'BRYAN' HITS THE WIRE AHEAD

It didn't take long for trainer Michael Dilger to tally up his first graded victory. Just six months after going out

on his own, the former Todd Pletcher assistant looked much like his mentor when 2-year-old **Wired Bryan** (Stormy Atlantic) took the Gil Sanford S. at Saratoga Sunday. The gray was away well and set the early pace, covering the opening quarter in :22.40.

Hollywood Talent (Talent Search) moved up from the outside to take the lead late on the backstretch and

through the home turn. The generous 7-1 shot rated for a few strides before moving up to rebid entering the straight. Once in front, the Anstus homebred happily pulled away to finish under a hand ride. "Today is my first stakes winner and first stakes runner," Dilger said after the race. "Sorry, I'm hoarse. I was cheering a little bit. He's New York bred; there were no restricted stakes races until later on in the year. The timing fit to run him here.

"I told [winning rider] Shaun [Bridgmohan] to be close and if he was on the lead, that's fine," the trainer continued. "He's very relaxed in the gate; he breaks super sharp; that early speed is his weapon. So, rather than tell him to sit handy and make a run, let the horse do what's natural for him. I was a little nervous when he got headed, when [jockey] Joel [Rosario, the pilot of Hollywood Talent] came up on his outside. I have to admit, I was a bit nervous at that point. Shaun came back and said he's not a one-dimensional horse. He's a horse that can rate if we need him to. We learned a lot from the horse today."

"You can see what a phenomenal job Mike's done with this horse," commented Bridgmohan. "He was a total professional. He left the gate running and he had running on his mind. For a young horse to be down on the fence like that--he got passed around the turn and he showed enough heart to come back and put them away late. He's a pretty decent little horse. He did relax pretty good. I told Mike I don't think he's strictly a speed horse and has to be on the lead; I think he'll settle and that will make him more effective. He's a very smart horse. I'm happy I was the chosen pilot."

His own worst enemy on his last start when his increasingly slow-starting tendencies cost him the

G3 Prix de Guiche at Chantilly May 14, **Triple Threat (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}) emerged from a subsequent break on his best behavior, and duly flaunted the full extent of his talent in Sunday's G2 Grand Prix De

Maisons-Laffitte. Having flashed above-average ability when besting subsequent Pattern-race performer Park Reel (Fr) (Country Reel) in a mile conditions event at Saint-Cloud in October, the homebred returned to that track and trip the following month to finish fourth in the G1 Criterium International. Losing ground at the beginning of the G3 Prix la Force on his seasonal bow, the bay still managed to prevail in that 10-furlong Classic trial at Longchamp Apr. 7, but his tardiness out of the gates became more exaggerated in the Prix de Guiche, where he faced better-class rivals.

Favored Debt Ceiling (Discreet Cat) was rank down the backstretch, was forced to check and was unable to get back in the action and finished last in the six-horse field. "He just got away from him down the backside and ran up on horses' heels," said John Robb, trainer of the Gill Bashford Manor S. winner. "[He] just had a horrible trip, that's all."

Wired Bryan's only previous career start was a highly successful one. The front-running chance romped by 7 1/4 lengths against Empire-breds going five furlongs June. 19.

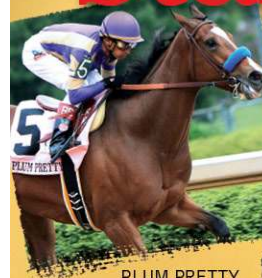

The dark bay began his career against \$32,000 taggers here in 2011 and has gradually stepped up in class throughout his career. He tried his hand against graded company to close out last year with a fifth in the GIII Valedictory S. going 1 3/4 miles over this track Dec. 16. So Long George kicked off this year with an optional claiming victory going seven panels on the turf June 1 and was fourth by only a half-length in the GII King Edward S. on that surface June 23. "When I first got him, he was life and death to make time breezing," said Charalambous. "To be standing here [in the winner's circle] is pretty exciting. He just kept stepping up and stepping up. We put him in tougher races and he responded. You don't know how proud I am of this horse."

