Seven colts will line up in today's GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park looking to gain a foothold at the top of a wide open sophomore division.

Let's Go Stables and Coolmore's **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) is the 9-5 morning-line choice in the nine-furlong event. The bay colt has already packed a lot into 2013; he debuted with a **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★** effort at Gulfstream on New Year's Day, added the Mar. 9 GI Tampa Bay Derby two

starts later and returned to take the Apr. 6 GI Wood Memorial. Verrazano suffered his first loss when 14th in the GI Kentucky Derby, but returned to his winning ways with a 9 1/4-length romp in the June 16 GIII Pegasus S. "We threw a lot at him in a short time this year," admitted Let's Go Stable's Bryan Sullivan. "He went from an unraced 2-year-old into the Derby, which is an incredibly tough race. But right after the Derby, we drew a circle around the Haskell as our goal, and we used the Pegasus S. to get here. That race showed us he likes this track a lot. If he can duplicate that race, we'll be in good shape on Sunday." **Cont. p3**

A LAUGHER IN THE DIANA

Accomplished in 2012, Richard Santulli's **Laughing (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) led home a one-two finish for the English stallion in Saturday's GI Diana S. at Saratoga. Allowed to set the standard through opening splits of :24 1/5 and :49, the bay was narrowly ahead of favored **Center Court** (Smart Strike) following three quarters in 1:12 2/5. Set down for the drive in the lane, she held off fellow Irish-bred **Dream Peace (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) by a head at the wire, with the closing **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) back in third. **Cont. p7**

READ ALL ABOUT IT!

Following in the steps of Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) 12 months ago, Dr Christoph Berglar's **Novellist (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) took yesterday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. back to Germany in style under the deputizing Johnny Murtagh. Coming of age when winning the June 23 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud last time, the 13-2 shot took another leap up the ladder by slamming **Trading Leather (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) by five lengths and smashing the track record in the process. "He's a very high-class horse with a good engine and is up there with all the King George winners I've ridden," his rider said after steering his fourth winner of this race. "He feels like a very good horse and the hardest part was pulling him up afterwards." **Cont. p4**

KING OF THE CASTLE

Verrazano is joined by fellow Triple Crown veterans **Golden Soul** (Perfect Soul {Ire}), runner-up in the Derby; GI Preakness winner **Oxbow** (Awesome Again); and Derby and Belmont also-ran **Vyjack** (Into Mischief).

Calumet Farm's Oxbow was a troubled sixth in the Derby, but found his moment to shine with a front-running tally in the Preakness. He makes his first start since running second behind yesterday's GI Jim Dandy winner Palace Malice (Curlin) in the June 8 GI Belmont S. "I'm looking for a big effort from him Sunday," said jockey Gary Stevens. "I talked to [trainer] Wayne [Lukas] and he's happy where the horse is right now."

Golden Soul, still looking for his first graded score, was 34-1 when second to Orb (Malibu Moon) in the Derby. The Charles Fipke homebred makes his first start since a ninth in the Belmont and the late-running colt faces a speed-favoring Monmouth track. "I would expect him to be no more than seven to 10 lengths back early in the race," said trainer Dallas Stewart. "He can make his run from there. The horse looks right now like he's on his game. I'm very happy with him coming into the Haskell." Repole Stable's **Micromanage** (Medaglia d'Oro) overcame traffic to take the July 7 Long Branch S. over the Monmouth oval.

Emory Hamilton went to \$100,000 to acquire Too Chic (Blushing Groom {Fr}) as a Fasig-Tipton yearling back in 1980, and the longtime owner/breeder continues to be rewarded for that shrewd investment.

Let's Go Stable, Michael Tabor, Mrs. John Magnier and Derrick Smith's **Verrazano** (More Than Ready), the 9-5 morning-line favorite in Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park, is one of five Grade I winners, all bred by Hamilton, that can be traced back to the GI Maskette S. heroine and GI Alabama S. runner-up. Chic Shirine (Mr. Prospector), Serra Lake (Seattle Slew) and champion Queena (Mr. Prospector)--all bred and campaigned by Hamilton--and Brahms (Danzig), a \$1-million Keeneland July graduate, complete

the honor roll.

