BRIGHT START TO F-T SARATOGA SALE

The Chamber of Commerce type weather that ushered in this year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Yearling sale was carried over to the opening day of trade, with average, median and gross up from comparable figures from a sluggish opening session one year ago, all despite a slimmed down catalogue. With a pair of seven-figure yearlings leading the way, a total of 50 yearlings sold for an aggregate of \$15,670,000, compared to 52 grossing \$13,590,000 a year ago. Average price increased 19.9%, up from \$261,346 to \$313,400, while median increased 36.3% from \$200,000 to

\$272,500 this year. Another notable change was reflected in the buyback rate, which decreased from 33.3% last year to 25.4%.

"We had a very good start to the Saratoga sale," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "With the smaller catalog, gross sales were up 15%, and I think that was a reflection of what we anticipated."

Topping last night's session was Hip 69, a filly by the late Three Chimneys' stallion Dynaformer. Three Chimneys' Robert Clay, bidding on behalf of Borges Torrealba, went to \$1.225 million to secure the half-sister to multiple graded-stakes winner Optimizer (English Channel). The filly was consigned by John Stuart's Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services on behalf of her breeder Brad Kelley's Bluegrass Hall.

Also breaking the million-dollar mark on a night which saw a strong domestic buying bench was Hip 23, a daughter of Distorted Humor, purchased by Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation. The filly was offered by John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale, which also co-bred the daughter of Cascading (A.P. Indy).

A.P. Indy was responsible for the dams of the session's top three lots.

"There were quality offerings in the catalog, on the sales' grounds and present tonight, and we had a quality group of buyers throughout," said Browning. "There was a very broad representation, which is very encouraging, not only for this sale, but for the Thoroughbred market with the spread of buying groups and activity. That was the single-most encouraging sign that I saw tonight."

Torrealba Digs Deep for Dynaformer Filly...

Three Chimneys' Robert Clay, bidding on behalf of the Borges Torrealba family, went to a session-topping \$1.225 million to secure a filly by Dynaformer ([hip 69](#)) during Monday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale.

"It's a big price," admitted Clay, who did his bidding on the balcony overlooking the sales ring while on the phone with Goncalo Torrealba. "It was nice to get a Dynaformer filly for him. She's a lovely Dynaformer, with a lot of size, a lot of quality. She's a beautiful mover and a really nice filly. We've been looking at her on his behalf."

Dynaformer, who stood at Three Chimneys, died last April, and Clay admitted, "There aren't that many left."

Last November, Three Chimneys and the Brazilian-based Borges Torrealba family announced they had formed a partnership. They purchased several high-profile mares at the November sales, led by the \$4.5-million Pure Clan (Pure Prize), as well as the \$1.95-million Pilfer (Deputy Minister).

The Borges Torrealba family owns and operates Grupo Libra, a group of diversified companies in Brazil, including Brazil's largest shipping container terminal. Grupo Libra is a third-generation family business that was founded by Goncalo's grandfather, Wilfred Borges.

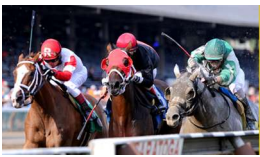

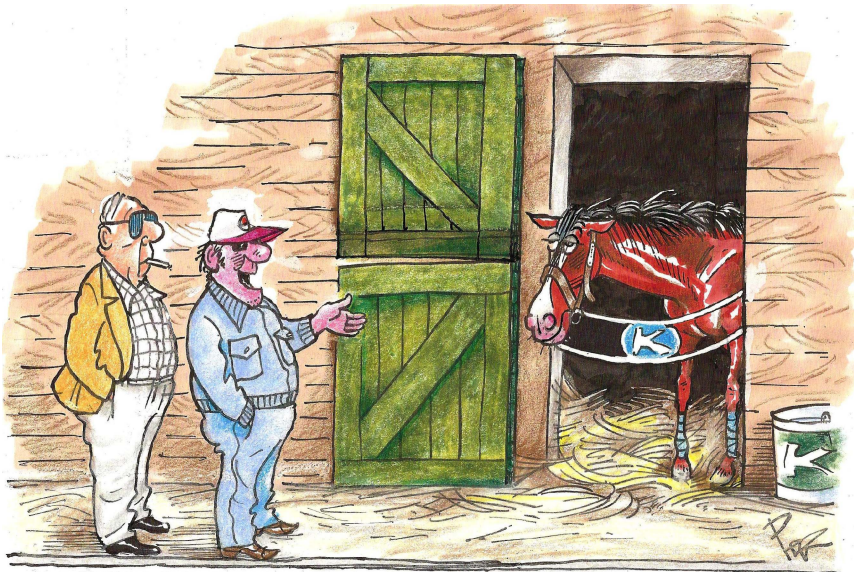

Dynaformer Filly Continues Big Year for Calumet...

