Despite spotting 12 pounds to the runner-up, Horse of the Year **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) earned his eighth-straight win and second-consecutive GII Fourstardave H. title at the Spa yesterday. Backed down to 2-5 over a turf course that had taken plenty of moisture in the previous two days, the Mort Fink homebred was away in midpack and worked his way into the pocket entering the first turn as fleet-footed New York-bred **King Kreesa**

(King Kugat) showed the way. Loaded for bear around the home bend, the champion looked briefly as if he might run into the same kind of traffic trouble he did last time in the GII Firecracker H. But pilot John Velazquez tipped Wise Dan into the two path to confront the pacesetter at the head of the lane, and though King Kreesa gave the chalk all he could handle to midstretch, Wise Dan called on his class late to prevail by 1 1/4 lengths. Second choice **Lea** (First Samurai) finished 4 1/4 lengths back in third. "As I told some of you today, to prove that he's a great horse like everybody's talking about, he had to carry that weight," said winning trainer Charlie LoPresti. "He was cruising up the rail. I was worried about that front-runner. When he cruised up to him on equal terms, he had so much horse he just went right on by him. Johnny [Velazquez] just kind of rode him out. The :24 and change worried me; you don't let a speed horse get out there like that. Johnny had so much confidence in him. They started to pick it up and ran fast the last part of it. I know that horse of ours has a great kick. And he proved he's a great horse today." **Cont. p3**

IN DEEP AT DEAUVILLE

Today's renewal of the G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois--a "Win and You're In" event for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile--is as strong a renewal as any of its immediate predecessors, with six individual top-level scorers assembled with a total of 15 Group 1 victories to boast about. Within such a cosmos, it is hard to pick a stand-out, but there is something about **"TDN Rising Star" Dawn Approach (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) that suggests he still has a hand to play. Stripped of his unbeaten record over a mile by **Tornado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the G1 Sussex S. at Glorious Goodwood just 11 days ago, Godolphin's G1 2,000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. hero is back for more, but connections are confident he is ready to give his customary best again. "I love the competition at the highest level, and this is as high as you get, so I'm looking forward to it," Jim Bolger said. "I discussed this with Simon Crisford, who discussed it with Sheikh Mohammed, and they were very much up for it. Once we knew he was well and had plenty of life in him, the decision wasn't too difficult--he shows his well-being, so it's fairly easy to gauge." **Cont. p9**

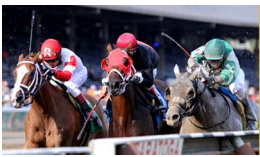

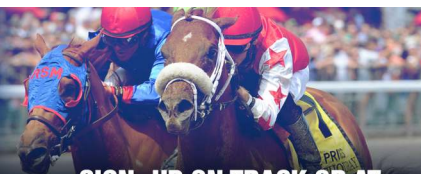

"[Wise Dan] broke well, was in the right place following the speed in the race," offered Velazquez. "After that, it was pretty easy. I knew the horse on the lead was going to take me a long way. It ended up being a nice race down the lane with the horse on the lead. I was right where I wanted to be, not too far back. I knew at the time I pulled out it was going to be a fight down the lane and I know my horse is a fighter. It was awesome. It was a much tougher race than last year. The horse who was second was peaking at the right time. But my horse still did it, and with a lot of weight on top of him, too."

While many have lamented that Wise Dan's 2013 campaign has been less-than-ambitious, the chestnut has certainly impressed in the consistency he has shown from last year to this one. He first looked like one to watch on the big stage when turning in a devastating 10 1/2-length romp on seasonal debut in last April's GIII Ben Ali S. at Keeneland and suffered a rare loss by a head in Churchill's GI Stephen Foster H. in June. It's been nothing but trips to the winner's circle since then, as Wise Dan began his streak with a five-length win over an even boggier course here a year ago. Wise Dan reeled off similarly impressive scores in the GI Woodbine Mile, GI Shadwell Turf Mile and GI Breeders' Cup Mile to sweep all categories he was up for at the Eclipse Awards. He returned at Keeneland again in the GI Maker's 46 Mile Apr. 12, and came into this off yielding-turf victories in Churchill's GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic May 4 and GII Firecracker H.--the latter came by two lengths over Lea.

