

WAR-MONGER

Having his fifth start at the top level in just over two months in yesterday's G1 Juddmonte International, the success of Joseph Allen and Coolmore's **Declaration of War** (War Front) proved that a class act can thrive on a busy campaign, just as former Ballydoyle heavyweights Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) and Giant's Causeway had before him. Sent off at 7-1 returning only 10 days after his strong-closing fourth in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois over Deauville's straight mile, the sturdily built bay tanked in the slipstream of **Trading Leather (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) and tracked **Al Kazeem (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) as that rival drew first blood approaching the quarter pole. Sent by that 11-8 favorite by Joseph O'Brien soon after, he hit the line

with 1 1/4 lengths to spare over the rallying long-time leader as Al Kazeem finally capitulated his superiority by fading into third. **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) proved a major disappointment and trailed in a distant last. "He's an amazing horse with an unbelievable constitution, and very much like Giant's Causeway, in that he's a big powerful strong traveler," Aidan O'Brien commented after celebrating a fourth renewal of this prestigious prize. "We've never had one like him--every day in his work he has been getting better and racing is improving him. Physically, he looks like a horse getting ready to have his first run." **Cont. p3**

TRAVERS ATTRACTS NINE

A field of nine 3-year-olds was drawn in the Saratoga paddock Wednesday for Saturday's \$1-million GI Travers S. Todd Pletcher's two-pronged charge of **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) and **Palace Malice** (Curlin) will break from posts three and eight, respectively, and are the 2-1 and 5-2 top two choices on Eric Donovan's morning line. Pletcher acknowledged that Dogwood Stable's GI Belmont S. and GII Jim Dandy S. hero Palace Malice likely drew better of his two runners, as he will be placed outside of expected pacesetter **Moreno** (Ghostzapper), who is in stall six. "I think, ideally, you'd like to be outside of Moreno, who you think will be the most likely pacesetter," offered the Spa's leading trainer. "Sometimes you worry about post positions and the race doesn't unfold the way you think it will." Of Let's Go Stables and Coolmore's colorbearer Verrazano, a 9 3/4-length winner of the GI Haskell Invitational last out July 28, Pletcher said, "I was kind of hoping he'd draw outside of Moreno, but he's a tactical horse that can put himself in a good position, and, obviously, Johnny [Velazquez] knows him well. We'll see how the race unfolds going into the first turn." **Cont. p5**

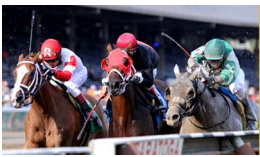

Declaration of War draws clear

France to this major stage has been carefully orchestrated by two of Europe's most talented trainers. The imposing colt, who started out at Pornichet-la-Baule in the winter of 2011, demonstrated stamina as well as his natural speed when capturing his first black-type contest in the G3 Diamond S. over slightly further than this trip on Dundalk's Polytrack last October. Heading to the G1 Lockinge S. on the back of a win in Leopardstown's Listed Heritage S. over a mile Apr. 14 and some stellar work at home, he flopped as the 5-4 favorite for that May 18 Newbury highlight, but rebounded a month later to restore the buzz when capturing the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. Subsequent defeats in the July 6 G1 Eclipse S., July 31 G1 Sussex S. at Glorious Goodwood and Prix Jacques le Marois saw him pigeonholed as reliable and consistent and even exposed by many, but at Sandown and Deauville he was finishing off strongly, and at Goodwood the rain-softened ground was against him. Made the stable's choice in front of Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Ruler of the World (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), he was placed more prominently here as Kevin Manning set a series of testing fractions on the Bolger homebred. James Doyle was asking Al Kazeem for his effort in early stretch and the response was less immediate than in his recent efforts, with his lead gained at the quarter pole never more than a tenuous one. Declaration of War was finding his surge while his Irish co-hort Trading Leather dug into his considerable reserves down on the rail as the favorite wilted in between, but it was the Rosegreen runner who had the most to give when the hurt was applied. "He ran a massive race and I'm not sure it was as much of a surprise to us as it was for most people," Joseph O'Brien commented. "He's run consistently all year and coming here, I thought I'd be closer to Al Kazeem--whether he beat him or not was a different story. They went a nice, even gallop all the way--there was no hiding place and the track suited him lovely. Al Kazeem got two lengths on me, but when he got going it was all over and he toughed it out to the line. A mile or mile and a quarter are fine as long as the ground is good and quick, and you could run him every second day and he'd give his best. He was a very green horse at the start of the year and the Lockinge is his only disappointment; we never knew why the ground was a bit false and we put it down to stage fright. He has redeemed himself since." **Cont. p4**

