## HEAD OF THE CLASS

Haras du Quesnay's unbeaten **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}) routed her rivals in yesterday's G1 Prix de Diane Longines at Chantilly to provide her owner-breeder-trainer family with a memorable success in this Classic in which all the fancied runners flopped. While the bay had looked very promising when winning two mile contests at Longchamp in September and at Saint-Cloud May 15, she was facing some proven Group 1 performers here and her odds of 8-1 owed much to potential. Held up in rear early by Thierry Jarnet, Treve sliced through gaps on the inner to hit the front passing the quarter pole and stretched clear from the errant **Chicquita (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), scoring by four lengths and smashing the course record by two seconds.

"This is a dream come true," commented trainer Criquelette Head-Maarek. "It reminds me of my first Prix de Diane winner Harbour (Fr) (Arctic Tern), who also carried these colors to success in 1982. She is a lovely filly with a lot of class and I know she was stepping up from a 'B' race to a Group 1, but she had been working impressively." **Cont. p3**

## VERRAZANO FLIES IN THE PEGASUS

What appeared to be a two-horse race at Monmouth Sunday quickly became a one-horse romp after G1 Preakness S. runner-up **Itsmyluckyday** (Lawyer Ron) was pulled up midway down the backstretch of the GIII Pegasus S., allowing favored **★ "TDN Rising Star" Verrazano** (More Than Ready) to cruise to victory. After breaking well, Verrazano assumed his usual position at the head of affairs as Itsmyluckyday, who was sent from the sixth slot, chased the pace from the outside. Just as the Eddie Plesa trainee was about to challenge for the lead down the backside, pilot Mike Smith pulled him up. "It felt like a left hind," said Smith. "He actually broke really sharp and was just about to go up to press Verrazano and I felt something behind. I wasn't going to take a chance and decided it was better to be safe than sorry so I just took the cautious road." **Cont. p7**

## ANIMAL NEARS ROYAL TEST


**Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) will face 12 rivals in tomorrow's G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot, with trainer Graham Motion hoping that the rains stay away for the next few hours. Speaking of the 2011 G1 Kentucky Derby hero, who recently added this year's G1 Dubai World Cup to his enviable tally, the conditioner was taking a cautious approach as the big occasion nears. "I do feel confident, but if we were running at Gulfstream or Belmont I would feel very confident," Motion said yesterday. "There are a lot of unknowns going into this, including the ground. I think he will handle almost anything and I did speak with [Clerk of the Course] Chris [Stickels] this morning and he feels we should have good going on Tuesday unless we get any rain that we are not expecting. I think it is one less tangible to throw in his direction, so I would rather see him run on firm ground. I would feel more comfortable with that, but I do think he would handle softish ground and he worked fine on it the day we took him to Ascot." **Cont. p10**

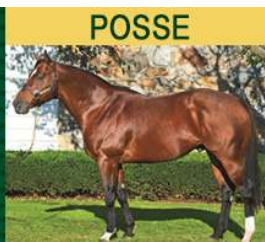

Haras du Quesnay has been a major player on the French stage for decades now and the family's red silks have been carried by some high-class performers, but this success will carry extra weight as it is a direct advert for the establishment's new resident Motivator (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}).

Already enjoying a burgeoning reputation in this country due to the exploits of last year's G1 Prix de l'Opera heroine Ridasiyna (Fr), the 2005 G1 Epsom Derby hero has another serious distaffer on his portfolio after Treve dominated this seemingly competitive Classic. Led out unsold at a mere €22,000 at the Arqana October Sale in 2011, the homebred had continued to thrive since that rejection and made an instant impact on her debut at Longchamp in September. Avoiding the traditional Pattern-race trials, she crept into this Classic's picture while enjoying her dress rehearsal in a conditions event at the former venue in the middle of last month and gave all the signals that she was ready for the jump in class. Positioned towards the back early by Thierry Jarnet, she saved vital ground on the rail as the likes of **Flotilla (Fr)** (Mizzen Mast) and **Esoterique (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) over-raced without cover throughout the early stages. As Olivier Peslier moved **Silasol (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) out just ahead of her at the top of the straight, she was able to make a decisive strike between the fading pacemaker **Sage Melody (Fr)** (Sageburg {Ire}) and **Baltic Baroness (Ger)** (Shamardal) as Flotilla failed to fire when committed by Christophe-Patrice Lemaire. Clear by the furlong pole, it was left to Chicquita to chase, but the filly who had fallen last time made heavy weather of the pursuit by flashing her tail and veering left across the track.

