Leading French juvenile **Vorda (Fr)** (Orpen--Velda {GB}, by Observatory), who maintained her perfect record in last month's G2 Prix Robert Papin at Maisons-Laffitte, has been sold to Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Thani, our sister publication *Jour de Galop* has revealed. Also victorious in June's Listed Prix La Fleche, the bay will line up in the colors of Gerard Augustin-Normand, who retains a 50% interest for Sunday's G1 Prix Morny at Deauville. She will remain in training with Philippe Sogorb. "Gerard Augustin-Normand and Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Thani will share ownership of Vorda for the Prix Morny," explained the Sheikh's stud and racing manager Sylvain Vidal. "After the race she will be

REACTION FROM THE RACING AND GAMING LAW SUMMIT *By Mike Kane*

Speakers at the Saratoga Institute on Racing and Gaming Law Tuesday reacted negatively to comments made Sunday about medication policy during The Jockey Club Round Table. Day 1 of the annual program presented by Albany Law School's Government Law Center and the Institute of Legal Studies was called "The Race Horse Medication Summit." The presentations discussed problems plaguing the industry, some of which were covered during the The Jockey Club's meeting, which was held at the same location, the Gideon Putnam Hotel and Conference Center in Saratoga Springs. However, some of the speakers at the Saratoga Institute took issue with what was said at the Round Table that, if national uniform drug testing rules are not enacted quickly, the federal government would take over the regulation of racing. Trainer Rick Violette, president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, and other panelists said that positive things are happening in racing. New York State has adopted the 36 recommendations of the report issued by the New York Task Force on Racehorse Health and Safety on Sep. 29, 2012 and a number of Mid-Atlantic states have followed suit. **cont. p3**

LOPRESTI OFFERS OPTIONS FOR WISE DAN

Fresh off a 1 1/4-length victory in last Saturday's GII Fourstardave S. at Saratoga, **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) is expected to make one more start before attempting to defend his title in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita, according to trainer Charlie LoPresti. LoPresti indicated that the 6-year-old would likely contest Keeneland's GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 5, although he hasn't ruled out a start in the Sept. 15

GI Woodbine Mile. The gelding, who won both of the aforementioned races in 2012, appeared no worse for wear coming off his eighth consecutive victory. "It doesn't look like it took a whole lot out of him," LoPresti commented the day after the race. "It was a pretty easy race for him." In related news, LoPresti indicated that MGSW **Successful Dan** (Successful Appeal), runner-up behind Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song) in the Aug. 3 GI Whitney S., may return in the Aug. 31 GI Woodward S. "Right now, he's good," said LoPresti. "We're excited. He's training good...We're not going to do a whole lot with him."

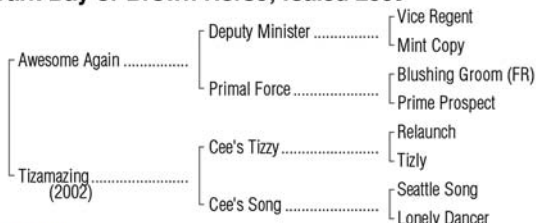

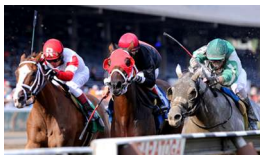

“Sometimes, we do have an inferiority complex and we kind of cower when we are compared to other sports,” Violette said. “We are talking about Olympic athletes today and it reminded me of a conversation that I had with a fellow NYRA board member when we were talking about Lasix. He said, ‘I have trouble getting by our horses getting a medication on race day. All those other athletes can’t even have a cup of coffee.’ I said, ‘What planet are you on?’”

“That was the same Sunday that Tony Romo had broken ribs and had pain-killing injections into the ribs before the game and at halftime had it redone. The bat boy on most baseball teams couldn’t pass the regimen that our horses go through. Literally 981 medications are on a screening rotation.”

Dr. Scott Palmer, who was a member of that New York task force that examined the cause of the 21 equine deaths at Aqueduct in 2011-12, said that the World Anti-Doping Agency policy of granting exemptions to athletes needing specific medications to compete would not work in racing. Stats showed that some 40% of requests were approved. The USADA has been discussed as a possible regulator for racing.

“It seems like the Olympics have kind of got a halo,” Violette said. “They are assumed to be the pristine hay, oats and water of the human athletes.”

Prior to Violette’s talk, a long list showing therapeutic medications permitted for use by human athletes in competition.