Wise Dan became the first back-to-back winner of this race since Fourstardave himself did it in 1990 and 1991 when it was called the Daryl's Joy S. He will likely follow the same path he did last year, with starts in the Woodbine Mile Sept. 15 and Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 2. His connections finished a close second last weekend here in the GI Whitney H. with Wise Dan's half-brother Successful Dan.

King Kreesa's trainer Jeremiah Englehart was quick to tip his hat to the winner. "I knew [King Kreesa] was going to keep digging," he said. "With 129 pounds, [Wise Dan] still had the heart to run him down. It takes a real nice horse, and he is a champion. [Wise Dan] had a serious competitor today, and as good as both horses are doing, I was really happy with my horse's effort."

Dice Flavor, a clear winner of the GIII El Camino Real Derby at Golden Gate Feb. 16 the last time he found the winner's circle, launched a fierce rally to get up in the dying strides and upset this well-matched group.

Off the board when tried in the G2 UAE Derby at Nad Al Sheba in March, Dice Flavor returned to the States to be fourth in the GIII Affirmed H. over Betfair Hollywood Park's synthetic June 2. An improved third in the nine-furlong GII Swaps S. over the same track, Dice Flavor was returning to the grass for the first time since early February. He was second last under Garrett Gomez as part of a strung-out field, with Rosengold (Stormello) throwing down the gauntlet through unreasonably fast opening fractions. As that one tired, Den's Legacy emerged with the lead in upper stretch, but Dice Flavor sliced through a seam from far back and got up to deny him the victory. "This is special; it eases some of the pain," said Gomez, back riding for the first time since July 14 due to alcohol-related issue. "I'm so happy to be back. And I'm so glad the fans were so supportive. This is a very special moment."

Successful in this race 12 months ago, La Pomme d'Amour became only the third distaffer to bring up a repeat with a return to form here. Off the board on four occasions after her career-best in this race, the homebred had given a signal that she was about to stage a revival when second in the G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil over 14 furlongs at Longchamp last time July 13. Prominently placed by Maxime Guyon, the chestnut stalked the leading Chalnetta and, after working her way past that rival with 150 meters remaining, asserted for a straightforward success. "She has always been a good mare, but needs good ground or faster--that is the key to her," trainer Andre Fabre commented. "She could possibly run in the G1 Prix Vermeille [at Longchamp Sept. 15]."

There was a surprise in store here as Cirrus des Aigles failed to get back to winning ways, with the German raider Petit Chevalier getting in the way of the supposed procession. Not an obvious contender entering this test, the bay had only opened his black-

type account on his penultimate start in the June 25 Listed Grand Prix de Compiègne before finding the subsequent G1 GROSSER Dallmayr-Preis winner Neatico (Ger) (Medicean {GB}) seven lengths too strong when second in the July 5 G3 Hamburg-Trophy over

this trip. Always prominent, he was committed passing the quarter pole and, after gaining first run on Cirrus des Aigles, held that rival all the way to the line. "He was in good form and fought hard," trainer William Mongil explained. "We will probably take him back to Germany now and Baden-Baden." The runner-up's trainer Corine Barande-Barbe was not too disappointed despite the veteran lacking his customary pizzazz for the third consecutive outing. "I would have loved to see him kick on earlier, as he is not a horse who delivers an instant turn of foot, especially on that ground," she said. "He looked to be toying with the winner, but he needs time to get going and maybe he is being a bit slower to reach top form than I anticipated. He is coming along fine and we have the G1 Champion S. [at Ascot Oct. 19] in mind, so he might now run in the G2 Prix Dollar [at Longchamp Oct. 5] beforehand."