Aidan O'Brien was pondering the 4-year-old's future afterwards. "Ten furlongs is as far as wants to go, but I'd be happy to run over any trip from six furlongs to 10 as long as the ground is fast because he's a great traveler and soft blunts that," O'Brien said. "We'll see what the boys want to do, but he won't mind going to the G1 Irish Champion S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 7] and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic is one you always dream about. I cannot tell you the constitution he has-- wherever the action has been, he's been there, not lost a kilo and come out with a smile on his face every morning. It's important to mind a horse like that--his foals will be monsters, as that's his natural physique." Jim Bolger revealed that the runner-up would re-oppose at Leopardstown. "It was an excellent run and he'll now go to Leopardstown for the Irish Champion S.," he told *PA Sport*. "He'll appreciate the uphill finish." Trainer Roger Charlton was blaming the ground for Al Kazeem's first reversal of the year. "James [Doyle] never felt happy at any stage," he told *PA Sport*. "He wanted to press Trading Leather more and he couldn't do it. He's had three runs on firm ground and he was looking after himself, I think. You hope you can get away with it, but if you keep running a horse on firm ground when he prefers it softer, that's what happens. Whether he goes for the Irish Champion S. or whatever, we'll just see how he comes back."

For connections of Toronado, it was the second time this season that they were left scratching their heads after the mercurial performer put in a dismal effort. "It wouldn't have made a difference if it was over six furlongs, seven or a mile," Richard Hannon, Jr. told *PA Sport*. "It's very disappointing. We'll go through him at home and at least there are two months until the big mile races. It's just a shame we didn't see what he could do at this trip."

Verrazano and Palace Malice have very similar pace-pressing styles. "Ideally, they're horses that want to stalk an honest pace," Pletcher said. "I think we should get an honest pace in here, and they're both going to be laying just off the main speed."

Stuart Janney III and Phipps Stable's GI Kentucky Derby victor **Orb** (Malibu Moon) has been firing bullets down at Fair Hill since a third-place run behind Palace Malice in the June 8 GI Belmont S., and conditioner Shug McGaughey expressed mild concern with his charge's number two post position.

"I'm going to sound a little bit like Todd," the Hall of Famer said yesterday. "If I'd have had the six or seven or eight [post], I probably would have been a little bit more happy than the two, but we've got a long way to go. We can save some ground and, hopefully, there will be a pace where we can get out when the time comes."

Orb is the 4-1 third choice on the morning line.

Two-time Travers-winning trainer D. Wayne Lukas will saddle Jim Dandy runner-up **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) for Willis Horton in the 'Midsummer Derby.' Lukas was pleased with post five for sentimental reasons, but ultimately didn't think the draw would affect the outcome.

"[It's] my favorite number, [but] I think it is [meaningless]," Lukas offered. We are going a mile and a quarter here. We've got a little ways to go. I think it's going to be spread out a little bit. I don't think everybody is going to be bunched up going into the first turn. It will mean a little bit on the break and it will mean a little bit on who's in the back and who's doing what, and what they are thinking about as they try to get position. It gives us something to talk about, but it's not that big of a deal."

Made the subject of the irresistible spring chatter more for his exploits on the Newmarket gallops than the substance of his Newmarket maiden win in September, ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Telescope missed the Dante and then flopped in a public pre-Derby workout at Lingfield, coming back with a touch of sore shins. While that episode of ill fortune took his Classic chance away, it also

added further mystique to his aura and, when he did finally re-appear, a scarcely-credible 24-length conditions score at Leicester July 18 only served to add fuel to the fire.

