

DEFLECTIONS ALTER WOODWARD COMPLEXION

The decision by trainer Todd Pletcher to not enter Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song) in today's GI Woodward S. and Thursday's news that reigning GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Fort Larned (E Dubai) would miss the race due to what trainer Ian Wilkes deemed a 'minor' injury has stripped away only some of the luster. Four of the six horses that remain in the nine-furlong feature have combined to win a half-dozen Grade I races, while **Successful Dan** (Successful Appeal) and **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) have gone agonizingly close to joining that fraternity on more than one occasion.

Though there are more accomplished rivals in the field on paper, oddsmaker Eric Donovan has established Zayat Stables' **Paynter** (Awesome Again) as the 2-1 revised morning-line favorite, owing mostly to the horse's considerable talent and some to the events of late 2012 that left the GI Haskell Invitational S. hero on

death's doorstep. Runner-up in the GI Belmont S. before giving trainer Bob Baffert an unprecedented sixth Haskell, Paynter took ill, battling colitis and the beginning stages of laminitis before ultimately undergoing surgery to remove part

of his large intestine. His ability to overcome those life-threatening conditions would be remarkable--that he's been able to return to the races and is perhaps a better animal than he was in 2012 is the stuff of legend. A smashing allowance victory over seven furlongs at Hollywood June 14 was good for a 114 Beyer Speed Figure, and though he fell short to Kettle Corn (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GI San Diego H. last time out July 27, it was just the second start off the extended absence and he gave the winner four pounds.

"It was so emotional, what he went through for two months," Baffert commented. "Now that he's back, I really want him to take on the big guys, because he's a big guy himself."

There were plenty of big fish to fry, including stablemate Game On Dude (Awesome Again), in the GI Pacific Classic last weekend, a race in which the aforementioned Kettle Corn ran on for second.

"I didn't want to run him in the Pacific Classic," explained Baffert. "The Woodward is a great race, pointing to the Breeders' Cup. We're excited about running him. It's a tough field, but he's tough."

'SAGE' ADVICE FOR THE FOREGO?

Sage Valley (Discreet Cat) got very good late last year, rattling off three consecutive scores capped by a romp in Aqueduct's Mr. Nasty S. Nov. 9. He'll look to be even better in today's GI Forego S. at the Spa. He ran back to that race when annexing the GIII Maryland Sprint H. first off the bench May 18, but may have been feeling the effects of that race on three weeks' rest in the True North, finishing fifth. He

atoned for that defeat with a tidy win in the GIII James Marvin S. over this course and distance July 19 and has the benefit of six weeks between runs. "We always liked him a lot," said trainer Rudy Rodriguez. "I don't think he needs the lead. I think he'll be able to relax. In [the RTN True North], he kind of slipped leaving the gate, and I think we brought him back a little too quick [off his win in the Maryland Sprint H.]. We've given him some time, and we know he likes Saratoga. He has been training here very, very well." About 30 minutes before Paynter takes his place in the Woodward starting gate, owner Ahmed Zayat will send out a formidable one-two punch in the Forego S. Which of the duo would be called the 'preferred' half of the entry is open to some debate. **Cont. p3**

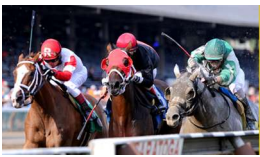

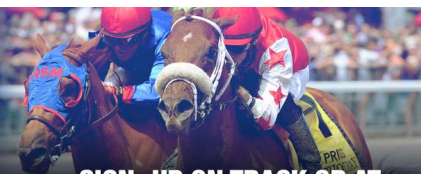

The absence of the potential two main speeds makes the Woodward an interesting exercise in handicapping. Paynter has not been further back than third at any call in his last six races, and Rafael Bejarano will either need to ride for speed inside of Mucho Macho Man and beat that one to the lead or take back and concede the front. On paper, Mucho Macho Man has the ability to cross and clear, even if his best efforts have come from just off the pace. Herded and carried out by To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) in last year's running, Mucho Macho Man was a neck back at the wire, then chased Fort Larned around the track in the Breeders' Cup Classic and was forced to settle for big-figure second. He hasn't been the same in three starts this season and exits a third in the GI Whitney H. Aug. 3.

