



## FLAT OUT/'LARNED' WORK FOR WOODWARD

MGISWs **Flat Out** (Flatter) and **Fort Larned** (E Dubai) posted their final major preparatory moves Monday morning in advance of a tilt at Saturday's GI Woodward

at Saratoga. With regular exercise rider Neil Poznansky aboard, Flat Out covered four furlongs in :48.30 over the Oklahoma training track, the best of 44 works at the distance. The work came one day after trainer Bill Mott's other

Woodward entrant, **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate), went four furlongs in :49.30 at Oklahoma, second-best of 27 at the distance. "Ron was bucking and squealing [Sunday], and Neil thought Flat Out gave him a good feel this morning," Mott said. Flat Out, winner of the July 6 GII Suburban H. at Belmont in his latest start, won the GIII Westchester S. in April. Last term, he recorded his sole victory in the 10-furlong GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, a race he also won in 2011. In his most recent trip to the post, Ron the Greek finished fourth behind winner Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song) in the Aug. 3 GI Whitney Invitational H. "We had the option [to run Flat Out in the Whitney]," Mott said. "He had won the Suburban, and we thought if he was doing really, really well going into the Whitney, we'd run. We worked him and thought he maybe wasn't on his game 100%. He has always had issues with his feet, and we thought we needed a little more time for one of his feet. With that being said, we pointed to the Woodward. We didn't want to skip them both. This work today was as good as Neil has felt him. He gets on him every day, and he seemed to think he was more on his game than he has been some of his previous works."

Also working toward the Woodward, Fort Larned went out shortly after 6:30 a.m. Monday morning and was clocked in 1:00.86 on the main track. Trainer Ian Wilkes caught the 5-year-old galloping out six furlongs in 1:12 3/5. "It was a nice work, and I'm very pleased with it," said Wilkes. "The only thing I can control is my horse, and I'm happy with him." Fort Larned, victorious in last season's Whitney and GI Breeders' Cup Classic, was an impressive 6 1/4-length of the June 15 GI Stephen Foster H. Most recently, the bay tired to fifth in the most recent renewal of the Whitney. "Last year, he was running all year," said Wilkes. "I feel this year he needs more racing. After this, we're definitely going to look at the Jockey Club Gold Cup [Sept. 28]."

## BREEDERS' CUP OPTION FOR JWALA

Connections of Friday's G1 Nunthorpe S. heroine **Jwala** (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) has the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint as a potential aim to bring down the curtain on her career, trainer Robert Cowell announced yesterday. Successful at 40-1 in York's five-furlong sprint, Manor Farm Stud and Sheila Hoare's 4-year-old half-sister to Airwave (GB) (Air Express {Ire}) will head to the Oct. 6 G1 Qatar Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp on the Arc card en route to a possible engagement at Santa Anita.



"She seems to have come out of **Jwala** (GB) *Racing Post* it in really good order," Cowell told *PA Sport*. "The Abbaye is definite and she won't be racing next year, but there's a possibility she may take up an invite for the Breeders' Cup. It's something she's got an automatic invitation to. The owners are mulling over their options at the moment. They probably don't have a lot to lose, so there's a small chance she may take up that engagement as well, but we'll see."

## NEXT STOP FOR 'DELTA' TRAIN: BELDAME

**Royal Delta** (Empire Maker), dominant winner of Sunday's GI Personal Ensign H., will try and defend her title in the Sept. 28 GI Beldame Invitational before a tilt at the Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita Nov. 1-2. Like last year, she will be cross-entered in both the Distaff and the Classic, according to trainer Bill Mott. **Cont. p3**