Seaneen Girl was a huge 31-1 longshot when she upset last year's GII Golden Rod S. at Churchill, and while she hadn't found the winner's circle in six starts since, there have been some credible performances this year. Third in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks in March, she ran second to Fiftyshadsofhay (Pulpit) in the GIII Iowa Oaks at Prairie Meadows June 29, but took a step backward when sixth in the GIII Arlington Park Oaks over the Poly July 20. Back on the dirt and sent off the crowd's pick to finally get her picture taken once again, the chestnut hounded the pacesetting Makayla's Angel (Sky Mesa) through a :48 flat half, turned back the challenge of Lucky Rag Doll two furlongs out and streaked clear under Paco Lopez. "She left Churchill on Thursday night and had a 15-hour van ride," said winning trainer Bernie Flint. "She basically did that right off the van. That was a real impressive race from her. She's such a nice filly. The Breeders' Cup down the road is always something you look at, but for now we'll just see how she comes out of this one." Makayla's Angel was DQ'd from sixth to last for causing interference on the first turn to C C Gold (Touch Gold), who clipped heels and nearly went down.

This event was billed as a virtual sure thing for the long-absent 2012 champion female sprinter Groupie Doll, but an unsung filly had different intentions. A stakes winner at Delta Downs last January for trainer Bret Calhoun and owners Wayne Sanders and Larry Hirsch, Devious Intent was purchased privately in the fall and turned over to Kellyn Gorder. She annexed a muddy one-mile optional claimer at Oaklawn in her second start for these connections Mar. 10, but was a well-beaten fourth in Hawthorne's GIII Sixty Sails H. going nine panels Apr. 20. Cut back to six furlongs for her last two starts, the bay was runner-up in both a Churchill optional claimer May 16 and the Saylorville S. at Prairie Meadows June 28. The bay enjoyed an easy trip early tracking Magic Hour in second through fairly sensible splits. Groupie Doll, meanwhile, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint and last seen finishing second beaten a nose against males in the GI Cigar Mile H. Nov. 24, steadied out slightly after the start and traveled behind the first flight while a bit headstrong. The prohibitive favorite tipped out on the home bend under a confident Rajiv Maragh, and spun four or five wide into the lane, appearing en route to a convincing comebacker. But Devious Intent and Magic Hour still had run left, and they continued to the wire ahead of the one-paced chalk. "That's racing, isn't it?" the beaten favorite's trainer and co-owner/breeder Buff Bradley told *Daily Racing Form*. "Sure we're disappointed, but I'm still glad we came here. This should set us up for bigger things down the road."

All eyes were on **"TDN Rising Star"** Telescope here, but the bubble was burst, for now, by David Livingston after a war of attrition drew the sting from the sophomore up the straight. Successful in the G2 Beresford S. when at Ballydoyle in September 2011, the bay managed no better than a distant third in the following year's G3 Irish St Leger Trial over 14 furlongs at The Curragh in August, and was transferred to Mike de Kock. Fourth in the Listed Gala S. over 10 furlongs at Sandown on his third start for that trainer July 5, he stepped up a notch here to outbattle one of the season's biggest talking-horses. Settled in second early traveling strongly, he was committed on the front end as Telescope loomed alongside passing the three-furlong marker and gradually asserted from the furlong pole. Noble Mission showed the same slow-starting tendency that marked his full-brother's finale in Ascot's Champion S., but made up ground to finish a close-up third. "Ryan [Moore] said [Telescope] felt a bit lethargic today." Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's Harry Herbert told *PA Sport*. "There was no gear change, he just stayed on. He lacked the zip that he shows us in the morning. When you look at this horse, you can see that he's still changing and is not the finished article. He hasn't run a bad race but when you come here with his reputation, it was always going to be difficult if he got beat. We'll possibly see about stepping him up in trip, but we will just let the dust settle. He could have just had an off-day. We will regroup, but with this horse we are always thinking of next year."

