'LEMONADE' ENDS DROUGHT

Caroline Forgason's **Somali Lemonade** (Lemon Drop Kid), a winner of her first two races as a juvenile, including Keeneland's GIII JP Morgan Chase Jessamine S., ended a 10-race losing streak in Tuesday's GIII Dr. James Penny Memorial H. at Parx. Placed in a tracking third as favored **Pianist** (More Than Ready) led through a half mile in :51.10 over the soggy going, Somali Lemonade made a three-wide bid at the top of the lane, hit the front in midstretch, and outbattled **Miz Ida** (Proud Citizen) for a hard-fought decision. Somali Lemonade, second, beaten only a head, in the 2012 GI Garden City S., concluded her sophomore campaign with a seventh-place finish in Churchill's GII Mrs. Revere S. Nov. 17. She made only one prior start this term, a fourth-place finish in a \$62,500 optional claimer at Belmont Park June 2.

FASIG HRA CATALOGUE NOW ONLINE

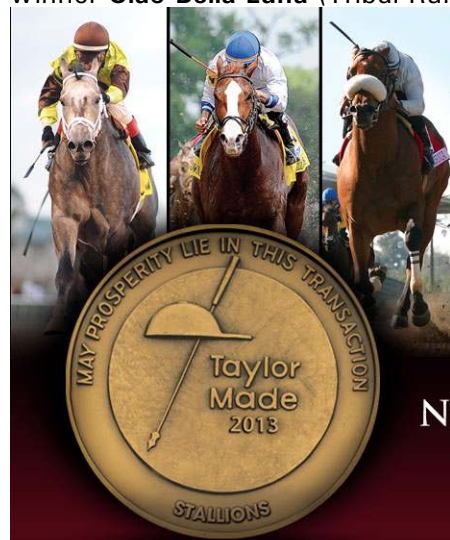

SUGAR BOY JOINS MARCO BOTTI

Sugar Boy (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}), who disappointed when last in Saturday’s G1 Irish Derby, will be sent to Marco Botti to train in Newmarket, the *Racing Post* revealed yesterday. Purchased before the Curragh Classic by Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum, the Apr. 26 G3 Sandown Classic Trial winner came back to Patrick Prendergast’s yard jarred up due to the fast ground prevalent at the track. “He was a little disappointing in the Irish Derby,” Botti told the trade daily. “According to the trainer and the jockey, the ground was too quick and he didn’t let himself down. Whatever the reason, he is a nice horse. Previous to the Irish Derby, the form was solid. At Sandown, he beat Galileo Rock (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who was second in the Irish Derby. He is very exciting and we’re pleased to have him in the yard. He was a little bit jarred up after the race, but nothing serious. I’m not sure whether he’ll come to us this week or not. Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa has horses with me and this is an exciting one for the future.”

THE ARTS SCENE (Continued)

A picnic at Royal Ascot is the equivalent of tailgating at an American football game, with a few significant differences--it's a lot less casual, considering people coming and going from Ascot picnics are heading for the Royal Enclosure, so the prevailing dress is top hat and tails, and so on (*to read Liesl King's story about Ascot picnics from Friday, June 21, [click here](#)*). Another significant difference is that you don't see portable charcoal and gas grills in the parking lots.

Though Liesl's story was written about the picnics in Car Park 1, my own Ascot tailgating experience invariably consists of the Wednesday's Patrick Cooper/BBA Ireland picnic in Car Park 2, just about directly across from the racecourse main entrance. Though often the cast of characters is similar from year to year, you can bet every year some new and interesting characters cross the stage. This year, without doubt, the most interesting new character at The Patrick Picnic was the Turner Prize-winning contemporary artist, Mark Wallinger, pictured here with his friend, the digital conservationist (uh-huh) Aleda Fitzpatrick.

We chatted with them for a while, and after all, I am a journalist, so I asked a lot of the usual questions--where are you from, what do you do, etc.? The longer I talked to Mark the more I found myself trying to keep up. This fellow, I said to myself, is no ordinary contemporary artist--whatever that might be. Huh, I finally said; I think my *TDN* readers might be interested in your story; can we speak next week, I asked? Absolutely.

