Yvonne Jacques's **Grandeur (Ire)** (Verglas {Ire}), who left a favorable impression in three starts on American shores in 2012, makes his third trans-Atlantic trip and is the tepid 7-2 morning-line favorite for today's

GI Arlington Million, a "Win and You're In" event for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 2. Consistent, if not overly flashy, at three for trainer Jeremy Nosedo, the grey gelding took a Newbury conditions test Sept. 21, then was successful in the GII Twilight Derby Nov. 2

and in the GII Hollywood Turf Cup in December sandwiched around a troubled runner-up effort in the GI Hollywood Derby. ### 'PRINCESS' SEEKS THIRD GRADE I CROWN

Todd Pletcher sends out GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior) in search of her third-straight Grade I victory in today's Alabama S. at Saratoga. The Ed Stanco homebred followed that huge upset in Kentucky with a six-length victory in the GI Coaching Club American Oaks here July 20. The heavy 3-5 favorite on the morning-line must navigate some added real estate in this test, moving up from nine to 10 furlongs for the first time. "She should excel with the added distance," said Pletcher. "She finished both the Kentucky Oaks and the Coaching Club very well, indicating to me she wants more distance. She's easy to turn off in the early part of the race and relaxes nicely, so that should also help." **Cont. p6**

### ARQANA AUGUST GETS UNDERWAY

Arqana stage the first of three days of their flagship Deauville August Yearling Sale today, followed on Tuesday by the inaugural edition of the v2 Yearling Sale. Split into two parts, the catalogue features 188 select lots to sell today and tomorrow on the back of this year's Classic-winning exploits of Style Vendome (Fr) (Anabaa) and Flotilla (Fr) (Mizzen Mast). The latter's half-sister by High Chaparral (Ire) is one of a plethora of high-class prospects (185) from the draft of Haras des Capucines, while Style Vendome's Kendargent (Fr) half-brother is consigned by Haras de Colleville as hip 30. Over the past 12 months, this auction has been further advertised by the exploits of the G1 Sussex S. winner Toronado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}), who cost a mere €55,000, and Morandi (Fr) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who fetched just €65,000 and has been runner-up in this year's G1 Prix du Jockey Club as well as annexing the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. At the other end of the spectrum is the current G1 Irish Oaks title holder Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who was also runner-up in the G1 Prix de Diane, and cost €600,000 in 2011. Arqana President Eric Hoyer commented, "This year, the catalogue has been reduced to 376 yearlings from 471 in 2012, which means that the selection was even more demanding. I have no doubt that the champions of tomorrow will be found in this catalogue, as were the many 3-year-olds who fly the flag for Deauville this year." Selling starts at 5pm. 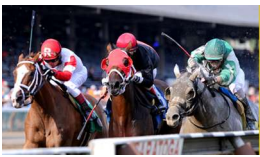

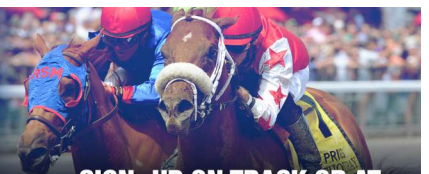


**A 'GRAND' RE-APPEARANCE (cont. from p1)**

William Buick upset Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) aboard Debussy (Ire) (Diesis {GB}) in 2010 and has the mount on Grandeur this afternoon. Buick will have to work out a trip from the widest alley in the field of 13, and is likely to try to slot in behind the pace in what figures to be a truly run affair. One of the speeds is **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps), who will look to become the first back-to-back winner of the Million (John Henry was victorious in 1981 and 1984). A Grade I winner at nine, 10 and 12 furlongs, though denied an Eclipse last season, the noted front-runner was bankrupt in a pair of tries in Dubai, then flashed his trademark early zip in the GI United Nations S. July 6 before weakening to fourth. "He's back to where he was last year, and we're really looking forward to [Saturday]," trainer Dale Romans said after Little Mike galloped 1 1/2 miles on Friday after arriving at Arlington on Thursday. "He looked as good as he could out there, and I feel better about his chances now than I did when I woke up." He'll also have company near the front in the form of **Nate's Mineshaft** (Mineshaft), one of the first most will eliminate, but who should have some say in the outcome.

year's race off a spectacular U.S. debut in the restricted Wickerr S. going a mile over the Del Mar turf course July 24, finishing full of run before galloping out like a horse crying out for additional real estate. Indeed, he is a Group 1 winner in Argentina at today's distance, has a

cozy draw in seven and is piloted by two-time Million-winning jockey Gary Stevens, who was denied a third when he was unceremoniously dislodged by Storming Home (GB) as they were about to cross the wire in 2003.

