

RIVALS FACE OFF IN HALL OF FAME

Old adversaries **Rydilluc** (Medaglia d'Oro) and **Charming Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) will rekindle their battle this afternoon in Saratoga's GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame S. going 1 1/16 miles on the turf.

The pair has faced each other in four previous starts: Rydilluc topped that exacta in the 1 1/8 mile GIII Palm Beach S. at Gulfstream Mar. 3, while Charming Kitten was third, one placing above Rydilluc, in the GI Blue Grass S. over the Keeneland synthetic Apr. 13. The Gary

Contessa-trained Rydilluc again topped that pair's exacta in the Penn Mile June 1. They were last seen in Colonial Down's GII Virginia Derby July 13. The former, who was favored at 5-2, pressed the pace, but came up empty in the stretch and weakened to eighth, whereas the Ramsey homebred stalked and rallied for runner-up honors just a head behind War Dancer (War Front). "I think that horse [Charming Kitten] and my horse probably know each other," Contessa said. "They probably talk to each other going down the backside. I mean, they've run against each other so many times."

The speedy Rydilluc last posted a five-panel work in :59.87 (2/26) over the Oklahoma training track Aug. 2. "I still think Rydilluc is a sensational horse, and he's worked fantastic," Contessa continued. "I believe we ran poorly because the turf was soft [at Colonial Downs], and my horse has trained very well since. His work the other day was poetry in motion. He looked phenomenal, and I had the first quarter in 25 [seconds] flat and the last quarter in 22 4/5. [Jockey Edgar] Prado barely moved on him. The horse is certainly coming into the race ready, and we've just got to come out and do it."

The Todd Pletcher-trained Charming Kitten also enters the turf affair in good order. "He's run really well, and we were just a little unfortunate the other day [in the Virginia Derby] when he just missed," said Pletcher. "He consistently shows up and runs hard every time. It's just been unfortunate. I think he's coming up to this in really good order." **Cont. p3**

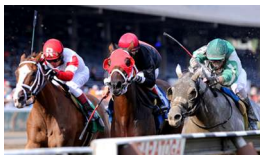

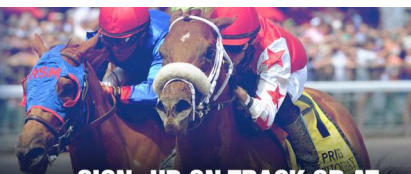

Pletcher also trains **Notacatbutallama** (Harlan's Holiday), who enters off victories in Belmont's GIII Hill Prince S. June 15 and the Solar Splendor S. July 13. "He showed a lot of talent right from the beginning," the conditioner said of the Repole colorbearer who graduated by 6 1/2 lengths at Saratoga last summer. "He just seems to keep getting better and better. The thing that seems a little different with him this year as opposed to last is that he's learned to polish off a race. He's had a tendency to make the lead at times and idle a little bit, but now he's beginning to finish up well."

Balance the Books (Lemon Drop Kid) will return to the Spa for the first time since winning the GII With Anticipation S. there last August. The Chad Brown trainee has been winless in three sophomore starts, most recently finishing third in the Solar Splendor. "He proved he liked the turf course here last year," Brown said. "It seems like he's rounding back into form, so we're going to give him a shot in here."

It took until his latest outing when registering an impressive five-length success over Royal Diamond in the June 30 G3 Curragh Cup for Ernest Hemingway to deliver on early promise, but the imposing bay proved here that he is on the right track by defying a penalty. In the wilderness after his 10-length debut success on Dundalk's Polytrack and subsequent flop in the G2 Dante S. at York last spring, he took a leap forward off a return fourth in the Apr. 7 Listed Alleged S. at The Curragh when coming of age last time over 14 furlongs back there. Despite meeting that race's runner-up Royal Diamond on six-pounds' worse terms here, Joseph O'Brien was content to allow him several lengths as he anchored the Ballydoyle representative in last throughout the early stages. Moving up to join the long-time leader with a furlong remaining, he asserted after a brief tussle to book a ticket to the Sept. 15 G1 Irish St Leger back in Kildare. "He's tough and he tries and he handles quick ground," the rider commented. "Providing the ground is right for the Irish Leger, he'd have a massive chance."

A STANDARD BRED GIANT DIPS A TOE IN THE THOROUGHBRED YEARLING POND

Imagine if the largest sales outfit in Thoroughbred racing (say, Taylor Made Sales) also managed one of the largest auction houses (say, Fasig-Tipton or Keeneland.) In Standardbred racing, that situation exists in the form of Preferred Equine, the number one sales agency which also conducts the majority of the Standardbred auctions. Tomorrow, they offer their first-ever Thoroughbred at auction at the when [Hip 203](#) goes through the ring at the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Preferred Yearling sale. Sunday, they will sell [Hip 445](#).

