LOPRESTI LOOKING FORWARD TO WEEKEND

While reigning Horse of the Year **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) will be tucked away in his stall this weekend, his older half-brother **Successful Dan** (Successful Dan) and rejuvenated fellow stable companion **Turallure** (Wando) will fly the flag for trainer Charles LoPresti in Saturday's GI Woodward S. and GI Bernard Baruch H., respectively, with Breeders' Cup goals on the horizon.

Now seven, Successful Dan will face the starter for just the 15th time in his career and is still in search of that elusive Grade I victory, after losing the 2011 Clark H. via a controversial decision from Churchill stewards.

"It would mean more to me than any race than I've ever won, and I don't say that lightly," LoPresti told a national media teleconference Tuesday morning. "I just think that this particular horse--we've been through so much with him and I would just like for everybody to see that he is as good a horse as I've said all along. It would mean

a great deal to me to see this horse win. He has a special place in all our hearts."

With nearly as many stops throughout his career as he has starts, Successful Dan has been plagued by suspensory problems and a smattering of bad luck, but has been brilliant at times. Winner at three of the GI Northern Dancer S., he overcame a 13-month absence to annex the GI Fayette S. as a 4-year-old in 2010. After begin demoted from the victory in that year's Clark, the homebred went missing again--this time for nearly a year and a half--returning to best subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Fort Larned (E Dubai) in the GI Alysheba S. in May 2012. Sidelined off a runner-up effort to that Ian Wilkes trainee in the GI Cornhusker H. the following month, Successful Dan wired this year's GI Ben Ali S. at Keeneland Apr. 21 and was a disappointing and inexplicable fourth behind Fort Larned in the GI Stephen Foster H. June 15. He took his chance against a star-studded bunch in the Whitney, but horror struck as they were leaving the paddock when he reared and fell to the ground.

"He has never, ever done that," LoPresti explained. "I think I had him pretty sharp for that race, but I don't know why he did that. From what I understand, something spooked him, he ran backwards and lost his balance and over he went. He ran a great race in spite of that. I have to think that maybe it took a little bit out of him when he hit the ground as hard as he did. So maybe he wasn't into the race the first part of it, took him a while to get his feet underneath him, but he made up a lot of ground and ran really hard. I'm hoping he'll be a little closer this time, a little sharper." **Cont. p3**

NO MORE FOR NO NAY NEVER

Wesley Ward yesterday announced that the unbeaten **No Nay Never** (Scat Daddy) will not race again in 2013. Having broken new ground with wins in the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot and the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville, the largely Coolmore-owned colt will be rested before being targeted at next

year's G1 St James's Palace S. at the Royal meeting. "He is in beautiful shape and came back from Deauville looking absolutely fantastic," Ward told *PA Sport*. "I've spoken with Mr. [John] Magnier, Mr. [Michael] Tabor, Mr. [Derrick] Smith, Paul

Shanahan and all the other wonderful partners involved with the horse to see what we should do from here. He has done quite a bit already this year and I would hate to push the envelope with him. I think we are going to give him a couple of months in the field here in Ashford in Lexington. I can't think of a more beautiful and tranquil place for the horse to have some down-time and get some long grass. At the moment, we are thinking of the G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot next year and working backwards from there. That might seem a long way off, but, in the great scheme of things, next year actually isn't all that far away and I have had success previously when you have a target in your mind." **Cont. p4**

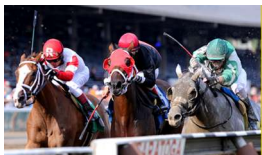

Indeed, Successful Dan, who received final vet clearance at the stalls that day, appeared lethargic in the early stages of the Whitney, falling as many as a dozen lengths behind. But he began to find his best stride on the turn and closed the margin to three-parts of a length on the wire. So, what will need to happen in the Woodward to turn the tables?

“There needs to be a lot more pace in front--I was really expecting that [in the Whitney],” LoPresti offered. “Cross Traffic got an easy first quarter and I was really proud of our horse. He really closed a lot of ground and ran really good. Cross Traffic is a really good horse, he’s really improving, but I’m hoping that they go faster up front than they did.”

