

SWEET WIN IN THE SPINAWAY

Sweet Reason (Street Sense), making her second career start and finding a second sloppy surface, skipped over the Saratoga mud to record a sparkling 5 3/4-length victory in Sunday's GI Spinaway S. The victory gave Leah Gyarmati her first Grade I win, and the trainer credited the patience of longtime client Jeff Treadway.

"Obviously, it's very, very exciting, and it couldn't happen to a better owner," Gyarmati said. "Jeff Treadway has tons of patience. He's done all the right things as an owner. He's always done the right things for his horses, and it paid off." **Cont. p5**

Trying seven furlongs for the first time yesterday, **Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum's Rizeena (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}) justified trainer Clive Brittain's lofty opinion of her by winning The Curragh's G1 Moyglare Stud S. Successful over five furlongs in the G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot June 19 and placed over six in both the G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. at Newmarket July 12 and G1 Prix Morny at Deauville Aug. 18, the 9-2 shot swooped from the rear under James Doyle to upstage the 13-8 favorite **Kiyoshi (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) in the final 100 yards, and hit the line with ears pricked 3/4 of a length ahead of that subsequently demoted rival. "I've said for some time that this filly was in the class of **Sayyedati**, who won this race for me before, and she certainly is," her trainer commented. "She has never stopped improving and could be exceptional." **Cont. p3**

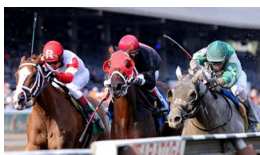

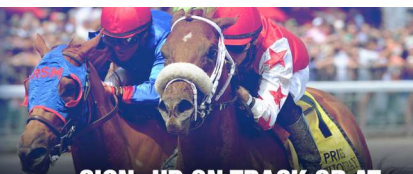

When Rizeena had come back into Sandown's winner's enclosure after the Listed National S. May 30, Clive Brittain declared that she was in the league of his past stars Pebbles (GB), Sayyedati (GB) and Crimplene (Ire), and that statement was upheld when she added the Queen Mary to her tally at the Royal meeting. If her subsequent reversal under a penalty at the hands of Lucky Kristale (GB) (Lucky Story) in the Duchess of Cambridge at Newmarket's July meeting was a surprise at the time, it was put into better light after that rival subsequently added York's G2 Lowther S. under her own penalty. Staying on best of all in the Prix Morny, she looked in need of this extra distance on that occasion, and entered this race with valuable experience behind her as she took on the lightly-campaigned and much-vaunted Kiyoshi and Tapestry. Held up off the honest pace set by the two other of Ballydoyle's Galileo trio Perhaps (Ire) and Wonderfully (Ire), she enjoyed a clear passage out wide, which was something denied Joseph O'Brien and Tapestry as Kiyoshi bumped her and kept her in a pocket with a quarter mile remaining. As Kiyoshi took over a furlong later, she was a sitting duck for her fellow British raider, and duly succumbed soon after as Tapestry stayed on when in the clear.

"It's been a big week and this is a good end to it," the newly appointed Juddmonte number one jockey James Doyle commented. "She ran a cracking race against the colts in the Morny, having got a bit of a knock early on which took her out of her rhythm, and the step up to seven obviously suited. I thought they'd go a really strong tempo, as Tapestry looked like a galloper, but they didn't go that fast for the first couple of furlongs and when the pace lifted, I got shuffled back further than I had aimed. I was on a filly with a good turn of foot, so I wanted to be patient and not ask her questions too quickly. There is a lot to look at here and she propped on the line, but there was no problem. In my view, she is going to be a better 3-year-old, as she's a bit leggy and tall. She seems to be getting better and a mile won't pose a problem." Her trainer revealed the mechanics behind her progress. "She started racing off a weight of 460 kilos and she was 475 before she got on the plane, so she has put on 15 kilos in a normal routine exercising every day," Brittain said. "We knew they were going to put a lot of pace into the race and I was confident we'd stay, so I knew if James got her into a rhythm, which is important, she would finish, and that is what she did. Until I speak to Sheikh Rashid, I don't know where she'll go, but she has an entry for the G1 Cheveley Park S. [at Newmarket Sept. 28], and I also put her in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac [at Longchamp Oct. 6]. I think she'll get a mile if we need to, but the temptation is to go back to the Cheveley and take on the filly who beat her at Newmarket.