Preferred Equine, owned by 48-year-old David Reid, who runs the business out of Briarcliff Manor, New York, where he also lives, is the harness racing industry's largest sales agency, having sold \$350 million in horseflesh over the past 25 years. They have auctioned off 20 horses who went on to earn more than a million dollars, including the reigning Pacer of the Year, Captaintreacherous, and last week's Hambletonian Oaks Winner, Bee A Magician (make sure to check after Saturday.)

They're also the largest auctioneers, at least of top-drawer horses, operating the Tattersalls Horse Sales company, which conducts mixed sales; and serving as co-general managers of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale each fall on the grounds at Fasig-Tipton, which they lease for the event. The Lexington sale is the premiere yearling sale in the industry; Captaintreacherous sold for \$250,000 in 2011 at the sale. In the last two years, yearlings have sold there for up to \$450,000.

How dominant is Preferred? At last week's Tattersalls Summer Mixed Sales at the

Meadowlands, they consigned the top 15 lots.

They are offering hip 203 (Bellamy Road-Unbridled Blessing, out of Unbridled's Song) and 445 (Bellamy Road-Sadler's Sarah, by Wayne County {Ire}) as agents for Lindy Farms and the Antonacci family, another Standardbred powerhouse looking to dip a toe in the Thoroughbred waters.

"I have a lot of cross ties within the industry and within the makeup of my business," said Reid. "For our Lexington Selected Sale each fall, we lease the Fasig-Tipton sales grounds. I have a relationship with (Fasig-Tipton President and CEO) Boyd (Browning) and the auction crew. Danny Green works at our yearling auction every year. They've been welcoming."

The Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale was a natural choice, he said, both for his local ties and those to Fasig-Tipton. Reid is somewhat of a local, having been born 25 miles away in Argyle, New York, and marrying in Saratoga.

"I was raised on a dairy farm but my family use to attend the races at Saratoga on a regular basis—many times doing a double header—Thoroughbreds during the day and the harness track at night. We also had a close friend that raced Standardbreds and I was exposed to horses at a young age. When I started thinking about selling these horses, Fasig-Tipton was a logical choice. I've always admired the way their conduct their business. It's a first-class operation."

"We just wanted to try something new," Reid continued. "It's something that I've always wanted to try. We're just going to explore the waters. I really have no expectations. We're going to get a feel for the market. We're obviously very under-educated, and we don't know the marketplace, but we're willing to take a shot." cont. p5

Reid founded Preferred in 1988 with a partner, Geoff Stein. They operated the company in tandem until last year, when Stein died suddenly and unexpectedly of a heart attack at the age of 58. By then, they had built the company into one of the most successful operations in the business, dealing in private sales and stallion seasons, in addition to their sales and agency business.

The yearlings selling Saturday and Sunday were raised at Lindy Farms, another bastion of the harness racing industry which owns 100 Standardbred broodmares.

“Hip 203 is a homebred,” said Reid. “We’ve owned the mare for a while. She was in Kentucky and we moved to New York, just to get a New York-bred. Hip 445 we bought as a weanling at Fasig-Tipton Timonium (for \$19,000) as a pinhooking venture.”

Reid was asked if there were a difference between raising Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds. “It’s still a learning curve,” he said, “and probably in a lot of ways there are differences, but raising horses is raising horses. Lindy has raised numerous world champions and millionaires. They wanted a challenge, like myself, to get a couple of Thoroughbreds and give it a try. Being from New England, they’re big Saratoga racing fans, and have gone up there for the meet the last 10 or 15 summers. They love the New York-bred program, so they thought they’d take a chance.”

Fasig’s Boyd Browning, for one, welcomes the new blood.

“We need new faces,” said Browning. “Dave has expressed an interest in getting involved in the Thoroughbred game. He’s looking at some diversification. I have watched the way they operate in the Standardbred business. At the fall sale, they have murderers row, and have obviously done a very, very good job in developing relationships and selling horses.”

If Reid looks somewhat familiar, it may be due to his involvement with Ice Wine Stable. “We entered a racing business four or five years ago under the name of Ice Wine Stable with Wesley Ward,” said

Reid. “We have had some success from a limited number of horses.” Their No Nay Never (Scat Daddy) broke his maiden at Keeneland in April and went on to win the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot for Wesley Ward.

