### HATS OFF!

**Estimate (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), who was the ultimate 80th birthday present to The Queen from His Highness The Aga Khan, was bred for Royal Ascot's G1 Gold Cup, being a half-sister to her breeder's 1999 hero Enzeli (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}), and she used that regal blood to conjure up her own piece of magic to create another

major landmark for this hallowed meeting yesterday. Having served notice when winning the G3 Queen's Vase here 12 months ago that she could be the one to become the first to garner this old prize for a reigning monarch, the Sir Michael Stoute project kept the dream alive and kicking by taking the

G3 Sagaro S. over a two-mile trip back here last time May 1. Always positioned ideally by Ryan Moore close to the early leaders, the bay struck the front approaching the furlong pole and gamely held off the overseas raiders **Simenon (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) and **Top Trip (GB)** (Dubai Destination) to score by a neck and a length respectively. "This is fantastic--to ride a winner for the Queen here and to do it in the Gold Cup is very special," her rider said. "The beauty of this filly is she relaxes very well and does it for you." **Cont. p3**

### EMOTIONAL WIN FOR LADY CECIL

Sir Henry Cecil's record haul of 75 Royal Ascot winners may never be eclipsed, but that tally will not include **Riposte (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), who provided his widow Lady Jane Cecil with a first winner at the

meeting when bounding to an impressive score on a highly charged day in Berkshire. "First of all, that was for Sir Henry, for Prince Khalid and for all the staff at Warren Place," a tearful Lady Jane Cecil commented. "I don't really have the words to say what I'm feeling right now, but I think people will have a pretty good idea. Sir Henry was adored by so many people and people who had never met

him just loved him. We hardly dared to dream that we'd have a winner, but we thought this was one of the best teams we'd had in a while. He would have been relishing this, as everyone knows how much he loved [Royal] Ascot and for it to be for Prince Khalid is so very special. My family and the Warren Place family have showed complete support and keeping busy is keeping us all going." **Cont. p4**

### JUDGEMENT DAY

Today's G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot is piled with talented fillies, but at the top of the billing are the G1 1000 Guineas first and second **Sky Lantern (Ire)** (Red Clubs {Ire}) and **Just the Judge (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}), and their rematch is one of the highlights of the meeting. Since the former, who had won the G1 Moyglare Stud S. at two, swooped late to master Qatar Racing and the Sangster Family's colorbearer in that May 5 Newmarket Classic, there has been extra spice added to the mix. That came when Just the Judge went to The Curragh three weeks later to go one better in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas, and while connections of both are confident in their fillies' ability, they have been disadvantaged by wide post positions. "It's a shame, but the two Guineas winners are in the same boat, with Just the Judge drawn widest of all and Sky Lantern just one stall better in 16, and, while that makes it tough in such a big field, we will both have to live with it," Richard Hannon said. "Sky Lantern has done so well since Newmarket--she has put on weight and is stronger and, while Just the Judge showed in Ireland that she has improved since our Guineas, the grey filly has also taken another step forward."

**An Inestimable Win...**

When His Highness The Aga Khan presented England's monarch with the result of a mating between Monsun and the dam of his own Gold Cup hero Enzeli, little did he realize the importance of his gesture which has now superceded Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's gift of Carlton House (Street Cry {Ire}). Coming into the Queen's Vase off a Salisbury maiden success last May, Estimate hit the heights with a five-length win before finishing third on two occasions behind Warren Place's high-class Wild Coco (Ger) (Shirocco {Ger}) in the G3 Lillie Langtry S. at Goodwood in August and Doncaster's G2 Park Hill S. the following month. Thoughts of the Gold Cup came into even sharper focus after her fluent comeback success in the Sagaro, and she entered this extreme test with a lot of suitable credentials, other than the vital hard experience that is required. With the 2010 hero Rite of Passage (GB) (Giant's Causeway) missing due to the fast ground, Estimate at least had one less former Gold Cup winner to worry about on her big day, and it was another in that category in **Colour Vision (Fr)** (Rainbow Quest) that she tracked as they followed the pace set by German raider **Earl of Tinsdal (Ger)** (Black Sam Bellamy {Ire}). Colour Vision struck first off the home turn, but the Royal runner was on his case in a flash and, after grinding him down before the furlong pole, then had to contend with Simenon out wide and Top Trip in between. Despite the former's gutsy effort, there was an unstoppable momentum behind the filly as the crowd's wave of support carried her across the line first to create one of those special landmark events in this meeting's continuing saga. "She showed a lot of courage, because she had to beat one and then stave off another," Sir Michael Stoute said. "She switches off so well, but I really felt it was a seriously tough task for her, and I couldn't be confident at all. It is a great honor and a great thrill, as we know how much Her Majesty loves this game." Simenon's trainer Willie Mullins said, "He ran a career-best, so we're very pleased if a little disappointed. I thought 'maybe' at the furlong pole, with Johnny [Murtagh] being in such good form, but the filly had the graded-stakes form. It's probably a fantastic result for racing. I would have loved to have won and will probably never be in this position again, but when the stands erupted from the furlong-marker and people rushed forward to see the winner, it was a fantastic atmosphere." **Chart p4**