Brad Kelley, who began operating as Calumet Farm in 2011, has already won a Classic under his new banner and continued a big season Monday night in Saratoga with the session-topping \$1.225 million sale of a filly by the late Dynaformer. The yearling is a half-sister to Calumet's multiple graded stakes winner Optimizer (English Channel).

The seven-figure price tag was no surprise to John Stuart, whose Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services consigned the yearling on Kelley's behalf.

"Our expectations were that we would be pretty close to the top with her, whatever that would be at Saratoga this year," Stuart said. "She was a pretty obvious filly. She is a beautifully bred filly, but she is also an outstanding mover. She is as good a moving filly as I've ever had."

In addition to Optimizer's exploits on the racetrack, Calumet's silks were carried to victory in this year's GI Preakness S. by Oxbow (Awesome Again).

"They are having a pretty good year," Stuart said of Calumet. "The Preakness and maybe this filly's half-brother Optimizer will win the GI Sword Dancer and be the Grade I winner he deserves to be, because he's a warrior. And everyone can get into the family now, because they'll be standing him at Calumet."

Kelley purchased Indy Pick (A.P. Indy), in foal to Horse Chestnut {SAf}), for \$260,000 at the 2007 Keeneland November sale. She produced Optimizer in 2009. She has a 2-year-old filly by English Channel and a weanling filly by the turf champion. Kelley relocated English Channel from Hurricane Hall to Lane's End in 2009.

The decision to sell Indy Pick's Dynaformer yearling was an easy one, according to Stuart.

"Basically, we made the decision that, since they are selective around the sales--you've got to have the sire, you've got to have a perfect x-rays, they've got to be conformed well--for them to sell well," he said. "So those that meet that definition will be sold. And the ones by the stallions that are cold or they have an off-set knee, and we like them, then we'll race them."

Stuart has had plenty of sales success with daughters of Dynaformer. He consigned Blue Bunting to the Saratoga sale in 2009. That filly sold for \$200,000 and went on to be a multiple Group 1 winner in Europe. He also consigned Riskaverse to the 2005 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale where she sold for \$5 million.

"I've been lucky with Dynaformer fillies," Stuart smiled.

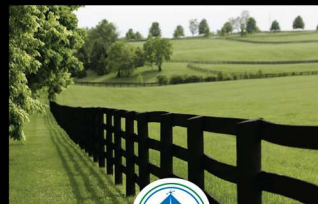

"We went a little beyond what we appraised her at, but we were not that far off," said Hill. "We were pretty close."

Hill ‘n’ Dale Well Rewarded for Outstanding Family...

John Sikura’s Hill ‘n’ Dale Farm has had a long and successful association with the family of [hip 23](#), who is a daughter of Hill ‘n’ Dale homebred stakes winner Cascading (A.P. Indy).

“She is a unique filly that we’ve retained all of the daughters,” said Sikura. “We’re very proud of the family and it has never been presented at auction. We always feel so blessed to see such a great appreciation for something that hasn’t been exposed to the marketplace. You never know how they will perceive and value that pedigree, and they seemed to value it greatly. It’s a very proud moment.”

Hill ‘n’ Dale has been involved in three generations of the yearling’s filly. Her third dam is broodmare of the year Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister), who brought a record \$14 million at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton November sale. Cascading is out of Teeming (Storm Cat), a half-sister to GI Belmont S. winner Rags to Riches.

“We have spent a long time developing this pedigree,” Sikura confirmed. “We owned Better Than Honour, twice. We’ve had great success with her and I think her daughter Teeming is going to be the next fantastic mare. To have a filly of this quality as her first foal is very exciting. That’s why I moved here and got into the business, to get into significant pedigrees that can make their mark. So it’s a great moment.”

