LITTLE MIKE DRAWS 11 IN MILLION

Priscilla Vaccarezza's **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) will break from post 11 and face 12 foes as he looks to defend his title in Saturday's GI Arlington Million. The

bay, who also annexed the GI Breeders' Cup Turf in 2012, enters this test off a fourth-place run in Monmouth's July 6 GI United Nations S. after a disappointing trip to Dubai. He is the 5-1 second choice on the morning line. The Million has been won by foreign-trained runners in three of the last five years, and

British-based **Grandeur (Ire)** (Verglas {Ire}) leads a six-horse string of invaders in the featured race. The 7-2 morning-line favorite, who drew the far-outside 13 post, enters off a runner-up finish in the July 27 G2 York S. The Yvonne Jacques colorbearer took a pair of Grade IIs in California last year.

Glen Hill Farm's **Marketing Mix** (Medaglia d'Oro) figures to be the shortest price in Arlington's Saturday Grade IIs as she looks to avenge a head defeat in last year's Beverly D. S. The dark bay has scored twice at the highest level since then, and most recently bested the boys in Betfair Hollywood Park's July 14 GIII Sunset H. Arlington morning-line maker Joe Kristufek has installed Marketing Mix, who will break from post six in a field of nine, as the 2-1 chalk.

The Arlington Million is a "Win and You're In" event for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, while the Beverly D. offers an automatic berth to the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf.

The GI Secretariat S. is likely the most wide-open of the card's three prestigious races, featuring a field of 13 sophomores with little to separate them. GIII Transylvania S. winner **Jack Milton** (War Front), a close third in the July 13 GII Virginia Derby in front of **Draw Two** (Macho Uno), **Ryduilluc** (Medaglia d'Oro) and Bethel (Pulpit) is the early favorite. **Fields p5**

DANCING RAIN TO SELL AT TATTS DECEMBER

Dual Classic-winning distaffer **Dancing Rain (Ire)** (Danahill Dancer {Ire}), who became the first filly to complete the G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Preis der Diana double, is set to go under the hammer at the Tattersalls December sale Dec. 2. Trained by William Haggas for owners Martin and Lee Taylor, the 5-year-old will be offered by Clairemont Stud in foal to Frankel (GB). Her 3/4-sister Sumora (Ire) (Danahill), dam of champion 2-year-old filly Maybe (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), was the highest-priced broodmare sold in Europe in 2011 when selling for 2.4 million guineas at the Park Paddocks complex.

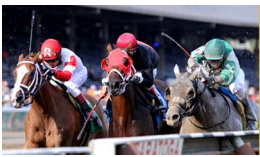

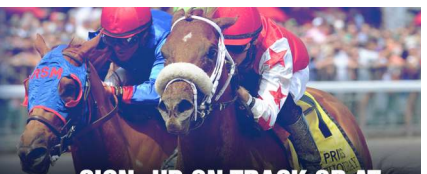

GOING PROSPECTING

Now that he is a Group 1 winner, **Havana Gold (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) has taken the pressure off and the Prix Jean Prat hero takes a slight class drop to consolidate his reputation in today's G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville. Qatar Racing and CSH's solid performer, who also boasts last year's G3 Somerville Tattersall S. on his resume alongside a fourth in the May 25 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh, goes up in trip to meet the G1 Prix du Jockey Club runner-up **Morandi (Fr)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and the G1 Prix de Diane third **Silasol (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), so his stamina will be tested to the full. "Richard has always told me he's a 10-furlong horse, so we will find out tomorrow if he improves for the extra two furlongs," Qatar Racing's Racing Manager David Redvers told *PA Sport*. "He has some big autumn entries and if--and that's a big if--he goes well tomorrow, that would obviously be the kind of races we'd be looking at." Silasol had previously won the Oct. 27 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac and May 26 G1 Prix Saint-Alary at Longchamp and is yet another class Wertheimer product, along with the colt **Pilote (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}). Runner-up to stable companion Triple Threat (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte last time July 21, he hails from the Andre Fabre stable successful a record nine times.

☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Siyenica (Fr)** (Azamour {Ire}) heads to Deauville today for the G3 Prix de Lieurey, having got her career back on track with a win in the Listed Prix de Bagatelle at Chantilly July 25. Twice unplaced in Group 1 company prior to that revival, His Highness The Aga Khan's homebred is probably still up to returning to that standard in time now that a more patient approach is being taken. One who has already made her mark in that sphere is Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Thani's **What a Name (Ire)** (Mr. Greeley), who was runner-up in last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp. After winning the G3 Prix Imprudence on her return at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 4, she has subsequently finished off the board in both the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 5 and the G2 Prix de Sandringham at Chantilly June 2. Bringing an unbeaten record to play is Godolphin's **Zibelina (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}), who captured Ascot's Listed Valiant S. when last seen July 26.

Today's G3 Desmond S. at Leopardstown features a rematch between the main protagonists in the G3 Minstrel S. at The Curragh July 20, **Darwin** (Big Brown) and **Gordon Lord Byron (Ire)** (Byron {Ire}). Just 1 3/4 lengths separated the pair on that occasion and the latter has an eight-pound turnaround in the weights this time. Darwin remains one of the most interesting horses housed at Ballydoyle at present and this will represent a true measurement of how much he is progressing. Last year's G1 Prix de la Foret winner Gordon Lord Byron has subsequently finished third to Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville Aug. 4 and if any rain comes could get revenge here. Toronado in Juddmonte Mix...

Sheikh Joaan Al Thani's **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) could take on Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in Wednesday's G1 Juddmonte International, trainer Richard Hannon announced yesterday. Following his success in the G1 Sussex S. at Glorious Goodwood July 31, jockey Richard Hughes is keen to step up in trip for the extended 10-furlong contest. "Hughesie wants me to run him in the Juddmonte," Hannon told *PA Sport*. "We'll probably keep him to a mile, but there's only one horse to beat in the Juddmonte, so it's very tempting. He'll be kept in the race, and we'll have a look."



Dettori Booked for Shea Shea...

Frankie Dettori has been given the call-up to ride G1 Al Quoz Sprint victor **Shea Shea (SAf)** (National Emblem {SAf}) in next week's G1 Coolmore Nunthorpe S. at York--a race the jockey has won three times--after regular partner Christophe Soumillon failed in his appeal to overturn a ban in France. "Christophe Soumillon was due to take the ride as usual, but he picked up a suspension in France and failed on appeal so won't be available," explained trainer Mike de Kock. "We're fortunate to have Frankie available to stand in. Shea Shea is doing well, his coat looks good and he should be at his best for the race. It's an easier five furlongs than at Ascot, where he was beaten late by Sole Power [in the June 18 G1 King's Stand S.], so we're hoping it will suit him perfectly."

NEW YORK TIMES RELEASES 'THE JOCKEY'

The *New York Times* yesterday released a 10,000-word multimedia piece on its website profiling 55-year-old Hall of Fame jockey Russell Baze, the winningest rider in North American racing history, entitled "[The Jockey](#)." Written by Pulitzer Prize winner Barry Bearak with images by Chang Lee, the piece utilizes the same techniques as the *Times*' "[Snow Fall](#)," which proved immensely popular when it was released last December. The Biggest Little Race in the World...

They call it Ruidoso Roulette. It's the term given by horsemen to the local weather extremes that can wreak havoc on a horse's chances in trials for the \$2.6-million GI All American Futurity. Wind, rain, and sudden shifts in temperature can all make a horse go slower--or faster--as literally hundreds of 2-year-old

colts, geldings and fillies compete for 10 coveted spots in the Futurity starting gate.

Contested over 440 yards, the Futurity is Quarter Horse racing's biggest event. Think Kentucky Derby, minus a minute and forty seconds. It's

held each year on Labor Day in the mountain city of Ruidoso, New Mexico. This year, there are a staggering 28 trials, staged for the first time over two days instead of one. Today, beginning at 1 p.m. Eastern Time, 14 trials will be run. Tomorrow, another 14. The horses who register the five fastest times on each day, win or lose, will advance to the Futurity final Sept. 2. The margin for error is exceedingly slim. A bad post, a bump from a rival at the break, a sudden headwind? That might be it for your Futurity hopes.