Unraced as a juvenile, Riposte, a 3/4-sister to the dam of the mighty Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) was slowly away, yet still shaped with promise when running second at Sandown on debut Apr. 26. She experienced more early problems when easily landing a maiden at her local Newmarket track last time May 17. Without The Lark (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) and Alive Alive Oh (GB) (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) to concern her, as that pair were high-profile withdrawals due to the ground, she was caught dawdling at the break once again here and raced off the pace after recovering from that early blip. Circumnavigating most of her rivals in a rapid manoeuvre rounding the home turn, she seized control in early stretch and, with jockey Tom Queally leaving nothing to chance, was driven out inside the final quarter mile to hit the line accompanied by a mighty roar of approval from the crowd. "It's been a tough, tough week, I know a lot of people are struggling emotionally and this means an awful lot to everybody," said Queally. "It's great that she did it as well as she did, and I'm sure Sir Henry is looking down helping us. I thought her forte would be her stamina, but she showed a turn of foot and quickened up really well. She was slowly away and I wanted to race handy, but she was in front where it mattered."

Missing the kick as he did on debut in a 4 1/2-furlong maiden special weight on Keeneland's Polytrack Apr. 26, he was nevertheless in front after a matter of strides and although he was handed a lead by Ambiance (Ire) (Camacho {GB}) before halfway, was back in front inside the final furlong.

## STYLE VENDÔME

C.10 Anabaa x Place Vendôme



Bred by Guy Pariente (Haras de Colleville) who sold him to Nicolas Clément for €92,000 at the 2011 August Yearling Sale, this Classic winning colt comes from the last crop of the influential Anabaa and is out of a Listed placed daughter of Dr Fong. With a race record now boasting five wins, this magnificent grey colt was already making headlines at the age of two, ending the year with a highly promising Listed win at Deauville. This year, he has blown away the racing industry, first of all when romping home in the Prix Djebel (Gr.3) then when winning the Poule d'Essai des Poulains (Gr.1) with a majestic performance against seventeen rivals including Intello and Olympic Glory.

## OCOVANGO

C.10 – Monsun x Crystal Maze



This son of Monsun bought by BBA Ireland for €180,000 from Watership Down in August 2011 caught the eye from his very first start as a two-year-old at Saint-Cloud. The André Fabre-trained colt continued in the same vein on the very same course winning the Prix François Mathet (L.) on his reappearance followed by the Prix Greffulhe (Gr.2). Deemed good enough to take on the best of the English in the Epsom Derby (Gr.1), Prince Faisal's colt finished fifth, less than a length away from the third placed horse, having been unlucky in the straight.

## TORONADO

C.10 – High Chaparral x Wana Doo



In August 2011, this son of High Chaparral bred by Paul Nataf and consigned by the Haras d'Omméel, appealed to Amanda Skiffington who went to €55,000 for him. Even as a two year old, he was already impressing onlookers with his class and good looks, winning three times including the Champagne Stakes (Gr.2) at Doncaster. He was faultless on his seasonal reappearance at Newmarket in the colours of Sheikh Joaan Al Thani, where he was in a different league to the other runners in the Craven Stakes (Gr.3) before finishing fourth in the 2000 Guineas (Gr.1). In the St James's Palace St. (Gr.1) at Royal Ascot, he ran a cracking race to finish 2nd, only beaten a nose by the extraordinary Dawn Approach.

