STRONG RESULTS AT SARATOGA

The Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sale concluded its two-day engagement at the Humphrey S. Finney Sales Pavilion with proof of what beaming sales officials termed "a healthy market."

Over two sessions, 108 yearlings grossed \$31,870,000, compared to 107 selling for \$32,000,000 a year ago. While the average fell 1.3% to \$295,093, the median was up 11.1% to \$250,000 and the buy-back rate, a sparkling 17% during Tuesday's session, fell to 21.2% from 34% in 2012.

"Across the board, activity tonight was very, very brisk, with lots of bidding, quality bidding from the start to finish of the sale," reported Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "You could feel the energy in this pavilion inside and outside the last two nights. There was more energy, there was more interest, there were more bidders and more activity. There were more bidders and they were willing to bid on more horses this year than last year. They weren't willing to bid significantly higher for the most part, but they were certainly engaged on more horses."

Browning was not discouraged by the slight decline in average, correlating it with the decreased buy-back rate.

"The market is not down," he said. "It would be a misconception to say that the market is down 1%. Anytime you drive your buyback rate down, your average price will probably creep down, too, because you are getting more horses sold. That makes the increase in median even more impressive--to drive the buyback rate down and the median be up and the average remain the same is a pretty significant combination of factors. It shows a healthy marketplace."

While two horses reached seven figures during Monday's opening session of the sale, none approached that threshold during the second session. Barbara Banke's Stonestreet and George Bolton combined to purchase Tuesday's top-priced lot, a son of Indian Charlie, for \$750,000. For the session, 58 horses sold for \$16,200,000. The average was \$279,310 and the median was \$250,000.

Over two days, 13 horses sold for \$500,000 or more, compared to 15 in 2012. Three horses brought seven figures a year ago.

The overall results of the Saratoga sale show the marketplace "has found a new equilibrium," according to Browning.

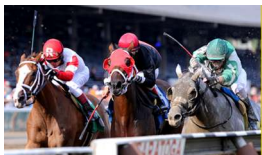

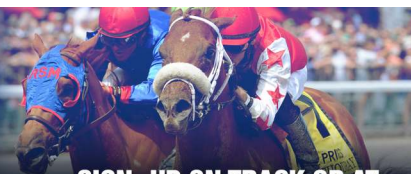

Strong Results at Saratoga cont.

"I think the results show tremendous interest in horses, particularly quality horses," Browning commented. "I think it shows increased activity, but we continue to see rationality in the purchasing side of things. People stop bidding. They don't decide to buy a horse and buy it for whatever it costs. We've lived through a period of time where, if two people wanted to buy a horse, they might just bid, it seemed like, forever. They no longer bid forever. But they are certainly willing to bid and go to what they believe are rational limits for a horse. There is discipline, but there is interest. We've lived through a time where there was much less interest. Interest and discipline bodes well long-term and is probably the sign of a very healthy marketplace. Sellers are realistic in setting their reserves and buyers are realistic in evaluating their horses. And we've got a pretty good balance right now in the marketplace among the buyers and the sellers."

Action returns to the Finney Sales Pavilion Saturday with the first of two sessions of the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred Yearling Sale.

"We had a very successful sale and it gives us a strong foundation to build on for 2014 in Saratoga and it bodes very well for the New York-Bred sale which commences in four days," Browning concluded. For the complete results of the sale, visit www.fasig-tipton.com.

Streets of Fire...

About an hour into last night's session, Stonestreet Stables loosened up their purse strings to secure a pair of colts in rapid succession. The first purchase to go to team was [Hip 102](#), a colt by two-time Horse of the Year Curlin who realized \$475,000. He was soon followed by [Hip 105](#), a colt by Indian Charlie, who headed the final session of the Saratoga sale with a \$750,000 final bid from Stonestreet, buying in partnership with George Bolton. Seated in the back row of the main pavilion, Stonestreet principal Barbara Banke was positioned alongside Bolton and advisor John Moynihan, who was handling the bidding duties. The bay colt generated some buzz upon his arrival in the ring and was greeted with bids coming from both sides of the pavilion, but it was Moynihan who leveled the winning blow.

