratifying beyond description."

When reflecting back on Animal Kingdom's career, which has also included an Eclipse Award as Champion 3-year-old and two lengthy layoffs and rehabilitation from injuries, Bandoroff was quick to credit Irwin and trainer Graham Motion.

"Barry's done an amazing job plotting this horse's career, and he showed guts keeping the horse in training," he said. "Graham has just taken all his talent and tuned him like a fine instrument. None of it would have happened without them."

So where does Denali, which has sold more than \$400 million worth of bloodstock and ranked among the nation's leading consignors every year since 2000, enter into the Animal Kingdom equation?

Scratched from the local GII Marjorie L. Everett H. May 18, More Chocolate will look to provide trainer John Sadler with his second score in this race following the exploits of Victory Encounter (Victory Speech) in 2004. While More Chocolate bypassed the Everett, that heat's one-two finishers, **Open Water** (Include) and **Lady of Fifty** (After Market) are back for this. That pair finished in reverse order here in last December's GII Bayakoa H. 'DELTA' LOOKS TOUGH IN REPEAT BID

Last year's GII Fleur de Lis H. marked a significant point in **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker)'s career. Having been beaten on seasonal debut and subsequently off the board in the G1 Dubai World Cup, there were questions as to whether the previous year's champion 3-year-old filly was the same horse since Ben Leon went all the way to \$8.5 million to secure her at KEENOV. But after an eight-length romp here, which earned the dark bay a career-best 110 Beyer Speed Figure, there was no doubt that Bill Mott had gotten her back on track. She would add Grade I wins in the Beldame Invitational S. Sept. 29 and Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic Nov. 2 en route to another Eclipse Award, but again finds herself in search of redemption. An easy five-length winner of Gulfstream's Feb. 17 GIII Sabin S., Royal Delta turned in another uncharacteristically dull showing back at Meydan Mar. 30, finishing a distant 10th. Displaying a sharp recent worktab at Belmont Park, the queen appears poised to take back her crown. "Royal Delta's timing is the same as it was last year and I think we've got a similar amount of work in her," said Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott. "She's doing well and it's just time to go back to the races with her. I think she's perhaps a little bigger and stronger than last year, appearance-wise. She's a year older and I think she's becoming a fully mature horse." Becky Winemiller's **Wine Princess** (Ghostzapper) appears the most likely upsetter, however unlikely such an outcome might be. The daughter of Hall of Famer Azeri (Jade Hunter) is three-for-three under the Twin Spires, having most recently taken a one-mile allowance here by seven lengths Apr. 27. "Royal Delta is a proven champion and a serious racehorse, but we've got quality too and we're undefeated on the dirt here," said trainer Steve Margolis, whose 2012 GIII Monmouth Oaks winner will receive 10 pounds from the favorite. "We're looking forward to the challenge and feel our horse deserves a shot."

ANYONE'S CROWN IN HILL PRINCE

An extremely evenly matched field of 12 sophomore turfers squares off in Belmont's GIII Hill Prince S. today. WinStar Farm and Twin Creeks Racing's **Red Rifle** (Giant's Causeway) figures to take plenty of support as he seeks his third victory in as many starts. The chestnut graduated by two lengths going seven panels on the main track at Gulfstream Mar. 9, and pressed a solid pace before drawing off to a similar margin of victory in an 8 1/2-furlong Polytrack allowance at Keeneland Apr. 13. The runner-up that day, Pyrite Mountain (Silent Name {Jpn}), returned to annex Woodbine's May 5 Wando S. before finishing fourth as the favorite in last Sunday's Plate Trial. Red Rifle, a Todd Pletcher trainee, is out of May Night (Gulch), SW and MGSP on grass. The GI Belmont S.-winning conditioner also has Repole Stable's **Notacatbutallama** (Harlan's Holiday), a stakes winner and runner-up in the GIII Pilgrim S. on the inner turf here last October. The bay was most recently third--one spot behind **Shining Copper** (Aragorn {Ire})--in Pimlico's James W. Murphy S. May 18. Team Valor International hands **Infinite Magic** (More Than Ready) over to new private trainer Rick Mettee, and the British import figures to appreciate the return to the sod. EDGEWOOD TOP THREE BACK FOR REGRET