## CHICQUITA

F.10 - Montjeu x Prudenzia



Chicquita, a daughter of the Listed winner Prudenzia bred by Ecurie des Monceaux and Skymarc Farm, was the object of everyone's attention in August 2011, none more so than the Australian Paul Makin who, represented by Badgers Bloodstock, went to €600,000 to secure the filly. In the Prix de Diane (Gr.1), this talented filly trained by Alain de Royer Dupré put in an exceptional performance, coming from last place to snatch second place from dual Group 1 winner Silasol.

## MORANDI

C.10 – Holy Roman Emperor x Vezina



In August 2011 Jean-Claude Rouget paid €65,000 in order to get his hands on this powerful colt sold by the Haras des Capucines. Aged two and in the colours of Daniel-Yves Trèves, the grey colt had an exceptional season, the highlights of which were a 12 length victory in the Prix de Condé (Gr.3) and a 7 length victory in the Critérium de Saint-Cloud (Gr.1) making him the best two year old in France in order of prizemoney. This year, he showed he had lost none of his ability when finishing an excellent second to the untouchable Intello in the Prix du Jockey Club (Gr.1).

## FLOTILLA

F.10 – Mizzen Mast x Louvain



A daughter of Mizzen Mast and the Miesque Stakes (Gr.3) winner Louvain, this filly bred by the Haras des Capucines was bought by the Justin Bahen - Hubie de Burgh tandem for €120,000 in August 2011. At the end of her two year old year, the young filly belonging to Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Thani and in the care of Mikel Delzangles had her crowning moment on American soil when winning the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (Gr.1) in fantastic style. This year she was a most eye-catching winner of the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (Gr.1) on her seasonal debut against the unbeaten Esotérique, breaking the track record in the process.

"This feels good," Joel Rosario simply stated. "He stayed in the gate, was a little bit quick to take the lead, but he's a good horse." Ward added, "That's what we expected. The one little issue he has had is that he sits in the stalls and gets relaxed and breaks slow, but he

came through for us. We put a lot of time and effort into it. My staff at home work very hard from when we break them in in October and November and never miss a day. They train in Florida and then go to a beautiful place called

Palm Meadows to continue their education before going on to Keeneland. Everybody there has been so gracious in keeping the turf pristine after the meet is over for us to breeze on. They did us a huge favor and I want to thank Keeneland very much. It sure is fun and I'll keep coming as long as we keep getting in the winner's enclosure." ### A PICNIC IN THE CAR PARK

I am sure that after being told just how truly elegantly one dresses for Royal Ascot, you are completely baffled as to quite how a picnic fits into the grand scheme of things. The thought of a picnic just does not compute when one thinks of racing on such a royal scale. On top of that, it takes place in a car park. Not in a marquee, or

under beautifully appointed canopies on an emerald green lawn; no it is most definitely in a car park.

To be precise, this particular picnic takes place in car park one, yet car park one is no ordinary car park. Situated at the end of the straight, it finds itself sandwiched between the last of the grandstand buildings and the forest where the course turns to drop down into Swinley Bottom. Here you find precisely measured and appointed parking spots, each denoted with an elegant marker, corresponding with the number on your car park pass. And do not even attempt to try to park in the wrong one, as there are almost more parking attendants than there are cars in the hallowed confines of car park one.

You see, car park one is for Royal Enclosure members only, and in order to acquire one of those precious spots, you must submit your name to the Club, where it is duly added to a waiting list. Spots do become available from time to time, usually through a sad occasion such as the death of the previous occupant. And, waiting around 18 years or more for a spot is not

unusual! While waiting, one could always borrow a spot for a day or two from friends, but your own is simply so much better. The most coveted spots are close to the rail, where one can leisurely watch the racing or engage in a spot of people watching, as elegantly dressed couples cross the

track from the infield car park. So, once you finally acquire that magical spot, what do you do with it? You plan a daily picnic, of course. Picnics in car park one are proper picnics. No baskets with ham sandwiches or flasks with coffee here. The cars range from the 4x4 variety to stretch limousines, all with very big trunks. Out come the picnic tables elegantly covered with spotless damask. Next, crystal champagne glasses are polished and neatly placed, before tray upon tray of incredible delicacies is unveiled. Proper linen napkins are the order of the day, but if you do have to slum it and make do with paper ones, it is best that they sport the British flag.

