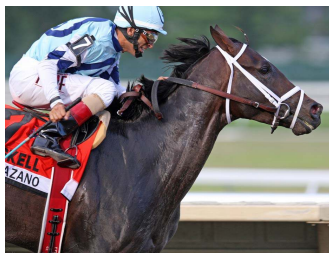

VERRAZANO DOMINATES HASKELL

Let's Go Stable and Coolmore's **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) delivered a tour de force performance to win the GI Haskell Invitational H. by a resounding 9 3/4 lengths at Monmouth Park Sunday. "He made a huge statement today," said trainer Todd Pletcher, who was winning his third Haskell. "This was one of, if not the, most impressive win by any 3-year-old this year." The win was extra sweet for the locally based Let's Go Stable team. "This is just amazing," said Bryan Sullivan. "This is my home track and it all worked to plan. This is something we'll cherish for long, long time." Kevin Scatuorchio added, "This is a dream. Having worked here as my summer job in high school with my friends, you one day dream of this, and to have it happen today is unbelievable." **Cont. p3**

KATE IN CONTROL

Successful when leading throughout in the G1 Prix Rothschild 12 months ago, Teruya Yoshida's **Elusive Kate** (Elusive Quality) made light work of her defense at her beloved Deauville yesterday to win with plenty in hand. Sent off the 19-10 favorite, the bay, who had been the subject of a controversial win in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket last time July 12, was handed a lead this time before being sent to the front by William Buick with three furlongs remaining. Soon clear, she was able to be eased near the line to score by 2 1/2 lengths from **Duntle (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), taking her earnings through the €1 million barrier in the process. "She handled the slow ground well and I'm delighted with her," trainer John Gosden said. "It's good when you have one as consistent as that." **Cont. p7**

