Sir Henry Cecil's presence is sorely missed at the Glorious Goodwood meeting he enjoyed so much over the years, and it is a Warren Place representative in **Tickled Pink (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) who is the

focus of attention in today's G2 King George S. Her dam, Cassandra Go (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), captured this race in 2000 for her owner Trevor Stewart, and there were shades of that talented distaffer in her daughter's dominating display in Newmarket's G3 Abernant S. over six furlongs Apr. 18. Subsequently off the board in both the May 15 G2 Duke of York S. and G3 Ballyogan S. at Leopardstown June 13, she dropped to this trip and duly regained the winning thread in the G3 Sandown Sprint last

time July 6. Back in second on that occasion after a luckless trip was Cheveley Park Stud's veteran **Kingsgate Native (Ire)** (Mujadil), who took this four years ago and has looked something like the force of old so far this term. Penalized for his win in Haydock's G2 Temple S. May 25, the 8-year-old will find the added weight difficult to defy against Lordship Stud's **Swiss Spirit (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who was just a neck behind in that contest at level weights. Like Kingsgate Native, who he had beaten in the G3 Dubai World Trophy over this trip at Newbury in September, he failed to make an impact in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot last time June 18. **Cont. p3**

FRENCH TRIP UNLIKELY FOR TORONADO

Trainer Richard Hannon yesterday suggested that the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois was not on the agenda for Sheikh Joaan Al Thani's **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) following his success in Wednesday's G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood. While the Aug. 11 Deauville contest had been mooted as a possible target before the sophomore's defeat of Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) in the "Duel on the Downs," that plan may be shelved as connections play the waiting game. "Unlike Ascot, he enjoyed a lovely clear run and Hughesie rode him perfectly, but I can assure everyone that if they thought he looked a bit useful at Goodwood, then they should see him in the mornings on the gallops," his trainer said. "We have been blessed with fast ground for a while now, and the turn of foot he shows when he gets those conditions is quite amazing. Sean Levey has done such a great job in getting Toronado settled, but Hughesie rode him in his final workout last weekend, and when he got off he told me that the only horse who has ever given him that sort of feel was Canford Cliffs. We have been very lucky to have had some top-class horses here over the years, but we all reckoned that Canford Cliffs was the best until Toronado came along." **Cont. p3**

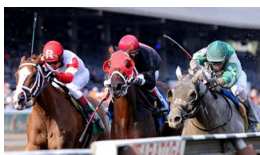

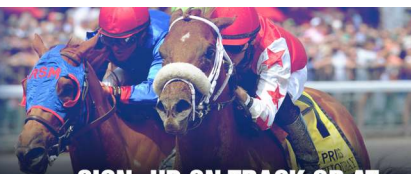

Kingsgate Native's Robert Cowell told *PA Sport*, "Kingsgate seems in really good form and looks a picture. He ran a bit flat at Ascot, but bounced back at Sandown and hopefully he'll run very well. Ideally we'd like the ground to dry up a little bit for him." Swiss Spirit's owner-breeder Trevor Harris told *PA Sport*, "I think if he can reproduce his Temple run, he'd have a very good chance. If the ground is good or faster, that will suit him. The one question we would have is how he will handle the track. Hopefully he'll be all right, but he is quite a big horse. If he runs his race, then he's going to be there or thereabouts."

French Trip Unlikely for Toronado cont.

Hannon continued, "Toronado is probably that bit more straight-forward than Canford Cliffs, and it is great news that he is likely to stay in training next year. We will stick to a mile this year, and we will talk to the owner and make a plan as to where to go next. Deauville will probably come a bit quick, but we will leave it a week before making a decision, and the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot in September would be the obvious race. Who knows, Dawn Approach might turn up there too. Toronado is now 13 kilos heavier than he was in the Guineas--he is so much more relaxed since we switched him from Everleigh to Herridge and obviously the spoon-bit that we fitted before Royal Ascot has made all the difference to his breathing. He is simply a very special horse." Later, the trainer's son and assistant Richard Hannon Jr. was looking further afield. "He just nicked himself in the race, but he's fine and has been out this morning," he added. "He and Dawn Approach are a saga that is going to go on and on and we'll find out who's best at the end of the summer. I'd love to go to the Breeders' Cup and running on fast ground around two turns at Santa Anita would be right up his street, and set him up as a stallion."

