I knew I had a horse that would take all the beating, but this time a lot of the better juveniles have come out and it will be a tougher race--they may have caught up with him. We'll take it one race at a time with him. If he wins the Morny, we'll discuss races like the Breeders' Cup, but Mr. Tabor has bought into him now, so we'll need to sit down with the Coolmore boys. They already had horses with me and are such knowledgeable men."

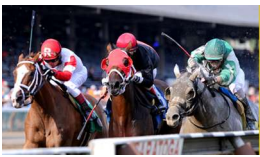

Marois Postscript

Despite a third-place effort as the favorite in Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville, Intello (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}) still remains firmly in the picture for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in October, trainer Andre Fabre confirmed Monday. Meanwhile, Godolphin's Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}), a disappointing fifth, scoped dirty following the race and is now undergoing anti-biotic treatment.

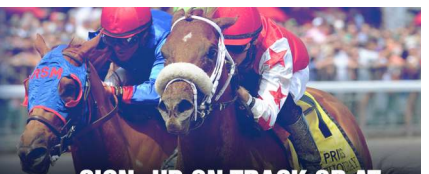

his freshman season in June 2012, the athletic chestnut just missed in the G1 Polla de Potrillos (2000 Guineas), but bounced back to win back-to-back Group 1s, including the Derby Nacional on the main track last November. He took on his elders in the G1 Gran Premio Carlos

Pellegrini back on the turf at San Isidro Dec. 15 and was gaining late, but settled for the place spot in Argentina's most prestigious race [\(video\)](#).

"I got a call from John Fulton, representing the owner," Mandella said, explaining the chain of events that led to Indy Point coming to California. "It was a nice surprising call. He told me about the horse and asked me if I'd be interested in training him for the owner. It took me about a half a second to say yes."

Indy Point first hit the worktab in early March, but the conditioner elected to give the colt plenty of time to acclimate before taking the wraps off the colt in the restricted Wickerr S. going a mile over the Del Mar turf course July 24.

A touch headstrong while in midpack early on, he came out in the lane and pulled away to score with authority by 1 1/4 lengths in 1:32.74 [\(video\)](#).

"He trains like he'd be a very good miler," Mandella stated. "I think he went further in Argentina, because that's where the big races were. When you come back and run a mile like that in [a minute] :32 and change first time out, you have to be pretty fast."

Having excelled at distances up to 2500 meters in Argentina and given the timing of the race, Indy Point was at one time a candidate for the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 25, but the decision to come to Chicago was an easy one, says Mandella.

"When I ran him here the other day, he looked so good," he commented. "I saw the Pacific Classic coming up on the main track and the Arlington Million on the grass. I wasn't smart enough to do any fancy multiplication--I just did two and two."

In preparation for Saturday's race, Indy Point worked strongly over the Del Mar Poly this past Saturday.

"He worked really well, went a mile in 1:39.60 and galloped out a mile and an eighth in 1:53," Mandella explained. "I was very happy with it, just looking to put some wind in him. He just ran a good mile race, so it was more maintenance than anything else."

Asked to compare this colt with the likes of dual Million runner-up Sandpit (Brz) and The Tin Man, Mandella had a typically understated and blunt answer.

"To me, they're as different as people. The likeness is that they can run. They're good athletes and they have good temperaments and he's got all those things." -ALC

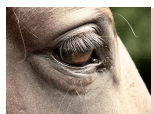

At the Anniversary Games in London last month, Mo Farah, the Olympic champion at 5,000 and 10,000 meters, challenged Usain Bolt, the world record holder at 100 and 200 meters, to a charity race over 600 or 800 meters. A possible clash between these titans of the track created plenty of speculation, with many predicting that Farah's stamina would trump Bolt's speed.

The connections of Intello no doubt hoped that his stamina would also prove decisive when this impressive winner of the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club tackled the very speedy Moonlight Cloud in Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois--especially when there was reason for thinking that the distance of a mile wasn't absolutely ideal for either of them. After all, George Strawbridge's mare had gained nine of her 10 previous successes over six and a half or seven furlongs. She had also gone very close to defeating the brilliant Australian mare Black Caviar over six furlongs at Royal Ascot.

