## ALPHA PERFORMANCE FOR 'DELTA'

Prior to yesterday's GI Personal Ensign H., there remained little doubt that the two-time champion older mare **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) would be able to follow up on a tour-de force victory in the GI Delaware H. with another emphatic score in the Spa's jewel for older fillies. As the Besilu Stables' runner crossed the wire a geared-down four lengths ahead of Authenticity (Quiet American), there was no doubt. Noticeably warm heading into the gate, Royal Delta broke well and kept **On Fire Baby** (Smoke Glacken) close by as the frontrunner carved out a solid opening quarter in :23.56. Royal Delta easily moved ahead of that rival and kept the tempo up with a stern half in

:46.78 as 2-1 second choice Authenticity inched closer to the piping hot favorite down the backstretch. Approaching the far turn after three quarters in 1:10.78, Royal Delta maintained a comfortable advantage over Authenticity, who launched her bid on the outside and On Fire Baby, who began to retreat after starting to show the effects of her early exertions. Despite Authenticity's best intentions to reel in the free-moving winner, Royal Delta made amends for a narrow second-place defeat in this race last term with an emphatic 4 1/2-length score this time around. **Centring** (A.P. Indy) was third. With the victory, Royal Delta stamped her 'Win and You're In' ticket to this fall's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, a race she has won the last two years.

"When she comes with her 'A' game, that's what you expect," said winning trainer Bill Mott. "She was just good. She was good last time [in the Delaware H.]. [Jockey] Mike said she was strong and felt great."

Added winning rider Mike Smith, "I just was happy I got away good today, and once we did that and she got into her monstrous stride, horses seem to have to take two to her one. She's a machine. Down the lane, she got to looking around the track a little bit, so I got after her just a little to keep her going. She's just so big. You hate for her to gear too much down and someone comes running. It's hard to get going again. Other than that, everything was wonderful.

## 'DUDE' DUSTS CLASSIC FOES

**Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) put up one of the most visually impressive wins of his career with a thrilling romp in this, a "Win and You're In" event for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. A heart-breaking second in last year's renewal when overwhelmed late by the re-opposing **Dullahan** (Even the Score), Game On Dude left the gate here as the crowd's 8-5 pick and had made the front, and the rail, by the time they reached the first turn. From there, he dictated :24.10, :47.96 and 1:12.61 splits as

**Delegation** (Speightstown) applied token pressure. By the three-eighths pole, Game On Dude began to get away from the field, and he turned on the afterburners down the lane, powering away from the rest to win by a record 8 1/2 lengths (note: *Trakus* listed the margin at 9 1/2 lengths). **Kettle Corn** (Candy Ride {Arg}) took a multiple-horse photo for place honors; rank outsider **You Know I Know** (Simon Pure) was third. "It was very emotional for me," said winning trainer Bob Baffert. "I watched it with [wife] Jill in the paddock, in a room with just the two of us and the paddock judge. To go through what we did with him last year, getting run down late like we did...He just made a huge statement. It was just great day for horse racing in Southern California." **Cont. p5**

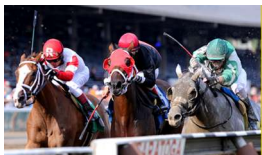

Trainer Todd Pletcher, who played the role of spoiler when upending the big mare with Love and Pride (A.P. Indy) in 2012, had to settle for second-best with 6-year-old Authenticity, winner of the July 20 GIII Shuvee S. in her latest start.

"I thought our filly ran super," said Pletcher. "We were just second best. I'm really pleased with her effort. She didn't lose any respect in defeat."

Added jockey John Velazquez, "I got a little bit excited at the five-sixteenths pole when we were getting closer. I thought we had a chance. Then at the quarter pole, Royal Delta reached in and got away again. We were just second best."

Darley's Centring, a well-beaten fourth in the Delaware H., rallied late to be third.

"A good effort," said Tom Albertrani. "A Grade I placing, that's the most important thing. She kind of lost contact early on, but she made up some good ground so it was a good effort." Echoing the sentiment, jockey Javier Castellano said, "I had a good trip. My filly really closed today. I really liked the way she did it in the last part of the race. She closed and almost got second place in a Grade I behind Royal Delta."