“The medications on there are incredible,” he said. “We think of them as the hay, oats and water of the human set and virtually none of those medications are allowed on performance day. Most of those medications are off the charts for seven days, 10 days, some longer.”

Violette acknowledged that more work remains.

“We’re not looking at it through rose colored glasses,” he said. “Professional athletes get tested once, maybe twice a year unless they are coming back from a suspension. We test 30 to 40% of the horses every single day in New York. It’s an incredible endeavor. Dr. [George] Maylin has been doing it for years. We want the cheaters out. But it isn’t the wild west.”

In his remarks, Maylin said that more funding is needed to improve testing procedures and keep up with the changes taking place.

Violette said some of what he heard at the round table sounded like the leaders “think it’s best to carpet bomb the industry and expose and magnify all of our ills.”

“To be honest,” Violette said. “it was a very ill-advised example of bad leadership. Instead of unifying people it became another divisive adventure into the world of Thoroughbred racing.”

“The good news, and there is a lot of good news, I can’t wait to go back to Washington if they ever call us back and say, ‘What have you done?’ We’ve done a lot in the last five years since Eight Belles in both the Thoroughbred aftercare programs that are all over the country now, to what is happening in the Mid-Atlantic. The Jockey Club cringes when the Mid-Atlantic gets credit for advancing that they haven’t been capable of advancing in the last 50 years, that’s uniform medication.”

Edward Martin, president and CEO of the Association of Racing Commissioners International, said the model rules have been approved on a national level and now it’s a matter of more states approving them. Martin said that state regulators must follow the law.

“In this country, you are innocent until proven guilty,” Martin said. “That sometimes rubs some people the wrong way. Who would love to have some kind of dictator in charge of racing and just say, ‘off with their heads.’ But we don’t live in a society like that. Racing regulators are government agencies. You are innocent until proven guilty and the challenge in these cases is to present evidence, so that you can get a conviction and that conviction can be upheld on appeal. It’s the same problem that other areas of regulation and law enforcement have and it’s a fact of life.”

Princess of Sylmar Looks for Third Grade I Win...

Ed Stanco, owner of GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Coaching Club American Oaks heroine **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior) hopes to see his homebred capture her third straight Grade I victory in this

"When I watched Questing blow away the field [in last year's Alabama] and I saw that when she won by six or 10 lengths, I can't remember, I thought this is an incredible experience," Stanco said. "Just to think that we are going to be in that same race just a year later, I never, never could have imagined that would happen. The Alabama has been a favorite of mine forever."

Stanco referred to her victory in the CCA Oaks as a validation of her upset in Kentucky.

"When she won that race [the Kentucky Oaks], it was just terrific," Stanco said. "Then when she won the Coaching Club, it was just an explosion of emotion. It's something I never experienced before and probably never will again and it's a phenomenal feeling. Now, going into the Alabama, I know she will probably be close to being the favorite and my feeling is, 'Oh God, just stay healthy and have a nice trip.'"

When asked how a win in the Alabama could affect the filly's standings as top 3-year-old, regardless of gender, Stanco was humble.

"If she does well, then she has actually beaten all the top fillies in the country," Stanco replied. "It's just shocking to me how far she has come and how good she is. It's a blessing."

Romans Returns to Defend His Title in Arlington...

Trainer Dale Romans and **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) return to Arlington to defend their title in the GI Arlington Million Saturday. No horse has ever won the Million two years in a row. John Henry did it twice, but three years apart, in 1981 and 1984. "It is hard to keep your horse around for that long," Romans said about winning a million dollar race two years in a row. "It is taxing on them to run at that level and train as hard as they have to to win a Grade I." Little Mike comes into this start off a fourth-place finish in the GI United Nations S. at Monmouth Park July 7, where he was beaten by just over three lengths. Prior to that, he made two lackluster starts in Dubai. "It took him a while [after returning from Dubai] to get his weight back up and get as strong as he was," Romans said. "He ran a good race, got beat three lengths in his first start after Dubai and has had some nice works."

Little Mike is in top shape and will have no excuses on Saturday, according to Romans. "He had excuses in his first few races this year," Romans remarked. "Physically, he has no excuses going into this race. He

is going as good as he could possibly go and is back to his old self. I expect him to bounce back and run huge Saturday." Last year, Little Mike was ridden to victory by regular rider Ramon Dominguez, who has since retired, so he will be guided Saturday by Joel Rosario, who was also aboard in the

U.N. "He is the hottest rider in the country," Romans commented. "He hasn't done anything wrong. It seems like he is winning stakes every weekend and we are happy to have him."

