

F-T SARATOGA SALE STARTS TODAY

The Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearlings Sale begins its two-day run Monday evening in the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, with a boutique catalogue featuring 152 yearlings, down from 189 in 2012. Potential bidders were out in force at the sales grounds on a bustling Sunday morning.

“The activity has been high and the feedback about the quality of the horses has been very positive,” reported Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. “Ultimately, that’s what makes a good horse sale--having quality stock on the grounds.”

The 2012 Saratoga sale got off to a slow start, with the first-session average down 20% and the median off 29% from the 2011 opening session, but action picked up during the sale’s second session. At the close of business a year ago, 107 yearlings sold for an even \$32 million. The average was down 6.3% to \$299,065 and the median fell by 10% to \$225,000.

Given current conditions, Browning is optimistic that the auction is primed for a strong renewal.

“The market has been pretty good and racing has been good,” Browning said. “We had two great updates yesterday that improved pedigree pages that were already pretty nice to begin with. So there are a lot of positive factors. And we have high expectations for a very good sale Monday and Tuesday.”

The Saratoga catalog features siblings to Saturday’s two Grade I winners. Woodford Thoroughbreds consigns a filly by Congrats out of K.D.’s Shady Lady (Maria’s Mon) as hip 74. The yearling is a half-sister to GI Clement L. Hirsch S. winner Lady of Fifty (After Market). Taylor Made consigns a half-brother by Medaglia d’Oro to Cross Traffic, who won the GI Whitney H. just a few furlongs from the Fasig-Tipton sales grounds. He sells Tuesday as hip 134.

Taylor Made’s Mark Taylor admitted to some pre-sale jitters Sunday, but said his overall attitude was positive ahead of Monday’s 7 p.m. start time. Cont. p9

CLOUD BURST

So impressive when winning Deauville’s G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest for the past two years, George Strawbridge’s diminutive star Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) was every bit as good in yesterday’s edition as she dispatched the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. and G1 July Cup hero Lethal Force (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) with a minimum of fuss. Warming up for her treble bid with a scintillating performance in the G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot over seven furlongs at Longchamp July 6, the Strawbridge homebred was never more than

three lengths off the pace set by her British rival. Given the go-ahead by Thierry Jarnet approaching the furlong pole, the 6-5 pick did what no other had managed in the major sprints so far this term by stripping him of the lead soon after, and she scampered clear under hand riding to score by 1 3/4 lengths. “What can be said that has not already been said--she is really fantastic and all class and I think she’s even stronger and better than last season,” commented trainer Freddy Head, who was registering a remarkable sixth success with just two horses since 2006. He also stage-managed the three successes of his previous stable luminary Marchand d’Or (Fr) (Marchand de Sable). “She really knows how to run now and if she comes out of this race and is well during the week, the plan is to come back next Sunday for the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, which has always been the target.” Cont. p3

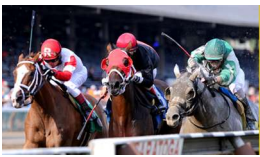

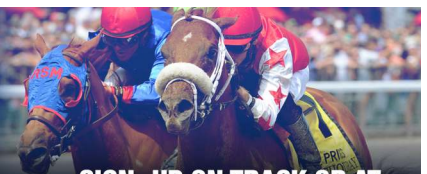

Labeled a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ at two, Moonlight Cloud was sent to the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket the following May in the hope that her raw speed would last the mile, but she duly ran out of steam late on to be seventh in that Classic. Returning to her native country to annex the G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot over seven furlongs at Longchamp before her first emphatic score in this prize, she was the subject of a troubled passage when fifth in the six-furlong G2 British Champions Sprint S. on her final sophomore start at Ascot in October. Back with a win in Longchamp's G3 Prix du Palais-Royal over a panel further last June, she almost managed the unthinkable later that month when Ascot's winning post came just a handful of yards too soon and she just failed to end the dynamic sequence of Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. Stamping her authority on this contest next time, she was sent back over a mile a week later and was far from disgraced when fourth at her second attempt at the trip in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at this meeting. Proving that she does get that far when taking the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp the following month, she never featured in the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita, but showed on her comeback in the Porte Maillot that she retained all of her considerable ability. Wide throughout as she had been on her two prior runs through this contest, she was kept close enough to Lethal Force to avoid giving that rival the potent lead he had enjoyed in Britain, and was full of run when asked for her effort inside the final quarter mile. Quickly subduing the trail-blazer with a furlong to race, she was on auto-pilot from there as she surged to the line to record the clear-fastest time in the race's history.

