## AND IT'S NO NAY NEVER

America's worst kept secret **No Nay Never** (Scat Daddy) came to Deauville yesterday and rode off with the G1 Darley Prix Morny in what could be a momentous occasion for his country. While Wesley Ward has operated as a ground breaker before at Ascot, the entrepreneur proved it could be done outside of Royal meeting here, as his best-laid plan paid off in style. Sent off the 11-5 second choice as the home crowd put their weight behind **Vorda (Fr)** (Orpen), the G2 Norfolk S. winner soon had control, with David Flores keeping a lid on his

enthusiasm. All behind were in trouble passing the quarter pole and Vorda could only get to within a length at the line. "This is really sweet," Ward said. "This is something we had planned a long time and everything worked out perfectly. He had been doing fantastically in Deauville, and I was just worried about the rain last night and this morning, but it was amazing how quickly it dried out by this afternoon. ## ROMANTICA LIVES UP TO FAMILY NAME

It was surely only a matter of time until **Romantica (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), a granddaughter of Hasili (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}), became the latest Group 1 winner for one of the world's greatest families, and the inevitable became reality when the 4-year-old won Sunday's G1 Darley Prix Jean Romanet at Deauville. Sticking close to pacesetting **Dalkala** (Giant's Causeway) early, the bay traveled strongly and always looked to have every move covered, despite being carried wide by that rival at the top of the stretch. Mastering her passing the quarter pole, she put her seal on the race as **Sarkiyla (Fr)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) stayed on without threatening. For Juddmonte Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe, the result was another chapter in a remarkable success story. "It is very sweet to win a Group 1 with her, and it so happens that it is on the same weekend as her dam winning the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois. She loves good ground and it was perfect for her today. Even though they didn't go fast, she was up there in the right place and quickened well. There are various options now. One is to go to the G1 Prix Vermeille [at Longchamp Sept. 15] and then the G1 Prix de l'Opera [at Longchamp Oct. 6] or head straight to the Opera, so we'll wait and see." **Cont. p4**

## DUBAWI BLUEBLOOD TOPS ARQANA AUGUST

There were no surprises during an upbeat second session of Arqana's August Sale yesterday when figures were up across the board and an immaculately bred filly by the auction's leading sire Dubawi (Ire) from the Coulonces Consignment topped proceedings when selling to James Harron Bloodstock for €1.5 million (**US\$1,999,135**). Through two days of selling in Deauville, 122 yearlings have grossed €25,973,000. The average of €212,893 is up 34.9% from a year ago, while the median rose 28.6% to €135,000. The session-topping lot **163** is a half-sister to the 2010 G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein winner Royal Bench (Ire) (Whipper), and 2011 G1 Irish Derby third Memphis Tennessee (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}), and hails from the high-class family of the top-level performers Honolulu (Ire), L'Ancrese (Ire) and Moonstone (GB). It is a dynasty that continues to thrive, with the latter now responsible for two of Ballydoyle's better young colts in Nevis (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) and Stubbs (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). "She was the pick of the sale," commented the young Irish bloodstock agent Harron, who spent time as assistant to Hubie de Burgh. "I just loved her and she has a great pedigree. I have bought her for a new client, but I cannot say who and it has not been decided where she will be trained." **Cont. p9**

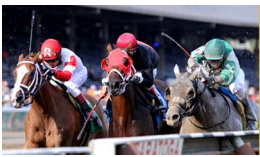

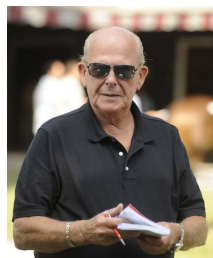

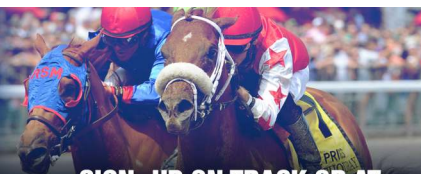

The pick of Wesley Ward's Royal Ascot team after demonstrating his quality with a debut win in a 4 1/2-furlong maiden special weight on Keeneland's Polytrack Apr. 26, No Nay Never broke the track record for juveniles in the Norfolk. If there was anything to fault in that performance, it was a tendency to break tardily, but even that looked to be remedied here as he was one of the quickest out of the gates. There were shades of Fasliyev, another physically dominant juvenile in his year, in this performance as he imposed himself from pillar to post despite the ground having gone against him. "At one point, I thought about scratching him and I walked the course this morning when it was on the soft side, but after discussing it with the Coolmore team I decided to walk it again at 1:30," his trainer explained. "There was a little bit of give in it, but it was okay. After watching him go through the first half of the race, I could see he was getting ahold of the ground. He had the perfect trip and, although we've had success in Europe before, this is really nice.