So of course, as we do now, I googled him and looked him up in Wikipedia. First major shock--I thought he must have been about 35 when I met him at the picnic. He's actually 54, which means he has a lot more history than I first assumed; and what a very interesting history it is. Mark is, without doubt, one of Britain's leading contemporary artists, with a string of exhibitions, awards, and achievements big enough to fill a book. In fact, there is such a book, entitled (strangely), *Mark Wallinger*, written by Martin Herbert and published in 2011 by Thames & Hudson, London. The front-jacket blurb refers to it as "the first comprehensive monograph on Mark's work. It spans his entire career to date and is extensively illustrated with images of nearly all the artist's work." The front-piece of the book reproduces his Ink on Paper drawing from 1997, on display in the Anthony Reynolds Gallery in London, entitled "Mark Wallinger is Innocent." This is a contemporary artist with a sense of humor. **Cont. p6**

A native of Chigwell, in Essex (and otherwise best known as the setting for the British sitcom *Birds of a Feather*), Mark first came to prominence in the mid-1980s, having studied at the Chelsea School of Art and Goldsmith's College in London. Originally an accomplished painter, albeit always with a whimsical edge and contemporary feel, Wallinger quickly expanded his repertoire to include video, photography, multimedia productions, and sculpture. His subject matter ranges across politics, religion (he won the Turner Prize in 2007 for 'State Britain,' a recreation of peace campaigner Brian Haw's protest against, first, Iraq sanctions, and then against the Iraq war which took place in Parliament Square between 2001-2006)--and horse racing.

Between 1992-1995, Mark, who has been fascinated by horse racing for as long as he can remember, produced a series of works around the world of horse racing and, believe me, horse racing has never looked quite like this. Mark did some research and found that the surname which had the highest number of registered colors at that time was Brown. He did a series of paintings in 1993, called "Brown's," of all the colors registered by people with the surname 'Brown.' He noted that most of the Browns avoided the color brown, and further noted that this work "was a nice joke on painting, that if you mix all the colours on your palette you get brown." In 1994, he bought a filly by Keen (full brother to Kris and Diesis) with a group of friends and he named her A Real Work of Art. For his own colors he chose, in honor of Emily Davison, the suffragette who threw herself in front of the King's horse in 1913, the green, violet, and white of the suffragette movement. A Real Work of Art eventually won a race in Germany as a 3-year-old in 1995, and produced a black-type winner there, Art Attack (Platini), in 2006.

At the Tate Gallery in 1995, Wallinger displayed a video installation, lasting seven and a half minutes, on four video monitors, entitled 'Royal Ascot, 1994.' He had recorded the Royal Procession during each of the then-four days at Ascot in 1994. Wallinger's footage showed, in Martin Herbert's words, a "surreally identical" event--as Wallinger says,

"Except that the Queen is wearing a different dress or hat. The Duke of Edinburgh rather unnervingly doffs his hat at the same point, every day." Also in 1994-95, Wallinger produced a series

of huge oil on canvas 'diptychs' called "Half-Brother." In one panel, he has painted in front half of Unfuwain and the back half of his half-brother Nashwan; in another, the front half of Exit to Nowhere, the back half of Machiavellian. **Cont. p7**

