AN UNORTHODOX APPROACH

The last time a colt contested the G1 Epsom Derby and came back to win the G1 St James's Palace S. was Marju {Ire} in 1991, so the task in hand is not a straightforward one for **"TDN Rising Star" Dawn Approach {Ire}** (Galileo {Ire}) in today's strong renewal of the mile contest. Blowing his perfect record

to pieces with a reckless effort in the Derby 17 days ago, Godolphin's number one hope for e Royal Ascot meeting will have to race with more conservatism despite the drop back to the trip over which he dominated the G1 2000

Guineas. "He's in great form and I have no reason to think that he's any less of a horse now than on Guineas day," commented trainer Jim Bolger. Bolger also saddles Thursday's G3 Ballycorus S. winner **Leitir Mor {Ire}** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), but said that colt is not in as a pacemaker. "He likes to race close to the pace, but I can't say he will definitely be at the front," Bolger added.

Dawn Approach was initially not coming here after his blue riband meltdown and one of his biggest obstacles to a return to winning ways is another who has had a wobble on the way. Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's **Magician {Ire}** (Galileo {Ire}) was under consideration for the Derby himself after his G1 Irish 2000 Guineas win at The Curragh May 25 before being committed to this race instead and might have been challenging for favoritism had he not suffered a knock in the lead-up.

ANIMAL MAGNETISM

Ascot opens its doors for the Royal meeting today and, like 12 months ago when Frankel {GB} (Galileo {Ire}) graced the opening G1 Queen Anne S., the action starts with a major presence as the world's greatest comeback kid **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) bids for a unique international treble.

Whereas his predecessor was homebound for his career, Team Valor's flagbearer has charted a diverse path from his native America to Dubai and now to England for his probable career finale.

Animal Kingdom's record on turf includes second placings to the heavyweights of that sphere Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) and Point of Entry (Dynaformer) in the Nov. 3 GI Breeders' Cup Mile and Feb. 9 GI Gulfstream Park Turf H., respectively, and there should be nothing of that caliber lurking in this soft-looking renewal. However, the 5-year-old's distance of travel has to cast some cloud over his prospects. Trainer Graham Motion is under no illusion as to the task at hand. "It certainly is an unusual situation and a huge challenge that we are taking on," Motion said. "I've always wanted to come back here and take a shot at one of the prestigious races and I couldn't imagine having a better horse to do it with than Animal Kingdom." Cont. p4

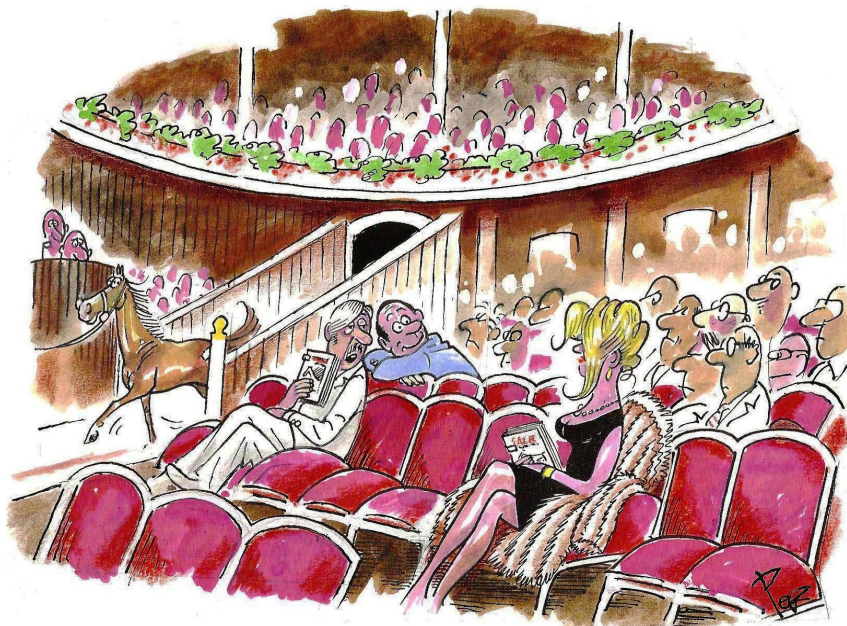

Magician (Ire)'s absence seemed to pave the way for stablemate and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Mars (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) to join in the game of musical horses as far as this race is concerned. Sixth in the Guineas and the Derby and particularly eye-catching in the latter race, he remains a fascinating prospect. "Magician travels very strongly and keeps on going," said trainer Aidan O'Brien. "He has a lot of speed and everybody saw at the Curragh how strongly he traveled. We think Mars could be in the mold of Rip Van Winkle--in his work, his cruising speed was up around 40 mph, which is very fast, so there's a chance he might be better coming back to a mile. His first run on grass was in the Guineas and it was a very respectable run, so it was probably a big task that we set him. We learnt a lot about him at Epsom and he'll be ridden handier over a mile. Racing will help him relax and mature."

Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) was rerouted to this event after his disappointment in the Newmarket Classic led connections to skip a tilt at the Derby. The way he disposed of the proven pattern-race performer **Dundonnell** (First Defence) in the G3 Craven S. at Newmarket Apr. 18 sticks in the memory and trainer Richard Hannon is hoping for a revival of fortunes fitted with a spoon bit. "We know we did not see the real Toronado in the Guineas, but everything he has done at home since he resumed exercise has convinced us that we still have the real deal," Hannon commented. "We believe that he suffered a displaced palate as soon as he left the stalls at Newmarket, so he did remarkably well to finish fourth. He was legless at the end and in another 100 yards would have trailed in last. However, we have switched him from Everleigh to Herridge and also changed his tack, and both seem to have had a positive effect. He is much more relaxed and is breathing properly again, and, whereas we could have gone for the tongue-tie, a lot of horses do not find that comfortable, so we went for the spoon-bit, which we have used on several of our horses in the past and he seems very happy in it. He worked super in his final gallop, and, while we don't underestimate either Dawn Approach or Magician, we are just focusing on ensuring that our horse is back to his best and able to run to his full potential." Jockey Richard Hughes added, "I haven't lost faith in him. We know he wasn't at his best in the Guineas, yet he was still there at the two pole on the bit and not many horses would have done that with the fractions they were doing. Something went amiss and he wasn't getting much air. He's very talented, but he has to prove himself now. I know what he is, but we have to get everyone else to see how good he is."

"[Animal Kingdom] is very laid-back and that has shown since he's been over here--he's adjusted and fitted in very well," explained Motion. "He is an extraordinary animal and the grass is probably his preferred surface. I'm not sure what his best distance is, but the mile at Ascot is more comparable to a mile and a furlong, which is what he would be running over in the States. He has a tremendous turn of foot and great speed that he can use at any time. We're not ducking anybody and it's admirable that [owners] John [Messara] and Barry [Irwin] want to do this. It's been a great experience and for me it's a relief that all his work is now behind him."

Second in the betting, but perhaps only there due to connections, is Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Joseph Allen's **Declaration of War** (War Front). His form lacks the substance of many of his opponents in this line-up. He was brought along steadily by Aidan O'Brien, but flopped when thrown into the deep end in the May 18 G1 Lockinge S., never looking likely to justify a huge gamble into 5-4 favoritism.

The fact that the G3 Diamond S. and Listed Heritage S. winner was backed to that extent suggests that the read-outs at Ballydoyle were raising eyebrows and his conditioner retains the faith. "We probably learnt a lot about him at Newbury, as what threw us was that he won his group race over a mile and a quarter and he showed a lot more speed than we thought," O'Brien said. "Maybe we did the wrong thing with him and maybe I didn't have him fit enough, so we've changed a lot of things and we still think he's an exciting horse. We need to find out what his correct trip is now, as he's a powerhouse and an unbelievable specimen and he might even have to go back shorter the way he's training."

Teruya Yoshida's G1 Prix Marcel Bousnac and Rothschild winner **Elusive Kate** (Elusive Quality) could provide the pace, as she responds to aggressive tactics. Third when last seen in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. in October, she faces a tough task attempting to beat the colts first time up.

“Like everyone else, I have plenty of respect for Animal Kingdom, but I’m sure that he’s plenty short enough and is there to be taken on and I feel that Elusive Kate is ideal for the job,” jockey William Buick said. “She couldn’t have done any more at home than she has and the boss, John Gosden, knows her inside out. A straight mile and nice ground is just what she wants and I’m sure that the males up against her will know she’s about come the finish.”

Adding to the international flavour is Qatar Racing’s **Trade Storm (GB)** (Trade Fair {GB}), who is a progressive type finding his full strength at present. Successful in Meydan’s G2 Zabeel Mile Mar. 2, he was beaten less than three lengths when fourth in the G1 Dubai Duty Free on World Cup night four weeks later.

“I’m really happy with him, he’s in good health and he’s showing all the right signs,” trainer David Simcock commented. “He trained very well in Dubai, where the whole routine suited him. He’s going the right way and we’ve always been hopeful he’d make up into a nice horse. Take Animal Kingdom out and there’s not a lot between the rest.”