It had been a different story over a mile for this daughter of the sprinter Invincible Spirit. Moonlight Cloud had been successful in only one of her four previous attempts at the longer trip, when she scraped home at odds-on in last year's G1 Prix du Moulin. And she had finished only fourth in last year's Jacques le Marois.

The presence of several pacemakers threatened to expose any lack of stamina in Moonlight Cloud, but they collectively failed to blunt her ability to quicken in the final stages. Intello, on the other hand, just lacked the necessary pace in the final 100 meters, but still achieved an honorable third, which will surely add to his appeal as a stallion. **Cont. p5**

With seven Northern Hemisphere Group 1 winners to his credit, including GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Vale of York, it is easy to forget that Invincible Spirit started his stallion career at a very different level to his current position. Although he stood the latest season at €65,000 (and the 2008 season at €75,000), his first four crops were all sired at only €10,000. His excellent first-season results led to his fee rising to €35,000 in 2007, the year that Moonlight Cloud was conceived.

Invincible Spirit's finest moment on the track came when he emulated his sire Green Desert by winning the G1 Sprint Cup at Haydock. However, his pedigree wasn't that of a one-dimensional sprinter. His dam Rafha was a G1 Prix de Diane winner from a family with endless stamina, so I expected him to sire some quality winners at a mile and a quarter or more, given some help from his mares. He has duly done so, with Lawman, his very promising stallion son, staying well enough to land the Prix du Jockey-Club. Lawman has been followed by such as Ektihaam, Allied Powers, Speaking of Which and G1 Irish Derby second Born To Run.

However, there is no escaping the fact that speed--often precocious speed--has been the main virtue of Invincible Spirit's progeny. Moonlight Cloud has underlined this with her trio of victories in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest, and he has also sired two winners of the G1 July Cup (Fleeting Spirit and Mayson) and two of the G1 Cheveley Park S. (Hooray and Rosdhu Queen). His lengthy list of group winners also includes 14 others who gained all their victories over five or six furlongs. For the record these are Captain Marvelous, Our Jonathan, Conquest, Madame Trop Vite, Zebedee, Swiss Spirit, Spirit Quartz, Glamorous Spirit, Age of Chivalry, Lockwood, Beyond Desire, Tickled Pink, Invincible Ash and Charming Woman. **Cont. p6**

Moonlight Cloud's owner must be torn between wanting to keep his great mare in training and the desire to start her broodmare career as quickly as possible. She has the attraction of having the blue-hen Doff the Derby as her third dam. Doff the Derby in turn was a daughter of the similarly celebrated Margarethen, who also produced the outstanding Trillion, dam of the extraordinary Triptych. Margarethen's name has also cropped up this year as the fifth dam of Treve, the exciting winner of the Prix de Diane.

Doff the Derby earned her blue-hen status by producing a pair of dual Classic winners in Generous (Derby and Irish Derby) and Imagine (Irish 1000 Guineas and Epsom Oaks), plus four other stakes winners. One of them, Wedding Bouquet, is the second dam of Moonlight Cloud. Wedding Bouquet was a 3/4-sister to Generous, as both were by sons of Nijinsky. However, Wedding Bouquet's sire Kings Lake was much speedier than Generous' sire Caerleon and Wedding Bouquet was fast enough to win the GIII Monrovia H. over 6 1/2 furlongs. She had earlier been placed in the G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S. at two, when she also scored three times.

Moonlight Cloud's dam Ventura resulted from Wedding Bouquet's visit to Rainbow Quest's son Spectrum. This was a likeable match, as Rainbow Quest had done very well with daughters and grand-daughters of Nijinsky, once siring a French 2000 Guineas second from a Kings Lake mare.

Spectrum was very good on his day, as he showed in winning the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and the Champion S., but his sale to South Africa in 2004 reflects the fact that he hadn't developed into the excellent outcross stallion that Coolmore no doubt had in mind when they bought him. He had his moments, though, notably siring Golan (G1 2000 Guineas and G1 King George) and Gamut (G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud), as well as Tartan Bearer. This narrow loser of the 2008 Derby was out of a mare by Generous, so had a pedigree quite similar to that of Moonlight Cloud's dam Ventura.