"I hope this shows American trainers that you can come here and win nice races--when you get beat, it can be expensive--but it can be done and I hope this opens new doors," Ward continued. "I don't think they realized how big the racing is over here. I think once they come over here and have a little success, you'll see a lot more of them." **Cont. p4**

“He will go back on Tuesday and I’ll talk to the Coolmore boys and everyone involved with the horse about where he goes,” Ward added. “It probably takes a little bit of time; last time he was a little tired. But he bounced right back in 10 days.” Ward noted that he has also had a chance to visit the Arqana Yearling Sale while in town, and he purchased [Lot 26](#), a son of Sageburg (Ire), for €50,000 through agent Gatewood Bell.

Flores said, “This is a very special moment in my career. Everyone around here has been fantastic to me and I love the system of racing in Europe. He had a dream trip and is just fantastic--I will savor this moment forever.” The fillies Vorda and Rizeena both made up significant ground late, and their respective trainers were delighted with their performances. Philippe Sogorb trains the former, who was sent off the 7-5 favorite to keep her unbeaten record, and he said, “She has to be ridden from off the pace and I am very proud of her--we were beaten by a better horse on the day. She fought hard and we will probably keep her at six furlongs, and if all is well we will go for the G1 Cheveley Park S. [at Newmarket Sept. 28].” Rizeena’s conditioner Clive Brittain commented, “She was away a shade slowly, but ran on very nicely and I have to be happy.”

Slow coming to hand as many of her relatives are, Romantica built on runner-up finishes in the G3 Prix Chloe over nine furlongs at Chantilly and G3 Prix de Psyche over this track and trip in July to win this venue’s G2 Prix de la Nonette. Unplaced when tried over 12 furlongs in the G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp in September, the bay returned to annexe Chantilly’s G3 Prix Allez France over this trip Apr. 29. A staying filly in the Classic Aga Khan mold, Verema had been campaigned almost exclusively at Longchamp so far, and had two pattern-race successes to her tally at that venue, in last year’s G3 Prix de Lutece over 15 furlongs and the G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil over a panel less when last seen July 13. The homebred had ventured away from the Bois de Boulogne once when taken to Meydan to be third in the G3 Dubai Gold Cup over two miles on her 4-year-old bow Mar. 30. Settled in fourth early by Christophe-Patrice Lemaire off the usual lope that these races result in, the bay had first run on Dance Moves as the sprint began inside the final quarter and she gained the overall advantage with 100 meters to race. Alain de Royer-Dupre commented, “That was a very good performance under a penalty, and she loves that ground. She won with something in hand, and we’ll see where she goes, but the G1 Prix du Cadran [at Longchamp Oct 6] is a possibility.”

Caroline Thomas needed some help from the stewards, but the 11-1 shot earned her first stakes victory Sunday at Saratoga. A homebred for Bonner Young, who also campaigned the filly's Grade I-winning dam Bit of Whimsy, Caroline Thomas had been a victim of her late-running tendencies, finishing fifth in both the Mar. 2 GIII Herecomesthebride S. and May 27 GII Sands Point S. She was a close-up third in the June 16 Bit of Whimsy S. and was coming off a traffic-plagued seventh-place finish in the July 20 My Princess Jess S. The filly trailed the seven-horse field as heavy favorite Tapicat (Tapit) led through :23.68, :48.13 1:12.31 fractions. Tapicat scampered clear in upper stretch, but her advantage was short lived, as rank outsider Nellie Cashman, Caroline Thomas and Watsdachances rallied past. Nellie Cashman, an upset winner of the GIII Virginia Oaks in her latest, just held off Caroline Thomas to hit the line first, but the stewards ruled she came out and impeded Watsdachances and demoted her to third. Caroline Thomas was put up, with Watsdachances moved to second. "She ran a splendid race," trainer Barclay Tagg said of the promoted winner. "Whether we got put up or not, she was only beaten a couple of inches. She ran the race we've been looking for." As for what is next for Caroline Thomas, Tagg added, "We had the [Sept. 14] GI Garden City and the [Oct. 12 GI] Queen Elizabeth II that her mother won at Keeneland in mind all along, but our confidence was wavering a little bit with all the problems she had trying to get going in the races." Javier Castellano, aboard Watsdachances saw his charge lose momentum at a critical juncture. "When Caroline Thomas made that move, my horse took off again," Castellano said. **Cont.p6**

"I had to stop my momentum because the other horse inside, she drifted. I don't blame [jockey Forest Boyce, aboard Nellie Cashman], she did the best she could. But, she hit her right-handed and she never corrected the horse to go by. It cost me the place. I could have won by a neck, who knows? Unfortunately, it went a different way today." Of the beaten favorite, who faded to fifth, trainer Bill Mott said, "Our test was to see if she'd get nine furlongs, and it looks like we'd better stick with races around a mile." After a runner-up hiccup in the GII Suburban H. in his latest July 6, Last Gunfighter got back to winning ways here and has now taken seven of his last eight races. The streak started with a Belmont maiden win last October, continue through victories in the Raymond Earl S. and Evening Attire S. at Aqueduct over the winter, and was highlighted by a pair of Grade III wins, in the Excelsior S. at the Big A Mar. 23 and in the Pimlico Special S. "I was told in the paddock that he's a grinder, which played a big part in how I rode him," said winning jockey Joe Bravo, who teamed with trainer Chad Brown to win Saturday's GI Sword Dancer at Saratoga with Big Blue Kitten (Kitten's Joy). "With that information I knew I wasn't going to get that one quick punch, so I wound up moving at the 3/8ths pole. He has a big powerful stride and he just kept coming and coming all the way to the wire."