"He traveled really good and got himself in a really nice position," jockey Richard Kingscote said. "Turning for home, I was pretty confident. He likes to keep rolling and this track really suits him, as they get racing early and grind it out. He's a lovely horse for me and the whole yard, and we all love him at home. Tom [Dascombe] was really confident about the trip and he has always shown at home that it is not a problem. On

that evidence, there looks to be more to come as he seems to like a slog and the ground doesn't bother him. He is genuine and is going the right way." Dascombe added, "We probably haven't done as well as we should have done with him by now, but I think the horse is helping us because he's

matured. We've taken our time and tried to pick races this year. We've tried to get him spot-on for each day, and it seems to be working a bit better than it was. This was the plan and the target. Hopefully, we'll move on if he's alright after this. When you've only got a few, you need to make them produce the results so this is massive." For part-owner Michael Owen, who was previously famous for his part in English soccer, the win was a landmark for his fledgling Manor House Stables operation.

"It doesn't get any better than to win this prestigious race--there is a lot of heritage involved. He's the apple of my eye. We wanted to be in a position where we could inject a bit of pace if needed, as he's a relentless galloper, and stamina won the day. It's scary to breed one like this, as I only have one mare so I'm very lucky. We looked at the Gold Cup this year, but he just wasn't quite right and so we went the softly-softly route with the plan being the G1 Irish St Leger [at The Curragh Sept. 15] before a tilt at the G1 Melbourne Cup [at Flemington Nov. 5]. That's a strong possibility now, so Australia here we come. It's a great training performance from Tom and a great ride by Richard, so I'm really proud of them and all those who are behind the scenes. With football, you always feel you're in some sort of control, but this racing game is so tough on the nerves--you're powerless."

Saayerr started off in the same five-furlong Salisbury maiden won by his stable's past group winner **Approve (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) May 23, and followed an

impressive win there with a short-head defeat of the smart **Lilbourne Lass (GB)** (Pastoral Pursuits {GB}) giving her eight pounds also over that trip at Windsor June 3.

Subsequently unable to land a blow when eighth in the G2 **Norfolk S.** at Royal Ascot June 20, the bay relished this rise in trip to secure a first black-type success. Never far away from the honest pace under Ryan Moore, he worked his way to the front approaching the

furlong pole and held off the unexposed **Cable Bay** in a gritty display as the pair pulled clear. "I'd say the extra furlong helped him, but five furlongs at Ascot is not a massive difference to six furlongs here," his rider said. "The race panned out quite well for him. They didn't go mad for the first two furlongs, but I got a nice tow for a good part of the race and, when the runner-up came on the outside, he found a bit more and just did enough."

Trainer William Haggas's wife Maureen added, "That's his trip, and he almost outstayed the second horse there. He ran well at Ascot, but it was probably too short for him. We were a little bit confused by Windsor the time before, as he looked like he wanted six furlongs there, but Ascot's five is stiff and we thought the Norfolk was the easier race. William has always loved him and six is obviously his go. He is bred by Cheveley Park Stud and I don't think the mare stayed that far, so with a real professional and solid 2-year-old with plenty of speed it is best to keep going now and make hay while the sun shines."

Newmarket July 11 to wait for some rain. Always traveling easily for Tom Queally out wide in fifth here, the lightly raced chestnut was held on to, but motored into contention without being asked a question approaching the quarter pole. In front soon after, she was not fully

extended to stamp her authority on this contest and impress her jockey as a result. "She retains all her ability and maybe some more," he said. "She was equally as impressive as last year and the ground was safe, so we needed to get her out. I wanted to go around for as long as I could on the bridle and keep her together, even if it cost me some ground and she won pretty good. We hope she can go on to better things, as Sir Henry was always very keen on her and the owners paid a pretty penny for her, so it's paid dividends. I think she can make her presence felt at Group 1 level and she's got class, a bit of speed and a few gears. She traveled through the race with conviction. The ground is key to her and very important--she certainly wouldn't want it any quicker than this."