"I know she'll get the mile and this was an important race in my heart." ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Tapestry was placed ahead of Kiyoshi after an inquiry concluded that she had been hampered by the second and that cost her the place, but Aidan O'Brien was not

downhearted. "She ran very well and when she was starting her run she was cut off, but came home very well," he said. "She's a big, rangy filly and we are taking her along gently."

Rizeena hails from a productive American family. Champion filly Serena's Song (Rahy) appears under her fourth dam, Imagining, while up closer are multiple graded stakes winner Doubles Partner (Rock Hard Ten), and current Melbourne Cup favorite Puissance De Lune (Shamardal).

Sweet Win in Spinaway (cont. from p1)

Sweet Reason came from well back to graduate by 6 1/4 lengths over a soupy Saratoga surface in her debut in an off-the-turfer Aug. 9, and the Spa faithful took note yesterday, betting the filly down from her 8-1 morning-line odds to 5-2 at post time. Unhurried out of the gate, Sweet Reason settled off the early scrum for the lead as **Bahnah** (Elusive Quality) emerged as the early pacesetter through fractions of :22.51 and :45.78. Sweet Reason kicked into gear on the turn and powered up three wide to the outside of favorite **Sweet Whiskey** (Old Fashioned). The showdown between the top two betting choices was short-lived, as Sweet Reason went right on past and cruised home to a sharp score. **Stopchargingmaria** (Tale of the Cat) ran on well to be second, with **Dancing House** (Tapit) getting the show spot as Sweet Whiskey tired to fourth. **Brazen Persuasion** (Indian Charlie), the Gill Schuylerville S. dead-heat winner, refused at the break.

Winning rider Alex Solis never had a doubt. "She runs like she has done it her whole life," Solis said of Sweet Reason. "She won easily. At the half-mile pole, she switched leads and I just let her do her own thing. At the quarter-pole, she took the lead and I just kept on her a little bit to keep her occupied. She is very special."

Despite the impressive success over muddy surfaces, Gyarmati, a former jockey who has been training since 1999, thinks Sweet Reason will perform well over a fast track as well. "She trains very well on a dry track," Gyarmati said. "I'm sort of anxious to see how that translates into what she does in the afternoon on a dry track. But that's OK, this is good enough for me for now. I can live with this for a while."

Livermore Leslie, also the dam of graded stakes winner Don't Forget Lil (Kafwain), has a yearling filly by Rockport Harbor and a weanling filly by Midshipman.

Todd Pletcher, trainer of runner-up Stopchargingmaria and beaten favorite and fourth-place finisher Sweet Whiskey: "I thought both fillies ran well. It's a peculiar track, and both of them were trying an off track for the first time. I thought Sweet Whiskey probably didn't relish the going, but she kept trying to the end. Stopchargingmaria, I think, was second best on the day. The winner was very good, but I was pleased with [Stopchargingmaria's] effort. She galloped out well. We'll look forward to the [Oct. 5 GI] Frizette."

Javier Castellano, jockey aboard Stopchargingmaria: "I had a beautiful trip. That's where I wanted to be, right behind the speed. I was able to save ground in the first part of the race and then angle to the outside, and she kept running in the last part. She ran very good to be second; the winner was much the best."

John Velazquez, jockey aboard Sweet Whiskey: "I had a perfect trip, and when I called on her she was not there for me. She was going well and when I asked her to go, she didn't come up with any run, so I think she was intimidated by the track, definitely."

Group 1 in the Gran Premio del Jockey Club Italiano to restore his confidence, he was able to begin his 4-year-old campaign with a clean slate. After securing a workmanlike comeback in this venue's 11-furlong G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Unternehmer May 12, he first entered the main international stage by annexing the June 23 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, and rubber-stamped his arrival in scintillating fashion at Ascot. Left in front early by his reluctant rivals, the homebred tanked through the first part of the race until passed by Seismos in the backstretch.

Shaken up by Eduardo Pedroza to regain the lead passing the quarter pole, he had to be kept up to his work to hold his stable companion at bay, and gave the impression for the third time that this circuit is not his favorite.

"I told Eddie that he had every option, but the best thing was to settle him," trainer Andreas Wohler told *PA Sport*. "When he had the lead he settled and he gave him a superb ride. I wanted him to have an easy time today and Eddie just gave him a little tap to remind him, because he kept looking around when he got to the front. Novellist was only between 85 and 90% fit today, as the big race is five weeks away. We will step up his work a little bit, because he had a bit of an easy time coming up to this race." Connections confirmed that Johnny Murtagh, who rode Novellist to win the King George, would be back on board in the Arc.