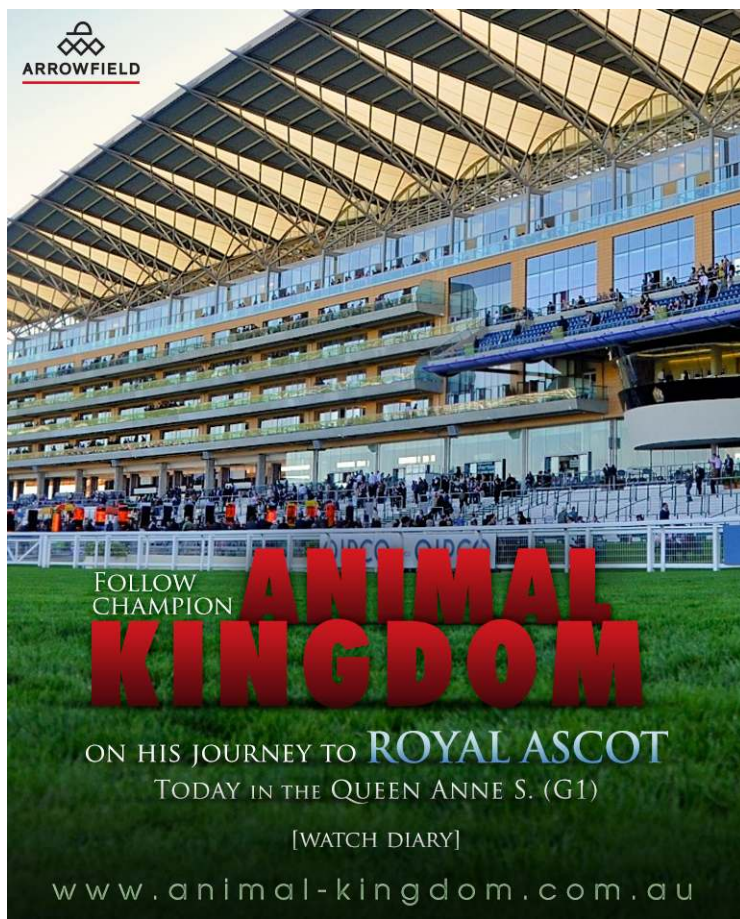

SHEA’S DAY?

If America can pull off a landmark victory in the opener, it could be South Africa’s turn just over half an hour later in the G1 King’s Stand S. at Royal Ascot, with **Shea Shea (SAf)** (National Emblem {SAf}) out to reward the pioneering spirit of his trainer Mike de Kock. While de Kock’s focus on the international stage tends to center around Dubai, he has made a significant impact in Hong Kong and the U.S., and even sent Asiatic Boy (Arg) (Not For Sale {Arg}) to be fourth in the 2007 G1 Sussex S. Shea Shea represents his best chance of breaking through at Royal Ascot, having broken Meydan’s track record twice, most recently in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint on Dubai World Cup night, which compounded the impression he created when covering the five furlongs of Turffontein in :56.5 in last April’s G1 Computaform Sprint.



“It’s not a pipe-dream--he has run some very quick times,” de Kock said. “I believe he’s the real deal and he has produced world-class form. It is never straightforward with all the traveling. It is difficult for us to compete because of quarantine regulations--it is not a level playing field regarding South African participation. Winning would not just be important to us, but it would help the South African horse internationally. There is the weight and the pressure of a nation on him. We will be doing our best and he will be doing his best--if it doesn’t happen, it doesn’t happen. He’s maintained his coat, which is nice as it’s been a bit chilly here and he should be cycling into a winter state being a Southern Hemisphere horse. Ascot will be different to what he’s used to, but he has been to the July Course to work and up the Long Hill gallop, so he has had a good go at undulations. I think the uphill finish at Ascot might suit him because he likes to get going late.”

Unlike South Africa, Australia has enjoyed multiple successes at this meeting in recent times and four have come in this contest in the last 10 years. Danny O’Brien has shipped in the Mar. 9 G1 Newmarket H. winner **Shamexpress (NZ)** (O’Reilly {NZ}) and he has been happy with how the youngster has handled the ordeal so far.

"He took the trip really well, which is obviously the big thing," O'Brien explained. "We had a barrier trial at Flemington and the horse who finished second then, Linton, went on to win a Group 1 sprint, the Stradbroke H., so Shamexpress's form leaving Australia was very good. He is a horse I have always had a good opinion of, but it was his win in the Newmarket H. which sealed the trip to Royal Ascot. I think Shamexpress is coming here at the right time of his career--he is nowhere near as seasoned as some of the Australian horses who have run at Royal Ascot such as Takeover Target and Black Caviar, because he is only a 3-year-old. This horse is beautifully actioned and I don't think the track will be a problem. It would be fantastic to win at Royal Ascot. We were second with Star Witness and it is a great week of racing. Being that close and not winning has left me with the desire to come back here and succeed."

Last year's G1 Prix Morny, G1 Middle Park S. and G2 Norfolk S. scorer **Reckless Abandon (GB)** (Exchange Rate) lost his unbeaten record on his sophomore bow when third behind the past G1 Golden Jubilee S. winner **Kingsgate Native (Ire)** (Mujadil) and **Swiss Spirit (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the G2 Temple S. at Haydock May 25, but trainer Clive Cox can only see positives in that performance.

"We've got that run under our belt now, which I think is important, especially from a sprinter's point of view," Cox told *PA Sport*.

Cox continued, "From a sprinting mentality, more than physically, it does them the world of good. I'm really pleased that's put him on his game. From the end of June and July onwards, 3-year-olds get a bit of help with weight-for-age from their elders, but there aren't that many opportunities early in the year. For that reason, the Temple was the logical place to go and he acquitted himself really well."

Swiss Spirit, who beat Kingsgate Native in the G3 Dubai International Airport World Trophy over this trip at Newbury in September when under the care of David Elsworth, looked unlucky not to confirm that form in the Temple on his second start for the John Gosden stable and jockey William Buick is hoping he can make his presence felt. "With due deference to Shea Shea and Shamexpress, I think there might be a little lack of depth to the King's Stand S. and I am fancying a big run," Buick said. "This is a progressive horse and [he] stepped up considerably last time over five at Haydock. I have no doubt in my mind that we would have won but for being quite badly bumped at the start and lost valuable momentum. The only factor that could be better is the draw [in 17], because I'd like to have been nearer to where I think the pace might be, but I think I have the right horse to overcome that."