"Everyone has been congratulating me and I am so happy for the whole family--it really is a family affair," Criquette Head-Maarek said. "My father unfortunately could not be here today, but he has done so much for us all and to offer him this Prix de Diane is a thrill. She was the best I had in my hard last year and this, but each time I wanted to run her she had small problems including when she was lame before the G1 Prix Saint-Alary. I decided to wait and when I said to 'Papa' that I was going to run her in the Prix de Diane they thought I was a bit crazy, but sometimes you have to be. Two weeks ago, she worked amazingly and she had the perfect strong pace to run at which really suited her here. 'Papa' bought the granddam from Nelson Bunker-Hunt's dispersal and it was a fantastic family, so we bred her to Motivator as we like him and it was a good cross and it worked out very well." **cont. p4**

“She is not in the Arc, but things change and we will see what we are going to do--that can be sorted out,” continued Criquelette Head-Maarek. “It is a little too early to decide on that and there are other races for fillies like the Vermeille and Opera, but she will definitely be rested until September. She could stay in training next season, as that was only the third race of her life and she won’t be over-raced this year. She is brand new. I have had some very good fillies in my yard, but she has a tremendous turn of foot and had to be good to win this. She will stay and her mother beat Six Perfections over six furlongs as a 2-year-old here, so she was good too.”

Part-owner and brother Freddy Head added, “Criquelette has been very bullish about this filly for a while, so I backed her idea to run and she has proven what a good trainer she is. She knows what to do with a good one like this and I am truly delighted for her.” For 46-year-old rider Thierry Jarnet, who partnered Freddy Head’s stable star Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) to three Group 1 wins over the past two years, the result was another boost in this later part of his career. “It is very sweet to win this race in front of a home crowd and I had the dream trip and was always confident,” he said. “It looks like the old boy has life in him yet.” Chicquita entered the race as the least exposed, but trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre was delighted with the outcome. “I don’t know why she drifts like that, as she doesn’t do it at home,” he commented. “She has talent whatever and has done very well to finish second in a Classic, so we’ll see what we do now.”

After showing abundant promise when winning a 10-furlong debutantes contest on ground officially described as good here May 7, Flintshire was runner-up to a potentially smart rival in Silver Trail (GB) (Indian Haven {GB}) on testing ground in a conditions event over 1 5/16 miles at Longchamp last time June 1. Relishing this faster surface and step up to the Arc trip, the homebred suggested he could be one to bear in mind for that autumn feature after he has taken in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris en route at Longchamp July 13. Keen initially towards the front, the bay was eventually settled in fifth by Maxime Guyon and was sent forward in early stretch as he extended his impressive stride. Taking control approaching the furlong pole, he stretched clear from the perennial place-getter Park Reel to stamp real authority on the race. "He is a horse with class, but last time the ground was much too soft for him and this ground is the key to him," trainer Andre Fabre commented after greeting his 15th winner of this prize. "This distance is also much better for him and he showed his true form. All being well, he'll go for the Grand Prix de Paris now."

Off the mark in the Listed Prix Matchem at Maisons-Laffitte last June, Mainsail was second in the G3 Prix Daphnis at Longchamp later that month before finishing off a light campaign with a seventh in the latter venue's G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein over a mile in October. Third in both the Listed Prix Jacques Laffitte back at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 4 and Listed Prix de Montretout reverting to this trip at Longchamp May 21, the homebred was able to enjoy an easy lead and turned that to his advantage for a career best. Setting soft fractions under Christophe Soumillon, the bay wound up the sprint inside the final quarter and after establishing a decisive lead was geared down late for a cozy score. "He had been rather unlucky both times this year and had shown his class last year, so he deserved that," trainer Pascal Bary commented. "Christophe gave him a great ride and it is possible he could run in the G3 Prix Messidor [at Maisons-Laffitte July 7]."