"Too Chic was brilliant, but fractured a cannon bone before she could really do her thing--she only ran from May through September [as a 3-year-old]," Hamilton commented. "I loved Mr. Prospector, and her two daughters [by him] were both Grade I winners [Chic Shirine and Queena]--that was huge."

Hamilton, the daughter of prominent owner/breeder Helen Groves, has bred an additional 10 graded stakes winners from the same family, including Al Khali (Medaglia d'Oro), Chief Havoc (Giant's Causeway), Coal Play (Mineshaft), Hungry Island (More Than Ready), La Reina (A.P. Indy), Soaring Empire (Empire Maker), and Tara Roma (Lyphard).

Hamilton added, "Obviously, I'm very pleased with the family. I've tried to keep most of them, but I'll be reluctantly selling a filly out of Flying Passage [Medaglia d'Oro half-sister to Hungry Island and Soaring Empire] in September. It's business."

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Verrazano, a \$250,000 KEESEP yearling, counts Too Chic as his third dam. The GI Wood Memorial S. hero was produced by the Giant's Causeway mare Enchanted Rock, who was retired after finishing a distant 10th in her lone career start on the Belmont lawn. The 9-year-old's first foal was GII Risen Star S. winner El Padrino (Pulpit), a \$210,000 KEESEP yearling graduate.

Hamilton has high hopes for Enchanted Rock's unraced 2-year-old filly by Tapit. Named La Madrina, she is currently in training with Shug McGaughey. Enchanted Rock, one of approximately 10 of Hamilton's broodmare band, is also the dam of a yearling filly by Pulpit; she foaled a colt by the late Claiborne stallion earlier this spring.

Enchanted Rock, a half-sister to the dam of Hungry Island, Soaring Empire and ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Tokyo Time (Medaglia d'Oro), was bred back to leading sire More Than Ready this spring, and is currently carrying a colt.

"I don't think that there were super high hopes for Enchanted Rock [as a racehorse], but she was okay," Hamilton revealed. "She was just very big and was going to need a lot of time. We ran out of the time part when she got hurt, so the decision was made to retire her. More Than Ready is pretty much an outcross, and like I said, she's a very big mare. I've tried to breed her to stallions that aren't too big, and have some speed."

With three different winners of the Triple Crown series and the second half of the season officially underway this weekend, Hamilton believes that the 3-year-old title is up for the taking. Verrazano made amends for a 14th-place finish in the GI Kentucky Derby with a runaway win in Monmouth's GIII Pegasus S. last time June 16.

"Verrazano will do well in the Haskell, and hopefully, he'll win it," Hamilton concluded. "There's a toss-up amongst the 3-year-olds right now with no definite leader after the Triple Crown races, so we'll see how things sort themselves out in the next couple of months." --*Steve Sherack*

Novellist had a mighty reputation prior to the G1 Deutsches Derby last July, and it was warranted after he won the G3 Albert Von Metzler-Rennen at Frankfurt and Cologne's G2 Oppenheim-Union-Rennen by a combined margin of 11 lengths. In the event, what had looked a sure bet turned into anti-climax as he was stripped of his unbeaten record by Pastorius (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) in the Hamburg Classic, and then flopped when fourth in the G1 Grosser

Preis von Baden in September. Andreas Wohler stated that he had excuses for both reversals and kept the faith, sending him to Italy for a confidence-restoring win in the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club Italiano at San Siro in October. His return success in the G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Unternehmer over 11 furlongs May 12 was workmanlike, but he showed in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud that he was moving forward at a rate of knots under a highly complimentary Ryan Moore. **Cont. p5**