Taking on the older horses in the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. over an extended 10-furlong trip at Haydock just 11 days ago, the handsome bay went down by a length to the battle-hardened David Livingston (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), and duly flattened the huge anticipation. While he lost some of his 'x' factor there, he gained some admiration as an inexperienced colt holding his own against more toughened performers, and the fact that Sir Michael Stoute was taking the uncharacteristic step of backing up such a precious commodity here spoke volumes. Settled in third early, Ryan Moore was visibly containing the handsome bay's enthusiasm before finally agreeing to let go passing the three-furlong marker. Soon in the clear, he was given two smacks late to keep his concentration as the long-absent Ballydoyle representative Foundry made eye-catching inroads into his advantage. "It was a great thrill and huge relief," Highclere's Managing Director Harry Herbert said after greeting the syndicate's 400th winner. "I think he showed today he is a very exciting horse and a bit special, but he is still learning the game. Ryan said after dismounting that he was a different horse today and that he felt powerful and he had trouble pulling him up. Looking at him, there is an awful lot more to come physically this year and next. We'd have to consider supplementing for the G1 St Leger [at Doncaster Sept. 14], looking at that. He wasn't put in originally, because Sir Michael thought he had too much speed, but it's got to be under consideration when the dust has settled. I asked John Warren before the off how he thought he looked today, and he said he looked fuller and stronger than at Haydock, but that he would be a different horse next year. Perhaps he went through a phase of growth last time, and he ran really well there anyway, but he was rolling and unbalanced and babyish and he was found out on the day." Sir Michael Stoute added, "He's still got a long way to go and he should be a better 4-year-old. There will be plenty of time to think about the St Leger."