"He got a lot out of the Whitney," co-owner Dean Reeves commented. "[He] came back in really, really good shape, and in his works, he's really been pulling on our exercise rider. [He] has felt good, so coming back in four weeks has been good for him because he's really getting back into that race mode."

Successful Dan, who had a Grade I stripped from him by stewards in the 2011 Clark H., has had a stop-start career, but takes this next step towards accompanying half-brother Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) to the Breeders' Cup. After flipping on the way to the track for the Whitney and far back early, he came with a hard late run to finish 3/4 of a length adrift of Cross Traffic while 1 1/2 lengths clear of Mucho Macho Man. An honest pace would suit, but he has also shown that he can be handier if necessary.

Trainer Bill Mott, who saddled To Honor and Serve last year, sends out a pair of dual Grade I winners in **Flat Out** (Flatter) and **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate). The former retains strong form at age seven, and exits a 2 1/2-length success in the GI Suburban H. July 6 where he sat atypically close to the pace. He is more likely to revert to rallying tactics here, but hasn't won outside of Belmont Park in nearly three years. Ron the Greek has a win over Mucho Macho Man in the Sunshine Millions Classic to his credit this term and was fourth in the Whitney after making something of a premature move. Javier Castellano takes over for the injured Jose Lezcano.

Fast Bullet (Speightstown) has made the trans-continental ship from California and is now a resident of the Travers-winning barn of Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas. A chestnut like his successful sire, he also follows in his father's hoofprints in that he remains lightly at age five and has flashed lots of his brilliance. Fast Bullet enters this with just one defeat in his five trips to the post, a sixth off a 355-day layoff in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. He has just one start under his belt this season, a front-running defeat of his entry mate **Justin Phillip** (First Samurai) in the GI True North S. on the Belmont S. undercard June 8. For those who want to take a skeptical approach, the fast final time of that race could be attributed to a below-par early pace, and the shape of this event could be dramatically different. In contrast to Fast Bullet, Justin Phillip is race-hardened as he makes career start number 30 today. And he is in perhaps career-best form. Somewhat disappointing when fourth in the GI Smile Sprint H. July 6 at Calder, he turned the tables on that race's winner Bahamian Squall (Gone West) in the GI A. G. Vanderbilt H. Aug. 4. **Cont. p4**

A pair of ⚡ **"TDN Rising Stars"** ⚡ lock horns for the first time in tonight's GI Del Mar Debutante at the oceanside oval. Possessed of a pedigree which screams two turns, Kaleem Shah's **Awesome Baby** (Awesome Again) displayed outstanding debut speed to crush a field of maidens by 4 3/4 lengths Aug. 4, covering 5 1/2 furlongs in a sparkling 1:03.14. She has since breezed three-quarters of a mile in a race-like 1:11 and is the 5-2 morning-line selection. The Bob Baffert stable is also represented by **Fascinating** (Smart Strike), the half-sister to Bodemeister (Empire Maker) and still winless in two starts; and recent maiden winner **Secret Compass** (Discreet Cat). "They're really nice fillies," Baffert said. "Awesome Baby ran awesome. Fascinating, I can't believe she's still a maiden, but the distance should help her."

She's a Tiger gets blinkers on for this and also has a strong interim drill over six furlongs. Concave, one of two in the race for owner Paul Reddam, debuted with a handy victory sprinting over the turf at Hollywood July 12, but made a seamless transition to the Poly last time. Pat Valenzuela replaces Mario Gutierrez, who guided Concave to her first two wins. Gutierrez has the call on Reddam's **Sprouts** (Square Eddie).