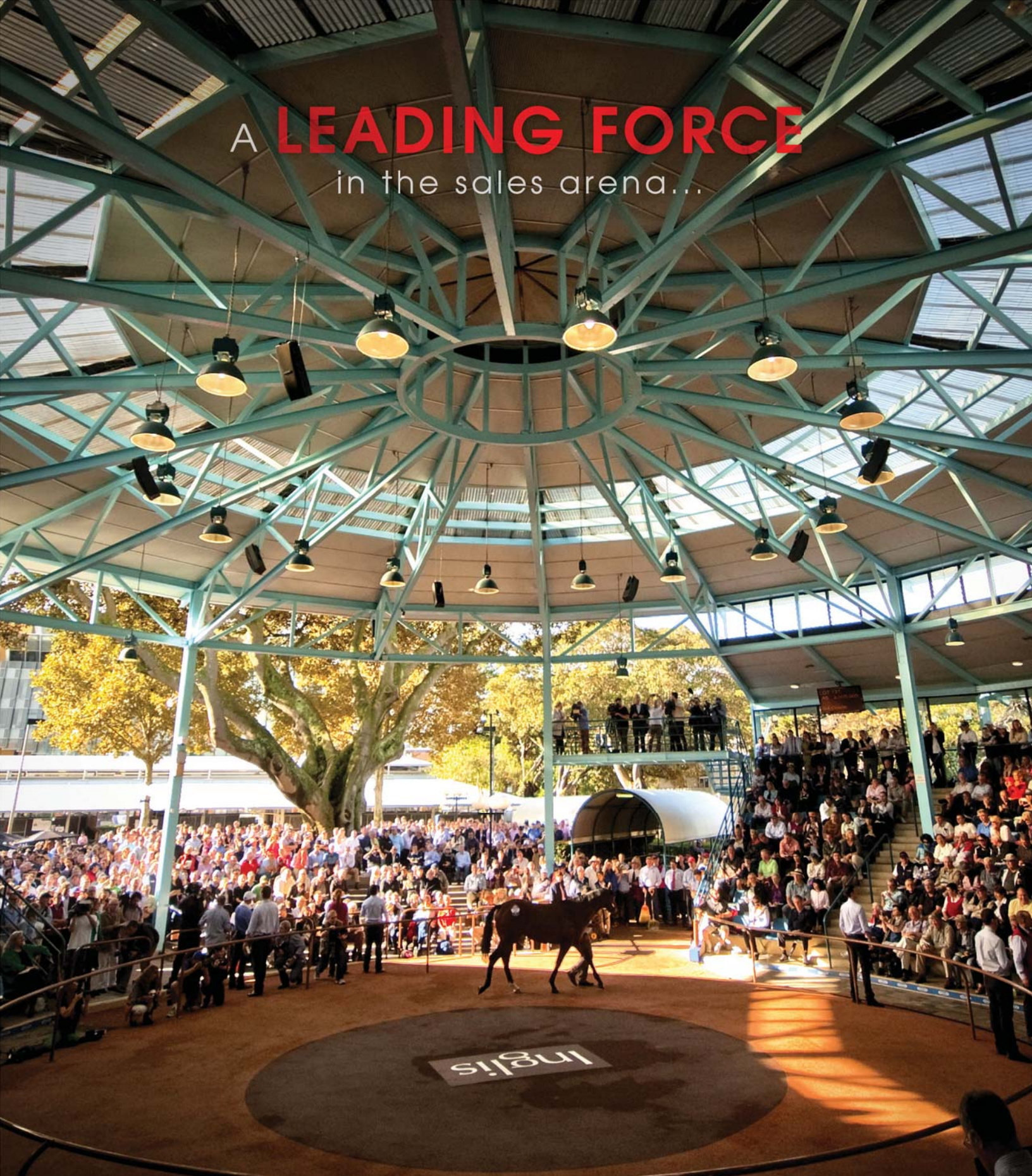

Verrazano Dominates in Haskell (cont. from p1)

Breaking from the outside in the seven-horse field, John Velazquez and Verrazano angled towards the rail and took up a stalking position just to the outside of G1 Preakness S. winner **Oxbow** (Awesome Again) through an opening quarter in

:23 4/5. Oxbow snuck loose down the backstretch, but his advantage was short-lived as Verrazano moved to challenge after a leisurely half-mile in :48 1/5. Given his cue by Velazquez after three-quarters in 1:12 2/5, the even-money favorite inhaled the pacesetter and stormed clear down the lane.

"We had the perfect trip," Velazquez said. "He was incredible today. When I asked him, he was right there. He was in a perfect spot and Gary Stevens's horse was moving easily, so I moved him out to the middle of the track so no one could keep me pinned in. It looked like he was going a little slow on the lead, so I went up to put a little pressure on him. Power Broker moved at us a little and my horse just took off."

Oxbow finished fourth and jockey Gary Stevens dismounted shortly after crossing the wire, but the colt walked off the track under his own power. According to *Daily Racing Form*, x-rays of Oxbow's right ankle showed no fractures, but the colt may have suffered a soft-tissue injury.

Verrazano showed promise right from the start, earning ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status with a 7 3/4-length debut win at Gulfstream Jan. 1. He captured the GII Tampa Bay Derby in just his third start and stamped himself as a favorite for the G1 Kentucky Derby with a win in the Apr. 6 G1 Wood Memorial. He suffered his first, and only loss to date, when 14th over a sloppy Churchill track in the Derby, but he rebounded with an emphatic 9 1/4-length victory in Monmouth's GIII Pegasus S. June 16.

The strapping bay will now be aimed at a divisional showdown with Saturday's GII Jim Dandy winner and stablemate Palace Malice (Curlin).

"He'll ship to Saratoga tomorrow morning," Pletcher said. "The plan all along was to run in the Haskell, and if he showed he could handle distances of 1 1/8 miles plus, the Travers would be a logical next spot. The way he finished today over a track that's been deep and demanding all week, with his ears pricked at the wire, showed he handled it pretty well. Those of us who've been around this horse have always had a lot of confidence in him and anyone who knows him isn't really surprised by what they saw."