Cascading has a weanling colt by Distorted Humor, while her dam Teeming has a weanling filly by Smart Strike and a yearling filly by Tapit.

“There are two mares I would never sell,” Sikura admitted. “One mare, Dai Jin, who we lost and was a foundation mare for us, and now Teeming, who has carried such a heavy burden and has done so much for the farm and has allowed us to do a great thing for our families and keep us relevant in the business.”

Sikura said he wasn’t surprised by the yearling’s seven-figure price tag. “I thought she was a million-dollar filly,” he said. “If she made anything beyond a million, I don’t think it would make a difference. I don’t think you get to see a filly like that very often. If you judge her physically, she is a very good specimen, so she really had everything. If I wasn’t in this pedigree and I was bidding on her, I would give that and more for her. The reserve was \$400,000, so the market appraised her accordingly.”

Better Part of Valor...

Flexing its muscles early in Monday's opening session, Team Valor International came out swinging with a healthy \$600,000 final bid for [Hip 8](#), a daughter of the late Indian Charlie.

"She's big, and sometimes I'm afraid of buying big horses, but she is a really great mover," said Team Valor's Barry Irwin. "She has a long, sweeping walk and good conformation. That's why I bought her."

The daughter of breeder Peter Redekop's Grade III winner Alpine Garden (Lemon Drop Kid) was offered as a weanling at last fall's Keeneland November sale, and the dark bay filly was secured for \$185,000 by Brian Graves' BGH Ranch.

"She was a really good physical horse, very elegant, big quality mare with a good mind," said Gainesway's Michael Heron. "She took to the sales process and showed herself well and worked her way up the ladder to find herself an item to be sought after."

Indian Charlie, who stood at Airdrie Stud before succumbing to cancer at age 16 in 2011, is represented by his final crop of yearlings this season. During yesterday's session, a total of five yearlings by the sire were offered, three of which sold for an average of \$401,666.

"I have never bought an Indian Charlie," confirmed Irwin. "But this filly had a lot of depth. She is just a spectacular individual."

At the halfway mark of yesterday's session, Team Valor came out firing again, this time for [Hip 33](#), a striking colt by Medaglia d'Oro. The bay, consigned by Bluewater Sales, was bred by Mike Moreno's Southern Equine.

"He's a brute and that's what I liked about him," said Irwin. "He is awesome. He has a great temperament and has a great way about him. I felt really comfortable buying him."

Regarding the price, the third highest of Monday's opening session, Irwin said, "I thought I had no chance. I really thought he was going to go for over a million. I would have gone to a million, but not farther than that."

Bluewater Sales' Meg Levy said, "We were very happy with that price. When you bring a horse like that to sale, you just never know. I expected him to bring anywhere between \$500,000 and a million. I think that was a fair price for him. I think he

went to a very good spot. Team Valor is an extremely successful partnership and Barry Irwin knows what to do with them to make them win. And that's what we need for our breeders' mares."

The Jan. 25 foal is out of stakes winner Crystal Current, who is a daughter of multiple Grade I winner and millionairess Dream Supreme (Seeking the Gold), making her a full-sister to GI Hopeful S. hero and up-and-coming sire Majestic Warrior. Also campaigned by George Steinbrenner's Kinsman Stables, the colt's third dam, Spinning Round [Dixieland Band}, recorded a career best in the GI Ballerina S. Crystal Current, in foal to Distorted Humor, was purchased for \$3.1 million by Southern Equine at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale.

Team Valor has already enjoyed success with the Darley sire Medaglia d'Oro, having campaigned Crop Report, winner of the Mar. 23 Rushway S.

"I bought Medaglia d'Oro himself for Richard Haisfield and Stonewall Farm when he was with Bobby Frankel," said Irwin. "I have a breeding right in him and I've

seen a lot of his foals. A lot of them look like grass horses, but this horse likes a real died-in-the-wool American, dirt horse."

Offering a positive update to an already loaded page, a full-sister to Crystal Current, named A.P. Dream, is also responsible for Wind Fire (Distorted Humor), who was third in the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot June 20.

Underscoring his affinity for the Saratoga sale, Irwin added, "I bought good horses here before. I bought [dual graded stakes winner] Fairbanks (Giant's Causeway) for [a sales-topping] \$1.85 million [in 2004]. I've spent big amounts here and done well here."