The owners' representative Jimmy George added, "She looks like she has retained all her ability and it is great vindication of Sir Henry's opinion of her last year. That is why the owners bought her and kept in training with the key being to get a Group 1, but she is quite ground-dependant and that is why she was taken out of the Princess of Wales's. Obviously, races like the G1 Yorkshire Oaks [at York Aug. 22] and G1 Prix Vermeille [at Longchamp Sept. 15] are options if she comes out of this well, but Warren Place are well-placed to decide where she goes. I think she'll stay with her own sex for now and if she is up to Group 1 standard, maybe she will take on the boys later. She looked a class act today and a pretty decent middle-distance filly was in second."

GLORIOUS RETURN

Today's action at Goodwood sees the return of **Masterstroke** (Monsun {Ger}) in the G3 Glorious S., and Godolphin's 4-year-old remains one of the most intriguing of the older brigade with a host of the major contests still to come in 2013. Handled by Andre Fabre last term, the homebred captured the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville over 1 9/16 miles in August before filling third spot in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp in October. After failing to appear at the Dubai Carnival when getting involved in a stalls incident, he has been given time to recuperate, and trainer Charlie Appleby is not expecting fireworks on this belated seasonal bow. "Masterstroke has been off the track for a while," he said. "We have taken our time since then and I expect him to improve on his first start of the season. He ran well on heavy going in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, and he would probably prefer a little cut in the ground, although he won on good going at Deauville and Vichy last year." Among his opponents is George Strawbridge's 2012 G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly winner **Aiken (GB)** (Selkirk), who was runner-up in the two-mile G3 British Champions Long Distance Cup on Ascot's Champions' Day on his last outing in October.

"We think that he has the potential to go all the way, so we'll be looking for a big run here. Similarly, Baltic Knight, our second runner, is making great strides, and he is rated only two pounds behind Montiridge, so he deserves this shot at Pattern company." **Glory Awaits (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}) probably ran right up to the form of his second to Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) in the May 4 G1 2000 Guineas when fifth behind that rival in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot last time June 18.

Stephanie Headed Home to Arlington For 'Beverly'...

The GI Beverly D. S. may be the next target for multiple Grade I winner and GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf heroine **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy), according to trainer Wayne Catalano. The Ramsey Stable homebred millionaire is coming off a third-place finish as the heavy chalk in the GI Diana S. at Saratoga July 27.

"She came out really good," Catalano said. "The race doesn't look like it took too much out of her."

Stephanie's Kitten had a troubled start in the Diana and charged from last into a leisurely pace to take third by only half a length to horses carrying five pounds less than her.

"Things didn't set up right," Catalano explained. "She didn't break good and it kind of cost us the race."

Stephanie's Kitten would be returning to her roots, having begun her career and donned cap and gown at Arlington in 2011. The leading Arlington Park trainer does not think coming back in three weeks or the added 1/16 of a mile will be an issue for the filly.

"She went the last eighth in :10 3/5 in the Diana--not too many horses can do that," Catalano remarked.

Normandy Invasion Back In Training...

Fox Hill Farms' **Normandy Invasion** (Tapit), a good fourth in the GI Kentucky Derby May 4, is back in training, according to trainer Chad Brown. The GI Wood Memorial runner-up missed several workouts with a foot abscess in July. "He's been galloping for over a week, but I am not sure of the timetable," Brown said. "After another week of galloping, I might let him breeze. Right now, I just want to get him to his first breeze and then go from there."

