HEADING SKYWARD

Ben Keswick's **Sky Lantern (Ire)** (Red Clubs {Ire}) has been one of the success stories of 2013, and bids to extend her top-level tally taking on her elders for the first time in today's G1 Etihad Airways Falmouth S. at Newmarket. Since her eclipse in this track's G3 Sweet Solera S. in August, the grey has emerged as a leading force by winning three of her last four starts in Group 1 company and being unlucky in the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. Her success in the May 5 G1 1000 Guineas on the Rowley Mile here was followed by an impressive four-length win in Royal Ascot's

G1 Coronation S. June 21, and Richard Hannon Jr is confident of a bold show. "She seems in great form," he said. "It's always very difficult when horses go and win races like that in the fashion she did. You don't really have an idea what it has taken out of her until you take her to the races. Her weight is very good and we've been happy with her work since. She's taking on the older mares, so we're not sure how it's going to go, but physically she's done extremely well. I haven't known a filly do so well from two to three at our place ever. She's continued to thrive since the Guineas. I'll leave tactics up to Hughesie. We've got her there for the race in good form. He'll take over and do his job." Teruya Yoshida's **Elusive Kate** (Elusive Quality) found only **Giofra (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) too strong on her sophomore bow in this race 12 months ago, but has gained an edge on that rival in terms of form by winning the G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville and placing in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, G1 Sun Chariot S. and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Fourth on her return in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 18, she will strip fitter for that experience. "It's an exciting race and as tight an elite field as you would see," conditioner John Gosden commented. "I'm happy at this stage, she needed the race a little bit in the Queen Anne but that's no surprise as it was her first run since October. She has done fine since Royal Ascot. Obviously that was a strong race and she was against the colts. You'd have to say Sky Lantern produced an exceptional performance at Royal Ascot, and tactically it's going to be interesting." Giofra reverts to a trip that may suit her best, despite her exploits when placing in the G1 Prix de l'Opera, G1 Hong Kong Cup and G1 Dubai Duty Free. Fourth when last seen in the G1 Prix Ganay over 1 5/16 miles at Longchamp Apr. 28, Haras de la Perelle's homebred has enjoyed a break and will benefit if Elusive Kate sets a demanding pace. **Falmouth field p9**

QATAR THE HOTTEST DESTINATION

Temperatures may have soared in Newmarket this week, but Qatar is the hot destination for those horses attracting the highest bidders at Tattersalls' July Sale, with five of the top seven lots sold over the first two days bound for the emirate.

Wednesday's best price of 250,000gns was surpassed during Thursday morning's session when

Durand (GB) (Motivator {GB}) ([lot 374](#)) reached 260,000gns, bought by trainer Ibrahim Al-Malki.

As always at this sale, recent good form can lead to decent profits, and the 3-year-old, a 6,500gns yearling purchase who was owned and trained in Ireland by John Joseph

Murphy, had posted a 3 1/2-length victory over 10 furlongs at Roscommon since the publication of the catalogue, having been placed on debut in May. With an entry in the G3 Royal Whip S. next month, he may stay in training in Ireland in the short term before shipping to Qatar.

"He went for more than I thought he would but I like him very much," said Al-Malki. "I watched his maiden win, which was very impressive in a track record. He is for the Qatar Derby, but he is entered in the Royal Whip, so we might leave him here for now." **Cont. p3**

The Aga Khan-bred **Zarkiyar (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) ([lot 435](#)) will be racing in the silks of Sheikh Mishaal bin Hamad bin Khalifa Al Thani, President of the Arab Equestrian Federation and the brother of the new Emir of Qatar, after selling for 200,000gns. The 3-year-old was the tenth horse purchased by Qatar's eight-time champion trainer Gassim Ghazali, who snapped up Wednesday's top lot Miblish, and is another to be aimed at the ten-furlong Qatar Derby. Also boasting recent winning form, Zarkiyar, from the family of European champion filly Zarkava (Ire), claimed a 12-furlong maiden at Tipperary June 27.

Ghazali was back for more later in the session, selecting 3-year-old **Sejalaat (Ire)** (Kheleyf) ([lot 483](#)) from the Shadwell consignment for 60,000gns. The 81-rated colt was a six-furlong winner last year for Ed Dunlop and was the most expensive of Shadwell's 32 horses sold for an aggregate of 390,300gns.

Qataris Clash for Seamless...