A brass band wanders through the car park, playing lively tunes, and champagne flows liberally as guests settle down to lunch. Many have arrived by helicopter, popping in for a bite to eat before going off to watch the first. A loud cheer going up and the sounds of God Save The Queen signals that the Royal Procession is making its way down the straight. Time to start packing up before heading to the Royal Enclosure for a leisurely afternoon of racing.

Just before the car park completely empties, the carriages of the Royal Procession, having delivered their passengers safely, make their way down the turf, before turning in and proceeding through the car park. Picnic goers are afforded a rare chance to photograph the horses up close and personal or chat to the postillions, while the covers go up on the carriages.

The car park is, however, not empty for long. With the horses in the last safely back in their stables, it is time to head back to car park one. With the day's racing and betting done, the party proper swings into top gear. The pre-race picnic goers have tripled in number and the day's racing, bets won or lost, are animatedly discussed over a glass of champagne or whiskey, preferably with a fine cigar in hand. Finally, the last car slowly bumps across the uneven ground just before 9 p.m., and the gates are closed. But not for long, as tomorrow is another day's racing and another day for that peculiar, but glorious British activity, the picnic in the car park.

“There is much speculation as to how these fillies will handle the bend, but Sky Lantern went around the sharp American turns okay in the Breeders’ Cup, so we have no real worries on that score,” Richard Hannon continued. “Hughesie will have to drop her out from that draw and just hope he gets the breaks.” Just the Judge’s trainer Charlie Hills said, “This is our big day. There’s a lot of speculation about the rematch with Sky Lantern, and we are looking forward to what should be a great spectacle. She’s continued to be in great form at home since her win in Ireland, and Jamie Spencer was very pleased when he rode her on Saturday morning.” Khalid Abdullah has a pair of live contenders in the mix in the Sir Michael Stoute-trained supplementary entry **Pavlosk** (Arch) and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Big Break (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) from Dermot Weld’s stable. The former dominated the Listed Michael Seely Memorial S. over this trip at York last time May 17,

while last year’s G3 Killavullan S. scorer Big Break was a creditable fourth in the Irish Guineas on her seasonal bow. “This is turning out to be too good a race I fear, but Pavlosk won really well at York when stepping up on only her second start. Ryan [Moore]

was impressed and she has pleased in her work since,” the owner-breeder’s Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe said. “Big Break was not too far behind in the Irish Guineas from a bad draw, and there was a bit of bumping and boring there. She wouldn’t have won, but we were very pleased with that as a first effort.” Adding more overseas flair is ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Siyenica (Fr)** (Azamour {Ire}), and the fact that Alain de Royer-Dupre has committed her to such a test speaks volumes about the regard in which His Highness The Aga Khan’s homebred is held. She failed to follow up on the promise of her debut win in a mile conditions event at Longchamp Apr. 22 when fading to seventh in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary at the same track last time May 26, but drops back in trip. “She is a nice filly and needs to have a strong pace, which is why we are coming here for this race,” her trainer told *PA Sport*. “She is an improving type, but she didn’t like the way the Prix Saint-Alary was run. She was in front and she pulled too hard and could not run her race. She goes on any ground.” Trainer Eddie Lynam has already won at the meeting with Sole Power (Ire) (Kyllachy {GB}) in the G1 King’s Stand S., and while the fast ground was up his street, his Coronation representative **Viztoria (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) wants rain. “She relishes soft ground, but Ascot has a great cover of grass and a climb up the hill home,” her conditioner said of the May 6 G3 Athasi S. scorer. “She’s better than I’ve ever had her by some way and her rating suggests she’s good enough to be competitive. She is potentially the best I’ve trained, but she needs to do it on the track.”