Runner-up on her first two starts to the subsequent G3 Albany S. winner Kiyoshi (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Wedding Ring, respectively, in six-furlong maidens at Goodwood May 23 and at this track June 7, Ihtamal was third against the colts in the Listed Chesham S. when stepped up to this trip at Royal Ascot June 22. Returning from a break here, the bay shed her maiden tag in style to provide Godolphin with a fifth consecutive renewal. Placed in behind the leading duo racing up the center of the track, she struck the front approaching the furlong marker and surged clear up the rising ground as Midnite Angel stayed on. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented, "Ihtimal won well today and I was very pleased with her performance. She deserves another step up in class now and we will either keep her over seven furlongs or try her over a mile. Racing Manager Simon Crisford added, "We might look at the G2 May Hill S. at Doncaster on September 13 next and take it from there. Wedding Ring also ran a good race and we may drop her back to six furlongs."

Andre Fabre is edging nearer the great Francois Boutin's record of seven wins in this, and looks to **Intello (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) for a sixth. So unlucky when third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains over this trip at Longchamp May 12, the Wertheimers' homebred garnered the G1 Prix du Jockey Club over 1 5/16 miles at Chantilly June 2, before dropping back to this trip to win the G3 Prix Messidor at Maisons-Laffitte July 7. Fabre's last winner, Manduro (Ger), was heading to the Arc after this race in 2007, and he has a similar audacious plan for Intello. "It is going to be a very interesting race, for sure, but we are looking forward to it," he told *PA Sport*. "I think Intello has the class and ability to be a top-class miler, but he is probably more efficient at a mile and a quarter. It is a challenge taking on the best milers, but a challenge we are happy to take. There are one or two showers around, but the ground should be good, which should be fine for everyone. We have the Arc in mind, but we will see how he runs in the Marois and how he takes the race. To run in and try and win the Marois over a mile and the Arc over a mile and a half is an ambitious plan. It is either ambitious or stupid, we will see. I think Intello is an exceptional horse. His confirmation, his pedigree and his attitude tell me is not the average horse." Heading the older brigade is George Strawbridge's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Moonlight Cloud (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who brought her tally at this track to five-for-six when adding a third-straight renewal of the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest over 6 1/2 furlongs on Sunday. Her only defeat in Normandy came in this race last year, when fourth after meeting significant trouble in running, and trainer Freddy Head is full of hope she can shake up the younger brigade.

"I was very impressed with her in the Maurice de Gheest," he told *sportinglife.com*. "She beat a very good horse in Lethal Force very easily and I have to say, she has never been better in her life. She will take a lot of beating--she adores the track, is better than she's ever been and you must remember she was very unlucky in the race last year--she should have won. I don't fear anyone--particularly the three-year-olds, it's very hard for them. They've had tough seasons and my filly is fresh, so she is definitely the one they all have to beat." Another who loves this straight mile is **Elusive Kate** (Elusive Quality) and she is four-for-five, with her only reversal also coming in this race last year. Third on that occasion, Teruya Yoshida's top-class 5-year-old stamped her authority on the G1 Prix Rothschild over this track and trip two weeks ago, and jockey William Buick is expecting another bold show. "I have a real affection for Elusive Kate, who always turns up for the party and has given me some wonderful times," he said. "Don't get me wrong, I've got all the faith in the world in her and I know she will try her heart out but we've got some serious opposition. I'm just hoping that the recent hard races have left a mark on Dawn Approach and Declaration of War, and that Intello might find this grade over a mile possibly just short of his best. I do think we might get the better of the other smart filly in this, Moonlight Cloud, who we just nudged out of third in this race a year ago, but my main concern is making the best of our rails draw with three pacemakers possibly coming over. We'll have to avoid the deadwood coming back--but this filly knows how to look after herself and she loves Deauville. Best of all, she's in a great place at the moment and on a roll."