The idea of trials, largely foreign to Thoroughbred racing, isn't the only unique aspect of the All American Futurity, the third leg of a Quarter Horse racing Triple Crown that includes the Ruidoso Futurity in June and the Rainbow Futurity in July. Maybe more interesting, in fact, is how the race is funded in the first place. But for about \$75,000 in added-money contributed by Ruidoso, the entirety of the estimated \$2.6 million value of the 2013 Futurity will have come from nomination fees. Beginning when the horses are foals and continuing right through trial day, owners, breeders and trainers contribute money into a pot that ultimately funds the Futurity purse. **Cont. p10**

In Thoroughbred racing, by contrast, purses for the biggest races are most often derived by handle and, in the last 15 years or so, through alternative-gaming funding. A notable exception, of course, is the Breeders' Cup, where more than half of the \$25 million in guaranteed purse money in 2013 will be from nomination, stallion and entry fees. But the Breeders' Cup also earns a substantial amount in pari-mutuel retention. Intra-race wagering--not including Pick 3's, 4's, etc.--on the 2012 Breeders' Cup Classic alone was over \$15 million. By way of comparison, betting on the 2012 All-American Futurity was about \$620,000, or about 4% of the Classic handle.

Getting a horse to the All American Futurity isn't cheap, either. Whereas a single \$500 foal nomination will make a horse eligible for the Breeders' Cup for life, the All American Futurity requires a \$200 foal nomination, followed by a series of six more sustaining fees that all together total about \$3,600. There's also a \$1,200 fee for starting in the trials, meaning that the connections of each of the 280 horses that will run in the next two days have ponied up at least \$4,800 in fees, or \$1,344,000 in total. Horses can also be supplemented to the trials at a cost of \$50,000.

Not surprisingly, there are a vast number of nominated horses, maybe up to 1,000, whose owners discontinued their payments at sometime during the process for whatever reason. Additionally, some owners pay the trial entry fee and don't enter the trials to keep their horse eligible to the following year's All American Derby. That's because the purses of the Ruidoso, Rainbow and All American Futurities are capped at a certain amount, and any additional monies paid in flow over into the following year's Derby. The All American Derby purse this year? An estimated \$2.3 million. The All American Derby is held annually the day prior to the Futurity.

If the cost of paying for a single horse to get to the Futurity trials seems pricey, think about trainer Blane Wood, who in total has a whopping 28 horses in the Futurity trials. Yep, one for each. The total nomination outlay for those horses, none of whom are assured a spot in the Futurity starting gate, is no less than \$134,400.

All this begs the question--why do it this way?

Well, it's the only way *to* do it, really. Ruidoso, the city, isn't big. Sitting 6,900 feet up in the Sacramento Mountains, it falls within Lincoln County, New Mexico, population 20,497. Though about half of the county's residents live in the greater Ruidoso area, that hardly makes for a broad fanbase from which to build attendance and handle. But current demographics tell only a small part of the story.

The origins of the All American Futurity and Ruidoso Downs are nearly as interesting as the history of Lincoln County, which gained fame in the 1800s for the so-called Lincoln County War--the Old West dispute that propelled Billy the Kid to notoriety. Back in the 1930s, regional oil and cattlemen used to vacation in Ruidoso, valued especially by West Texans for its cooler climes, and occasionally they held match races for their horses in a broad cornfield owned by a farmer named Miller. Families picnicked as the stocky, fast-as-lightning horses competed. A track was eventually built, and by 1947, the first pari-mutuel races were held at what was then called Hollywood Park. In 1953, Gene Hensley purchased the property and renamed the track Ruidoso Downs. Hensley hoped to build the track into one of Quarter Horse racing's premier venues, but he had a problem: how do you promote a track that isn't remotely close to a major metropolitan center? His solution: create the richest event in Quarter Horse racing.

The idea of nominations-based futurities wasn't new at the time, and Hensley enlisted Carl Mercer, who had launched a successful futurity in Southern California, and Ruidoso musician and promoter Ray Reed, to help develop and promote this centerpiece of Ruidoso racing. The result was the All American Futurity. Contested for the first time in 1959, the inaugural Futurity achieved Hensley's aim--its \$129,686 purse was Quarter Horse racing's richest ever, and the race was an instant success. The filly Galobar won that year, becoming of the first of three winners for owner Hugh Huntley and trainer Newt Keck in the first five runnings of the race.