Heading the first section of the Juddmonte draft was **Seamless (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}) ([lot 457](#)), whose eight-length Yarmouth victory June 27 provided a decent enough update to convince trainer Abdulaziz Al Boenain, bidding against his compatriot Gassim Ghazali, to part with 100,000gns for the 3-year-old colt out of the Listed winner Fashionable (GB) (Nashwan).

Wild-card entry Peter Mac (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) ([lot 428A](#)) was supplemented to the sale Tuesday morning with two wins to his credit. It proved to be a shrewd late move by his owners, Middleham Park Racing, as the juvenile was secured with a single bid of 95,000gns by Qatari businessman Hussain Ali Bukannan, whose four purchases at the sale so far have cost a total of 153,000gns.

It wasn't all one-way traffic to Qatar, however. Juddmonte's **Navarre (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) ([lot 463](#)) is heading to California after being bought by the tongue-twisting combination of Kern/Lillingston Association/SackvilleDonald (Agent) for 52,000gns. His full-sister Proviso (GB) won four Grade 1 races at Santa Anita, Belmont and Keeneland after making a similar switch to America from Andre Fabre's French stable, while half-brother Byword (GB) (Peintre Celebre) lists the G1 Prince Of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot as top of his six stakes wins. **Cont. p4**

Buyers seeking potential jumpers found themselves outbid on a number of the pricier lots, but agent Mags O'Toole, buying for trainer Noel Meade, had the final say on **The Plan Man (Ire)**, a twice-raced 3-year-old son of Jeremy, at 42,000gns. He shares his sire with the sensational 2013 Triumph Hurdle winner Our Conor, with his new connections hoping that their acquisition can also make a successful conversion to the National Hunt game.

Describing The Plan Man as a "fine, big, scopey type", O'Toole added, "Let's hope he continues Jeremy's fine record with juvenile hurdlers."

A further 2,276,300gns was bid on a total of 126 lots on Thursday--a 20% rise from the same sessions last year--with the average up again, this time by 30% at 18,066gns (from 13,895gns) and the median increasing by 29% to 9,000gns (from 7,000gns). The only sector in decline from 2012 was the clearance rate of 89%, which was down by seven points. The sale concludes today with a morning session starting at 9.30 a.m., and the post-racing evening session at 6 p.m.



NOT YOUR AVERAGE SHUTTLE STALLION

This past weekend saw an unprecedented achievement by a stallion when **Silvano (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) sired the Grade/Group 1 double of the German Derby and South Africa's biggest race, the Durban July. As impressive a feat as this would be for any stallion, it is the circumstances behind this achievement that deserve your attention.



Silvano *Maine Chance Farms*

Silvano stands at Andreas Jacobs' Maine Chance Farms outside Cape Town in South Africa. The German-bred son of Lomitas was a true international globetrotting star in his time on the track, winning the G1 Queen Elizabeth Cup in Hong Kong,

the G1 Singapore Cup and the GI Arlington Million, as well as placing at the Group 1 level in Australia and Germany. Andreas Jacobs, the owner of Newsells Park Stud in the UK and Gestut Fahrhof in Germany, brought Silvano to South Africa in 2003. When Jacobs first visited Maine Chance with his wife after purchasing the property from Graham Beck, he noted that "we could hardly anticipate that we would have the opportunity to acquire one of the most beautiful stud farms in the world." He had been looking to stand a stallion in South Africa for some time, and thought upon Silvano's retirement from the track that he would be the perfect horse for the job.

"I thought he suited South Africa, as all the biggest races there are for 3-year-olds and older over 2000 meters on fast ground--exactly his own racing profile. And with his outcross pedigree he could cover every mare in the country."

In a year when Silvano has been completely dominant over South Africa's classic distance races and has toppled six-time consecutive Champion Sire Jet Master (SAf) with an unassailable lead at the top of the South African Sires Championship, these words seem almost prophetic. It has been an incredible season for Silvano. His progeny have won four of the five richest Grade 1's in the country, including the country's two most prestigious races: the G1 J&B Met and G1 Durban July. With five Grade 1 winners and 12 stakes winners this season in South Africa alone, Silvano has broken the all-time South African stakes earning record by a stallion even before this weekend's win in Africa's biggest race.

C.10 Anabaa x Place Vendôme



Bred by Guy Pariente (Haras de Colleville) who sold him to Nicolas Clément for €92,000 at the 2011 August Yearling Sale, this Classic winning colt comes from the last crop of the influential Anabaa and is out of a Listed placed daughter of Dr Fong. With a race record now boasting five wins, this magnificent grey colt was already making headlines at the age of two, ending the year with a highly promising Listed win at Deauville. This year, he has blown away the racing industry, first of all when romping home in the Prix Djebel (Gr.3) then when winning the Poule d'Essai des Poulains (Gr.1) with a majestic performance against seventeen rivals including Intello and Olympic Glory.

