Woodbine as he romped by 9 1/4 lengths, covering the 1 1/4 miles of Polytrack in 2:01.51 to set a new track record. He bested the previous record, set by Strait of Dover (English Channel) in last year's Queen's Plate S., by .48 seconds. Backed as the 6-5

favorite, Delegation jumped in at the start and was a bit rough to handle for jockey Luis Contreras, but settled nicely at the front shortly thereafter. He easily maintained a narrow advantage through the opening furlongs, setting tepid fractions of :24.51, :48.63 and 1:13.34, and began to inch clear leaving the backstretch. Widening through the home turn, the bay shifted into another gear and quickly opened up on the rest of the field. Peeking under his arm and seeing no competition in sight, Contreras rode Delegation to the wire in hand. "I had an unbelievable trip," the pilot commented. "I could feel the power underneath [me]. It's great to ride horses like this." Conditioner Mark Casse added, "When this horse is on his game, he's probably as good a horse as I've ever trained. He has an unbelievable stride. To go a mile and a quarter and to keep running the way he did just shows truly how good he is. When he's on his game he can probably run with any horse in North America." **Cont. p3**

Frankie Dettori will ride for Sheikh Joaan Al Thani after a retainer was signed at Chantilly on Sunday. One of the emerging forces on the international stage, the brother of the Emir of Qatar who has flaunted his considerable spending power in recent months, snapped up the services of the ex-Godolphin jockey "Al Shaqab Racing owned by H.E Sheikh Joaan Bin Hamad Al Thani are pleased to officially announce that Frankie Dettori will be the resident jockey," read a statement. Dettori told the *Racing Post* yesterday, "Sheikh Joaan is now a big player in

racing. He is keen to expand and I can see the passion and love for racing that he has got. He is the sort of person you want to work with, so I'm delighted to be with him." Not among the rides Dettori will enjoy will be on Toronado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}), who was second in the G1 St James's Palace S. and will continue to be partnered by Richard Hughes, as will all other Richard Hannon-trained horses owned by Sheikh Joaan. The owner's representative Sian Jones told the trade daily, "Richard [Hughes] will also stay in our first colours for all Richard Hannon's horses, but we have horses all over France with different trainers and in England with Marco Botti, Sir Michael Stoute and Lady Cecil, so there are plenty of good horses for Frankie."

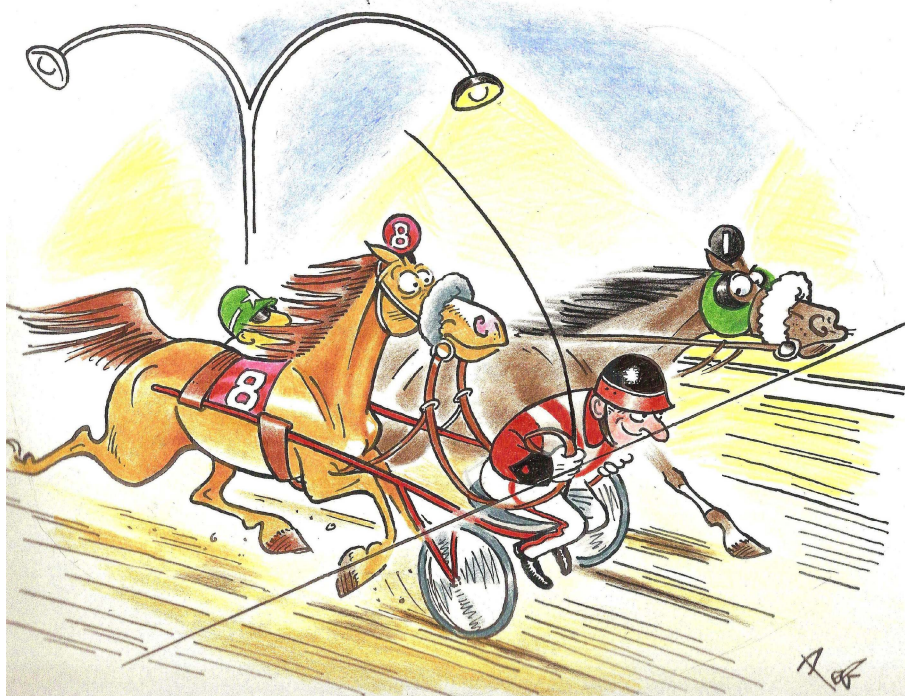

Camelot Features among Eclipse Eight (Cont. from p1)