Trainer Mike de Kock went agonizingly close to winning the 2008 Million with Archipenko (Kingmambo), his lone starter in the race to date, and will saddle classy South African **The Apache (SAf)** (Mogok).

The champion 3-year-old of his generation in 2011 and a dual Group 1 winner that season, the bay won the G2 Al Rashidiya S. at Meydan in January, but found the mare Sajjhaa (GB) (King's Best) too tough in the G1 Jebel Hatta and the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. He most recently returned from a four-month absence to be fourth in the aforementioned York S., but figures to come on for the effort.

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Real Solution** (Kitten's Joy) will try to go one better than his sire, who was runner-up as the favorite to Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells) in the 2005 renewal. Dominant in winning three of five starts in Italy in 2012, the homebred was a decent fourth in the GIII Fort Marcy S. over an insufficient mile at Belmont May 4, but stayed on well to be third last time out in the GI Manhattan H. June 8. He'll get to take the shortest way around from the sometimes-tricky inside draw and could make some noise with a better-timed run.

**'BEV'-VY OF CHANCES IN 'D**

A case can be made for as many as four or five of the nine fillies and mares signed up for today's GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington, for which the winner will receive an all-fees-paid trip to Santa Anita for the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf Nov. 1. Foreign-bred (though many of those American-based) runners have won 10 of the last 11 runnings of the 9 1/2-furlong test, but Ontario-bred **Marketing Mix** (Medaglia d'Oro) is likely to go off a slight favorite to turn that around. The half-length runner-up to I'm A Dreamer (Ire) (Noverre) in the 2012 renewal, the dark bay broke through at the top level in the GI Rodeo Drive S. ahead of a second to Zagora (Fr) (Green Tune) in the Filly/Mare Turf. Inclement weather in the Midwest delayed her return to action this term, but her head success in the GI Gamely S. May 27 came at the expense of recent GI John C. Mabee S. winner Tiz Flirtatious (Tizbud) and she exits a defeat of the boys in the Gill Sunset H. in her first try at 12 furlongs July 14 at Hollywood. James Wigan's **Dank (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) could prove best of the three Euro raiders. Never worse than a 4-1 chance in her 10-race career, the homebred was a Group 3 winner last season and was the first-up winner of the G3 Dahlia S. May 5, defeating recent G1 Nassau S. runner-up Thistle Bird (Ire) (Selkirk) into third. The bay was a half-length third to **Duntle (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the G2 Cambridge S. over that one's pet distance of a mile at Royal Ascot June 19, but bounced back to win the G2 Kilboy Estate S. at The Curragh July 21. Dank will be the first Beverly D. starter for trainer Sir Michael Stoute.

Owned by Flaxman Holdings, Duntle could be the class of the field and would be a Group 1 winner but for a disqualification in last year's Matron S. The chestnut exits a second to Elusive Kate (Elusive Quality) in the G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville July 28 over a mile, but is something of a question mark at today's extended trip.

**PLAN B FOR RYDILLUC IN SECRETARIAT**

Trainer Gary Contessa had some quick thinking to do when last Friday's GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame S. was washed onto a sloppy main track at Saratoga. While he could have opted to keep **Rydilluc** (Medaglia d'Oro) in upstate New York for the nine-furlong GIII Saranac S. Sept. 1, he instead breezed the colt a bullet five-eighths of a mile last Sunday and will try 10 furlongs again in today's GI Secretariat S. in Chicago. The bay established himself as the top turfer of his generation--between eight and nine furlongs, at least--with victories in the GIII Palm Beach S. in March and in the inaugural Penn Mile June 1. He stretched out to a mile and a quarter for the first time in the GII Virginia Derby July 13, but faded tamely away to finish eighth. Contessa chalked that result up to the ease in the ground and not the trip, and he gets the top of the ground today.