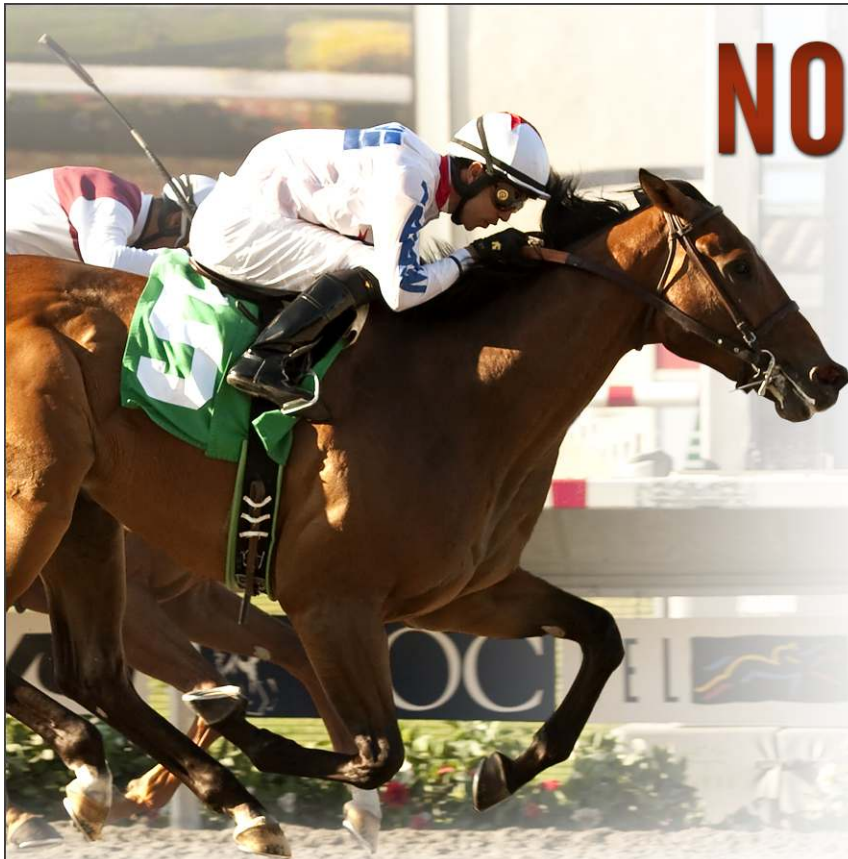

Fresh off their victory in Sunday's GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. with hard-knocking 5-year-old Justin Phillip (First Samurai), the Zayat braintrust reached out for another colt from the Storm Cat sire line. 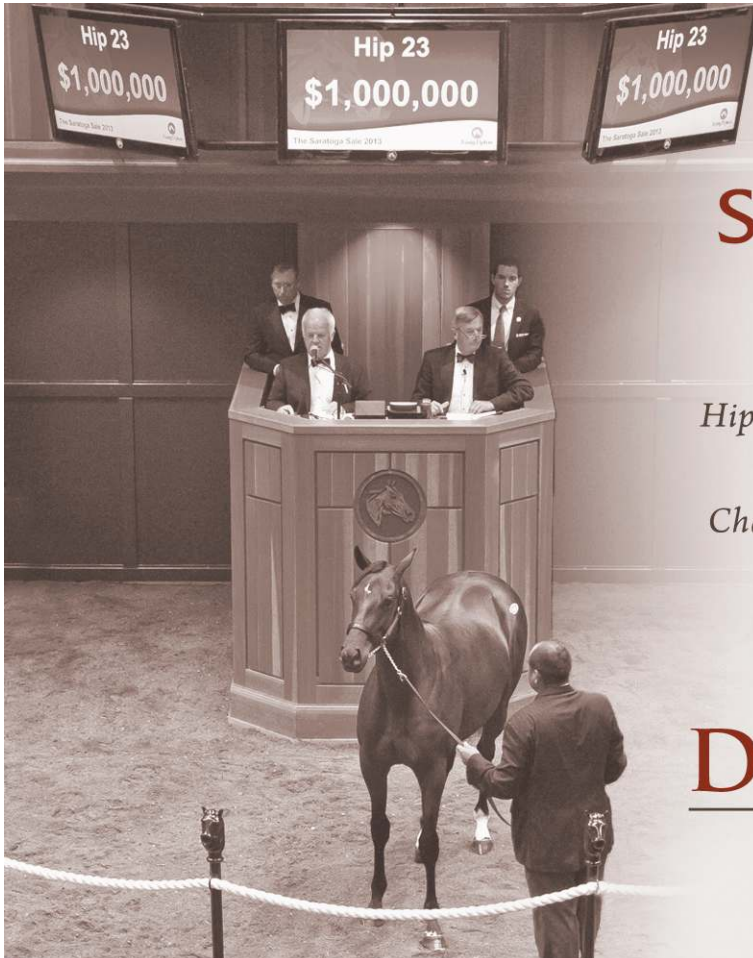

