## MAJOR LEAGUE MIDSUMMER MATCH-UP

A power-packed field of nine heads postward in today's GI Travers S. at Saratoga, with a bevy of talented sophomores angling for the top spot in the division. **Orb** (Malibu Moon), almost universally coronated after his GI Kentucky Derby win, was given time to regroup after his fourth-place effort in the GI Preakness S. and third in the GI Belmont S. and his extended sojourn at Fair Hill Training Center has reportedly done him a world of good.

"Just his walk and his appearance and the way he's been acting has all been reminiscent of what was going on over the winter," trainer Shug McGaughey said of the Derby winner. "I think the time off after the Belmont has

helped him. I'm looking forward to the Travers. I think it's a great race. I'm looking forward to running Orb, and I think you'll see him run a very good race."

Orb will be the first Kentucky Derby winner to run in the Travers since Super Saver (Maria's Mon) was 10th in the 2010 Midsummer Derby. His loss snapped a three-race string of victories by Derby winners: Sea Hero (1993), Thunder Gulch (1995) and Street Sense (2007).

"I'd like to get him back on the right track so we can have a positive fall with him," McGaughey continued. "Obviously, we're in the race to win, but if we get a really good, solid effort, that would be fine, too, just so we can move on. But, I think he'll be awful tough."

Trainer Todd Pletcher has a potent one-two punch in the Travers, with GI Haskell Invitational winner **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) the 2-1 morning-line favorite and GI Belmont S. and GII Jim Dandy S. winner **Palace Malice** (Curlin) second choice at 5-2.

"You always try to do what's best for each individual horse and each individual owner, and I think the Travers is the right race for both horses," Pletcher commented. "It's kind of as simple as that. I'm as interested to see it as everyone else. They're two horses that are doing unbelievably well and coming off really, really good races. It's going to be interesting. I think it's going to be a fun race to watch. It's shaping up to be a great Travers." *Cont. p3*

## JEEZ JWALA!

What **Jwala** (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) lacked in form credentials heading into yesterday's G1 Coolmore Nunthorpe S., she more than made up for in genetic predisposition, and the half-sister to Airwave (GB) (Air Express {Ire}) achieved what her brilliant sibling failed to do in winning York's premier sprint. Injured when knocking herself in the stalls when last in the G2 King George S. at Goodwood last time Aug. 2, Manor Farm Stud and Sheila Hoare's bay, who was ignored at 40-1 showed dash from the outset to trade blows with the dragsters and began to edge ahead approaching the final furlong.

Sticking to her guns bravely as the 3-1 favorite **Shea Shea** (SAf) (National Emblem {SAf}) and his arch-rival **Sole Power** (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) closed in late, the homebred held on to score by a half length and a nose, respectively, and become the third shock winner in the last four renewals. "She's a fabulous filly who travels almost too well, as she's got so much speed," commented jockey Steve Drowne, whose recent career had been de-railed by a heart virus. "My problems have been well-documented, but you need one like this to get you back up again. She had a tough time too last time, as she knocked herself silly in the stalls and was punch-drunk in the race, but bounced back here."

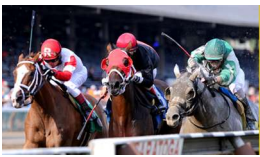

In last year's dramatic renewal of the Travers, the Kieran McLaughlin-trained Alpha (Bernardini) and Ken McPeek-trained Golden Ticket (Speightstown) dead-heated for the victory. Both trainers are back this year. McLaughlin will saddle Godolphin's **Transparent** (Bernardini). The \$725,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling finished first in the July 26 Curlin S. over the Saratoga oval, but was disqualified and placed fifth. Godolphin, which owns Alpha, will also be represented in the race by the Tom Albertrani-trained **Romansh** (Bernardini), who inherited the Curlin win. A \$750,000 Saratoga yearling, the dark bay colt broke his maiden in his third start in an off-the-turfer at Belmont May 25 and makes just his fifth start in the Travers. "The horse has been improving with every start," Albertrani said. "He has raced only four times, and I have seen a big improvement after every start. I love the way he has been going into this race. He is definitely more focused. I am getting all the right signs. Hopefully, he is just good enough to handle the rest of the field." McPeek will saddle Magdalena Racing and Diamond M Stable's **War Dancer** (War Front). The dark bay colt has made only one start on the main track, but McPeek thinks his win in the 1 1/4-mile GII Virginia Derby July 13 will be pivotal. "I think the fact that he's won at a mile and a quarter is a big deal here," McPeek said. "Obviously, this race is a lot tougher than last year's. If you get it done here, it's a big deal."