OCOVANGO

C.10 – Monsun x Crystal Maze



This son of Monsun bought by BBA Ireland for €180,000 from Watership Down in August 2011 caught the eye from his very first start as a two-year-old at Saint-Cloud. The André Fabre-trained colt continued in the same vein on the very same course winning the Prix François Mathet (L.) on his reappearance followed by the Prix Greffulhe (Gr.2). Deemed good enough to take on the best of the English in the Epsom Derby (Gr.1), Prince Faisal's colt finished fifth, less than a length away from the third placed horse, having been unlucky in the straight.

TORONADO

C.10 – High Chaparral x Wana Doo



In August 2011, this son of High Chaparral bred by Paul Nataf and consigned by the Haras d'Omméel, appealed to Amanda Skiffington who went to €55,000 for him. Even as a two year old, he was already impressing onlookers with his class and good looks, winning three times including the Champagne Stakes (Gr.2) at Doncaster. He was faultless on his seasonal reappearance at Newmarket in the colours of Sheikh Joaan Al Thani, where he was in a different league to the other runners in the Craven Stakes (Gr.3) before finishing fourth in the 2000 Guineas (Gr.1). In the St James's Palace St. (Gr.1) at Royal Ascot, he ran a cracking race to finish 2nd, only beaten a nose by the extraordinary Dawn Approach.

CHICQUITA

F.10 - Montjeu x Prudenzia



Chicquita, a daughter of the Listed winner Prudenzia bred by Ecurie des Monceaux and Skymarc Farm, was the object of everyone's attention in August 2011, none more so than the Australian Paul Makin who, represented by Badgers Bloodstock, went to €600,000 to secure the filly. In the Prix de Diane (Gr.1), this talented filly trained by Alain de Royer Dupré put in an exceptional performance, coming from last place to snatch second place from dual Group 1 winner Silasol.

MORANDI

C.10 – Holy Roman Emperor x Vezina



In August 2011 Jean-Claude Rouget paid €65,000 in order to get his hands on this powerful colt sold by the Haras des Capucines. Aged two and in the colours of Daniel-Yves Trèves, the grey colt had an exceptional season, the highlights of which were a 12 length victory in the Prix de Condé (Gr.3) and a 7 length victory in the Critérium de Saint-Cloud (Gr.1) making him the best two year old in France in order of prizemoney. This year, he showed he had lost none of his ability when finishing an excellent second to the untouchable Intello in the Prix du Jockey Club (Gr.1).

FLOTILLA

F.10 – Mizzen Mast x Louvain



A daughter of Mizzen Mast and the Miesque Stakes (Gr.3) winner Louvain, this filly bred by the Haras des Capucines was bought by the Justin Bahen – Hubie de Burgh tandem for €120,000 in August 2011. At the end of her two year old year, the young filly belonging to Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Thani and in the care of Mikel Delzangles had her crowning moment on American soil when winning the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (Gr.1) in fantastic style. This year she was a most eye-catching winner of the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (Gr.1) on her seasonal debut against the unbeaten Esotérique, breaking the track record in the process.



Not Your Average Shuttle Stallion cont.

The odds were with Silvano to sire the Durban July winner this year, as the sire of no less than six runners in the race. In the end, it was the progressive 4-year-old, Heavy Metal (SAf) who would be the one to step up, with Silvano's Grade 1 winning filly Do You Remember finishing third. Heavy Metal has now won Grade 1's on both his attempts at 2000 meters and above, and is set for an international campaign that will likely include Dubai and Hong Kong. Two other of Silvano's progeny based in South Africa are also set for international campaigns. Vercingetorix, the highest rated 3-year-old in the country, is set to join Mike de Kock in Dubai, while Grade 1 winning 2-year-old filly Happy Valentine has been purchased by Team Valor and will ship to France to start an international campaign.



Heavy Metal

The victory of Lucky Speed (Ire) in the German Derby last weekend added another element to the Silvano story. What makes this win special is how a European bred 3-year-old sired by a South African-based stallion won a European classic. Due to arduous quarantine restrictions, it is extremely difficult to shuttle stallions to and from South Africa. In fact, in the last 10 years, Silvano is the only stallion to have done so. And this was done more out of good will by Jacobs than for any commercial benefit.