Romans will also be represented by **Finnegan's Wake** (Powerscourt {GB}), who is Grade I stakes placed, but is still searching for that elusive black-type score in the Arlington Million.

"He is working well," Romans said of last year's G1 Secretariat S. runner-up. "He doesn't have the credentials of some of these horses, but he is kind of a 'now' horse. He is doing super at the moment and seems to be doing better and better."

Hunter's Light Hits the Turf at Arlington...

Godolphin Stable's **Hunter's Light (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) was among the Europeans to take to the turf Tuesday morning in advance of Saturday's G1 Arlington Million. Making his sixth start on his third continent this season, the 5-year-old was last seen running third in the G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis July 28.

"He looked good, I think," confirmed Godolphin representative Steve Armstrong after Hunter's Light first appearance on the local turf course. "[Wednesday] he'll do a 10-furlong canter and we'll see how he feels. We'll wait for [head trainer] Saeed [bin Suroor] to get here."

Regarding the horse's latest start, Armstrong said, "The German race was basically sort of just a stepping stone. This was always the plan, to come here." Last fall, Hunter's Light won the 10-furlong G1 Premio Roma GBI Racing at Capannelle before running three races in Dubai earlier this season, including a score in the G1 Maktoum Challenge Round 3 and a seventh in the G1 Dubai World Cup. Before his placing in Germany, the globetrotting horse was sixth in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup. "He's a pro--nothing bothers him," said Armstrong. "He's so relaxed and has traveled so much."

Local Jockeys Well Represented at Intern'l Festival

Hall of Fame jockey Kent Desormeaux, a fixture at Arlington's International Festival, has collected three wins in the GI Secretariat S. and GI Beverly D. and a win in the GI Arlington Million.

He is riding regularly at Arlington for the first time this year and is currently the leading jockey for the meet. He will get the call aboard local competitor **La Tia** (City Place) in the Beverly D. and **Tattenham** (Rock Hard Ten) in the Secretariat.

"I'm excited because this time around I'm representing Chicago," Desormeaux said. "I'm one of the hometown guys this year, so I'd love to win it for Chicago."

Desormeaux feels that his familiarity with the course will give him an edge.

"There is no question about it, and I hope that my extra familiarity with the course will work in our favor," he said.

Local jockey James Graham, rider of 2010 Beverly D. runner-up Hot Cha Cha (Cactus Ridge), also looks forward to this year's International Festival.

"This is always a day I look forward to, and I love both of my horses on Saturday," Graham said. He rides **Ausus** (Invasor {Arg}) in the Beverly D. and **Najjaar** (Jazil) in the American St. Leger S. "They both worked great for this, and the filly ran just a couple ticks off the track record last time [1:53.94 in the GIII Modesty H. July 13]. If she can duplicate that race, we can win."

Last year's leading jockey at Arlington, Francisco Torres, expressed similar sentiments about his mounts for the Festival.

"Whenever you get the opportunity to ride for connections like Team Block, especially in that kind of race, it's a big thing," he said about his mount aboard **loya Bigtime** (Dynaformer) in the American St. Leger. "I worked him the other morning, and he went some kind of good, so he's going into the race 110%. I think everyone looks at this day kind of like Chicago's own Kentucky Derby, and I'm just happy to get to be a part of it. It's a great weekend, and I just hope for good weather and a good race."

Also representing the local jockey colony on Arlington's biggest day are Florent Geroux, Julio Felix, E. T. Baird, Eddie Castro and Quincy Hamilton.

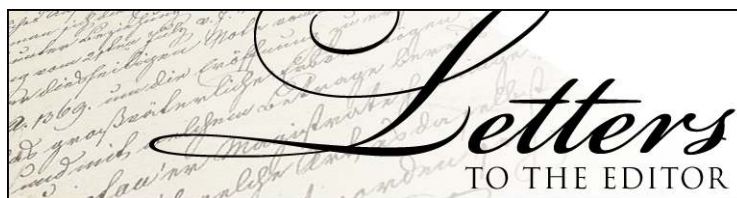

Since its addition to the *Daily Racing Form* in 1992, the Beyer speed figure has played a prominent role in defining evaluations for racing horses. The first question asked when looking to buy or sell a horse running in the United States is typically, "What Beyer did they run?" The difference between a high Beyer figure and a low Beyer figure can often equate to millions of dollars.