**Jack Milton** (War Front) gets a chance to become the latest hit for his sensational young sire. Already the winner of the GIII Transylvania S. in April, the Gary Barber runner was a fast-closing third to Rydilluc at Penn National and was third by a neck behind War Dancer (War Front) in the Virginia Derby last time out.

**Draw Two** (Macho Uno) aired by nearly eight lengths in a Belmont maiden Oct. 17, then made a successful sophomore debut, defeating subsequent GIII American Derby third **Stormy Len** (Harlan's Holiday) in a May 10 Belmont allowance. The gray did well to be fourth in the Colonial race last time out, and trainer Michelle Nihei is high on his chances. This year's Secretariat hasn't attracted the most imposing draft of horses from Europe, though **Visiyani (Fr)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) goes for the same connections responsible for 2012 winner Bayrir (Fr) (Medicean {GB}).

Big Blue Kitten validated the form of the Monmouth S. with a perfect-trip victory in the GI United Nations S. over a mile and three-eighths July 6, though the 93 Beyer he earned that day would not win this race. The strength of the U.N. could be questioned, as Teaks North (Northern Afleet), who will be scratched from this, was last of six in a \$100,000 tagger Thursday, though Hangover Kid (Lemon Drop Kid) defeated fellow New York-breds in Thursday's West Point S. **Al Khali** (Medaglia d'Oro), who was runner-up in last year's rendition, was the recipient of a suspect ride from Junior Alvarado in the Man o'War, who tried to go inside with the massive 7-year-old instead of remaining in the clear. He's come exceptionally close to crashing through at this level and looms as a value play.

The May 17 Hilltop S. victress finished just a half length behind Emollient (Empire Maker) last out in the 1 1/4-mile GI American Oaks at Betfair Hollywood Park July 13. Her late-closing style should suit her well in what looks to be a speed-laden affair. Patricia Generazio's homebred **Discreet Marq** (Discreet Cat) makes her first trip west in hopes of adding a Grade I to her resume. The native New Yorker is on a hot streak, boasting back-to-back wins in the GII Sands Point S. May 27 and Eventail S. July 4, both going 1 1/16 miles at Belmont. The Christophe Clement trainee shows a speedy worktab at Saratoga, firing a five-furlong bullet in 1:00 1/5 in her last work Aug. 7. "I don't think the distance will be a problem," said Christophe Lorieul, Clement's assistant trainer. "Everybody thinks that she has to be on the lead to win and she doesn't. We have worked her from behind horses and she can rate, that's not a problem. She won't be too far off, but she doesn't have to be on the lead to win. That's what we think anyway." Glen Hill Farm homebred **Wishing Gate** (Indian Charlie) enters this off a 1 3/4-length victory over **Unusual Way** (Unusual Heat) in the GII San Clemente H. here last out July 21.

Last year's G1 SA Nursery winner wore the Shadwell silks when annexing the Feb. 14 G3 UAE 2000 Guineas and

Mar. 30 G2 Godolphin Mile on Tapeta, and he has been given abundant time to recover. "He's done everything we've ever asked of him," Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Racing Manager Angus Gold told *PA Sport*. "However, he's done none of it in Europe, so this is a new venture for him. He was champion 2-year-old in South Africa and then went