WORK IN PROGRESS

So far, **Stubbs (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) has more or less trod down the Dawn Approach path and Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's precocious colt bids to continue the progression along that particular line in today's G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot.

Like last year's hero, Stubbs debuted in the opening Curragh juvenile maiden of the season Mar. 24 and, although he did not emulate his predecessor's success in that race, two starts later he was following his example by winning the Listed Rochestown S. at Naas June 3. He is

joined by Peeping Fawn's son **Sir John Hawkins** (Henrythenavigator) and **War Command** (War Front) and that pair are inter-linked on form. Sir John Hawkins beat the Bolger runner Intensified (Ire) (Intense Focus) in a six-furlong Curragh maiden May 26 before War Command denied the same rival over an extra panel at Leopardstown June 7. "Stubbs is out of an Oaks winner, but the pace is probably coming from Danehill Dancer and he's doing everything right," Aidan O'Brien commented. "First time, he got tired in bad ground and has won very nicely since. We are going to learn a lot about him. Sir John Hawkins won nicely at The Curragh where he was just ready to run." Richard Hannon has put his own stamp on this race in recent times, with Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) and Strong Suit (Rahy) impressive winners in 2009 and 2010, respectively. This time, he saddles three smart prospects in Mohamed Saeed Al Shahi's June 1 Listed Woodcote S. scorer **Thunder Strike** (Sakhee's Secret {GB}), Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's May 31 Goodwood maiden scorer **Wahaab (Ire)** (Tamayuz {GB}) and Julie Wood's **Championship (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), with Richard Hughes favoring the latter.

He looked an exciting colt in the making when overcoming traffic problems to score on debut in the same six-furlong Newbury maiden won by the yard's aforementioned Coventry winners May 17. "Hughesie made a late switch in the Coventry," Hannon explained. "He was going to ride Thunder Strike, but he was so impressed when he gave Championship his final blow-out at Everleigh last Wednesday that he has jumped ship. Championship has done so well physically since Newbury and now looks a different horse. He won that debut stylishly enough, but he has definitely improved and, while we aren't going there with the confidence we had in Canford Cliffs and Strong Suit, we do like our fellow. However, don't rule out Thunder Strike. He is a colt with plenty of speed and we weren't sure that he would stay the six furlongs in the Woodcote S. at Epsom, but he got the trip well and he is clearly a decent tool. So too, is Wahaab, who made an impressive winning debut at Goodwood the same day. He was hollering in the paddock and has a bit of growing up to do, but we have been impressed with everything he has done at home since, and he is definitely going the right way."

In the Woodcote, the eye-catcher was Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum's **Riverboat Springs (Ire)** (Bushranger {Ire}) who managed second despite hating Epsom's camber. "I know we've got 3 1/2 lengths to find [on Thunder Strike], but anyone who saw that race will know that Mick Channon's horse did an absolute feat to finish so close," jockey William Buick commented. "He was detached at halfway, still had a massive task with a furlong to run, but we were flying at the finish to be second. I know this track will be much more up his street and, with the experience he's gained from Epsom, he is going to be a player in the closing stages." Richard Fahey's juvenile team is strong this year and he has made no secret of the regard in which he holds David Armstrong's May 16 York maiden winner **Parbold (Ire)** (Dandy Man {Ire}). "I was worried about the ground, because it rained a lot at York and I nearly took him out," Fahey said. "He is a horse with a lot of speed and mentally he is there."

Build up to Animal Kingdom's appearance tomorrow in the opening race of the 2013 Royal Ascot meeting has been remarkable to watch unfold, as the racecourse has generated an unbelievable amount of interest in the challenge undertaken by our horse.

The media has been all over our horse and his unusual story, everybody jumping on the circumstance of AK being the first Kentucky Derby winner since 1935 hero Omaha to race at Royal Ascot. If you don't believe me, Google it. The Depression Era Derby hero has replaced Omaha Steaks as the most searched item in all of Nebraska!

The British are nothing if not worldly--after all, they tried to run the world for a long, long time. So they know a sporting challenge worthy of the name when they see one.

The international aspect of the various connections has really intrigued them, what with a homegrown English lad as the trainer, a legendary Puerto Rican as the jockey, a Kentucky horseman as the breeder, an Australian stud master as the majority owner and the ruler of Dubai as a racing and breeding partner.

Toss in the international nature of a Brazilian sire and a German dam and the global profile is complete.

I spent the first part of the day doing the mundane, making sure I had enough clean clothes to last the rest of the week and picking up my Morning Suit from Moss Brothers on Regent Street ("no, I don't want to try it on again to make sure it fits!").

Joe Drape and I were the only diners at an Indian restaurant down the block from the Corus Hotel, where last summer my wife Kathleen and I stayed when we attended the track and field portion of the Olympic Games.

This evening, Asprey's (which makes trophies for such diverse and iconic sporting events as Wimbledon and the Dubai World Cup) hosted many Ascot connections at a cocktail party at their store on Bond Street, right across the street from Ralph Lauren's shop where polo shirts for men can be had at a mere 50% more than they cost in Manhattan.