Getting even stronger at five, he won five of eight starts, including the GI Hollywood Gold Cup on the synthetic and the nine-panel GI Awesome Again S.-- named after his sire, but had to play the bridesmaid to Dullahan in last year's renewal of this race. Getting off to an eye-opening start with a 6 1/2-length victory in the nine-furlong GII San Antonio Feb. 3, he continued his dominance with a rousing 7 3/4-length score for a second consecutive title in the Big 'Cap. Shipped East to take a shot at the pricey GII Charles Town Classic over nine panels Apr. 20, the dark bay had to dig deep to fend off Clubhouse Ride by a half length. In search of his sixth straight victory in the July 6 Hollywood Gold Cup, the gelding proved more than capable as he came home a length winner over Kettle Corn. "He has been working well and you could tell he's a different horse this year here," said winning trainer Bob Baffert, who was collecting his fourth Pacific Classic title. "He was just doing everything so smoothly. I loved the way he was in the paddock today. He wasn't too keen he was real relaxed. I ran the race in my mind and there was so much other speed. But at the end of the day, I told Martin: 'You have the fastest horse so don't be afraid to get bold with him.'

Mike Smith, who had been aboard the 6-year-old in his five latest starts, was notably absent for yesterday's win, having made the trip to Saratoga to guide dual champion Royal Delta to a victory in Sunday's GI Personal Ensign H. With Smith engaged out east, Joel Rosario had been slated to ride, but Martin Garcia inherited the ride when Rosario suffered an injury on Friday. "I feel amazing," said Garcia, who was also partnered the Baffert runner Fed Biz in the GII Pat O'Brien earlier on the card. I still can't believe that I won." Game On Dude becomes only the second horse (following Lava Man in 2006) to sweep the Southern California Triple of the Santa Anita H., the Hollywood Gold Cup and the TVG Pacific Classic in one season. The ownership group behind Game On Dude consists of Diamond Pride LLC, the nom de course for former New York Yankees and Los Angeles Dodgers manager Joe Torre; the Lanni Family Trust of the late J. Terrence Lanni, once a member of the board of directors of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club; Bernie Schiappa, and the Mercedes Stable of Ernest Moody and Maria Mercedes Villa.

Fed Biz unleashed a furious late rally to get up and deny odds-on Goldencents for his second Grade II victory of the season. The \$950,000 KEESEP yearling, a 7-1 chance under Martin Garcia, was content to rate well off the pace as No Silent and Goldencents ensured an honest pace. Goldencents roared into the lane up by a length, but by the eighth pole was beginning to get leg weary. Fed Biz, moving widest, took advantage and swept past on the outside to win by 1 1/2 lengths. Goldencents held for second, with Gonna Fly Now (Rockport Harbor) getting third. The final time established a new course record at Del Mar. The Pat O'Brien is part of the Breeders' Cup's "Win and You're In" series, guaranteeing the winner a berth in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

"That's what happens when you have a horse that loves the surface," said winning trainer Bob Baffert. "He's a miler, but he loves this surface. He's been working with [Grade I winner] Paynter [Awesome Again] and just breezing over it. I told Martin [Garcia] to be patient and, hopefully, the speed will come back to you. We got a great run today."

Added Martin Garcia, "It was a good race. Set up perfectly for me. I just waited for the stretch, then I let him do his own thing. He knew when to go and he knew what to do."

With the win, Fed Biz became the fifth consecutive winner of the event for Baffert. Mavourneen O'Brien, daughter of track founder Pat O'Brien, has presented the trophy for each of those renewals.

"I keep meeting the daughter of Pat O'Brien and she says, 'Well I see you're still alive, so I say 'I see you're still alive, too.'"

Fed Biz kicked off 2013 with a win in the 1 1/16-mile GII San Fernando S. at Santa Anita Jan. 12 before finishing third in his next two--the nine-furlong GII Strub S. Feb. 2 and the grassy GI Frank Kilroe S. Mar. 2. A close-up second in the one-mile Thunder Road S. over the Santa Anita lawn Apr. 6, the bay was shipped East for the May 27 GI Metropolitan Mile over Belmont's main track and came home fifth--beaten 11 lengths. Given a brief respite for his latest, he returned to be fourth in the nine-furlong GI Eddie Read S. over the oceanside turf course July 20.

Off a step slow from the four hole, the big bay regrouped to grab the lead while traveling in the two path into the first turn. Left alone to control a moderate pace down the backstretch, Obviously entered the stretch a length clear. Put to a drive by Joe Talamo, Obviously had to work to hold off He Be Fire N Ice and a fast-finishing Silentio, but he nonetheless bolstered his already glowing resume. A winner in his second outing at Cork in Ireland as a sophomore, Obviously added a victory over the Dundalk Polytrack before being picked up by Craig Rounsefell's Boomer Bloodstock and Jamie Lloyd for 130,000gns a few weeks later at the Tattersalls Horses in Training Sale. Obviously resurfaced last spring in Southern California for trainer Mike Mitchell, and earned his first Stateside victory in his second outing against optional claimers at Santa Anita last April.