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Kitten's Dumplings** (Kitten's Joy) will have to navigate an additional sixteenth of a mile as she returns to the site of her May 3 Edgewood S. victory in tonight's GIII Regret S. A stakes winner on the Retama turf last November, the homebred was second behind Tapicat (Tapit) in Tampa's GIII Florida Oaks Feb. 2. She could only muster a fifth-place run behind Emollient (Empire Maker) in the GI Ashland S. Apr. 6, but appreciated the return to grass when flying past her opponents--including runner-up **Praia** (Distorted Humor) and third-place finisher **Broken Spell** (Broken Vow)--for a 3 3/4-length victory in the Edgewood. There doesn't appear to be much reason for Praia or Broken Spell to be able to turn the tables on Kitten's Dumplings, but it will be the first trip beyond 8 1/2 furlongs for all three runners. Lothenbach Stables' **Eden Prairie** (Mizzen Mast) is an intriguing upset candidate. The dark bay upset Fair Grounds optional claiming foes at 19-1 Mar. 20, and nearly stole Keeneland's GIII Appalachian S. Apr. 18 before being tagged by out-of-the-clouds Unbelievable Dream (Kitalpha) and Overheard (Macho Uno) to settle for a close-up third. While the former didn't do much running in a paceless renewal of Belmont's GII Sand's Point S. May 27, Overheard finished third in Woodbine's GIII Selene S. two back before flying home to take that track's Alywow S. six days ago. With a bullet work for conditioner Neil Pessin in 1:00 flat over the Arlington Polytrack June 8 on display, Eden Prairie will likely be back on the engine this time. There are other speeds signed on, and one who could benefit from a pace collapse is the lightly raced **Intelyhente** (Smart Strike). The Eddie Kenneally trainee showed early interest before fading first out in November, but uncorked a powerful rally last time from well off the pace to don cap and gown over course and distance last time May 19.

THE QUEEN CHASES GOLD

The Queen's **Estimate (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) yesterday headed the 19 entries remaining in an open-looking renewal of the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot on Thursday, with all involved hoping that last year's G3 Queen's Vase heroine can follow up in the prestigious affair. Her success during the Diamond Jubilee celebrations in 2012 was the 21st in a 60-year period in the Royal silks, and the Sir Michael Stoute-trained 4-year-old returned to annex the venue's G3 Sagaro S. May 1. "Estimate is two out of two around Ascot and she was very impressive against the boys in the Sagaro S. there last month, but she needs to raise her game again to provide the result all of racing craves for," The Queen's Racing Manager John Warren said. "It would be terrific for The Queen if the dream could become reality, especially with Prince Philip having had such a difficult time," he added, referring to the Queen's recently hospitalized husband. Heading the opposition is the 2010 hero **Rite of Passage (GB)** (Giant's Causeway), who is one of two from the Dermot Weld stable alongside Friday's Listed Saval Beg S. scorer **Pale Mimosa (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}). While the former is not a certain starter if the ground continues to dry, Pale Mimosa also may not be asked to reappear so soon after her last race, but even in their absence there is set to be a considerable overseas presence. Andre Fabre has Khalid Abdullah's G3 Prix de Barbeville winner **Last Train (GB)** (Rail Link {GB}) and Francois Doumen the G2 Yorkshire Cup runner-up **Top Trip (GB)** (Dubai Destination) in the race for France, while Germany is set to be represented by the Andreas Wohler-trained duo **Altano (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Earl of Tinsdal (Ger)** (Black Sam Bellamy {Ire}). Godolphin will rely solely on last year's winner **Colour Vision (Fr)** (Rainbow Quest) after withdrawing both Cavalryman (GB) (Halling) and Willing Foe (Dynaformer), with Aidan O'Brien also scratching a potential leading contender in Imperial Monarch (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

