



QATAR CALLING FOR TATTS TOP LOT

Miblish (GB) (Teofilo {Ire}), who finished fifth behind Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Eclipse S., will continue his racing career in Qatar after topping the first day of trade at Tattersalls when selling for 250,000gns to trainer Gassim Ghazali.

"I watched his run on Saturday on the TV and thought that he was the one I wanted," said Ghazali, a regular visitor to the July Sale. "I hope he might be a contender for the Emir Cup in March and I'd like to try to buy five or six horses while I'm here, but the big problem for buyers who travel from overseas is the high number of scratchings from

the sale."

A winner over seven furlongs at two for Clive Brittain and Saeed Manana, Miblish ([lot 153](#)) landed the Listed Magnolia S. at Kempton in March and has posted some decent subsequent efforts in group company, including a third-place finish in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. in May.

Miblish's price tag exceeds that given for the top lot at last year's July Sale, when Estentepe (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) sold for 220,000gns, and contributed to a session which posted more than double the turnover of the corresponding session in 2012, albeit for 29 more horses sold.

The 4-year-old **Lover Man (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}) ([lot 190](#)) boosted his appeal by winning the Listed Prix Hampton at Maisons-Laffitte on June 11 and the gelding duly found a buyer with deep pockets when Scottish trainer Keith Dalgliesh, acting through Bobby O'Ryan, went to 135,000gns to ensure he joined his Lanarkshire stable. Confirming that Lover Man was the "most expensive I've bought so far," Dalgliesh added that he hopes to aim him at Scotland's premier sprint prize, the Ayr Gold Cup. Out of the Group 3-winning Selkirk mare Seltitude (Ire), he hails from the family of G1 Breeders' Cup Turf winner In The Wings (GB) and Derby hero High-Rise (Ire). **Cont. p3**

FASLIYEV, DURANDAL PASS AWAY IN JAPAN

Japanese breeders lost two stallions this week who both had earned racing championships and sired significant runners; **Fasliyev** (Nureyev--Mr. P's Princess, by Mr. Prospector), who reigned as 1999 European juvenile champion, and **Durandal (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence--Sawayaka Princess {Jpn}, by Northern Taste), Japan's top sprinter and miler in 2003 and 2004. Fasliyev died on July 9 of a diaphragmatic hernia at Yushun Stallion Station on the island of Hokkaido, where he had been based under the ownership of a syndicate since he was sold by Coolmore in 2007. Bred in Kentucky by Harold Harrison, he ranked 39th among leading Japanese sires by 2013 progeny earnings at the time of his death. Complete statistics are not available for the 2013 breeding season, but in 2012, Fasliyev covered 114 mares in Japan. Overall, his Japanese progeny have earned about \$10.8 million. Prior to his move to the island nation, Fasliyev was based at Coolmore in Ireland and shipped to Australia. From 12 crops, he has sired 32 blacktype winners, led by Carry On Katie, winner of the 2003 G1 Cheveley Park S., and 2012 Italian highweighted mare Malikayah (Ire), as well as champions in Macau, Saudi Arabia and Austria. Overall, Fasliyev's offspring have won more than \$50.4 million. In his championship season, Fasliyev was undefeated for trainer Aidan O'Brien, capturing the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Phoenix S. Produced by Mr. P's Princess, a daughter of 1999 Broodmare of the Year Anne Campbell (Never Bend), Fasliyev was from the family of Grade I winners and sires Desert Wine and Menifee. Meanwhile, Durandal died in his stall at the Breeders Stallion Station in Hokkaido from a heart attack at age 14. The powerfully made chestnut out of Sawayaka Princess won three Group 1 events in Japan for owner-breeder Teruya Yoshida and his Shadai Farm and began his stud career at the Shadai Stallion Station. Durandal's best progeny include Yoshida's 2011 G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) winner Erin Court (Jpn) and Group 3 winners Jewel of Nile (Jpn) and Fragarach (Jpn). He has sired 425 registered foals from his first six Japanese crops and his runners have earned more than \$2.6 million. Japanese records indicate Durandal covered 67 mares in 2012.