SPEED TO THE 'MAX'

If **Silver Max** (Badge of Silver) is the destination for your wagers in today's GII Bernard Baruch H. at Saratoga, you can expect to get the 'Max' for the minimum in terms of a return on investment, particularly given the way the course has been carrying speed of late. The one-time claimer put together a six-race winning streak in 2012, capped by a front-running score in the GII Virginia Derby, and posted his first win of this term in the off-turf Opening Verse S. at Churchill June 1. He was third to Prayer for Relief (Jump Start) in the GIII Cornhusker H. June 29, but returned to the turf to run them off their feet in the GIII Oceanport S. July 29. He should be able to clear the traffic inside with ease and they'll have him to catch. "I think he's back, and he'll end up being one of the best turf horses in the country when the year is done," trainer Dale Romans said. "He had the makings of it last year. I squeezed the lemon a little bit, and he needed a freshener. He got it, and he's doing a lot better." **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper) easily defeated Silver Max in the GIII Appleton S. in late March and finished willingly to add the GIII Red Bank S. at the Jersey Shore May 18.

He faces a similar scenario today as he did last time when he chased lone speed Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) in the GI Shoemaker Mile S. June 29 and could do no better than second. He's at the mercy of the pace today, but could be one to return to in a truly run race. **Turallure** (Wando), runner-up in the 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, has reportedly thrived since his return to the Spa this summer and hinted that he was on his way back to his best form with an allowance second over a mile July 24. Julien Leparoux, in to ride Successful Dan in the Woodward, rode Turallure to win the GI Woodbine Mile and in the Breeders' Cup and takes over at the controls today. **Field p6**

READY TO REIGN?

Already made ante-post favorite by many betting firms for next year's 2000 Guineas, ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Kingman (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) arrives at Sandown today with the threat of his bubble being burst in a select renewal of the G3 Solario S. Trainer

John Gosden has been keen to play down the excitement which was inevitably generated by the emphatic six-length debut success of the Juddmonte homebred in a Newmarket maiden over this trip June 29, but the visual and statistical evidence of that performance suggest the hype is right. The runner-up, Adhwaa (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), has since won and

finished fourth in the G3 Sweet Solera S. to boost the form, and Kingman has the pedigree to go on from there, being a son of the Classic heroine Zenda (GB) (Zamindar), and therefore half-brother to his potentially high-class group-winning stable companion Remote (GB) (Dansili {GB}). This is also the operation's newly-instated retained jockey James Doyle's first major assignment, and the all-round expectation is not lost on the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe. "It is a big first ride, but that is what we all come in for," he told *PA Sport*. "It's what James comes into the game for and what Prince Khalid is trying to breed horses for, so it is certainly a pivotal moment, I should think. Lest we forget, he is only a maiden winner and I think quite a few people have forgotten that. I'm right with John [Gosden] on this, of course we hope he's going to be a good horse, but the three horses he's running against have all got really good proven form and proven experience. We have to take it step-by-step, and making him a great champion before he's out of short pants is a bit premature." Godolphin put forward a duo from Charlie Appleby's Moulton Paddocks stable and Saeed bin Suroor's Godolphin Stables yard, respectively, and the former may hold the stronger hand with the gelding **Music Theory (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}). Impressive when taking a six-furlong maiden and conditions race over this trip at Newmarket in the space of a fortnight earlier this month, he will test the credentials of the favorite. **Cont. p6**

BBAG YEARLING SALE

VISITORS RAISE THE STAKES AT BADEN-BADEN

Yesterday witnessed a strong renewal of the BBAG Yearling Sale, with increases in the key figures helped by a predictably wide-ranging international influence at the Iffezheim complex. The gross of €7,149,500 was up from last year's figure of €5,652,000 from 24 fewer offered, and the average saw a 43.5% increase to €47,983.