"We haven't really every bought Indian Charlies, but he was just gorgeous," said Moynihan.

When asked about the purchase price, Moynihan admitted, "I didn't think he'd bring that much, I thought would be closer to \$500,000."

Commenting on what drew him to the colt, Moynihan said, "He looks like he'll be a very precocious 2-year-old, an early type horse, so we thought we would take a shot."

The colt was consigned by his breeder, John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales.

"When you bring them into the ring, you just never know," said Sikura. "We thought he was a very solid horse and we had significant interest from many perspective buyers. We had 11 scopes in all, so we knew he would do well. Good horses are very expensive, especially those that have sire power."

The Feb. 5 foal, who is a member of Indian Charlie's final crop of yearlings, is out of the unraced Queenie Cat (Storm Cat), who is a half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Vindication (Seattle Slew), who brought \$2.15 million at this venue in 2001. The bay is also a half to graded stakes scorer Scipion (A.P. Indy), a \$1.9 million buy at the Saratoga sale in 2003 and GSP In Step (Unbridled's Song), a \$1-million purchase at Keeneland September in 2009. Offered at the Keeneland September sale in 2005, Queenie Cat also lit up the board, landing a \$1.7-million final bid.

"We loved the horse from a physical standpoint," added Moynihan. "Every time he came out, he came out full of energy, so I really liked him. And he has a very good family, too."

According to Sikura, it was an added bonus that the colt went to a top-rung operation like Stonestreet.

"We've had a very good sale and we're thrilled that John Moynihan was judging the horse," Sikura said. "Stonestreet is known to buy quality and John has bought a lot of nice horses, so it's nice to have them buy this one."

Hill 'n' Dale brought four to Saratoga this year, and after withdrawing a pair of them, the operation was left with two, including a filly by Distorted Humor from the family of Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister), who brought \$1-million from Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation at Monday's opening session.

"They rewarded us very well and they both went to a great home," added Sikura. "We offered two and sold both of them. We brought a small and precise group here and we felt we were well represented."



Back to the Well...

Stonestreet returned to the proverbial well with the purchase of Hip 102, a colt by Curlin, who annexed the GI Preakness S., GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and GI Breeders' Cup Classic for a partnership that included Team Stonestreet/Bolton. Secured for \$475,000, the bay was the fourth-highest priced colt of the session.

"We would have loved to have seen both horses sell for less, especially the Indian Charlie," admitted Moynihan when asked about yesterday's purchases.

The Feb. 22 foal is out of Party Chatter (Pleasant Colony), a full-sister to graded stakes winner Silver Fox and champion imported older horse Colonial U.S. Bred by Fox-Straus, the mare was purchased in foal to Rock Hard Ten by that operation for \$80,000 at the 2006 Keeneland November sale.

"He is a beautiful colt," stated Moynihan. "He is one of the best Curlin's I've seen at auction, so we're very happy to have him."

The colt's sire enjoyed a timely upswing this spring when Palace Malice--campaigned by Dogwood Stables and trained by Todd Pletcher--took the June 8 GI Belmont S. and followed up with a victory in the July 27 GII Jim Dandy S. The colt is expected to make his next start in the GI Travers S.

"He is a beautiful bay horse that looks like he'll be fast and that he'll run far," said Moynihan. "He very much reminds me of Palace Malice. He has that same frame and color as Palace Malice."

Moynihan added, "With the recent success that [the offspring of] Curlin has had on the racetrack, I knew it was going to be a little different ball game than I originally thought going in. He was a beautiful horse."

Stonestreet has enjoyed plenty of early success with its current crop of juveniles, including Ari the Adventurer (Pioneer of the Nile), victorious in her debut at Belmont July 11 and Elena Strikes (Smart Strike), who graduated at Monmouth June 11 before finishing runner up in the July 19 GIII Schylerville S.

"Barbara really loves racing and if we can find a few of those horses that can give us some early starters next year," explained Moynihan. "That'll help us kind of balance out some of the later horses that we have."--

Bass Goes to the Front of the Class...