LATE SCARE FOR MAGICIAN

Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's **Magician (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) has sustained "minor bruising" and a final decision as to his participation in Tuesday's G1 St James's Palace S. will be made on Sunday. While the injury is thought to be superficial at this stage, connections outlined provisional plans should the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner be forced to sidestep the mile contest. "Magician sustained minor bruising after receiving a knock yesterday," a statement

issued on www.coolmore.com read. "Aidan is very happy with Magician today and he is 100% sound. A final decision will be made on Sunday whether or not he will run in Tuesday's St James's Palace S. Should he not run, **Mars (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will take his place and in the event of that happening, **Indian Chief (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) will run in the G3 Tercentenary S." In other moves from the operation, plans for the Ballydoyle 2-year-olds were also outlined. "**Stubbs (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), **Sir John Hawkins** (Henrythenavigator) and **War Command** (War Front) are all probables for the [G2] Coventry and **Fountain of Youth (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) goes for the [Listed] Windsor Castle. **Bye Bye Birdie (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) runs in Mallow [Cork] on Sunday, after which a decision will be made on the [G2] Queen Mary. **Coach House (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) is a probable for the [G2] Norfolk S. and **Wonderfully (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is likely to represent us in the [G3] Albany. We plan to run both **Friendship (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Adeste Fideles** (Giant's Causeway) in the [Listed] Chesham S."

Jerry Brown, President, Thoro-Graph Inc:

Just a quick response to the letter of Elizabeth Blythe regarding the Belmont S. times. Raw times are useless in comparing races even on consecutive days, let alone 40 years apart. The reason that final times for the Belmont have gotten slower over the years has nothing to do with the horses, and everything to do with the surface. When Secretariat was running, the track cushion at Belmont varied between 2 3/4 and 3 1/4 inches. Now it varies between 4 1/4 and 4 3/4-- a difference of 1 1/2 inches, on average. Roughly speaking, a change of 1/2-inch in cushion depth causes at least a two-second differential in final time at 1 1/2 miles, all other things being equal.

But all other things are not equal. Back in the 70's, racetracks had a higher percentage of clay in them, which made them harder and "faster" when dry. Now they have more sand. That's why many tracks are faster when wet than dry--think about walking on the beach near the ocean, as compared to further away from the water. Today's horses race in a deep sandbox.

As with all athletes, Thoroughbreds have gotten better over the years. You can see it in improving Olympic records, you can see it in improving times for Standardbred horses (who run on a more uniform surface) over the last 30 years. You can't see it in raw times in our sport only because the tracks have changed. But you can see it if you use accurate performance figures.

The newly formed United States Anti-Doping Agency (USADA) held its first symposium in 2000 and asked questions that needed to be asked: What performance-enhancing drugs are human athletes using with impunity? What do they have that we can't catch? The answer at what has now become an annual get-together on anti-doping science was alarming. The list included EPO, Human Growth Hormone, blood transfusions and designer steroids.

That the drugs were illegal and dangerous didn't stop a lot of athletes. They cared more about how they could make them run faster, jump higher and power their bicycles and they had their hands on plenty of drugs that existing drug testing methods could not detect.

"What you had was this win-at-all-costs culture and an incredible amount of money being put into sport, particularly with those at the top who win the most," said USADA CEO Travis Tygart. "There were just so many forces out there supporting the win-at-all-costs way of doing things."

The sobering reality was that those who were willing to pump their bodies full of chemicals in order to help them win were beating the system. It was hard to get caught.

How much has that changed? The answer: some.

Marion Jones and Lance Armstrong were caught and exposed and no one is hitting 70 home runs a year any more in baseball. But the game of cops

and robbers goes on, with the cheaters looking for drugs that will both improve performance and slip through the cracks of detection and the regulators, sports officials and scientists trying to come up with new techniques to ensure our playing fields are level.

For the most part, the cheaters have always been a step or two ahead of the authorities, but

the gap may be about to close due to a new paradigm. It's no longer about finding a drug in a the blood or urine of an equine or human athlete but identifying changes in the body caused by the drug.

In the field of human athletics, scientists are more and more using biological passports to catch cheaters. The biological passport shows what an individual's biochemistry is like when it is unaltered by drugs. When the athlete takes a performance-enhancing drug, changes occur in the body, and the biological passport should show this. You no longer need to detect the presence of a drug in someone's system if you can prove that there was a change in the body and that the change only could have occurred with drugs.

Because so many drugs are undetectable or pass through

the system very quickly, the passports represent a significant step forward. They are already being used in cycling, where numerous cheats have been caught by the method, and in track and field. The International Tennis Federation is in the process of implementing its own biological passport program.