Silvano was originally intended to be a shuttle stallion between South Africa and Germany. However, while he was based in South Africa in 2003, the export of horses from South Africa was suspended for two years due to a breach in the African Horse Sickness protocols. It was therefore fate that decided Silvano would be syndicated and permanently based in South Africa. At this stage Silvano had covered only two crops in Germany, and there was still high demand there for the 2001 German Horse of the Year. Jacobs therefore took it upon himself to reverse-shuttle Silvano back to Germany in 2009 as soon as the export restrictions allowed him to do so. This was no simple process, however. In order to shuttle Silvano to Europe the stallion had to quarantine for more than three months between stations in South Africa, Mauritius and Germany. That favor appears to have paid off this last weekend when, from a crop of a little more than 60 foals, Silvano produced a European classic winner and likely German Champion 3-year-old in Lucky Speed, bred by Gestut Hof Ittlingen, trained by Peter Schiergen and owned by Stall Hornoldendorf.

Not Your Average Shuttle Stallion cont.

It has been a big year for South African horses, with Soft Falling Rain (SAf) (National Assembly), Shea Shea (National Emblem {SAf}) and The Apache's (Mogok) performances on World Cup Night in Dubai being the highlights. Shea Shea came out of his Dubai World Cup night win rated by Timeform the best sprinter in the world (after the retirement of Black Caviar). After a narrow, and perhaps unlucky, loss in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot, he is now the favorite for Saturday's G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket. Closer to home, the South African sales results have also seen boosts, with the average of both the two primary sales, the Cape Premier Yearling Sale Book 1 and TBA National Sale, rising by 33% and 27%, respectively.

Likewise, runners with German pedigrees have been making a mark in Europe this season, with Estimate (Ire) (Monsun {Ger})'s G1 Ascot Gold Cup win, Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger})'s win in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and Maxios (GB) (Monsun {Ger})'s win in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan amongst the standouts. To add to the obvious influence of Monsun, he is also the broodmare sire of Lucky Speed and G1 Prix Ganay winner Pastorius (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}).

The loss of Monsun was a great one to European breeders, and the task of finding his successor will be a difficult one. Though it would be difficult and unwise to compare the two, in South Africa Silvano appears to be on the road to leaving the kind of mark on South African breeding that Monsun did for Germany. And on the international stage, it is unlikely we have heard the end of this story.

before following up in Newbury's G3 John Porter S. two weeks later. Proving gamest from the front in the May 4 G2 Jockey Club S. on the July Course here, he was not helped by the slip of Ekthiham (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), when subsequently third in Royal Ascot's G2 Hardwicke S. last time June 22. Again sent to the head of affairs by Joe Fanning, the chestnut enjoyed a relatively soft lead and, when he started to apply the pressure with three furlongs remaining,

He's in the King George and although the heart says King George, the head would maybe say things like the Irish Leger, the Canadian International and the Japan Cup. Those would be the dreams that are in my head at the moment. He's not really an international horse yet, but he looks like one that could be."

It is 21 years since Clive Brittain saddled Sayyedati (GB) to win the G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket's July meeting, and he brings one that he believes compares favorably with that star in **Rizeena (Ire)** (Ifraaj {GB}) to the race today, which is renamed the G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. Having beaten the colts in the Listed National S. at Sandown May 30, Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum's colorbearer mastered some serious foes in Royal Ascot's G2 Queen Mary S. last time June 19, and carries a penalty as a result on this first attempt at six furlongs. 'She's done very well since Ascot,' her trainer told *PA Sport*. "She's got to give three pounds away, but she gave them all a two-length beating and more. You have to carry your penalty. She certainly would be right up with the best fillies I've had." From Ballydoyle is the impressive G3 Grangecon Stud S. scorer **Bye Bye Birdie (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who came alive in a first-time visor in that Curragh contest June 30. The application of that headgear may help her turn around a nine-length deficit with Rizeena from the Queen Mary. Of the others who chased home Rizeena at Royal Ascot, **One Chance (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) finished closest in third, while Des Anderson's **Fig Roll (GB)** (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) was just a half-length behind her in fourth. She has since won the Listed Empress S. over this track and trip June 29 and bids to provide Richard Hannon with a fourth renewal. "She is such a terrific mover and she floats along and though Rizeena will be a tough nut to crack, our little filly is as hard as nails," he said.