Before long, the All American Futurity became the race that every Quarter Horse owner, trainer and jockey wanted to win, and the number of nominated horses has grown exponentially. The inaugural year saw 28 entrants compete in three trials to make the Futurity final. A decade later, 103 horses competed in 11 trials. Those numbers doubled less than a decade later. Last year, a record 26 trials were held over the span of a single day. Racing started at 10 a.m. and didn't conclude until 7:00 in the evening--an exhausting nine hours for nearly everyone involved, not the least of which were the jockeys that competed in nearly all of the trials. **Cont. p11**

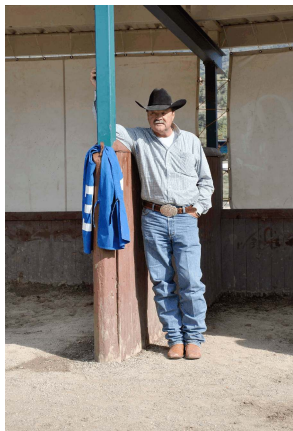

In response, Ruidoso decided to split the trials into two days for the first time. While "Ruidoso Roulette" will still be in play to a large degree, officials thought the track variant might be too much between days, and so opted to take the five fastest horses today and the five fastest tomorrow.

So, what are some of the storylines heading into today's trials? Keep an eye on the aforementioned Blane Wood. Among his 28 runners is the filly Big Biz Perry, a 30-1 upset winner of the \$1 million Heritage Place Futurity in June, but now the number one-ranked horse on the AQHARacing.com/Horseplayer.com national poll. She goes in the 12th race today. Blane's father Leo won the All American Futurity with Pie In The Sky in 1979, but Blane, perennially a leading trainer, has yet to win the race. Ricky Ramirez will have the mount on Big Biz Perry and all of the leading Wood-trained runners.

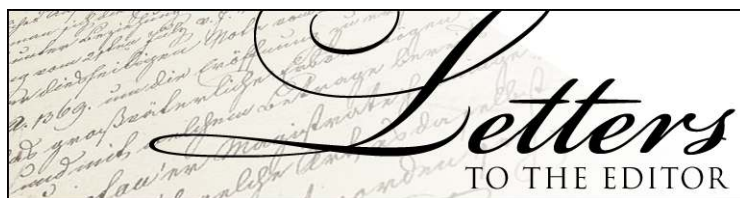

Also watch for Hes Relentless. Racing for Tom Maher, Johnny Cope and R.D. Hubbard, the current owner of Ruidoso and known among Thoroughbred fans as the man who bred and/or raced the likes of Stravinsky and Gentlemen (Arg), Hes Relentless ran second in the Heritage Place Futurity. He's entered in today's eighth race.

TVG will be airing the trials today and tomorrow, and will have the All American Futurity final on Sept. 2.

Byron Rogers--In response to Jason Litt (8/13):

Jason Litt raised some interesting points in his letter to the editor on Beyer speed figures.

One of the more pertinent of those was the allusion to the almost cult-like devotion that commercial breeders and owners display with regard to using Beyer (and other speed figures), as a proxy for genetic merit, and the impact this has on sales on the basis of these numbers.

Peer-reviewed heritability studies published have repeatedly shown that time, and measures based on time, like Beyer Speed figures, have a low degree of heritability. Or to put it another way, there is very low correlation in performance as a racehorse when expressed as a speed figure, and performance as a breeding animal. A peak Beyer figure--such as the 118 for Smarty Jones, and 98 for Tapit, indicating a difference of around 10 lengths--might be important in terms of handicapping, but the contrasting performance of the two at stud is a fair illustration of the usefulness of a speed figure as an indicator of potential breeding performance. So, if a stallion owner tells you a stallion ran a 120 Beyer speed figure, or a consignor selling a mare tells you she ran a -1 on the sheets, with regard to the individual's stud potential, it is next to meaningless noise and should be treated as such.

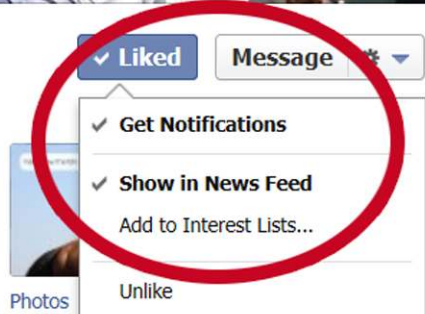