By definition, the Beyer Speed Figures are "a numerical representation of a horse's performance, based on the final time and the inherent speed over the track on which the race was run." Simply put, the faster the final time of the race, the higher the speed figure.

I am mystified by the Beyer Speed Figures given to the horses winning the grass races at Del Mar on August 11, 2013.

2nd Race: 1 1/16 miles on the turf, open \$50,000 claimers. It was won by Magic Channel with the half mile fraction of :47 1/5, the three-quarter mile fraction of 1:11 1/5, and the final time for the mile and one-sixteenth 1:41 1/5. This time earned a 78 Beyer.

5th Race: One mile on the turf, a first condition allowance race. It was won by No Jet Lag with the half mile fraction of :47 1/5, the three-quarter fraction of 1:11 1/5, and the final time for the one mile 1:34 1/5. This time earned an 80 Beyer. cont. p8

8th Race: 1 1/8 miles on the turf. This was the GII John C. Mabee S. It was won by Tiz Flirtatious in spectacular fashion with the half mile fraction of :52 4/5, the three-quarter fraction of 1:17 4/5, the one mile fraction of 1:41 and the final time for the one mile and an eighth 1:51 3/5. As you can see from the fractions, they were crawling for nearly the entire first mile. The one mile fraction for Tiz Flirtatious at 1:41 flat was nearly seven seconds slower than the one mile final time for No Jet Lag at 1:34 1/5. With each 1/5th of a second roughly equating to a length, it means that, at the same one mile distance, No Jet Lag would have been 34 lengths ahead of Tiz Flirtatious! Now for the amazing part...Tiz Flirtatious received a 92 Beyer.

I firmly believe that Tiz Flirtatious ran a phenomenal race and is a legitimate graded stakes filly. But I can't understand how a speed figure that, by definition, is claiming to be based strictly off final time can justify this 92 Beyer figure. This is not the first instance where a Beyer figure has been difficult to understand and explain.

As an owner, breeder, commercial seller, and bloodstock agent, there's simply too much riding on these numbers for there not to be some checks and balances, or rhyme or reason, to the figures doled out. At this stage, it just appears arbitrary. If we are going to continue to hold Beyer figures in such high esteem, they must become more consistent in how they evaluate performance.

Responding to Jason Litt's letter:

When the pace of a race is extraordinarily slow and results in an extraordinarily slow final time, a speed figure based on the final time may be absurdly low. In such cases, we prefer to assign an arbitrary Beyer Speed Figure to the race rather than publish a number that does not remotely reflect the ability of the horses. This is what happened in the John C. Mabee S. at Del Mar Aug. 11.

In the first two turf races of the day, Magic Flower received a figure of 78 and No Jet Lag an 80, numbers that made sense based on the horses' prior performances. But in the stakes race, after the field had gone the first six furlongs in 1:17.94, the fillies and mares couldn't have recorded a representative final time if they had sprouted wings (to use Trevor Denman's phrase.) As Mr. Litt wrote, Tiz Flirtatious' performance was much slower than the one delivered by 3-year-old No Jet Lag. Indeed, Tiz Flirtatious' time of 1:51.71 for 1 1/8 miles translated into a Beyer Speed Figure of 43.

If we had published a figure of 43 for this Grade II stakes, Mr. Litt could justifiably have written a letter saying that the number was patently absurd. I am responsible for the Del Mar figures, and I concluded that a figure of 92 would be consistent with the previous performances of the runners. (For example: third-place finisher My Gi Gi received a figure of 84 in the Mabee. Her four prior numbers had been 86, 79, 84 and 86.) We have always dealt with aberrant final times in this fashion. Yes, this practice is arbitrary, but it is surely preferable to publishing speed figures that are misleading or meaningless.