out to Dubai, but he's had a very long rest and is just starting back on Saturday. When he won the Godolphin Mile, he did it in exactly the opposite fashion that I had imagined. There were question marks over the trip, so I thought he'd be held up and be the last off the bridle, but Paul [Hanagan] was forced four or five wide, was one of the first off the bridle and then had to hang on grimly. He had to work very hard that day and, unsurprisingly, he gave himself a very hard race. Mike [de Kock] has given him plenty of time to recover and this looks the right place to start back. He seems in good form from what I have seen of him, and Paul has been a few times to ride him and is happy, so it's time to get back to work." Charles Wentworth's **Caspar Netscher (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) returned from a failed spell at stud to finish runner-up in the G2 Lennox S. over this trip at Glorious Goodwood last time July 30, and the 2011 G2 Gimcrack S. and G2 Mill Reef S. and 2012 G3 Greenham S. and G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen winner remains a class act. "I was very pleased with his comeback--he acquitted himself very well," jockey Shane Kelly told *PA Sport*. "Obviously, Soft Falling Rain looks the one to beat, and while some horses don't recreate their Meydan form over here, he was also a champion at home, so he's got plenty of form on turf. My horse goes on soft, but doesn't really need it--he just copes with it better than some. When he won the German Guineas it was like a road and he didn't really like that either. All he needs is nice, decent ground to show his best." Princess Haya of Jordan's **Gregorian (Ire)** (Clodovil {Ire}) was third in Royal Ascot's G1 Queen Anne S. June 18 before finishing fifth in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 31, and reverts to this trip to avoid the crack milers.

### THE HARAS THAT KEN BUILT

In the Aug. 8 *TDN*, Bill Oppenheim wrote about the remarkable A Runner Index of third-crop French stallion Kendargent (Fr), who will be represented by two yearlings in the main Arqana Sale, both consigned by his breeder, Haras de Colleville, and a third in the v.2 sale Tuesday.

Saturday, they offer [hip 30](#), a half-brother to the recent French Guineas winner Style Vendome (Fr) (Anabaa {Fr}); Monday, [hip 358](#), a half-sister to the Group 2-placed Sir Jade (Fr); and Tuesday, [hip 381](#).

Wrote Oppenheim, "The leading North American and European F2009 sire is a complete revelation: the French sire Kendargent (5.83), who is by a very good sire in Kendor, but who failed to win a black-type race himself. The number of non-black-type winning horses who go on to top sire lists is miniscule, and I'm sure it's completely safe to say no one outside of the Kendargent family could have predicted anything like this."

The Kendargent "family" consists of owner Guy Pariente and stallion manager Guillaume Vitse, who stand the stallion just a few kilometers from Deauville at the very impressive Haras de Colleville, in the small village of Saint Pierre Azif. He

is the stud's lone stallion, but his recent successes have kept the six-man operation, led by Vitse, a former Lane's End employee, more than busy. Kendargent was purchased by Pariente, a successful businessman, at Arqana for €45,000 in 2004. Initially raced in France, where he was stakes-placed, he came to America in 2007, where he was trained by Julio Canani. He won one of two starts in the U.S.--an allowance at Hollywood at 1 1/16th miles--before being retired with an injury. Pariente, who owned a handful of mares at

the time, brought him home to France. **cont. p11**

"He loves his horses," said Vitse. "He always believed in him. He was French-bred and has a good cross. When he got hurt, he called me and said 'let's bring him back to France to be a stallion.' He said he's got everything he needs to be the best. At the time, we only had six or seven mares. We sent the horse down to stand in the South of France and he only got 12 or 13 outside mares. So the following year we brought him back here, and stood him for €500."

From the first season he produced just 19 foals, but they included Restiadargent (Fr), who won the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte and the G3 Prix d'Arenberg, and was third by just a neck to Black Caviar in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot. He also sired Kendam (Fr), second to Restiadargent in the Arenberg. Both were owned and bred by Pariente from that initial group of six mares.

Since that time he has sired the Group 3 winner Kenhope (Fr)--second to Sky Lantern in the G1 Coronation S. and third to Elusive Kate in the G1 Prix Rothschild--and five additional Listed winners. Kendam went on to become a Group 3 winner as well.

Kendargent's name is a play on his sire's name and his color; Kendor is "Ken of Gold"; his grey son Kendargent is Ken of Silver.

Haras de Colleville is currently home to 25 yearlings and Pariente's growing broodmare band, which currently numbers 42. The mares and foals share a large field with a half-dozen contended cows. "We bought them as babies and were going to sell them for meat when they were old enough," said Vitse of the cows. "That was two years ago. Now it's too late, as they seem so happy here."