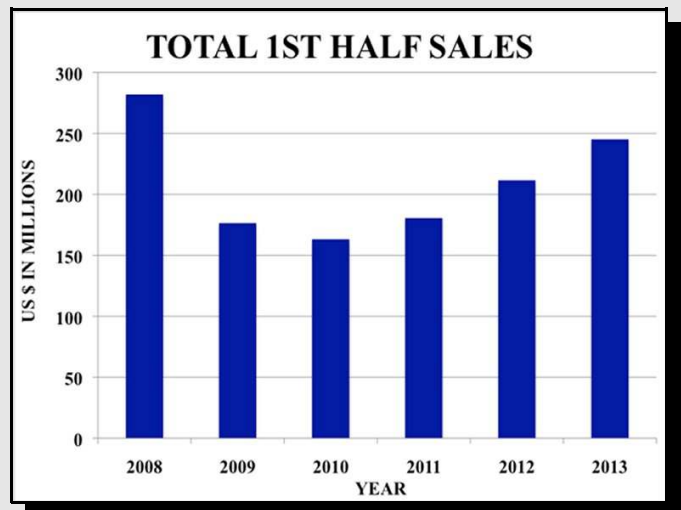


"The final tally on the 2013 North American and European 2-year-old sales: gross up by 17% and average up by 20% from last year (bodes well for the yearling sales). With 3% fewer catalogued and sold. Compared to pre-crash 2008, the number catalogued has fallen by 17%, the number sold by 7%, while the gross is now just 1.4% below that of 2008, and the average is up 7%. Combined with first-half mixed sales, gross revenues at the end of June were 15% below those in 2008."

Having ‘done’ horse racing--in a way I’ve certainly never seen anything like before--Mark turned to other projects, including a two-week stint in a bear costume in a gallery in Berlin in 2004, and his Turner Prize-winning Brian Haw anti-war protest project in 2006-07. But he returned to the theme of the horse

when he won the commission, in 2008, for the Ebbsfleet Landmark project. The project was to create something 50 meters high (about 164 feet) which would be positioned near Ebbsfleet, in Kent, which would welcome visitors

to Britain. Mark’s winning submission was for a White Horse, which he felt would be appropriate for Kent for three reasons. First, from a semi-mythical invasion of what is now Kent in the 5th Century by the twin brothers Hengist (‘stallion’ in Old English) and Horsa (‘horse’), in which the flag of the invaders included a white horse; second, that the white horse (possibly because of the above) is the symbol of Kent; and third, that Kent is well known for the white substance, chalk.

Unfortunately, the £12-£15 million White Horse is on Wallinger’s short list of “unrealized” projects. Shortly after he won the commission, the world economic meltdown intervened and funds to “realize” the project died up. While still working to find the necessary funds to bring the project to Ebbsfleet, Wallinger unveiled a life-size version of “The White Horse” outside the headquarters of the British Council on the Mall in London earlier this year. He was delighted to learn that the seat of the horse is now just about the color of denim, as a result of so many people in blue jeans climbing up to sit on it.

When we spoke at the picnic and I asked Mark about the sort of art he did--and before I had seen any images of his work--he described an almost bewildering range of media in which he has worked. “So what are you,” I asked. “A sort of GP [General Practitioner] of the Arts?” He laughed, “In a way, I suppose,” he replied. “I like that description.” When we spoke on the phone, after I had seen images of his work and understood better that he is a general practitioner of the imagination, I asked what he does think about the artist’s relationship to what he or she sees. “I want to say, have a look at this, or how about this?” he replied. “Art can be soul food,” he added. “It can be uplifting, it can be spiritual.” And, in the mind and imagination of Mark Wallinger, it can be challenging, complex, funny, and, above all, inspiring. Great Art.

RMTC Issues Drug Bulletins:

Edited Press Release

The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) Tactical Research Committee has reviewed data from laboratory analysis of two substances of concern in racing that have been marketed as powerfully effective drugs: "Purple Pain" and "TB-500." Both of these substances are non-FDA-approved and only available through compounding pharmacies. Accordingly, under the RCI guideline regarding unclassified medications and foreign substances, the RMTC recommends that any administration of these substances be treated as a prohibited act and that a finding for either substance or their metabolites be treated as a finding for a prohibited substance. As such, these substances should be treated as an RCI Class 1 substance with Class A penalty guidelines. Purple Pain is marketed as a pain reliever. TB-500 is claimed by some marketing materials to build muscle, speed muscle recovery, stop bleeding, increase red blood cells, and decrease inflammation. "This effort is part of the RMTC's renewed focus on identifying and detecting illicit substances and eliminating them from racing," RMTC Scientific Advisory Committee co-chair Dr. Rick Arthur said. "This type of work is intended to ensure the integrity of racing as well as the safety of the equine and human athletes."