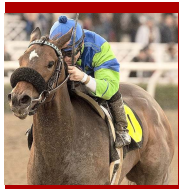

LANCASTER ISSUES WARNING

Britain's Thoroughbred Breeders' Association Chairman Richard Lancaster spoke out on the dwindling numbers of horses, owners and breeders at the annual AGM in Newmarket Wednesday. Addressing the statistical evidence of diminishing forces within the breeding industry, he said, "Since 2007, the number of racehorse owners has declined by over 1,300 and British Thoroughbred foal production has fallen over the same period, from a high point of 5,920 foals in 2008, to 4,366 foal registrations in 2012. This is the lowest recorded figure in recent years and indications are that the 2013 foal numbers will fall further, emphasising that there is a vital need to stimulate production. Correspondingly, British breeder registrations continue to drop. We have more work to do to clarify the actual individual numbers involved, but with 3,648 breeding entities recorded in the 2012 GSB Fact Book, down from 4,750 in 2011, this suggests that whilst a number of breeders have left the industry, those remaining are showing considerable caution in terms of replacing or adding to their broodmare numbers."

Lancaster's speech preceded the awards ceremony, which featured the prestigious Andrew Devonshire Bronze which was picked up by owner-breeder George Strawbridge, who in turn became only the third American to be honored after John Gaines and Paul Mellon. Darley also featured prominently when collecting the BBA Silver Cigar Box for housing the leading British-based sire by prize money in Exceed and Excel (Aus) and the Tattersalls Silver Salver for leading British first-season sire New Approach (Ire).

"It's thrilling and it's absolutely what Sheikh Mohammed deserves for his investment and effort," Darley's Director of Stallions Sam Bullard commented. "New Approach is the most exciting young stallion around--to have done what he's done in such a short time is quite an achievement. As regards horses who shuttle to both hemispheres, Exceed and Excel looks to be the best since his father, Danehill. For him to be the leading sire in Britain and the champion sire-elect in Australia is fantastic."

HONG KONG SEASON ENDS WITH GAINS

The Hong Kong 2012/13 racing season concluded at Happy Valley Wednesday with Hong Kong Jockey Club Chief Executive Officer Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges describing it as “one of the best seasons we’ve had, ever.”

The season’s 83 meetings produced a betting turnover of HK\$93.8 billion (*US\$12.7 billion*), up 9% from last season, and higher than the previous top mark established in 1996/97. The HKJC also experienced increase attendance, with over two million racegoers over the last season.

“The figures have been extremely good,” Engelbrecht-Bresges noted. “And if you look at the contributions to the Government, our betting duty stands at HK\$11 billion, an 8.6% increase on last season [about HK\$10.6 billion], meaning that this year’s betting duty is almost back up to the 1999/2000 level. It must be noted, though, that the Club’s net margin this year was HK\$4.085 million, which is still some way short of the 1999/2000 figure [HK\$4.5 million]. This reflects the challenges the Club has going forward in the face of increasing competition and higher operating costs.”

In addition, HKJC Executive Director of Racing Bill Nader announced yesterday purse increases for the 2013/14 season of approximately HK\$31 million (*US\$3.9 million*). The Hong Kong Speed Series-- comprised of three Hong Kong Group 1 races--will receive a boost of HK\$5 million. All Hong Kong and International Group 2 races will receive an increase of HK\$500,000, while Hong Kong Group 3 races will rise from HK\$2.4 million to HK\$2.5 million. Class 3 races will increase to HK\$1 million; Class 4 races to HK\$725,000, and Class 5 races to HK\$550,000. Class 1 (HK\$2 million) and Class 2 (HK\$1.4 million) races will remain at their current levels.

“If we look back a few years to 2006/07, we can get some historical context to these prize money increases and see just how far we’ve moved things on,” said Mr Nader. “Class 1 races were at HK\$1.6 million back then and now they’re at HK\$2 million, which is a 25% rise; Class 2s were worth HK\$1 million and now their current HK\$1.4 million is 40% higher than in 2006/07; Class 3 was at \$750,000 seven years ago and next season they’ll all be HK\$1 million races. In classes 3, 4 and 5 we’ve seen respective rises of 33%, 27% and 22% over that period.

“We’re seeing good growth in our prize money levels, particularly in our higher class races, and this reflects the Club’s continuing commitment to improving the quality of the racing product here in Hong Kong,” Nader added. “In the case of the Hong Kong Speed Series races, the increases give our top sprint races more parity with our major races staged over a mile and beyond.”

Next season will also bring changes to the Hong Kong incentives scheme. The First Win bonus for PP (privately purchased) horses (with an initial Hong Kong rating of 80 or more) that win a Class 1 or higher race within their first 12 months in Hong Kong has increased to HK\$1 million (from HK\$800,000). PPs that gain their first local win at Class 2 level within that period will receive HK\$750,000 (up from HK\$600,000). Next season will also see an increase in the Hong Kong International Sale Bonus, which will be awarded for the final time. HKIS graduates that win in Class 3 before the end of their first full season will receive a HK\$600,000 bonus, up from HK\$500,000.