A listed-placed winner over a mile, Ventura was sold for 500,000gns at the end of her racing career. Her price dropped to 58,000gns by the time Strawbridge sold her in 2009. Then along came the 2-year-old Moonlight Cloud to restore Ventura's price to 260,000gns a year later. Moonlight Cloud's Group 1 victory at three prompted another visit to the sales ring in 2011, when Ventura sold for 900,000gns to M.V. Magnier. She has a yearling filly by Makfi and is now in foal to Galileo, who sired her other stakes winner, the stayer Cedar Mountain. Incidentally, Galileo yet again had a magnificent time last week, including with his 2-year-olds.

Ventura's half-sister Maddelina now ranks as the second dam of the group-winning middle-distance stayer Hawaafez, while another half-sister, Wedding Morn, produced the 2012 2-year-old Group 2 winner Probably.

Moonlight Cloud is by no means the Margarethen family's first Group 1 winner from the Danzig male line, as it also scored at the top level with Danehill's sons Landseer (French 2000 Guineas and Keeneland Turf Mile) and Horatio Nelson (Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere), as well as with Green Desert's son Tamarisk (Sprint Cup at Haydock).

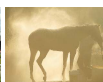

Corfu, Danza Possible for Hopeful...

Stablemates **Corfu** (Malibu Moon) and **Danza** (Street Boss), first and third, respectively, in Sunday's GII Saratoga Special S., have both emerged from their efforts none the worse for wear and will receive consideration for the GI Hopeful S. on closing weekend of the Saratoga meeting Sept. 2, trainer Todd Pletcher confirmed Monday. "[Corfu] has shown that he's very fast and he's got some courage to go along with it," Pletcher said of the \$675,000 Barretts March sales-topper. "I was once again surprised at how well he bounced out of what seemed like a demanding race. I think [Danza] definitely got lost in the shuffle, because one more stride and it's going to be a three-horse photo."

Pletcher was represented by three other winners on the Sunday program, none more impressive than ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Sweet Whiskey** (Old Fashioned). The Alto Racing runner, a \$300,000 OBS March graduate, wired a field of maidens by 5 1/4 lengths Sunday afternoon, stopping the clock in 1:02.81, just 0.30 of a second off the track record. "She'd been training really well and had breezed in company with a couple of other fillies that had already run well at the meet, so we anticipated she would run well," Pletcher said. "It was nice to see her do it." Sweet Whiskey is a candidate for the GI Spinaway S. Sept. 1, while the barn's other maiden winner, **We Miss Artie** (Artie Schiller) could go next in the GII With Anticipation S. Aug. 29 following a three-length graduation in his turf debut. In other news from the Pletcher stable, **Authenticity** (Quiet American), winner of the GIII Shuvee H. July 20, breezed five-eighths of a mile in 1:01.92 for the GI Personal Ensign Invitational S. Aug. 25, while champion **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday) was pronounced ahead of schedule after going a half-mile in :49.62. "His fitness level is a little higher than I expected it to be after only three breezes, so we're making good progress," Pletcher explained.

One day after being put up to the victory in the GI Adirondack S. at Saratoga, **Designer Legs** (Graeme Hall) was visited in her stall by owner Murray Valene. Despite the rough nature of the race, the filly seems to have come through with no serious problems. "Murray knows her really well, and he said, 'She's a fighter,' and she is. She fought really hard," trainer Dallas Stewart said. "It was a tough race. She got banged a little bit, but thank God she came back good. She's got one little minor scratch, but she looks good. As hard as it is to win, we got lucky." She will also receive consideration for the Spinaway in just over three weeks. "We would love to," he said, referring to a run in the seven-furlong test. "We'll just train her up to the race, and, if everything's right on, we'll do it." Stewart, who has **Golden Soul** (Perfect Soul {Ire}) pointing towards the GI Travers S. Aug. 24, said that **Perfect Title** (Perfect Soul {Ire}), a last-out seventh in the GI Jim Dandy S. July 27, will be out of action for two to three months after surgery to repair a leg injury suffered in his first post-race breeze. "He's back in his stall here," Stewart said. "We had to put a couple of screws in the cannon bone. He worked excellent; it was just one of those things. He'll go to the farm in a couple of days, when he's good enough to travel. He'll be out a few months, for sure, so we'll have time to figure it out." The stable will also have **Irish Lute** (Midnight Lute) in the GI Prioress S. on the Travers undercard.