The RNA rate was up slightly to 33.2% from

31.6%. The overseas impact was felt at the highest end of the market, with Emmanuel de Seroux's Narvick International snapping up one of the catalogue's choice lots for an undisclosed Japanese client for €390,000. By a newcomer on the domestic sire scene in

Wiesenspfad (Ger) (Waky Nao {GB}), who had his first black-type winner this week when Abendwind (Ger) took the G3 Zukunfts-Rennen at the local track, lot [68](#) is out of the champion Saldentigerin (Ger) (Tiger Hill {Ire}), who has now produced her own champion in last year's G1 Preis der Diana heroine Salomina (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}). Gestut Bona's homebred was the subject of a tussle between de Seroux and John McCormack, with the former, who stood with Riki Takahashi, ultimately prevailing.

Three lots later, Darley secured one of the trio of Monsun (Ger) colts on offer who boasted one of the strongest pages in the book. From Gestut Karlshof, lot [71](#) is a March-foaled chestnut whose half-brother Seismos (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) recently jumped to prominence when registering an impressive win in the G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern. His full-sibling is the 2009 G1 Preis der Diana runner-up Soberania (Ger), just another top-level performer from this excellent family heavily influenced by Monsun's Group 1-winning Samum (Ger), Schiaparelli (Ger) and Salve Regina (Ger).

Later in the day, the same operation paid €300,000 for another by that now-deceased heavyweight consigned by Gestut Brummerhof as lot [189](#). He is out of a Darley-bred half-sister to Godolphin's former stalwart Predappio (GB) (Polish Precedent), who was Group 1-placed and also captured the 1997 G2 Hardwicke S. That purchase was the culmination of a spree carried out by the establishment's representative Franziska Schaertlin Coffey, which also involved lots [173](#), [186](#) and [188](#).

The first of that trio was Gestut Wittekindshof's daughter of Shamardal and the champion Elle Danzig (Ger) (Roi Danzig), who is a full-sister to the triple pattern-race scorer and 2010 G1 Preis der Diana runner-up Elle Shadow (Ger), and fetched €150,000. Next up was Gestut Karlshof's March-foaled full-sister to the multiple Group 1-winning champion Kamsin (Ger) (Samum {Ger}), and half to group winner and Group 1-placed Kapitale (Ger) (Dubawi {Ire}), who sold for €170,000 before €120,000 was paid for Gestut Rottgen's full-brother to Godolphin's G1 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 3 runner-up Kassiano (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}).


Seitz Strikes...

Among the international contingent was Freddy Seitz of Brookdale Farm, and he managed to secure the sole representative of Montjeu (Ire) in the catalogue from Graf and Gräfin von Stauffenberg's nursery. Lot [192](#) is out of a half-sister to G1 Prix de l'Opera-winning champion Lady Marian (Ger) (Nayef), and she was snapped up for €260,000. "She may stay in Europe," Seitz told *Racing Post*. "She's for a partner, so we'll wait and see. We also breed, so that's always in the back of our mind when buying fillies." The same vendors had earlier seen their daughter of Lady Marian's sire sell to Shadwell for €230,000. Lot [179](#) is another filly with broodmare appeal, being out of Flames To Dust (Ger) Oasis Dream {GB}), a half to the smart Hong Kong runner Industrial Success (Ire) (Bering {GB}), descended from the matriarch Gaily. "She's a great filly, as nice as I've seen here--although I didn't expect to have to pay that much," Angus Gold told the trade daily. "She's going to be a staying filly, but she just had a little more class and looked a little less backward than others of that type--hopefully Oasis Dream can inject a bit of speed."

Juddmonte's Dansili had only two yearlings on offer yesterday, and they sold for a combined price of €410,000 to underline the quality of his progeny and emphasise the subsequent demand. First up was lot 160, Gestut Fahrhof's February-foaled bay who hails from the immediate family of the Lagardere flag-bearers

Sagamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) and fellow sires Sagacity (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}) and Sageburg (Ire) (Johannesburg). His page had been further advertised by the recent Classic exploits of the talented Secret Gesture (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), and Dr. Christoph

Berglar of Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) fame had the final say at €210,000. "It was love at first sight," Berglar told the *Post*. "He's the spitting image of his sire, moves very well, and I also liked the fact he's not too big and looks very racy." Close behind was Gestut Rottgen's lot 174, an April-foaled half-brother to the 2010 G1 Preis der Diana heroine Enora (Ger) (Noverre) and the multiple Pattern-race scorer Egerton (Ger) (Groom Dancer), as well as the dam of the 2009 G1 Preis von Europa third Eliot (Ger) (Tiger Hill {Ire}). He sold to HFTB Racing Agency for €200,000.