"To win one Maurice de Gheest is fantastic, but to win three with the same filly is amazing," Thierry Jarnet said. "I've been very lucky to be on some really nice horses this season, and I'm 46 and enjoying it as much as ever. I had the perfect trip and she did it on her own. I'm happy she didn't have a hard race with next week in mind." Lethal Force's trainer Clive Cox told the *Racing Post*, "Adam [Kirby] felt he probably just peaked at Newmarket and just felt a bit flat in comparison. We were very happy with him to bring him here after Newmarket. All credit to the filly and I'm still very pleased with my horse."

Graded stakes veteran Justin Phillip finally locked down an elusive Grade I victory in Sunday's GI Alfred Vanderbilt H. after finishing second in last year's rendition by a neck. The dark bay finished last season with a fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Santa Anita and remained on the west coast to complete the GII Palos Verdes trifecta Jan. 19 before weakening to fifth in the GII San Carlos Feb. 23, both efforts behind subsequent GI Met Mile winner Sahara Sky (Pleasant Tap). He returned to form in a wet Oaklawn optional claimer Mar. 21 and closed to take the GIII Count Fleet Sprint H. there Apr. 13. Most recently, he was runner-up behind fellow Zayat colorbearer Fast Bullet (Speightstown) in Belmont's GII True North H. June 8 and finished fourth behind Bahamian Squall in Calder's GII Smile Sprint H. July 9.

"Last year's Vanderbilt was a good opportunity for him, and I thought he was unfortunate not to win that day," said winning trainer Steve Asmussen. "For everything to work out, to have him in this position today--a good draw, a good set up--was very rewarding. I can't say enough about how much respect I have for Justin Phillip as a racehorse. He hasn't held any of the mistakes we made with him against us. We were trying to win the Derby with him when he was three! He has a lot of talent, and you want to get that done. For him to travel as much as he has, run as fast as he has, and probably put up his best race today--1:08 2/5 in a Grade I, put him over a million dollars--it's very rewarding."

"It was very good," pilot Johnny Velazquez said of the ride. "The speed developed the way I expected it would. I was right behind those two horses [Gentlemen's Bet and Delaunay], and I was aware of the horse that was inside [Bahamian Squall], so I kind of got him pinned down inside there. I made my move around the three-sixteenths pole, and he responded. When you ride these kinds of horses, and they respond to the things you want to do, it makes me look good."

Tom Amoss, who trains fourth-place finisher Delaunay commented, "I thought he broke sharp and had very good position. They were going fast, but he's used to that. When he hadn't separated himself from the field by the eighth pole, I knew we were in trouble. I'm going to give him a little time. His last two races weren't good and he's telling us something."

Alberts Hope kept his perfect record intact with dogged determination in the stretch of the GII Best Pal S. The Jaam Racing colorbearer was an upset winner at first asking, sent off at odds of 33-1 going five panels at Betfair Hollywood Park. He was a tepid 5-2 choice in his graded stakes debut here. Racing a bit wide on the backstretch as Alpine Luck (Lucky J.H.) and Guns Loaded led, the bay put in an eye-catching run to reach the fore two furlongs out. Celtic Moon, moving strongly to his inside, made him work in the final panel, but Alberts Hope asserted late for the neck victory. Alberts Hope becomes the second graded winner, and second juvenile stakes winner this year, for sophomore sire Run Away and Hide (City Zip), himself a multiple graded stakes winner at two.

"I was kind of surprised by his first time out [win] because I had never really pushed on this horse," said trainer Mike Puype. "I think there's a little bit more even than you've seen today. Obviously the next step is on to the [Del Mar] Futurity [Sept. 4]. We'll give it a shot and see if he's good enough. He doesn't owe anyone anything after this win [considering] what we paid for him (\$40,000)."