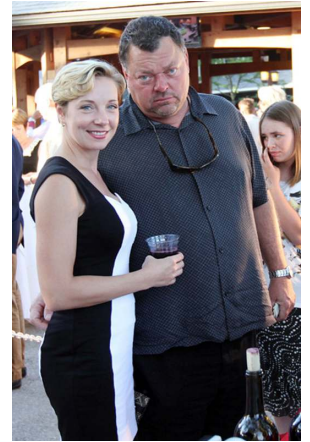

FOCUS ON VENUS

Cork stage the G3 Give Thanks S. today, and have been rewarded with the presence of the G1 Irish Oaks runner-up **Venus de Milo (Ire)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}). Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's upwardly mobile latecomer was arguably unlucky not to have won that July 20 Curragh Classic, having found the steady gallop against her when producing a late rally to finish a half-length down on Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). Her mettle will be tested by the rock-solid 6-year-old **Midnight Soprano (Ire)** (Celtic Swing {GB}), who annexed the G3 Noblesse S. over this track and trip June 16 before finding the fast ground at Haydock against her when sixth in the July 6 G2 Lancashire Oaks. "She's got a penalty, but this race has been the plan for some time," trainer Paul Deegan told *PA Sport*. "She's very well, but it looks like Venus De Milo will be very hard to beat given how well she ran in the Oaks."

Pletcher Runners on the Spa Tab...

Padua Stables' **Authenticity** (Quiet American) covered four furlongs of Saratoga main track in an easy :51.36 (67/69) Monday as she prepares for the GI Personal Ensign Invitational S. Aug. 25. "I was kind of on the fence as to whether to work her two or three times in between races," said trainer Todd Pletcher of the recent Gill Shuvee H. winner. "She'd been getting a little more aggressive in her gallops, like she wanted to do something, so we just let her have an easy breeze on her own this morning and will let her come back with a little more solid work."

Also out yesterday morning for Pletcher was last year's champion 2-year-old colt **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday), who had his second three-furlong breeze back after having time off to recover from a minor pelvic stress fracture. The Starlight and Coolmore contingent representative was clocked in :38 flat (11/19). "He jumped right back into it and is ready to go a half next week," said Pletcher. "Obviously, he's a very talented horse and it's nice to have him back and get him ready for a fall campaign."

Pletcher also worked a trio of his recent juvenile maiden winners who could run in stakes this weekend. GII Adirondack S. hopeful and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Stopchargingmaria** (Tale of the Cat) drilled in :49.40 (35/69); while GII Saratoga Special S. possibles **Danza** (Street Boss) and **Corfu** (Malibu Moon) worked together in 1:01.01 (7/23). "All the works went according to plan," he said. "We'll talk to the owners and make a decision [whether to run], probably [Tuesday]."

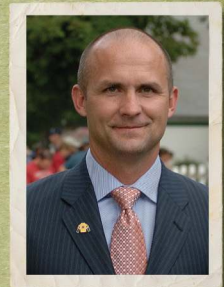

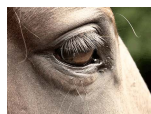
BOB FRENCH, JR. (1926-2013)

Successful Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse owner L.R. "Bob" French, Jr. passed away Friday at his home. He was 87. Born in Brownwood, Texas in 1926, French graduated from the University of Texas at Austin before joining the U.S. Air Force as a pilot. He later became an independent oil and gas operator and rancher, residing in both Texas and California. French's most accomplished horses--both Thoroughbreds and Quarter Horses--were trained by Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas. Among the