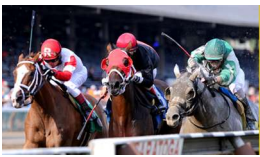

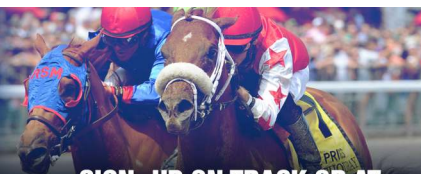

“She looked fine; she was good this morning,” said Mott. “Looked like she’s got another one in her. If she runs in the Beldame, we go to the Breeders’ Cup. She could be nominated [to both the Classic and Distaff] the same way she was last year, but I don’t think anything is written in stone yet. I think that would be a conversation for something closer to the race. I don’t think it’s something we’re going to plan on now. It’s an option.” Royal Delta kicked off 2013 with a five-length score in the Feb. 17 GIII Sabin S. at Gulfstream before failing to fire and coming home a well-beaten 10th on the Tapeta in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 30. Not fully back to her old self when second in the June 15 GII Fleur de Lis H. at Churchill Downs, she came back to blow the doors off with a rousing 10 3/4-length score in the July 20 GI Delaware H. “I heard [the crowd] when she crossed the wire and, obviously, I was standing out in front with [owner] Mr. [Ben] Leon,” Mott said. “He was beside me, and as she was approaching, everybody was applauding, and I said, ‘Listen to this behind you.’ It made him feel good. I didn’t have to tell him, but I said, ‘It’s nice. People still appreciate seeing a good horse.’ To see the consistency; they’re just very gallant animals, particularly one like her.”

## RACETRACK ROUND-UP

### Pletcher Gears Up For Big Weekend

GI Whitney H. winner and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song) is being “very strongly” considered for Saturday’s GI Woodward, according to trainer Todd Pletcher. Pletcher is also considering Belmont’s GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 28 as an alternative. “There’s a good chance he will be entered,” Pletcher said of the Woodward. “[The decision will be based on] what I think gives us the best chance to win the Breeders’ Cup Classic,” he said. “There are a lot of variables. The horse is here, he’s doing well, he won the Whitney over the racetrack. He also ran very well at Belmont. I’d say it’s more likely that we run here than we won’t.”

Pletcher is also aiming a pair of 2-year old fillies for Sunday’s GI Spinaway S. in ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Sweet Whiskey** (Old Fashioned) and **Stopchargingmaria** (Tale of the Cat). The former breezed a half-mile bullet in :47.69 Monday morning. “[Sweet Whiskey] was impressive,” said Pletcher. “I wasn’t surprised she did that. She’s a pretty forward-training filly that’s pretty fast. She wasn’t being asked to do it; she was doing it because she was happy.” Stopchargingmaria went five panels in 1:00.84 in company with **Elena Strikes** (Smart Strike) on Monday. “I thought that both fillies were very, very good,” said Pletcher. “I’m really pleased with the way they went, and we’re optimistic.”

### Lea to Contest Forego

GIII Commonwealth Turf S. winner **Lea** (First Samurai) will be aimed for Saturday's GI Forego S. at Saratoga, trainer Al Stall said yesterday. The colt was most recently third behind Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 10 and has made just one previous dirt start in his career when he won an optional claimer at Churchill Downs June 1. "He ran so well in that one [dirt] race," said Stall. "We like the way

the horse is training, and if you go by [Ragozin numbers], the race on dirt was the best race in his life by many, many points. The next race was either the [GII Bernard] Baruch [Saturday], which we didn't want to do, or the [GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 15] with Wise Dan at level weights, or the [Grade I] Shadwell [Turf Mile Oct. 15] with Wise Dan at level weights, so we'll go back to dirt and see if it works."

### Zinzay to Jessamine; Center Court to Rood & Riddle

Trainer George "Rusty" Arnold confirmed yesterday that Regis Racing's **Zinzay** (Smart Strike), a debut winner going 8 1/2 furlongs on the turf at Saratoga Sunday, will make her next start in the GIII Jessamine S. at Keeneland Oct. 9. "I never expect them to pull out a victory," said Arnold. "I expect them to run well. She had trained well and we thought she had performed well, and that's all you can ask for a 2-year-old first-time starter. Winning is just a bonus." He added, "She did everything right," said Arnold. "She acted good in the paddock, she acted good in the gate. She broke well and did everything the right way. We're very happy with her. She had trained well, but you don't know if they are going to do it until they do it." Zinzay is the first foal to race out of Music Room (Unbridled's Song), an unraced half-sister to Music Note (A.P. Indy), who posted Grade I wins in the Beldame, Coaching Club American Oaks, Ballerina and Mother Goose on the dirt; and Musical Chimes (In Excess {Ire}), who captured the Group 1 Poule d'Essai Des Poulisches and GI John C. Mabee H. on the turf. "She likes the grass," said Arnold of the juvenile. "Her works were better on the grass. I don't think she is going to see the dirt."