That rider missed out due to his commitment to Freemason Lodge and Hillstar (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and William Buick also sidestepped the chance for the ride as a result of his own tie with the Gosden stable, so it was Murtagh who stepped in during a rich spell of form in the saddle as he continues his fledgling

training career. With Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) apparently better for his comeback fifth at Saint-Cloud and favored, the German raider was shuffled back in the betting, but turned that logic on its head with an emphatic display here. Content to settle the bay in fourth as Ektihaam (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) ensured a strong pace to aim at, Murtagh gave him a squeeze in early stretch and that was enough for him to seize the advantage from Trading Leather passing the quarter pole and dominate the finale. "I loved the way when I asked him to stretch he wanted to get on with it," his rider said. "It was the way I dreamt about it last night, although I thought it was going to be more dramatic and a fighting finish. He didn't feel like he was breaking the track record and I think he will go on and improve again. I was third choice, but it's great to get on these horses. The trainer was very cool beforehand and he has done it all around the world. I just feel like I can win on anything at the moment." Andreas Wohler added, "I used to come here as a kid and watch it in the school holidays and now I am here as a trainer. We knew he'd improved since his last race, but to do so as much as that is unbelievable."

Wohler is looking at the Oct. 6 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe for the winner now. "His main target now is the Arc and he will have one race beforehand," he added. "The two options are the G2 Prix Foy [at Longchamp Sept. 15] and [Sept. 1] G1 Grosser Preis von Baden, and it's more likely we'd go for the Grosser Preis."



Wohler cont, "He's won a group race in Germany and a Group 1 in Italy last year, but to make a stallion he needs more international form, so we went to Saint-Cloud and then on to here. It's the strength of our German horses that they mature late and when stepped up in distance. I was 24 when my father died in 1986, and I had to take over the licence earlier than I was expecting. The best horse I had before was Lomitas, who was exceptional, but this horse is exceptional as well." Jim Bolger was not disappointed with the effort of Trading Leather, and plans to keep the game homebred busy, "That was very satisfactory. Everything went well, except for the last furlong. We probably could have done with a little more pace early on, but all in all we're very happy. We'll stick to the original plan, all being well--he'll go to York for the [Aug. 21] G1 Juddmonte International, and then the G1 Irish Champion S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 7] before coming back here for the [Oct. 19] G1 Champion S."

Sir Michael Stoute said of Hillstar, "He's going the right way. We're delighted with him and I don't think we'll be dropping him back in class now." Cirrus des Aigles, who failed to pick up in his usual style and could only finish fourth, could also take in the York feature, according to trainer Corine Barande-Barbe. "Christophe [Soumillon] said he needed a run--he took a breath three times, which showed he needs a race and the going was quite fast. But I am not disappointed, competition always improves him. Even if we do work at home, it is not the same and he knows a lot as well. We might go to York next for the Juddmonte International, but we have a date here in October." Soumillon added, "He ran very well--he wasn't really fit--and the horse needs a race. The speed we went under the track conditions, it was hard to follow that."

Laughing, who rounded out her European campaign with a pair of Irish victories in the spring of 2011, was purchased privately upon the advice of agents Niall Dalton and Frank Lyons by Colts Neck Stables' Rich Santulli. A winner of two of six starts in 2012, including Monmouth's GIII Matchmaker S., Laughing kicked off 2013 with a 3/4-length score over favored Dayatthespa (City Zip) in the Oceanport oval's GIII Oceanport S. June 29. "She had the winter off and she came back well," said winning trainer Al Goldberg. "She ran a pretty good race last time first time out of the box. She came out of the race just great, so [Santulli] said, 'Let's take a shot.'"

Sent off the second longest shot on the board at 6-1 this time, she was allowed to set modest early splits, and had enough left in reserve to fend off Dream Peace--one of two runners in the field trained by Chad Brown--by a length at the wire.

"[Trainer Alan Goldberg] said, 'Break good, let her do her thing, and go from there,'" explained winning jockey Jose Lezcano. "When I asked her at the quarter pole, she took off again and gave me enough to win the race."

In addition to the runner up, Chad Brown entered three in the Diana, Grade I winner Samitar (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who finished fourth; and Dayatthespa, who was scratched prior to the nine-furlong test. Following Laughing's first Grade I win yesterday, Goldberg said he wasn't displeased by Dayatthespa's defection.