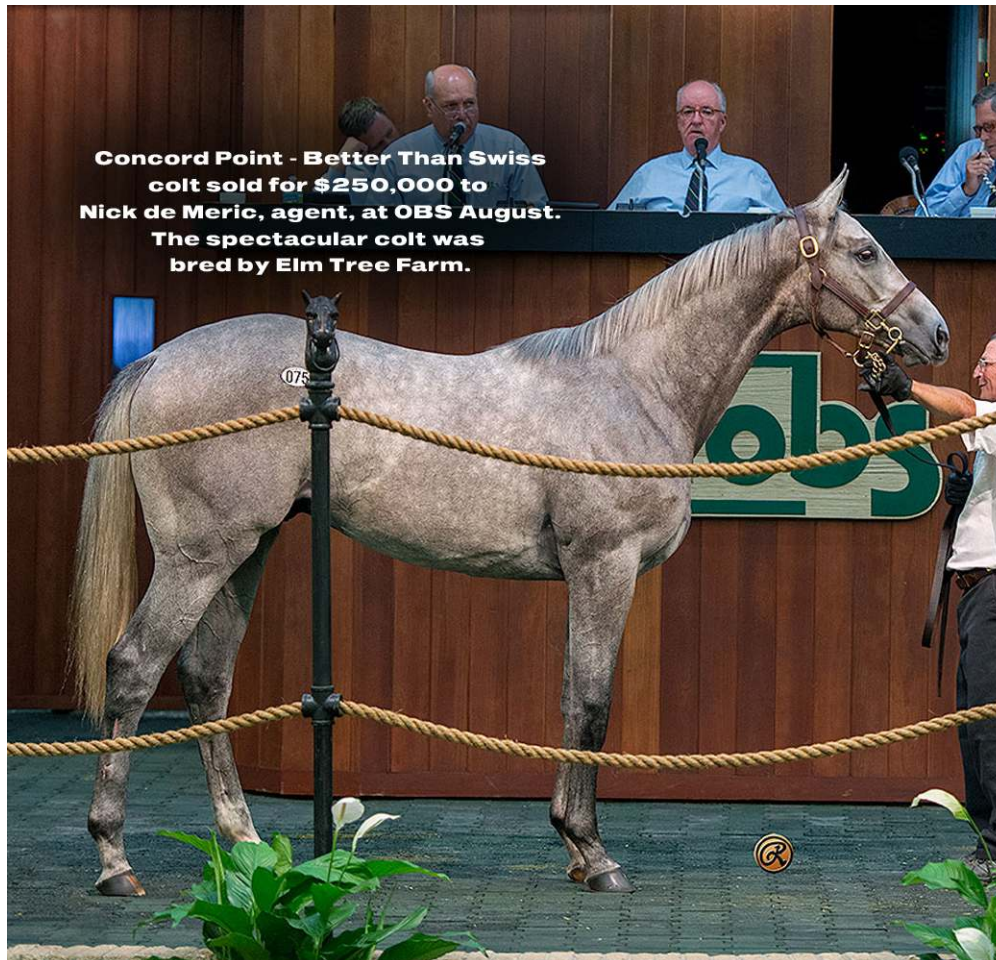

Following an unplaced debut effort over six furlongs at Salisbury June 16 and a short-head second to the subsequent listed scorer **Miracle of Medinah (GB)** (Milk It Mick {GB}) over the same track and trip a fortnight later, **Treaty of Paris** was off the mark at the third time of asking by five lengths over that distance at Pontefract July 19. No match for the Hannon trainee **Shifting Power (GB)** (Compton Place {GB}) when six lengths runner-up to that exciting individual in a conditions event over this trip at Newmarket last time Aug. 2, the bay gave weight to that form with a pillar-to-post success here. Skipping along the quick surface, he had only the course winners **Il Paparazzi** and **The Grey Gatsby** to worry about late on. After seeing off the former, he found the line just in time with his advantage being whittled with every stride. "I spoke to Mr Candy before the race and he said 'he's very straightforward, so ride the race as you find it', and I tried to use his experience today," jockey James Doyle said. "The trip was a little bit of a worry and it probably was speed that won him the race. He quickened up smartly and it was a good performance, so hopefully he can build from here. He stays seven, but has speed for six and I think he'll be slightly better with more cut in the ground."

GROUNDS FOR CONCERN

The Knavesmire's fast surface could deny the York faithful the opportunity of watching **Wild Coco (Ger)** (Shirocco {Ger}) tackle the top level for the first time in her career today, but that tantalizing prospect remains alive as connections ponder whether to give the 5-year-old the green light to contest the G1 Darley Yorkshire Oaks, a "Win and You're In" event for the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf. K I Farm Corporation's hefty purchase has looked every inch a Group 1 mare in her successes in the last two renewals of Goodwood's G3 Lillie Langtry S. and last year's G2 Park Hill S. at Doncaster, and holds pole position among the Warren Place interns at present. Taki Murayama, representing the owners, told *PA Sport*, "It all depends on the ground. Lady Cecil is very keen to run, but if it is too firm, she may take her out. It will be purely up to Lady Cecil. I imagine the decision will be left as late as possible as there is a chance it could rain before the race. It would be a shame, as we had been looking forward to running." In contrast, last year's runner-up **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) has ideal ground conditions as she bids to put a disappointing unplaced effort in the July 6 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown behind her. That flop was a rarity for Lord Lloyd-Webber's often-unlucky homebred and jockey William Buick is keeping the faith. "We are on a bit of a recovery mission after she failed to fire in the Coral Eclipse last time," he explained. "It was the only time in her career when she didn't perform to the highest level and I don't know why. She was just flat when I asked her to join in the action turning for home, but once I realized that it wasn't happening for her I left her alone. She's been in good order since and I'm very hopeful that she will bounce back to her best and go one better than she did a year ago. She's a year older and stronger now, and she's got the faster surface that allows her to use her pace." Of the 3-year-olds, **Venus de Milo (Ire)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) warrants respect having finished runner-up in the G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh July 20 and won the G3 Give Thanks S. at Cork Aug. 6. "The original plan was to give her a break and go to the Prix Vermeille, but after the Curragh she thrived and really went the right way," Aidan O'Brien explained. "We kept her in full work and have been happy with her since." Despite finishing second in the G1 Epsom and G1 German Oaks, there is a sense that Qatar Racing and Newsells Park Stud's **Secret Gesture (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) is capable of better, and her rider Jamie Spencer is in confident mood. "Hopefully, the race will be run to suit and she can show that she's one of the better fillies," he said. "I rode the race [in the Preis der Diana] to beat the track rather than the opposition and got nailed close home, so hopefully on a more conventional course I can ride a normal race on her."