As expected, there was decent money floating about for potential jumping prospects, and that is just what Highflyer Bloodstock's Anthony Bromley hopes that **Duroble Man (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}) ([lot 197](#)) will prove to be after bidding 130,000gns on behalf of Max McNeill. Agent and owner have combined successfully in the past, parting with 100,000gns in 2011 for Grumeti (GB) (Sakhee), who made a convincing conversion from the Flat when landing a Group 1 juvenile hurdle race at Aintree's Grand National meeting in 2012 after finishing third in the Triumph Hurdle at Cheltenham.

"We hope that Duroble Man will be a Triumph Hurdle horse," said Bromley, who confirmed the 3-year-old will be joining Grumeti's trainer, Alan King. The Monsun sireline is increasingly coveted in the National Hunt sphere, thanks largely to the exploits of the extraordinary Sprinter Sacre (Fr) (Network {Ger}) and Duroble Man is another grandson of the late German stalwart.

"I love this sireline and, importantly, this horse has soft-ground form," added Bromley of the 10-furlong winner with a rating of 86. "For me, he was a standout to go jumping."

Exceedingly Good Session...

Darshaan (GB) has long been regarded as one of the best broodmare sires of the modern era and it was one of his daughters who held sway early during the opening session of the Tattersalls July sale when selling for 75,000gns.

First Of Many (GB) ([lot 104](#)), already the dam of listed winner Many Colours (GB) (Green Desert), proved to be the highlight of the Darley draft and will now head to Ireland after being bought by Michael Donohoe of BBA Ireland for an undisclosed client.

“There’s plenty happening in the family and it’s a family that’s all about speed,” said Donohoe. “My client was looking for a mare in foal to a proven sire and she’s by a top broodmare sire in Darshaan.”

First Of Many’s dam Star Profile (Ire) (Sadler’s Wells) is a half-sister to Lady Alexander (Ire) (Night Shift), the dam of this season’s runaway freshman sire in Europe, Dandy Man (Ire). One of just three stallion sons of the late G1 July Cup winner Mozart (Ire), the Ballyhane Stud resident Dandy Man currently tops the first-season sires’ table with 12 winners from 28 runners to date, including the Royal Ascot winner Extortionist (Ire).

The 14-year-old First Of Many was sold in foal to Darley’s popular shuttler Exceed and Excel (Aus), who has a seemingly unassailable lead in the Australian sires’ championship as the Southern Hemisphere season draws to a close. His popularity was evident again just eight lots later when another Darley offering, **Naruko** (Street Cry {Ire}) ([lot 112](#)), was knocked down in foal to him at 74,000gns, sold to John and Patricia Walsh of Anchorage Stud in Ireland. Darshaan again featured in this pedigree as Naruko, now four and a winner last season in France, is out of his daughter Lake Toya, a dual stakes winner. Further back, the family includes the Classic-winning half-siblings Generous (Ire) and Imagine (Ire).

Exceed and Excel was again to the fore when his daughter **Dozy (GB)** ([lot 78](#))--a half-sister to First Of Many--sold in foal to Tweenhills’ first-season sire Harbour Watch (Ire) for 57,000gns to Alma Taylor. The owner of Red House Stud for the last three years, Taylor has had a long association with the property just outside Newmarket, having managed the farm for the late Tom Warner since 1969.

Taylor said of the dual juvenile winner, now a 4-year-old, “I particularly liked her breeding and she was a good racehorse. I already have a mare in foal to Harbour Watch--we like to sell a few horses and keep a few to race.”

Too Good to Pass...

Tom and Ben Harris, whose father Trevor owns Lordship Stud in Newmarket, teamed up to add **Roxelana (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) ([lot 133](#)) to the farm’s broodmare band after placing the successful bid of 70,000gns. A half-sister to Godolphin’s UAE 1,000 Guineas winner Lovely Pass (Ire), they hope to send their new acquisition to that filly’s sire, the GI Breeders’ Cup Classic winner Raven’s Pass.