"Even if [Dayatthespa] was in, I'd feel like we'd sit right off," said Goldberg. "It looks like [Dayatthespa] really wants the front. As it turned out, it was better this way."

Palace Malice was shelved after graduating over this track in his second career start last August. On the board in his first two starts of the 2013 season--including a third-place finish in the GII Risen Star S. at the Fair Grounds--the chestnut encountered a world of trouble in the Mar. 30

GII Louisiana Derby and had to settle for seventh behind stablemate Revolutionary (War Pass). Only a neck behind Java's War (War Pass) when trying the Polytrack in the GI Blue Grass S. Apr. 13, the \$200,000 Keeneland April grad faded to 12th after setting suicidal opening splits in a sloppy renewal of the May 4 GI Kentucky Derby. Overlooked at 13-1 in the final jewel of the Triple Crown, the colt left the

competition in his wake as he galloped home a 3 1/4-length winner in the June 8 GI Belmont S. Allowed to settle in a stalking second behind Moreno, who carved out a modest opening quarter in :24.06 before picking up the tempo slightly through a half :47.48. Narrowing the gap between himself and the pacesetter as they approaching the quarter pole, Palace Malice drew on even terms with Moreno midstretch, left that rival behind late and was a length clear of the late-closing Will Take Charge at the wire. "He was really good early," said winning rider Mike Smith. "He jumped on [the bit] a little bit coming off the backstretch. I talked him out of it, and he was great. He's still learning. It set up really well, but Todd and his connections had him really ready. He was better than last time. Those are kind of big words to say after winning the Belmont, but he truly was, and with room to grow." Recording his third win of the afternoon after taking the opener with Caixa Electronica (Arromanches) followed by Unitarian (Pulpit) in the fourth, winning trainer Todd Pletcher said, "Palace Malice broke really well and went to the first turn really relaxed. We had a beautiful trip. He got into a good comfortable rhythm down the backside... The horse keeps getting better and better and today was arguably his best performance yet. Hopefully, on to the [GI] Travers S. [Aug. 24]"

Looking to get back in the win column for trainer D. Wayne Lukas was Will Take Charge, who just came up a length short of the victory. However, the Hall of Fame trainer was none-the-less pleased with his colt's effort. "I do my best work when they're 20-1," said Lukas. "We've had good luck zeroing in on the bigger races in my career, if you look back...I thought he'd run big. At the top of the stretch I thought we had a shot at it, because they were developing a little heat up front." Campaigned by Willis Horton, the \$425,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase has been off since a 10th-place finish in his latest start in the Belmont S. "He's a little bit light, and he's just getting his growth; the next 30 days should make a difference," said Lukas. "I can see him being very effective in the Travers; I think he'll even get better late in the fall."

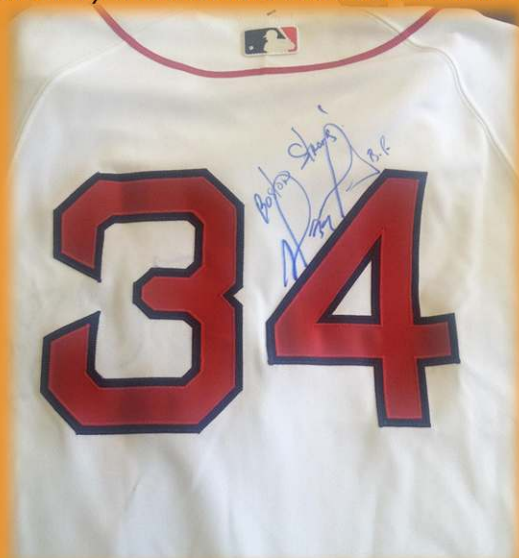

ST NIC MAKES PROGRESS

There was some positive news regarding **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) yesterday afternoon, with the 6-year-old showing the right signs after his colic surgery. Following the operation on his pastern fractured Tuesday morning, the six-times Group 1 winner went under the knife again due to a severe bout of colic later in the week, and a guarded prognosis had been given. Coolmore's website was able to provide an upbeat update yesterday. "St Nicholas Abbey has made positive progress and is in good form today following yesterday's colic surgery," it read. "The colic was caused by caecal shutdown [equivalent to the human appendix], which is an extremely painful condition. His treatment means he cannot have food for a prolonged period--this is difficult for a horse like St Nicholas Abbey who loves his food! He will get parenteral nutrition instead [intravenous nutrition] to fulfil his daily requirements. Dr Nathan Slovis, a medicine specialist from the Hagyard Institute in Kentucky, arrived today to oversee his ongoing recovery and treatments. All surgeons are pleased with the progress he is making with his pastern reconstruction, and he is taking weight on the leg well."