LoPresti is willing to allow Wise Dan to continue to do his talking on the turf--at least for the rest of this season--(“I don’t see too many horses beating him right now the way he is,” he said), and adds that his half-brother is a dirt horse through and through.

“Successful Dan is different, he’s a strong horse, he’s a big horse and he’s so much better on the dirt than Wise Dan,” the conditioner offered. “Successful Dan is a true dirt warrior. He reminds me of the great old geldings of the years gone by, the Foregos and those kind of horses, because of the way he’s built and the way he runs and trains on the dirt. He’s had a lot of hard luck with his suspensory injuries, but, knock on wood, I think that’s all behind him. Wise Dan is a very sound horse, he’s very easy to train and he’s an overachiever. You don’t have to breeze him very often, you don’t have to have him on a set schedule because the way he gallops and trains in the morning, he puts so much into it. He keeps himself fit and he’s a horse who tells you when he’s ready to run.”

LoPresti is looking forward to the challenge of this weekend and seems ready to take the next step if Successful Dan performs the way he expects him to.

“It’s been kind of tough at times, but maybe we’ll shine this time,” LoPresti offered. “I’m excited to run this horse. He’s training good, he’s doing good, he’s had super-good breezes, everything’s good with his legs. I’m glad to see there’s been some new additions. It may change the complexion of the race.”

He added, “I think that the further he goes, the better he’s going to be,” when asked about his charge’s ability to stay the 10 furlongs of a race like the GI Breeders’ Cup Classic. “As you saw in his last race--I’m not taking anything away from the other horses and Cross Traffic ran a great race--if you look at the rest of the field and how much ground Successful Dan was making up...he really started rolling around the turn. He’ll run all day is what I’m trying to say. I don’t think the distance is ever going to be the problem for that horse. The big thing for him is the pace scenario where nobody is going to steal the race. If he’s got a fair shot to be four or five lengths off a really good pace, I think he’s going to show you he can go that far.”

While the Dans have helped tremendously to make LoPresti’s a household name, it was Turallure who provided the trainer with some of his most thrilling moments, with a score in the 2011 GI Woodbine Mile before missing by a nose in the GI Breeders’ Cup Mile six weeks later. The homebred has failed to win in seven subsequent starts, with just a pair of minor placings, but LoPresti thinks he has the 6-year-old sitting on go in Saturday’s Bernard Baruch.

“He hasn’t run any bad races, but he hasn’t been brilliant the way he was,” LoPresti admits. “I had this in the back of my mind that sometimes these older horses get a bit complacent where they’re at. Keeneland is kind of a quiet atmosphere and we kind of go through the motions there. But right before we came to Saratoga right after that race at Arlington [a fifth the June 8 Swoon’s Son S.], he started to show some real spark again. I wanted to get him back up to Saratoga where he really shined a couple of years ago. Once I got him up here, the old Turallure was back. He was sharp and looking out his window and watching the races.” Sent off at 9-1 in a July 24 allowance over a mile, he was last in the middle stages, but came running to miss by a head ([video](#)). “He was brilliant in his training and he ran a great race,” LoPresti commented. “He’s trained really forward and I’ll be disappointed if he doesn’t run good. I think we have him back where he was.” **Cont. p4**

Assuming Turallure runs well, LoPresti will be faced with one of those 'good' problems, namely how to manage a pair of top milers.

"I do want to give Turallure a chance to get to the Breeders' Cup, so to keep them apart would be the best-case scenario," he explained. "I don't want to beat the Horse of the Year, but I feel I have an obligation to the owner that has Turallure and I don't want to keep him on the sidelines just to keep him away from Wise Dan. The thing about the Bernard Baruch this year is that it's a week later, so it'd be almost impossible to take Turallure to Woodbine. I think it makes more sense to look at the million-dollar race [Woodbine Mile] with Wise Dan and see what happens with Turallure." One potential spot is the \$750,000 GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland Oct. 5.--*Alan Carasso*

No More for No Nay Never (cont. from p1)