Despite the prospect of a small field, there is no shortage of quality with the first, second and third in that Royal Ascot contest--**Al Kazeem (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), **Mukhadram (GB)** (Shamardal) and **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB})--set to re-oppose. From Germany is Stall Antanando's Apr. 28 G1 Prix Ganay winner **Pastorius (Ger)** (Soldier Hollow {GB}) and the track's Director of Racing Andrew Cooper is relishing the prospect of an intriguing race. "It's going to be interesting to see what Aidan [O'Brien] runs and we'll have to wait and see, although there seems to be a bit of momentum gathering behind his 3-year-old [Mars]," he told *PA Sport* yesterday. "Talking to connections of Pastorius, I think they are very keen to come across from Germany and give it a shot, so hopefully we'll get at least six or seven runners on the day." Cooper gave the going as 'good, good-to-firm in places' yesterday with an ideal weather forecast in the lead-up set to make his life easier. "The fact is that since we last raced on June 15, there has been hardly any rain at all and we have been watering on and off since then. There is the possibility of 1-2 mm of rain tomorrow, but after that there's nothing showing up at all in most forecasts--no sign of any storms. Not only that, but it is due to get quite warm by the end of the week too, so we don't have much option but to apply some irrigation, but we'll review the system on a day-to-day basis. The instruction is to try and produce going no quicker than good to firm and that will be the aim--but if it's good-to-firm on the day that's no problem, nor should it be at this stage of the year. It will just be proper summer ground."

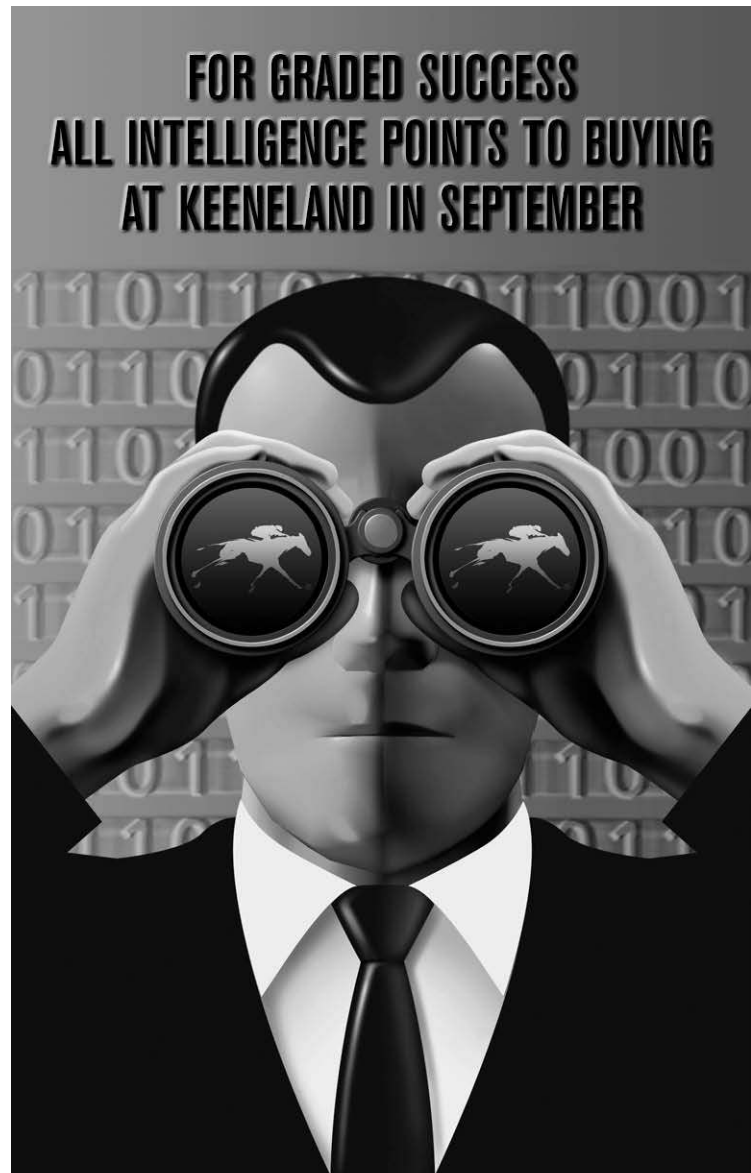

[Gambling footprint expanding in Florida under Gov. Rick Scott](#)