So impressive when demolishing some smart rivals in the June 18 G2 Coventry S. under Seamie Heffernan, War Command is reunited with Joseph O'Brien, who had partnered with him to success in his Leopardstown maiden over seven furlongs June 7. Understandably, the rider is full of confidence. "He's in good form," he told *PA Sport*. "I couldn't have been happier when he won at Leopardstown on his debut. We were hoping he'd run well at Ascot, but he bolted up. He's a lazy worker, but he has a good attitude and he never kills himself at home. He's had a little break and has strengthened up. He'd have no problem with six or seven furlongs and we'd be hoping for a good run." Not to be ignored is the stable's other representative in **Wilshire Boulevard (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who has already upset a better-fancied stable companion in Oklahoma City (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in the G3 Anglesey S. over 63 yards further here last time July 20. If there is one lurking in the background who could yet come to the fore it is the John Murphy-trained **Big Time (Ire)** (Kheleyf), who was beaten just a half length by **Sudirman** (Henrythenavigator) in the G2 Railway S. over this course and distance last time June 29. Having previously beaten Ballydoyle's Fountain of Youth (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in a conditions race over this trip at Naas May 15, he remains unexposed, and has been supplemented by his conditioner. One who is seemingly thoroughly exposed at present is Prince Faisal's **Ambiance (Ire)** (Camacho {GB}), who sports a visor for the first time following his third placing in Tuesday's G3 Molecomb S. at Goodwood. Fourth in the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot June 20 and successful in the Listed Dragon S. at Sandown July 5, he possesses the class to make an impact if the more high-profile colts disappoint.

"He's so laid-back that when he hit the front [at Goodwood], it was like he was in a gallop at home," Ted Voute, the owner's Racing and Bloodstock manager told *PA Sport*. "Maybe that's as good as he is, I don't know, but the 2-year-old form has been a bit all over the place this season and he deserves a go in a race like this."

MUCH OF A MUCHNESS

Not for the first time this year, one of Germany's feature races has drawn a disappointing cast, with today's G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern at Munich unable to build on the country's recent increase in profile by failing to attract overseas challengers, and offering a sub-standard domestic line-up. Litex Commerce, whose Penelopa (GB) (Giant's Causeway) collected in Sunday's G1 Preis der Diana for the Miltcho Mintchev stable, are represented by **Temida (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) who is looking for back-to-back successes in this contest. Having registered a career-best when beating Stall Eivissa's re-opposing **Feuerblitz (Ger)** (Big Shuffle) here 12 months ago, has only been seen once in the interim when a respectable second in the G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin over this trip at Hoppegarten July 21. Gestut Ebbesloh's **Girolamo (Ger)** (Dai Jin {GB}) also beat Feuerblitz in the G1 Preis von Europa at Cologne in September, but there is no reason to think he can beat Temida having finished a one-paced fourth behind her in the Grosser Preis von Berlin last time.

‘MABEE FLIRTING’ WITH NEXT GRADED WIN

Pamela Ziebarth’s homebred **Tiz Flirtatious** (Tizbud) is the well deserved chalk in today’s GII John C. Mabee S. at Del Mar. The GII Santa Ana S. heroine has been first or second in nine of her 10 starts, most of which were black-type. The only blemish to that record is a third on the dirt in the GII La Canada S. last January. The Martin Jones trainee was an extremely game and close second in the GI Gamely S. last out May 27 to multiple Grade I winner Marketing Mix (Medaglia d’Oro) and registered her career and field-best 96 Beyer Speed Figure for the second time in that test.

Multiple Grade I victress **Lady of Shamrock** (Scat Daddy) makes her third attempt to defeat Tiz Flirtatious as the second choice on the morning-line. The Hronis Racing colorbearer was runner-up to the favorite in the Santa Ana, third behind her in the Gamely, and ran second to Starformer (Dynaformer) last out in Belmont’s GII New York S. June 29. Lady of Shamrock has a home-field advantage having won at this track-and-trip in the GI Del Mar Oaks Aug. 18, where she earned a 94 Beyer Speed Figure. Conditioner John Sadler adds blinkers for this test.

Tom Proctor saddles ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Customer Base** (Lemon Drop Kid) in search of her first graded victory here. WILL ‘BRYAN’ BE FIRST TO THE ‘WIRE’?