The farm, which covers 100 hectares (about 250 acres), was purchased by Pariente in 2007, while Kendargent was still racing in America, and as been extensively renovated and beautifully maintained. Done in the traditional Norman style, it is dominated by a large sculpture by the famous French sculptor Antoine Bourdelle, which has become the farm's logo.

It could easily accommodate more stallions, and Vitse said Pariente is open to the idea, but they would have to be the right ones. "We're not going to get stallions just to get stallions," he said.

For now, they are content to have one very in-demand sire. Kendargent covered 178 mares from all over Europe in 2013 for a fee of €6,000, and breeders might see that double for 2014. He has attracted the attention of overseas interests, and while shuttling to the Southern Hemisphere might one day be in his future, for now Vitse and Pariente are content to let him stay right where he is. --Sue Finley

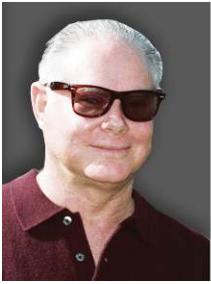

## LASIX NOT AT THE ROUND TABLE

I, along with some 300 other invited guests, attended The Jockey Club Round Table last weekend in Saratoga. Many of Thoroughbred racing's stakeholders had a seat at the Round Table.

The elephant in the room, although unseen and barely mentioned, was Lasix. And believe me, my depiction of Lasix as a clumsy oversized oaf whose swinging trunk might knock over beverages atop the table at its most threatening, is more accurate than depicting it as a 400-pound gorilla. An ape frightens humans and nobody seemed scared of the big fella at the Round Table.

Much ado was made at the Round Table about the need for adopting uniform drug rules in order to create a level playing field that would enhance integrity of the sport so the engine that powers the entire enterprise—the horseplayer—would have more confidence, which would result in this hardy, but gradually disappearing, individual betting more money more often on the races.

Bolstering the notion that horseplayers took into account the impact and possible abuse of drugs, results of a poll strongly and surprisingly (to tunnel-vision drug advocates) indicated that horseplayers wanted better control over drugs that are administered to racehorses as much as they want reduced takeout from bets.

And you know what? I truly believe that and have been writing and saying so for many years, mostly to loud guffaws and ceiling-level raised eyebrows of horsemen and a minority of the horse-playing community.

The Jockey Club put up a rousing good program. For a guy like me that has been decrying the lack of progress on the drug front, listening to the applause from those in attendance after speeches saying all the right things about medication abuse was music to my ears.

Main focus of this year's Round Table seemed to be rallying the troops to support Alan Foreman's Mid-Atlantic medication policy that promises to finally give the entire nation of racing uniform drug rules. Foreman's concept allows use of Lasix on race day.

And, on a significant (if not fully realized level), I think The Jockey Club hierarchy truly believes that controlling medication can level the playing field to give comfort to horseplayers and racing's participants. I believe that under the helm of Jim Gagliano the leaders have tried to grapple with some the drug issues heretofore unconsidered. These are well intentioned people.

But, if Dinny Phipps and Stuart Janney believe for one second that placing The Jockey Club's substantial clout behind a measure that allows race-day use of any medication—and especially Lasix—they are just kidding themselves.

The Jockey Club has been pushing the Foreman program for quite a while now. So when I read a pre-Round Table piece on bloodhorse.com that said The Jockey Club had an anti-Lasix policy, I was taken aback.

I quickly shot out a handful of e-mails to anti-Lasix proponents that I respect to ask them if they knew TJC had come out against the drug. Only one of these folks had heard of it. None of the others—and they comprise some of the most vociferous anti-Lasix and successful owner-breeders in the world—had ever read or heard TJC mention this.

So if TJC is against Lasix, how it is—one may naturally wonder—can they be for the Foreman plan?

In questioning one high-level racing stakeholder that most certainly knows the answer to this question, I learned that more than a year ago a strategy was developed whereby certain groups decided that Lasix was too controversial and volatile of an issue to deal with at this time. It was decided to separate Lasix from further policy discussions and deal with everything else. Hence the stronger move to get as many racing jurisdictions as possible to adopt the Foreman guidelines.