To use biological passports in racing, a sport with tens of thousands of competitors, may not be practical. But some in the equine field are going beyond the typical drug tests. In Pennsylvania, Dr. Lawrence Soma and Cornelius Uboh are at the forefront of a movement to detect drugs by finding changes in the horse's biological makeup.

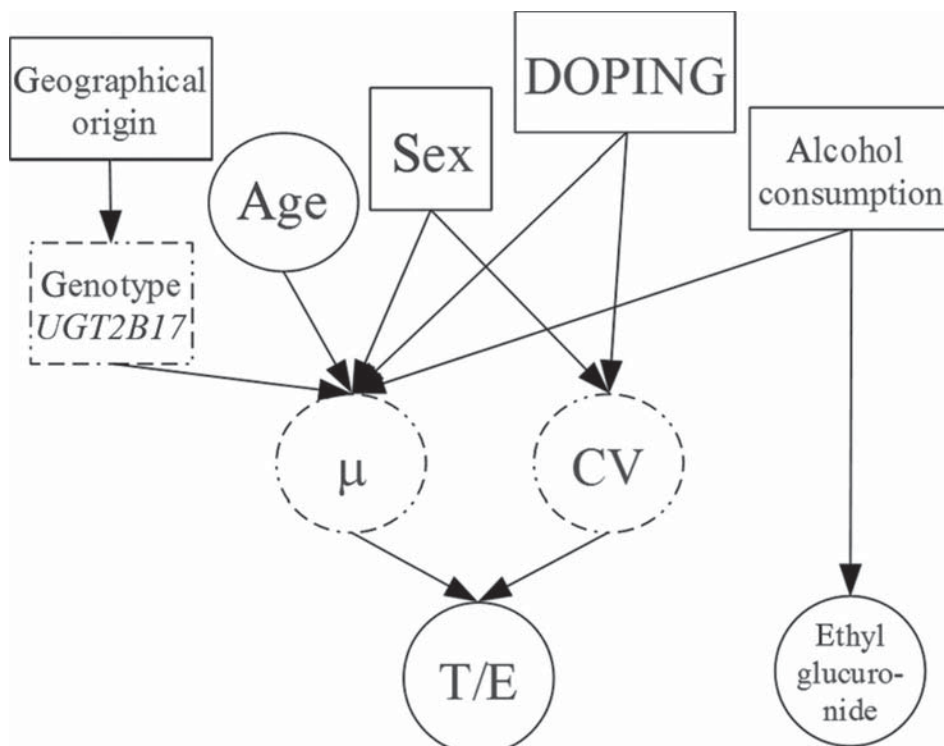
"We are looking at the effect of the drug and not necessarily the drug itself," said Soma, the racing commission's equine research director at the New Bolton Center of the University

of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine.

Soma works hand in hand with Dr. Uboh, the director of the Pennsylvania Equine Toxicology and Research Laboratory of West Chester, Pa., which is a joint venture combining the expertise of University of Pennsylvania personnel and those who work for the state racing commission.

Uboh and Soma set about to detect when trainers were using shockwave therapy, which has an analgesic effect on horses and is used to treat such problems as fractures and ligament issues. The method is illegal in Pennsylvania when given within seven days of a race and it can be dangerous if the pain-killing effect is still taking place when the horse is running. But since shockwave treatments do not involve drugs, obviously, drug testing is useless when it comes to detection.

"Shockwave therapy, that is not a drug and you couldn't go and look for it with traditional drug testing methods," Uboh said. "But you can find changes in the proteins. So that's the approach. There are different types of treatments that are given to horses that we may never be able to detect that create changes in the proteins, in the cytokines (proteins that are released by tissue cells in response to trauma, disease, etc.) so those

are the things we are looking for. Changes...are they going up or are they going down? Assume that this is the natural level for the horse, when you put something into the horse you affect that natural level. You either push it up or you push it down.”