He earned his first black-type victory in this event last year, and gathered the GII Arroyo Seco Mile before finishing third--beaten two lengths--behind Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) and Animal Kingdom (Leoroidesanimaux {Brz}) after making the early running in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. Resuming with a second-place effort in the GIII San Simeon at Santa Anita Apr. 20, Obviously bested Saturday's GII Del Mar H. placegetter Lucayan (Fr) (Turtle Bowl {Ire}) in Betfair Hollywood Park's GII American H. May 25, and was last seen earning his first top-level score in the GI Shoemaker Mile there June 29. Yesterday's victory was his sixth from seventh starts going a mile on the turf. "He didn't have that [winning] margin that he usually has, but he fired and he dug in when [He Be Fire N Ice] came at him," Mitchell noted. "It was a real good horse race. I don't tell Joe how to ride him; it's totally up to him, and I think he found out something today." Talamo was full of praise for his mount, adding, "He came away from there a little slow, but that's not unusual for him. I look now and see that he went the half in :46 4/5, and I can't believe it. That's as slow as he's ever gone. But he ran hard all the way. I got after him late, but I usually do. He's the kind of horse that if he gets out there on his own, he starts waiting on horses. When they come to him, he'll dig in and fight."

**GII Play the King cont.**

It was a new Dimension, for sure. The 5-year-old gelding had made five previous North American starts and had never been on the lead at any call, but a change in tactics here led to a career-best score. A handicap-type horse in Britain in 2011 and 2012, Dimension crossed the Atlantic last fall and ran fourth and then eighth in allowance races at Keeneland Oct. 14 and Churchill Nov. 16. Off for the winter, he ran on to be third in a one-mile Keeneland allowance Apr. 14, but could do no better than fifth in a similar spot at Indiana Downs May 21. Let go at 28-1 odds in the GIII Bold Venture S. July 17, he showed an affinity for the Woodbine sod with a rallying, near-miss second-place try, and was given more respect this time around while still at double digits. Up to lead from the rail draw under jockey David Moran, Dimension carved out snappy :22 1/5 and :44 1/5 splits as longshot Danger Baby (Stormy Atlantic) and Escaper pressed. Dimension was still going strong as the field fanned out behind him in upper stretch, and after a blistering three-quarter mark in 1:07 2/5, Dimension refused to relent and came home strongly. Escaper held for second, with Riding the River the only closer to make serious headway. Trainer Conor Murphy, who is based at the Skylight Training Center in Goshen, Kentucky, just outside of Louisville, explained, "His best trip in England and Europe was always seven furlongs [when he was] on a good, galloping track like this. He was in the GII Firecracker H. at Churchill back in June. But it rained very heavy a couple of hours before the race [eventually won by Horse of the Year Wise Dan]. He's a horse who loves fast ground, so we took him out of there. With this race in mind, I was going to run him in an allowance over seven on the turf course, but I had a look at the Bold Venture and there were only five runners, so we'd have a crack. He ran so well there."

As Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) flopped again when only fifth with no obvious excuse here, it was left to the improving 3-year-old Tres Blue to stake his claim for an Arc bid. Having won the Listed Coupe des Trois Ans over 12 furlongs at Lyon-Parilly May 9, he was third behind the subsequent G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner Flintshire (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in the G3 Prix du Lys over that trip at Chantilly June 16, and second to Lucky Speed (Ire) (Silvano {Ger}) in the G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg July 7. Taking on his elders in the G3 Prix de Reux over this track and trip last time Aug. 4, he was able to win a shade cosily there, and a victory in this would see him on the road to Longchamp's autumn showpiece. Beginning smartly before being positioned in a perfect spot stalking the aptly named Slow Pace and Penglai Pavilion against the fence, he was unhurried as Cirrus des Aigles was moved up to join the lead.

As that favorite failed to pick up in mid-stretch and started to tire, Fabrice Veron sent Tres Blue between him and the resilient Slow Pace and only managed to wear down the long-time leader in the final 50 meters as Penglai Pavilion joined in the slow-motion finish. "The more he runs, the better he is and he is very tough and courageous," trainer Henri-Alex Pantall commented. "We hesitated to come here, as it was between this and the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden, but with Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) going there we thought this would be easier and we made the right decision. He has had some hard races in close succession, so he will head straight to the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 6]."