**Centre Court** (Smart Strike), eighth in the GII Ketel One Ballston Spa Saturday, has been sent to Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington to undergo a nuclear scan, Arnold confirmed yesterday. "She's sound, but something has gone amiss that I haven't found," said Arnold. "I worked hard trying to find it, but I'm missing something. She's going to be examined on Wednesday morning, and then I'll get a report from [Dr. Larry Bramlage]. She trained sensationally, but something has changed in the afternoon. She wasn't comfortable leaving the gate, she had her head in the air, she was bearing out. Nothing was right. Something is there that I'm missing and all of my vets are missing."

**Wired Bryan** (Stormy Atlantic), winner of the July 21 GII Sanford S., posted his first work yesterday morning since finishing a nose behind winner **Corfu** (Malibu Moon) in the Aug. 11 GII Saratoga Special S. Trained by Michael Dilger, Wired Bryan covered five panels in 1:00.88 over the Oklahoma training track, the fastest of nine horses at the distance Monday. According to Dilger, the colt will try and turn the tables on Corfu in the GI Hopeful S. Sept. 2.

“We wanted a good work this morning, [and] good horses work fast,” said Dilger. “I’m very pleased with the way he worked. As long as he’s fine tomorrow, we’ll go ahead and enter him for Monday.”

As for the tough beat in the Saratoga Special, Dilger added, “It was a tough race for both horses, but I’m very happy with his weight and his overall condition since that race, and I’m very pleased with the way he worked this morning. I’m looking forward to the race.”

One of this year’s top juvenile fillies is the G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. and G2 Lowther S. winner Lucky Kristale (GB) (Lucky Story), and her Intikhab half-brother is offered by John Troy as hip [131](#), while others with smart connections include Rossenara Stud’s hip [256](#), a daughter of the increasingly-influential aforementioned Dark Angel whose full-brother Heeraat (GB) took the G3 Hackwood S. last month, and whose half-sister Ambiance (Ire) (Camacho {GB}) is a Listed-winning juvenile, and Ballyphilip Stud’s hip [469](#), an Arcano half-sister to the Group 1-winning Xtension (Ire) (Xaar {GB}).

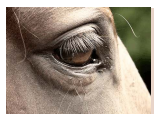

Years ago, when the 2-year-old programs in Britain and Ireland were largely geared to excellence over five and six furlongs, the phenomenon of the "short runner" wasn't uncommon. These sprinters virtually needed a downhill track and a following wind to have a hope of lasting the minimum trip of five furlongs.

Today, you will find that quite a few of the top European sprinters have elements of stamina in their pedigrees, good examples in the last 10 years being the July Cup winners Sakhee's Secret, Marchand d'Or and Les Arcs, all of whom were sired by Group 1 winners over a mile and a quarter or more. It was Oasis Dream, another July Cup winner with staying elements in his pedigree, who was responsible for Jwala, last week's shock winner of the G1 Nunthorpe S. over five furlongs.

Oasis Dream's first three dams were by Dancing Brave, Mill Reef and Busted, all excellent winners of the King George over a mile and a half. However, Oasis Dream took much more after his sire Green Desert--another July Cup winner--and was all about speed, as he showed in the 2003 Nunthorpe. In stopping the clock at :56.20 seconds, he fell just 0.04 seconds short of the track record, and there was speculation that he would have broken the record had his rider been more forceful in the closing stages.

With his mixed ancestry Oasis Dream has inevitably sired a wide variety of winners. Among his 10 Group 1 winners you'll find four which scored graded/group victories over a mile and a quarter or more, notably that grand filly Midday (Yorkshire Oaks, Prix Vermeille and Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf). Another example is Strathnaver, a mile-and-a-half Grade III winner at Keeneland this year. He has even sired Address Unknown, winner of this year's Chester Cup over two and a quarter miles, and the St Leger third Monitor Closely.

At the other end of the distance scale is his impressive collection of juvenile group winners, which features such as Arcano, Power, Naaqoos, Showcasing, Approve, Misheer, Visit and Captain Gerrard (himself a prolific sire of juvenile winners in his first crop this year). And his ten Group 1 winners also include two top winners over the minimum trip, namely the 2011 King's Stand S. winner Prohibit and now Jwala.