After a tardy start to proceedings which saw several lots fail to make their reserve, the auction sprang to life when agent Michael Andree paid €180,000 on behalf of Jurgen Imm's Stall Nizza for lot 40, a son of Medicean (GB) whose page includes the aforementioned champion Lady Marian. Moments later, Narvick International made their first significant purchase when paying the same amount for Gestut Ebbesloh's well-connected son of Azamour (Ire). Lot 43 is out of the Classic-placed Lasira (Ger) (Vettori {Ire}), making the April-foaled bay a full-brother to the pattern-race winner Lindenthaler (Ger), and he will be trained in Japan. Local companies often use it as entertainment for their clients, and what a great way to introduce non-racing people to the concept. All that was needed was a couple of Sunday's stars to canter by, and Baden Racing would have their very own Breakfast With The Stars.

While I could easily have lingered longer, it was sale time, and a gentle stroll down the road brings breakfast

guests to the BBAG Sales Grounds. Bright sunshine and a mere flutter of the flags suggests that a perfect day lay ahead. It didn't take long for the numbers on the electronic price board to start soaring. Lot 40 was a very handsome,

hard-to-fault son of Medicean (GB), and despite there being no black-type under the first two dams, the bidding was fierce, with the hammer finally falling at €180,000.

The audience had barely caught their breath when the full brother to Lindenthaler, named Lundeby, entered the ring. By Azamour (Ire) out of the classy Vettori (Ire) mare Lasira (Ger), the elegant colt had catalogues flying, and again the price soared over the €100,000 mark, with Lundeby being knocked down for €180,000 as well.

The first Monsun, Lot 66, failed to set the sale alight, going for a mere €100,000, but two lots later, a

beautiful dark brown filly entered the ring. A half sister to champion 3-year old filly Salomina (Ger) and out of the champion 3-year-old filly Saldentigerin (Ger), the Irish-bred Salwina not only had the pedigree to die for, but she also oozed class. Some

horses just know they are special, and this was one of them. She owned the ring and demanded that you look at her. Without her even setting foot on a racetrack, her paddock value is substantial, and hence it came as no surprise when she was knocked down to a Japanese buyer for €390,000, becoming the sales topper.

The talk on Thursday had, however, been all about Lot 71, the second Monsun colt, called See The White. A very elegant colt, he clearly had some growing to do, but oozed quality, and this time it was Darley who walked away triumphantly, having paid €360,000 for the privilege of taking him home.

Then it was time to get on with business as usual, as several lots changed hands without banks having to be

robbed. There were some disappointments along the way, but that is the nature of the beast, and most vendors seemed satisfied.

Just when the sale seemed to have settled into a comfortable rhythm, along came another

brown colt, Lot 160. By Dansili (GB) out of the Sadler's Wells mare Avec Amour (Ire), he looked the part, and being from the family of champion 3-year-old Sagamix (Fr), it came as no surprise when the hammer fell at €210,000. Sales are pretty much the same the world over, but the beauty of the BBAG Sales grounds and the proximity of the Baden Racecourse and its early morning delights certainly makes it well worthwhile to attend.

The following editorial appeared in the Aug. 28 issue of Racing Post, and has been reprinted here with the publication's permission.

BRITAIN NOT IMMUNE WHEN IT COMES TO DRUG ISSUE *by Julian Muscat*

Even after what will go down in Britain as the summer of drugs, our horsemen are dismayed Breeders' Cup Ltd. has revoked the ban on the use of raceday Lasix in its 2-year-old races.

The pros and cons are too complicated to address here. They revolve around improving performance, equine welfare and the overall health of the breed. However, in the latter two respects, aspects of Britain's tolerance of therapeutic drugs in training is vastly at odds with its zero tolerance on racedays.