Formally with Andre Fabre, Lockwood was entering the winner's circle for the first time since his triumph for his previous stable in the G3 Prix de Ris-Orangis at Maisons-Laffitte in July 2012 when taking a seven-furlong conditions race at Thirsk last time Aug. 3. Niggled along in the face of a strong early gallop to hold his midfield pitch here, the grey was shaken up and looking for room with 2 1/2 furlongs remaining. Seizing a gap soon after as Boom and Bust skipped clear, he responded gamely for the whip to run down that rival in the final 75 yards. "He was weak when he joined Godolphin and didn't show a lot," Saeed bin Suroor said. "Before he won last time, physically he had improved a lot and mentally he was happier. The ground today suited him and I said to the jockey to keep him handy and he showed a turn of foot. We'll need to see how he comes out of the race, but the [Sept. 7] G1 Haydock Sprint Cup is an option and if we were happy with him, we could give him the chance there. He handled the surface really well when he trained in Dubai and the Carnival could be a good opportunity for him when he has grown and improved."

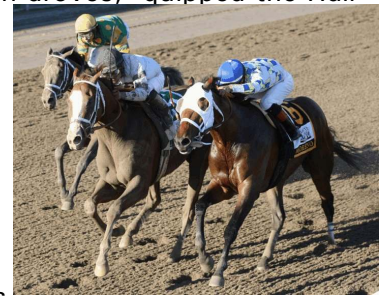

## LUKAS WEIGHS 'TAKE CHARGE' OPTIONS

The Saratoga base of D. Wayne Lukas was like Grand Central Station Sunday morning as the press converged after the stable's latest star **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) took down the GI Travers S. one day earlier. "They keep coming in droves," quipped the Hall of Fame trainer. "That's a good thing." As for the star of the show, Lukas said. "He's doing wonderful; really good. I'm very pleased with that. He had great energy this morning, out grazing and feeling good, very good."

According to Lukas, options for the Willis Horton runner's next assignment

include facing older rivals in the Sept. 28 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont or the GII Pennsylvania Derby for 3-year-olds Sept. 21. "One of them's a Grade I and very prestigious--if you were to win the Jockey Club, you'd go damn sure to the head of the division," Lukas said. "If you stay in your division, the million dollars is not necessarily bad, either. We'll weigh all the options. You get an extra week if you go to the Jockey Club, so that's also something." Early on Saturday's Travers Day card, speed proved to be king, but Will Take Charge overcame the bias when rallying off a modest early pace to peg frontrunner Moreno at the wire of the 'Midsummer Derby.' "I was concerned about the fractions," admitted Lukas. "I thought the fractions were way in favor of the horses that you all liked and not him. When they threw up that half-mile [1:48.88] and then the [1:13.43] for three quarters, I thought it was tailor made for the favorites. When you go 13 and four [fifths] and you're a world-class horse, you're supposed to finish." Winner of the Smarty Jones S. and GII Rebel S. earlier this season, Will Take Charge finished eighth in the GI Kentucky Derby, seventh behind sidelined stablemate Oxbow (Awesome Again) in the GI Preakness S., and 10th in the GI Belmont S. He came back to run a strong second--beaten just a length by Belmont winner Palace Malice (Curlin)--in the Spa's GII Jim Dandy S. July 27. "His trips were compromised [during the Triple Crown]," Lukas said. "His style of running puts him in a position where he has to have some things go his way. As he's gotten older and more mature now, mentally and physically, he's able to overcome that stuff. Early on in his career, that was the thing that probably slowed him up."



Travers Wrap up cont...

**Moreno Pennsylvania Derby Bound**

Southern Equine's **Moreno** (Ghostzapper), a gallant second behind Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) in Saturday's GI Travers S., is expected to remain at Saratoga and train up to the GII Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 21 at Parx, according to trainer Eric Guillot Sunday. Then, if all goes well, the striking colt will run in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita.

"We'd run him right out of his stall," Guillot said, referring to his home base on the West Coast. "It's my back yard. I've got to take that on."

Despite dealing with an abscess near the colt's throat all week, Guillot indicated Moreno was no worse for wear following his race in the 10-furlong marquee test for sophomores.

"That's an abscess that started [last] Monday," said Guillot. "I think the worst day was [Saturday]. We started compressing it."

While Guillot said the abscess had no impact on Moreno's performance, the strap from his blinkers wrapped around the abscess. He is treating the wound with silver sulfadiazine, a topical antibacterial.