Patience eventually paid off for Peter Kavanagh, who has been trying to buy a mare from the family of Featherhill (Fr) for some time and eventually struck for **Zain Queen (GB)** ([lot 39](#)), a daughter of Danehill Dancer (Ire) out of the listed winner Rave Reviews (Ire) (Sadler’s Wells), who was knocked down for 44,000gns to head the early proceedings at the opening session. **Cont. p5**

Featherhill's descendants include the Group 1 winners Groom Dancer, Plumania (GB), and Falco, plus recent G1 1,000 Guineas third-place finisher Moth (Ire), and her unraced 3-year-old great granddaughter Zain Queen will now head to the paddocks at Kildaragh Stud, which Kavanagh runs with his wife Antoinette.

With four sales sessions spread over two days still to come, the 176 horses to have changed hands on the first day, for an increased clearance rate of 84%, garnered a total of 2,819,600gns, compared to 1,371,300gns last year. The average of 16,020gns also improved--up 72% from 9,329gns--as did the median of 6,100gns (up from 5,500gns).

WILD PRESENCE

Often the last chance to book a place in the line-up for the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S., today's G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket does not boast a serious contender for that highlight and may be open to K I Farm Corporation's **Wild Coco (Ger)** (Shirocco {Ger}) to make a mark. One of last year's more progressive fillies, she took Goodwood's G3 Lillie Langtry S. and Doncaster's G2 Park Hill S. over 14 furlongs in August and September and did not look short of pace in either contest. Yvonne Jacques's **Grandeur (Ire)** (Verglas {Ire}) is back on home soil, having enjoyed a profitable sojourn in America last winter when winning the Nov. 3 GII Twilight Derby at Santa Anita and Dec. 15 GII Hollywood Turf Cup either side of finishing runner-up in the GI Hollywood Derby Nov. 26. He is penalized for those exploits, as is Abdulla Al Mansoori's **Universal (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) as a result of his win in the May 4 G2 Jockey Club S. on the July Course here and he warrants respect on his latest third in Royal Ascot's G2 Hardwicke S. June 22.

COMMAND POSITION

Aidan O'Brien's current crop of juveniles are more than up to the normal standard and that was exemplified in the G2 Coventry S., where **Sir John Hawkins** (Henrythenavigator) was third behind his brilliant stable companion War Command (War Front). No match for that runaway winner, he still emerged with credit from a strong renewal of the June 18 Royal Ascot contest and looks the one to beat in today's G2 July S. at Newmarket. Also in that race was Nick and Olga Dhandsa and John and Zoe Webster's **Jallota (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who was fifth having won previously over this course and distance from De La Warr Racing's **Brown Sugar (Ire)** (Tamayuz {GB}) June 8. Richard Hannon trains the latter, who has since broken his maiden by five lengths at Salisbury June 26 and he also saddles Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's impressive five-furlong Beverley maiden scorer **Anjaal (GB)** (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) as he looks for a sixth renewal and third since 2010. "They are two nice horses with similar profiles, in that both ran well first time out at Newmarket and then confirmed that promise when justifying favouritism by breaking their maidens with the minimum of fuss," Hannon commented. "Anjaal impressed at Beverley, as did Brown Sugar at Salisbury, but obviously the Coventry third is going to be hard to beat." Angie Bailey's **Astaire (Ire)** (Intense Focus) back in third when registering a debut score over this trip at York May 25 and warrants respect, as does Godolphin's **Figure of Speech (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who stamped his authority on proceedings in a maiden over this track and trip June 21.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



FEDERAL INTERNET GAMING EXPANSION PUSH CONTINUES

The U.S. Senate Commerce Committee has scheduled a meeting next week to hear testimony on the expansion of Internet gaming. Because as much as 20 percent of pari-mutuel wagering occurs online, any expansion of Internet gaming is of great interest to the U.S. horse racing industry.

In the past two legislative sessions, Congress has failed to pass legislation to legalize Internet gaming, primarily poker. Despite these setbacks, the push continues with new legislation (H.R. 2282) introduced this year by Rep. Peter King (R-NY). The NTRA will continue its efforts to protect horse racing's interests in this process.

The NTRA has been at the forefront of Internet gaming legislation for more than a dozen years. Our involvement began in 2000 when the NTRA helped secure an important amendment to the Interstate Horseracing Act that legalized pari-mutuel wagering on horse racing via the Internet.

The NTRA's work continued when the Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act (UIGEA) was introduced in 2006. That legislation was intended to halt all Internet gaming but the NTRA was able to secure provisions in the final version of UIGEA that maintained our industry's unique ability to offer legal online pari-mutuel wagering.