Since graduating in her second start over this course and distance Aug. 8, Wishing Gate was eighth in the Oak Tree Juvenile Fillies Turf S. in September, followed by a solid runner-up effort in Santa Anita's Surfer Girl S. in October. She never factored when eighth in her seasonal debut going 1 1/8 miles in a Keeneland allowance Apr. 21, but was a much-improved second going 1 1/16 miles at Arlington Park May 18.

In her most recent start, the Glen Hill homebred returned to her winning ways in an Arlington optional claimer June 23.

Wishing Gate rated off the pace in the two path through the opening stages. She began to improve her position late in the backstretch and crept closer into contention. The bay angled out to the two path entering the stretch and challenged Unusual Way. The two matched strides briefly before Wishing Gate pulled ahead and kicked clear to her first graded score.

"This gets me right; this redeems me," said winning jockey Gary Stevens. "I rode this filly in an allowance race at Keeneland this spring and I absolutely butchered her. Cost her the race, for sure. So, to win this one today on her helps make up for that one. She's a good filly and she's progressing. It sure is great to be winning at the highest level. That's why I came back. To win one at Del Mar is special. And I know this track is special for Mr. [Leonard] Lavin [owner of Glen Hill Farm]. I know he's somewhere today--probably Chicago--watching this and I'm sure it made him happy."

"That ride was perfect," commented winning trainer Tom Proctor. "You couldn't ask for a better trip. It's a pretty fair turf course. I didn't think about the pace. I don't think a whole lot. I just hope for the best. Now you'd have to think about the [GI Del Mar] Oaks [Aug. 17]."

Wishing gate is out is out of multiple graded stakes winning Glenhill homebred Rich in Spirit. Second dam Qualitative was purchased for \$200,000 as a Keeneland July yearling in 1996.

TRIPLE THREAT ON UPWARD ARC

Team Valor International and Gary Barber's Triple Threat (Monsun) looked like the ultimate professional when registering a two length score in yesterday's G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte, bidding his time near the back of the pack before descending with a sweeping move inside the final furlong to prove much the best. The victory provided marked relief for the connections of the promising 3-year-old, who has managed to flash his talent

despite causing trouble at the gate in his two previous starts this term.

A winner in his third outing last year, Triple Threat wrapped up the season with a fourth-place finish in Saint-Cloud's G1 Gran Criterium. The Andre Fabre-charged managed victory in his sophomore debut in the G3 Prix la Force at Longchamp Apr. 7 despite breaking slowly, a problem that was exaggerated in his next outing in the G3 Prix de Guiche May 14, costing him the race.

"Last year he had no problem leaving the gate," explained Team Valor Chief Executive Officer Barry Irwin. "This year, in both his races, he stayed in the gate. The first time he stayed in a little bit; he probably lost four lengths. The next time he stayed in the gate for two full seconds."

To rectify the dark bay's issues, Irwin called on renowned natural horseman Monty Roberts, who traveled to France and spent 2 1/2 weeks working with Triple Threat daily.

"It turns out the horse is sensitive about anything touching his stifles," Irwin said. "So, they used a blanket on him, and he's got some other techniques that he uses, and he got the horse over it, thank God. I was hoping we could run him in the French Derby, but by the time [Roberts] got finished working with the horse, he was sapped, and he needed a few weeks off."

Judging by yesterday's victory, Triple Threat is back to his best, and his ownership group is now looking ahead to the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 6.

of smart miler Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire})--Irwin said he believes the colt's sire line, as well as his own constitution, will help see him through the 1 1/2 miles of France's greatest race.

"The way he finished up today, he was strongest at the end, and [jockey

Pierre-Charles Boudot] eased him up," Irwin said. "I talked to Andre's wife, Elizabeth, and I said, 'what do you think about 1 1/2 miles?' She said it doesn't look like it would be any problem after this race."

Triple Threat is one of just a handful of horses--"two racehorses, one broodmare and a couple foals"--that Team Valor keeps in France. Team Valor and Barber raced Triple Threat's sister, Pina Colada, in partnership, which prompted Irwin to purchase the dam, Drei (Lyphard).

"I liked [Pina Colada], and I love Lyphard," Irwin noted. "Every once in a while, when we have something that we like or that we know about that no one else does, we try to go out and buy the dam. So we bought her privately in Ireland and bred from her for several years and retired her."