"The St. James's Palace is a very prestigious and important race in Europe, it's an important stallions' race and I think that is an attainable target for him," Wesley Ward continued. "In all three of his races he has kept running. He hasn't been holding on at the end and I think a mile is 100% within his reach. If we give him a little breather now, give him a physical break and some time to get himself together, I hope he can go and show how good he can be as a 3-year-old, just as he has dominated at two. We could pick him up in the middle of November, right after the Breeders' Cup, and then start building him up again. The first race I have in mind for him is the GIII Transylvania S., which would be a good place to start him as he would not be meeting the best 3-year-old milers. Hopefully then he could run in the GII American Turf S., which is run on Kentucky Derby day at Churchill Downs. That would be a stiffer test than his first run of the year at Keeneland and would give us five or six weeks then to get him to Royal Ascot. We will see how things progress and I will talk to the Coolmore boys, but that is the plan I am looking at. I couldn't be happier with him and he is an amazingly sound horse, considering all the traveling he has done. We are just so privileged and blessed to have a colt like him."

TAPESTRY ADDED TO MOYGLARE MIX

🌟 **"TDN Rising Star"** 🌟 **Tapestry (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) was yesterday supplemented for the seven-furlong G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh on Sunday. Following Susan Magnier's unbeaten filly's latest success in the G2 Debutante S. over the same track and trip Aug. 11, Tapestry was added at a cost of €22,500 to swell the Ballydoyle contingent to four. Qatar Racing's G3 Albany S. winner **Kiyoshi (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is set to make her eagerly awaited return after a break, having captured an extremely strong renewal of that six-furlong Royal Ascot contest June 21. "We are very happy with her and looking forward to running her over seven furlongs," said trainer Charlie Hills yesterday. "It's a galloping track and should suit her."

Also from Britain is Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum's June 19 G2 Queen Mary S. scorer **Rizeena (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}), who was third in last Sunday's G1 Prix Morny at Deauville, while an intriguing contingent among the 13 fillies remaining is Jim Bolger's unraced **Prudent Approach (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}), a full-sister to Dawn Approach (Ire).

A colt from the first crop of Rathasker Stud's Fast Company (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) led the way during an upbeat first session of the DBS Premier Yearling

Sale, which saw 218 yearlings gross £6,886,600. The average rose 9.8% to £31,589 and the median was up 10.6% to £26,000. Nicolas de Watrigant's Mandore International Agency paid a session-topping £210,000 (US\$326,537) for hip [252](#). The handsome February-foaled bay from Glacken

View Stud--is out of a half to Shadwell's graded stakes winner Elhayq (Ire) (Nashwan) from the extended family of sires Al Hareb and Kendam (Fr). Not surprisingly given his pedigree, the €35,000 GOFNOV weanling drew the attention of Shadwell's Angus Gold, but he lost out with de Watrigant in determined mood buying for Sheikh Joaan Al Thani.

"He is an outstanding individual, the best horse in the sale," de Watrigant told the *Racing Post*. "He looks a proper racehorse. He'll go to Richard Hannon and is the first horse Sheikh Joaan has bought at this sale." His purchase came just moments before David Redvers stepped in on behalf of the same connections to secure the top-priced filly of the day by Dark Angel (Ire).

From John McEnery's Rossenara Stud, hip [256](#) is a full-sister to this year's G3 Hackwood S. scorer Heeraat (GB) and a half to Ambiance (Ire) (Camacho {GB}), winner of the Listed Dragon S. and placed third in the G3 Molecomb S. as well as fourth in the G1 Prix Morny. After signing the docket at £130,000, Redvers told the trade daily, "She's got a great current pedigree and is a fantastic individual who is correct and looks a real athlete."

Art on Show...

This year, Dutch Art (GB) has had his already-solid credentials advertised further by, among others, the G2 Lennox S. winner Garswood (GB) and G1 July Cup third Slade Power (Ire) and the Cheveley Park Stud resident was responsible for a highlight of the session when one of his daughters sold for £120,000. Offered as hip [129](#) by Houghton Bloodstock on behalf of Pantile Stud, who had earlier sold another Dutch Art filly, hip [122](#), for £70,000, she is out of an unraced full-sister to the 1992 G2 Champagne S. winner and 1993 G1 2000 Guineas fourth Petardia (GB) (Petong {GB}). "She's for a partnership with David Wachman," BBA Ireland's Adrian Nicoll told the *Post* after securing the March-foaled bay, whose full-sister had been bought by Tony Neres for £110,000 at this auction 12 months ago. "We thought she was one of the best fillies here, but we were at our limit. She's a real athlete and a gorgeous filly. The good ones are selling well and below that it's a little tricky."