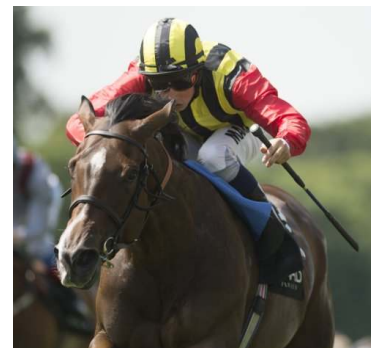
GETTING HIS CENTS WORTH IN BING CROSBY

While the sophomore class gets back to work on the east coast, one of its early stars tackles his elders in today's GI Bing Crosby S. at Del Mar. **Goldencents** (Into Mischief), who debuted with a dominant victory over the Del Mar oval last September, moved to the front of the division with his win in the Apr. 6 GI Santa Anita Derby, but he disappointed when a well-beaten 17th in the GI Kentucky Derby and has been on the sidelines since finishing fifth in the GI Preakness S. He adds blinkers for his first sprint since his debut, and turned in a bullet three-furlong drill Wednesday in :34 1/5. "The Kentucky Derby is a very difficult chore to put a horse through," O'Neill said Saturday morning. "There's so much stress for them with all that's going on and the race didn't unfold perfectly for him. "I was so proud of the way he bounced out of that and, to me, ran a respectable race [fifth] in the Preakness. We put him away for awhile then brought him back. He's just full of energy and we're really pleased with him right now." **Comma to the Top** (Bwana Charlie) makes his 33rd trip to the post today. The gritty veteran is looking for his third 2013 graded stakes win. He travelled east to annex the Mar. 2 GIII Tom Fool H. and added the May 27 GIII Los Angeles S. He set the pace before tiring to second in the seven-furlong June 29 GI Triple Bend H. last time out, but has won five of nine starts at today's six-furlong distance. **Jimmy Creed** (Distorted Humor), a \$900,000 Keeneland September yearling, ended 2012 with a win in the GI Malibu S. and began this year the same way, taking the Apr. 6 GII Potrero Grande S. at Santa Anita. He hopped at the start of the Triple Bend before checking in eighth in his most recent start.

Elusive Kate (Elusive Quality) returns to her ideal venue to bid for back-to-back renewals of the G1 Prix Rothschild today. So effective from the front when dealing with Golden Lilac (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) last year, the John Gosden trainee is unbeaten by her own sex in four visits to Normandy, having finished third to the colts in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois in August. Backing up her return fourth in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 18 with a controversial defeat of Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}) in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket last time July 12, jockey William Buick is hoping she can continue the momentum. "I think this year's Prix Rothschild is a touch harder than last year, but she's also very much at home at Deauville--she won twice their over seven as a 2-year-old and she was only beaten a length and a half by Excelebration and the colts in last year's Prix Jacques le Marois," he said. "They'll know she's around, make no mistake, and given the pick of the field I wouldn't look anywhere else." One who could challenge her dominion is the Niarchos family's prolific **Duntle (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}), who was stripped of her initial Group 1 win when judged to have caused interference to the eventual runner-up Chachamaidee (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) in Leopardstown's Matron S. in September. Returning to win the G3 Amethyst S. at that venue May 12, the homebred followed up in Royal Ascot's G2 Duke of Cambridge S. last time June 19. Trailing in that contest was Ibrahim Araci's otherwise solid performer **Chigun (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who started favorite there on the back of a career-best success in The Curragh's G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. May 25. Of the 3-year-olds, Cuadra Montalban and Ecurie D Primes's **Peace Burg (Fr)** (Sageburg {Ire}) is still unexposed, and had the re-opposing **Topaze Blanche (Ire)** (Zamindar) and **Kenhope (Fr)** (Kendargent {Fr}) back in second and third, respectively, in the G2 Prix de Sandringham at Chantilly June 2. TALE'S LATEST CHAPTER