Ramona Bass, sitting alongside bloodstock agent Steve Young, gave a quick shout of excitement as she came out on top for a filly by War Front during Tuesday's second session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. Bass, who has campaigned graded stakes winners Witty (Distorted Humor) and Rumor (Indian Charlie), admitted she had made her final bid when she was extended to \$650,000 for the daughter of Lerici (Woodman) from the Gainesway consignment. "That was definitely my limit," Bass said. "So I was thrilled when they stopped--they took forever to stop, by the way! They made me sweat it for about three minutes, but it was very exciting."

Bass said that she had looked at other yearlings on the Saratoga sales grounds, but called off the search once she saw [hip 83](#). "She was it as far as I was concerned," said Bass. "I loved everything about her, absolutely everything. I am a big lover of War Front. The War Front was the main issue, but everything about her grabbed a hold of me. She is just gorgeous all the way around."

A noted wildlife conservationist, Bass currently has eight horses in training and 10 broodmares. "We're looking to improve," she said of her racing operation.

Lerici is a half-sister to the dam of graded stakes winner Grasshopper and is from the family of Folk Art and Sportin' Life. The 9-year-old mare had a Dixie Union yearling bring \$400,000 at the Saratoga sale in 2010 and her 2-year-old by Giant's Causeway brought \$300,000 at this year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale.

Solis Secures Distorted Humor Filly...

Bloodstock agent Alex Solis Jr., bidding from a row near the back of the sales pavilion, went to \$650,000 to purchase a filly by Distorted Humor ([hip 108](#)) from the Denali Stud consignment on behalf of an undisclosed client. "We loved everything about her," Solis said of the yearling, who was bred by Datt Farm and is the second foal out of the unraced Remember (Forest Wildcat). "We bought her for a client in New York; they are building a broodmare band."

Remember is a daughter of Dancin'inmydreams (Seeking the Gold), a sister to champion Heavenly Prize and the dam of Grade I winner Dancing Forever.

"We knew she was going to bring a fair bit of money, but you don't get chances to buy fillies with that kind of pedigree very often," Solis said. "And we loved her."

Solis also signed the ticket for a daughter of Blame ([hip 127](#)) for \$240,000.

"The sale for the right horse has been very strong," he said. "I think for the top pedigrees with good physicals, it can be very difficult."

More Traffic for Fox Hill Farm...

Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm is more than familiar with the progeny of Stop Traffic (Cure the Blues), the dam of Saturday's GI Whitney H. winner Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song). Fox Hill, already owner of the mare's 2-year-old and 3-year-old, added her yearling colt by Medaglia d'Oro to the roster with a \$600,000 final bid at Saratoga Tuesday. The colt was consigned by Taylor Made Sales.

"We love that mare so much," Porter said after signing the ticket on [hip 134](#). "We have a 3-year-old named Fame and Fortune (Unbridled's Song) who has had some problems physically, but has a lot of promise, and we have her 2-year-old named Thirteen

Arrows (Indian Charlie) who is with Chad Brown. I was over there this morning and Chad thinks she is the best 2-year-old he's got. So we have the yearling, 2-year-old and 3-year-old."

Porter purchased the once-raced Fame and Fortune for \$500,000 at the 2011 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale and the unraced Thirteen Arrows for \$350,000 at the 2012 Keeneland September sale. He almost had a sweep of the mare's last four foals.

"I've been trying to buy Cross Traffic," Porter revealed. "Before the [GI] Met Mile, I thought we had him bought, but that didn't work out."

Despite the obvious preference for the foals out of the Diamond A Racing mare, Porter said the colt was picked out by advisor Tom McGreevy without looking at the catalogue.

"Tom McGreevy never looks at the pedigree, so when we looked at him at the barn, I said, 'Tom, it's Stop Traffic,'" Porter chuckled.

Porter did admit he had expected to pay more for the handsome bay colt.

"I was willing to pay a little more than \$600,000, I jumped the bidding up to \$600,000 hoping to stop them," he said. "For some reason, they stopped bidding—maybe I paid too much."