Gil Sanford S. hero **Wired Bryan** (Stormy Atlantic) looks to capture his third straight victory in today’s GII Saratoga Special S. The Anstu Stables homebred’s 5 1/4-length score in the Sanford makes him the only graded stakes winner in the field. The gray also romped home to an impressive 7 1/4-length graduation after setting a speedy pace in his debut at Belmont against state-breds June 19. The Mike Dilger trainee was overlooked at 7-1 in those starts, but gets the recognition he

deserves today as the 7-2 second-choice on the morning-line. “He had 32 days between his maiden win and the Sanford; that’s probably ideal,” Dilger said. “This is maybe a little bit short, but he’s got a good disposition, he’s held his weight well, he’s trained well and breezed well. It was a case of ‘Why not?’” Wired Bryan was the first graded stakes winner in as many runners for Dilger, who went out on his own earlier this year after working under Todd Pletcher.

The Tabor, Magnier, and Smith colorbearer was the Barretts March sales topper this year with a hefty price tag of \$675,000. He was a hard-fought victor in his five-furlong unveiling at the Spa July 25 after setting blistering fractions. “It was a very fast race,” Pletcher said. “I think he showed some courage. There was a lot of pace pressure early, and he seemed to bounce out of the race really well, so we hope to take advantage of his speed and give this a try.” Pletcher also sends out Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners’ **Danza** (Street Boss), a debut winner at Belmont July 12.

Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider homebred **Twang** (Dixie Union) was third on debut at Churchill Downs June 21, but decisively donned cap and gown last out here July 27. “We’re just trying to catch the right spot,” trainer Al Stall said. “He came out of the race well, so we’re looking for sooner rather than later.”

The homebred was expected to join trainer Shug McGaughey's barn at the Spa this afternoon. "I don't know how he could have done any better," said McGaughey of the drill. "The track had a little bit of water in it, which I think he probably appreciated. It was harrowed and everything. He worked great, came back great, and ate right up. We'll put him in the [hyperbaric] chamber tomorrow morning and the cold-water spa and ship him." As for Orb's regiment when he arrives in New York, the Hall of Fame conditioner offered, "He'll probably walk under tack Monday, then gallop, and blow out next Monday."

Plesa Gives Positive Update on Itsmyluckyday...

Trainer Eddie Plesa, Jr. yesterday offered a positive update on GI Preakness S. runner-up **Itsmyluckyday** (Lawyer Ron), who suffered a fracture of the ilium--a bone in the pelvic region--in Monmouth's GIII Pegasus S. June 16. "Itsmyluckyday is doing outstanding," Plesa said of the Trilogy Stable and Laurie Plesa colorbearer. "He's still under stall rest until the first of October. FREEDOM CHILD RETIRED

West Point Thoroughbreds and St. Elias Stable's **Freedom Child** (Malibu Moon--Bandstand, by Deputy Minister) has been retired, and will begin stud duty in 2014 at Mike and Josh Pons' Country Life Farms in Maryland.

A maiden winner at Gulfstream Mar. 10, Freedom Child failed to factor in the GI Wood Memorial Apr. 6, but rebounded to steal the GII Peter Pan S. at Belmont May 11 by 13 1/4 lengths in the slop. He finished 13th of 14 in the GI Belmont S., and was a flat ninth in what would prove his final outing in the GII Jim Dandy S. July 27. He retires with two wins from eight starts and earnings of \$170,072.

"He came out of the [Jim Dandy] fine," trainer Tom Albertrani commented. "The Belmont is hard to gauge what went wrong, whether it was the distance or whatever, but his last race was really disappointing. We thought he'd run better. His Peter Pan was a very impressive race."

Country Life, which also stands Cal Nation (Distorted Humor) and Friesan Fire (A.P. Indy), stood Malibu Moon for the first four years of his stud career, from 2000 to 2004.

STRONG OPENING TO F-T NEW YORK SALE

The Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Sale opened its two-day run in Saratoga Saturday evening with a powerful opening session which saw the average increase 18.4% and the median go up by 10%, while the buyback rate fell from 42.9% to 28.6%.

“The average is up, the median is up and the RNA rate was down,” reported Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. “Obviously it was a very good sale.”

In all, 95 yearlings sold for \$6,427,500. The average was \$67,658 and the median was \$55,000. A year ago, 64 yearlings grossed \$3,657,000, with an average of \$57,141 and a median of \$50,000.