"We're good to go now, but I thought I was going to have to scratch on Monday. We don't know what caused it--I think an ingrown hair, maybe, or he jerked back on the chain. It got infected and went the wrong way. You don't want to pack it and work on it too hard and too fast. Yesterday, we iced it. I gave him a lot of anti-inflammatories [after the race]."

A day removed from his front-running colt's gutsy race, Guillot reflected on the previous day's roller-coaster ride.

"That's what we wanted," Guillot said of the manageable early fractions. "That's why he got beat a whisker. It was a tough loss. It left me all emotional. I walked down to the track by myself. I wished everybody--50,000 people--just evaporated. I wanted to be by myself for a few minutes. Then I realized, 'I just got beat a whisker at 30-1 against the best of the best.' It's horse racing...I tried to not get all emotional and teared up, but I had to. I couldn't do it. I didn't see [owner] Michael [Moreno]; he was up in the box. I was in there 10 minutes later, and we were both crying."

Ever the jokster, Guillot added, "If his name was Guillot, he would have won by 20."

**On to J C Gold Cup for Orb**

**Orb** (Malibu Moon), coming off a third-place effort in Saturday's GI Travers S., will make his next start in the Sept. 28 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, according to Shug McGaughey Sunday morning. Winner of the GI Kentucky Derby, Orb finished fourth in the May 18 GI Preakness S. and third in the June 8 GI Belmont S. before receiving some time off at Fair Hill Training Center.

"I thought he ran a great race," said the Hall of Fame trainer, who trains the colt for Stuart S. Janney III and Phipps Stable. "He came to the paddock the way I wanted him to, and I thought he had running on his mind. I thought Jose [Lezcano, replacing injured Joel Rosario] rode him great. He was down on the inside the other two horses, and he couldn't get by Moreno, really, after that slow pace. I'm disappointed we didn't win, but I'm not disappointed in his effort one bit. I thought they did a terrific job with him."

Orb, who also won the GII Fountain of Youth S. and GI Florida Derby over the winter at Gulfstream, will be facing older horses for the first time in the Jockey Club Gold Cup.

"Now we've got a good, solid race under his belt, we've got all last winter and spring's stuff behind us," said McGaughey. "I think we can really move forward now. I'm going to look at the Gold Cup. That's not to say the Pennsylvania Derby or the Indiana Derby or something is completely out of the picture, but I think we want to go to the Gold Cup."

**Pletcher Duo Fine After Travers Efforts**

Trainer Todd Pletcher indicated Sunday morning that GI Travers S. favorite **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) and second choice **Palace Malice** (Curlin) returned from their respective seventh- and fourth-place efforts in good order, and that a decision on where the colts will appear next has yet to be finalized.

"We're disappointed," Pletcher said. "Any time [things don't go as planned], after a race you don't only look at that race but their entire body of work," said Pletcher. "As far as their next starts, we have no firm plans. We'll wait a few days and talk it over with [Dogwood Stables'] Mr. [Cot] Campbell and [Let's Go Stables and Coolmore] before we make any decisions."

While Palace Malice--winner of the June 8 GI Belmont S.--wound up beaten less than a length after stumbling at the start, Pletcher could offer no excuse for Verrazano, winner of Apr. 6 GI Wood Memorial Invitational at Aqueduct and runway victor of the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth July 28.

"[Verrazano] is still six-for-eight and a multiple Grade I winner," affirmed Pletcher. "We're disappointed in [Saturday's] performance, but we're not disappointed in the horse. I can't offer much excuse. I thought he was in a very good tactical position. [But] when Johnny [Velazquez] needed him to start picking it up around the half-mile pole, he just didn't have the response we were looking for."

As for Palace Malice, winner of the July 27 GII Jim Dandy S. in his latest start, Pletcher added, "[With Palace Malice], we weren't planning on being last going into the first turn behind a dawdling pace. I thought he had a winning race in him. Unfortunately, the start did not go well. Once that happened we were in a completely different spot than we anticipated being. Unfortunately, he came up a length short. For a number of reasons, the bad start was compromising. When you tack on the fact they didn't go very fast up front, I thought he ran a great race, considering all that."



### Pletcher Duo Fine... cont. from p14

As is its Sunday custom, the Pletcher barn was busy yesterday morning, sending out several of the barn's aces for their respective works. Among those on the main track worktab for Pletcher were last season's juvenile champion **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday), who worked five furlongs 1:00.91 in company with **Graydar** (Unbridled's Song), and **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song), who negotiated a half-mile in :48.19.