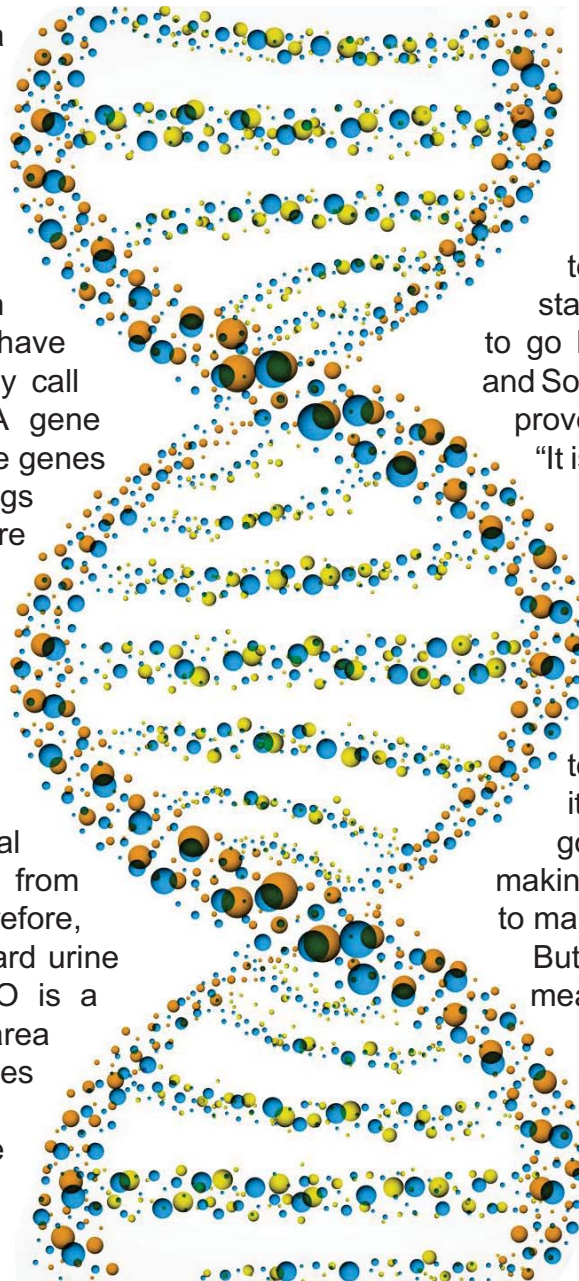
This new way of catching cheaters—not by finding the drugs but finding changes in the physiology of the horse created by the drugs—can be done in a number of ways, starting with methods involving DNA.

Uboh and Soma did not have the luxury of having biological passports for individual horses in Pennsylvania, but they would have the next best thing—what they call an “equine chip.” The DNA gene chip contains thousands of the genes for the horse in general. Drugs and shockwave therapy are two examples of things that can create changes in the DNA of the horse. Scientists also look for changes in proteins and cytokines.

There are certain drugs that could create a performance-enhancing effect for several days but quickly disappear from the animal’s system and, therefore, cannot be detected by standard urine and plasma drug tests. EPO is a prime example. This is the area where the new methodologies can be particularly effective.

be detected in blood or urine, but have already initiated the cascade of events to make them effective and able to influence performance,” Soma said. “For example, we can only detect EPO or Darbepoetin for three to five days depending on the dose. Trainers may administer EPO or Darbepoetin six to seven days prior to the race; under these circumstances

the drug cannot be detected but the effectiveness had already been initiated even though the drug is no longer detectable.”

Soma admits that the new techniques he, Uboh and their staffs are working on have a ways to go before they are commonplace and Soma admits that some areas may prove to be “fishing expeditions.”

“It is a brand new approach and if it doesn't work, then we certainly can be criticized, but as far as I am concerned that is what research is about,” Soma added. “If you don't have any imagination, if you don't say listen we are going to try this, it is an approach and it may take two or three years to go down this path, you risk never making the sort of advances we need to make.”

But they are hopeful that meaningful breakthroughs are not that far off.

“We are happy with the progress that we are making or that industry is planning to make,” Uboh said. “We're not too far away.”

It's not just Uboh and Soma

who are optimistic.

Tim Morris, the former Director of Equine Science and Welfare for the British Horseracing Authority, and a Nottingham University professor, said, “the use of biomarkers when they can be specifically linked to a particular substance offers great promise for more sensitive and useful detection of abuse of medications or doping of race horses. Biomarkers can be accommodated within the current testing and regulatory regime. However, approaches such as the equine version of the human athlete passport, which rely on less specific and complex changes to samples taken from horses over time, do present far greater technical challenges, and also probably require regulatory changes to allow such long-term testing and for their use in discriminatory cases.”