The session’s top-priced lot came just six hips into the sale when bloodstock agent Steve Young bid \$300,000 for an undisclosed client to acquire a daughter of War Front from the consignment of Sienna Farms. That yearling was one of 18 youngsters to bring six figures Saturday night. During last year’s opening session, only six yearlings sold for six figures.

“Anyone who was on the sales grounds yesterday or today could feel the energy and see the level of activity and interest was robust,” Browning continued. “The strength of the New York program is real and there is tremendous interest in racing New York-breds. Five years ago when there was the transition from the main sale to the New York sale, there was a dramatic difference in the overall look and shape and quality of the horses on the sales grounds. This year, when the horses were shipping out from the main sale and shipping in for the New York sale, there was quality leaving and quality coming in. And I think that shows you the vast improvement that has been made by the New York breeders, they had to get better in order to compete and they have done so. What we are seeing now is quality horses that happen to be New York-breds, as opposed to New York-breds who were occasionally quality horses. It’s very, very encouraging and there is lots of positive momentum in the New York program. Hopefully it is going to continue to grow and improve.”

The New York-Bred sale continues Sunday evening at 7 p.m.

War Front Filly Tops F-T New York Opener...

Bloodstock agent Steve Young got the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred Sale off to a quick start when going to \$300,000 to secure [hip 207](#), a daughter of War Front, just six hips into the auction’s first session Saturday evening.

“She is by one of the best sires in America and she is a beautiful filly,” Young said. “She is more of a real good horse that’s born in New York than a New York-bred.”

While he declined to name who he was bidding for, Young did say the bay would be trained by Todd Pletcher. Asked if he noticed an increase in quality in this year’s catalogue, Young didn’t hesitate. “Absolutely,” he said. “I think, as a group, this sale of New York-breds is the best it has been in a long time and between the purses they run for and the breeders bringing horses here by some of the studs that are in this book, I would think it would continue. I think there is a feeling the New York-breds are better now than they’ve been.”

The yearling was consigned by her breeder, Sal and Colleen Simeone’s Florida-based Sienna Farms. She is out of Unrepenant (Pleasant Tap), a daughter of multiple stakes placed Roadie (Gate Dancer).

Sienna manager Becky Boyd said the yearling’s final price exceeded expectations.

“I think we were on spot with her, maybe a tad more than we originally thought, but she came up here and acted really professional and the vet work couldn’t have been more perfect on the filly and she is by the right sire,” Boyd said. “So everything came together for us.”

Sienna has approximately 15 broodmares and breeds to both race and sell. The farm sold Unrepenant for \$10,000 at this year’s Keeneland January Sale.

“The owners are originally from New York and this was the last of the mares that they had sent up here to go into the New York program,” Boyd explained.


“They keep some to race, so it was a little bittersweet to sell her,” she continued. “I think they sold her because they don’t own the mare anymore and they also take a great deal of validation out of breeding a nice horse. And if this filly goes on and does great things, they will be happy with that.” **Cont. p2**

Gratifying Result for Gallagher's Stud...

Marlene Brody was forced to wait almost the entire night, but did not go home disappointed as she watched her Midnight Lute colt sell for \$250,000 as the last hip through the ring ([350](#)) during Saturday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred sale. The yearling, bred by Brody's Gallagher's Stud, was consigned by Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud and was purchased by William Schettine's Signature Stallions.

"I wasn't expecting that much," Brody, sitting alongside Gallagher's manager Mallory Mort, admitted. "I was thinking maybe \$150,000 or a little bit more. It was a very nice price."

Of the long wait to see her handsome colt go through the ring, Brody smiled, "It was horrible. I am very sleepy."

Brody credited Craig Bandoroff with prepping the youngster, who is out of Krakowviak (Tale of the Cat), a half-sister to graded stakes winner Antoniette (Nicholas), the dam of MGISW Switch (Quiet American).

"When he was in the ring, I was thinking he looked splendid," Brody said. "He was posing and I congratulated the young man over there who taught him to walk and to stand--he did a wonderful job."