Preserving the horse racing industry's Internet gaming rights is fundamental to the NTRA's federal legislative function; we take that responsibility very seriously.

YIP RECEIVES CHAMPION TRAINER HONORS

Dennis Yip was given his first Hong Kong Champion Trainer trophy yesterday after a decisive last race victory at Happy Valley. He is the first local Chinese Hong Kong trainer to receive this honor since his mentor Brian Kan.

"I'm very happy and proud to do this for Hong Kong-- I was born in Hong Kong, I grew up in Hong Kong and I would like to thank the Hong Kong people for supporting me," said Yip.

Yip had 68 wins going into yesterday's nine-race card, only two ahead of Tony Cruz. Cruz scored back-to-back wins in races four and five to even the score.

"It's amazing, to go right to the last race before we know the result," said Yip. "I felt some pressure after Tony got the two wins because he had more seconds than me, but I was quite confident that my horses had good chances in the last two races."

Neither trainer was victorious in the eighth race, but Yip's Flying Elite (NZ) (Yamanin Vital {NZ}) was sent off as the heavy chalk in the ninth and final race and proved that faith was well deserved.

"To think I might win the championship was just a fantasy," confessed Yip, "and then after April, when I went top, I started thinking and planning for all of my horses. I seriously tried my best and for every horse I started planning, planning, planning and thinking hard."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

CIRRUS PRIMED FOR ASCOT TEST

Trainer Corine Barande-Barbe issued a positive bulletin regarding **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) ahead of his tilt at Ascot's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. Only fifth on his seasonal bow in the June 23 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, the 7-year-old yesterday headed a field of 15 remaining in the July 27 12-furlong feature after the details of the latest forfeit stage were announced.

"He is very, very well at the moment," Barande-Barbe said of the triple Group 1 winner yesterday. "He improved for his run at Saint-Cloud and improved with each piece of work afterwards--he has been really impressive. We gave him a precautionary entry in the G3 Grand Prix de Vichy on July 17 in case I wanted to give him a prep-run, but it is a bit too near the King George and a bit too far from my stables. I knew that he would need the run in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. He lacked a bit of rhythm on that occasion and he was taking a breath just as everybody else was pushing and fighting, so Olivier Peslier didn't ask him too much. He was standing up in his box the next day and looking very happy. It's hard work for him to meet top Group 1 horses on his first start of the season and he did it quite well. He worked on Tuesday on good going at Chantilly and he doesn't mind quicker ground."

Barande-Barbe continued, "The going was quite firm when he won at Meydan last year and he coped with it well. He had a little bit of a belly a month ago, but it's gone now and he is probably more muscular compared to previous years. He is really coming in to top condition now and his work rider says that he has never been so sharp."

As expected, Roger Charlton withdrew **Al Kazeem (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and he was the most notable scratching.

OAK LODGE LOOKS FOR STRONG JULY

Oak Lodge USA, the Kentucky-based wing of the Fitzsimons family's equine operation, will be represented by its third consignment at the Fasig-Tipton July Sale next Monday. The Paris farm, which is managed by Alan Fitzsimons and his wife Suzy, will send six yearlings through the sales ring.

"I think this is one of our better drafts of yearlings that we've brought to the July sale, so we're pretty optimistic," Alan Fitzsimons said.

Fitzsimons got his start in racing back in 1980, when his father purchased a farm and began a pinhooking operation in Kildare.

"My father just started pinhooking foals to yearlings back in 1980 and it grew from there," Fitzsimons explained. "He started off with 150-200 acres and, at the time, there were only four stalls on the farm and it has grown to 100 stalls and a second farm in Ireland. The main farm is in Kildare in Naas and then we've got Springfield House Stud in Tipperary, which was bought in about 2006."

After spending weekends and school breaks working on the farm, which bred dual Classic winner Cockney Rebel (Ire) (Val Royal {Fr}), Fitzsimons went on to graduate from both the English and Irish National Stud courses and then traveled overseas to round out his CV.

"I went to New Zealand to work at Cambridge Stud and I worked at Eliza Park in Australia as well," he explained. "Then I had the opportunity to come to America and work. So I came out here in 2004, and I worked at Three Chimneys for two years. From there, I went to work at Ashford Stud for another two years."