The heavy favorite, third in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, closed 2012 with a narrow neck loss when second in the GI La Brea S. In her only previous start this term, she defeated Executiveprivilege (First Samurai) by 5 1/4 lengths to take an allowance over this track July 18. Sweet Marini outbroke Reneesgotzip and was in front in the early strides, but the favorite spurted up to assume control. She tugged her way through fractions of :22.43 and :44.46 while opening up three lengths on the chasing Sweet Marini. Asked for more by Garrett Gomez in upper stretch, Reneesgotzip poured it on down the lane, completing the six furlongs in 1:08.18 and sailing under the wire much the best in 1:14.48. "She's very, very fast and that's her main weapon," said Gomez. "But she's got another dimension to her. She doesn't have to be on the lead, but when she's running like she did today you really don't want to do anything else with her. She's a nice one, no doubt. And you love to ride horses like her." Winning trainer Peter Miller added, "You never want to be overconfident, but if you like the way they're doing and you know they love this racetrack...and it was a good setup. There didn't look like there was any speed that could run with her. What can I say? She's just the fastest thing on four legs."

Up With the Birds lived up to his prohibitive odds to give Sam-Son Farm a remarkable sixth win in this race. The homebred colt won the nine-furlong Coronation Futurity S. by 3 1/2 lengths at Woodbine last November, and kicked off 2013 with a closing victory in the Black Gold S. at Fair Grounds Mar. 2--his first start on grass. Second in the GIII Transylvania S. at Keeneland Apr. 5, he returned to Woodbine--and the main track--to romp in the Marine S. May 26. Bettors sent him off the choice in the first leg of Canada's Triple Crown, the July 7 Queen's Plate, and after trailing the field early off tepid fractions, found only Midnight Aria (Midnight Lute) too good. Connections bypassed the Triple Crown's second leg, the Prince of Wales S., to focus on the series finale, and the plan worked to perfection. Up With the Birds and jockey Eurico da Silva raced under cover in the opening stages before taking closer order on the backstretch. They moved to the lead in upper stretch--a move that looked premature when Riven Seven rallied to perhaps put a nose in front at the furlong grounds--but Up With the Birds turned back that challenge and drew off to a clear-cut success. "He was very aggressive," da Silva said. He wanted to be there.

"I think he knew he lost last time, so he said, 'This time, Eurico, I do the job.' When he took the lead, it was hard for another horse to catch him, because he wants to take off. He's all heart." Added trainer Malcolm Pierce, "We always try to freshen our horses and give them lots of time between races. There would have been more pressure if he had won the Queen's Plate to try for the Triple Crown. But after getting beat in the Plate, it was an easy decision to wait for this race."

### What a Gal...

For much of the day, Ecurie des Monceaux's daughter of Galileo (Ire) and Alpine Rose (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) had topped the sheets at €1 million. Last year, her Sea the Stars (Ire) offering made €1.2 million at this sale, and her March-foaled grey offering drew similar attention before MV Magnier saw off all comers to prevail for Lot [99](#). Alpine Rose sealed her reputation on the track when capturing the 2009 G1 Prix Jean Romanet at the local venue, and has become a star mare for

Henri Bozo. "She is a lovely looking filly with a great temperament, and of course we are very happy with her sale," the leading vendor said. "It makes sense that a rare product with such a pedigree out of a young mare is worth that price."

### A Pair For Pascal...

Leading trainer Pascal Bary was busy buying for owner Jean-Michel Hegesippe, whose highly regarded 3-year-old Spiritjim (Fr) (Galileo {Ire}) is two-for-three this term. Early in the session, he signed the docket at €400,000 for Lot [101](#), another from the Monceaux draft by Teofilo (Ire). Out of the listed-placed Alsace (GB) (King's Best), he hails from the extended family of Bary's former Group 1-winning sire Zambezi Sun (GB) (Dansili {GB}). "I really liked him and had to spend a bit to get him, but I know the pedigree well and he is very nice," he commented. Later, the Chantilly-based conditioner was back for one of the session's most well-connected colts by Galileo. From Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu, Lot [132](#) is a three-parts brother to the Montjeu (Ire) pair of Group 1 winners Corre Caminos (Fr) and Recital (Fr), the latter of which cost €750,000 in 2009. This May-foaled bay, whose full-brother had sold for €520,000 12 months ago, is also a half to the multiple group winner Racer (Fr) (Spectrum {Ire}) and he was secured for half a million. "This is a real surprise, as Mr. Hegesippe thought he had finished after buying the Teofilo, but he loved him and came back to try," Bary said. "We thought he would bring much more, so we are delighted to have him and hope he is as good as his siblings." The consignor Aliette Forien added, "We are delighted. The mare is very good and has produced some nice horses and this one stands alongside them all."

