## SNOW FAIRY RETIRED

Cristina Patino's **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab--Woodland Dream {Ire}, by Charnwood Forest {Ire}) has been retired after another tendon injury sustained in a home spin yesterday morning. Successful six times at the top level, the dual Oaks winner was last seen beating the

colts in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown in September and was being coaxed back for a return to action by Ed Dunlop when the setback occurred. "It is with much sadness that a decision was

made this morning to retire Snow Fairy," the conditioner said in a statement. "Unfortunately after a routine piece of fast work today she was found to have re-injured her near-fore tendon, which has caused her problems in the last two years. I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank Mrs. Patino for all she has done, she has been the most wonderful owner of a truly amazing horse. Most owners would have retired her a lot sooner than she did, and if this had been the case, she would not have won the Irish Champion last year, which was without doubt her greatest performance. I would also like to thank all of my staff who have looked after her, ridden her and travelled her around the world." In total, the 6-year-old amassed nearly £4 million in prize money throughout four seasons of racing, which saw her complete the English and Irish Oaks double and go on to annex the G1 Hong Kong Cup in her sophomore year and the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup in 2010 and 2011. Sidelined off her second Kyoto victory by injury, she added Deauville's G1 Prix Jean Romanet to her tally last August only to be stripped of that contest when testing positive for a prohibited substance. On her last start, she beat Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Leopardstown feature and was being prepared for the Hong Kong International meeting when suffering further tendon problems. "She remains the only international horse to have won two Group 1s in Japan," Dunlop continued. Snow Fairy will return to Ireland, where I hope she will have a fantastic life as a broodmare."

## BC RELEASES BOARD ELECTION RESULTS

The Breeders' Cup announced election results for five positions to its Board of Directors, including newly elected members Bill Oppenheim (Journalist), J. David Richardson (Chief of Surgery, University of Louisville, M.D.) and Elliott Walden (WinStar Farm). Both Oppenheim and Richardson, along with Roy Jackson (Lael Stables), who was reelected to the Board, will all serve four-year terms. Barry Weisbord (*Thoroughbred Daily News*, Trakus) was also re-elected, and will serve a three-year term, fulfilling the expiring term of Oliver Tait. These individuals were elected by the 48 Breeders' Cup members whose voting concluded at the annual meeting Tuesday. Jerry Crawford and Walden finished in a tie for the final position in the election, which is a one-year term to fill the expiring term of David Willmot.

A runoff election by the members was scheduled to take place between July 22-26 to break the tie. Following the meeting, Crawford and Walden agreed to draw lots and that the person losing the drawing would withdraw from the runoff election in order to avoid the cost and inconvenience of the runoff. Walden won the draw and will serve a one-year term. In addition to the five newly elected/reelected members, the Board consists of Helen Alexander, Middlebrook Farm; Antony Beck, Gainesway Farm; William S. Farish Jr., Lane's End Farm; Craig Fravel, President & CEO of the Breeders' Cup; Bret Jones, Airdie Stud; Tom Ludt (Chairman), Vinery; Robert Manfuso, Chanceland Farm; Clem Murphy, Coolmore Stud; and Richard Santulli, Jayeff "B" Stables.

The owner's Racing Manager Patrick Cooper added, "We've had an unbelievable roll. It's come to an end, but that's the way it happens. We've had some fun along the way. She will go to Elusive Pimpernel. He is Mrs. Patino's horse and was a very good two-year-old a few seasons back. She will stay with Ed for a little while then she will come down to Islanmore Stud in Limerick." Dunlop, who also trained Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), paid his latest star the ultimate compliment yesterday. "On official ratings, Snow Fairy was the best," he added. "We know how hard it is to win any race in Japan, for a horse to win twice there makes her incredible." In total, Snow Fairy won eight of her 21 starts and was placed in another five Group 1 races.

### TATTS EXTEND OCTOBER SALE

Tattersalls yesterday announced that their October Yearling Sale will feature an extra day this year, with a fourth session added to Book 2. ## RACETRACK ROUND-UP

### Vyjack Readies for Jim Dandy...

**Vyjack** (Into Mischief), eighth in his latest start in the June 8 GI Belmont S., continued his preparations for the July 27 GII Jim Dandy S. with a five-furlong work over the main track at Saratoga Tuesday morning. Working in tandem with stablemate Colizeo (Distorted Humor), Vyjack--accompanied by trainer Rudy Rodriguez--completed the task in 1:00.07, the fastest of 17 moves at the distance yesterday. The gelding galloped out six panels in 1:12.84 before rounding out seven furlongs in 1:27.08. "The horse worked very good," Rodriguez told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's training very good over here. He had a very good work at Aqueduct too. Let's keep out fingers crossed."