People keep asking me if I am nervous, or if I am getting excited yet, and what does it feel like?

I usually only get nervous when I am anxious.

Anxiety is fear of the unknown. I experience it when I do not have a good feeling about how a horse will do. God knows that Animal Kingdom is facing plenty of unknowns tomorrow: running for the first time in a straight course, racing on an undulating course for the first time, racing in England for the first time and dropping from 10 furlongs on a Tapeta track to turf, on which he will try to win his first race at a distance as short as a mile.

I was apprehensive about the straight course before arriving in England, but I must tell you that after watching him work twice on an uphill straight, I am buoyed with confidence and I don't expect to be nervous tomorrow.

What I do think will happen, is about a minute or two before the race kicks off, I will experience a tiny electric shock beneath my tongue that has occurred countless times, beginning when I used to participate in track in high school. It is the anticipation of competition.

Competition is why we brought Animal Kingdom to Ascot.



I've owned my top hat for the past 20 years or so, but recently, I've noticed that it's getting smaller on my head. (Friends tell me it's the other way around, and that my head is getting bigger, but I don't see how this is possible.) It's grey, and for the past several years, Shawn Drysdale has been teasing me that I really need a black hat. They don't make them any more, however, so they're vintage... and they're expensive. I Googled top hats in London before I headed over for Ascot, and came up with Hetherington Hats in Chelsea. I called the owner, and he asked me my hat size. I said 7 1/2 to 7 5/8ths. "Oh, no," was the reply. "What's wrong?" I said. "The big ones are hard to find," said, "and they're expensive." "What's expensive?" I asked. "Around 3,500," he said. Pounds, of course. Ouch. I called Shawn, and she gave me the number of the guy where Neil gets his hats. I talked to my friend Tessa, and she said she had a guy, but it wasn't a store; it was in the basement of a house."

"I called my friend Louise and asked where Charlie gets his hats. She called me back, said it was by appointment only, but that Charlie talked to the guy and I had an appointment at 11 a.m. the next day. I didn't have the name of the place, but gave the driver the address, and he dropped me off at a house in Chelsea. I wondered if it was the right address, but I was directed down the stairs to find that Hetherington Hats, Tessa's friend, Neil's guy and Charlie's place were all one in the same.

There were hats everywhere. The proprietor, Martin Ellis Jones, agreed with Shawn; it had to be black. He started by putting my head into a machine that reminded me of one of those children's toys where you press your hand into hundreds of thin pegs and see the shape on the other side. This produced a measurement which went into another machine, which was calculated by another machine, and in the end, he produced a hat which he said was the one. I put it on...and it was pure heaven on my head. It was quickly apparent to me that no other hat would do. I asked the price, he told me, and I swallowed hard and agreed to pay it. (If my wife is reading this, I swear it was not the 3,500 pounds listed earlier.)

In a bit of a surreal moment, he then took me on a brief tour of the neighborhood, and had me look into the window of a nearby home, where Andy Warhol's famous portrait series of Chairman Mao hung on the wall. (I looked it up, and Sotheby's sold it for \$722,500. I swear, honey, my hat was less.) Back in the shop, Jones hunted for his credit card machine, couldn't find it, and just told me I could wire him the money when I got back home. He also added that he had a special case for my hat, but had to locate that as well, and that he would engrave it with my initials and I should come back Thursday and get it. He called me Monday, three days early, and told me it was ready. I brought my son Brad with me, as he would need a hat for Ascot the next day. Jones told him he'd need a black hat as well, if he planned to stand in the winner's circle, but Brad wasn't sure he wanted to invest in a hat, and said this might be more of a one-time thing. Jones told him he could borrow one, priced at 6,000 pounds, for no charge. I've never had the experience of agreeing to a price and then having the sweeteners added in...but I feel as if had I stuck around long enough, I would have gone home with the Warhol as well somehow. Suffice to say, if you're ever coming to Ascot, Martin Ellis Jones is your man, and this is the place to get your hat.

She appears on stage with Seth Rudetsky, a popular American host of a daily Broadway show on Sirius/XM Radio. Rudetsky interviews LuPone and accompanies her on the piano, having her sing songs that come up in conversation-- some of which she has sung on Broadway, and others which she literally didn't know the words to. LuPone is game, and a host of professional singers and actors in the audience participate as well. For the Broadway aficionado, it doesn't get better than this.

FLOTILLA TO DROP BACK

Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Thani's **Flotilla (Fr)** (Mizzen Mast) is set to revert to a mile following her disappointing effort in Sunday's G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly. 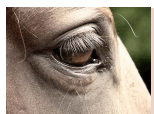

When an unbeaten filly slices two seconds off the race record in winning a Classic, you have to think that she could develop into racing royalty. That, of course, is exactly what the unexposed Treve did in the Prix de Diane two days ago, and a glance at her female line quickly establishes that she has every right to develop into a queen of the turf. Treve's fourth dam Trillion contested the Prix de Diane some 36 years earlier. Like Treve, Trillion arrived at the Chantilly classic unbeaten in two starts and she too ran really well, rallying so bravely that she failed by only a head to pass the faltering Madelia.