**WHO WOULD BE KING?**

For those who failed to make the headlines on Derby day, today’s G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot offers a gilt-edged opportunity to shine, and Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier’s **Battle of Marengo (Ire)** (Gaileo {Ire}) is poised to take advantage. Beaten just 1 1/2 lengths by stable companion Ruler of the World (Ire) (Gaileo {Ire}) when fourth at Epsom 20 days ago, the consistent performer carries a penalty as a result of his successes in the G2 Beresford S. at The Curragh in September, and in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown May 12. “We were very happy with him going to Epsom and it just got a little bit messed up in the middle of the race,” Aidan O’Brien said. “Joseph would ideally have liked to have started his momentum from the middle of the race, but [Dawn Approach] was a bit keen and arrived there earlier than Joseph would have expected, and so he had to make a little move more suddenly than he would have preferred. He ran a big race and was only beaten a couple of lengths, but for some reason, horses coming back from the Derby don’t have a good record at Ascot. I think that may be because the ground at Epsom used to be a little bit harder than it is now, but Andrew Cooper and all his team do a wonderful job on the ground, and horses come out of the race very well now. We’re hoping that’s the case and Battle of Marengo seems to be well, but the Derby is the Derby and there is nowhere to hide. You often think horses don’t have hard races until you run them again and it can be a different story.” In what looks a below-standard renewal full of exposed runners, Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum’s unbeaten **Mutashaded** (Raven’s Pass) still carries potential, and looked in need of this trip when surging clear at the end of a 10-furlong handicap at Sandown May 23. Trainer Roger Varian said, “Mutashaded lacks experience, but he has done nothing wrong. He has always worked like a nice horse and I am quite confident that he’ll get the trip. It’s a big step up in grade, but I hope he can run well.” **Field p10**

**HONORING THE LEGEND**

It is testament to Sir Henry Cecil's enduring legacy that Ascot rushed to place his name on today's G3 Queen's Vase, in which he holds the record of eight successes, and a ninth for Lady Cecil courtesy of **Disclaimer (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) would be another landmark moment in this meeting's rich history. Brought along with the kind of understanding and insight that characterized his great trainer's career, the highly regarded Juddmonte homebred has been a revelation since being gelded after taking six starts to break his maiden. Signing off with that breakthrough over nine furlongs at Redcar in October, he returned after the operation to win handicaps over 10 and 11 furlongs at Doncaster and Kempton Apr. 26 and May 6 before upstaging Contributer (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in Goodwood's Listed Cockeyed Hat S. over the latter trip May 24. "Only very few 3-year-olds truly stay two miles in June, so only time will tell whether he will or not," Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "He won a two-horse race at Goodwood in nice style, beating quite a nice horse. Henry pinpointed this race for him early in the year and we'll see what happens." Sir Henry Cecil's record of 75 Royal Ascot winners is under threat from Aidan O'Brien, who already sits on 40 after saddling three more so far this week. Perhaps the biggest threat to Disclaimer's bid to honor his trainer with a heart-warming success is Ballydoyle's **Leading Light (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who carries a penalty for his win in The Curragh's G3 Gallinule S. over 10 furlongs May 26. Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's colt enjoys forcing tactics, and would arguably have been a Derby contender in any other stable. "His two runs this year have been over a mile and a quarter, but he's a relaxed horse who doesn't mind going off in front and gets very lazy. This was just another option open to him, rather than running two of them in the King Edward VII. He might relax and get the two miles, even though he probably doesn't need it. He only has a small penalty for winning his group race and he'll be an exciting one to see what does happen."