Verrazano's dam Enchanted Rock, whose first foal was graded stakes winner El Padrino (Pulpit), has an unraced 2-year-old Tapit filly currently in training with Shug McGaughey. She also has a yearling filly by Pulpit and produced a colt by the late Claiborne stallion this spring. She is currently in foal to More Than Ready. Points offthebench Upsets Bing Crosby (cont. from p1)

Comma to the Top (Bwana Charlie) jumped out to the early lead, but was passed by longshot **Coach Bob** (Bertrando) through an opening quarter in :22.44. Meanwhile, racing four deep among a tightly packed group, Points offthebench put in a powerful run leaving the turn to put a nose in front after a half in :44.98. Goldencents, saving ground until upper stretch, was forced to angle out around rivals widest of all at midstretch and came flying at him in the final sixteenth, but Points Offthebench found the wire in time under Mike Smith. Smith was registering a big stakes double on the weekend after piloting Palace Malice (Curlin) to victory in Saturday's GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga.

It was also a milestone win for trainer Tim Yakteen. "My first Grade I winner," Yakteen said. "It's been a long time, at least eight years [since he started training on his own]. I didn't think I'd have to wait this long. He was training great, we drew a great post and he was ready for the task, so I felt confident going into the race. He ran huge and Mike gave him a great ride."

Smith added, "Tim told me two things about him beforehand: He said don't make the lead too early with him and he'll need some help changing leads. This horse is still learning and I had to help him switch in the stretch. I made that lead and I knew that [Goldencents] was coming. But my horse dug back in. He's a good horse; he really is."

Goldencents was the 9-5 favorite while taking on elders in his first start since finishing fifth in the GI Preakness S. May 18. Jockey Kevin Krigger admitted his charge didn't get the best trip. "When we turned for home, they fanned out in front of me and I had to make a choice," Krigger said. "I thought for a second about trying to go down inside, but then I went out. I didn't want to get stopped in a race like this. He fired for me and ran really well. I think we've got to be happy with this race. It was a good one."

Points offthebench, a maiden winner over this track two years ago, raced only once in 2012, defeating state-bred foes in an optional claimer at Santa Anita in February. Sidelined for a year after that victory, he returned with a runner-up effort in Arcadia Feb. 2 and was making his graded stakes debut off a pair of open-company optional claimers.

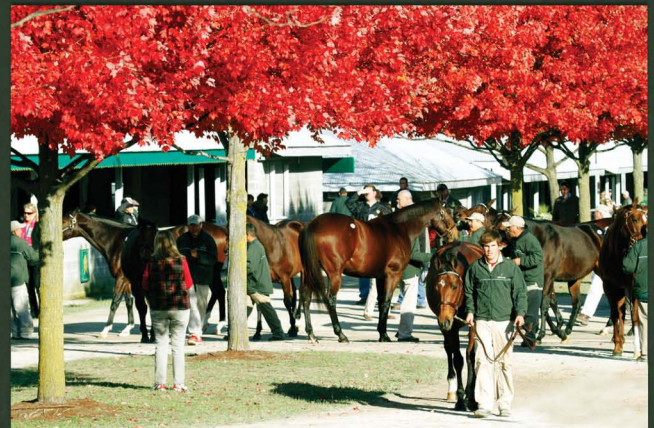

On another red-letter weekend for the German breeding industry, Neatico upstaged the overseas challengers to register a home success and a career-best here. To say that the homebred is a late-developer is wide of the truth, as the veteran had annexed the G3 Herzog von Ratibor-Rennen at Krefeld as a juvenile before a largely disappointing sophomore campaign, during which he had his stamina stretched beyond breaking point in the G1 Deutsches Derby. Despite getting some prize money in pattern races at four and five, his overall profile was not boosted. His third placing in the G2 Grosse Europa Meile here on his seasonal finale last September seemed to suggest that he had reached the limit of his ability.