Pantile Stud plays host to just seven mares and owner Colin Murphy was understandably delighted with his trades, adding, "It's been a brilliant day and it'll pay some of the bills. A lot of the credit must go to my stud manager Bo Hicks-Little as she has done a fantastic job. I've used Dutch Art right from the beginning, I like his family and Cheveley Park have been very good to us. I bought [the dam] Petong's Pet as a yearling at Tattersalls and sent her to Rae Guest, but unfortunately she never raced." The upsurge in the fortunes of Camacho (GB) in 2013 has seen the former Juddmonte colorbearer move back to Gay O'Callaghan's Morristown Lattin Stud and it was one of his representatives who had long featured as the top-priced colt of the session when selling to trainer Clive Cox for £105,000. Also from the draft of Rossenara Stud, hip [156](#) is a grandson of the listed-placed and Ebor H. winner Tuning (GB) (Rainbow Quest), whose son Tuning Fork (GB) (Alzao) was runner-up in the 2003 G2 Dante S. *Cont. p6*

The Dandy Man Can...

The freshman year of Dandy Man (Ire) has yielded a plethora of winners, including the three-time Group 2-placed Parbold (Ire), and it was that G2 Coventry S. runner-up's owner David Armstrong who signed the docket at £100,000 for one of the Ballyhane Stud sire's colts in the name of his Highfield Farm. Presented as hip [61](#) by that establishment, the April-foaled bay is the first produce out of a dual-winning daughter of Marju (Ire) who hails from the family of 1995 GI Sword Dancer Invitational winner Kiri's Clown. That price was later matched by Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock for Lynn Lodge Stud's hip [201](#), a son of Pastoral Pursuits (GB) from the family of the top Singapore performer Mr Big (Aus) (Elusive Quality) and Declaration of War (War Front).

Coolmore sire Rip Van Winkle (Ire) caused a splash at Deauville last week and, with just one colt available this week, he inevitably drew the operation's adjutants into the fray. Consigned by Floors Stud as hip [68](#), the February bay is a grandson of the 1995 Listed Empress S. victress Maid For the Hills (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) who hails from the extended family of the 2004 GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic victor Stroll.

"He's a grand horse and a good mover from a very good stud," Demi O'Byrne told the *Post* after outgunning Anthony Stroud Bloodstock's Matt Coleman at £90,000. Active throughout the opening session, Shadwell consolidated its position as the day's leading buyer when striking at £90,000 for a John Troy-consigned son of Derrinstown sire Intikhab. Offered as hip [131](#), he is a half-brother to leading juvenile distaffer Lucky Kristale (GB) (Lucky Story), who was impressive in both last month's G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. and last week's G2 Lowther S., and improved upon the 25,000gns he cost as a Tattersalls December foal. The March chestnut is also from the family of the 1987 G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas hero Don't Forget Me (Ire).

SEPTEMBER TIME

Speaking of revamping sales, which we have been (see *WST p8*) in the context of Arqana's new "v.2" Deauville sale a week ago Tuesday, this year we see another new, revised format for the Keeneland September Sale. Last year, you'll recall, there was a one-day Book 1 with just 132 yearlings catalogued, of which just 75 (57% of those catalogued) sold, followed by a three-day Book 2. This year, Book 1 is Week 1: four sessions, Monday-Thursday, with Friday off as usual, 875 catalogued total (219 a session), with sessions beginning at noon. It's a good move, because it's a realistic one.

The inconvenience for buyers is that they have to stay in town all week, because it starts Monday with a Pulpit colt out of Fairy Princess and ends Thursday night with a Malibu Moon colt out of Eyes on Eddy--once through the catalogue, alphabetical by dam. The inconvenience for consignors is that Thursday horses could end up being on the grounds for a week. But these logistical issues will just have to iron themselves out. The basic format--the same one Tattersalls now uses for its three-day October 1 sale--is the right one for today's market.