Vyjack won his first four career starts, including the Jan. 5 GII Jerome S. followed by the Mar. 2 GIII Gotham S., both contested at the Big A. Third behind Verrazano (More Than Ready) in the GI Wood Memorial Apr. 6, the bay came home an uninspired 18th in the May 4 GI Kentucky Derby.

"We were wide the whole way around," Rodriguez told the publication. "Instead of saving a little ground through the stretch, we were wide again. I was not disappointed in the way he ran. He looked like he came back good."

**Novellist on Course for Ascot...**

Dr. Christoph Berglar's **Novellist (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) is being prepared for a tilt at the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot July 27, connections confirmed yesterday. Last seen winning the June 23 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, the 4-year-old was the subject of a positive bulletin from trainer Andreas Wohler yesterday. "He came out of Saint-Cloud really well and is in good form," he said. "We have always believed in the horse, and he is proving it now. He has to improve a bit further to win at Ascot, but he will head there in great shape. We have used a pacemaker for Novellist in the past, because he needs a strongly run race, but he won't have one at Ascot because we think that there will be a good pace. There's no rain forecast ahead of next week, and faster ground would be a slight concern for Novellist, but he is a very nice mover and should be fine on good-to-firm going. We would be happy to have Ryan Moore on board again, and it looks like he will be available. The King George is the summer Arc and a very important race in the worldwide calendar. The statistics would say that it is not possible, but it would be a dream to have back-to-back German winners of the contest." Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) scored a thrilling nose victory from Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in last year's renewal.

**Pletcher Preps for Summer Stakes...**

Trainer Todd Pletcher offers a pair of contenders in Saturday's GI Coaching Club American Oaks at Saratoga in the form of GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior) and GII Fair Ground Oaks winner **Unlimited Budget** (Street Sense). Princess of Sylmar, who worked four furlongs at the Spa in :48.54 July 14, proved she was a force to be reckoned with when she pulled off a huge upset in the Oaks, winning at odds of 38-1.

"We weren't surprised she was able to pull off the win," Pletcher said. "I think, at the time, everyone considered it to be one of the strongest Kentucky Oaks we've seen in a long time and I think with another strong performance, she can certainly validate herself as one of the leading 3-year-old fillies for sure. She's doing really well and I love the way she has been training."

Unlimited Budget heads into Saturday's race off of a sixth-place finish against the boys in the GI Belmont S. June 8.

"We decided to take a calculated risk [running in the Belmont] and not that she ran poorly, but a mile and half may be beyond her strength," Pletcher said. "We are cutting back to 1 1/8 miles, which suits her well. Her record prior to that was outstanding and, like I said, she didn't run poorly in the Belmont either."

John Velazquez will be aboard Unlimited Budget for the CCA Oaks and Javier Castellano gets the call on Princess of Sylmar.

Jockey Mike Smith, who accompanied Princess of Sylmar for her Oaks score, will be riding Royal Delta (Empire Maker) in the GI Delaware H. that afternoon.

Pletcher, also potent with his juvenile fillies, will be sending out at least one, possibly two, impressive debut winning young ladies in Friday's GIII Schuylerville S. on the Spa's opening day card. Known for his

success with 2-year-olds at Saratoga, Pletcher is looking for his fifth win in this renewal.

**Yes It's Liz** (Yes It's True), who won her five furlong unveiling in :57.99 at Belmont July 3, is one of the possible Stonestreet entries. Yes It's Liz would be running on just 16 days rest if she goes to the gate in the Schuylerville.

"She's very fast," Pletcher said. "She's a precocious kind of filly. We expected that type of performance from her. She has good gate speed. She came out of that race really well and that's why we thought about running her back."

The other possible entry is Stonestreet homebred **Elena Strikes** (Smart Strike), who was an impressive debut winner at Monmouth June 22.