### YES!...

Now famed as the buyer of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf and this year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine Flotilla (Fr) (Mizzen Mast), agent Thierry Delegue of YES was back representing that star's owner Sheikh Mohammed Al Thani, and paid €420,000 for Lot [111](#), a Dubawi granddaughter of the high-class racer and producer Hydro Calido (Nureyev). Related to a host of luminaries including Bago (Fr) and Machiavellian, she has major residual value. "We were very keen to buy the Dubawi [hip 49] yesterday, but lost out and that may have been a blessing in disguise, as personally I liked this filly better," Delegue said. "She is very nice-looking and is from a top-class family, and Sheikh Al Thani has it in mind to breed from her later on. She will stay in training in France."

Notwithstanding her illustrious sibling, the March-foaled bay hails from the family of this year's G1 Diamond Jubilee S. and G1 July Cup victor Lethal Force (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}).

**More Dubawi Gold...**

The second session began with a flurry of activity set off by John Ferguson's €360,000 purchase of another by the dominant sire Dubawi from Haras du Mezeray. Lot [98](#) is a half-brother to Germany's prolific miler Alianthus (Ger) (Hernando {Fr}), who was successful no less than eight times in pattern company. He also signed for another with German bloodlines in Lot [148](#), Ballylinch Stud's Iffraaj (GB) half-sister to two group winners in Flambo (Ger) (Platini {Ger}) and Fight Club (Ger) (Lavrco {Ger}), who cost €300,000.

**Lightning Strikes Twice?...**

Nicolas Clement bought his G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero Style Vendome (Fr) (Anabaa) for €92,000 for Count Andre de Ganay and Christian-Bernard Baillet here in 2011, and he was buying for that combination again yesterday. Lot [157](#) is a Dalakhani (Ire) grandson of the Group 1 winner Sulk (GB) (Selkirk), whose pedigree was boosted on Saturday by the Beverly D.-winning exploits of Dank (GB) (Dansili {GB}). "I had some luck for the owners with Style Vendome, and I'm hoping I can repeat the dose," Clement said after prevailing at €310,000. "He is lovely and is from a good family."

€1.5 million to James Harron on the second day of the Arqana August Sale. The Australian-based agent was acting on behalf of an unnamed "new private investor," and had to see off a determined underbidder in Nicolas de Watrigant.

The sale of the half-sister to group winners Royal Bench (Ire) (Whipper) and Memphis Tennessee (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}) sparked a memorable day for vendors Anna and Etienne Drion of Coulonces Consignment, who were mobbed by well-wishers as they left the ring--Anna and her mother, Maya Sundstrom of Team Hogdala, both with tears in their eyes.

"I don't know what to say, I'm speechless," said Swedish-born Anna as she was hugged by friends and colleagues. Her husband was a little more effusive, however, saying, "That's the first time we've topped a sale and the first horse we've sold ever to make more than a million. Damn it feels good!"

The Drions have been operating as Coulonces Consignment for five years from their converted sheep farm in Normandy called Haras de Grand Chene. They took their trading name from Haras de Coulonces, which is owned by Anna's parents Maya and Jan Sundstrom, who, with Anna, bred the 2009 Prix du Jockey-Club winner Le Havre (Ire) (Noverre), now a promising first-season sire in France. The Sundstroms, who arrived in France in 2004, enjoyed a good sales result of their own through their daughter and son-in-law's Coulonces Consignment when selling a Nayef filly out of Fresh Laurels (Ire) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}) for €140,000.

"We've been knocking on the door for a while-- €850,000 is the nearest we've come before this," added Etienne. "We were pretty confident that this horse would sell well but you never really know."

Out of the unraced Cozzene mare Hit The Sky, a daughter of Group 1 winner Cerulean Sky (Ire) (Darshaan {Ire}), the yearling filly, offered on behalf of the Hit The Sky Partnership, hails from a family that has brought plenty of success in the past to Kilfrush Stud in Ireland, and which includes Irish Oaks winner Moonstone (Ire).

The County Limerick farm was recently sold to Qatari owner Mubarak Al Naemi.

The transaction boosted further a great sale for Dubawi, who was responsible for one of the joint-top lots of the first session, a colt out of Mise (Ire) who sold for €1 million to Peter and Ross Doyle. The Darley

stallion is the leading sire at Arqana with eight lots sold for an average of €579,375, holding off Oasis Dream (GB), whose two lots have averaged €510,000 and Galileo (Ire), who has had 10 yearlings through the ring for an average of €461,000. Those figures go some way to telling the story of what Arqana representative Freddy Powell labeled "an unbelievable sale." Strong is hardly the word for it, as another 37 horses from the second session sold for six-figure sums in addition to the two for €1 million or more. The average for the first two days sits at €212,192, an improvement of 34% on the figure for last year, with a total of €25,463,000 having been paid for 120 yearlings.