Somebody should tell these guys that putting all of their energy, funding and clout behind the Foreman measure is a misguided venture that will only lead to outside intervention.

Horseracing is desperately trying to beat the Feds in a race for who controls drug policy. Our industry has a window of opportunity to self-police. If TJC thinks that outside forces are going to accept any policy that allows any drugs (especially Lasix) to be used on race day, they are delusional.

Horseplayers know the ins and outs of Lasix, how it impacts the form and the horses and why outing it from the arsenal of trainers would benefit the game. Horseplayers are not stupid or uninformed.

And neither are the owners or breeders of Thoroughbred racehorses.

Look at what happened just this week in Kentucky, where a proposal was introduced by famed veterinarian Dr. Mary Scollay to the bluegrass state's equine drug council. Kentucky stands alone as the only state in the union with horse racing that is programmed to stop the use of Lasix on race day. Adopting the Foreman measure would eliminate the prospect of this seminal policy from being implemented.

Mr. Foreman is actively touting his model drug rules to the detriment of the anti-Lasix movement, which is completely counterproductive to those who would seek to impress horseplayers that racing's playing field can be made level.

Speakers at The Jockey Club have been decrying the rampant abuse of drugs at the Round Table for nearly a quarter of a century. Since the early 1980s presentations at the Round Table have called for action. So what's different this time? *cont.* p13



Dinny Phipps ended his remarks at the Round Table by hinting that if racing could not get its house in order that Federal intervention was not only possible but perhaps necessary.

From an historic perspective, Mr. Phipps is one of the heroes in the anti-Lasix movement. He is to be greatly admired as one of those who resisted the implementation of Lasix as the head of the New York Racing Association, which held out some twenty years longer than California racing.

May I humbly suggest to Mr. Phipps and his racing partner Mr. Janney that they reconsider their current stance on Lasix, because the longer they ignore the consequences, the greater the chances that an outside entity is going to force changes upon this game.

And when horseplayers responded to concerns over drugs in the poll funded by The Jockey Club, the chief drug they had in mind was Lasix. You cannot have it both ways-either lead the sport in ridding it of drugs or move out of the way and let somebody else do it for you.

**Transparent** (Bernardini) breezed four panels in :49.12 over the Saratoga main track Friday morning in his final work before the GI Travers S. Aug. 24. "He worked well," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. The Darley colorbearer hit the wire first in the July 26 Curlin S., but was taken down for coming out on the turn and placed fifth. "It was a true prep, the Curlin," the conditioner continued. "We're happy with his work. We're heading to the Travers."

### Centre Court on Point for Ballston Spa...

**Centre Court** (Smart Strike) breezed a half-mile in :48.13 over the Oklahoma training track turf course Friday morning under exercise rider Simon Harris. The GI Jenny Wiley S. winner was last of five last time out in the GI Diana S. at the Spa July 27. "She just came off the grass, and she went very nice," trainer Rusy Arnold said.

"That will be her last work. If she comes out of this work good, I'm going to be very happy." The G. Watts Humphrey colorbearer is scheduled to make her next start in the Gil Ketel One Ballston Spa S. Aug. 24.

### Richard's Kid Works for Pacific Classic...

Recent GIII Cougar II H. winner **Richard's Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid) worked six panels in 1:13.60 (7/11) at Del Mar under jockey Joe Talamo. The duo went through splits of :25.6, :38.2 and 1:02.2 and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:26 and a mile in 1:39.20. "That was nice," conditioner Doug O'Neill said of the breeze. "But after going the first eighth of a mile in 13 [seconds] to finish up the way he did just validates again his love of this racetrack and his love of Del Mar." The 2009 and 2010 GI Pacific Classic hero will aim for a third win in the event this year. "He gallops strong every day, and after his win in the Cougar II he's fit and ready," O'Neill said.

#### GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. - #5 Nutello (12-1)

I'm admittedly a bit of a sucker for European shippers in races like this (and Nutella), so I'll try fresh face **Nutello** in a race filled with cut-below types besides deserving favorite Boisterous. The 4-year-old has been pretty inconsistent, but his best races beat these most of the time. His third in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club last year takes this, as does his stakes win at Toulouse in April. The obvious question is, "Why expect his good race?" The answer seems to come down to turf condition--Nutello's best runs have been on good-to-soft ground or firmer, and that's what he'll get here. Trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias' only runner in recent memory to venture to North America was Chinchon, who never ran a bad race in four tries on this side of the pond and most notably took the 2010 GI United Nations. While Chinchon was a bit more accomplished internationally than Nutello, his best *Racing Post* ratings were similar to the latter's. So if Nutello runs like his predecessor over here, he'll be tough to beat. **Wager: \$60 Win on #5 Nutello.**

#### GI Alabama S. - #3 Galloping Giraffe (20-1)

Let's be honest, there's really not much point in going crazy trying to beat Princess of Sylmar. She towers over this field and will likely win for fun at something like 1-5. But since she won't do me much good here, I'll take a minuscule shot with her stablemate **Galloping Giraffe**, who only needs to improve some 27 Beyer points to match the chalk's last. It seems like they didn't think much of the chestnut early in her career. She debuted on the turf--not usually a good sign for a Pletcher trainee--and she was subsequently dangled for a \$65,000 tag when airing second out at Belmont June 14. But the Repole colorbearer's effort in a nine-furlong allowance here July 31 was very good. Well back in last early behind a slow pace (11 points below par to the half on the Moss Pace Figure scale), the lanky filly uncorked a strong wide bid to settle for second behind a runner who traveled up close early. This 10-furlong distance seems right up her alley, and she figures to be moving well in the stretch--it's just a matter of how well Princess of Sylmar is moving at that point. **Wager: \$20 Win on #3 Galloping Giraffe.**

#### GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. - #4 Twilight Eclipse (5-1)

Returning to his optimum distance (2-for-2, including a world-record setting performance in Gulfstream's Gil Pan American S. in March), and, hopefully, a firm course, I'm expecting a huge effort from **Twilight Eclipse**. The West Point colorbearer briefly looked a winner until being swallowed up in the stretch by the very imposing favorite and Belmont lawnmower Boisterous over a good going in the GI Man o' War S. downstate July 13. I'm willing to give him a pass for his GI Manhattan H. flop over the yielding sod June 8, and he should be primed for his best three starts off a layoff. With not much speed signed on other than the Ramsey rabbit, Twilight Eclipse should sit a perfect stalking trip and will be the one to catch when they straighten for home. **Wager: \$50 Win on #4 Twilight Eclipse.**

#### GI Alabama S. - #2 Montana Native (10-1)

It's just about impossible to knock division leader Princess of Sylmar, and the 3-5 morning-line favorite deserves every penny that's wagered on her against this overmatched bunch. That being said, in terms of this contest, playing her to win at that overwhelming price won't really do anybody much good. **Montana Native** is certainly sneaky enough, and seems to be improving at the right time to be a factor here. Her pedigree doesn't exactly scream 10 furlongs--Yes It's True out of a Quiet American mare--but she keeps getting better with added distance and experience. A respectable third behind the talented Close Hatches at Gulfstream back in March, Montana Native has returned from her spring break in top form. A sharp victress over nine rivals in a \$75,000 optional tagger at Churchill June 27, she stretched to nine furlongs in style at the Spa with a runaway, albeit a bit green, tally in the Broom Dance S. July 24. The Ghostzapper Racing colorbearer has been training up a storm for the McPeck barn since, firing a best-of-55 bullet in :48 3/5 over the Oklahoma track Aug. 3. She's speedy, but doesn't need the lead to get the money. Stranger things haven't certainly happened at the Graveyard of Favorites. **Wager: \$20 Win on #2 Montana Native.**