Gabriel Charles, a debut winner over the Del Mar main track last July, was off the board in the GI Del Mar Futurity and GI FrontRunner S. before moving to the lawn for a 3 1/2-length victory in the Nov. 3 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint Preview S. He concluded his juvenile campaign with a runner-up effort in the off-the-turf Eddie Logan S. Dec. 29. In his lone previous 2013 outing, the bay colt closed stoutly only to miss by a head when second to Rising Legend (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) in the opening day Oceanside S. July 17. Gabriel Charles, owned by Michael House and Sam Britt, settled near the back of the pack as Redwood Kitten established the early pace.

Redwood Kitten was still on top after three-quarters in 1:12.35, but Gabriel Charles was making rapid progress on the bend and swarmed to the lead with a five-wide bid into the stretch. Gervinho, who had been racing tucked in along the rail just behind the pacesetter, was forced to switch to the outside in the final furlong and was closing strongly late. Gabriel Charles is the first North American graded stakes winner for his sophomore sire (by Street Cry {Ire}). "He's always had a nice turn of foot, but he used to fire it early," explained winning jockey Mike Smith. "Now they've got him waiting and firing at the end. I had a good trip today and it all worked out right." Winning trainer Jeff Mullins added, "It's gratifying to know he'll go two turns, which has always been kind of a question mark with this horse."

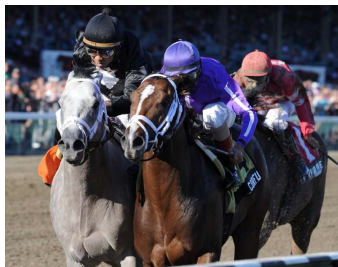

"In both of his races, Corfu's shown he's got some fight to him, so we hope that he'll be able to carry his speed a little further," trainer Todd Pletcher said of the Tabor, Magnier and Smith colorbearer. Pletcher, successful in this race last year with eventual champion Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday), will also send out a pair of ☆ **"TDN Rising Stars"** ☆ in WinStar Farm's **King Cyrus** (Bellamy Road) and Starlight Racing's **All in Blue** (More Than Ready).

King Cyrus enters off a daylight maiden win going this distance Aug. 5. The latter, an impressive debut victor at Belmont July 4, stumbled at the start and reported home a well-beaten fourth behind Wired Bryan in the GII Sanford S. July 21.

"His one start was impressive," Pletcher said of King Cyrus. "He's a horse that is going to appreciate more distance down the road, but in a race that looks like it's going to have a lot of pace, it could set up well for him. You're always concerned going from one start to a Grade I, but that's sort of where today's racing is. You're forced to jump into the deep end of the pool right off the bat." Wired Bryan has fired a five-furlong bullet over the Oklahoma training track since suffering his first career defeat in the Special. "He's got a lot of try," former Pletcher assistant trainer Michael Dilger said. "I think his biggest asset is his attitude. He's a very laid-back horse, borderline lazy. That helps when you're trying to put together three races in quick succession. We're running him in these races because that's the way he's presented himself."

The Woodward was McLaughlin's first Grade I victory of the year. "Everything went right for us," he said. "It was a big win for the horse, and a big win for everybody. It's been a long time between Grade Is; it just shows you how hard they are, how hard any graded stakes are to win."

SPA MAIDEN WINNERS LOOK TO STRETCH OUT

Lane's End Racing and Dell Ridge Farm's Honor Code (A.P. Indy) and Richard Pell's Grand Arrival (Harlan's Holiday) both broke their maidens impressively Saturday at Saratoga and the trainers of both are looking forward to giving their charges more ground.

Honor Code, tabbed a ☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆ after his late-charging 4 1/2-length victory ([video](#)) over seven furlongs, is a "two-turn dirt horse in the making," according to trainer Shug McGaughey. "We'll be anxious to get him stretched out and see where that takes us."

Grand Arrival romped home a 6 1/4-length winner in his second start Saturday ([video](#)) and could be in line for a graded stakes assignment next up. "It's always nice when a 2-year-old does what you think he's supposed to do," said trainer Nick Zito. "We just hope he goes forward. He came out of the race great, thank God." Zito said the Oct. 5 GI Champagne S. could be next for the juvenile. "It looked like he'd go a distance of ground, which is great," said Zito. "We'll see what happens. We'll see how he develops."