“With the changes in the ISG bonus scheme, the Club is actually increasing its incentive pool to a wider group of horses by making it more achievable,” said Mr Nader. “Our aim is to have more Sales graduates winning in Class 3 and above and the \$600,000 bonus is a nice incentive on that path to success.”

STALLIONS, ZULU WARRIORS AND THE FLASH OF A SABRE *by Liesl King*

After a day of racing, that included the greatest race in Africa, the G1 Vodacom Durban July, it seems fitting to be spending a day in the heartland of the Zulu Kingdom. Known as fierce warriors, the Zulus are also great singers. There is nothing quite like walking along a stone pathway, flanked by Zulu singers welcoming you in full voice. The sound reverberates around you, words lost on the wind, but the big smiles make the message perfectly clear. Welcome to Summerhill Stud, home of an extraordinary family, for there is no other way to describe the relationship between owner Mick Goss and his staff.

The Sunday after the July would seem like the perfect day to get up late and slowly migrate to a comfortable spot in front of the television, all the while nursing that hangover from the day before. Yet hundreds of guests from all over the world chose to rather get in their cars and head out on the long drive to the little town of Mooi River. For on its outskirts lies the stud farm of Summerhill, where for many years, Goss has hosted the Summerhill Stallion day. Three years ago, Investec came on board and one is now cordially invited to the Investec Summerhill Stallion day. but apart from that, nothing much else has changed.

After being warmly welcomed by the singing Zulus, guests are handed a fluffy Investec blanket to ward off any chills coming from the snow-covered Drakensberg Mountains. Seated on the grassy bank of a natural auditorium, we eagerly await the arrival of the stallions in their Investec finery, while soaking up the welcome rays of the sun after weeks of grey rainy skies.

Suddenly Mick Goss appears, looking down from the bank, he seems small in stature, well that is until he starts to speak. For there surely is no greater orator in South Africa when it comes to the story of this little part of the Zulu Kingdom and that magnificent animal we call the Thoroughbred racehorse.

Goss starts off by introducing a newcomer to the farm, as PJ The People's horse makes his entrance. Piere Jourdan is not a stallion, in fact he is a rather ordinary Thoroughbred. With skew legs, a distinctive roman nose and a pedigree that did not set the world alight, the plain bay is just that, plain. Yet while he may not have the looks or the pedigree, Pierre Jourdan (SAF)

(Parade Leader) had the heart and the bay gelding came perilously close to winning the Triple Crown, going down in the last leg. Maybe it was his looks, maybe it was his gutsy attitude, but the ugly duckling instantaneously became the people's favorite, known simply as PJ, the people's horse. Newly retired to Summerhill, he proudly led the stallion parade.

Variety is the spice of life with stallions and Summerhill is no different. Brave Tin Soldier (Storm Cat) is as beautiful as he is elegant and regally parades for the guests, while Mullins Bay (GB) (Machiavellian) made a dramatic entrance that would be hard to top. Walking into the auditorium, the stallion made it only as far as Goss and his podium, before rising high on his back legs. The rear was graceful and perfectly balanced, the teeth on display were not.

A son of Sunday Silence, Admire Main (Jpn), had clearly been taught better manners in the faraway land of his birth, posing for the barrage of cameras without batting an eye, before A. P. Arrow (A.P. Indy) did exactly the opposite. His feet were seldom on the ground and his mane flew in all directions as the gleaming ball of chestnut muscle threw a tantrum before his audience.

That set the scene for the troupe of Zulu warriors to make their entrance. And, in true Zulu tradition, they were heard, long before they were seen. Stirring battle cries filled the air, before a group of traditionally dressed Zulu warriors made their way into the auditorium to perform a war dance usually reserved for the eve of a battle. It was awe-inspiring and frightening all at the same time and the audience to a man, could easily imagine the fear of the foe, as thousands of these spear-carrying warriors, in full cry, appeared over the horizon at dawn.

One gets transported back in time, watching these dancing Zulu warriors, but the tantalizing smells wafting up from the kitchen drag you back to reality, suggesting that lunch would not be a far-off affair. As always, Cabriere cellar master Takuan von Arnim, deftly assisted by Coolmore's Sophie Magnier, performed the ritual sabrage. The sabre flashed in the sunlight and the champagne cork flew skywards without a drop being spilled. All that was left was for the Summerhill staff to sing the National anthem and a song for the gravely ill, Nelson Mandela, before sitting down to lunch.