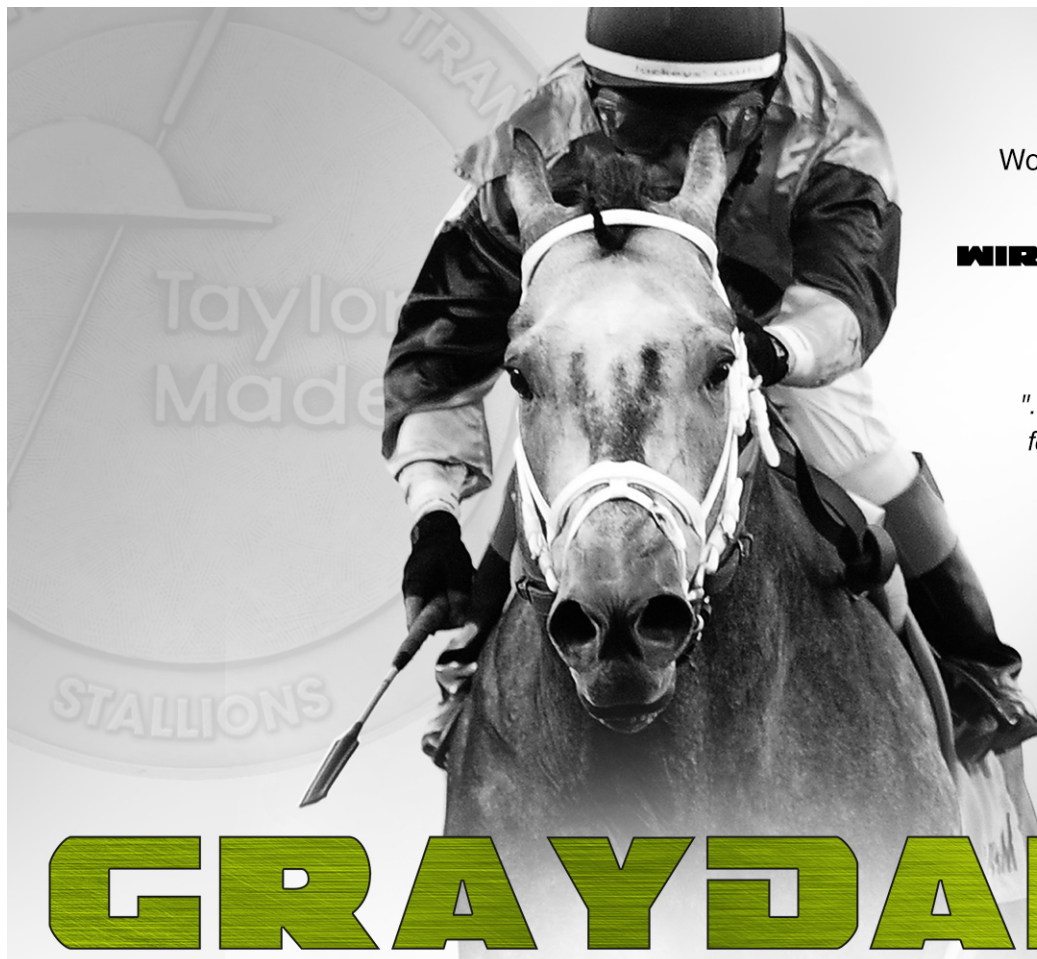

Starting off with a two-length win in a six-furlong maiden at Hoppegarten last July, Penelopa was second in the Listed Zukunfts-Rennen over a furlong further at Baden-Baden the following month, and returned to contest the G2 German 1000 Guineas at this track June 2. Unable to go the pace when only eighth in that mile Classic, the bay proved that middle-distances were her bag when third in the June 22 Listed Preis Dusseldorf over 100 yards shy of this trip last time. Held on to early by Eduardo Pedroza, she benefitted from the experience and guile of that rider by saving vital energy, allowing the frantic dash to gain a prominent pitch to happen ahead of her. By halfway, she was still on the rail taking the shortest route around the turning circuit with the favorite and G1 Epsom Oaks runner-up Secret Gesture just ahead, and was still on the inner as that rival loomed on the front end after the home turn. Secret Gesture was committed with a furlong remaining and appeared to have the race in safe keeping, but Penelopa gave a surge to overwhelm her in the final yards and win going away. The victorious connections are looking at the G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp Sept. 15, while those of the runner-up offered no excuses for her reversal.

"I think all the ingredients are there, in terms of a small catalogue with plenty of horses with good conformation. Everybody knows the foal crop is down, so maybe there is not as much to choose from. The further you get into the sales season, the sense of urgency increases. So I think all those ingredients are good, but at the end of the day you just never know. Buyers are fickle."
 Denali Stud's Craig Bandoroff also sees reasons for optimism.
 "There is no reason to think it's not going to be good," Bandoroff said. "It's good leading up to it, the economy is good, the stock market is good, people are in a good mood. Racing seems to be doing some things right for a change. Supply and demand is in a good balance now and that is important."
 Mill Ridge's Headley Bell commented, "We're realistic, but hopeful." Of the slimmed-down catalogue, he added, "This is a boutique sale and you've got the atmosphere and everything that goes with that. I think you place your horses accordingly and we love the horses we have here."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

CUP TARGET CONFIRMED FOR WINSILI

Saturday’s surprise G1 Nassau S. winner **Winsili (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) has the Breeders’ Cup as her ultimate aim this term, connections announced yesterday. Following the success of the John Gosden-trained 3-year-old in Goodwood’s 10-furlong contest, the Juddmonte homebred is set to build towards the Filly & Mare Turf at Santa Anita in November. “Everything went better than expected, but we always had a good opinion of Winsili,” Khalid Abdullah’s Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe commented. “Winsili had only had the two races this season, so she’s not got many miles on the clock. She’s not particularly big, but is a robust filly and I would think a Breeders’ Cup Filly & Mare Turf might be on the agenda as a main aim given mile-and-a-half races like the Yorkshire Oaks are out, really. She could take in something like the G1 Prix de l’Opera [at Longchamp Oct. 6] on the way.”