By outlawing medication on racedays, Britain sets a high international watermark. That much is certainly true, but Americans are increasingly frustrated by what they feel is Britain's hypocritical stance over medication trainers can use when preparing a horse.

Graham Motion, the British-born trainer of Animal Kingdom, alluded to it in [*Racing Post*] yesterday. Trainers can use Lasix on the training grounds without violating the rules; ergo, Britain is not a drug-free utopia.

Motion has a point. Lasix is not the only substance available to trainers on the gallops. A vast array of medication can be used on a daily basis. That may come as a surprise to many, but the key phrase within Britain's stance on drugs is raceday medication.

You may well ask: what about those 700 tests taken last year as part of the testing-in-training programme? None of them returned a positive, but that's because the testing-in-training programme is significantly different from the raceday testing programme.

When testing horses in training, the BHA's anti-doping unit is looking specifically for performance-enhancing drugs such as anabolic steroids. Other prohibited substances may be present in the sample, but they do not contravene the rules when horses are in training.

So much so that the BHA's website lists 'Detection Times' for a total of 32 "commonly used therapeutic medications" for "routine, legitimate treatment" by trainers. This helps trainers avoid their horses returning positive samples on raceday.

On that list are a range of corticosteroids, anti-inflammatories and painkillers that enhance performance by allowing horses to optimise their ability to gallop by treating known ailments. Which is exactly how most Americans regard Lasix.

It is right Britain bans all such medication on raceday. But scratch the surface and British trainers are preoccupied by the same difficulties as their U.S. counterparts--and use similar drugs--in preparing horses to race. Irrespective of where it is trained, the Thoroughbred is a brittle species.

Other unsatisfactory aspects of Britain's anti-doping policy have surfaced in the wake of recent scandals involving Mahmood Al Zarooni and the use of Sungate. For instance, although the use of anabolic steroids is strictly prohibited, the rule is in effect unenforceable. That's because any trainer wanting to dope a horse can move it from their yard, which is licensed by the BHA, to any other non-licensed property. This puts the horse beyond the testers' legal reach.

It also means Britain has no out-of-competition testing programme in the true sense. That would require horses to be available to testers at all times. Only when horses can be randomly tested, irrespective of their location, can racing claim to run a programme in line with other sports.

Nor has the BHA's legislation on drugs use proved as effective as it should be. The decision not to charge nine trainers whose vets prescribed the therapeutic use of Sungate illustrates the point. With the BHA on suspect legal ground, its officials could not realistically proceed with charges even if they had wanted to. The decision was not theirs to take, as it would have been within a more robust legal framework.

Ultimately, the policing of any drugs programme is what matters. Recent events leave the uncomfortable feeling that Britain is unable to endorse aspects of its stance by effective policing. These intrinsic flaws within the overall programme have fuelled the belief in the U.S. that Britain should not throw stones.

BHA chief executive Paul Bittar's plea for greater funding of the anti-doping programme should be urgently heeded. Recent cutbacks can only serve to undermine the quest.

According to the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities' 2011 Report on Prohibited Substances, Britain now tests significantly fewer horses per race than the U.S. or France. It now takes fewer samples each year than there are races run. Britain also returns a consistently lower percentage of post-race positives than most front-line racing nations. But the question is whether Britain's tolerance of medication in training, its lack of an effective out-of-competition testing programme and its impotent rules on steroid use entitle it to take the moral high ground within the international arena. If there is much to be proud of, there is also much to do.



Pletcher to Win Saratoga Training Title

Trainer Todd Pletcher will tally his fourth consecutive--and 12th overall--Saratoga training title this year. He enters the final weekend with 34 victories and \$4,065,857 in earnings. Conditioner Chad Brown is ranked in second with 22 wins. Highlight victories of the meet for the Pletcher barn include Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior)'s GI Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Alabama, Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song)'s GI Whitney Invitational H. and Capo Bastone (Street Boss)'s GI King's Bishop as well as 15 juvenile wins. "We're very, very pleased," Pletcher said. "We've had a very good meet in terms of 2-year-olds running pretty well. I think anytime you can come up here and win four Grade 1s, you have to be pretty happy. We've won [14] stakes overall, so we're really, really pleased. Hopefully, we can finish really strong, too. I couldn't have dreamed of having a better meet."