Out of the top two and just once off the board in her previous 17 trips to the post, **Dance to Bristol** snapped a streak of four runner-up efforts with a Laurel allowance score Feb. 6. She added a similar event

Mar. 15 before bolting up by nine lengths in the **Sugar Maple S.** at **Charles Town** Apr. 20, earning the same 106 **Beyer Speed Figure** as **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) later that evening in the **GII Charles Town Classic**. An easy winner of the **Skipat S.** on the **GII Black-Eyed Susan S.** undercard May 17, the chestnut announced her arrival on the national scene with a 2 3/4-length defeat of **Fantasy of Flight** (Tiznow) in the **GIII Bed O'Roses H.** at **Belmont Park** June 15. She

overcame a fair bit of adversity in her latest to just touch off loose-on-the-lead **Classic Point** (Flatter) by a neck in the **GII Honorable Miss H.** in her first appearance at this venue July 29, and firmed into second favoritism late.

Settled cozily in fourth early on as **Classic Point** went the opening quarter mile in an ordinary :23.03, **Dance to Bristol** remained inside on the turn, then was angled out to the four path and led as they cornered into the lane. **Book Review**, who didn't seem to be getting over the track all that well down the backstretch, followed the move of the eventual winner into the final quarter mile and was gaining inches late, but fell just short. **Villanesca** held for third. "Her will to win is what makes her special," reported victorious trainer **Ollie Figgins III**. "Book Review had dead aim on her inside the eighth pole. Once she saw her coming, she just wouldn't let her by. She broke nice and clean and [jockey **Xavier Perez**] just let her get her rhythm. She eased to the outside a little past the half-mile pole, it looked like, and everything went pretty smooth. We knew we had a good horse, and we were hopeful [we could come to Saratoga and win two graded stakes races]." According to **Figgins**, **Dance to Bristol** could train up to the **GI Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Sprint** or have one start in the interim. **Judy the Beauty** (**Ghostzapper**), who vied for favoritism for much of the wagering, flipped in the gate and was a late scratch.

Tried in the Listed Bosra Sham Fillies' S. on only her third start when still a maiden over six furlongs at Newmarket in October 2011, Jwala was not ready for that test and trailed in eighth, but was steadily built back up in maiden and handicap company and, by this time last year, had three consecutive wins on the board in minor events. The first sign that she was beginning to bring her inherent talent to the fore came in Doncaster's Listed Scarbrough S. in September, where she led until mastered late on by Sole Power over that flat five-furlong strip. Her third and fourth runs back this term after two

inauspicious starts saw her again fill the position of bridesmaid over this trip in the Listed Achilles S. at Haydock June 7 and Ayr's Listed Land O'Burns Fillies' S. June 22, but it was over this course and distance next time that she showed she was making some forward progression after an apparent plateau to her form. Beating the subsequent G3 Hackwood S. winner Heeraat (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) in the July 13 Listed City Walls S., she suffered a fracture to her eye socket in the starting gates when never a factor in the King George at Glorious Goodwood, but had recovered quickly from that trauma to book her place in this line-up. **Cont. p6**

With just that excusable blip blighting her consistent profile, she boasted more solid prospects than her odds suggested of bettering the sixth placing of Airwave on unsuitably soft ground here in 2004. Her cause may also have been aided by the significant rain which fell during a storm the previous evening, and which saw confidence ebb in the fast-ground specialists and hold-up performers Sole Power--who had started at 100-1 when successful three years ago--and Shea Shea. Racing up the center just off the early pace set by