Crying out for a step up from a mile when runner-up in his three starts this term, the bay came good with an extra 165 yards to cover in Dortmund's G3 Grosser Preis der Wirtschaft June 23, and used that confidence-booster as a springboard to an emphatic seven-length success in the July 5 G3 Hamburg-Trophy over this trip to earn a supplementary to this contest. With his G1 Deutsches Derby-winning stable companion **Lucky Speed (Ire)** (Silvano {Ger}) waiting for the Aug. 11 G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern, Peter Schiergen knew he had a serious bullet to fire at this contest, and Neatico duly delivered under a well-judged tactical ride from **Andrasche Starke**. Settled off the strong pace set by **Olivier Peslier** on **Opposite**, he was rated while **Silvestre de Sousa** tackled the leader on **Hunter's Light** with a quarter mile remaining. As that pair dueled ahead, Neatico was asked for his effort, and he was able to find a surge which took him past his softened-up rivals inside the final 100 yards.

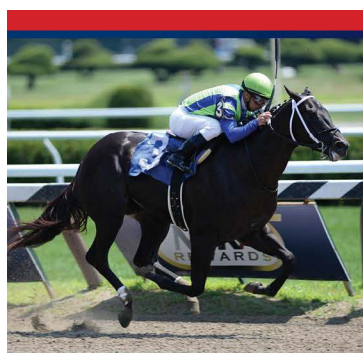

First arriving at this Normandy venue two years ago, Elusive Kate made an instant impression by winning the Listed Prix Six Perfections and was back to dominate the G3 Prix du Calvados soon after. With no rail on her left to guide her on her next start at Longchamp, she first exhibited an exaggerated tendency to drift that way when still managing to win the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac on Arc day, and that was avoided on her next foray to France when bagging this race in 2012. In the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, only the colts Excelebration (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) and Cityscape (GB) (Selkirk) got past her, and a stumble at the start of Newmarket's G1 Sun Chariot S. may have cost her the win in September. Third behind Excelebration and Cityscape again in Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. on Champions' Day, she was returning from a lengthy winter break when fourth in the G1 Queen Anne S. at the Royal meeting June 18. Her drifting habit returned with a vengeance as she defeated Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}) in the Falmouth at Newmarket July 12. Led until the three-furlong marker by fellow British raider Chigun (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), she was committed at that point and, with the stand's fence to keep her straight and concentrate her effort, turned the remainder into a procession. "She's really top-class and has never stopped improving," jockey William Buick said. "She has been well-managed from day one and is getting quicker with age. The pace was perfect today, but I was surprised I was so far clear at the furlong pole. I know Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) and Intello (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}) will be in the [Aug. 11] G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, but I see no reason why she shouldn't come back and take them on." Gosden may have other plans for the winner, however. "We'll have a look at the Jacques le Marois, but she could go for the G1 Matron S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 7]--that is more likely at the moment," he said. "This result proves that the fillies from the Falmouth are absolutely top-drawer. She's as wide as she is tall and goes on most ground. She'll probably be retired ahead of next spring and she's done incredibly well for her very sporting owner."

This event was marred when **Take Charge Indy** (A.P. Indy), who took all the money and looked ready to power home after leading by 2 1/2 lengths through a half in :47.43, was pulled up abruptly by jockey Gary Stevens with a condylar fracture to his left fore. Stevens said afterwards, "I heard a loud pop around the half-mile pole. He wanted to continue but I pulled him up." Taking advantage of the situation, **Pants on Fire**, until then tracking six lengths back in third, swept through to the inside and assumed command three furlongs out, and was full of run down the lane to win by two lengths over a charging **Hymn Book**. **Take Charge Indy's** leg was stabilized and he was vanned back to his barn for further evaluation. Co-owner **WinStar Farm** reported the colt was expected to undergo surgery Monday.