While Irwin has no plans to expand his operations in France, he did note his desire to use Triple Threat as a stallion down the road.

"This horse is a race away from going to stud, and he is a terrific looking horse," he said. "He looks like a miler, and I would be anxious to breed to him. I love the way he looks."

Irwin said that while the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe is the long term target for Triple Threat, he was unsure what would come next.

"It was really hot [in France] today--it was 90-something degrees," Irwin said. "So I'm sure Andre's going to want to wait a while just to see how the race impacted him." --*Kelsey Riley*

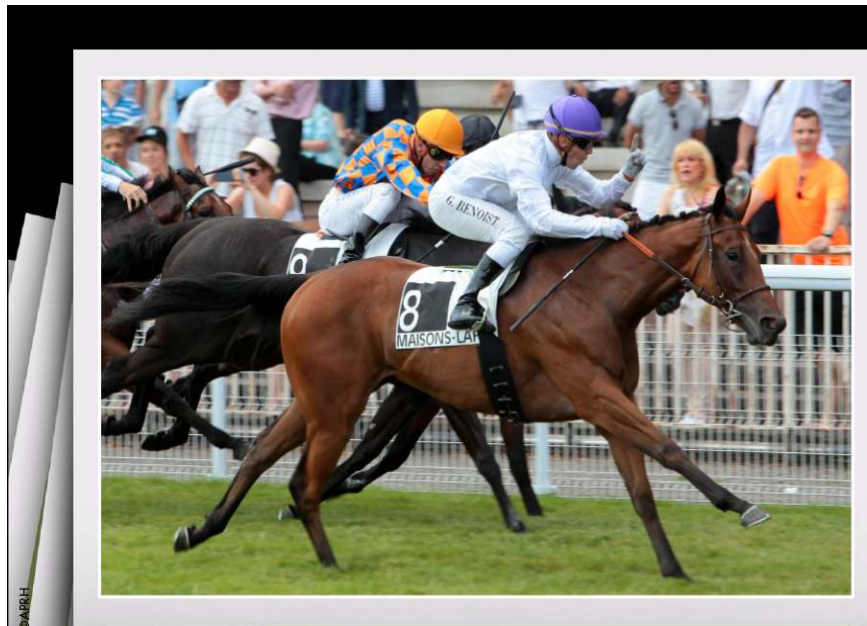

She has a great temperament, and if she continues to improve I would presume she would try to win a Group 1."

Palace Malice Gears Up for Jim Dandy...

GI Belmont S. upset winner **Palace Malice** (Curlin) worked four panels in :49.77 (34/95) at Saratoga Sunday in his final work before Saturday's GII Jim Dandy S. ([video](#)). The Dogwood Stable colorbearer ran the first quarter in :25.00 and was never prompted by exercise rider Jake Nelson.

"I thought he worked very well," said Todd Pletcher. "We were looking for a little easier work than he's been getting and that was executed well, good gallop out, seems like he's in good form. I think he's done super since the Belmont. If anything, he's gotten bigger and stronger, and it seems like he took that race really well. He's getting better all the time. He's been really push-button. We breezed him by himself for the first time after the Belmont, and I wasn't sure what to expect, but he seems to handle that really well. He was relaxed, but he picked it up when he needed to."

Paynter/Liaison Work Ahead of San Diego...

Zayat Stables' **Paynter** (Awesome Again) and Arnold Zetcher's **Liaison** (Indian Charlie) put in their final preparatory move ahead of Saturday's GII San Diego S. at Del Mar. Sent out in tandem at 8 a.m. Sunday, Liaison, with Martin Garcia, broke off two lengths in front of Rafael Bejarano aboard his stablemate and the duo maintained that cushion between them through a quarter in :24. Paynter joined Liaison in the stretch, and the pair completed the task with the former getting a half mile in :47.20, and the latter was caught in :47.60. According to Del Mar clocker Toby Turrell, the duo completed their respective five-furlong moves about a length apart, with Paynter getting the faster time, officially in :59.40. Liaison stopped the clock in :59.60.

"Both horses went strong with Liaison gaining a slight edge on the gallop out," said Turrell.