While there may be more similarities than differences between the two businesses, there are still some differences. **cont. p6**

“There are a lot of uncharted waters we’re entering,” said Reid. “The two philosophies in the sales business seem to be a little different, from the repositories to the pinhookers to the RNAs. A very low percentage of Standardbreds are sold with reserves, therefore, we have very few RNA’s on a percentage basis. Additionally, the Standardbred sales have no repositories, and I don’t expect any in the near future. The main difference, though, is that our industry doesn’t experience the same level of sales activity. In the Thoroughbred sales, you have yearling sales starting in July. They go all the way through October. Yearling sales in the Standardbred business are late September to beginning of November. We have no 2-year-old-in-training sales, there is a very limited weanling market and overall, less trade activity.”

“The whole reason for venturing into the Thoroughbreds is that our motto is we try to learn something new every day. We take it as a challenge to learn another facet of the horse industry and that’s one of the challenges of entering the thoroughbred game.”

Those who have watched him think the transition is possible.

“You have to have horsemanship, but at the end of the day, you have to be in the people business and have a combination of both buyers and sellers,” observed Browning. “Obviously, Dave has been able to do that for quite some period of time and enjoys a tremendous reputation in the Standardbred business. There are opportunities for us all to work together in the equine industry. It will be fun to watch, and I’m confident that he’ll be successful.”

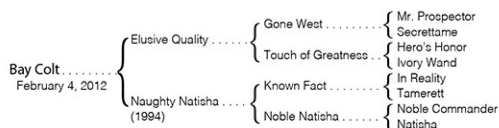

Letters TO THE EDITOR

A recent experience brings me to the taboo subject of nurse mares. This year we suffered an awful tragedy of losing a mare that died of a heart attack an hour after birth. Normally, all my mares are insured, but this mare was over the age limit. So that was an additional expense. Then I was introduced to the strange world of the nurse mare industry.

My foal was a NY-bred so we bottle-fed the foal for two days and brought a nurse mare called Little Red in from Kentucky. Little Red did a great job and subsequently stayed at my farm before shipping back to its owner this week.

When it came time to ship the nurse mare back, my vet remarked that she was being shipped back with its feet done, wormed, and fat, as if that was unusual. She said she worked in Kentucky for five years and felt it was a disgrace how some of them are sent back home (being the poor step-children that they are.)

All of this introduction begs the very important question that my daughter asked me: "Dad, what happens to the nurse mare's foal?"

Well, I was determined to find out. I made a few telephone calls to "industry experts" who spoke in careful and measured tones (read: quietly, with very "between-the-lines" answers).

So I knew right off that there was bad news in the offering. I then called the farm where I leased my nurse mare. They told me that they had 150 mares and there were several lease mare farms in Kentucky that were much larger. When I asked my daughter's question, they said that they send the newborn foals to a rescue in Ohio. I contacted the rescue several times but they have not responded.

Simple logic tells me that if there are several hundred nurse mares, there aren't enough rescues to care for that many foals.

I would like the Thoroughbred Safety Committee of The Jockey Club to look into this issue to establish the facts and to create some type of horseman's code, guidelines, and safety net. All of us who breed need this important nurse mare industry at some point. But we need to bring it out from the shadows and make sure that it operates ethically and humanely.

I would also like to know where leadership farms in Kentucky stand on this issue. It would not be good for the already questionable reputation of our sport if animal rights people looked into our use of lease mares for us.

We wouldn't want to see a headline the next time a famous mare needs help that says, "Foal from the wrong side of the tracks is killed in order that a more lucrative foal can live."

The Breeders' Cup will revert the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic to its original name, the Breeders' Cup Distaff. The race was run as the Breeders' Cup Distaff from 1984 to 2007 and for the past five years as the Ladies' Classic. "We restored the Ladies' Classic to its original name due to feedback from our loyal fans who have a strong affinity for the Distaff," said Craig Fravel, Breeders' Cup President and CEO. "In recognition of our 30th year, the Distaff has provided us with some of racing's most remarkable moments, personified by such outstanding Thoroughbreds as Lady's Secret, Personal Ensign, Azeri, Zenyatta, and our two-time defending champion, Royal Delta. It is a fitting tribute to bring back the name Distaff to honor the rich history of the Championships."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Golden Soul Points to Travers...

GI Kentucky Derby runner-up **Golden Soul** (Perfect Soul {Ire}) is being aimed for a start in the GI Travers S. Aug. 24 after he breezed five panels in 1:00.99 at Saratoga Thursday morning. This was the Fipke hombred's first work since finishing last of seven in Monmouth's GI Haskell Invitational July 28. "He worked great," said conditioner Dallas Stewart. "Actually, he came out of the Haskell great. I can't explain the bad race. Health-wise, he's fine. We've been galloping him steady, giving him his normal routine and he's handled it fine. He worked great today. He had great energy and came home good, so we're pointing toward the Travers."