Pants on Fire, winner of the 2011 GII Louisiana Derby, won the 2011 GIII Pegasus S. and last summer's Skip Away S. over this track and distance. He was third in this term's GIII Hal Hope S. and GIII Skip Away S. at Gulfstream and was coming off a third in the June 1 Mountainview H. at Penn National. "He came out of his last race a tired horse," said winning trainer Kelly Breen. "We gave him some time, and he responded today." The win was the third of four straight on the Monmouth card for jockey Paco Lopez. "He's just a really nice horse," Lopez said. "I just tried to keep him on the outside out in the clear because he doesn't like dirt in his face. I had to go inside Gary a bit when he pulled up, but he just kept going and trying hard to the wire."

Forty Tales, second in the Feb. 2 GII Hutcheson S., closed from well back to record back-to-back victories in the Apr. 27 one-mile GIII Derby Trial and seven-furlong June 8 GII Woody Stephens S. Shortening up to 6 1/2 furlongs and looking for his third straight, the bay colt dropped back to next to last, some 10 lengths behind pacesetter Mentor Cane (Mizzen Mast), who blitzed through an opening quarter in :21.77. Mentor Cane opened a clear advantage through a half in :44.49, but floated wide into the stretch, giving Mico Margarita the lead. Mentor Cane clawed his way back into contention, but Forty Tales was flying in the center of the course and surged to the front in the shadow of the wire. Forty Love, purchased by David Randal for \$100,000 while in foal to Summer Squall at the 2002 Keeneland November sale, produced a full-brother to Forty Tales last year and a weanling colt by champion Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) this spring.

Silver Max, who capped a six-race win streak with a one-length victory in the GII Virginia Derby last summer, got back to the winner's circle with a dominating 9 1/2-length triumph in the off-the-turf Opening Verse S. at Churchill June 1. He set the pace before tiring to third over the main track in the June 29 GIII Cornhusker H. at Prairie Meadows last time out. The bay colt broke from the inside, grabbed the early lead and set the pace through fractions of :23.84 and :47.08 with longshot Tune Me In (Concorde's Tune) a chasing second. Tune Me In moved to challenge the pacesetter leaving the backstretch, but Silver Max shrugged off that gray foe through three-quarters in 1:09.81 and powered clear down the stretch, completing the mile in 1:33.85 en route to a sparkling victory. Howe Great closed for second.

"He's just a super quick horse that's capable of laying down some speedy fractions," said winning trainer Dale Romans. "He just keeps going and going. I only have one other horse in my barn that can match his easy, fluid stride--and that's [GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner] Little Mike."

Silver Max is owned by Kentucky native Mark Bacon, a brand manager for Southern Comfort, and Dana Wells, president of the advertising company CBS Outdoor. Wells, a top defensive lineman for University of Arizona, played one game with the Cincinnati Bengals in 1989.

A disappointing sixth when stretched to two turns in the La Lorgnette S. Sept. 23, she kicked off her 4-year-old campaign with a \$62,5000 optional claiming tally going six furlongs June 15. Nikkis Smartypants was gunned to the lead here, and vied for early command while racing on the inside of longshot Little River through a half mile in :45.90. Under a nice hold at the top of the stretch, Nikkis Smartypants

dug in gamely as they bunched up in the lane, and proved best to realize a career high. "Her feet and her breeding indicated she would handle turf," trainer Robert Tiller said. "The bottom line is that a horse is either going to like it or not like it, plain and simple." Winning jockey Eurico Da Silva added, "I knew I had a lot of horse today. My horse was really focused, she was ready and all she wanted to do was run." Favored Sensible Lady (Street Sense) missed the break and made a powerful sweeping move to reach contention at the top of the stretch, but flattened out late to finish last of seven.

LOOKING TO KEEP THE DANCE GOING

Susan Wantz's **Dance to Bristol** (Speightstown) will be looking for her fifth straight victory when she goes postward in today's GII Honorable Miss S. at Saratoga. The 4-year-old filly won stakes at Charles Town and Pimlico in the spring before earning her first graded tally in the June 15 GIII Bed O'Roses H. at Belmont last time out.