*Days after a judge ruled last month that the barrel races held at a fledgling North Florida racino were not a legitimate parimutuel sport, state regulators crafted a license, the first of its kind, to allow "flag-drop" races to replace them. In the past two years, the same regulators have allowed slot machine operators to run electronic roulette and craps games in Miami-Dade and Broward counties, allowed a dormant jai alai permit to be used to expand the number of slot machines at Magic City Casino, and allowed Tampa Bay Downs and Gulfstream racetrack in Hallandale Beach to run a one-time race in June so they could offer thoroughbred races via simulcast year-round. **Mary Ellen Klas, Miami Herald***

Superplex had the subsequent G3 Prix de Guiche winner Dalwari (More Than Ready) back in third when winning a conditions event over an extended nine-furlong trip at Longchamp on his sophomore bow Apr. 18 and was only three lengths behind Ocovango (GB) (Monsun {Ger}) in Saint-Cloud's G2 Prix Greffulhe when fourth in that May 4 Derby trial. Fading to 11th under a positive ride in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club over 1 5/16 miles at Chantilly last time June 2, the bay was the latest to underline the strength of that Classic when annexing his first black-type event here. Starting slowly and held up in rear early, he was forced to make his move wide out, but had the measure of Pilote inside the final 50 meters and finished off strongly to assert his superiority.

'ZAPATA' FIRES BULLET

The Ronald Pellegrini-trained **Angelica Zapata** (Sharp Humor) fired a five-panel bullet in 1:01.80 at Calder Saturday in her final tune-up before a possible start in this Saturday's GI Princess Rooney S. She is entered for both the six-furlong Princess Rooney and the 7 1/2 furlong \$100,000 Hollywood Wildcat S. on the undercard. "I thought she worked really good," Pellegrini commented. "I told [rider] Juan [Leyva] to just go about 1:02. The track might be a little on the fast side because she went a little faster than that. I was very pleased. She has natural speed." The Herman Van Den Broeck colorbearer tied together a four-race string of stakes and handicap wins at Calder last year, but began this season with a fourth-place effort cutting back to six furlongs in the U Can Do It S. June 8. "We're probably going to run in the Hollywood Wildcat," said Pellegrini. "She can run on the turf and if they take it off and it goes to the dirt, a mile on the dirt she would like, too," Pellegrini said. "I'm just afraid the track being so fast favoring speed that she wouldn't be able to catch up."

Stanley Gold Works Three for Smile Sprint...

Conditioner Stanley Gold sent out his trio of **Fort Loudon** (Awesome of Course), **Jackson Bend** (Hear No Evil) and **Grand Shores** (Black Mambo) Saturday for their final works in preparation for starts in this weekend's GI Smile Sprint H. at Calder. Fort Loudon, winner of the GIII Gulfstream Park Sprint Championship S. in February, finished sixth last out in the GI Metropolitan H. at Belmont Park under the care of trainer Nick Zito May 27. The bay worked four furlongs in :48.60 (8/80). "He's a horse that you have to push to work," Gold said. "He would like to not do anything if he didn't have to, but when you ask him there's plenty there. He's responsive, but he's the kind of horse that you could go around there in three minutes if you wanted to. He did what we needed him to do and that's why I sent him out at 7:30 when it was more crowded and there was more for him to see what was going on."

MGISW winner Jackson Bend worked the second-fastest time of the morning over the four-furlong distance, stopping the clock in :47.80. After finishing seventh in last summer's Forego S. at Saratoga Sept. 1, his connections had initially planned on sending him to stud.

However, he was put back in training shortly thereafter. Jackson Bend was fifth in the Ponche H. here in his only start of the season. "This is his normal thing," Gold said of the breeze. "He was pretty quick. He went :47 and change and he came back full of himself. He was happy to take off, go fast, and come home and bounce around the shedrow."