GIOFRA RETIRED

Haras De La Perelle homebred **Giofra (Fr)** (Dansili {GB}--Gracefully {Ire}, by Orpen), winner of last year's G1 Falmouth S., has been retired, according to *The French Daily News*. The 5-year-old failed to find the winner's circle after her Falmouth victory over Elusive Kate (Elusive Quality), but performed admirably nonetheless, placing in last year's G1 Prix de l'Opera Longines and G1 Hong Kong Cup before hitting the board in G1 Dubai Duty Free to kick off her season Mar. 30. She finished third behind Elusive Kate while attempting to defend her Falmouth title at Newmarket July 12, and most recently finished last of 12 behind that foe in the G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville July 28. Giofra will return to her owner-breeder's farm to commence her breeding career.

CALIDOSCOPIO TO HARAS LA QUEBRADA

Calidoscopio (Arg) (Luhuk--Calderona {Arg}, by Lefty), winner of last year's GII Breeders' Cup Marathon and this season's GII Brooklyn H., will enter stud at Haras la Quebrada in Argentina, where he will stand for the current Southern Hemisphere breeding season, according to *Racing Post*. The now 10-year-old Calidoscopio made history last year by becoming the first South American-trained horse to win at the Breeders' Cup and, after failing to fire when fifth in the GIII Tokyo City S. at Santa Anita Mar. 23, recorded a memorable victory when coming from more than 20 lengths out to take the Brooklyn at Belmont June 7. He was retired with a tendon injury at the end of June.

PASQUIER BANNED

Jockey Stephane Pasquier was handed a three-month suspension yesterday by France Galop, after testing positive for a prohibited substance. Although the details have not been disclosed, the punishment revolves around a test carried out after a race meeting at Longchamp in April, but the authorities have imposed only half the normal ban length in this case. Agent Herve Naggar issued a statement on behalf of the 35-year-old, whose career has been highlighted by the 2006 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe success of Rail Link (GB). "This morning Stephane Pasquier was issued with a three-month suspension by the France Galop stewards following a positive sample for a prohibited substance taken on April 11 at Longchamp," it read. "The France Galop medical commission met on July 9 and concluded that there was a possibility of contamination and an absence of voluntary consumption of the incriminating substance. Therefore, Stephane Pasquier has decided to appeal the decision of the stewards and will make no further declaration on the subject while that procedure takes place."

Exceed and Excel, Northern Meteor Take Australian Titles

Darley's **Exceed and Excel (Aus)** (Danehill) was officially crowned Australia's champion sire when the Southern Hemisphere season drew to a close Wednesday. A resident of Kelvinside Stud near Aberdeen, New South Wales, Exceed and Excel's progeny amassed A\$11,437,997 in earnings over the 2012-2013 season, highlighted by victories by Overreach (Aus) in the G1 Golden Slipper and Guelph (Aus) in the G1 Sires Produce and Champagne S. The 13-year-old will stand for a fee of A\$88,000 this season, and his book will include sprint champion Black Caviar (Aus). First season sire honors went to Widden Stud resident **Northern Meteor (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), who sadly died due to complications from colic just a day before his title became official. Northern Meteor's first crop included 19 winners and three stakes winners. He was to stand for A\$27,500 this season. Sheikh Mohammed was the leading owner by Australian stakes wins with 51, while his Darley Stud took leading breeder honors. Darley's primary trainer Peter Snowden was the leading trainer by stakes winners with 46, while his first call rider Kerrin McEvoy led the jockey's table with 36 stakes victories.

South Africa

Silvano Crowned Leading Sire

Maine Chance Farms' **Silvano (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) earned his first leading sire title in South Africa when the 2012-2013 season drew to a close Wednesday. The 17-year-old is the sire of 12 stakes winners this season, including G1 Durban July winner Heavy Metal (SAf) and G1 German Derby winner Lucky Speed (Ire). The trainer's championship also drew to a dramatic conclusion, with perennial leader Mike de Kock just edging former assistant Sean Tarry in stakes earnings, R16,867,912 to R16,517,350. Jockey Pierre Strydom led the jockey's table with R18,269,625 in stakes earnings. Summerhill Stud was the leading breeder with R16,193,195 in stakes prizes, while Mrs I and Mr M J Jooste claimed leading owner honors with R16,473,540.