Joseph Sutton's **Burban** (Speightstown) is still looking for her first graded victory. The 5-year-old was second behind Aubby K (Street Sense) in the May 4 GI Humana Distaff and fourth in the May 27 GIII Winning Colors S. before a front-running victory in the Roxelana S. at Churchill June 22.

Joseph Shields's homebred **Classic Point** (Flatter) will attempt to complete the transition from claimer to graded stakes victress in the Honorable Miss. The chestnut filly graduated for a \$16,000 tag at Belmont last October and won for a \$25,000 tag going one mile at Gulfstream four starts later. She comes off a pair of Belmont optional claiming victories at today's six-furlong distance. "We had to run her for \$16,000 before she won," explained Hall of Fame trainer Allen Jerkens. "We're lucky we didn't lose her with the way she turned out afterward. Then everybody said, 'If you run her a distance, she'll run good.' She won, and everybody said, 'See?' And then the last two races she won were six furlongs."

Jerkens admitted his charge will have to improve to win the Honorable Miss. "We're taking a chance," Jerkens said. "There aren't many allowance races for her, anyway. We'll see what happens. She'll have to run bigger, that's for sure. She's become bigger and stronger since she got older."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

TRAVERS NEXT FOR PALACE MALICE

Dogwood Stables' **Palace Malice** (Curlin) exited his dominant victory in Saturday's GII Jim Dandy S. in fine shape and will head to the Aug. 24 GI Travers S., trainer Todd Pletcher confirmed Sunday. Palace Malice's time of 1:47.37 was second fastest since the race was moved to 1 1/8 miles in 1972. "I figured it was going to be good, a very solid time," Pletcher said. "He picked it up every step along the way. I was encouraged [jockey] Mike [Smith] said he felt like he had something left. You hate to say it was a bigger performance than winning the Belmont, but it certainly looked that way." Dogwood's Cot Campbell was happy with how the colt bounced out of the race. "He seems to have come out fine, very feisty, feeling good, looking for peppermints; that's always a good sign," Campbell said. "So, we're very pleased, and we'll start easing into the next go-round."

'Test' Next For Lighthouse Bay...

Saturday's GI Prioress S. upsetter **Lighthouse Bay** (Speightstown)'s next stop will be the GI Test S. Aug. 24, according to trainer George Weaver.

"She's tired. She ran hard, but she looks good," Weaver said. "If she's doing well, we'll probably try the Test. It's a marquee race up here, and it seems like the logical thing to do with her."

The Prioress marked Weaver's first Grade I win in North America, having captured the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen in 2005 with Saratoga County (Valid Expectations). "We got a lot of texts from a lot of people," said Weaver. "It's a good feeling knowing that you have a following. There are a lot of people who are happy we won."

Baffert Pleased with Paynter...

Trainer Bob Baffert was happy with **Paynter** (Awesome Again)'s runner-up effort in Saturday's GII San Diego H. "Paynter ran a great race," Baffert said. "I can't be disappointed. He ran hard the whole way and never gave it up. I don't think he liked the track that much but he's such a great horse he kept trying all the way." The San Diego was Paynter's second start back from a near-fatal illness. Baffert would not commit to a next start for the Zayat Stables runner, but Justin Zayat tweeted Sunday evening that tentative plans were to run the 4-year-old in the Aug. 31 GI Woodward S. at Saratoga. Trainer John Sadler said San Diego winner **Kettle Corn** (Candy Ride {Arg}) will head next to the Aug. 25 GI TVG Pacific Classic.



Trakus Fact: Paynter, two wide on both turns and second beaten just a half-length, covered 27 feet more than San Diego winner Kettle Corn. 27 feet equates to roughly 3.1 lengths. Kettle Corn ran the final quarter in :23.98, and a final eighth in :12.14, both easily the fastest in the race.

Stall Juveniles to See Stakes Action...

Trainer Al Stall is aiming his two impressive 2-year-old maiden winners from Saratoga's Saturday card at stakes at the Spa.