But Morris also said he sees the potential impracticalities as well, adding, “The use of biological passports in particular would be a challenge to all but the top-flight horse racing analytical labs around the world.”

No one should view this emerging field as a panacea. It is more a step in the right direction. Not only have dopers consistently found ways to beat any and all drug detection methods, but, as Morris points out, these could also be methods that have a hard time expanding beyond Pennsylvania.

The Pennsylvania Equine Toxicology and Research Laboratory has advantages other labs do not. Because it is

associated with the University of Pennsylvania, it has access to people like Soma and others who provide invaluable expertise. And in the Pennsylvania Racing Commission, Soma and Uboh have regulators who are behind what they are doing and are willing to spend more money on research than most state racing commissions.

“The racing commission in Pennsylvania is very generous and very supportive of research,” Uboh said. “I couldn’t say enough about the way Pennsylvania Racing Commission has stood behind research because they know that is what is going to provide information that the commission needs.”

Uboh and Soma say they can and will share their information and research with anyone who inquires, but most other labs do not have the type of

expensive machinery in place in Pennsylvania that is necessary to go beyond standard blood and urine drug testing.

“You have to have the instrumentation to do this,” Uboh said. “You have to have the personnel. So those are two key factors that is needed and many laboratories do not have them. Why not? The commission is not giving them sufficient money to do it.”

Those are problems for another day. For now, the focus is on perfecting the science and making it an important tool in the fight against doping in horse racing.

“This is an emerging field,” Soma said. “Will it be fruitful in the next couple of years? We certainly hope so.”

Would Racing Be Better Off With USADA in Charge?

Perhaps the problem of doping in horse racing is a bigger one than the sport can handle. That, anyway, is the contention of Senator Tom Udall and Representative Joe Pitts, who have introduced the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act. The act would give the United States Anti-Doping Agency control over drug testing in the sport and handing out punishments for those that it catches.

USADA is an independent agency created in 2000 to take over the anti-doping program for the U.S. Olympic Committee. It was formed at a time when it was believed that cheating was out of control in Olympic sports, particularly in track and field. The U.S. Congress has recognized USADA as "the official anti-doping agency for Olympic, Pan American and Paralympic sport in the United States."

Whether or not racing would be better off with USADA in charge or the status quo, a patchwork of state racing commissions and labs spread across the country, remains the subject of debate. But few will argue the success USADA has had cleaning up the sports that it oversees. Its two most noteworthy successes have come in the cases of Marion Jones and Lance Armstrong, high-profile athletes who were exposed as cheats largely because of USADA's determined efforts to catch them.

Does USADA want the job? The answer is yes. "It's obviously an honor to be asked, as we were by

Congress, to be involved," USADA CEO Travis Tygart said. "We absolutely support the independent model for all sports, whether horse racing or any other. From our experience and from what we've seen from around the world, these complex issues and this tension between promoting the sport and policing it means the only way to truly give hope to clean athletes is through an independent model. If that's us and horse racing, we're happy to play that role. Obviously our expertise is not in horse racing; we know the industry and have been invited to learn more about the industry and we look forward, if this moves forward, which hopefully it will, to working with the various industry stakeholders. We would hope for a system not unlike what is done in the Olympic world where the key stakeholders within the industry that embrace a clean culture have rallied around the mechanism that is going to best support their rights and ultimately the integrity of the sport."

Tygart believes the reason USADA can do a better

job policing a sport than the sport itself is because sports organizations have an inherent conflict of interest when it comes to catching dopers. If Barry Bonds is clubbing 75 home runs a year and putting hundreds of thousands of fans in the seats, does it really pay to bring him down? If a trainer is a cheater, but is filling your races with 10 starters per card, does racetrack management really want him or her to go away?