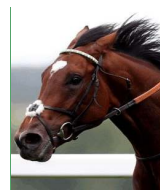

Ivanhowe, who opened up with a second at Dusseldorf in his only juvenile start Oct. 7, broke through over this course and distance on sophomore return last time May 20, and now heads the list of contenders for the July 7 G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg after a decisive score in this prestigious Classic trial. The homebred bay was reserved in rear following an untidy exit, but kept the leaders within range throughout. Easing away from the potential pitfalls of the rail in early stretch, he challenged going well at the quarter-mile marker and lengthened clear in good style under whipless coaxing inside the final furlong to easily claim a personal best. "I was really quite optimistic beforehand, and softer going would have been even better for him," commented winning conditioner Wilhelm Giedt.

Rapidly progressive last term, Midnight Soprano moved up from competitive handicaps to open her black-type account in Leopardstown's Listed Saval Beg S. over 14 furlongs in June before running second in the G3 Curragh Cup over that trip the following month. 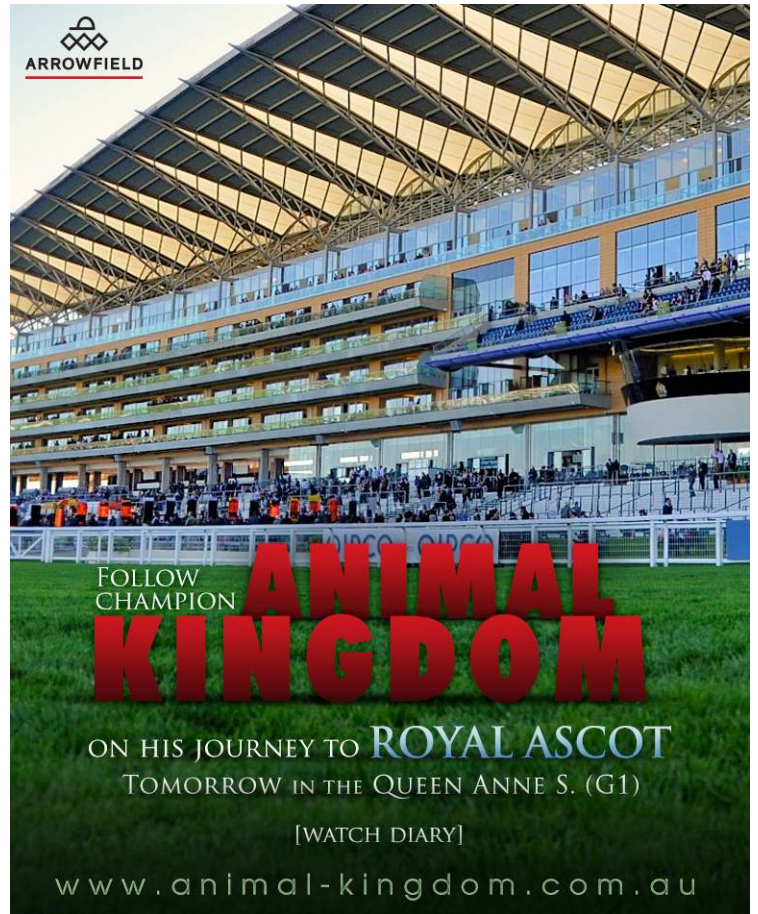

"Magician is an incredibly exciting horse and he was very impressive at The Curragh," commented trainer Aidan O'Brien, who will also saddle **"TDN Rising Star" Mars (Ire)** and last year's G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner **George Vancouver**. Trainer Roger Charlton has opted to run **Dundonnell** in the contest instead of Wednesday's G3 Jersey S., while Kevin Ryan will put forward the surprise May 4 G1 2,000 Guineas runner-up **Glory Awaits (Ire)**.

He believes Glory Awaits is entitled to be in with a shout on his latest Classic form. "The clock doesn't lie and that wasn't a fluke," Ryan said.

"The horse will do the talking. We were very hopeful before the Guineas, he was on the pace throughout and there was 2 1/2 lengths back to the third. He's a very tough horse and we always felt that blinkers would bring out a lot of improvement in him. Last year, he idled in his races and we saved them for the Guineas and they have put him on his 'A' game. He's come out of the race very well and I feel he's improved again. He's a lovely horse with a great walk and super temperament and his work has been very good."

# TRACKSIDE... with Liesl King

## THE COLORFUL HISTORY OF HEATH HOUSE

As my time in Newmarket draws to a close, I am reminded that all things in life have a beginning and an end, even towns. Newmarket pounces on you, suddenly, like most English towns. Winding through the lush green countryside on narrow lanes enclosed by high hedges, you crest a slight rise and there, without warning, the High Street is spread out before you.