Thoroughbreds French co-owned were 1986 champion 2-year-old colt Capote; 1982 champion 2-year-old filly Landaluce; Terlingua, a MGSW who produced prolific sire Storm Cat; and GSW and successful sire Mt. Livermore. Many of French's runners were owned in partnership with Larry Beal and Lukas, and he also partnered with the likes of Eugene Klein, Edward Cox and Overbrook Farm. French is survived by his wife of 50 years, Marcia Fuller French, as well as five children, 12 grandchildren and a half brother and sister. The reality, of course, is that it was nearly a lifetime away--the era of the Vietnam War and the Middle East's Six Day War. Horse racing in Britain in 1967 was also very different from its modern counterpart. It had been only two years earlier that Track Spare had won the first race commencing from starting stalls, and the concept of supplementary entries was still light years away. This latter fact presented owner Brook Holliday with a major problem. Holliday's father, the exceptionally successful breeder Major Lionel Holliday, had died in December 1965, the year his Lancashire Oaks winner Noble Lassie produced a colt by the none-too-fashionable Vienna. The colt was given no classic entries.

This didn't look a problem when the colt, Vaguely Noble, was beaten on his first two starts, but then he started to show his true worth. After sailing home 12 lengths clear in the 18-runner Sandwich S. at Ascot, the Holliday homebred tackled the Observer Gold Cup (now the Racing Post Trophy) and was just as impressive, bursting seven lengths clear in the final furlong. Timeform gave a rating of 132 to the 2-year-old.

The decision was taken to sell Vaguely Noble at Tattersalls' December Sales, and there was great excitement when he fell to a bid of 136,000gns (£142,800) from Hollywood plastic surgeon Dr. Robert Franklyn. Of course, 136,000gns doesn't sound very exciting to modern ears, but Vaguely Noble's price was more than three times the long-standing British record for a horse in training. It may help to put his price into context if I point out that the average wage in Britain in 1967 is listed as a mere £1,380--less than one one-hundredth of Dr Franklyn's outlay--and the average house cost around £3,800.

Original plans for Vaguely Noble to be trained in Ireland were changed when Nelson Bunker Hunt bought a half-share early in 1968. Vaguely Noble was instead sent to Etienne Pollet at Chantilly. The French maestro asked his star colt to race five times in 1968. Although he suffered an unexpected reverse when given a great deal to do in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, Vaguely Noble won all of his other races by a minimum of three lengths. His most notable display came when he won the Arc by three lengths from Sir Ivor, who had won the 2000 Guineas and Derby and would later go on to win the Champion S. and Washington D.C. International. Timeform rated Vaguely Noble one of the all-time greats, with a figure of 140.

John R. Gaines took an option to buy a 25% interest in him for \$1.25 million, and the colt retired to Gainesway. Although Vaguely Noble had clearly been an exceptionally talented colt, there were grounds for wondering whether he would prove as effective as a stallion, especially as a stoutly bred turf horse based in Kentucky. For a start, his sire Vienna sired little else of note.

However, Vaguely Noble answered the doubting Thomases by siring a succession of top-class performers on both sides of the Atlantic. Pride of place has to go to that magnificent filly Dahlia, but he was also responsible for the likes of Exceller, Estrapade, Mississipian, Lemhi Gold, Jet Ski Lady (Oaks), Empery (Derby), Nobiliary, Royal And Regal and Gay Mecene.

Sadly, Vaguely Noble's stallion sons proved incapable of extending his influence in the Northern Hemisphere, but Vaguely Noble's female line continues to shine, as Toronado demonstrated last week with his defeat of Dawn Approach in the G1 QIPCO Sussex S. This victory prompted *Racing Post* handicappers to promote Sheikh Joaan's colt to a rating of 130--the best by a 3-year-old in 2013.

Toronado's fourth dam Regal Lady was a half-sister to Vaguely Noble. As a daughter of the Derby winner Relko and Lancashire Oaks winner Noble Lassie, Regal Lady was bred to stay pretty well, and she did. One of her wins came over 1 5/8 miles. Regal Lady developed into a good broodmare, producing G2 Prix Hocquart winner Regency and the G1 Oaks third Britannia's Rule.