It was the second work in company over the track for Liaison and Paynter. They also went five furlongs July 15, with Paynter getting the distance in 1:00.40 and Liaison completing the task in 1:00.60.

"Liaison worked good, looks good and is as ready as I can get him for next week," Baffert told owner Arnold Zetcher, who was alongside in the grandstand to watch the exercise. "They both went well," Baffert said. "All systems are go. The plan is to run them both in the San Diego if everything goes right."

Paynter, runner up in last spring's GI Belmont S., rounded out the season with an impressive victory in the GI Haskell Invitational in July. In his seasonal return, the bay came home a 4 1/2-length winner in a June 14 allowance at Betfair Hollywood Park. Liaison, victorious in the GI CashCall Futurity at two, hit the board in a trio of graded events at three, including Saratoga's GII Jim Dandy S. The bay kicked off this term with a score in the GII Mervin Leroy H. at Betfair Hollywood Park May 4 before finishing second in the June 1 GII Californian S.

Pletcher Fillies Exit Weekend Races Well...

Both GI TVG Coaching Club American Oaks victress **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior) and GIII Shuvee H. winner **Authenticity** (Quiet American) came out of the weekend in good form, according to conditioner Todd Pletcher. Princess of Sylmar, who took Saturday's affair off an impressive longshot victory in the May 3 GI Kentucky Oaks, will aim for a start in the GI Alabama S. Aug. 17. Authenticity is scheduled for the GI Personal Ensign Aug. 25, where she is expected to face reigning GI Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic winner Royal Delta (Empire Maker). The Bill Mott pupil cruised to a 10 3/4 length win in Saturday's GI Delaware H. "Obviously, if the Royal Delta that ran [Saturday] shows up in the Personal Ensign, we're all running for second," said Pletcher. "We'll give it a try anyway."

Todd Pletcher sent out several noteworthy runners Sunday morning. **Kauai Katie** (Malibu Moon), in company with GI Arkansas Derby winner **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union), worked four furlongs in :50.03 (43/95). "Neither are overly enthusiastic work horses; they tend to run better than they breeze, so I thought they'd make good [work] mates," Pletcher noted. "They were head-and-head throughout and went well. Kauai Katie is aimed for a start in Saturday's six-furlong GI Prioress S., while Overanalyze is being pointed towards the GII West Virginia Derby at Mountaineer Aug. 3. "Kauai Katie is good at six furlongs," Pletcher continued. "I think she handles seven very well also. We're hoping for a favorable post position draw. She showed she likes Saratoga here last year [maiden win and Grade II Adirondack S. victory], so we'll see what we can do."

Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song), who was just caught by Sahara Sky (Pleasant Tap) on the line of Belmont's GI Metropolitan H. last time out May 27, worked in company with **Midnight Taboo** (Langfuhr), covering five panels in 1:00.86 (5/34). The gray is being aimed for the GI Whitney Invitational H. Aug. 3. "It's going to be interesting," Pletcher said of the upcoming start. "He's been so fast, it's hard to imagine him being too far off the pace going 1 1/8 miles, but there is some other speed in there, so we'll just have to see. We're not going to look to take him back, but hopefully, he will relax a little bit going two turns. I think he's got the type of personality that suggests he will."

Lukas Duo Breezes Through Stretch...

Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas sent out GI Preakness S. winner **Oxbow** (Awesome Again) and GII Rebel S. victor **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) to breeze through the stretch Sunday morning at Saratoga. "Because of the heat and everything we'd been having, I didn't want to put another stressful work into them," noted Lukas. "They're dead fit. I just let them come off the turn and they breezed pretty strong through the stretch." The Calumet Farm colorbearer will run in Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park, while Will Take Charge will head to the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga Saturday. "From a standpoint of their dispositions and condition, I thought it was better that Will Take Charge remain here for the Jim Dandy and run out of his own stall rather than ship again," Lukas explained. "I didn't want to ship him again. I thought it would serve him [better] to take this one trying to get to the [GI] Travers [S. Aug. 24]."

Glorious View to Honorable Miss...