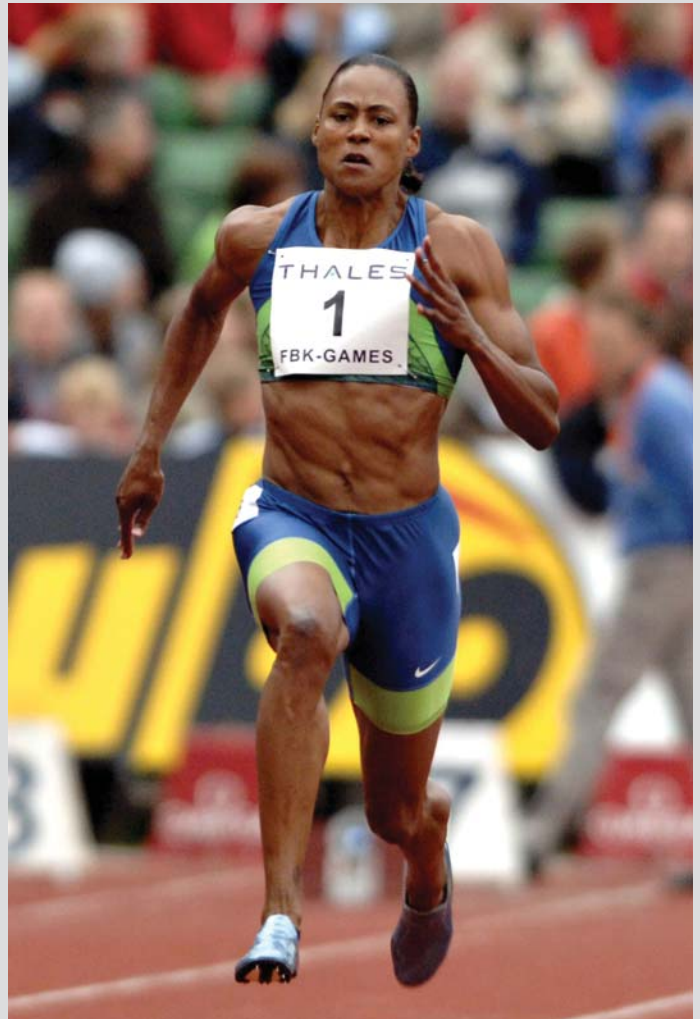
“When USADA was established, there was no longer this inherent conflict of interest where a sport attempts to police itself and the policing mechanism is sometimes directly opposite of the fund-raising and growth of the sport functions that any sport has,” he said. “It’s impossible to both effectively police and promote your sport because some of the very athletes that may be cheating with these dangerous drugs may be the ones you want to promote to put fans in the seats, to grow revenues, to have bigger TV contracts, all the things as a sports organization you have an obligation to fulfill.”

Though he admits he is not an expert on horse racing, Tygart doesn’t buy the idea that doping is under control or that overages of otherwise legal medications are the only thing that the labs should be catching.

“You can’t say that because no one has been caught that the cheating isn’t going on,” Tygart said. “You look at baseball in the late nineties and early 2000s and no one was caught then, either. We now know differently from the Mitchell Report; their estimates were that over 80 percent of the population was cheating. The better yardstick is to look at other sports. You can take a look at a story in inline roller skating and see the story of a 16-year-old kid (Corey Gahan) getting suspended. This is a sport where there is no fame, no money and you had a kid on one of the most sophisticated doping programs that we’ve ever seen because his dad and his coach got the glory of watching him win. You can’t underestimate the win-at-all-costs mentality that is out there, especially when you add big money to the equation. You’d be a fool to think that the temptations aren’t astounding.”

Should USADA move into horse racing, one thing Tygart would like to change is the see-no-evil, hear-no-evil culture that exists on the backstretch. In racing, he sees trainers operating by a code of omertà—the cultural attitude popular in cycling that promotes a code of silence and lack of cooperation with authorities. Honest trainers and owners, the ones most hurt by the dishonest ones, rarely if ever speak up, express any outrage or do anything to help solve the problem.

Tygart and USADA have tried to change that way of thinking in other sports, and their successful

prosecution of Lance Armstrong was largely the result of his teammates cooperating with authorities. “Those who have agreed to abide by the rules have to stand up and embrace them and that might mean when they see syringes lying around a barn or around the track they pick up the phone and they call the independent entity,” Tygart said. “When people are asked questions under oath they need to testify truthfully; say, ‘yes, these doctors provided me with these drugs and the same doctors that provided me with these drugs were providing all the other athletes on the team with these drugs.’ You have to give support to people within the culture that don’t want to break the law, don’t want a secret race and ultimately don’t want to be frauds in violation of the rules and possibly the law in order to be successful in a sport.”