The 20-year-old Stop Traffic, a multiple Grade I winner on the track, was purchased by Diamond A owner Gerald Ford for \$300,000 at the 1996 Keeneland November sale. She is the dam of a weanling full-sister to Cross Traffic.

Porter bought three yearlings at the two-day Saratoga sale. He also purchased a filly by Malibu Moon ([hip 63](#)) for \$335,000; and an Unbridled's Song filly ([hip 109](#)) for \$300,000.

"There is always plenty of competition here," Porter said. "There aren't that many horses and everyone gets a good look at them."

It's good to see the market consistent for the breeders and if you bring a nice horse here, you are rewarded."

Vincent Colbert purchased the unraced Quickest (Forest Wildcat) back in 2007 for \$75,000 at Keeneland January, three years before her half-brother Super Saver (Maria's Mon) won the GI Kentucky Derby and four years before another half, Brethren (Distorted Humor), became the second GSW from Supercharger (A.P. Indy). Colbert initially got off to a slow start selling out of Quickest. Her first foal, Defy Gravity (Bandini), made just \$2,500 as a weanling at the 2009 KEENOV sale, but she went on to be a stakes winner of nearly \$130,000. That, added with Super Saver's exploits, helped her next foal to sell, Miss Super Quick (Rock Hard Ten), bring \$165,000 at the 2012 September Sale, and this Street Sense miss did even better.

EXCHANGE WAGERING RULES APPROVED IN CALIFORNIA

Edited Press Release

The Office of Administrative Law notified the California Horse Racing Board Tuesday evening that all exchange wagering rules have been approved and are effective immediately. Although the regulatory framework is now in place, exchange wagering *cannot* begin in California until an agreement is reached between one or more exchange wagering companies, a racing association or fair, and horsemen, and then approved by the Board.

Exchange wagering is a non-traditional form of pari-mutuel wagering between two bettors--one backing a horse and the other wagering against the horse at agreed-upon odds.

The OAL action completes a regulatory process that began two years ago. The Board conducted numerous public hearings before eventually approving 25 rules for the regulation of exchange wagering, including rules covering license applications, operating plans, monitoring systems, and financial and security audits of exchange wagering providers. Those rules were submitted to OAL for review and approval, and some were resubmitted to address OAL concerns.

RETIRED

KINSALE KING RETIRED

Sheehy LLC's **Kinsale King** (Yankee Victor--Flaming Mirage, by Woodman), winner of the 2010 G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen and a close third in that year's G1 Golden Jubilee S., has been retired from racing after an MRI revealed what trainer Carl O'Callaghan called a "small injury" in a tweet Tuesday morning. He added that the veteran is still "very sound" but that it came time to "do the right thing." A \$27,000 KEESEP yearling and \$67,000 BARMAY 2-year-old, Kinsale King was a maiden winner in four starts for trainer Eoin Harty, but blossomed under O'Callaghan's care, defeating future MGISW Jeranimo (Congaree) in a first-level allowance in October 2009 before adding the GIII V.O. Underwood S. and GII Palos Verdes H. in early 2010. From there, he took on some of the world's best sprinters in the Shaheen, including favored Rocket Man (Aus) (Viscount {Aus}), but he was able to get first run on the Singaporean and got home a half-length best. O'Callaghan led the victory celebration with a Hale Irwin-like sprint across the Meydan apron, alternating runs with jumps. He returned to Europe for the Royal Ascot meeting and gave an outstanding account of himself when beaten two lengths into third behind Starspangledbanner (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}). Seventh to Big Drama (Montbrook) in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint that November, he won a Golden Gate allowance in February 2011 and most recently returned from a 15-month absence with a gutsy runner-up effort in a Hollywood turf sprint June 21. Kinsale King retires with a record of 16-6-1-2 and earnings of \$1,517,129.

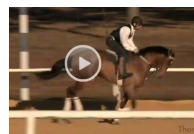

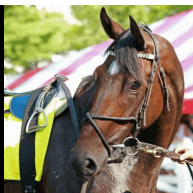