The Bill-Mott trained **Glorious View** (Pleasant Tap) will head to Saratoga's GII Honorable Miss S. at Saratoga July 29. Although it took the bay seven starts to break her maiden, she has since won an allowance at Aqueduct Mar. 10, an optional claimer there Mar. 11 and Belmont's GII Vagrancy H. May 15. "She's at Belmont and will work Monday or Tuesday and come up right after," said her conditioner.

Eblouissante With Minor Injuries After Shuvee...

☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Eblouissante** (Berardini) exited Saturday's GIII Shuvee H. with minor injuries after acting up in the gate. "She got banged up, but it's all pretty superficial," said trainer John Shirreffs. "She broke two teeth and grabbed herself in a couple spots on her legs, but nothing really serious. I feel really lucky that she didn't seriously injure herself. I think that's a credit to the assistant starter, who kept her from flipping over and getting underneath the gate. It was a bad situation but not a tragedy." The half-sister to champion Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) finished last of six.

"For her, it was [over at the start]. She lost all her focus and everything," Shirreffs said. "Obviously, it's disappointing, but it's one of those things that happens with horses. You can't always predict the outcome or what they're going to do. You just accept it and try to improve."

As for her next spot, Shirreffs said, "We're going to spend a lot of time in the gate and get over whatever it was that set her off. Then we'll just come back and start over again. We'll look to bring her back probably in a little lower-profile race," he said. "It's hard to say until we get her back on the track."



Bridgehampton to Skip Prioress...

Gill Victory Ride S. runner-up **Bridgehampton** (Bernardini) will skip Saturday's GI Prioress S. after spiking a fever, according to trainer Mike Hushion. "She'll probably miss a week," Hushion said. "We'll give her two weeks to get back, so it'll probably be three weeks from now when she'll be ready to run. We'll wait and see."

Micromanage to Contest Haskell Invitational...

Repole Stable's **Micromanage** (Medaglia d'Oro) is set to make a start in Monmouth Park's GI Haskell Invitational Sunday. The Todd Pletcher trainee won the July 7 1 1/16 miles Long Branch S., a prep for the jewel of the Oceanport meet, by 4 1/2 lengths after being fanned extremely wide around the first turn and rallying in the stretch ([video](#)). "His win in the Long Branch was very impressive," said Mike Repole. "He overcame a lot of trouble to win going away. He is two-for-two over the track [with a previous victory in an sloppy optional claimer May 11] and he is getting better every start. It looks like there will be a good pace and the added distance will help. It's very exciting to have a horse in the Haskell."

Pulford continued, "In addition, if our clients are the successful bidders in the online auction on a stallion to which they already hold a 2013 nomination, we will amend their contract should they be fortunate enough to buy it in the auction for a lower price."

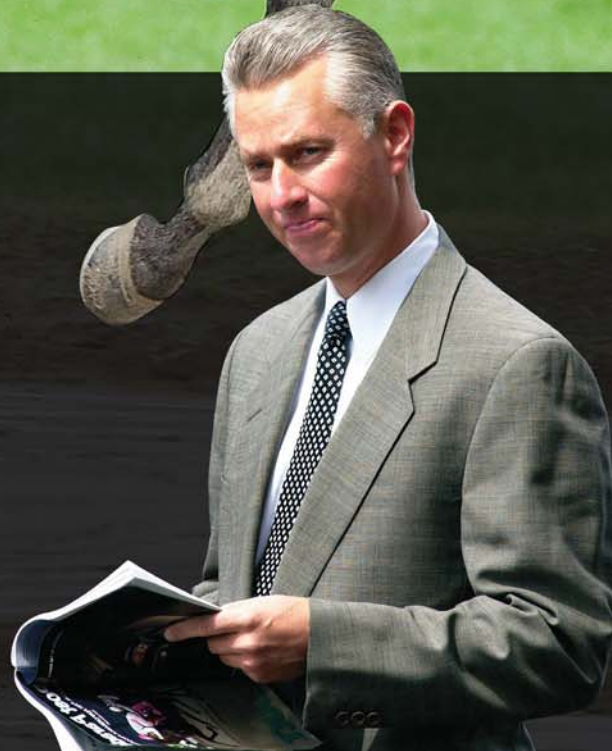