### **Another Grey Day in Deauville...**

This time last year it was a Sea The Stars (Ire) colt out of Alpine Rose (Fr) who took top billing at Arqana and 12 months on, that colt's three-parts-sister led the way during the early exchanges of the second session when becoming the third yearling in two days to sell for €1 million.

When there's a Galileo yearling on offer, it's not unusual to find the Coolmore team taking an interest, and this time around the Ecurie des Monceaux-consigned filly, who is grey like her mother and damsire Linamix (Fr), was knocked down to MV Magnier. It goes without saying that a Galileo yearling will own a pretty top-drawer pedigree. Alpine Rose only four years ago won the G1 Prix Jean Romanet--the 2013 renewal of which was staged just a couple of hours before the second day of the sale commenced-- and in her short time at stud she has made quite a name for herself. Last year's sales topper, who made €1.2 million, was her first foal and now her second has also changed hands for a seven-figure sum.

Bred by the Aga Khan, Alpine Rose's two group victories both came after Ecurie des Monceaux gave €550,000 for her as a 3-year-old at the Arqana December Sale of 2008.

Monceaux dominated last year's August Sale when selling 24 yearlings for a total of €5,394,000, including the three most expensive lots, and it's a similar tale this time around. At the end of day two, the consignment had raised €5,040,000 from 17 yearlings sold, including the first session's joint-topper, the Galileo three-parts sister to Irish Oaks winner Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}).

"The turnover at the sale has been strong and we knew we had a nice draft," said Henri Bozo, who manages Ecurie des Monceaux for Lucien Urano. "We were quite confident but with good reason. When it comes to the offspring of Alpine Rose, there are so few Group 1-winning mares in the hands of commercial breeders, and to offer a daughter of Galileo with a pedigree like that you would hope to get a good sale. We're very pleased."

### **First-Season Sires...**

Four of the six first-crop yearlings offered so far in the sale by 2,000 Guineas winner Makfi (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) have sold for an average of €168,750, the most expensive among them being the half-sister to multiple Group 1 winner Moonlight Cloud (Ire), who fetched €360,000 when knocked down to Oceanic Bloodstock. Coolmore's Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) is another freshman with representatives at the sale. His three to have sold have set an average of €158,667.

### **Botti Benefit...**

There have only been two runnings of the American St Leger on the Arlington Million card, but they've both been won by horses trained by Marco Botti in Newmarket. Marco's wife Lucie was overseeing the stable's runners in Chicago while the trainer was viewing yearlings in Deauville, and Dandino's victory was a well-timed birthday present for the Czech-born former jockey. **Cont. p12**

**Palace Malice, Verrazano Work Toward Travers**

Trainer Todd Pletcher sent out his star sophomores **Palace Malice** (Curlin) and **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) ([video](#)) to their final serious works in advance of Saturday's GI Travers S. at Saratoga. The former, who is coming off wins in the GI Belmont S. and GI Jim Dandy S., breezed four panels in :48.21 under exercise rider Jake Nelson. It was the 17th fastest of 70 half-mile works on the main track Sunday. Just a few moments later, Verrazano, who is exiting an exciting victory in the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth July 28, breezed the same distance in company in :48.65, the 25th fastest on the day. He worked with stablemate Capo Bastone (Street Boss) with regular rider John Velazquez in the irons. "Palace Malice is feeling good," Pletcher said of the Dogwood Stable colorbearer. "He's feeling great, actually, so we were happy to get him on the track. He seems to be thriving. The more he does, the better he gets. With both horses, it's rare that you go through these Triple Crown prep series, run in the Derby--and in Palace Malice's case, the Belmont--and seem to get bigger and stronger and better as you're doing it. I think the key to the really good ones is they're able to withstand those types of campaigns and flourish while doing it." Verrazano, owned by the partnership of Let's Go Stable, Mrs. John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, "Always goes in company," said Pletcher. "He's a little different personality than the other horse. I thought he went very well. His gallop-out was very good. We kind of flip-flopped their gallop-outs from last week. Palace Malice last week was a little bit stronger, so we wanted to do a little more on the day with Verrazano. We got what we were looking for." There are still questions about Verrazano's ability to handle the 10 furlongs of the Travers--he was well beaten in the GI Kentucky Derby at that distance--but Pletcher is confident after the colt's Haskell win that he'll have no problems. "With the way the racetrack came up that day in the Haskell, I think any horse that could handle a mile and an eighth and finish up as strongly as he did that day can handle a mile and a quarter at Saratoga," said Pletcher. "That was a very deep, demanding track that day. I think a mile and a quarter shouldn't be an issue." Velazquez will ride Verrazano in the Travers. Mike Smith will be aboard Palace Malice.