Robert Cowell, who has made his name with sprinters such as the 2011 G1 King's Stand S. hero Prohibit (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and two of this race's also-rans Kingsgate Native (Ire) (Mujadil) and Spirit Quartz (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire})--runner-up in this 12 months ago--paid tribute to the Rutland-based stud that nurtured the winner's high-achieving dam's latest success story. "She comes from a great farm and a class outfit, who sent me a few horses after we became friends," he said. "They know what they are doing--they breed a lot of sprinters and I like training them, so it's a good match. I was bullish about her, as I always thought she would be a Group horse and told a lot of people, and I'm glad she's shown it now. She's a grand filly and only finished a length behind Sole Power as a 3-year-old last year, but has come on leaps and bounds and is ultra-tough with a high cruising speed. She had a torrid time at Goodwood when she banged her head against the stalls, and it was only diagnosed later on. The [Oct. 6] G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp is the plan, and this will be her last year, so let's hope we can finish on something as high as this." Steve Drowne, who has partnered some accomplished sprinters in the past, including the sires Sakhee's Secret (GB), Avonbridge (GB) and Patavellian (Ire), was denied a riding licence after some fainting episodes, which were eventually put down to a virus causing an enlarged heart. He added, "I was always going to come back, but you need a certain bit of luck to get on one like this, and I was lucky I was in the right place at the right time. There was no fluke about it and she's the best five-furlong filly I've ridden by far. She's so well-behaved and settled going down, and is so simple to deal with. She runs her races the hard way--she's always in the firing line and there to be shot at."

Making his belated European return when filling the same spot in the G2 Princess of Wales's S. over a mile and a half at Newmarket July 11, he demonstrated his versatility by getting closest to Brown Panther (GB) (Shirocco {Ger}) reverting to this trip in the Aug. 1 G2 Goodwood Cup last time. Settled in the slipstream of the G1 Gold Cup runner-up Simenon by Silvestre de Sousa throughout the early stages, he stayed in the center of the track in the home stretch as Johnny Murtagh guided that rival to the stand's rail. The late-running sprinter **Forty Tales** (Tale of the Cat) seeks his fourth straight graded stakes success in today's GI Foxwoods King's Bishop S. at Saratoga. The bay colt, one of three Todd Pletcher runners in the 14-horse field, began his streak with a win in the Apr. 27 GIII Derby Trial S. He closed from well out of it to add a 3/4-length victory in the June 8 GII Woody Stephens S. at today's seven-furlong distance and came running with a similarly dramatic late rush to win the July 28 GII Amsterdam S. last time out. "I couldn't be happier about the way he's run in his last three races," said Pletcher. "I think we have found his niche, and he certainly would be a worthy winner after the resume he has put together."

Pletcher also saddes **Capo Bastone** (Street Boss), most recently seventh in the Woody Stephens, and **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union), coming off a third-place effort in the Aug. 3 GIII West Virginia Derby. All three Pletcher runners have similar late-running styles.

"It's unusual that we have three horses who don't have any speed," said Pletcher. "I would anticipate Overanalyze backing from long races to short wouldn't show a lot of speed. Capo Bastone and Forty Tales seem to have had most of their success coming from off the pace."

**Declan's Warrior** (Majestic Warrior) won the GIII Bay Shore S. in April and added the May 22 Gygistar S. at Belmont, but he couldn't get past Forty Tales after a troubled stretch run in the Woody Stephens. He is coming off a fifth-place effort in the Amsterdam.

**Salutos Amigos** (Salute the Sarge) was third in the Amsterdam, and trainer Eric Guillot thinks the best is yet to come now that the bay colt has put foot issues behind him.

"When I bought the horse and put him on the shelf, he had real spongy, real crumbly, a real bad horny wall on him," Guillot explained. "You couldn't put in any nails; you had to kind of glue, put a nail, glue, put a nail, glue. It would take two hours...to put a shoe job on him. I knew it would take six months to grow out. They've grown out. I don't have any more glue on the horse. The day after I shoe him, he goes like a champ. I don't have to keep him on any kind of medication to keep his feet right. The horse went from shuffling like he was on egg shells to striding out like a good horse."