Jwala's breeders, the Watson family, have reaped the rewards of consistently breeding for speed with a family which was classified as non-thoroughbred until Jwala's second dam Thorner Lane met the criteria for inclusion in the General Stud Book.

Just how much this family merited inclusion in the Stud Book was amply demonstrated by Jwala's distinguished half-sister Airwave, who finished a close sixth in the 2004 Nunthorpe, having earlier won the G1 Cheveley Park S. and G2 Temple S. Airwave was sold for 550,000gns as a 4-year-old and her record earned her the right to visit stallions of the caliber of Giant's Causeway, Storm Cat and Galileo. The first of her Galileo foals was her Group 3 winner Aloof and her Storm Cat filly, Meow, was a speedy listed winner who failed by only a neck to take the G2 Queen Mary S.

Timeform described Jwala's fifth dam, Midnight Dollar, simply as a National Hunt mare, i.e. a jumper, but she was mated with the headstrong Constable, one of the fastest 2-year-olds of 1954. *Timeform's* analysis of this colt stated that "we doubt if any 2-year-old could have beaten him over four furlongs. His high nervous energy, however, burns up his stamina quickly."

Fortunately for the Masons, their Constable filly took after her sire rather than her dam. Named Penny Pincher, she raced from two to five and earned the respectable *Timeform* rating of 95, plus an assessment that included "unlikely to stay beyond 5f."

More speed was added to the mix when Penny Pincher visited Blue Cashmere, winner of the 1974 Nunthorpe, to produce the five-furlong winner Spinner.

Spinner's greatest distinction was that she was a half-sister to the very speedy Clantime, a winner of nine races over the minimum trip who contested the 1987 Nunthorpe.

Spinner in turn was mated to Tina's Pet, who was fourth in the 1982 Nunthorpe after winning the King George S. over five furlongs. That mating resulted in Jwala's second dam Thorner Lane, a dual winner over five furlongs. Thorner Lane produced Jwala's dam Kangra Valley to a mating with Indian Ridge, a high-class sprinter whose sire Ahonoora and broodmare sire Swing Easy were both awarded victory in the Nunthorpe (or William Hill Sprint Championship as it was known when Ahonoora won it). Guess what? Kangra Valley's only win came over the minimum trip.

So Jwala was sired by a Nunthorpe winner from a female line which has consistently proved best suited by five furlongs, so it is hardly surprising that Jwala has been campaigned exclusively over that distance since she failed to win any of her four starts over six furlongs as a juvenile.

It makes an interesting exercise to compare Jwala's background with that of Sweet Lulu, the American-bred daughter of Mr. Greeley who kept her unbeaten record intact when she tackled one of America's premium speed contests for three-year-old fillies, the GI Test S.

In a country which stages no Grade I races over less than six furlongs, and only a handful at that distance, the speedier horses in the U.S. often have pedigrees which could see them cope with a wider range of distances than their European counterparts.

Just look at some of the names in Sweet Lulu's pedigree. Her sire Mr. Greeley won over a mile at two but gained his three graded successes over shorter distances and was probably best known for his close second in the Breeders' Cup Sprint.

It was a similar story with her broodmare sire Orientate, who gained his stakes victories at three over a mile and 1 1/16 miles. However, he shone over shorter distances at four, when his victory in the Breeders' Cup Sprint earned him the title of champion sprinter. Orientate shared the same sire, the fast Mt. Livermore, as another champion sprinter, Housebuster.

Sweet Lulu is inbred 3x4 to Mr. Prospector through his sons Gone West and Gulch. Although these contemporaries often flirted with longer distances in search of greater prestige and prize-money, they were ideally suited to distances around a mile, and Gulch was also fast enough to win the 1988 Breeders' Cup Sprint, along with the title of champion sprinter.

Sweet Lulu's dam Successful Outlook, winner of the GIII Tempted S. over a mile at two, also had the distinction of being inbred 3x3 to the outstanding Blushing Groom. Although his class enabled him to take third place in the Derby, Blushing Groom possessed impressive speed at up to a mile, as he showed in landing France's top four juvenile prizes in 1976. It is hardly surprising that Sweet Lulu has already scored over a mile, and her stamina helped win the day at Saratoga.