Soundness--or the lack of it--quickly proved Madelia's undoing, but Trillion had absolutely no problems in that area. A daughter of Hail To Reason, she inherited plenty of size from this champion sire, to the extent that Timeform described her as "a big, strapping mare." She also inherited plenty of the toughness that had allowed Hail To Reason to make 18 starts as a juvenile. By the time Trillion was retired at the end of her 5-year-old campaign, she had raced 32 times. Although her lack of a turn of foot made her vulnerable at the highest level, she numbered the G1 Prix Ganay among her nine victories and she was runner-up in no fewer than 10 other Group 1 races, once finishing a two-length second of 18 behind Alleged in the Arc.

Bearing in mind that Trillion earned a Timeform rating of 129, her chances of producing something better than herself looked somewhat slim, yet that is exactly what she achieved with her second foal, Triptych. This daughter of Riverman raced 38 times from two to six, mainly at Group 1 level and often against males, whom she first defeated in the Irish 2000 Guineas.

Triptych was seen at her very best as a 5-year-old, when her victories included the Prix Ganay, Coronation Cup, the Matchmaker International at York and the Champion S. at both Phoenix Park and Newmarket. Timeform rated her 133 that year, which put her amongst the greatest distaffers of all time. **cont. p13**

Tragically, Triptych was killed in 1989, before she had produced a foal, and Trillion was also none too fortunate, as she died at 13, after producing only four foals. Fortunately, all four of Trillion's foals were fillies and the three which survived--Trevilla, Barger and Triple Couronne--all have at least one Group 1-winning descendant.

Barger--herself a winner of the G3 Prix Vanteaux--is the second dam of Tawqet, winner of the Caulfield Cup, while Triple Couronne is the second dam of Amorama, twice a Grade I winner on turf at Del Mar. These two were by Riverman, which made them sisters to Triptych, but Trillion's first foal, Trevilla, was by Lyphard.

Trevilla, born in 1981, began her broodmare career with a visit to Vaguely Noble. The resultant filly, Sine Labe, made her mark by producing Tamarisk, a first-rate sprinter who sadly proved to be largely infertile. But the successes of Triptych and Barger soon had Trevilla heading not to Vaguely Noble, but to Riverman, another of Gainesway's European stars. Her first two visits act as a reminder that, if a breeder has faith in a particular mating, he or she should be prepared to persevere. Trevilla's first Riverman filly, Trevillari, failed to fulfil the promise she showed at two and was still without a win after 13 starts spread over three seasons. However, Trevilla's second daughter by Riverman was Treble, winner of the G1 Prix Saint-Alary.

Trevillari made up for her failings on the track by producing nine winners. The best of them was her Anabaa colt Tsigane, who was once beaten less than two lengths when third in the G1 Shoemaker Mile S. It is Tsigane's sister Trevisse--a sprint winner on her 2-year-old debut--who is now the dam of the exciting Treve. Trevisse's Hernando colt Trois Rois also scored at stakes level, over a mile and a quarter. Trevisse's next two foals are Trophee, a 2-year-old colt by Mr. Sidney, and a yearling colt by Fuisse. Mr Sidney and Fuisse are two of the stallions at the Head family's Haras du Quesnay, which also became the home this year of Treve's sire Motivator, who had previously been based at the Royal Studs in England.

It is impossible to review the bottom half of Treve's pedigree without highlighting the involvement of the Head family in several generations of her pedigree. Lyphard, the sire of third dam Trevilla, and Riverman, sire of second dam Trevillari, were both trained by Alec Head, while Treve's broodmare sire Anabaa developed into the champion sprinter of 1996 in the care of Criquelette Head, who trained him for her mother. Criquelette also trained Anabaa's very speedy dam Balbonella, who in turn was by Gay Mecene, another alumnus of the Alec Head yard. Now Mme Head-Maarek is training Treve for Haras du Quesnay. Incidentally, Treve's dam Trevisse is inbred 4x2 to Riverman (and 3x4 to Northern Dancer). Riverman also appears twice (this time 4x3) in the pedigree of another of the Heads' good broodmares, Funny Feeerie, dam of the Grade I winners Full of Gold and Fuisse. That means that Trevisse's Fuisse colt has four lines of Riverman.

Before leaving the topic of Treve's female line, I should point out that Trillion was a sister to Hail Maggie, as well as being a half-sister to Doff The Derby, all three being daughters of Margarethen. Hail Maggie produced the Grade I-winner Sabona and also ranked as the third dam of Landseer, winner of the French 2000 Guineas and Keeneland Turf Mile. Landseer's second dam Flood was a sister-in-blood to Triptych. Doff The Derby's contribution to the family fortunes was even more considerable, as her descendants include the Derby and Irish Derby winner Generous, the dual Classic winner Imagine and the high-class French filly Moonlight Cloud.

The Prix de Diane also paid tribute to the much-missed Montjeu, as Treve is by his son Motivator and the runner-up, the inexperienced Chicquita, is by Montjeu himself. Despite siring fillies of the calibre of Montare, Miss Keller and Sarah Lynx, Montjeu was rightly considered a better sire of colts. Oddly, the reverse seems to be happening with Motivator. In addition to Treve, he has been very ably represented by two other French daughters. Ridasiyna provided him with his first Group 1 success last October, when she proved much too good for those fine fillies Izzi Top and Giofra in the Prix de l'Opera. More recently, his daughter Ferevia has won the G3 Prix Penelope before finishing an excellent third in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary.