"I think she'll appreciate the added distance where she can break and not have to be rushed," explained Pletcher. "She's a filly who has shown a lot of quality. She has been training really well up here and she has a good mind. She has been doing well since that maiden race." **cont. p6**

Pletcher has plenty of impressive colts gearing up for graded stakes both at Saratoga and elsewhere. GI Belmont S. hero **Palace Malice** (Curlin) worked five furlongs at Saratoga in 1:00.32 over the weekend in preparation for the July 27 GII Jim Dandy S.

“Palace Malice breezed on Sunday and he is doing super,” Pletcher said. “He has moved forward since the Belmont and is doing really well. We are excited to run him in the Jim Dandy.”

GI Wood Memorial victor **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) breezed five furlongs in 1:01.67 at Saratoga on Monday in preparation for Monmouth’s July 28 GI Haskell Invitational. Pletcher was happy with the work, as well as, the colt’s victory in Monmouth’s GIII Pegasus S. June 16 in preparation for the Haskell.

Pletcher’s turf stars **Charming Kitten** (Kitten’s Joy) and **Jack Milton** (War Front), who ran second and third, respectively, in the GII Virginia Derby July 13, are being prepared for their next outings.

“I haven’t really had a chance to talk to Mr. [Ken] Ramsey [owner of Charming Kitten] about what the plan is,” Pletcher said. “I would say the possibilities are the [GII National Racing] Hall of Fame [S.] or the [GI] Secretariat [S.]. I have had a chance to speak to Gary Barber and we are pointing Jack Milton to the Secretariat.”

**MCBURNEY BARN ENJOYING BIG RETURNS FROM SMALLER INVESTMENTS**

It's been difficult to ignore the success of the Pat McBurney barn through the first half of the Monmouth Park meet. The stable, a combined effort between McBurney and John Forbes, for whom McBurney was a long-time assistant before taking over the daily operations in 2007, has tallied 12 trips to the Oceanport winner's circle and is hitting at a 39% clip with over 80% in the money. The barn might be best known for their previous success with GII King's Bishop S. winner Tale of the

Cat (Storm Cat) and multiple graded stakes winner Get Serious (City Zip), both yearling purchases. Tale of the Cat fetched \$375,000 at Keeneland September in 1995 and Get Serious was a \$130,000 buy as a Fasig-Tipton October yearling in 2005. However, in recent years, the operation has targeted less-expensive yearlings with higher ceilings. Those smaller investments have certainly paid off.

Two weekends ago, McBurney racked up three wins with 3-year-olds purchased at yearling sales running under the colors of the BDL Stable, Peter Donnelly and Phantom House Farm. **Lucky Rag Doll** (Silver Train), a \$19,000 Fasig October purchase out of the Dehere mare Here Comes Chelsie, romped by 6 1/4 lengths in her third start last Friday ([video](#)). The big chestnut filly was second by 3/4 of a length in her debut May 18 and third with trouble by that same margin June 9. She is set to make her first start against winners while stretching out for the first time in Monmouth's ninth race this Friday.

The coupled entry of **Cheap Red Wine** (Spellbinder--Our Sophia, by Belong to Me) and **Lost City** (City Zip),

out of the unraced Cherokee Run dam Mayan, finished 1-3 in their maiden special weight debut last Sunday, with the former romping to a 10-length victory ([video](#)). A savvy approach to yearling sales has become the key to recent success in the McBurney stable. “We go to yearling sales now because the two-year-olds in training sales have gotten too expensive and you get a whole lot more pedigree as a yearling,” McBurney said

of his team’s new purchasing process. “Obviously, you don’t know what you’re getting,” he added of the downside.

Included on the sales selection team is Terry Gabriel, manager of Pelican State Thoroughbreds outside Folsom, Louisiana, who breaks the yearlings before they make it to

McBurney’s barn. “It’s a combination of John, myself and Terry,” McBurney noted of the sales drafting process. “We go to the sales with [trainer] Steve Brown and we all work together.”

The team has been able to identify individuals offering the best value at a certain price point using pedigree analysis and conformation inspection.