February, the bay stepped right into the deep end and was far from disgraced when fourth behind I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) in the GI Santa Anita Derby in April. Faced with a hot pace and slop when second at a short price in Churchill's GIII Derby Trial S.

Apr. 28, the Bob Baffert trainee nearly stole the show on GI Preakness S. day when he romped by 5 3/4 lengths and earned a 106 Beyer Speed Figure in a 1 1/16-mile allowance. He seemed destined for a return to the spotlight at that point, and looked home free in June's GI Belmont S. until being tagged by Union Rags (Dixie Union) in the final strides, marking a third tough beat for Zayat Stables in last year's Triple Crown series following Bodemeister (Empire Maker)'s runner-up finishes in the GI Kentucky Derby and Preakness. While he was on the mend, Paynter received a major pedigree update from his brother-in-blood Oxbow (Awesome Again), winner of the GI Preakness S. and runner-up in the GI Belmont S. 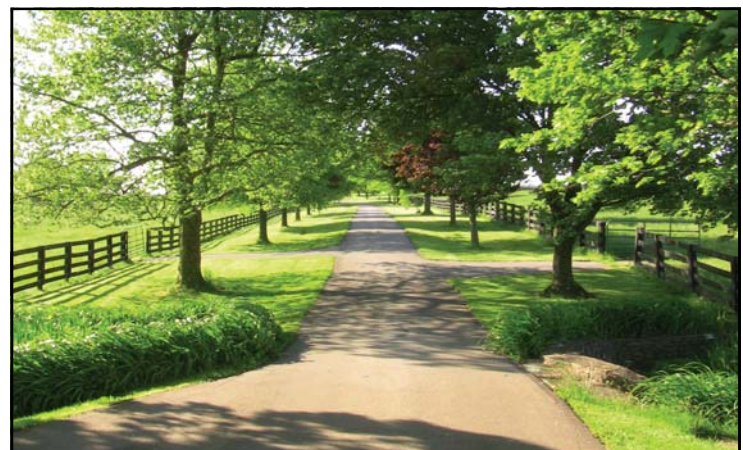

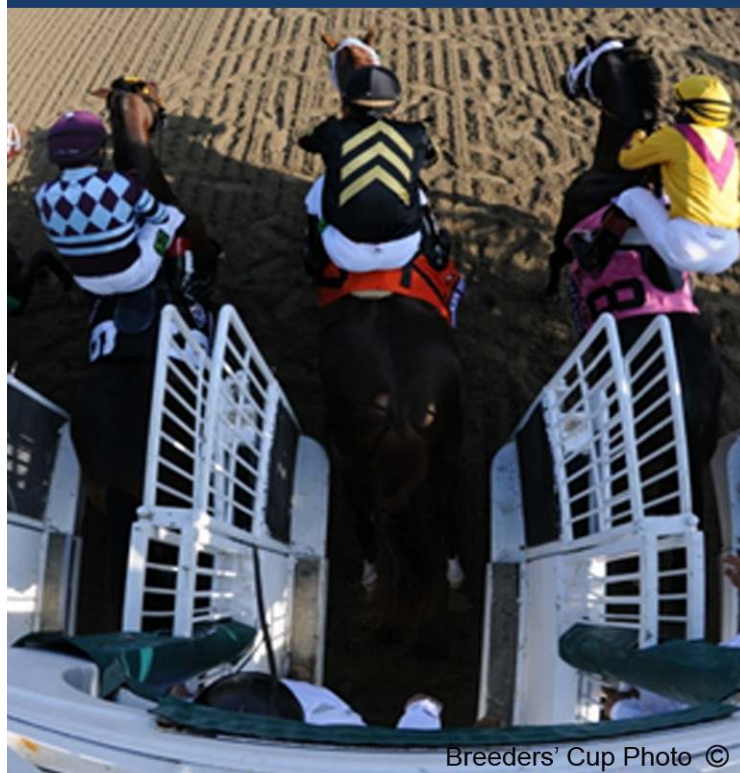