SURPRISE! IT'S GALILEO

Because of the way the APEX ratings are calculated--top 2% earners as of July 22, when the threshold in North America was \$83,650, whereas at the end of 2012 the A Runner threshold was \$121,200--it is possible that some horses which show as A Runners now may end up as B or even C Runners at the end of the year (depending on whether they increase their

2013 earnings if they are currently between the two figures). Given that caveat, in any case, it can hardly be a surprise that the world number one, Coolmore's Galileo (Sadler's Wells), tops the list of North American and

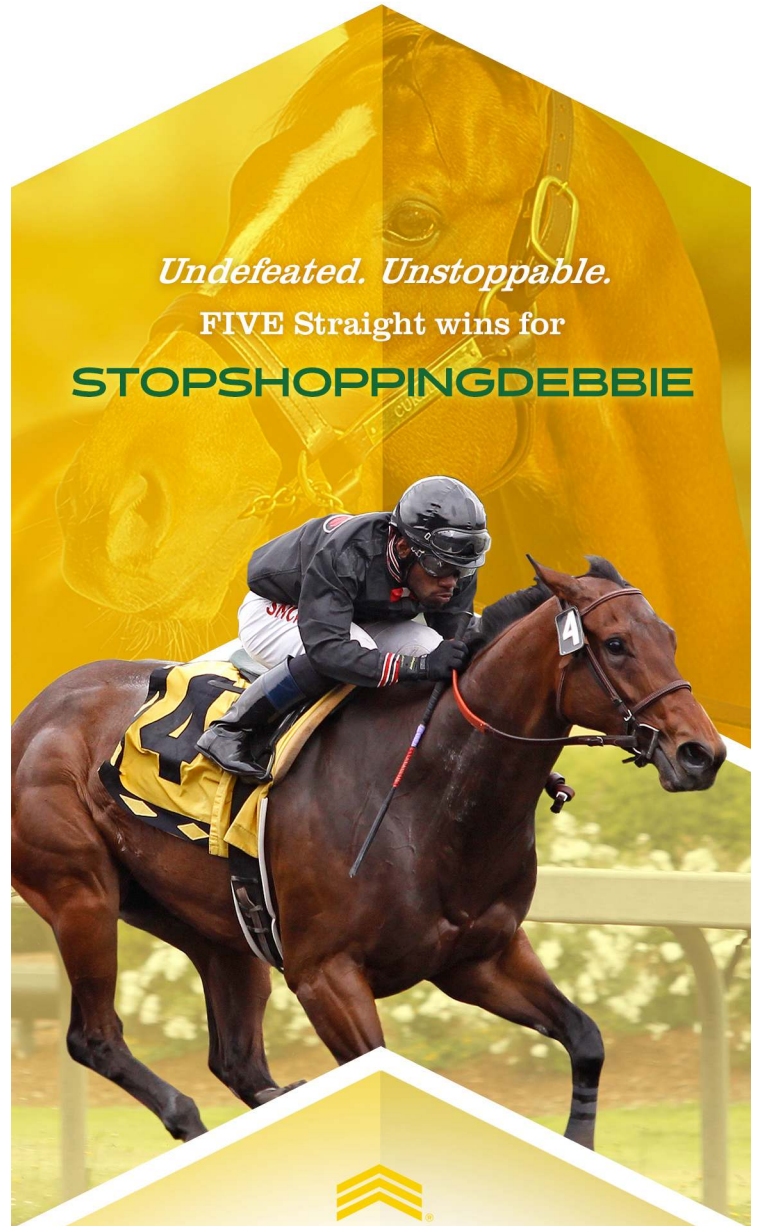
European sires by number of new A Runners in 2013 with 13. It's hard to cast our minds back five years ago (well, except for the world economic meltdown), but we should remember that at the end of 2008, when 2009 matings (foals of 2010) were planned, Galileo's oldest foals were then just finishing their 5-year-old season, and the quality of his mares was in the process of shooting up. Not that he ever needed the very top mares on his way to becoming the world number one, but he already has 10 new 3-year-old A Runners in 2013, including Classic winners Ruler of the World, Intello, and Magician. Back in 2003, when his first crop were about to be born and the promotional gear was being widely produced, I happened to be at Coolmore one cold February day and came away with a warm winter jacket emblazoned with 'Galileo' on the back. I'm thinking about auctioning it on eBay now (not really, Richard). He's definitely in the same class as his sire, 14-time British and Irish champion sire Sadler's Wells. Awesome.