# EUROPEAN PREVIEWS

## UP FOR GRABS

There is no stand-out performer in today's G2 Irish Thoroughbred Marketing Gimcrack S. at York, with very little separating six of the seven in the line-up bidding to earn their owner the honor of speaking at the Gimcrack dinner. One who has enjoyed that already is Sheikh Ahmed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, whose Shaveel (GB) (Dansili {GB}) scored at Newbury when this course was undergoing its renovation in 2008, and he is represented this time by **Saayerr (GB)** (Acclamation {GB}). Already successful at this level in Goodwood's G2 Richmond S. at the start of the month, he is penalized three pounds for a neck success from **Cable Bay (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), but trainer William Haggas is realistic about the task in hand. "He's very well, but he's got that penalty to carry, which makes life difficult," he told *PA Sport*. "We'll just have to see how he gets on." Cable Bay's conditioner Charlie Hills is expecting the lightly-raced colt to continue progressing, and also told *PA Sport*, "He is a colt we have always liked. We thought he may need the run at Goodwood, as he had a little setback after he won his maiden. I think he has come on again and hopefully he will run very well at York." Qatar Racing's **My Catch (Ire)** (Camacho {GB}) took the G3 Prix de Cabourg over this trip at Deauville last time July 28, and the Racing Manager David Redvers is hopeful he can hold his own at this level with that experience behind him. "He's been freshened up, and [trainer] David Brown is very confident about his chances," he said.

## RE-ENGAGE

Having lost his unbeaten record and temporarily some of his mystique in the G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh last time Aug. 11, **War Command** (War Front) returns to Kildare for today's G2 Galileo EBF Futurity S. Despite his emphatic victory in Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. over six furlongs June 18, Joseph Allen and Coolmore's exciting colt may have needed more than that trip when contesting the juvenile feature 13 days ago, and his debut win at Leopardstown came over this seven furlongs. He has to give three pounds to the talented Sean Jones representative **Exogenesis (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}), who beat his smart stable companion **Friendship (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in an above-average conditions event over this trip at Leopardstown July 4, and backed that up with a win in the G3 Tyros S. back over that course and distance three weeks later. Trainer Ger Lyons is making hay while the sun shines. "He's a typical Dark Angel--a seven-furlong to a mile horse," he told *PA Sport*. "I'm just looking at his 2-year-old career. He's an uncomplicated horse, he's adaptable on ground, but doesn't want it too firm or too soft. I'm not saying Exogenesis is Group 2 or Group 1 quality, but we're not afraid to lose by running him." Friendship re-opposes here after two subsequent wins, most recently under a stopping weight in a nursery over an extended seven-furlong trip at Tipperary on Thursday. His form also links in with Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Mustajeeb (GB)** (Nayef), as that unexposed colt handed him a 2 1/2-length beating on rain-softened ground in a Galway maiden over this trip July 29.

That came just nine days ago in Salisbury's G3 Sovereign S., which he won by six lengths without being asked a serious question, and served notice that he may be able to distill the class that saw him second in last year's G1 Arlington Million into real substance over this trip. Trainer Luca Cumani told *PA Sport*, "We had been thinking about running him over a mile for a good while, but unfortunately he refused to go into the stalls at Ascot for the G2 Summer Mile. Luckily, he went into the stalls at Salisbury, and it was a good performance. The track at Goodwood will be no problem, and I will be happy if he runs another nice race." **Cont. p12**

# NEWS TODAY

## LASIX ALLOWED IN ALL BC RACES IN 2014

Officially reversing course from a previously announced policy, officials at the Breeders' Cup have announced that all horses will be permitted to run with the anti-bleeding medication Lasix at the 2014 renewal of racing's championship day at Santa Anita. For the first time in 2012, a Lasix ban was put into effect for the five Breeders' Cup races for 2-year-olds, and the policy was to extend to all races in 2013. However, the Breeders' Cup controversially voted earlier this year to postpone the broader rules, causing division amongst its board members and leading Olly Tait to announce his resignation from the body this past March. The Breeders' Cup statement reads:

*Breeders' Cup remains committed to the goal that the world's major international racing events, including the Breeders' Cup World Championships, should be conducted under the same rules and conditions with regard to race-day medication. We will continue to work constructively with stakeholders in the U.S. and elsewhere, including potential host sites, racing commissions and horsemen's groups, toward that objective.*

*We were successful in implementing event-specific race conditions for 2012 and 2013 which prohibited race day administration of furosemide in Breeders' Cup 2-year old races in cooperation with the CHRB, Santa Anita and the TOC. However, in evaluating host-site options for 2014, it became apparent that the race-day medication policy for 2014 would have to be consistent with rules in effect in any eligible host jurisdiction at the time of the event. The horsemen's groups in potential host jurisdictions indicated that they would withhold their approval of simulcast rights unless this was the case, jeopardizing our ability to conduct simulcast wagering on our event, and thus the event itself.*

*There has been good progress toward uniformity on model rules in the U.S. over the last several months and the Breeders' Cup has endorsed that effort. To date, no racing jurisdiction in the U.S. has established a policy eliminating the use of all race-day medications and none of our potential future host sites has been able to offer assurances that such an eventuality is likely in the near term.*

*We have committed to the TOC and CHRB to conduct data collection at our 2013 event and monitor the performance of the runners in the juvenile races which will be held absent race-day medication. We hope that the results of 2012 and 2013, while obviously a very small sample, along with voluntary efforts by others in the U.S. on juvenile races, will further inform the discussion on this issue.*

*As a longstanding leader in the U.S. racing industry on standards of safety, security, testing and integrity, Breeders' Cup remains committed to continuing working on best practices in these areas.*

**MAJORITY OF SEPTEMBER CONSIGNORS TO BEGIN SHOWING FRIDAY** A poll conducted by the Consignors and Breeders Association (CBA) reveals that the vast majority of consignors of horses to Book 1 of the Keeneland September Sale will begin showing horses Friday, Sept. 6. The CBA received responses from 36 consignors, including each of the top 20 consignors, which account for over 70% of the horses over the two days of Book 1. According to statistics released by the CBA, many of the consignors are shipping in all of their Book 1 horses together and will be showing them on their first show day, while other consignors are splitting up the shipping into two groups based on which day they are selling. Well, that was less than enjoyable. Despite climbing early, Book Review looked like a winner as she beared down on Dance to Bristol in the stretch, but she came up a head short. Let's just turn the page...

#### GI Test S. - #2 Baby J (12-1)

Five of the nine runners in this group were first or second after the opening quarter in their last starts, but I'm not sure how much *true* speed there is signed on. So Many Ways had no business being as close as she was in the GI Prioress S.; dangerous California invader Sweet Lulu was going a mile last time and she's being ridden by a notoriously patient jockey in this one; My Happy Face set a slow pace last out going an additional two furlongs; and Wildcat Lily, whose early pace figures two and three back at Calder were very high, posted just average splits in the Prioress and seems likely to try a stalk-and-pounce trip this time from her outside draw. There's no doubt about what **Baby J's** doing early, however. She has been part of some very quick paces in her career, including the GIII Victory Ride S. last time (nine points above par on the Moss Pace Figure scale for the opening quarter) in which she was incredibly game to battle back and win after looking like she had been left in the dust in upper stretch. Seven panels might be pushing it, but if Baby J gets looser than most expect, she could have enough left late to hold on. **Wager: \$20 on #2 Baby J.**