As the sun set over the paddocks, guests, reluctant to leave, mingled to the sounds of the band, sated by good food and even better wine. Summerhill may be a bit off the beaten track and remember to pack your winter woollies, but your welcome will be immensely warm and sincere, here in the land of the Zulu warriors, where that magnificent animal, called the Thoroughbred racehorse reigns supreme.

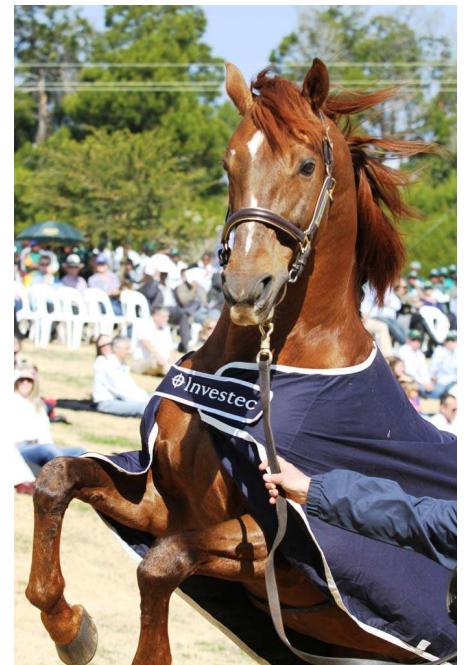

THE BIRTHPLACE OF MODERN DAY RACING "150 Years of Racing in Saratoga"

Saratoga has been the scene of some of racing's most memorable and historic moments. The average modern day racing fan can probably name only one or two of them. Upset ending Man O'War's perfect record in the 1919 Sanford Memorial is familiar to all racing fans, but many other racing greats and landmark moments in the sport have played out over the Saratoga track and, sadly, faded from memory.

In their book "150 Years of Racing in Saratoga," Allan Carter and Mike Kane remind the reader of those historic moments and the racing legends who got their start or made their mark at the Spa. Carter is the National Museum of Racing historian and Kane is a longtime journalist and was the museum's communication officer for five years. The two combined their talents and knowledge in this book that is structured like a collection of short stories. Their storytelling style, as well as photographs give the reader a unique and detailed glimpse into racing's past. With each flip of the page you begin to feel like you are in a time machine taking you back to the glory days of the Sport of Kings, at the place where so many rose to greatness, as well as fell to the curse of the "Graveyard of Champions."

The first section of the book discusses all of the "firsts" that occurred at Saratoga. Robyn Smith pioneered the way for female jockeys there as the first woman to ride and win at the Spa. Trainer Mary Hirsch, the first female to be granted a license from The Jockey Club and the first to saddle a Kentucky Derby runner, also became the first to win a race at Saratoga when she captured the Diana with No Sir, who she also owned. She is also the first and only female trainer to win the Travers S. in 1938 with Thanksgiving, which earned her her own chapter.

The book also details the stories of several Saratoga champions who were unfairly overlooked or who have faded from the limelight after their racing careers ended. Whichone was one of the best of his generation, but lost to Triple Crown Winner Gallant Fox in the Travers after suffering a career-ending injury. The tenacious filly Los Angeles won 16 stakes at the Spa and showed an obvious affinity for the track with 18 wins, six seconds, and one third in 25 starts. Her Spa record was bested by the horse the authors call "The Ultimate Saratoga Horse," Checkmate who had 19 wins and five seconds in 27 starts. The colt turned his career around at Saratoga, winning seven of his eight starts in his first season there.

With a historian as one of the authors, it is no surprise that this book is a compilation of facts and figures. One of the sections, entitled "Saratoga's Top 15 Fields," lists several historical fields chosen by Carter that contain multiple divisional champions and/or Hall of Famers. Many racing fans have heard the story of champion match races like those between Seabiscuit and War Admiral or Ruffian and Foolish Pleasure, but not many know the runners of the 1916 Saratoga H., which was the first loss for Regret, the first filly to win the GI Kentucky Derby.

The story and history of Saratoga have been told time and time again, but Carter and Kane show the reader a different perspective in this book. They tell the stories of the Spa that are not well-known, but deserve to be. Carter's adept knowledge and compilation ability as a historian combined with Kane's knack for storytelling breathe new life into the champions of the past and bring back into the limelight those that were undeservingly forgotten.