Guillot In Fine Form at the Spa...

Trainer Eric Guillot is quick with a line and detailed his Travers plans for Southern Equine Stables' **Moreno** (Ghostzapper) after watching the gelding zip six furlongs in 1:12.01 over the Oklahoma training track Sunday morning. "He finished like a freight train, galloped out in 1:24 2/5," he said. "He's like smoked ham--always ready. Put it on the dashboard, put it on the counter, put it in the trunk of your car--smoked ham is always ready." Guillot has all but assured that Moreno will be the pacesetter in the Travers, even joking that he would apply "bear grease" to the horse's tail. "Todd needs to acclimate Palace Malice and Verrazano to bear," Guillot said. "He needs to go to the zoo and acclimate his horse for bear, because when I paint that bear grease in Moreno's tail and get on the lead, the horse is in fear of the bear. They have bears in the New York zoo, right?"

Phipps Stable and Stuart Janney III's GI Kentucky Derby winner **Orb** (Malibu Moon) is sending out all the right signals since his arrival at Saratoga Sunday afternoon, trainer Shug McGaughey reports. "We got here and turned him out in the round pen at 5:30 this morning, and he was jumping and playing," McGaughey said. "I think his energy level is back to where we want it," McGaughey said. "We fed him last night, and he ate up in 20 minutes. We didn't feed him full feed, obviously, but he'll be on it tonight. He didn't look at it and go back to the corner by any means." The Hall of Fame conditioner has a schedule mapped out for the next 11 days. "I'll gallop him through the week, and I'll breeze him a half-mile on Monday, which we have done all the time," McGaughey said. "I think I blew him out Sunday before the Belmont. But, maybe, I want to do a little more with him, and we'll see how it goes from there. I want to school him in the paddock a time or two. We have schooled him in the gate at Fair Hill, so I don't know that I'll do that. Really, we're just going to try to keep what we've got, keep him happy and get him ready to [work] next Monday."

NEW PURSE MINIMUMS FOR GI, GII RACES The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's American Graded Stakes Committee (AGSC) has announced new thresholds for purses in Grade I and Grade II races beginning in 2014. Minimum purse levels will be raised \$50,000 for each grade, meaning that in order for a race to have Grade I status, the minimum purse will now be \$300,000. Grade II events must carry purse money of at least \$200,000. Minimum purse levels for Grade III, listed and grade-eligible stakes will remain at \$100,000, \$75,000 and \$75,000, respectively, for 2014. "There had been no raise in the purse minimum for graded stakes for several years and the committee felt it was important to have higher purses for our top tier races," said Dr. J. David Richardson, chairman of the AGSC. "Many non-stakes races now have purses comparable to graded races and we believe our best races should be set apart from the rest. With the declining foal crops we may see a movement toward somewhat fewer but more valuable graded races." The AGSC intends on increasing the minimum purse level on U.S. Grade III races to \$150,000 in 2015. Listed and grade eligible races will undergo an analysis to determine if any change should be made for 2015.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

PASTORIUS INJURED

Triple Group 1 winner **Pastorius (Ger)** (Soldier Hollow {GB}) suffered a fracture to his cannon bone in a workout yesterday, the *Racing Post* revealed. Last seen finishing sixth of seven in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 6, the 4-year-old was being aimed at the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden, G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and G1 Champion S. before injury struck. Successful in last year's G1 Deutsches Derby and G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis, he had added the G1 Prix Ganay to his tally at Longchamp in April, and it is hoped that he will find a place at stud when he has recovered. Trainer Mario Hofer told the trade daily, "A decision will be made on his future when he comes out of plaster in October. It is obviously very disappointing, as he had a major autumn campaign planned, but that's now out of the question." In total, Stall Antanando's flag-bearer won six of his 14 starts and almost €750,000 in prize money.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

‘SOLID’ CANADIAN FORM FOR BEVERLY D.