#### GI King's Bishop S. - #9 Overanalyze (12-1)

Wow. What a tough race--maybe we should each get two picks. My original inclination was to go with Mentor Cane, who I think has a ton of talent and potential. I just can't completely trust him after he lugged out and probably cost himself the race last time in the GII Amsterdam, however, and worry that he could find himself chasing the freakishly fast Let Em Shine and doing himself in. I'll still use Mentor Cane, but don't think he's the greatest bet in the world at his 8-1 morning line considering his lack of seasoning. I'm sure I just put him into the winner's circle... While Vyjack--who I would have loved--didn't make it here, I'll go with another Triple Crown turnback in **Overanalyze**. Despite being a Grade I winner at nine furlongs and having earned a career-best Beyer at that trip when annexing last November's GII Remsen S., I've always had a nagging suspicion that the son of Dixie Union wanted to sprint. His GII Futurity S. win at six furlongs last September was extremely visually impressive, and perhaps he hasn't taken much of a step forward since then because he's been asked to go farther than he really wants to. He should be plenty fit off a pace-pressing third in the 1 1/8-mile GII West Virginia Derby, and is likely to get lost on the tote thanks to dirtied-up route form. **Wager: \$40 on #9 Overanalyze.**

#### GI Travers S. - #8 Palace Malice (5-2)

I've never really been a big fan of **Palace Malice**, but I'm officially ready to admit that I was wrong about him. He absolutely validated his Belmont win in the GII Jim Dandy, earning a career-best 107 Beyer Speed Figure in the process and scoring for the second time in as many tries at the Spa. To me, he's by far the most trustworthy of the three favorites. Verrazano's GI Haskell win was downright freaky, but I still maintain that he's not a true 10-furlong horse. Orb, meanwhile, still has some major questions to answer after being exposed post-Derby. It seems a lot more likely that he was the beneficiary of one of the most brutal paces (set by Palace Malice, of course) you will ever see in the 'Run for the Roses' than that he had legitimate excuses in the Preakness and Belmont. So I'll go with the surest thing for this contest, but from a personal wagering standpoint, I'm also interested in Transparent and Will Take Charge. The former looks like a late-blooming type who should appreciate the distance, while the latter was running on very strongly at the end of the Jim Dandy and has been knocking on the door for a while. Any exacta combo of 5,8,9 and I'll be happy. **Wager: \$80 on #8 Palace Malice.**

**Results: Friday's GI Ballerina S. - #8 Judy the Beauty (SCR)**

A gate scratch is really starting to feel like a win at this meeting. Didn't have any action in the Ballerina after Judy the Beauty's untimely meltdown, but was treated to another tenacious performance by Dance to Bristol, who held off my opponent's pick in game fashion.

**GI Test S. - #9 Wildcat Lily (6-1)**

Have been a very big fan of Sweet Lulu since her **TDN Rising Star** worthy debut at Hollywood Park in late May, but will look elsewhere as that one figures to go off at less than 2-1 while making her first start on dirt against a talented bunch. The battle-tested **Wildcat Lily** (first or second in seven straight) is extremely hard to dismiss following a pair of gutsy performances in the Gill Azalea S. at Calder and GI Prioress S. at Saratoga most recently July 27. Although off the board in a pair of previous attempts at this distance, the chestnut appears to be a much different horse at this point of her career. She's run well enough in defeat in a pair of 6 1/2-furlong tries at Calder in May, and is drawn favorably on the outside if she can be rated early. Picking up Johnny V for the first time can't be a bad thing, and, if her best-of-100 four-furlong bullet in :46 3/5 at Gulfstream Aug. 17 is any indication, the Rontos Racing Stable colorbearer is sitting on another big performance. **Wager: \$50 Win on #9 Wildcat Lily.**

**GI King's Bishop S. - #14 No Distinction (15-1)**

**No Distinction**, only one of three entrants to reach 100 or higher on the Beyer scale in this loaded renewal of the King's Bishop, is more than capable of lighting up the toteboard. The dark bay strung together an impressive three-race winning streak against older horses while showing signs of immaturity earlier this term, including a runaway maiden win at Oaklawn Apr. 13, good for a 100 Beyer. He returns to dirt after prepping with a good second after doing all of the heavy lifting in the grassy 5 1/2-furlong Quick Call S. at the Spa July 25, and has fired a five-furlong bullet over the main track in the interim. Tactical speed will certainly come in handy in a race absolutely loaded with early zip, and he should be placed in a pretty good spot from his extreme outside draw. Picks up a great longshot rider in Joe Rocco Jr. **Wager: \$50 Win on #14 No Distinction.**