Ryduilluc Works Over Saratoga Main Track

Ryduilluc (Medaglia d'Oro) breezed a half-mile in :49.86 over the Saratoga main track Thursday morning. The colt registered his previous three works over the Oklahoma turf track, which is only open on Mondays Wednesdays and Fridays. "He [worked on the dirt], only because that was the day I wanted to work him," trainer Gary Contessa. "He's not a horse that has to work on the turf." The GIII Palm Beach S. winner was most recently 11th in the GI Secretariat Aug. 17 and his conditioner is unsure of when he will make his next start. "I'm looking at maybe a little bit of a breather," said Contessa. "Maybe going to Keeneland, maybe staying [in New York] for one of those overnight stakes. I like to just show up when least expected. There's a nice race for him on September 8th at Belmont Park, a flat mile turf stake for 3-year-olds [\$100,000 Hallssee overnight stakes]. It's probably not on my agenda, but it's there."

GI Forego S. - #7 Strapping Groom (10-1)

I must admit, it took me a long time to come up with somebody here. I knew that I wanted to oppose the favored entry (obviously), but couldn't find a longshot that didn't feel like a reach. I had originally dismissed **Strapping Groom** because, while his first win off the claim for David Jacobson did produce a competitive 104 Beyer Speed Figure, he set an extremely slow pace while alone on the lead. Still, that's a pretty solid number considering the glacial early splits would have hurt the final time, and his last two races are much better than they look. He was part of a very quick pace here on opening day in the track-and-trip GIII James Marvin S. in which the 4-5-6 runners early in the six-horse field finished 1-2-3. Talented pacesetter Souper Speedy came back to win a couple of weeks ago. Strapping Groom also chased a very hot pace in the Aug. 12 Kid Russell S. (opening splits of :21.58 and :44.11 over a quick track), but this time instead of fading, he took over with ease in upper stretch and won very convincingly for a sprint race. This is certainly a step up in class from the \$35,000 claimers he was running in just a few months ago, but Strapping Groom seems to be doing well and could run another big one off fairly short rest. **Wager: \$130 Win on #7 Strapping Groom.**

GI Woodward S. - #4 Flat Out (3-1)

It sure is hard to climb out of this type of hole with six-horse fields, especially with a familiar group of known commodities. The pain of that beat with Successful Dan in the Whitney was renewed looking at this field, and while I thought he ran huge last out, he feels like a "last time was the time" horse. Instead I'll go with **Flat Out**, who may offer a touch more value since he hasn't been out since a win in the July 6 Gil Suburban H. The 7-year-old ran down Cross Traffic at a one-mile distance that might have been better for the eventual Whitney winner in the GIII Westchester S. in April (good for a gaudy 116 Beyer), and had a little bit of traffic trouble when third in the Met Mile (thought it probably didn't cost him a placing). Flat Out's biggest knock in the past might have been his lack of early speed, but he's gotten quicker in recent starts, and figures to sit a nice trip just behind Mucho Macho Man and Paynter. Hopefully he can run them down in the stretch, and help chip away at this deficit. **Wager: \$130 Win on #4 Flat Out.**

GI Forego S. - #3 Jackson Bend (10-1)