Perretti Racing Stable's **Forty Tales** (Tale of the Cat) will look to make it three in a row in today's GII Amsterdam S. "He's an amazing horse, just a treasure," trainer Nick Zito said of Declan's Warrior. "I'm sure he'll run his normal good race. He just gives everything he's got. He is a true warrior, there's no question. He just likes what he's doing, and I hope he keeps going."

One, Possibly Two Darley Colts Heading to Travers...

Transparent (Bernardini) stamped his ticket to the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 24, when he finished first in Friday's Curlin S. despite being disqualified to fifth. "We missed out on the money, but he ran great," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "Our team did a great job of getting him ready. Nice horse. It was a great race coming off 112 days. It's a blow, but on the other hand, he's a very nice horse, so we'll point toward the Travers hopefully". Jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. moved Transparent out on the turn in the Curlin S. and crossed in front of Proud Strike (Smart Strike), who clipped heels, stumbled, and lost all chance. "It was a rider error-he made a mistake; everybody makes mistakes," McLaughlin said. "It was a matter of inches. If he waits another stride or two and then comes out, he's fine. It was unlucky." Trainer Tom Albertrani has taken the Travers under consideration for the other half of Darley's Curlin S. entry **Romansh** (Bernardini), who was moved up to first in that test after Transparent's disqualification. Albertrani is waiting on the outcome of the GII Jim Dandy S. and GI Haskell Invitational before making his final decision. "I think he can be at that level," Albertrani said. "We always saw this horse train like a nice horse, and he's still maturing. Even [Friday], it looked like when Transparent came up to him it looked like he almost started to come back a little bit again at him when he saw him. I still think there's a lot of maturing ahead for the horse." Both colts are sons of Bernardini, who Albertrani trained to Travers victory for Darley in 2006. Bernardini is also the sire of the past two Travers heroes Stay Thirsty and Alpha, who dead-heated with Golden Ticket in last year's renewal.

Wise Dan Preps for Fourstardave...

Horse of the Year **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) put in what will most likely be his final work in preparation for the GII Fourstardave H. at Saratoga Aug. 10. He breezed five furlongs on the Oklahoma turf course in :57.38 and was clocked galloping out six furlongs in 1:09.16 and seven in 1:22.56.

"I never in my life had a horse like this," trainer Charles LoPresti said. "People don't believe me when I tell them, but he's a freak of nature, this horse."

Wise Dan had a mile blowout on the main track last week, but LoPresti considered this his first important work since the GII Firecracker S. at Churchill Downs June 29.

"He was never asked for anything, I'll tell you," LoPresti said. "I would have liked for him to have gone in a minute, but that turf is not real soft right now. But I don't worry about him. He does what he wants to do. He's a horse that does it the way he wants to do it. You can't make him do things you want him to do. If he had worked real slow, I might have had to come back and do something else, but this looks like it's going to put me right where I want to be."

The 2012 GI Travers S. co-winner **Alpha** (Bernardini), who dead heated with Golden Ticket (Speightstown), breezed five furlongs in preparation for a possible start in the GI Whitney Invitational H. Aug. 3. He completed the work on the main track in 1:00.25 yesterday.

"That was his best work this year," McLaughlin said. "It was really nice to see. He loves it up here. He likes it up here on the main track. We're happy."

McLaughlin added, "Most likely we'll be running [in the Whitney]. We'll look at the weights and see who's running. There's an overnight stakes we are nominated to on Friday [Birdstone S.] that's a possibility. We'll see."

Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) worked five furlongs in preparation for the Whitney yesterday as well. He was clocked going 1:02.18 over the main track.