It is almost a back-to-front town, where you are greeted first by death, with the graveyard on one side and a large stone monument, in memory of a beloved husband, on the other. While at its other end, the High Street offers the Heath teeming with racehorses, work riders and trainers. Life lived at its fullest. Also at the end of the High Street, past the clock tower and just before the gallops, you will find Heath House Stables. It is here that I came across a story of skulduggery, a colt with white painted hocks, a young apprentice carted unceremoniously across the Heath in a mad dash and a horsehide mounted in a glass cage. But let me start at the beginning.

Heath House Stables date from the late 17th century when Tregonwell Frampton, Esq was its first occupant. Keeper of the running horses to their Majesties William III, Queen Anne and George I and II, Frampton is known as the Father of the Turf. A character of note, he was born in the reign of Charles I, when horse racing commenced at Newmarket and even in those early days it seemed a bit of skulduggery was not out of the ordinary.

One of the top racehorses of the time, Merlin, was set to run in a match race against one of Frampton's favorites for a considerable amount of money. As soon as the match race was announced, large bets were made between gentlemen of the North and the South. Frampton, deciding that there was even more money to be made, suggested to Merlin's trainer, that a secret trial, over the exact distance and with the stated weights should be staged.

Merlin's trainer was not keen, but his owner, Sir William Strickland, thought it a marvelous idea. So much so, that he instructed his trainer to deceive Frampton by adding seven pounds to the weight Merlin was due to carry, of course with the utmost secrecy. Unbeknown to Sir Strickland, however, Frampton had given the exact same instruction to his groom. The secret trial was duly run, with Merlin prevailing by just over a length. Secrets are hard to keep, though, and with each side convinced that without the added weight their horse would have won easily, large sums were wagered on both horses up and down the country. Some gentlemen even staking not only all the cash they could lay their hands on, but also their properties.

As the hour of the match race arrived and with each side assured of success, there was much boasting between the Southern and Northern gentlemen over the vast amounts they had bet. Merlin duly won the official match race by pretty much the same margin as the secret trial. A short while later, the truth about the secret trial emerged, but the damage had already been done and several gentlemen had been ruined.

Another colorful era in the history of Heath House Stables dawned when Matt Dawson became the trainer in residence. Racing folk are known for grand entrances and exits and due to a certain Prince Batthyany dropping dead on the steps of the Jockey Club Rooms, his horses came up for sale. Amongst the 2-year-olds was a handsome colt, with a white substance painted on his hocks, suggestive of joint problems. Dawson purchased the colt, correctly surmising that it probably was a ploy by the colt's current trainer to prevent it from being sold. On arriving home, Dawson washed off what turned out to be white paint and a young St Simon took up residence at Heath House Stables.

Another inmate of Heath House Stables during that time was a young apprentice by the name of Fred Archer. Indentured to Dawson, he learned his trade on the Heath and one bright morning found himself on the back of St Simon for a trial. St Simon didn't appear to be in the mood for running and Archer was instructed to nudge him with his spurs. St Simon bolted and as one onlooker describes "we saw him shoot out, pass his own stable companions, tear up the gallop and dash through another trainer's lot of horses galloping in front, scattering them like pigeons, before disappearing from view." **cont. p13**

Young Archer was unable to stop the runaway St Simon and when the colt finally came to a halt at the end of the gallops, he famously exclaimed, "He is not a horse, he is a blooming steam engine!"

Archer went on to become "the best all-around jockey that the turf had ever seen," winning 13 Jockey titles and 2748 races during his all-too-brief career. Sadly, his young wife died in childbirth and a depressed Archer, aged 29, took his own life shortly afterwards. He is buried, together with his beloved wife, in the graveyard at the entrance to the town.

St Simon would retire unbeaten and, despite being unable to compete in the Classics, he was hailed the champion of his crop. After a very successful career as a stallion, where he was leading sire nine times, he died in 1908 at the age of 27 at Wellbeck Abbey Stud. His progeny and their descendants dominated racing during the 20th century and well beyond.