# RACETRACK ROUND-UP

## BYRAMA ON TRACK FOR PACIFIC CLASSIC

Eclipse Thoroughbreds' **Byrama (GB)** (Byron {GB}), under consideration for Sunday's GI TVG Pacific Classic, worked five furlongs in :59.60 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:12.80 at Del Mar yesterday. Eclipse's Aron Wellman called the drill "textbook" and added, "She's gotten so professional, so relaxed. She galloped out strong, she really seems to enjoy this track and went really smoothly over it." Byrama, winner of this year's GI Vanity H., is coming off a third-place effort in the Aug. 3 GI Clement L. Hirsch S. She would become just the fourth filly to start in the Pacific Classic. "We're preparing to run," Wellman said. "We'll keep a close eye on her the next couple days. She's such a tough filly and we know her so well that she'll tell us what to do. If there's any [negative] indication, we'll do something else. But right now, she's clicking on all cylinders."

Also prepping for the Pacific Classic, **Kettle Corn** (Candy Ride {Arg}) went seven furlongs in 1:26.40 Sunday at Del Mar. "A very nice work, everything's go," trainer John Sadler said. Kettle Corn is coming off a win in the July 27 GII San Diego H.

Defending Pacific Classic hero **Dullahan** (Even the Score) worked five furlongs at Churchill Downs Sunday in :59.80. He is expected to ship to California today.

## Pletcher Will be Patient with the 'Princess'...

Trainer Todd Pletcher said he'll take some time before charting a course for Saturday's GI Alabama S. heroine **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior), but he said the GI Cotillion H. for 3-year-old fillies at Parx Sept. 21 or the GI Beldame Invitational for fillies and mares at Belmont Park Sept. 28 were possibilities. "We just need to see how she comes back, how she trains, how her weight is, her disposition, attitude, and all the other things you evaluate horses with," said Pletcher. "She's run two very powerful races in four weeks' time." Princess of Sylmar won the GI Kentucky Oaks in May and came back to win the GI CCA Oaks at Saratoga July 20 before her Alabama score. "If we don't go in the Cotillion and she runs again, then the Beldame would be the next possibility," said Pletcher. "I don't think we're under any time crunch. We can give her a normal three days off and go back to the track, and play it by ear over the next couple of weeks." Pletcher said Ed Stanco, who bred the filly and campaigns her under the King of Prussia Stable banner, intends to race Princess of Sylmar as a 4-year-old, and maybe even as a 5-year-old. "There are plenty of reasons to stop on a lot of these [horses] as you go along, so you hate to stop on one when there's not a reason to," said Pletcher. "At the same time, she's been running all year and there are a lot of races next year, and even possibly as a 5-year-old, so you don't want to get greedy. That's what we'll have to evaluate."

## Cross Traffic Sparkles in Return to Worktab...

Working for the first time since taking the GI Whitney Invitational H. Aug. 3, Goldmark Farm's **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song) blazed four furlongs in :47.83 in company with **Forty Tales** (Tale of the Cat) over Saratoga's main track yesterday. The 4-year-old could start next in the nine-furlong GI Woodward Aug. 31. "He's been showing us pretty good energy here since the Whitney," Pletcher said. "I actually feel like he's training better coming out of it than he was going into it, so we're trying to make sure the Woodward is the right spot. Certainly, the way he worked this morning indicated that he's coming out of the Whitney in good shape." If Pletcher opts to bypass the Woodward, the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Sept. 28 would be the gray's next likely target. "That's the decision we have to make, whether to run back here or in the Jockey Club," Pletcher said. "Based on what we're seeing, it would be pretty hard not to run him back." The ultimate goal for Cross Traffic is the \$5-million GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Nov. 2.

Forty Tales, meanwhile, is on track for Saturday's GI Foxwoods King's Bishop S. The late-running colt has won his last three, including the GIII Derby Trial S. at Churchill, the GII Woody Stephens S. at Belmont and the GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga. "It was an exceptional work for Forty Tales, who's not, generally, a very good work horse," Pletcher said. "Today, I thought he was really good."

Pletcher also worked 2012 juvenile champion **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday) in company with **Graydar** (Unbridled's Song), winner this year of the GI Donn H., who hasn't been out since taking the GII New Orleans H. in March. Both horses were registering their fourth works off vacations, and both recorded four-furlong drills in :49.02 on the main track. Shanghai Bobby hasn't raced since the GI Besilu Stables Florida Derby at Gulfstream Mar. 30. "Both were in a similar situation in terms of fitness level, so I thought it worked out really well," Pletcher said.

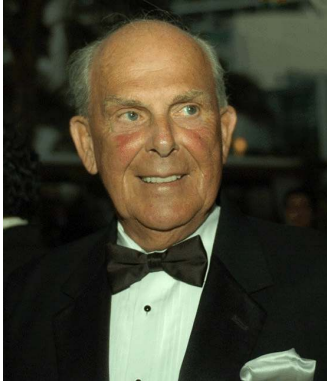

## OBITUARIES

### ONE IN A MILLION *by Christina Bossinakis*

The sport lost one of its most respected and recognizable figures yesterday when Buzz Chace, who has been a fixture on the racing scene for the better part of the last half century, passed away after losing his battle with cancer. He was 72. Funeral arrangements are pending. Chace is well known for having purchased a bevy of top-class performers, most notably Unbridled's Song (Unbridled), who annexed the 1995 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile en route to a 2-year-old championship before adding victories in the GI Wood Memorial and GI Florida Derby at three.