Last year there were 1,047 yearlings catalogued in the first week, but representing just 91 sires--an average of 11.5 yearlings per sire. This year the 875 Book 1 yearlings (a drop of 16% in the number catalogued in Week 1) represent just 76 sires--an average of 11.5 yearlings per sire. So the concentration of class is exactly the same: 11.5 yearlings per Week 1 sire; but about one of every six Week 1 sires from last year (numerically, anyway) have been moved into Week 2--though those would have been the 'borderline' Week 1 sires, one assumes. The most important comparison to be made on Friday the 13th will be this: last year, 655 yearlings sold in Week 1 (only 62.6% of those catalogued, by the way) averaged \$202,829. The measure of Book 1 yearlings this year will be the \$200,000 average--and how close to 655 sold can a catalogue of 875 accomplish? If a clearance rate of 150 per day can be achieved (that would be 68% of those catalogued), the drop in number sold for the week could be restricted to under 10%. If the average can gain 10%, to \$220,000, last year's Week 1 gross of \$132-million could be equaled.

Of the 76 stallions represented in this year's Book 1/Week 1 (see *table p10-11*), there are 18 with 20 or more yearlings catalogued in the first week, and these 18 account for 590, or 67%, of the yearlings catalogued. There is a huge preponderance of proven sires among these 18: no sires with their first 3-year-olds, or with their first 2-year-olds, are among those with 20+ in Book 1/Week 1.

Claiborne's **Blame**, who as far as I can tell all sectors of the market embrace (even the Europeans, because he's by Arch), is the only first-year sire with 20 or more catalogued in Book 1. He has 26, plus another 15 in Week 2, for 41 total throughout the sale. The other 17 sires with 20+ catalogued are all sires with 4-year-olds of 2013 or older. There can be no doubt one big effect of the World Financial Meltdown of 2008 on the Thoroughbred market was that breeders fled to the relative perceived safety of proven sires--known quantities--and that has led to a wholesale abandonment of younger, unproven sires.

So the Book 1 sire index reads like a Who's Who of America's proven sires. The top three in number catalogued are: Ashford's **Giant's Causeway** (50); Spendthrift's **Malibu Moon** (49); and Gainesway's **Tapit** (49). That's 148 catalogued among the three, or 17% of Book 1; so every sixth yearling you see in the book is by one of these three sires. Taylor Made's late **Unbridled's Song** (37) is one of six other thoroughly established sires with 30 or more catalogued in Book 1. The other five are: Lane's End's **Smart Strike** (36); WinStar's **Tiznow** (36) and **Distorted Humor** (34); Claiborne's new version of the great Danzig, **War Front** (35); and Darley's **Medaglia d'Oro** (34). Besides War Front (first foals 2008, 5-year-olds of 2013), the only others of these nine sires to have had their first foals since 2003 are two of the killer F2006 sire group, Tapit and Medaglia d'Oro. The other two big stars from that group, WinStar's current number one sire in North America, **Speightstown** (26), and **Candy Ride** (24), from his second Lane's End crop, are also among the 18 sires with 20+ catalogued in Book 1. None of those 18, by the way, have fewer than nine yearlings catalogued in Week 2, so you'll still be seeing yearlings by them during the second week. Candy Ride has 55 catalogued in the second week (for 79 total); Malibu Moon has another 38 catalogued (87 total, tops for all sires); and Giant's Causeway has another 24 in the second week, for 74 total.

Six other sires have 20+ catalogued in Week 1, including Airdrie's late **Indian Charlie**, who has 29 yearlings from his last crop catalogued in Book 1 (plus another 23 in Book 2). From 11 offered at the sales so far this year, six have sold, for an average of \$351,035 (per TDN's Instatistics); the buyers are really going for his stock.