Twang (Dixie Union), who scored a front-running 3 1/4-length victory in his second lifetime start Saturday, was nominated to the GII Saratoga Special Aug. 11. The Sept. 2 GI Hopeful S. is also a possibility for the Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider homebred.

"[The Special] is short rest, but we'll look at it," Stall said. "Obviously, we'll look at the Hopeful. We're not sure. We'll have to try him in a stakes sooner or later."

Twang was sent off as the 6-5 favorite Saturday after taking third in his debut at Churchill Downs June 21 ([video](#)).

"We like him," Stall remarked. "He showed us a lot early this summer. He wasn't quite ready to run at the Churchill meet, but we thought he'd be good enough to go over there and get some experience. We thought he had a chance to win, but he just wasn't that seasoned. He put in a good effort and was third, and it really set him up for the Saratoga race."

Stall's other Spa graduate **Base Case Scenario** (Pioneer of the Nile) is being aimed at the GII With Anticipation S. going 1 1/16 miles on the sod Aug. 29 ([video](#)).

The Klaravich Stable and William Lawrence colorbearer sat back off the pace for most of his second lifetime start Saturday. He stole the lead around the final turn and held off a late challenger to score by a neck.

"He should have gotten a lot out of that race," Stall said. "You never know, he could have run a good race and been third, beaten two lengths. [Jockey] Robby [Albarado] said he had a really nice turn of foot going around that turn."

Base Case Scenario was also unveiled at Churchill and took third in that debut June 30.

"We've liked him. He's a big, strong, nice horse," Stall said. "He's been doing everything right; he was just crying out for more ground. You don't get a chance to run around two turns as a maiden here until later in the meet, and he had some turf breeding on both sides. It was a nice effort by him."



SOUTH AFRICA SHINING BRIGHT

Jackson (SAf) (Dynasty {SAf}), cruising past the post in front to win Saturday's G1 Champions Cup at Greyville Racecourse in Durban, marked the final stakes race of the season in South Africa. There are still a handful of days until the end of July and the official closure of the racing season, but with all stakes behind us we can now look back and reflect on this season.

The story headlining the media in South Africa leading up to this final feature day was the tussle at the

top of the National Trainers' Championship. The final months of the year have seen a major battle between five-time champion trainer Mike de Kock and perennial top 10 trainer Sean Tarry, who worked as an assistant to de Kock before going out on his own 10 years ago.

With only four days of minor meetings left in the season, this championship could come down to the final day. Justin Snaith deserves mention in third place, as his team surpassed the record for number of winners by a trainer of 172 with more than a month left in the season, and currently on 195 he could break the 200 barrier before year end.

The Breeders' Championship is an equally tight contest, with Summerhill Stud, eight-time consecutive champion breeder, in a tight battle with the younger Klawervlei Stud in what is looking to be a rivalry that will continue for years to come. One of South Africa's best jockeys for more than two decades, Pierre "Striker" Strydom, won his last

Jockey's Championship in 1998 and, after a number of runner-up efforts in the years since, has convincingly won this year's title. It is worth noting here the success of another South African jockey, Douglas Whyte, who recently sealed his 13th consecutive Champion Jockey title in Hong Kong.

October 2011. We saw the death of South Africa's internationally renowned stallion, six-time champion sire Jet Master (SAf). The search has since been on for a new king to succeed his throne, and in 2013 we may have found him. German-bred Silvano (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) has ended the reign of Jet Master as the top of the stallion log through an incredible record breaking year that included no fewer than six Group/Grade 1 winners, including victories in South Africa's two biggest races, the G1 J&B Met and the G1 Vodacom Durban July. Meanwhile, the regally bred Fort Wood (Sadler's Wells) captured his first Champion Broodmare Sire title just as his illustrious tenure as a stallion--which has included producing three Horse of the Years--slowly draws to a close. The breeding industry has received plenty of signs of promise with all major sales seeing increases-- the two primary sales, the Cape Premier Yearling Sale Book 1 and TBA National Yearling Sale, experienced increases of 33% and 27%, respectively. On the racing front it has been an exciting year, with the stars on the track being led by reigning Horse of the Year Variety Club (SAf) (Var), who showed off in an unbeaten season of five wins, including three Grade 1's. The two horses likely to compete with the reigning champ for Horse of the Year honors are Champion Sprinter What a Winter (SAf) (Western Winter)--the highest rated horse in the country--and Heavy Metal (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}), whose win in the Durban July carrying 132 lbs was the performance of the season in the classic division.