Treve is his eighth group winner from his first four crops and six of those eight are fillies. Add in his listed winners and the imbalance between the sexes continues, with 10 fillies, as opposed to two colts and three geldings. I guess that owner-breeders won't object to that sort of record.

The picture could change a little with help from his son Sky Hunter, who suffered the first defeat of his career when an encouraging third to Intello in the Prix du Jockey-Club.

The emergence of Treve, Sky Hunter and Ferevia from the 82 foals in Motivator's fourth crop make it all the more unfortunate that the 2005 Derby winner has suffered a catalogue of problems which have begun to restrict his opportunities.

He went lame in his off-hind while being prepared for the Breeders' Cup Turf and the problems continued when his first season at the Royal Studs was brought to a premature halt after he had slipped in his paddock. Consequently he was unable to cover all of the mares booked to him and his first crop totalled 63 foals, which put him at a numerical disadvantage. He had no such problems in the next two seasons, siring 103 foals in both his second and third crops.

Motivator's next problem came in the autumn of 2009, when he suffered a tendon injury to his left-hind which prevented him covering at all in 2010. Consequently he has no 2-year-olds this year. His injury necessitated a cautious approach to the 2011 season, when he is credited with covering 52 mares for 35 foals. He is listed as having covered only 45 mares in 2012 in his last season in England, even though his fee was down to only £5,000.

I believe that the 2013 season wasn't entirely without its problems, but the French exploits of Treve, Ridasiyna, Ferevia and Sky Hunter suggest strongly that Motivator is now in the right place and very much worthy of perseverance.



BARGAINING WITH THE DEVIL

Near fatal incident reminds us of a formula that can revitalize racing

On June 11, an "incident" unheard of in the annals of Thoroughbred racing history can indirectly serve as a way to introduce a measure that could revitalize horse racing. It happened in what is known in France as "The Event": the daily horserace-lottery called the Quint, (pronounced cantay).

First watch what happened and then we can talk about the concept I am proposing for American racing. No need to understand the French of the race callers. Just look at the images. If you listen carefully you will hear a siren in the background as the horses round the turn. The siren was supposed to be an announcement to the jockeys to STOP THE RACE. But they could not hear it.

The driver of the tractor that should have pulled the starting gate off the track had difficulty with the computer panel (it was a brand new tractor), and was not able to start up the vehicle.

The starting gate remained on the track and this was a two-turn event!

With the gate located just after the turn, the riders could not see it until they were already upon it. No one was right on the track to warn them that a fatal collision could be imminent.



Just before it was too late, one rider, Adrien Fouassier, heard the siren and shouted to the other jockeys. Certainly Fouassier saved them all from a pile-up that would have made Hollywood chase scenes pale in comparison.

Jockey Alain Coutil told the press that they were all lucky. "If the turf had been less yielding and the pace faster, we never would have been able to stop on time."

So what does this have to do with an idea for revitalizing racing in the USA? First of all, this race was being carried live, not only on the cable racing station Equidia, but also on public television. The reason for the live broadcast? It was the Quint, race of the day, mainly an off-track wager that brings extra handle on a daily basis from players who rarely if ever go to a racetrack.

Even though the Nantes race course is a smaller market, there were €9 million (about \$13 million) in the Quint, betting pool that day. Needless to say, all wagers were refunded to the players.

To understand the phenomenon, consider that the *Paris-Turf* publishes a centerfold just for this Quint, race, with vastly expanded past performances that include remarkably candid trainer commentaries, such as, "my horse is not cranked up for this one, and has a better race coming up in two weeks" or "disregard the last race, the mare was in heat."

Since the Quint, functions as a national lottery (you need to pick the first five finishers in order), racing authorities demand transparency in the past performances. Thanks to the Quint, alone, the *Paris-Turf* pps are found at virtually every newsstand, where you will also find a half dozen other past performance publications that specialize in the Quint,.

Back in the USA, finding a *Daily Racing Form* has become more challenging than finding Waldo.

In American racing, the bargain with the devil has produced racinos, where the slot machine area is completely isolated from the racing itself. There is no crossover between the mindless gambling at the slot room that feeds the handle, and the mindful gambling engaged in by horseplayer handicappers a few yards away. There is no relationship between slot machines and horse betting. With the same logic, race tracks could have houses of prostitution on the premises.

On the other hand, the Quint, has created a significant crossover. It's still a lottery wager but allows for the intervention of thoughtful handicapping. I do not play the Quint. Even if it were a five-horse field, there would be 120 different possible combinations for picking the first five finishers in order. With fields of between 14 and 20 horses, the odds against picking the winning combination are breathtaking. Winning combinations often pay more than €200,000, but consolation payoffs are so feeble that there is no way to scratch out a sustainable bet over the long run.

Intelligent handicapping can help you come close from time to time, and that will seduce players to continue trying. As Yankee announcer Mel Allen used to say: "so near and yet so far!"