Chace also is recognized as having advised on the purchase of Grade I winners Dream Rush (Wild Rush), Lear's Princess (Lear Fan), Forest Danger (Forestry), Flashy Bull (Holy Bull), Irish Smoke (Smoke Glacken), Macho Again (Macho Uno) and Awesome Gem (Awesome Again), in addition to GSWs Master Command (A.P. Indy), Value Plus (Unbridled's Song), Half Ours (Unbridled's Song), and Freedom Child (Malibu Moon), runaway victor of the May 11 GII Peter Pan S. at Belmont.

"We had a great run together with the Jones family, and Buzz did a great job selecting those horses," said trainer Todd Pletcher, who met Chace in 1989 while working for trainer D. Wayne Lukas. Chace, who served as racing manager for Aaron and Marie Jones through much of the last decade, advised on several top-flight runners which filled the Pletcher roster, including Forest Danger, Master Command, Value Plus and Half Ours. "You couldn't say that Buzz bought a certain type of horse," said Pletcher. "I think he had a pretty simple approach to it. As simple as it sounds, he would just look for runners. His approach was almost genius in that it was so simple. Sometimes, people try to overthink it when they're looking at horses, but his approach was from the horseman's standpoint of simply trying to find a good athlete."

### *Humble Beginnings...*

The Thoroughbred horse racing business is chock full of horsemen and women who got their start in the industry through family involvement and connections. Baden P. 'Buzz' Chace took a more unlikely route. His father, Howard, died when his son was just eight and his mother, Lilian, supported her six children by working in a local textile mill. After abandoning his high school studies, Chace received his early instruction in the equine world at a riding academy named Gage Hill Stables near his childhood home in Fall River, Massachusetts, where Chace spent much of his time mucking stalls, riding horses, and giving riding lessons.

During one of those lessons, a young student brought a girlfriend of hers to the barn, Mary Lou, whom Chace ended up marrying in 1962. The couple had two sons, Baden III 'Buzz' and Mark.

During those formative years at Gage Hill, Chace also spent a lot of time helping out at horse sales from New Hampshire to Massachusetts and soon landed himself a job at Muriel Vanderbilt Adam's Sandy Point Farm in Newport, Rhode Island, where he was deeply immersed in all phases of the game, including preparing yearlings for sales, galloping horses and working stallions.

At the age of 20, Chace moved to the racetrack, assisting Adam's trainer Joe O'Shea, and it was there that he met Dr. Ed Devine, a Thoroughbred veterinarian, who treated horses for many of the biggest names in racing, including George Widener and Walter Jeffords.

"I had my hands on more good horses in one day than most people have had in a lifetime," Chace told the *TDN* in 2008. Chace soon signed up as Devine's assistant, and a multitude of daily tasks at some of the most notable horse farms in the region, including William duPont's Bellevue Training Center near Wilmington, Delaware. Chace worked for Devine for nine years, during which time he learned how to float teeth. Armed with that knowledge, Chace worked as a racetrack dentist along the New Jersey circuit, including Garden State, Monmouth Park, and Atlantic City Racecourse, before trying his hand at the training game, while still buying a few horses here and there along the way.

### *Off and Running...*

In 1993, trainer Jim Ryerson approached Chace about buying a horse for Leonard Pivnick and Chace wasted no time finding one at the OBS 2-year-old sale in Florida. Going much higher than originally anticipated, Pivnick dished out \$105,000 for a strapping son of Meadowlake. Named Meadow Flight, the colt went on to take the GII Pennsylvania Derby, GIII Flamingo S., Long Branch S. and was runner-up in the GI Haskell Invitational H. during the 1994 season.

"Without a doubt, Buzz had a very good eye for a horse," said Ryerson. "I saw how he had picked out some good horses for some trainers, about 15-20 years ago, so when the opportunity came up to buy some horses for Mr. Pivnick, [Chace] found Meadow Flight for him. That was the first big horse we had together."

Meadow Flight, who was Chace's first graded stakes winner purchased from a 2-year-old in training sale, was instrumental in bringing together Chace and Ernie Paragallo, a New York investment banker and software executive. That partnership yielded several winners, most notably Unbridled's Song, who was purchased for \$200,000 at the 1994 Fasig-Tipton August sale and went on to take the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Wood Memorial before becoming a top Kentucky stallion.

"So we went through a lot together with the campaigns of those two horses," offered Ryerson. "Of course, Unbridled's Song changed both of our lives. We had a great run together."

In a cosmic act of fate, Chace's most famous protege, Unbridled's Song—who stood 17 seasons at Taylor Made Stallions, died at the age of 20 only weeks ahead of the horseman.

"Everyone was talking about Unbridled's Song being the best horse to ever go to a 2-year-old sale," recalled Mark Taylor of Taylor Made, which also sold the horse on behalf of Paragallo and Chace. "[Unbridled's Song] had an entourage of followers each morning going to train. From there on, [well-known consignor] Bob Scanlon and Buzz became two of the best-known people in the game. They were both real horseman who came up the old school way. A lot of agents today have different backgrounds. Buzz had done every job on the racetrack from hot walker to horse dentist to trainer and jock agent. He really had a sixth sense about picking runners."