As was the custom in those days, mementoes were kept in remembrance of great horses. Hence, St Simon's skeleton was preserved and is currently in the

British Natural History Museum, while two hooves are in the Racing Museum at York. Yet a piece of St Simon made it home to the Heath where he bolted with a young Fred Archer so long ago. At the center of Heath House Stables,

in the entrance to the covered ride, St Simon's skin, complete with mane and tail, hangs mounted in a glass and wooden box.

Heath House Stables was home to the Father of the Turf, a young Fred Archer started his career there and it is the final resting place of one of the greatest horses in the history of racing. These days, Heath House Stables is home to Sir Mark Prescott and as he sits in his office, with a drawing of Frampton looking down on him, one gets the feeling that while everything has changed since Frampton's days, nothing has actually changed at all.

**RACETRACK ROUND-UP**

***Pletcher Tunes Up Fleet of Fillies at Belmont...***

The Todd-Pletcher trained **Dreaming of Julia** (A.P. Indy) breezed four panels in :49.07 Sunday morning over the Belmont training track in preparation for a start in Saturday's GI Mother Goose S. "She's a very consistent work horse and I'm very pleased with the way she's coming into the race," Pletcher said of the effort. The Stonestreet colorbearer enters the Mother Goose off a disappointing fourth-place finish in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 4 in which she was badly bumped at the break.

"I think it greatly affected her," the conditioner said of the start. "In addition to that, she kind of got back into a position going into the far turn and had to lose her momentum again. I think the combination of those two things were very costly. She's probably of the size that getting bumped in at the start like that would take her wind away a little bit. It was a pretty severe bump." Pletcher also sent out Kentucky Oaks winner **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior), who went a half mile in :49.41 and is aimed for a start in Saratoga's GI Coaching Club American Oaks July 20; multiple graded stakes winner **Kauai Katie** (Malibu Moon), who covered the four furlongs in :48.47 and is pointing towards Belmont's GIII Victory Ride S. June 29; and **Fusaichiswonderful** (Fusaichi Pegasus) who went the distance in :49.42.

***Fort Larned Whitney-bound...***

Jan Whithan's **Fort Larned** (E Dubai) appears to have exited Saturday's GI Stephen Foster H. romp well, according to trainer Ian Wilkes. "He looks good this morning," the conditioner said Sunday of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner. "I'm very proud of him. It was what we were hoping to see. The [GI] Whitney [H. at Saratoga Aug. 3] will be next and we'll just take it one race at a time. The ultimate goal is getting back to the Breeders' Cup Classic." Runner-up **Golden Ticket** (Speightstown) also came out of the race well. "We're thrilled with how Golden Ticket ran," said Phil Bauer, assistant to trainer Kenny McPeck. "There's no shame in running behind the Breeders' Cup Classic winner. Golden Ticket gives you everything he has every time and he proved he's a classy horse. We don't have any plans for his next race yet." Last year's victor **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate) completed the trifecta in this year's running. "Everything's fine," conditioner Bill Mott said. "The Whitney is a possibility for Ron the Greek." Morton Fink homebred **Successful Dan** (Successful Appeal) was fourth and "looks to be fine," according to trainer Charles LoPresti. "[Jockey] Julien [Leparoux] said he was bobbling the whole way and couldn't get ahold of the racetrack. Hats off to Fort Larned, though. I don't think there's a horse in the country that could have beaten him last night. I'm just going to see how [Successful Dan] comes out of it and give him a few days before we decide what to do." Fifth-place finisher **Pool Play** (Silver Deputy) "came out of it fine," said Norman Casse, assistant to his father Mark. "He was just too far back. We don't have any plans for him yet." **Take Charge Indy** (A.P. Indy), who disappointed when last of six as the 9-5 favorite, also looked well the morning after. "He appears to have come back good," noted trainer Pat Byrne. "No one was going to beat the winner. We tip our hats to Fort Larned. We'll discuss a plan with [owners] Mr. Sandford and Elliott Walden of WinStar and figure out what's best for him. We're not in any hurry to run him back."

**No Excuses for 'Delta'...**

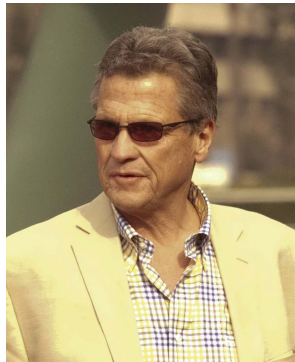

"I'm very happy with how she looks this morning. I had confidence in her last night, but we were running against Royal Delta, so we had our reservations. We're going to enjoy this moment before we come up with a plan."