Begun by Brody and her late husband Jerry, Gallagher's Stud has been a stalwart of the New York breeding industry since the late 1970s and Brody said watching the industry improve so dramatically over the last three years has been satisfying.

"It's very gratifying," she confirmed. "I think we'll be breeding better and better horses. I think what is happening now will encourage New York breeders to breed better and to buy better mares."

Still, it is always bittersweet watching her yearlings sell.

"It's always hard, they are our babies," Brody admitted. "Generally [fillies are less likely to be sold], yes. The fillies are easier to keep because you want to keep the family going."

Deutsch, who is in the wine import business, currently has about 10 horses in training with Christophe Clement.

"I've been involved in racing for about 30 years handicapping, but about five years ago I met an outstanding trainer named Christophe Clement," Deutsch explained. "He and I have forged a really nice friendship and business relationship. And I decided to take the step into horse ownership."

Deutsch campaigned Adirondack Summer (Thunder Gulch), winner of the 2011 Dania Beach S. at Gulfstream Park and third in that year's GIII Transylvania S.

The native New Yorker is looking forward to taking advantage of the sky-high purses in the state.

"I love the New York racing program," he said. "It offers great opportunity for great value. The purses are wonderful. I am a New York hometown guy, so I do most of my racing here in New York and I am excited about New York Thoroughbred racing."

The latest addition to Deutsch's stable, [hip 300](#) was consigned by Marshall Silverman, agent. He is out of Free as Tristan (Crafty Friend) and is a half-brother to recent New York Derby winner Amberjack (Indygo Shiner). The yearling was bred by Dixie Farm, which purchased Free of Tristan for \$13,000 out of the 2007 Keeneland November sale.

"He is very athletic," Stephens said of the yearling. "He's a big, two-turn looking horse--he just looks like a real athlete. The mare has been a good producer and Yes It's True has been solid."

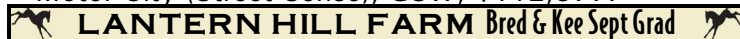

The Jockey Club Projects 2014 Foal Crop at 22,000, Announces Revisions to 2012 and 2013 Foal Crops:

The Jockey Club is projecting a 2014 North American registered Thoroughbred foal crop of 22,000, Matt Iuliano, the organization's executive vice president and executive director, announced yesterday. The Jockey Club also announced downward revisions for the 2012 and 2013 foal crops to 23,500 and 23,000, respectively. The original projection for both the 2012 and 2013 foal crops was 24,700. Additional foal crop information is available in The Jockey Club's Online Fact Book at jockeyclub.com/factbook.asp and in the state fact books at jockeyclub.com/statefactbook.asp. The foal crop projection, traditionally announced in mid-August, is computed by using Reports of Mares Bred (RMBs) received to date for the 2013 breeding season. RMBs are to be filed by Aug. 1 of each breeding season. "The revisions to the 2012 and 2013 foal crops are the result of receiving fewer reports after the Aug. 1 reporting deadline of mares being bred," said Iuliano. Stallion owners who have not returned their RMBs for the 2013 breeding season are encouraged to do so as soon as possible.

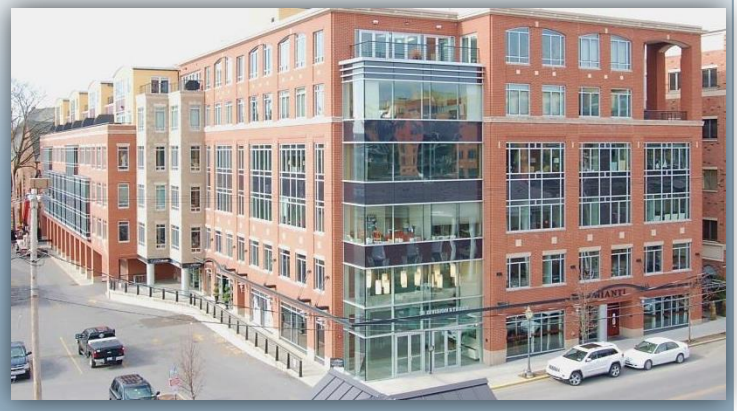