### **Golden Eye...**

During his time as a bloodstock agent, Chace purchased horses on behalf of some of the most recognizable names in the game, including Lewis Lakin, Raymond Dweck, Frank Maloney, Charles and Marianne Hesse, Aaron and Marie Jones, Peter Walski and Barry Schwartz. One of his biggest clients over the years was West Point Thoroughbreds, a partnership that lasted over 17 years. Through that profitable run, West Point's Terry Finley became very well acquainted with Chace, especially the agent's ability to spot young talent.

"It wasn't as if you could point to one type of horse that he would pick out," explained Finley. "He liked a certain type of horse, but sometimes you would just see a horse that wouldn't fit the mold that he would be attracted to and it would turn out to be a runner. They came in all shapes and sizes."

And the seeds that Chace planted for West Point in the past continue to bear fruit for the operation to this day.

"The last horse we bought together was Freedom Child," confirmed Finley. "Ironically, one of the last 2-year-olds that we bought together [Rock Me Baby, by Rock Hard Ten] won at Del Mar [a \$100,000 allowance Saturday night]."

Some of the stalwarts that Chace purchased on behalf of West Point were Grade I winners Lear's Princess (\$110,000 OBSMAR 2yo purchase; resold for \$2.7 million at FTKNOV in 2008), Flashy Bull (\$205,000 OBSFEB), Awesome Gem (\$150,000 BESMAR 2yo), Irish Smoke (Smoke Glacken) (\$285,000 OBSMAR 2yo; resold for \$750,000 at FTKNOV in 2007), Dream Rush (\$285,000 OBSFEB 2yo; resold for \$3.3 million in 2007) and Macho Again (\$150,000 OBSFEB 2yo).

"It's easier to go to the sales and spend a lot of money, but he wasn't in the position to do that on a regular basis," said Finley. "He generally had to buy the horses that were the middle of the road or the diamonds in the rough. When a horse grabbed him, it grabbed him. But that was part of the magic of Buzz Chace, that you couldn't really pin him down to any certain type of horse. But without a doubt, the one thing you could pin him down to was that of a master."

Finley, recalling one of Chace's favorite sayings, "Buzz would often say 'It's the hunt not the kill.' He was a great hunter. And all of us were lucky to have him in our lives. Thank you for everything, Buzz."

### **Master's Legacy...**

When previously asked what he thought might have contributed to his success in identifying untapped potential, Chace conceded that much of the rewards stemmed from having the support from those who are at the very foundation of the game, owners.

"The people I work for make me lucky," said Chace. "When you work for good people, that helps a lot. They would leave me alone and let me do my thing. Not every horse works out, but I know the ones I buy have a chance."

Whether it was a horse that brought over \$1 million or purchased for a bargain basement sum, Chace routinely unearthed useful horses and top-class performers for those who backed him.

"We're all looking for the same thing--the horse that can run, really run," said Chace. "They can come from anywhere. I've never seen a perfect horse in my life. Some are just more imperfect than others."

While quiet and understated, Chace was among the most widely known figures in racing and breeding circles. And for good reason.

"Buzz was an old school horseman and spent the majority of his life working in about every capacity around horses before he actually started spending people's money on them. That's why he was so good. He had deep experience in almost every aspect of horsemanship.

### **Trainer Todd Pletcher**

"He had a terrific demeanor about him. He was very low key and had a quiet approach to everything, but you could tell he was always watching and learning and taking things in. He was just a terrific person."

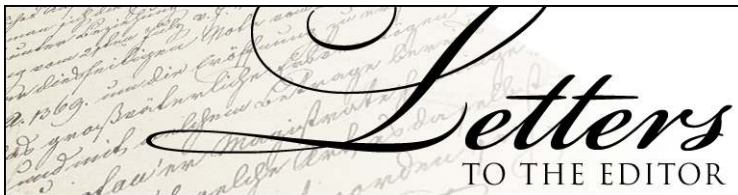
### **Trainer Jim Ryerson**

"I've known Buzz for over 35 years, close to 40 years. He and Mary Lou came to our wedding. I'll always remember Buzz in that he had confidence that we could have some luck together. We worked very well together and our families enjoyed each other's company. We had very good times together. It's a sad day."

### **West Point Thoroughbred's Terry Finley**

"Buzz Chace--such a beautiful man. What I liked best about him was that he was nice to everybody. He was almost nicer to the smaller owners than he might be to the big-time owners. I would like to think that would be one of his lasting legacies. Sometimes in the horse business, people get a little too big for the britches, but not Buzz. He was good to everybody."

"I never saw him disrespectful to a single person. But the only thing he couldn't tolerate was if somebody brought him some coffee that wasn't fresh [laughing]. If the coffee was older than five minutes, he would make them go and make another pot. He liked his coffee fresh."