“John Forbes with Steve Brown have developed a pedigree number,” McBurney explained. “John has even expanded to another number, which gives the greatest chance to buy a stakes horse with a pedigree we can afford. At the sales we first look at conformation. After they get by me and Terry, we will divide up the list of possible purchases. If a horse gets past one of us, then all three of us go back and look at the horse again. Some get crossed off at that point. Anybody that makes it through to that point goes to the veterinarians. If they’ve already scoped the horse and it hasn’t passed, then they’ll tell us. If they haven’t done anything, they’ll look at the x-rays and do a scope.”

Like any good investment endeavor, McBurney, Forbes and Co. also try to remain diversified. “We try to divide it up between colts and fillies,” the trainer noted. “Everyone is heavier towards the colts, but we’ve learned that fillies can sell pretty good, too. A lot of the time, we might throw a horse out if we think it has too much of a turf pedigree. It almost seemed like for a couple of years the numbers were leaning towards turf horses.”

The BDL stable has been an integral part of McBurney’s impressive winning skein. The partnership is comprised of three longtime friends from New Jersey-- Bob Jones, Dennis Lynch and Lee Carr.

“I’ve know both Dennis and Lee for well over 20 years,” said Bob Jones. “We worked in New York together. Dennis ran his own investment management firm, Lee Carr was head of equity trading for Morgan Stanley and I was head of the sales force for Equitable Life. So, that’s how we came up with BDL--Bob, Dennis and Lee.

“The three of us were involved with trotters and then two of my partners bought a piece of [2007 Coronado’s Quest S. winner] Cable Boy [Jump Start],” Jones said of the beginning of the BDL’s involvement with Thoroughbred racing. “I spent the year with them meeting with John Forbes and Pat McBurney and got to know them very well. So, at the end of that year, the three of us formed BDL Stables.”

The partnership has had other success before this most recent hot streak, notably with Mary’s Follies (More Than Ready). Purchased for \$40,000 as a

yearling at Keeneland September in 2007, she made five starts--winning two of them and hitting the board in every attempt--before being purchased by Paul Pompa, Jr. for \$500,000.

The bay would go on to win the GIII Boiling Springs S. at Monmouth and GII Mrs. Revere S. at Churchill Downs in 2009.

Currently, the BDL partnership has five 2-year-olds and six 3-year-olds--among them the promising sophomore **Bob and the Gang** (Mizzen Mast). The half to multiple graded stakes winner Just Jenda (Menifee) was purchased for \$40,000 at Keeneland September and has posted two sharp front-running scores in his last three tries. The only 4-year-old in their arsenal is **Dr. Goldfarb** (Orientate), a \$25,000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic

buy. The bay has steadily improved throughout his career and has two wins at the meet--an impressive allowance score May 26 ([video](#)) and a victory in a handicap on Sunday ([video](#)).

"The BDL plan is that the 2-year-old year is a gimme because you never know," McBurney said. "Hopefully, everyone makes it to the races in their 3-year-old year, so they can be evaluated. If they're not allowance or stakes horses, they're either sold or raced aggressively to be claimed to make room for the 2-year-olds coming up and, hopefully, we have enough to go back to the yearling sale again."

The barn hopes its buying strategy has loaded the pipeline for the upcoming years as well. "We have a Jump Start colt [out of Green Jeans {Green Dancer} who fetched \$35,000 at Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall] who, right at this moment, is doing very well," McBurney said when asked about the promising 2-year-olds in the barn. "And an Exchange Rate filly [out of Two Punch mare Winning Punch, who was purchased for \$40,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall sale]. A Northern Afleet filly, [the first foal out of This Cat Can Dance {Vindication} went for \$50,000 at Fasig-Tipton Fall] was the most expensive from last year. She's a gorgeous little filly. And we have a little Stroll colt [out of Miss Barbara {Miner's Mark} purchased for \$19,000 also at that sale] who acts like he's okay, too."

As for the stable's current success, the conditioner attributes it to a solid stock and a little help from the condition book.

"We did go to Gulfstream this winter and the horses that came out of there all seemed to be running well," commented McBurney. "The competition down there is very tough. Also, the condition book had worked the first three or four weeks. Every race we entered went and that was a little different from the previous year."

Of the partnership's commitment to New Jersey racing, Jones said, "We really enjoy Thoroughbred racing and we enjoy it at Monmouth. I have four kids who live within 10 minutes of the park and they've all become involved.