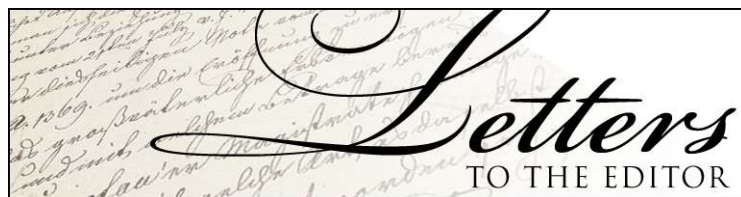
Crowd favorite Beach Beauty (SAf) (Dynasty {SAf}), Triple Tiara winner Cherry on the Top (SAf) (Tiger Ridge), and female flying machine Via Africa (SAf) (Var) ensured the fairer sex was not to be outdone this past year and thrilled crowds almost every time they stepped onto the racetrack.

Perhaps the most exciting performances for South African viewers were witnessed on Dubai World Cup night, however, when Soft Falling Rain (SAf) (National Assembly) became the first 3-year-old to win the G2 Godolphin Mile, and Shea Shea (SAf) (National Emblem {SAf}), in what was one of the best sprinting displays seen anywhere this year, lowered his own track record in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint. Adding to the success of the night, The Apache (SAf) (Mogok) finished second in the \$5 million G1 Dubai Duty Free. Shea Shea has followed up his win with a narrow second in the G1 Kings Stand S. at Royal Ascot and a fourth place finish in the G1 Darley July Cup July 13. He will have both the G1 Nunthorpe S. at York Aug. 23 and G1 Prix l'Abbaye at Longchamp Oct. 6 next in his sights, while The Apache will likely travel to the U.S. to compete in the G1 Arlington Million.

The African Horse Sickness quarantine restrictions continue to be the handicap and bane of the industry in South Africa, but this doesn't stop the new South African international team from collecting together bound for Dubai and beyond. Joining the above mentioned names at the Dubai World Cup Carnival next year is a powerful army, including Variety Club, Heavy Metal, unbeaten Grade 1 winning 3-year-olds Rumya {NZ} (Red Ransom), and Vercingetorix (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}), as well as Grade 1 winners Blueridge Mountain {Arg} (Giants Causeway), Slumdogmillionaire (SAf) (Strike Smartly), and Master Plan (SAf) (Jet Master {SAf}).

I find it interesting that Dansili accounted for the first and second finishers in the GI Diana at Saratoga on Saturday, and then later on the same day, Kettle Corn (by Argentine-bred Candy Ride) and Argentine-bred Batti Man took first and third in the G2 San Diego H. at Del Mar. (Also this week, Argentine-bred Indy Point by Indygo Shiner out of the Argentine mare Red Point won his U.S. debut in the Wickerr S. at Del Mar.)

Has anyone done a detailed and comprehensive statistical analysis on the performance of foreign-bred horses in stakes races in North America, or on stakes placings in North America by offspring of foreign-bred stallions? (Calling Bill Oppenheim?) On the surface, it appears that a relatively small number of foreign-bred horses disproportionately win or place in our major stakes races.

A lot of speculation has occurred regarding the decline of the American Thoroughbred because of exporting a lot of top weanlings, yearlings, broodmares, and stallions over many years with little importation. If it is true that foreign-bred horses are out-performing those bred in the U.S. on a percentage basis in major races, it would be strong evidence that we may be experiencing a decline in quality relative to the rest of the world and need to restock in order to hold our own.