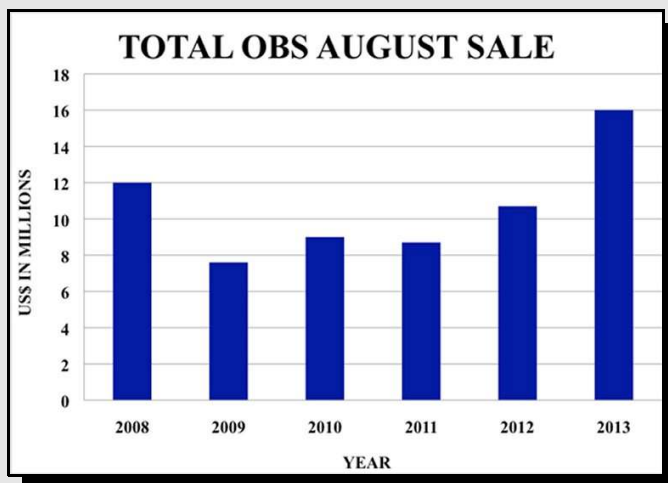
"Though Arqana has now divided the two sales and reconfigured them, four days is still four days, so for the moment it's still relevant to look at them combined. It's a good story, too: 16% more horses sold for 27% more money (up almost €8-million) and a 10% gain in average compared with last year. The better comparison may be with 2011, though, as 2012 was down €3-million from 2011; compared to 2011, this year saw 1% more (four) sold for a 15% higher gross and a 13% higher average; still a good story."

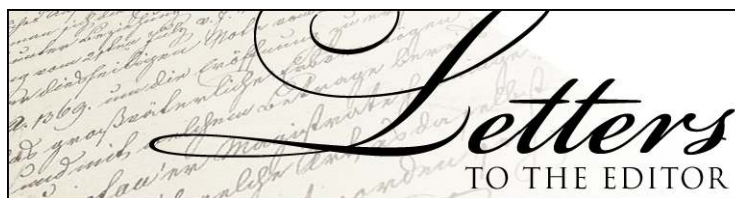
Claiborne's **Arch** and Darley's **Bernardini** each have 28 catalogued in Book 1; WinStar's (formerly Vinery) **More Than Ready** has 27. Darley's **Street Sense** is still the leading North American third-crop sire by 2013 progeny earnings (though Darley's Irish sire at Kildangan, **Teofilo**, has assumed overall leadership on the third-crop sire list); he has 22 catalogued in Book 1; and Claiborne's late **Pulpit** has 20 catalogued, from his second-last crop.

In 2010, as you'll recall the top stud fee for any horse retiring in North America was \$25,000, for **Zensational**. The market had improved a bit by 2011, and four stallions retired for fees of \$30,000 or higher, and are represented by their first yearlings in 2013. Blame, as mentioned, has 26 in Book 1 and 41 total.

The other three: Lane's End's **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality), who has 17 in Book 1 and another 42 in Week 2 (59 total); Taylor Made's **Eskendereya** (Giant's Causeway) has 16 in Book 1, and another 44 in Week 2 (60 total); and Ashford's **Lookin At Lucky** (Smart Strike) has 13 in Book 1 and another 39 in Week 2 (52 total). Among sires with their first 3-year-olds this year, only Coolmore's (formerly Ashford's) **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo) and Lane's End's **Curlin** (Smart Strike) have more than four yearlings in Book 1: 'Henry' has 10 (plus another 63 in Week 2); Curlin has eight (plus another 32 in Week 2). F-T TEXAS SALE REPORTS INCREASE

Riding the recent upswing in the yearling market, Fasig-Tipton's Texas Summer Yearling sale experienced across the board increases at Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas, Monday night. A total of 129 yearlings were catalogued this year, down from 170 last term, with 97 youngsters realizing an aggregate of \$1,255,100. In 2012, 113 yearlings were sold for gross receipts of \$1,150,000. The median rose from \$6,000 to \$8,000, while the buy back rate fell from 27.09% to 16.38%.

Heading the single session sale was a pair of fillies offered by Lane's End Texas that brought \$65,000 from Tom Durant. Hitting that mark early in the session was [Hip 9](#), a chestnut filly by freshman sire Discreetly Mine, who is the first foal out of Sign Up (Mineshaft). The Texas-foaled filly was bred by W.S. Farish. Late in the sale, a bay daughter of Birdstone was purchased for the same amount. Bred by La Bahia Stud, [Hip 89](#) is out of the unraced mare Golden Sheba (Coronado's Quest).