**GI Travers S. - #5 Will Take Charge (10-1)**

After chasing him throughout the entire Triple Crown series with extreme disappointment, **Will Take Charge** finally ran the race that I knew he was capable of with a strong second-place finish behind Palace Malice at 17-1 in the Gil Jim Dandy S. July 27. Removing the shades that day, the lanky chestnut settled in a perfect spot in fifth and came charging home late to cut the margin of victory to a quickly diminishing length. There should be plenty of pace to run at with the speedy Moreno and Verrazano both signed on, and the 1 1/4 miles distance can only help the cause. Hoping that the Coach finally has this guy figured out. **Wager: \$100 Win on #5 Will Take Charge.**

The grey broke on top and set the pace from the two path, zipping through fractions of :22.18 and :44.49. Coming a bit wide off the turn

when challenged by Kendall's Boy (Sky Mesa) at the top of the lane, the Todd Pletcher trainee re-rallied to open up in the final furlong and win by 2 3/4 lengths. He hit the wire in 1:02.64, just shy of the 5 1/2-furlong track record of 1:02.51. Havana becomes the fifth winner for his freshman sire (by Unbridled's Song) and is the ninth 2-year-old firster to win for his trainer at this meet. "Looking at the worktab of the horse who was second [Kendall's Boy], he looked like he had been training very well," said Pletcher.

"It didn't surprise us [Havana] broke alertly and showed speed, and I was happy to see him put in the performance he did," said jockey John Velazquez. "He's trained well enough and he ran well enough today that something like the [GI] Champagne [at Belmont Park Oct. 5] might make sense. He's been working really good in the morning. We all liked him, and we were all wishing that when it comes to the races that he could do the same thing he's been doing in the morning. He did it, so we're very proud. We thought we had a fast horse, and we didn't want to give him such a hard race." 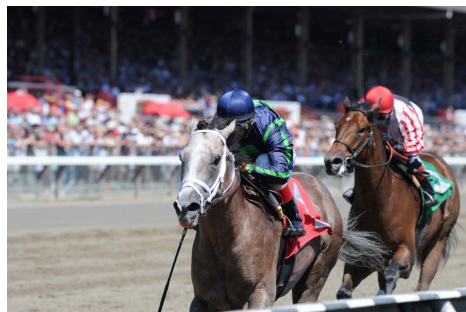

### Score One for 'De' Little Guy...

Two-year-old reseller Bruno De Berdt, who operates the Excel Bloodstock sales agency, was 3,000 miles away from Saratoga in the cozy confines of his California residence as he eagerly awaited the 1 p.m. (10 a.m. Pacific time) opener from the Spa. A hot-looking maiden on paper, the 5 1/2-furlong affair featured **Havana** (Dunkirk), whom de Berdt purchased for just \$50,000 as a yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale.

"He had all the right parts--he wasn't all that big, but he kept growing in the right way," de Berdt commented

when reached by phone shortly after Havana's near track-record setting performance. "He had a great mindset. We were able to put a saddle on him right away after we got him. He didn't really show a whole lot of brilliance at first,

and it wasn't until the final few works before the Barretts sale that we realized that he gives 100% all of the time. We try to put a good foundation so they're ready to peak on preview day."

And that he did, breezing an eighth of a mile in a sensational :9 3/5, the fastest time ever recorded during a preview show at Barretts. The April 22 foal was hammered down to Demi O'Byrne on behalf of the Smith/Magnier/Tabor triumvirate for \$575,000. The bloodstock agent was also responsible for the sales-topping bid of \$675,000 on Corfu (Malibu Moon), now undefeated in two tries including the GII Saratoga Special S.

Still, de Berdt was hopeful, but wasn't taking anything for granted.