Galileo's yearling sale season is about to get underway--he had one filly sell at Saratoga (\$600,000), and has 13 catalogued in Arqana's Deauville sale, which starts Saturday. Three sires are tied with 11 new A Runners each, and the two North American sires of the three rank second and third behind **Distorted Humor** (5 sold of 6 offered, average \$567,000) among North America sires with two or more yearlings sold at the three Fasig sales so far. These are Darley's **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado) (4/5, avg. \$531,250, per Instatistics)--eight of his 11 new 2013 A Runners are 3-year-olds, including Rydilluc, one of the top American 3-year-old grass horses--and Airdrie's late **Indian Charlie** (In Excess), whose four yearlings sold (admittedly from nine offered) have averaged \$488,750. **Cont. p10**

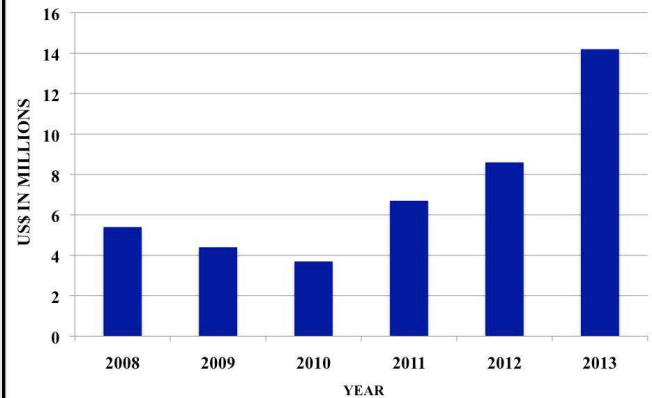

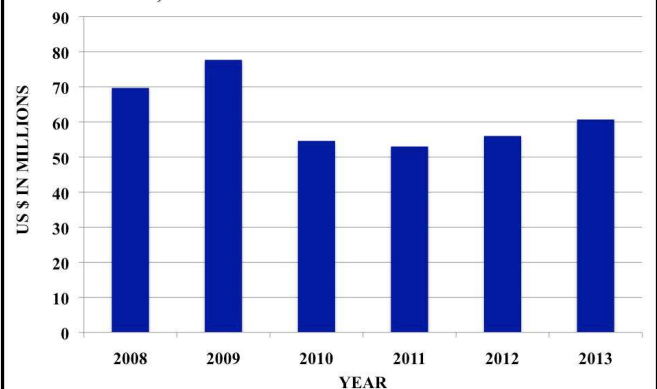

After many years of hovering around the 2.00 mark for A Runners, Indian Charlie's A Runner Index has now risen to 2.43. The buyers are definitely willing to pay for the good Indian Charlie yearlings, and he figures to be one of the hottest sires at the September sale,

especially as this is his final crop of yearlings. Also with 11 new A Runners is Banstead Manor's **Oasis Dream** (Green Desert); interestingly, no fewer than six of his new A's are 4-year-olds. Ashford's **Giant's Causeway** (Storm Cat) and Gainesway's **Tapit** (Pulpit) each have nine new A Runners (six of

Tapit's are 3-year-olds), while Banstead Manor's **Dansili** (Danehill) and Ramsey Farm's **Kitten's Joy** (El Prado) have eight each. Seven of Kitten's Joy's eight new A Runners are 3-year-olds, while Dansili's new A's include the 3-year-old Flintshire, winner of the G1 Grand Prix de Paris for the Juddmonte-Fabre team. This combination has already won the GP de Paris--G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe double with another son of Dansili, Rail Link in 2006, and it would be a brave punter who took the view a repeat performance is unlikely.

The overall leading sire of new 2012 A Runners is Japan's **Deep Impact** (Sunday Silence), with 15, which is reflected in his 2013 yearling average: 12 sold from 12 offered, for an average of \$757,350. **Fuji Kiseki**, one of the older sons of Sunday Silence at stud, has 10 new A Runners this year. King Kamehameha, who is by Kingmambo (and has no fewer than 26 A Runners already out of Sunday Silence mares), and Manhattan Caf,, another son of Sunday Silence, have eight new A Runners each.

Here and There... I had never been to The Jockey Club Round Table, the 61st edition of which took place Sunday morning at Saratoga, and I thought included a mighty array of speakers. A lot of the reporting has rightly focused on coverage of medication issues, and, yes, it was significant that Jockey Club Chairman Ogden Phipps said that if American racing doesn't put its own house in order, The Jockey Club would support federal legislation to do the job for us. Also very significant were the findings of a poll done by the Penn Schoen Berland group within the last two weeks (so, timely) which found that big bettors (a/k/a 'whales') rated medication issues equally as 'very important' as lower takeout rates--and Robert Green, who presented the findings, also reported that concerns about medication lead to their lowering their handle. Also very interesting was the presentation by Brian Kavanagh, CEO of Horse Racing Ireland and Chairman of the European Pattern Committee, who talked about the new 2014 Irish Champions Weekend, which will be the second weekend of September. The obvious next step is to formalize an end-of-(European) season championship series including the new Irish weekend; Arc weekend in France; and British Champions Day.