LANDO DEAD

Leading sire **Lando (Ger)** (Acatenango {Ger}--Laurea {Ire}, by Sharpman {GB}) has been euthanized at his base at Gestut Hof Ittlingen, aged 23. Having suffered a severe bout of colic and later a spiral fracture of his elbow, the seven-time Group 1-winning champion could not be saved, bringing an end a longstanding success story for his owner-breeder. Widely held as the best son of his leading sire, he prevailed over the now-legendary Monsun (Ger) in a vintage renewal of the G1 Deutsches Derby prior to recording back-to-back victories in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden and breaking new ground by annexing the G1 Japan Cup in 1995. Retired to stud the following year, he initially stood at Haras d'Etream for a five-year spell before returning to his birthplace at Ittlingen. Among his progeny are 14 individual group winners, of which seven have won at the highest level including the globetrotting and long-time leading money earner Paolini (Ger), the 2004 G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup winner Epalo (Ger), the high-class dual Group 1-winning champion distaffer Gonbarda (Ger) and Scalo (Ger), who stood his first season in France this year. Lando is also well on the way to establishing a reputation as an influential broodmare sire, with the Pattern-race winners in that category including the aforementioned Gonbarda's son Farhh (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), successful in this year's G1 Lockinge S.

ST NIC RECOVERY CONTINUES

Coolmore have issued a further upbeat bulletin on the progress of **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) as he continues his convalescence. One month on from his advanced surgery on a fractured right pastern, the 6-year-old is making satisfactory improvement. "The veterinary interns who are with him 24-7 described him today as the 'best he has been' and the veterinary surgeons are equally happy," a statement on Coolmore's Twitter page read. "Recent radiographs look good, his temperature remains normal and his white blood cell count is good. St Nicholas Abbey is eating well and has put on a little weight. He's comfortable and is lying down regularly to give himself every chance. As his recovery continues, we hope we can give a similarly positive update in another month."

The Andrew McKeever trainee boasts an overall record of 21-10-4-2 and earnings of \$1,055,892. A 2009 Keeneland September graduate, she hails from the female family of Grade I winners Banker's Lady (Nijinsky II) and Ecton Park (Forty Niner). "Daisy Devine has a very special connection to Keeneland, and we are delighted to include her in our November Sale," said Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson. "She is a unique individual: a Grade I stakes winner with a lovely pedigree. She has all the potential to be a top-quality broodmare."



THE APACHE AND THE ARLINGTON MILLION: SOMETIMES WINNING ISN'T EVERYTHING

The record books will show that The Apache (SAf) (Mogok), a 6-year-old entire, trained by Mike de Kock, crossed the line first in the 2013 GI Arlington Million, before losing the race in the boardroom. That is often the nature of racing, there are no sure things and even crossing the line in first does not always guarantee that you will return victorious. It was a great day for Real Solution (Kitten's Joy), who became his sire's third Grade I winner on the day, but it was an even better one for The Apache, despite being demoted to second.

As a strapping black colt, The Apache, out of the Dolpour (Ire) mare Apache Rose (SAf), was purchased in 2009 by Winston Chow for a very modest sum of \$8,000. And what a purchase it has turned out to be. Mr. Chow eventually wanted The Apache to compete in Hong Kong, where an import may not have had more than 17 starts. This would soon prove to be a major challenge for his trainer Gavin van Zyl.

As the colt showed immense promise, each race had to be weighed up and the consequences considered, all the while keeping an eye on that magical number 17. It wasn't long before The Apache started adding some group silverware to the cupboard. First up was the G2 Investec Dingaans over 1600 meters at Turffontein where The Apache romped home 1 1/4 lengths clear.

After a six-month break, he reappeared in Durban in the traditional winter season's opener for 3-year-olds, the G2 KRA Guineas, where he finished a creditable fourth.

Next up was the big one, the one that all trainers with promising 3-year-olds want to win, the G1 Daily News over 2000 meters at Greyville. The Apache relished the extra 400 meters and stuck his nose in front to deny Run For It (SAf) on the line. For The Apache, the season came to a glorious end on the 31st of July in the G1 Champions Cup over 1800 meters where the colt showed he had matured beyond belief, winning by a quarter-length against older horses. It was his 10th start and, with two Group 1 victories, he was crowned Equus Champion 3-Year-Old Colt.