Grand Shores, a half-sibling to Jackson Bend, was the third fastest at the distance, clocking in at :48.00. "The work that I liked the best was Grande Shores, because by the time he went out it was almost a quarter to nine and the track is probably at its slowest," Gold explained. "He is by himself, the track is empty, the track is slow and he's still cooking right along."

The later, who took Gulfstream's Sunshine State S. in December, enters off a fourth-place effort in the Ponche H. "I thought they would be good company for each other, and it worked out perfect. Both of them got something out of it and didn't overexert themselves," Fawkes said. "They went :48 and change and galloped out in 1:01 and change; I thought it was a perfect breeze."

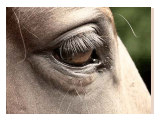

During Fidel Castro's long time in power, excellence in the field of sport was considered the perfect way to advertise the virtues of Cuba's austere Communist

regime. There were probably no better advertisements than a couple of Olympic gold medalists in the 1970s. One, the long-striding Alberto Juantorena, became something of a legend by winning both the

400 metres and 800 metres at Montreal in 1976. However, the poster-boy for Cuban sport was undoubtedly Teofilo Stevenson, the hard-hitting boxer who became one of the all-time greats of Olympic boxing by taking the heavyweight gold at Munich, Montreal and Moscow.

The big, handsome boxer provided the inspiration for the naming of a big, handsome Galileo colt who also developed into a champion for his breeder and trainer Jim Bolger. The equine Teofilo earned his place at stud after an unbeaten juvenile campaign and now quite a few of his progeny bear names which link, one way or another, to his human namesake.

His son Havana Gold, winner of the G1 Prix Jean Prat two days ago, is one of several with names which reference the Cuban capital. And the colt who initiated a tremendous Group 1 double for the Kildangan Stud stallion by taking Saturday's G1 Irish Derby is Trading Leather, whose name reflects the leather gloves used when fighters trade punches. Other Teofilos with boxing names include such as Heavy Weight, Light Heavy, Stevenson, Frazier, Punch Bag, Queensberry Rules and Ring Craft.

Light Heavy, a member of Teofilo's first crop, was third in last year's Irish Derby, so the Galileo stallion is making quite an impact on the Curragh classic.

Teofilo now has four Group 1-winning sons to his credit from his first two crops and Darley is in the very fortunate position of having two champion sons of Galileo--the other being New Approach--which have wasted no time in establishing their ability to sire Classic performers. New Approach, of course, has the Classic winners Dawn Approach and Talent in his first crop.

It is going to be fascinating to watch the progress of Galileo's other stallion sons. Recently we saw the second stakes winner from the comparatively small first crop by Galileo's St Leger winner Sixties Icon, plus the first winner by Galileo's son Soldier of Fortune, another Irish Derby winner bred by Bolger.

Next in line is the very talented Rip Van Winkle, whose eldest progeny are now yearlings. Then come the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Roderic O'Connor, whose first foals were born this year. Based at Ballyhane, the stud currently doing well with the first-crop sire Dandy Man, Roderic O'Connor represents the same Galileo-Danehill cross as Teofilo. It almost goes without saying that the incomparable Frankel is another representative of this cross. There is also the admirable Nathaniel to look forward to, so Galileo's reputation as a tremendously promising sire of sires looks set to grow and grow.

We mustn't forget that Kentucky breeders now also have two sons of Galileo available to them in Cape Blanco and Midas Touch, a pair who fought out a close finish to the 2010 Irish Derby.

To get back to Teofilo, his double at the weekend highlights his versatility, with Havana Gold scoring over a mile and Trading Leather over a mile and a half. This reflects the fact that Teofilo's own pedigree represents a combination of stamina, through his sire Galileo, and an element of speed, via his dam Speirbhean, a talented miler by the Group 1-winning sprinter Danehill.

It is my belief, though, that Teofilo is always going to sire more good performers over a mile and a quarter or more than at shorter distances, unless breeders suddenly start sending him many more mares as fast as Havana Gold's dam, the five-furlong Group 3 winner Jessica's Dream. **cont. p9**

Havana Gold is inbred 4x4 to the great Danzig through Danehill and Green Desert, two Group 1 winners over six furlongs by the legendary Claiborne stallion. But Amira's Prince, the Teofilo colt who was in such good form in America early this year, is inbred 4x3 to Danzig via the same stallions and he stays quite well, as he showed in taking the GII Mac Diarmida S. over 1 3/8 miles.