One of my racing friends and betting partners, Jean, is a smart handicapper who does well enough in other betting pools. By pooling our resources and combining our handicapping, Jean and I have been running a profit for the past year and a half in another wager called the Pick 5, where you do not need the five finishers in order.

Strangely, he continues to play the Quint, at a loss, even with occasional good payoffs for picking the top four finishers in any order. I ask him why he persists in playing the Quint, knowing that he does better in other wagers.

"It's just part of my culture," he says.

The Quint, race is a cultural phenomenon that bridges the gap between lottery bettors and horseplayers. Like the slots at racetracks, it's still a bargain with the devil, but in the end, the Quint, will certainly be more sustainable for the industry, while slot machines at race tracks will eventually and inevitably diminish as casinos arise at non-racetrack venues.

A national racing lottery wager would be good for the USA. But it won't work unless it brings new people into reading past performances, some of whom will eventually cross over into becoming race goers and race players. You'd have a better chance to get such a bet on national TV if it were based on a single race, rather than a pick-4 variety: fewer PPs to study and easier to show on national TV. If they broadcast the lottery on TV, why couldn't they show a single horse race?

I once appeared on National Public Radio and was given a chance to explain to lottery players that they would do better to shift their money into a trifecta at the races, because they could actually make an informed choice based on the logic of the past performances. If racing industry leaders were to engage in a smart public relations campaign, we could certainly convince some of the more mindful lottery players that they would have a better chance with a horse race.

The near fatal incident at the Nantes race course reminds us of how many people had a stake in the Quint, "event" of the day. Many of them were folks who would have otherwise bought a few lottery tickets. Followers of this type of daily event do not need a Zenyatta or a Goldikova to play.

The event is a mere handicap race, unless a major stakes race like the Arc de Triomphe has at least 14 starters.

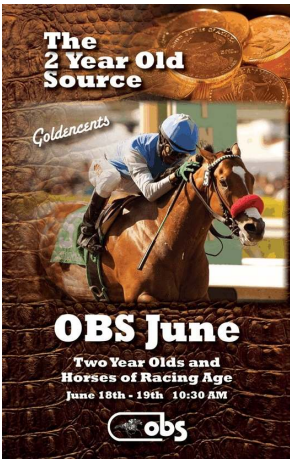
Anyone who hangs out at a French OTB (PMU) can see that there has been a significant extension of Quint, wagering into other races on the race cards of the day.

OBS JUNE SALE BEGINS TODAY

The OBS June Sale of Two-Year-Olds and Horses of Racing Age will begin its first session at 10:30 this morning. A total of 748 horses were catalogued with



hips 1-370 on offer today and hips 371-748 on offer tomorrow. "The 2-year-old season has been very solid," said OBS President Tom Ventura. "We've had impressive results in both of our sales and think there's a good turn-out for this sale as well. We have a very good group of horses and there's a variety of horses, so there are horses in different price ranges that really help this sale, and certainly helped the April sale, in terms of getting a broad base of buyers. Depending on their budget and their taste,

there's usually a horse that fits their criteria." The highly successful OBS April Sale, in which new marks for gross, average and median were set with the topper--a colt by Bernardini out of Rooney's Princess--hammered down to Brushwood Stable for \$900,000, bodes well for the prospect of the June sale. The 2012 rendition was one of the best in recent years with 181 horses sold for a total of \$5,273,800 with an average of \$29,137, up 40.7% from the 2011 sale, and median of \$15,000, up 53.8%.

"There's been a gradual improvement in the quality of horses that are [in the June sale]," explained Ventura. "The consigners have confidence now that the buyers will be here. Some horses are just given the time that they need and are targeted for this sale. The consigners feel that they can bring a top-level horse and be able to sell it for good money."

The two fastest furlong works of the under-tack show belong to [hip 258](#) and [hip 338](#). The former is a 2-year-old Red Giant filly out of GSW Theresa's Tizzy (Cee's Tizzy) consigned by Eisaman Equine.

The half-sibling to GSP Got the Last Laugh (Distorted Humor) worked the distance in [:9 4/5](#). Hip 338, consigned by SAB Sales, is a bay colt out of Elusive Quality. He is the second foal out of unraced mare Agatha (Distorted Humor). He also covered a furlong in [:9 4/5](#).

The three fastest quarter-mile works were posted by hips [335](#), [377](#) and [461](#) who covered the distance in :20 3/5. [Hip 335](#) is a filly by More Than Ready and by African Skyline (Saint Ballado) consigned by Hoppel's Horse & Cattle Co. [Hip 377](#) is a Congrats filly out of the stakes placed Beauty for Ashes (City Place) and consigned by Southern Chase Farm. Consigned by de Meric Sales, [hip 461](#) is an Exclusive Quality colt out of Dash Home (Two Punch).

"The under-tack show was similar to last year," Ventura said. "It was a fair attendance. The one thing about the under-tack shows that has changed over the years is that we're providing this instant information to our buyers in a variety of ways. We stream the under-tack show live and we get the videos edited and up probably within an hour of the time that they breezed. Many of our buyers can't dedicate eight or nine days, or in this case maybe a week, to be away from their operations, so they might have other people here doing some of their homework for them, but they still have access to the information they need before they actually get here. So, we did see some new faces showing up here today."