It was during his time at Ashford that Fitzsimons met his wife Suzy, a graduate of the University of Limerick Equine Degree Course. Suzy Fitzsimons had spent 15 years working for Coolmore, in Ireland, Australia and the U.S.

It wasn't long before the couple decided it was time to extend the Oak Lodge brand to the Bluegrass.

"It got to the stage where I was wanting to do something a bit different and the opportunity came up for us to buy a farm here in Kentucky and it just seemed like the sensible thing to do to break into the American market," Fitzsimons recalled. "So we began looking at farms, I guess it was in 2006, and then purchased the farm in Paris in November of '07. We started the business in the summer of '08--that is when we first started taking clients on to the farm. We started doing quarantine for Europe."

While 2008 might not have been the easiest time to start up a new business, the couple persevered.

"It was the late part of '08 that the economy sort of went downhill, it was a tough time to be starting out, but we managed to get through that and build it up from there," Fitzsimons said.

Oak Lodge USA has expanded to lease a second farm in Paris and the farm's 200 Kentucky acres are home to 35 broodmares and 20 yearlings and weanlings. Fitzsimons admits the farm does "a bit of everything."

In addition to boarding broodmares and foals, Oak Lodge sells foals, yearlings and mares for itself and for clients. It also stands the multiple graded stakes placed stallion **Baryshnikov** (Empire Maker).

While Oak Lodge is well diversified, Fitzsimons said he thought the farm's pinhooking ventures had the most upside.

"Probably the pinhooking can be the most rewarding, if it works out," he said. "It's not the easiest thing to do, there is a lot of risk involved in it because you have to have the right horse and they have to vet out 100% for the people to go ahead and buy them. If it works out, it is rewarding. But it's like anything, there are the highs and the lows of it."

Oak Lodge has already had success with its first two July consignments. From its 2012 July offerings, Oak Lodge sold a Midnight Lute filly for \$70,000. The yearling had been an \$18,000 Keeneland November weanling. The youngster, now named Miss Lafayette, is in training for West Point Thoroughbreds and St. Elias.

"I spoke to them about a week ago and they are pretty happy with her," Fitzsimons said.

In 2011, Oak Lodge sold a daughter of Ready's Image for \$80,000. The filly, a \$39,000 Keeneland November weanling, is now named Leinan. She was a first-out winner at Keeneland last April and is now a two-time stakes winner.

Fitzsimons is optimistic about the farm's 2013 July consignment, which is a mixture of homebreds, pinhooking prospects, and client's yearlings.

"There is a Midshipman colt who we have for a client in New York who is a pretty nice horse," Fitzsimons said of [hip 17](#).

From the first crop of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Midshipman (Unbridled's Song), the yearling is out of a full-sister to Grade I winner Karelian (Bertrando).

Oak Lodge bred [hip 232](#), a filly from the first crop of Grade I winner Quality Road. The yearling is a half-sister to graded stakes winner Tap Day (Pleasant Tap).

“We’re excited about Quality Road,” Fitzsimons said. “There has been a lot of talk about them and people seem to like what they’ve seen so far.”

[Hip 38](#), a son of Colonel John, was purchased by Kingston Bloodstock in utero for \$23,000 out of the 2011 Keeneland November sale. He is out of multiple stakes placed Ladyecho (Alphabet Soup).

“We have a very nice Colonel John, who is also a homebred,” Fitzsimons said. “Colonel John has made a pretty good start with his yearlings, I think they averaged over \$100,000, and he’s had a couple of winners already this year. There’s been a lot of positive talk from trainers and that’s always a good sign. So hopefully this colt will turn out really well.”

[Hip 55](#), a colt by Sky Mesa, was a \$45,000 Keeneland November purchase. He is the first foal out of stakes-placed Madel (More Than Ready).

“Sky Mesa seems to be having a very good year at the track this year,” Fitzsimons said. “It seems like the right time to have one. We’re pretty excited about him, so hopefully he’ll do really well at the sale.”

Fitzsimons admitted timing was key to success at the sales.

“Especially in the July sale, you have to have the right horse in that sale, and it has to be the right time and it all has to work out,” he said.