Grade I winner Dayatthespa appeared to lay over this group of solid New York-bred fillies and mares, and the only upset in the race may have been that the chalk didn't win by more. Content to concede her usual spot on the lead to Sally's Dream (Utopia {Jpn}) while kept out in the clear, the accomplished filly took over with little resistance in upper stretch. Wholelottashakin briefly looked like she could make a race of it in the run to the wire, but Dayatthespa shut the door on that foe to win clear. It has been nothing but good days at the Spa for the winner, who won by four lengths on debut here two seasons ago and annexed last year's Riskaverse S. during a five-race winning skein that also included the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland in October. After an eventful outing in Betfair Hollywood Park's GI Matriarch S. in November, the chestnut resurfaced to best state-breds in Belmont's May 5 You Go West Girl S. She was run down by Laughing (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) in Monmouth's GIII Eatontown H. June 29, and was scratched out of the local GI Diana S. July 27, which Laughing won. "It's important; it's only her third start of the year," said trainer Chad Brown of the decision to drop his charge down in class. "She had a lot of problems in the Matriarch last fall, and we weren't even sure if she was going to run again. She came back and ran great in New York-bred company down at Belmont. She got beat down at Monmouth, and I just felt I like I needed to get her back on track and run her in an easier race she could handle. ## Del Mar

### Del Mar to Make Way for New Turf Course:

Following the conclusion of the current race meeting Sept. 4, removal of the existing turf course at Del Mar will begin, making way for the installation of a wider and heartier course. Demolition of the existing surface should take about one month, and track superintendent Leif Dickinson said that, weather permitting, the new grass currently being grown in the Coachella Valley well to the east of Del Mar, could be installed by as early as Jan. 1, 2014. The new course, which will be widened to 80 feet from the present width of 52 to 63 feet (straightaways) and 54-56 feet (turns), is seen as a major step towards securing a Breeders' Cup bid as early as 2015. Widening the course will allow for as many as 14 runners in Breeders' Cup races. According to Dickinson, the widening of the course will allow for uniformity. "That will be the biggest thing," Dickinson said. "Giving uniformity to the course, with a good irrigation system and the ability for multiple rail movement is the number one thing we're doing." Dickinson indicated that one goal of the project is to toughen up the course. "What we want is a thick, dense grass, as tight as possible," he said. "The first line of defense in such a project is to keep the hoof from penetrating the turf." The widening of the course will result in an acreage of 10.5 acres versus the current 7.7 acres. One new feature of the course will be the construction of two pathways across it for easy access to the track's infield, particularly important for the San Diego Fair held each June and July. The pathways, 16 feet wide and 14 inches deep, will be constructed at the seven-eighths pole and the half-mile pole. When racing take place, two turf trays, each eight feet by eight feet and 14 inches deep, will interlock on top of the pathways. A similar construction is used successfully at Sam Houston Park in Texas. The course is expected to be well-rooted and ready for use by the beginning of the 2014 racing season.

**CHRB Clarifies Suspension Policy:**

*Edited Press Release*

Following issuance of the current 30-day suspension of trainer Carla Gaines, it has become apparent there are certain inconsistencies and ambiguities in the way some suspensions have been imposed.

Historically, when a trainer has been suspended, most suspension orders have included language prohibiting them from entering both the public areas of race tracks and the areas in which only state licensees may enter.

In the case of Ms. Gaines' suspension order, as with some others in the past, the prohibition did not include public areas of the race track. In the past suspended trainers have observed that restriction even though it was not spelled out and therefore not required.

California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) Chairman David Israel convened a teleconference August 14 for the purpose of understanding how this inconsistency occurred and how to correct it. Participating in the conference were Chairman Israel, Vice Chairman Chuck Winner, CHRB Counsel Robert Miller, Assistant Executive Director Jacqueline Wagner, Del Mar stewards, and CHRB staff.

As a result of the teleconference, Chairman Israel and Vice Chairman Winner decided to recommend to the full Board that a new policy be developed and adopted regarding suspensions. They will also recommend that all such cases be remanded to the stewards, who will issue the actual orders of suspension and who will consistently include language denying access to all premises in the jurisdiction.

The CHRB will discuss this matter and the recommendations of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman in executive session following the next CHRB meeting on August 22.