"I knew he had a lot of ability," de Berdt commented. "He went the right way. He was still very immature in March. I had the TV on from 9:30 because you never know coming out of the one hole. He'd been working well and that was the feedback I'd received. Once I sell, I don't like to bother connections, but the reports I heard were very positive. He was always a good-minded horse and he went out there and did his job. He was never really asked to do anything and when that horse came up to him, it was like he said, 'OK, this is what I'm supposed to'. Todd Pletcher has done an excellent job with him and think you'll be hearing more from him."

De Berdt explained his decision to take his colt to Barretts and not one of the subsequent juvenile sales.

"I live and want to have a presence in California and it is always my goal to have a nice horse or two at the Barretts sale," said de Berdt, who worked with the braintrust from The Thoroughbred Corp. in the early 2000s before striking out on his own in 2001. "We bought seven yearlings last year and hope we can take them to the next level. We train them and after 90 days we let them tell us where they want to go. Barretts looked at him and they loved him, but I'm sure he would have done just as well at any other sale."

As pleased as he was for his own success, de Berdt is happy to take a longer view.

"It's always a thrill to buy a horse, watch it develop and make it a profit, but it's more of a thrill to see that horse do well for the owners. You want the end-user to make money and hopefully they'll make money down the road. I don't think you could buy that horse for \$575,000 today," he dead-panned.

### Another Booming Result for Barretts...

Barretts's General Manager Kim Lloyd was in an understandably giddy mood shortly after 10 a.m. Friday morning. Havana's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ performance means that each of the top three sellers from the March sale have gone on to graduate in their first career appearances and are a combined four out of four. Diamond Bachelor (War Front), sold for \$570,000 late this winter, was also accorded ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status off a 3 1/4-length debut success going a grassy mile at Del Mar Aug. 8 ([video](#)).

"It's our consignors that bring them out," Lloyd commented. "[Breaking Point Farm's] Jim Chapman said he was going to bring [Corfu] out to top the sale, and Ciaran Dunne [consignor of Diamond Bachelor] did such a great job getting him to the sale. That colt had a beautiful presence and was well sold, and connections are doing a great job. The 2-year-old process finds them out, and those horses that go through it that well and show so often and stay strong. It's a lot of fun and everyone is thrilled."

Lloyd also paid tribute to de Berdt.

"He's such a passionate guy and to get a horse like that go through his hands is terrific," he offered. "It's gratifying that connections come through and pay good money and it shows how good a horse these sales produce. To have the three top come out and run is so unusual."

Lloyd said he was more hopeful than he was expectant pre-race, but was duly pleased with the result.

"We were talking before the race and I thought he could break that [track] record. He just had that sort of talent and went so easy," Lloyd commented.

### ROAP Endorses Penalty for Multiple Medications:

*Edited Press Release*

The Racing Officials Accreditation Program's board of directors voted Thursday to endorse the Penalty Guidelines for Multiple Medication Violations, which passed the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) Board and Model Rule Committee in July.

The Penalty Guidelines for Multiple Medication Violations, which is projected to be implemented in some states as early as Jan. 1, initiates a point system for equine medication violations similar to that used by state motor vehicle agencies.

The rule calls for points to be assigned to every trainer's fine and suspension history in the ARCI database by way of a separate ruling. That separate ruling would occur in the jurisdiction that issues an underlying equine medication positive test infraction that "triggers" a penalty phase in the points system structure.

"We believe that it is important for ROAP to support the current efforts in the industry to unify medication regulations and specifically the new penalty system given that the stewards and judges will be responsible for implementing these regulations at the track level," said ROAP Chairman Hugh Gallagher. "This is a rule designed to protect our racehorses first. It is a fundamentally sound rule that is ready for implementation today. What lies before us is the challenging work of having all jurisdictions in full participation, compliance and reciprocity as well a clear understanding of how this rule will be implemented by stewards and judges in North America and the Caribbean."

ROAP accredits stewards, judges, and racing officials in all three disciplines of racing — flat (Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse), harness and steeplechase. Additionally, continuing education courses are required every two years to maintain accreditation. Staying consistent with its mission of education, ROAP will cover the Penalty Guidelines for Multiple Medication Violations in future continuing education seminars.