Centre Court Back on Track...

In her first breeze back since finishing a disappointing last of five in the GI Diana S., **Centre Court** (Smart Strike) covered five furlongs in :59.78 (1/1) Thursday over the Oklahoma turf track. "She went the right way," offered trainer George Arnold, who is aiming the filly for a start in the GI Ballston Spa Aug. 24. "It's very encouraging, and she's as happy as she can be. I feel better now. She has done nothing but get better since she's been here. I'm not giving her an excuse, but training at home [over the Keeneland synthetic], I just don't think she was herself, but now I do. Since the race, everything's gone good and every day's been better. I'm very happy the way she went today, so we're ready to go. I wouldn't be running if she wasn't showing me all the right signs, and now she has. I had to train her on the [Polytrack] at home. She likes the Poly, but she doesn't breeze as good on it. I don't know that she didn't need the [Diana] a little bit, but she doesn't need it now."

Turallure Set for Baruch...

2011 Gil Bernard Baruch H. winner **Turallure** (Wando) went four furlongs in :47.44 Thursday in preparation for a start in this year's rendition of that race. "He's training as good as Wise Dan or [GI Whitney runner-up] Successful Dan is," trainer Charles LoPresti said. "I think the Bernard Baruch is a good race for him." The gray last saw the winner's circle in the 2011 GI Ricoh Woodbine Mile and finished second in the GI Maker's 46 Mile S. at Keeneland last April. However, he was off the board in five subsequent starts, but appeared to be rounding back into form when second in an optional claimer here July 24. "He had a bone bruise, and I think it took him a while to get on track," LoPresti explained. "I think getting him up here [helped him]. He got up here and got more competitive. He got a little breeze on the turf course over there [at Oklahoma]. I think it all started coming back to him: 'Hey, this is what I'm here to do.' He [hadn't been doing] anything wrong, but he didn't have that spark. He's showing it now. I think he's going to run big."

KIRK BREED, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, CHRB

Kirk Breed, California Horse Racing Board Executive Director, died Wednesday at age 73 after a battle with cancer. He was also a lobbyist specializing in horse racing and had his own consulting firm.

Breed continued to oversee CHRB operations throughout his extended illness. His duties included overseeing enforcement and licensing, as well as directing and implementing the CHRB's equine drug testing program. At the time of his appointment in 2008, Breed said, "I believe in providing good leadership and getting people to work with me, not for me. All things considered I believe this job is a good fit for me." In his youth, Breed helped his father train and race Quarter Horses. He wore many hats, working for the State Department in Washington D.C., the Peace Corps, and the Oklahoma Department of Tourism and Recreation, as well as being a founding member of the Oklahoma Horse Council. CHRB Chairman David Israel issued a statement about the loss of his esteemed colleague: "The members of the Board lost a beloved colleague and friend," Israel said. "In his years as executive director, Kirk Breed provided invaluable guidance and counsel to everyone who served on the Board. No one was more dedicated to assuring the welfare of the horse, the well-being of the participants and the integrity of the sport than Kirk. He will be missed, and all of us express our heartfelt condolences to Mary Ann and the entire Breed family.

Assistant Director of the CHRB Jacqueline Wagner will oversee the daily operations until a new executive director is named.

LEVY SUPPORTED BY TBA *Edited Press Release*

The Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) announced that 67.9% of voters were in favor of the Thoroughbred Research, Development & Extension levy, which calls for a charge of A\$10 per mare covered per season and paid by the stallion owner, and a charge of \$10 per mare returned per season and paid by the broodmare owner. The planned operative date for the Levy is Aug. 1, 2014. Ballots were issued by the AEC July 15, with the ballot closing Aug. 8. The count conducted at the Melbourne Office of the AEC.

"We are delighted with the results," said Thoroughbred Breeders Australia (TBA) President Mr Trevor Lobb. "The strong yes vote means TBA will now prepare the required formal submission to the Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry."

If approved by the Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry, the levy will be matched dollar for dollar by the Australian Government. Coupled with voluntary contributions from the Thoroughbred racing sector, the levy will generate an R&D fund of around A\$1-million per annum for investment in R&D projects, including the production of more commercial yearlings, improvement in reproductive techniques and management of exotic diseases.

"On behalf of TBA, we would like to thank all those who participated with special thanks to The Keeper and Joint Proprietors of the Australian Stud Book [Australian Turf Club and Victoria Racing Club] as well as the directors of the Australian Racing Board for continuing their voluntary contribution towards development of the racehorse," added Lobb.

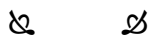