"Shanghai continues to go great," Pletcher said. "We're still a month or so away [from a start], but I like what we're seeing so far. He's coming back and getting fit a week or so ahead of what we anticipated. We're really pleased with him and happy to have him back."

Regarding the GI Whitney Invitational H. winner, Pletcher added, "Cross Traffic also went well," he added. "We'll make a decision [today] or the next day on whether he'll run in the [GI] Woodward [Saturday]."

### Mucho Macho Man Works

Multiple graded stakes winner **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) put in his final work for the Saturday's GI Woodward, breezing five furlongs in 1:03.50 over the main track Sunday morning. Hall of Fame jockey Edgar Prado was aboard for the work, the second for the 5-year-old since finishing third in the Aug. 3 GI Whitney H. "He went good," said Prado of Mucho Macho Man, who is trained by Kathy Ritvo for Reeves Thoroughbred Racing. "He went nice and easy the first part, picked it up and finished up good. That's what Kathy wanted, so that's what we did."

Prado has ridden Mucho Macho Man in his past two starts. He was third in the June 14 Criminal Type S. off a five-month layoff, and second, beaten 2 1/4 lengths, in the Whitney by front-running winner Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song). "He was running hard and strong every step of the way [in the Whitney]," said Prado. "I definitely think that he got something out of the race. He tries all the time. Both times I rode him, he tried real hard; he just couldn't catch the horse in front."

Mucho Macho Man won three of six starts in 2012, all stakes: the Sunshine Millions Classic, GII Gulfstream Park H. and GII Suburban H. at Belmont. He closed the year finishing a close-up second in both the Woodward and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. This year, Mucho Macho Man is 0-for-3, but Prado feels the horse is moving in the right direction.

"He is going good into this race," Prado said. "He's training very good. Kathy is happy, and I'm really happy with the way he's doing. Hopefully, the [Woodward] shapes up the way it did last time, and we'll be able to run those horses down."

## RACETRACK ROUND-UP

### Captain's Affair to Arlington-Washington Futurity...

Team Valor International Chief Executive Officer Barry Irwin confirmed yesterday that **Captain's Affair (Ire)** (Captain Rio {GB}) will line up in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity at Arlington Park Sept. 7.

A debut winner at Gowran Park in Ireland May 8 over a field that included three subsequent winners, including Group 3 winner Wilshire Boulevard (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), Captain's Affair was purchased privately by Team Valor following that effort. Rested for three months thereafter, the chestnut colt most recently finished fifth after setting the pace in the Listed Canford Cliffs S. Aug. 9 for trainer John Joseph Murphy. That event was won by Indian Maharaja (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), one of the early favorites for next year's G1 Epsom Derby.

"In that race, he was supposed to have followed a couple of horses, but the rider opted instead to make the pace on him, and the colt got very tired in the last furlong," Irwin noted.

### MAKYBE DIVA TO ALL TOO HARD

Four-time Group 1 winner All Too Hard (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}--Helsing {Aus}, by Desert Sun {GB}) will be the latest suitor for three-time G1 Melbourne Cup winning mare Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert King {Ire}), Vinery Stud confirmed via Twitter yesterday.

All Too Hard, who has just commenced his first season at stud at Vinery in the Hunter Valley for a fee of A\$66,000 (US\$59,598), earned his breakthrough Group 1 victory in last year's G1 Caulfield Guineas. He wrapped up his career with three straight top level scores in the C.F. Orr, Futurity and All Aged S. An A\$1.025-million Inglis Easter yearling purchase, All Too Hard is a half to world champion sprinter Black Caviar (Aus).

Makybe Diva, who made history by winning the Melbourne Cup in 2003, 2004 and 2005, has produced three foals to race, with just Rockstardom (Aus) (Galileo {Ire}) finding the winner's circle thus far.

### Calder to Reduce Overnight Purses:

Calder Casino and Race Course will reduce overnight purses by 12% starting Aug. 30. In a statement, the track blamed the decrease on overlapping race days in Florida and in conjunction with in-state simulcasting signals. Calder has been running head-to-head against crosstown rival Gulfstream Park since early July. "Purse dollars reflected in this cut have not evaporated," said Vice President and General Manager of Racing John Marshall. "The state's delay in addressing the issue enables purse dollars earned today to shift to other racetracks in the state, to be withheld from horsemen who are actually running live races, and to be paid in a future race meet. Neither Calder nor Gulfstream's racing product can sustain existing purse levels while overlapping without purse reduction or independent subsidy."