**\$20-MILLION DAY**

It had been since 2009, when their July sale was a two-day yearling event, that Fasig-Tipton grossed over \$20-million at the yearling sales season opener. There were a lot of smiling faces around the Fasig pavilion Monday night; they sold just 163 yearlings, which was 14% fewer than in 2012, but the gross of \$14,635,000 was just 5% below last year's, the average of \$89,785 was up 10% and the median of \$72,000 was up an impressive 20%. It was a strong sale from start to finish. But the other reason Fasig officials were smiling was the \$5,819,000 grossed by 55 horses of racing age, topped by a \$1-million filly, GI Princess Rooney H. heroine Starship Truffles (Ghostzapper) and an \$800,000 colt, the 3-year-old Eastwood

(Speightstown). Taken together, the two Monday sessions grossed \$20,454,000; no doubt, we'll be seeing more of these racehorse sales.

I don't think you can really call something a 'bull' market until the averages can be sustained with growing rather than shrinking numbers, but all the same, it was a strong yearling market, featuring plenty of demand for the supply. Nine stallions with three or more catalogued averaged over \$100,000, with WinStar stallions capturing the title for overall leader by average--**Bellamy Road**, from his last Paul's Mill season before moving to WinStar, had three sell, for an average of \$191,667--and leading first-year sire by average, the 2010 GI Kentucky Derby winner, **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon), who had three sell for an average of \$178,333. WinStar also had the number two sire on average, the promising freshman sire **Pioneer of the Nile** (Empire Maker), whose two sold averaged \$180,000. A fourth WinStar sire to average six figures was **Harlan's Holiday**, who had the distinction of having eight catalogued, eight through the ring, and eight sold, for an average of \$105,375. Other established sires to average over \$100,000 were: Spendthrift's **Malibu Moon** (four sold, average \$135,000); Hill 'n' Dale's hot second-crop sire **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet; three averaged \$126,667); and Three Chimneys' Exchange Rate (three sold, average \$113,333). **Cont. p11**

Besides Super Saver, two other first-year sires registered six-figure averages: Darley's **Desert Party** (Street Cry), who was transferred from Kentucky to Sequel Stallions in New York this year, averaged \$125,200 with five sold, including the yearling sales-topping \$460,000 filly; and Spendthrift's **Warrior's Reward** (Medaglia d'Oro), who had six sell for an average of \$103,333. Darby Dan's **Tale of Ekati** (Tale of the Cat) averaged \$93,333 with three sold; Darley's **Midshipman** (Unbridled's Song), winner of the 2008 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, had two average \$87,500, marginally ahead of Airdrie's **Majesticperfection** (Harlan's Holiday), whose five sold averaged \$83,600. Other first-year sires which had three or more catalogued included: Spendthrift's **Line of David** (Lion Heart, 4/\$73,000); WinStar's **Hold Me Back** (Giant's Causeway, 3/\$64,000); Lane's End's **Discreetly Mine** (Mineshaft, 5/\$63,000); Ashford's **Munnings** (Speightstown, 4/\$62,750); former WinStar (now Japanese) stallion **Summer Bird** (Birdstone, 3/\$39,000); and Lane's End's **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality, 2/\$37,000).

Top F2006 (first foals 2006) sires Tapit (2 sold, average \$275,000) and Speightstown (2/\$162,500), who stand at Gainesway and WinStar, respectively, were among four other sires with two sold which averaged over \$100,000. The other two were: Airdrie's **Flashy Bull** (2/\$125,000); and Ashford's **Tale of the Cat** (2/\$103,500).

One very striking aspect of Monday's sales was the continuing prominence of new, American-based operations at the top of the charts. Whisper Hill Farm (Mandy Pope), Regis Farms (Nat Rea), Conquest Stable (Ernie Semersky and Dory Newell), and Wounded Warrior Stable (Chris McEwen) are all relatively new to the business, and that alone is cause for optimism that North American racing, in spite of our many and well-documented problems, still has a future as a high-end sector of the entertainment business. With new investment also, particularly in Europe, from Qatari and other Middle Eastern and Asian and Southern Hemisphere interests, the outlook for the 2013 yearling sale season looks reasonably bright. A rising tide lifts all boats.