Jim and Susan Hill's **Solid Appeal** (Successful Appeal) invades Chicagoland for Saturday's GI Beverly D. S., and though she will need to improve to challenge the likes of **Marketing Mix** (Medaglia d'Oro) and European raider **Duntle (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), she is there on her merits. Stakes-placed as a maiden at two, the 4-year-old filly graduated in her first attempt on the grass last July and took a Woodbine allowance in October before finishing a deceptively good fourth to Centre Court (Smart Strike) in the GII Mrs. Revere S. at Churchill Downs Nov. 17. "Once we put her on the grass, she got much better," said trainer Reade Baker, who has never had a runner in the race. "We had her at Churchill Downs last fall and she ran a good race in the Mrs. Revere, and she has kept on improving." Indeed she has. In fact, she has yet to taste defeat in three starts this term, with a second-level allowance win over the Keeneland Polytrack Apr. 24 ahead of back-to-back Grade II successes in the May 25 Nassau S. and the July 7 GII Dance Smartly S. With the news the trainer Chad Brown will not send pre-entrant Dream Peace (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) for the Beverly D., Joel Rosario now has the call on Saturday. The Dominican was aboard for the Keeneland win. Baker is of the mindset that if you don't play, you can't win. "She's in great shape," he reported. "It's a Grade I stakes, is worth a lot of money and we are ready to run."

INTELLO STILL IN ARC PICTURE

Alain and Gerard Wertheimer's G1 Prix du Jockey Club victor **Intello (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}), who ran third to Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois at Deauville, remains a possible contender for the Oct. 6 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, according to trainer Andre Fabre. "Intello ran as I expected him to and I have no complaints," Fabre reflected. "At the end of the day, he was beaten by two top-class milers and it was a fair race run in a very good time. He will step back up in trip and runs next in the [10-furlong G3] Prix du Prince d'Orange at Longchamp [Sept. 21]. After that he will either run in the Arc or the [G1] Champion [S. at Ascot Oct. 19], but it will more likely be the Arc I think."

DAWN APPROACH FLOP EXPLAINED

Godolphin's ♀ **"TDN Rising Star" ♀ Dawn Approach (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) is set for a period on the sidelines after connections revealed he scoped badly in the aftermath of a disappointing fifth in Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois at Deauville. This term's G1 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. hero returned a bad scope and is being treated with antibiotics. "[Trainer] Jim Bolger told me that Dawn Approach scoped with mucus after the race, but he had been fine when tested before he left Ireland on Saturday," explained racing manager Simon Crisford. "He is now on a course of antibiotics and will be rested until all is well with him."

Wagering Up, Attendance Down at Midpoint:

Though total attendance is down over the first 20 days of the 2013 meeting at Saratoga, total all-sources handle, which includes wagers on Saratoga races both on-track and from simulcast outlets nationwide, was nearly \$286.6 million (average \$14,329,910), up by 0.5% over the \$285.3 million (average \$14,264,788) in 2012. On-track handle through the first 20 days was \$68,809,989 (average \$3,440,499) was down 2.9% from the 2012 figure of \$70,892,924 (\$3,544,646). A total of 388,607 patrons passed through the turnstiles in the first half of the meet (average 19,430), a decrease of 2.2% from the 397,330 recorded last summer (average 19,867). According to New York Racing Association officials, attendance figures have been negatively impacted by poor weather conditions for the July 19 opening-day program and July 28, the lone giveaway day during the first half of the meet. Average betting interests per race came in at 8.2 runners, down fractionally from the 8.3 last year. Only eight races have been taken off the turf this season compared to 21 at this point 12 months ago.

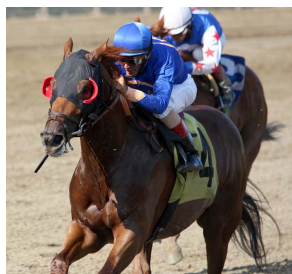



With half the meet in the books, total on-track handle is \$49,456,139 (average \$2,472,807) compared to the \$46,030,298 (average \$2,301,515) reported in 2012. All-sources handle currently sits at \$256.3 million (average \$12,817,181) versus \$230.3 million (average \$11,516,046) a year ago. Overall attendance has declined by 4.7% to 358,785 (average 17,939) from 376,566 (average 18,828), a drop attributed to an altered schedule. Many of the track's large-draw days are yet to come.