Amira's Prince is one of 10 stakes winners among the 116 foals in Teofilo's first crop, which also includes Parish Hall (G1 Dewhurst S.), Light Heavy (G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial) and Remember Alexander (G3 Tyros S.). His larger second crop--136 foals--promises to do even better, as it has already produced Trading Leather, Havana Gold and a third Group 1 winner in Loch Garman (Criterium International). Incidentally, six of Teofilo's seven group winners are colts, but he has several listed-winning and group-placed daughters, so this imbalance is likely to change.

In winning the Irish Derby, Trading Leather could be said to have fulfilled his destiny, as his grandsires, Galileo and Sinndar, were also successful in this Classic, scoring in 2001 and 2000, respectively.

Trading Leather's dam Night Visit was bred by Gainsborough Stud Management, but was sold as a 2-year-old and never raced. Her dam Moonlight Sail, a winner at two in France, was a sister to Maktoum Al Maktoum's outstanding racemare Hatoof. This daughter of Irish River won the G1 1000 Guineas and Champion S., plus the GI Beverly D. S. in the U.S., where she was second in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Moonlight Sail's brother Irish Prize was another who shone in the U.S., where his best victory came in the GI Shoemaker Mile.

Trading Leather's third dam, the Lyphard mare Cadeaux d'Amie, cost \$925,000 as a yearling. She won at up to a mile and a quarter and was a half-sister to the wonderfully versatile Mrs Penny, whose victories included the Cheveley Park S., Prix de Diane and Prix Vermeille. Cadeaux d'Amie's listed-winning daughter Insijaam visited Sinndar to produce the Oaks third Pictavia, who is a three-parts-sister to Trading Leather's dam.

Incidentally, the good-moving Trading Leather is yet another reminder of how much full siblings can vary. His year-older brother Night Invader showed little ability in three starts.

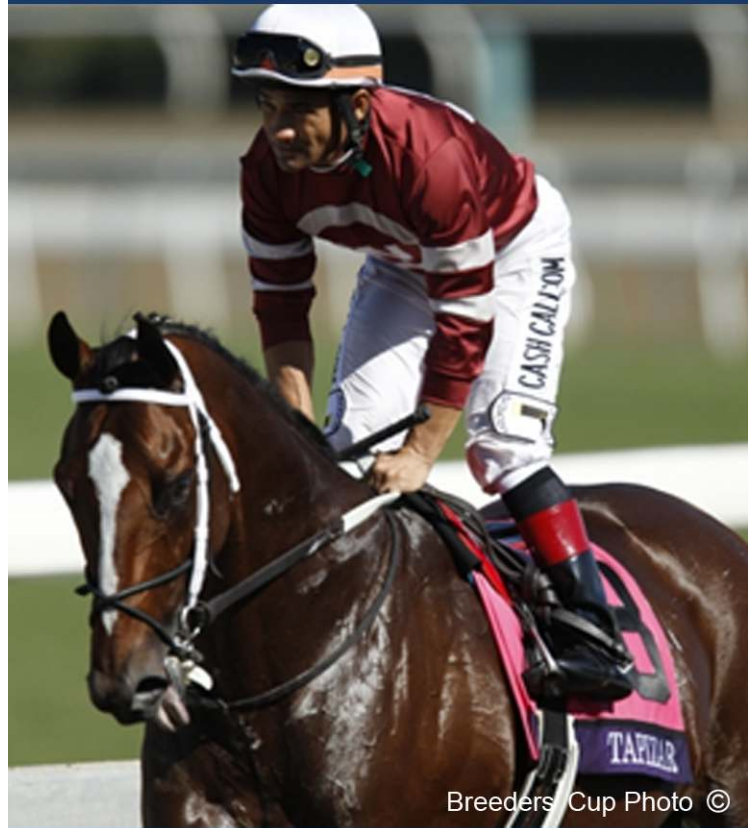

SAGAMORE FILLY TOPS MHBA YEARLING SHOW

A filly bred and owned by Kevin Plank's Sagamore Farm was named grand champion of the 79th annual Maryland Horse Breeders Association's Maryland-bred yearling show held at the Timonium Fairgrounds horse show ring in Timonium June 30.