NIEL TARGET FOR FLINTSHIRE

Khalid Abdullah's **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) is being aimed at the G2 Prix Niel at Longchamp Sept. 15, connections announced yesterday. Successful in the G3 Prix du Lys at Chantilly June 16 and G1 Grand Prix de Paris also at Longchamp July 13, the Andre Fabre trainee is being geared towards a tilt at the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. "Flintshire came out of the Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris in really good shape and everyone is very happy with him," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe commented. "He will go, all being well, to the Prix Niel, the trial in September, and then head for the Arc. He looks good, he's got this wonderfully good stride and he quickened off quite a slow pace at Longchamp so we have to be very positive about him."

WHITNEY WRAP-UP

The Todd-Pletcher trained **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song) exited his GI Whitney Invitational win "very well," according to his conditioner. "He looked good this morning and seemed to take the race really well," said Pletcher. "The [GI] Woodward [Aug. 31] is certainly a possibility, and if we decide we need more time, the [GI] Jockey Club Gold Cup [at Belmont Sept. 28] is a back-up plan."

Previously, the gray was second by a head behind Flat Out (Flatter) in the GIII Westchester S. at Belmont Apr. 27 and was just nipped on the line by Sahara Sky (Pleasant Tap) in the GI Metropolitan Mile May 27. "I think when you take a tough beat like he did in the Met, one side of you thinks, 'Well, we'll get one of these,'" Pletcher continued. "The other side is, when you blow an opportunity, sometimes you never get it again. I was happy for the horse; he ran two winning races at Belmont and lost by five inches. So, it was nice to get a Grade I win for him. He's got a real stallion's pedigree, and that's what you have to do, win races like that to take it to the next level."

"He put himself into the race right away," he added of the race. "Every time they turned up the pressure, he was able to turn it up another notch. It was a perfect trip, but it was a self-produced perfect trip. What I liked about the race yesterday, it looked like those horses were gaining on him, but then you look at the gallop-out, and he's cleared them again. It's all a function of pace and he showed yesterday he's ratable, even though he was on the front end. The first quarter showed he has speed, but he's not headstrong."

Reigning GI Breeders' Cup Classic champion **Fort Larned** (E Dubai) also exited the Whitney in good shape. After a slow start, the Ian Wilkes pupil finished fifth. "We didn't get away good yesterday; we broke a little slow," Wilkes said. "That wasn't from any tactics or anything. The horse just broke a little slow, and if we break better, it changes the complexion of the race. [Cross Traffic's jockey] Johnny [Velazquez] rode a great race. He got away with a :24 first quarter. Let's pay all tribute to what Johnny, Todd and Cross Traffic did. We will have to regroup."

"This Grade I handicap division is a tough division," Wilkes continued. "We could run this race again in three or four weeks and have a different winner. It's a testament to how strong a division it is. It's not easy; if you make mistakes, you're going to get beat."

Sixth-place finisher **Alpha** (Bernardini) returned to the Kieran McLaughlin stable in good shape as well. "He came out of the race great; it was just too tough a field," McLaughlin said. "We're not sure what we're going to do from here, but he's fine. He's in good shape."

"We were expecting a much faster first quarter and half," McLaughlin said of Alpha's position during the race. "We were well back, and it's hard to make up ground on these types of horses going 24 and 47. But, we knew we were in tough to start with. We just have to regroup and figure out what we're going to do."

Princess of Sylmar Works...

GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Coaching Club American Oaks heroine **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior) worked four furlongs in :49.60 Sunday morning over the Saratoga main track. "Princess of Sylmar worked dynamite this morning," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "I'm really, really happy with her. We're hoping she maintains form for a couple more weeks." The filly is a possibility for the GI Alabama S. Aug. 17.

Fast Work for 'Fifty' at the Spa...

Fiftyshadesofgold (My Golden Song) posted a four-furlong bullet work in :46.32 (1/66) at Saratoga Sunday morning. The Debutante S. winner is being aimed for the GII Adirondack S. Aug. 11. "She worked great," said conditioner Bret Calhoun. "It was a little quicker than I would have liked, but it was visually impressive. She did it easily and she never took a deep breath afterward."

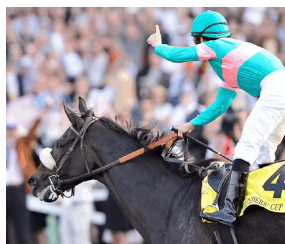