Still, Fitzsimons sees reason for optimism.

“You have to be apprehensive going into the first yearling sale of the year, but I think the 2-year-old sales went really well, so hopefully that rolls into the July sale. You have to be cautiously optimistic, you never know what way it is going to go, the first sale of the year. Hopefully everything goes well. If you’ve got the right horse, that people want, then there shouldn’t be any problem. So I think we should be ok, fingers crossed.” -*Jessica Martini*



RACING NEEDS A CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

They just got done with Wimbledon, and it was a pretty good show, highlighted by Andy Murray’s winning one for the home team. But imagine if they played the U.S. Open at the exact same time and some of the good players showed up in England and some took their talents to Flushing, Queens. Had that happened, both tournaments would have been watered-down, uninteresting contests beating each other into the ground.

No sport, it would seem, would be so foolish to have its biggest events conflict with one another, but horse racing does it virtually every week. And the results were what we got this past weekend when the Hollywood Gold Cup and the Suburban went head to head. It started with a snoozer in the Suburban, where even-money shot Flat Out beat four others and continued with an even more dreadful betting race in the Hollywood Gold Cup, where Game On Dude beat four at 1-5.

Between them, two tracks gave away \$850,000 in stakes races for older male route horses on the dirt and the result was two races that had customers wondering what they had done to deserve such unappealing betting fare. Then again, the horse player has grown used to this. Fields are small all over the country, the product has never been less appetizing and far too many stakes races, especially on the dirt, threaten to bore us to death.

There might have been a time when it would have worked to run the Hollywood Gold Cup and the Suburban on the same day. Belmont and Hollywood Park are some 2,600 miles apart and each area of the country has its distinctive horse populations. But those days are long gone. There aren’t nearly enough good horses around to be able to have so many major stakes at so many different racetracks and hope to attract the type of fields with quantity and quality that customers demand.

The answer is to create a roving championship series of races and race days, similar to what they have in tennis, golf, NASCAR. That may be a case of stating the obvious, but this dysfunctional sport shies away from the challenge of getting it done. The result is that it continues to try to sell its customers something they don’t want to buy (five-horse fields with 1-5 shots), and that’s a guaranteed recipe for failure.

But just in case someone in a leadership role wants to step up and fix this problem, here is the blueprint for how to do it:

Once a month and once a month only from January through October, racing will have a mini-Breeders' Cup Day. November will be saved for the actual Breeders' Cup and there's no need to have this take place in December. Through June the 3-year-old males won't be involved since they have the Triple Crown season to worry about, and obviously you can't start with championship events for 2-year-olds until, say, August.

There will be one championship race per month for every division but the aforementioned exceptions. The races will all be Grade 1's and no one will be allowed to schedule any other major races with big purses to compete with the championship events. (If you want to have a Grade 3 with a \$150,000 purse, that's fine.) The sport will work in unison (good luck) to promote these championship days and make sure they are a success. The races will all be linked in multiple race wagers like a Pick Six or maybe a 10-cent Pick Eight.

The championship events will be held on the same day but at two racetracks. For instance, had last Saturday been a championship day, Hollywood could have had the Gold Cup, a race for older fillies on the dirt, a male sprint and a grass race. Belmont could have hosted the other races, but the Suburban would have had to go. By getting rid of the Suburban and so many other stakes races across the year, NYRA could afford to make all of its races on championship days with huge pots.

Had the Hollywood Gold Cup been the only lucrative opportunity for male handicap horses for a month, the race likely would have had eight or nine horses and included a Flat Out vs. Game On Dude showdown.

After Hollywood and Belmont had their turn, no one would be allowed to hold something important until August, when maybe Del Mar and Saratoga would have a chance to hold a championship day.

This isn't perfect and not everyone would be happy. But what the sport is doing now isn't working. You cannot, week after week, put out a product that your customers keep telling you they despise, and expect to do anything but fail.

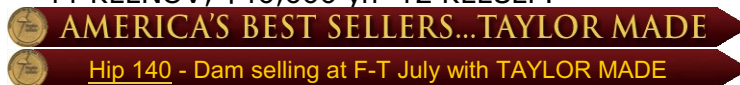