This would be a big step forward, and Brian also raised the possibility of such a series tying in, in some fashion, with our Breeders' Cup. There was, of course, the inevitable bleating by British interests that the new Irish weekend will clash with the G1 English St. Leger, but progress requires change and adaptation. The fact is that there is already a lot of going backwards and forwards among the three major European racing countries throughout the year, and rationalizing the structure to create a proper end-of-season European championship series would only be a step forward. On that note, we were interested to read that former Breeders' Cup V.P. Carter Carnegie has been appointed to a position which essentially is intended to present an international face to British racing and British Champions' Day. Aside from the fact they've landed the services of one of the most talented people in the business, the big plus is that Carter totally gets it as far as international scheduling and competition go, so, while his job will be to promote Britain above all, there's no question his international perspective is likely to seep into the discussions. It's a big plus for the British, and hopefully a big plus for the continuing development of top-class international racing as well.

The Big Bad Bob File... Three weeks ago we tabbed Paul Reddam and Vessels Farm's California sire **Square Eddie**, one of this year's leading freshman sires, as a horse we maybe need to add to our list of unheralded sires who are proving way better than their stud fees indicate. This we call the 'Big Bad Bob' List, in honor of the now-Irish National Stud sire who started from south of nowhere to become a good sire. Now we have another addition who, like the other two, does not appear among the 918 APEX sires we've rated this time around. In the case of Big Bad Bob, its because he doesn't have 10 3-year-olds of 2013, the minimum for a sire to be assigned APEX ratings (Square Eddie isn't rated because he only has 2-year-olds). The new addition is Claiborne's **Stroll**, a Grade I-winning son of Pulpit who ranks third on the North American Two-Year-Old Sire List (click [here](#)) after his daughter Skylander Girl was an impressive winner last Saturday's Ontario Debutante S. After standing three seasons at Claiborne, Stroll was leased for two years to Italy (which is why he isn't rated for APEX--we don't include Italian sires). Meanwhile, he notched up APEX ratings in the 2.50 range before he left. Now he's back, with five winners from 10 starters, including three black-type 2-year-olds, from his first crop back. He's picked up right where he left off. (*see box p 10*)

And Finally... What a field they assembled for the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville last Sunday: Moonlight Cloud; surprise second Olympic Glory; Intello; Declaration of War; and Dawn Approach. Best race of the year so far.

Britain

DWYER'S INDIAN BAN INCREASED

Jockey Martin Dwyer, who has continued in the saddle pending his appeal of a two-month ban imposed by the stewards of the Royal Western India Turf Club in February, had his sanction increased to eight months. The revised ban is set to run from Aug. 31 to Apr. 30 next year. Dwyer incurred the wrath of racegoers when finishing third aboard Ice Age in a race at Mahalaxmi and local stewards ordered the refund of all losing bets after subsequently deeming the horse a "non-starter." Dwyer suggested he did not receive a fair hearing at the initial inquiry and returned to India for an appeal hearing in April. "I've been told [the ban] has been taken up to seven months, but I have had no official notification through as it has only just happened," he told *The Guardian*. "I can't really comment much further, other than saying I will definitely be appealing. I am a bit confused at this stage and either way it is not good news. All I can do now is wait for the official notification and see what the reasons are." Paul Struthers, chief executive of the Professional Jockeys Association, added, "Having spoken to Martin, he is understandably very confused and very disappointed by the decision of the Stewards of the RWITC. We understand he still has a right of appeal and, if that is correct, he will most definitely be appealing. If that is correct, we understand he will be free to ride pending that appeal. We also await the written reasons for today's decision." BHA spokesman Robin Mounsey continued, "We have only just heard the reports emerging from India. We will await further information from the Royal Western India Turf Club before making any comment."

France

PASQUIER DRUGS BAN CONFIRMED

Stephane Pasquier's three-month ban for returning a positive drug test at Longchamp Apr. 11 has been confirmed after the rider failed to have the original decision by the stewards of France Galop overturned. His agent Herve Naggar confirmed that the ban had been upheld by the authority's appeal committee, but declined to make any further comment. Pasquier's ban will begin today.