Have seen enough promise from the classy 6-year-old veteran **Jackson Bend** in his first three attempts since coming out of retirement to take a shot with him at a decent price here. The 2011 GI Forego S. hero rallied smartly for a strong third behind subsequent GI Alfred Vanderbilt H. second Bahamian Squall once finally switching leads in deep stretch in the six-furlong GII Smile Sprint H. at Calder July 6, and may receive a similar set-up in a race loaded with early speed. The stretch-runner was forced to sit a lot closer to the front than he prefers following a much slower pace in the Housebuster S. at Gulfstream Aug. 3, and he didn't disgrace himself by any means with another respectable third-place finish. Jackson Bend has been training up a storm in South Florida since, and is clearly quite fond of this course (4-2-0-0) and seven-furlong distance (7-4-0-1). Picking up the services of leading rider Javier Castellano can't exactly be a bad thing, either. Primed for an upset. **Wager: \$40 Win on #3 Jackson Bend.**

GI Woodward S. - #6 Mucho Macho Man (9-2)

Mucho Macho Man, a painful second behind To Honor and Serve as the 4-5 favorite in this race last year, is overdue to get his hands on one of these major prizes. The lanky bay returned from his Sunshine Millions flop in the slop Jan. 19 to finish third as the chalk in a five-horse field in Belmont's Criminal Type S. June 14. Northern Meteor in Demand at Sydney Sale:

A pair of young mares in foal to Australia's late champion first season sire Northern Meteor (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) accounted for the top two prices at the Inglis Sydney Spring Thoroughbred Sale yesterday.

While the top price of A\$80,000 for [Lot 49](#), the three-time winner One Sweet Day (Aus) (Elusive Quality), was up from last year's A\$38,000 topper, other key figures saw declines, with a gross of \$532,050 down from A\$625,750 last year, the average of A\$4,587 down from A\$6,385 and the A\$1,100 median down from A\$3,500 last year. The clearance rate was up to 95% from 92% last year.

The 7-year-old One Sweet Day was consigned by Widden Stud, where Northern Meteor stood until his death late last month. She was hammered down to Luskin Park Stud carrying her first foal. One Sweet Day's dam is a half-sister to French Group 1 winner King Charlemagne (Nureyev), as well as the dams of U.S. Grade I winners Here Comes Ben (Street Cry {Ire}) and Albertus Maximus (Albert the Great).

The Widden Stud draft was also responsible for the second highest-priced lot of the day. That honor went to [Lot 48](#), the 6-year-old Mega Jewels (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), who is also carrying her first foal by Northern Meteor. From the family of Australian 3-year-old champion Racing to Win (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), Mega Jewels was picked up by William Inglis, agent, for A\$35,000.

The highest priced racehorse was the Group 2-placed Divine Moon (Aus) (God's Own {Aus}), who realized A\$34,000 from William Inglis, agent. The 4-year-old, who was consigned as [Lot 102](#) from Princes Farm, is from the famed Ingham family of Canny Lad (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}), Sepoy (Aus) (Elusive Quality) and Guelph (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). The most expensive yearling was [Lot 61](#), a filly by Oratorio (Ire) consigned by Coolmore Stud and purchased by Karl Brown Bloodstock for A\$23,000.

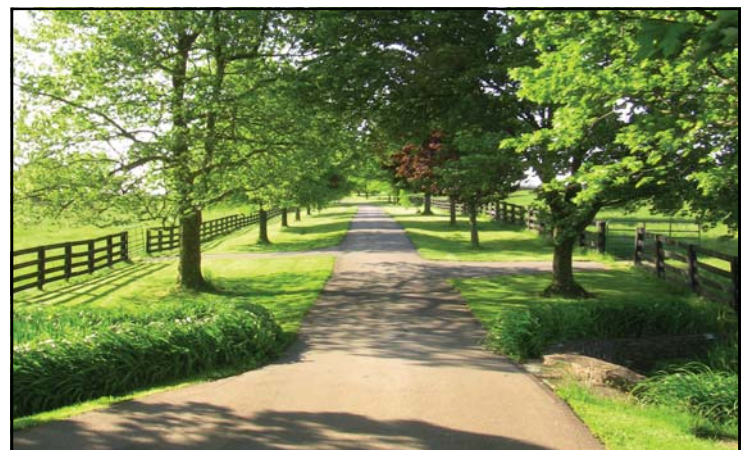