Toronado's third dam Such Style was also bred to stay well, as her sire Sassafra won the Prix du Jockey-Club and the Arc and was awarded victory in the Prix Royal-Oak over nearly two miles. However, some speed was introduced when Such Style visited Always Fair, a son of Danzig. Always Fair had looked potentially top class when he won his first three starts at two, including the Coventry S. and Acomb S., but he ultimately fell just short of the top rank, his best Timeform rating being 121. His only victory at three came in the G3 Prix Quincey over a mile.

Always Fair sired 11 stakes winners from just over 300 foals. One of those stakes winners was Toronado's second dam Wedding Gift, winner of a one-mile Listed race at two. She was considered good enough to tackle the 1996 G1 Prix de Diane and ran creditably to be fifth.

Wedding Gift also revived memories of Vaguely Noble when her Shamardal colt Casamento won the 2010 G1 Racing Post Trophy--the former Observer Gold Cup. Toronado's dam Wana Doo was by Grand Slam, another stallion with plenty of precocious speed, and this filly was a winner at Longchamp at two going a mile before scoring over 6 1/2 furlongs on Deauville's all-weather track at three.

Toronado represents another feather in the cap of his sire High Chaparral, a top-class middle-distance colt who also bagged two editions of the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf. Despite his accomplishments on the track, High Chaparral has had to work for his success as a stallion.

He was in direct competition with Sadler's Wells, Montjeu and Galileo when he retired to Coolmore, at a time when there was still some prejudice against Sadler's Wells as a sire of sires.

High Chaparral stood his first season in 2004 at a fee of €35,000, which was €5,000 higher than Montjeu's fee and €5,000 lower than Galileo's. The fees for Montjeu and Galileo subsequently soared, thanks to their outstanding results,

and High Chaparral consequently became overshadowed by his more-established stud companions. This led to his fee falling by €5,000 every season until it dropped to only €10,000 in 2009--his sixth season and the year Toronado was conceived.

A look at the mares which visited High Chaparral in 2009 reveals that a lot of them came from jumping backgrounds. High Chaparral was clearly on the brink of being transferred to Coolmore's National Hunt division, as another of Sadler's Wells's best sons, Yeats, has been. Fortunately this was prevented by some excellent results in 2009, both in Europe and Australia. His European team featured the group winners Above Average, Golden Sword, Joanna, Magadan and The Miniver Rose. High Chaparral's potential as a sire of classic horses was highlighted by Golden Sword's second in the Irish Derby and High Heeled's third in the Oaks. His Australian runners, headed by the New Zealand-breds So You Think and Monaco Consul, also shone.

Thanks to such horses as Redwood, Wigmore Hall, Wrote and Toronado, High Chaparral's recovery has continued, with his fee being restored to €25,000 in each of the last three seasons. That said, his profile remains higher in Australasia, no doubt thanks to So You Think's superstar status "Down Under." He attracted 235 mares at a fee of A\$88,000 in 2010, then 187 when his fee was raised to A\$99,000 in 2011. Last year he covered 158 mares at A\$77,000 and he is standing the 2013 Southern Hemisphere season at the same fee. His popularity should have been boosted again by the exploits of his son It's A Dundee, this year's Australian Derby winner who received a weight of 120 on Longines' latest list of the World's Best Racehorses.

He's an obvious two-turn kind of horse-bred that way, looks that way, trains that way. We were happy with the way he came into the race but didn't really expect him to blow them away like that." JOCKEY DIES IN RACING ACCIDENT

Jockey Simone Montgomerie, a 26-year-old mother of two, died yesterday from traumatic injuries suffered in a fall at the Darwin Cup meeting at Fannie Bay. About 100 meters from the finish of the 1000-meter Lightning Plate, Montgomerie's mount shied sideways, causing her to fall to the ground and be trampled by the other runners. Montgomerie was rushed to Royal Darwin hospital, where she died from her injuries. The final three races on the card were cancelled after riders agreed they were too upset and distressed to ride. A number of those in the horse industry reached out on Twitter regarding the incident. Jockey Nash Rawiller tweeted: "I've never left a racecourse feeling so sad and numb. Great jockey and beautiful young lady. Thinking of her family and close friends." Jockey Glyn Schofield offered: "Please keep Simone Montgomerie, her family and friends in your prayers. She paid the ultimate sacrifice to do what she loved doing." Hall of Fame trainer Lee Freedman tweeted: "Words can't explain the distress of Simone Montgomerie's death in Darwin. They face such danger. Everyone in racing feels this pain." Montgomerie, whose father is Melbourne Cup-winning trainer Peter Montgomerie, had been riding in Darwin since 2009, and last season rode 27 winners at Fannie Bay, becoming the first female to be honored as premier jockey at the track.