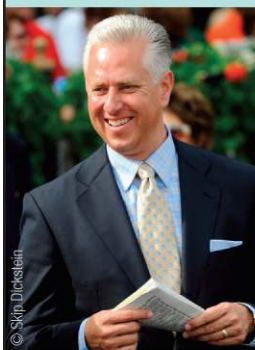

TRAINERS AND OWNERS ON STRIKE: A TRUE STORY

I suppose that in a country where employees engage in boss-napping (taking CEOs hostage in order to negotiate compensation for mass layoffs), where PTA members hide immigrant children who are threatened with deportation, and where in Operation Snail angry interest groups slow down traffic to make a point, it's not too much of a longshot to expect some sort bizarre protest to erupt at a French racetrack.

The eruption occurred July 4 at Dax, a small track in southwest France. At least six trainers who prolifically enter horses in low-level races in Paris and at rural tracks across the country decided to scratch a total of 35 horses from the Dax card. One of the rebellious trainers, Cedric Boutin, told the Parisien newspaper that, "Three of my horses came down with a fever just before getting on the road to Dax, and the other nine have upcoming races elsewhere."

Other trainers scratched "sans motif" (without a stated reason), which is permitted. If these trainers had expressed outright that they were scratching to protest, it would have meant fines of as much as the winning purse money.

For the past two years, France Galop has been adding restrictions on the subsidies paid to trainers for shipping horses. This began with a hike in the Value Added Tax on horse transactions. It was followed by a cap in the amount of shipping subsidy that any one horse can receive during a calendar year. Evidently, some of this belt-tightening is the result of guidelines from the European Commission.

In French racing, horses are not stabled at the track and most racing meets do not run day after day, so vanning is the primary way to get a horse to the track on raceday. The subsidizing of shipping for lower class horses has meant a renaissance of racing in smaller markets, and this in turn has led to a significant expansion in betting handle. The cost of shipping falls heaviest on the small owners who race more frequently for lower purses.

On July 4 at Dax, the effects of the trainer-owner protest rippled across the country. An example would be the second race, with 14 originally entered, with a featured Multi wager. In order to card a Multi bet, where the player must pick the top four finishers in any order, you need at least 14 horses in the field. For €3 you can play a Multi with four, five, six or seven horses. If you use 7 horses, for example, you receive 1/35 of the payout. With 14 runners, if you can get a longshot to finish fourth (or better), the payout can be generous. Hence, this is an extremely popular bet. But eight of the 14 horses declared as late scratches, which meant that the Multi had to be cancelled.

This meant an enormous amount of refunded tickets for those off-track bettors who played the Multi before the scratches, and a general loss of interest in other wagers on the race because of the small field.

According to the president of the Dax Racing Association, Jean-Louis Gayan Sourgen, this strike by the Association of Trainers and Owners cost the track €300,000, not a small sum considering Dax has only 15 racing days in 2013.

One trainer told me, "As for the transport subsidies, yes, I'm concerned about France Galop chipping away at them, because it's a marketing card that is useful in attracting owners, especially from England, where they end up paying exorbitant transport fees. I didn't know about the strike in Dax until it was happening, but I have to say hats-off to the trainers who actually cooperated to do it. There is an increasing frustration among smaller trainers (or big trainers with lots of small owners, like Boutin) that France Galop really doesn't have any use for anyone other than the Aga Khan and the Wertheimer brothers. Cutting the transport allocation the same time as the value-added tax went up is a blow toward keeping small owners in the game. Already two years ago, they eliminated any transport reimbursement for a horse that earned prize money of more than €6,000 in the day, and now that's been lowered to €5,000, too. I disagree that there are only 420 horses that have exceeded the proposed annual cap of €2,500 in transport subsidies. I'm sure horses at Cedric Boutin's yard are over the top on that limit."

From a bettor's point of view, the idea of playing dozens of different smaller tracks with large fields is seductive and enriching, at least in spirit.

France Galop responded with a communique that referred to "grave consequences," not without ambiguity, since these consequences to players, the track operators and the owners, trainers and jockeys of the scratched horses could refer simply to the aggravation and the money lost, rather than to any future sanctions.

Will the trainers and owners involved in the flash scratch strike be punished in some way? There have been no charges against boss-nappers, nor any punishment for parents who have hidden immigrant children in their homes to stop deportations. Farmers, truckers and students who have engaged in "operation snail" protests have never been pursued by the law. So, as an investigation proceeds, it is unlikely that France Galop will apply any sanctions. "If they try to unblock this situation with sanctions," according to the Paris-Turf, "it would be like adding oil to a fire that is already impassioned--it seems time to sit around a table and have a discussion."