Khalid Abdullah's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Joyeuse (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), a half-sister to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), has inexperience to overcome, but she looked exciting when scoring by 3 1/4 lengths in a six-furlong maiden at Lingfield May 28, and it is significant that Sir Henry Cecil was keen to run her at a meeting that he did not usually take his 2-year-olds to. "She's a little bit flighty and has a tendency to take a little bit of a keen hold," jockey Tom Queally explained. "She's just a bit high-spirited, so the hood helps to calm her and keep her relaxed. That's just her way, but she's settling all the time and this looks a nice opportunity to go on from her maiden and run a big race and, who knows, she might even win. She drew nicely clear at Lingfield and the form is holding up a little bit. I think she's on the up and she would be a very fitting winner. We all miss Henry terribly, so it would be a bittersweet moment, but all of the team have been pulling very hard together and making the best of it. It would be well deserved for everyone on the team." The owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe is aware of the tide of well being surrounding the filly. "The problem for her is, because of all of her connections, there is huge expectation on her," he told *PA Sport* yesterday. "Luckily, she doesn't realize it. We're looking forward to running her and we'll just have to see how she gets on. The ground at Lingfield was fine for her, but if the ground is fast tomorrow, I'm sure she'll be fine. If we get a thunderstorm and it absolutely pours down, who knows how she'll handle the ground, but I doubt the straight course will get too testing." Aidan O'Brien saddles Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's **Wonderfully (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), a full-sister to Tuesday's G1 St James's Palace S. third Mars (Ire), who scored on debut in a six-furlong maiden at Fairyhouse June 5 that has already thrown up two winners. In a race packed with potential, it is impossible to ignore the Richard Hannon-trained **Midnite Angel (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}), who scored by seven lengths over five furlongs at Windsor when last seen May 20. ## BEAUTY PARLOUR RETIRED

Wildenstein Stables Ltd's **"TDN Rising Star"**  **Beauty Parlour (GB)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}--Bastet {Ire}, by Giant's Causeway), who annexed last term's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp, has been retired. The homebred bay also ran second for conditioner Elie Lellouche in the G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly, but failed to sparkle in two runs for Sir Henry Cecil once transferred to Warren Place stables last summer. Unbeaten in four starts before her Chantilly reverse, Beauty Parlour finished off the board in the Sept. 29 G1 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket and the May 26 G1 Prix d'Ispahan back at Longchamp in her final start. "Beauty Parlour was undoubtedly a high-class filly," commented Lady Cecil. "Her work on the gallops in Newmarket was very impressive at times and it was a shame that she was unable to quite reproduce that on her two starts for Warren Place. We wish her well when she starts her new career as a broodmare." The 4-year-old retires with a career record of 7-4-1-0, and earnings of £463,108.

## DOGWOOD & ECLIPSE OFFICIALLY MERGE

"Cot Campbell, his brand, staff and family are pure class and to be provided the opportunity to live up to the high standard he has set is a responsibility I do not take lightly," Wellman said. "We have come to know many of the Dogwood faithful and we're keen to welcome them into the Eclipse family. It is an honor to be handpicked by Cot to carry on his esteemed legacy. This is the ultimate endorsement."

I'm good friends with [fellow jockey] James Doyle, and when they ride winners, you want to ride winners, too. It's great for Mr Channon and the team at East Ilsley." Channon added, "His form is solid and we thought that he had a decent chance. He's a smashing little horse and things just haven't gone right for him. He should have won a couple of runs ago, then we ran in a trial on desperate ground. 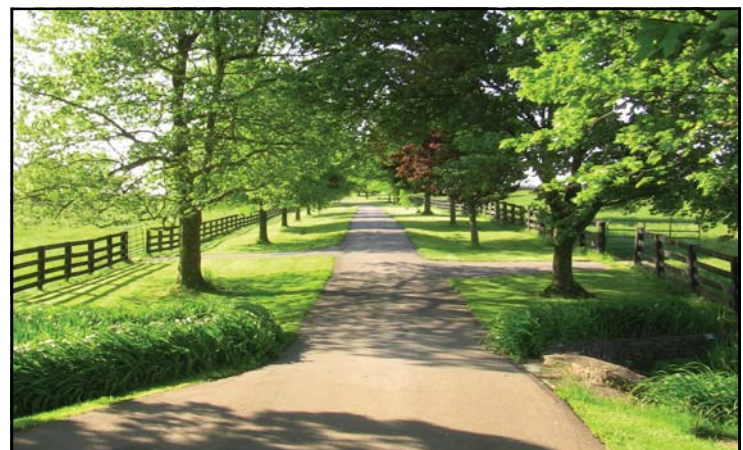