A couple of placings in group company followed and then it was decision time as that magical total of 17 starts loomed. Mr. Chow decided that Hong Kong was not a big enough stage for his star colt and opted instead to sell a half share to Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum. Consequently, The Apache joined Mike de Kock's merry band of Dubai bound horses at the quarantine station in Cape Town. Five months of quarantine followed on three different continents and yet The Apache lost none of his form.

Having his first start for Mike De Kock and his first in almost a year, The Apache dominated the G2 Al Rashidiya over 1800 meters under Christophe Soumillon at Meydan. With a second in the G1 Jebel Hatta and a second in the G1 Dubai Duty Free on World Cup night, The Apache was one of the stars of the World Cup Festival. Not bad for an \$8,000 purchase, who had spent five months languishing in quarantine.

De Kock and The Apache were, however, far from finished and the tough, sound South African-bred boarded a plane for the UK. There De Kock allowed him to settle in, before having a warm-up run in the G2 York S. The Apache showed he was ready for another challenge, with a credible 4th behind the talented Mukhadram (GB). The ultimate plan had always been the GI Arlington Million and De Kock was satisfied that the colt was on target. Again a plane trip loomed. By the time The Apache landed in the States, he had completed five long distance flights and visited four countries in just over a year--not something any sane person would ever consider asking of a highly strung racehorse and yet due to quarantine restrictions, the South African horses do it routinely.

Sadly, the outcome did not go The Apache's way and it is hard to lose a race in the boardroom, but even in defeat, the \$8,000 bargain basement buy from the Bloodstock South Africa National 2-Year-Old Sales, proudly flew the flag for South Africa. Just like passing the post first does not always guarantee victory, one also has to remember that winning is not everything and sometimes just passing the post is an achievement in itself.

An appreciation of Awad (Caveat--Dancer's Candy, by Noble Dancer {GB}): While marveling at the achievement of the Ramseys last weekend in three of our greatest Grade I turf races, I remembered Awad, who won all three; the Secretariat, the Arlington Million and the Sword Dancer Invitational. He still holds the track record at the distances: 1:58:69 for the mile and a quarter when winning the Arlington Million as a 5-year-old and 2:23.20 for the mile and a half at Saratoga while winning the Sword Dancer at age seven.

Awad raced in 22 Grade Is, winning four and nearly winning many more, as usually he was running best at the end of almost every race he ever ran. He broke his maiden in a stakes race and raced 56 times without Lasix, including his record time at Arlington, but he finished his career in 13 races using Lasix, including his record-setting time at Saratoga. Go figure!

He never won again after his record that August day at Saratoga, but of his last six races, five were Grade Is and with some luck he could have won them all. He raced once as an 8-year-old and retired to stud where I eventually saw him at Castle Rock Farm in Pennsylvania shortly before he went to Old Friends. I've tried but I don't think I've done justice to one of America's greatest racehorses, but feel I should mention that he was well ridden in his career, but never better than when Pat Day was in the saddle. Of course, Awad would never have been the horse he was without Dave Donk, who must have felt he died and went to heaven to have trained such a fine animal.

FILLIES SHARE TOP BILLING AT OBS

A pair of fillies brought co-topping bids of \$90,000 during Wednesday's first open session of the OBS August Yearling Sale. A daughter of Pioneer of the Nile was first to reach that figure when selling to trainer Mark Casse. Consigned and bred by Woodford Thoroughbreds, [hip 279](#) is the first foal out of graded stakes placed Smokin Again (Smoke Glacken). Bloodstock agent Mersad Metanovic signed the ticket at \$90,000 for a daughter of Flatter. Consigned by Beth Bayer, [hip 413](#) is out of Albany Park (Empire Maker), a half-sister to stakes winner Tigi (Dixieland Band).

Following on the strong select session Tuesday, figures were up across the board during Wednesday's open session. A total of 262 yearlings grossed \$4,601,600. The average rose 27.1% from a year ago to \$17,563, while the median was up 50% to \$15,000. The buy-back rate was 13.2%, down from 19.5% a year ago.

The second and final open session of the August sale gets underway this morning at 10:30 a.m.