"He breezed great this morning, and he came back great," trainer Kathy Ritvo commented. "It was a very good move today. He's been very consistent with his works, and is just feeling great."

Mucho Macho Man was third in his last start in the Criminal Type S. at Belmont June 14. Last year he ran third in the GII Alysheba and came back to win the GII Suburban H.

"I think he's going to run really good this race," Ritvo said. "He's just doing so well. He's going into all his works good, and coming out of all his works good. He's had a very consistent schedule, and his attitude has been great. He's just doing very well."

Mucho Macho Man is a multimillionaire and has multiple graded stakes wins, but is still searching for that Grade I victory. He came closest last year when he was second by a neck in the GI Woodward S. at the Spa Sept. 1.

"The Whitney is a great, great race to win," Ritvo said. "If we can be that blessed and get that lucky, it would be fantastic."

Hall of Fame trainer Nick Zito is looking at the Whitney for **Fast Falcon** (Awesome Again), who went four furlongs on the Oklahoma training track in :49.98 yesterday.

"He worked good," said Zito, who has two Whitney victories to his name with Commentator (Distorted Humor). "It was good, just nice and easy. He's ready. He's been running all year, and he's very consistent. We'll just take it from here."

Fast Falcon was third by just a neck in last year's Travers behind the dead heat winners.

"He shows up all the time, and he loves Saratoga," said Zito. "If you remember, he could have easily been last year's Travers winner. If that horse doesn't get hurt and doesn't stop in front of him, he's going to win."

The chestnut was third in his most recent start in the GII Suburban H. at Belmont July 6, where he scored a career best Beyer Speed Figure of 103.

Other possible Whitney entries include last year's winner **Fort Larned** (E Dubai), GI Metropolitan H. runner-up **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song), and multiple graded stakes winner **Successful Dan** (Successful Appeal).

VELAZQUEZ BECOMES ALL-TIME SARATOGA LEADING RIDER

Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez became Saratoga's all-time leading rider yesterday after capturing the fourth race aboard the Todd Pletcher trained Unitarian (Pulpit) in a come from behind victory. The win gave Velazquez 694 wins at the Spa to surpass the previous record of 693 held by another Hall of Fame rider, Jerry Bailey.

"I definitely want to say thank you Todd [Pletcher]," Velazquez said. "I've been riding for him since 1998 and we're still going. I want to thank my family, without whose support I wouldn't be able to do this. And I have to thank the fans. The fans have been great to me. Thank you for your support. I appreciate it, and hope to win many more."

Pletcher trained 255 of Velazquez's 694 Saratoga winners.

"I'm really happy for Johnny," Pletcher said. "It's his moment, you know?"

Velazquez tied Bailey's record after winning three races on Thursday's card, but was winless on his three mounts Friday and was sixth with his first mount Saturday before scoring the record-breaking win.

"It's a big number, I have to say that," Velazquez commented. "Just to be named after Jerry Bailey or Angel Cordero, who probably, in my eyes, obviously I'm a little biased when it comes to Angel, they are two of the best riders I've ever seen in my career. I'm humbled, and I'm happy."

Both Bailey and Cordero, Velazquez's long-time agent, were present in the winner's circle to commemorate Velazquez's milestone.

"It was a matter of time," said Bailey. "I looked at the numbers; he goes by all-time money winnings either year or next year past myself and Pat Day, he's going to set the standard for everybody. He's a great rider and he deserves every bit of this. I do hope he takes the time to enjoy and reflect on this, because it's major."

Added Cordero, winner of 649 Saratoga races, "That's a lot of winners, and he should be proud, because this is the meeting that everyone wants to win at."

Velazquez reached 5,000 career victories at Belmont last month and was inducted into the Hall of Fame at Saratoga last year. He has 22 NYRA meet titles, including five at Saratoga, three Eclipse Awards for Outstanding Jockey, and a George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award. Velazquez also captured three Triple Crown races, including the 2007 GI Belmont S. aboard the Pletcher-trained Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) and a Kentucky Derby. He has 11 Breeders' Cup wins to his name as well, with the most recent being last year's Breeders' Cup Mile aboard Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry).