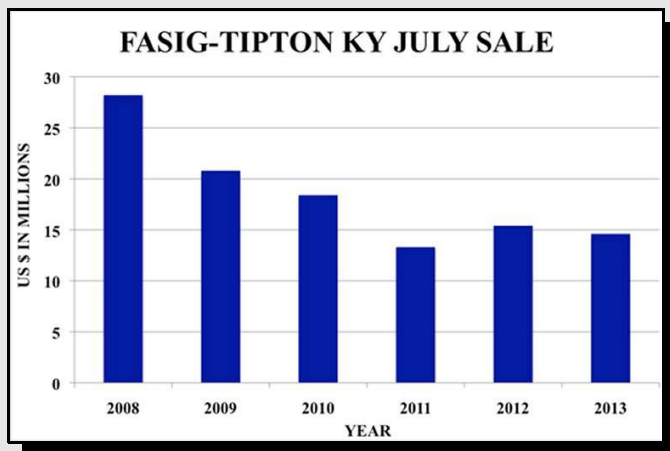

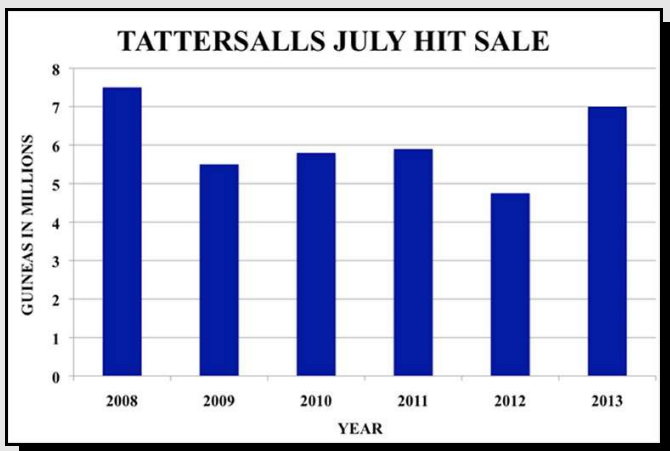

**DUTROW FAILS IN RENEWED ATTEMPT TO HAVE SUSPENSION OVERTURNED**

Trainer Richard Dutrow Jr. suffered a setback Tuesday in an attempt to overturn a 10-year suspension imposed by New York State regulators.

Judge Edward O. Spain of the New York Supreme Court, Appellate Division refused to sign a show cause order that could allow Dutrow's case to be re-opened to introduce new evidence.

Dutrow, 54, was handed the suspension by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board in October 2011, but was able to continue training until he exhausted his legal options in January 2013. The duties of the Racing and Wagering Board were absorbed by the New York State Gaming Commission in February.

"Mr. Dutrow's suspension remains in effect and there is no reason to expect it to change," said Lee Park, spokesman for the Gaming Commission.

Dutrow, who won the 2008 Kentucky Derby and Preakness with Big Brown, has a long history of fines and suspensions for major and minor violations of the rules. In 2011, he appealed a 90-day suspension from New York regulators for two separate incidents in November, 2010, the discovery of syringes in his office at Aqueduct Racetrack and a post-race positive at Aqueduct.

In his report following a three-day hearing in May 2011 the hearing officer recommended that Dutrow's license be permanently revoked and that he be fined \$50,000 because his "conduct at racetracks in New York State and elsewhere has been improper, obnoxious, unbecoming, and detrimental to the best interests of racing."

The three-person Racing and Wagering Board decided to impose a 10-year suspension.

### GULFSTREAM SIGNS AGREEMENT WITH FHBPA

Gulfstream Park announced Monday that it has signed a contract with the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, effective immediately, and will run through Nov. 28. The contract signed between Gulfstream and the FHBPA is for purses and other operational matters. The contract for summer racing is separate from the contract for Gulfstream's Champions Meet and will not affect the purses for the traditional season that begins Nov. 29. "Our agreement with the FHBPA reflects our common goals to build a stronger summer Thorough-bred program in Florida," said Gulfstream Park President Tim Ritvo. "We're proud of what we've accomplished after just six summer racing days. We can see excitement and energy growing and we can't wait to build on that over the next several months." FHBPA President Phil Combest added, "The FHBPA Board of Directors is extremely pleased with the agreement we reached with Gulfstream. Not only are its conditions fair to the horsemen, but the contract includes incentives which address the ever rising costs of workers compensation insurance.