"I have no excuses," trainer Bill Mott of the two-time GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner. "I suppose the [GI] Delaware H. [July 20] might be next for Royal Delta." Royal Delta will ship back to New York with stablemate Ron the Greek on Tuesday.

**MITCHELL HOSPITALIZED**

Trainer Mike Mitchell collapsed at Betfair Hollywood Park yesterday from an apparent seizure after the sixth-race winner's circle presentation for his trainee Gutshot Straight (Kela). The 65-year-old was taken by ambulance to Centinela Hospital Medical Center for treatment, accompanied by his son-in-law, jockey Julien Leparoux, who took off his remaining mounts on the card. He was reportedly seen moving while being transported via stretcher. Mitchell underwent surgery for a brain tumor last June and reported earlier this year that doctors had told him

that the tumor had shrunk. With eight wins at the meet, Mitchell is currently ninth in the Betfair Hollywood Park standings. Among the horses Mitchell trains is Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}), winner of the GII American H. in Inglewood May 25.

**ASCOT RACECOURSE KEY DATES**

- Summer 1711:** It was Queen Anne who first saw the potential for a racecourse at Ascot, which in those days was called East Cote. While out riding she came upon an area of open heath, not far from Windsor Castle, that looked an ideal place for "horses to gallop at full stretch." In June, Charles, Duke of Somerset instructed Sir William Wyndham, Master of the Royal Buckhounds, to have the open heath cleared of scrub and gorse in preparation for a race meeting. And 11 Aug. 1711, the first race meeting ever held at Ascot took place. Her Majesty's Plate, worth 100 guineas and open to any horse, mare or gelding over the age of six, was the inaugural event. Each horse was required to carry a weight of 12st and seven runners took part.
- 1807:** The inaugural running of the Gold Cup for three-year-olds and upwards. It is significant that the first Gold Cup was won by a 3-year-old, this was an event designed to attract horses bred to compete much younger than had been the case the previous century.
- 1813:** Parliament passed an Act of Enclosure. This Act ensured that Ascot Heath, although the property of the Crown, would be kept and used as a racecourse for the public in the future. Racing at Ascot was now secure. The Master of the Buckhounds continued to manage the races and the racecourse--just as it was more than 100 years before.
- 1822:** The Royal Enclosure was born when King George IV commissioned a two-storey stand to be built with a surrounding lawn. Access was by invitation of the King where he entertained his friends in style.
- 1825:** King George IV's greatest legacy to Royal Ascot was the Royal Procession. The King leading four other coaches with members of the Royal party drove up the Straight Mile in front of the crowds. A diarist of the day commented; 'the whole thing looked very splendid.'
- 1862:** A new race at the meeting was named after Prince Albert: the Prince of Wales's Stakes.

Maybe it's because my oldest child just graduated from high school and is now embarking on her journey to find her path in life, but the saying "find what you love to do, and figure out a way to get paid to do it" is a common statement at my house right now.

I remember saying to my wife in 1998 that Real Quiet would be the biggest moment in my career. I'm not sure I can say that anymore halfway through 2013.

"That horse is tough," I said, with his ears pinned and acting like he did not like the attention. She asked, "What's this one's name?" That feisty dark bay, of course, was Paynter and the statement I made about him being tough could not have been more true.

Working with the Zayat family on the Go Bode Go campaign, we became very close to them and their horses, especially Bode and Paynter. When Paynter got sick after the Haskell, we watched with great anxiety for his updates through Ahmed Zayat's Twitter feed along with the rest of the racing world. We worried about that friend we made on the backside of Churchill Downs, and although we knew he was tough, we worried we may never see him again.

Friday night at our house, with my family standing in front of the TV, we were all brought to tears as we watched that tough dark bay with the white star victoriously returned to racing. I looked forward to Paynter's return for so many obvious reasons, but as I looked around that room and saw my family jumping up and down cheering, it hit me: My daughter has graduated from high school and will move out sooner than later, my boys are nearing their teen years, and my wife and I are nearing our 20th wedding anniversary, and once again a special horse has us high-fiving each other like we just won lottery.

It's just one more way this industry continues to pay me for doing something I love. I am so thankful to these magnificent animals we call Thoroughbreds.