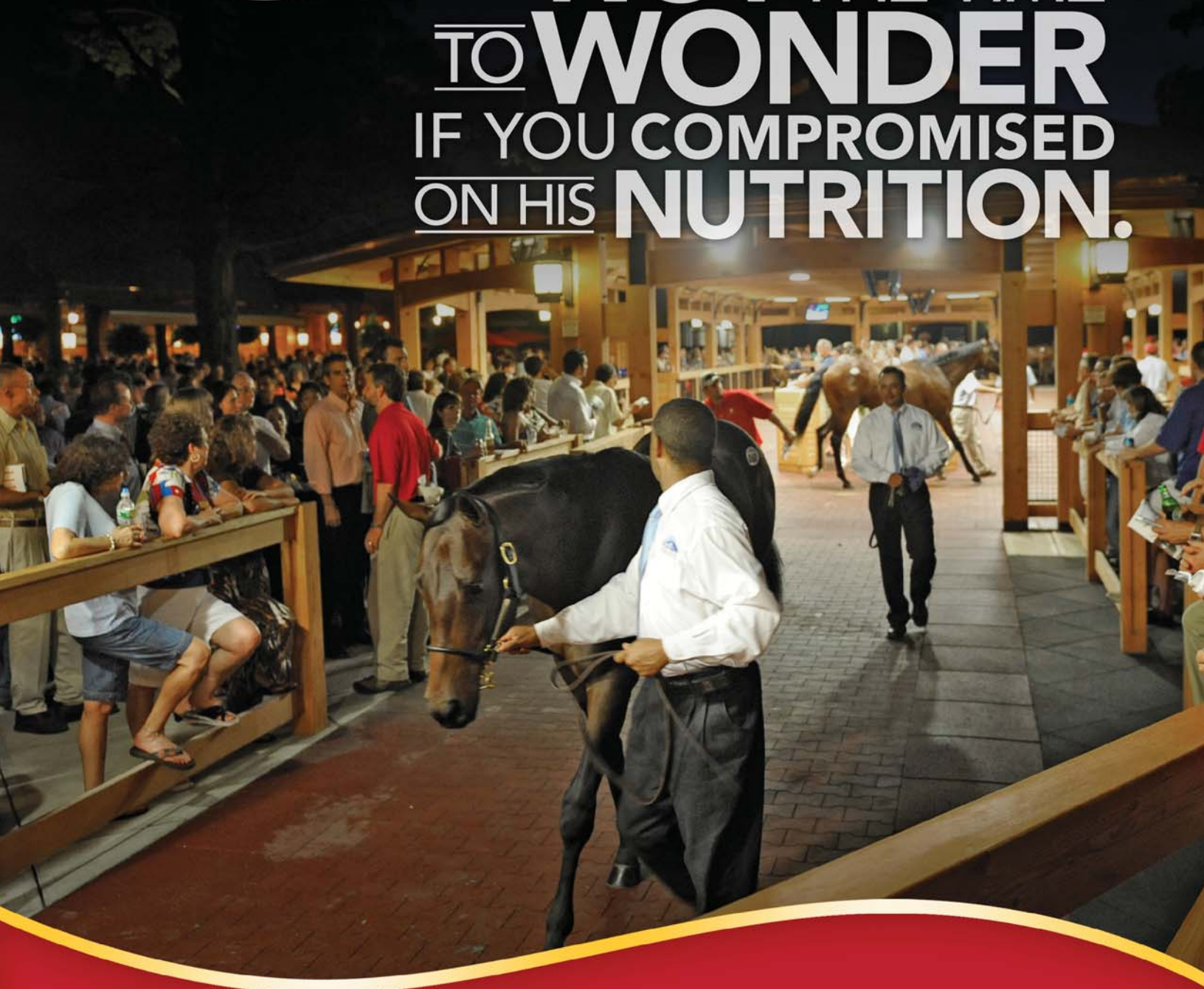