Unlike many balls, the speeches are always kept to a minimum, and both Andreas Jacobs, the chairman of Baden Racing and Wolfgang Gerstner, the mayor of Baden-Baden, only took a couple minutes to welcome the assembled guests.

Danedream was fittingly crowned Racehorse of The Year for a second successive year, with owner Heiko Volz speaking beautifully about the magical mare that changed his life. Trainer Peter Schiergen delighted the crowd after a question from Dr. Jacobs as to whether he rated her Arc win or her King George victory as his best. After pondering the question for a moment, he replied that while the Arc was his biggest victory ever, there is simply nothing like shaking the Queen's hand.



A sparkling introduction

Not to be outdone by the glorious music, the four-course meal was specially prepared by Martin Hermann, a two-star Michelin chef. The iced Champagne praline entered under dimmed lights and a shower of sparks, a fitting end to a wonderful meal. More dancing, this time

to the easy sounds of the Swing band, and before long we were called outside to watch a stunning fireworks display over the Baden-Baden skyline, set to the sound of Verdi's music.

Without warning, midnight arrived and with it the Midnight show, Sweet Soul Music Revue. The cast in their sparkly white jackets soon had the crowd on their feet, shouting, clapping and dancing. Twice the group tried to leave and twice they were called back for more. It may have been raining and a tad chilly, but inside the ballroom, it was cooking as couples of all ages danced and sang to the well-known songs.

"Buona Sera signorina, Buona sera. Its time to say goodbye to Napoli" rounded off a perfect evening. It was indeed time to say goodbye and head home on weary legs, the rain and our muddy dresses long forgotten. The Grand Prix Ball is not just a ball, it is a Ball like no other and I, for one, cannot wait for the next one.

D-Day in Baden-Baden...

Today is D-Day. I may have been here a while already, but the real reason for the lengthy travel by plane was not the Ball, contrary to popular belief, but actually the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden. Last year I cheered the mighty Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) home, little knowing that it was not to be her final Arc preparation, but sadly, the final race of her career. A disease outbreak at the Cologne training center where she was stabled put paid

to her Arc travel arrangements and her career. Currently in her new career as a broodmare, she is happily in foal to Frankel (GB).

Today, it is the turn of Germany's newest star, Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}), to take to the stage in what is likely to be his final Arc preparation. The outcome is not cast in stone, though, and even his staunch German fans are doubtful. The colt prefers fast ground, and it rained last night. While not soggy, the turf certainly looks like it could cut up. The colt also needs a fast pace, and with only five runners in the race, he seems unlikely to get that.

But first, there are six other races to get through, and rivers of Veuve Clicquot and beer to be drunk. Racing in Germany is rather like going on a family outing to the carnival, while dressed in your finery. Dogs of all shapes and sizes are an absolute necessity, and can often be seen sporting either a hat or a bejewelled collar or both, in matching colors of course. Guests dress in this season's latest fashion or the 17th century's fashion, sporting velvet riding habits and quaint little veils. And while hats are not obligatory, the bigger the better is derigueur if you decide to wear one.

To add to the carnival atmosphere, the returning horses calmly walk through the throngs of people, at the end of each race, without either batting an eye, except for the uninitiated foreign press of course. The railing between the two grandstands is simply removed after each race, allowing the field to return through the crowd to the unsaddling enclosure. It is indeed a sight to behold.

The course is often packed, with people milling in all directions and stepping back or out of the way of the horses is simply not the done thing. Extraordinarily, each group gets on with its own business and without ropes, barriers or officials, the field always reaches the safety of the unsaddling enclosure without a single foot being stepped on or a jockey unceremoniously being dumped.

Once one is over the initial shock of how things are done, German style, it is a wonderful experience to go racing at Baden-Baden. Children are catered for with a large playground well away from any horses. The life size horses, painted in exotic colors and placed around the course, also offer great entertainment, and there is often a queue of kids wanting to clamber on their plastic backs.

For the adults there are hat shops, art shops and even a Veuve Clicquot kiosk, complete with yellow caravan, umbrellas, tables and chairs. A large tipping board, sporting the fancies of the various newspapers for each race, adorns one of the grandstand's walls, and it amazed me to see the long queues of people patiently waiting to write down the day's suggestions.

Come racetime, the crowds are allowed right up against the railing, with only a small gap to the outer running rail, separating them from the flying horses. As racing in Germany is very much a family affair, it is also not uncommon to see children hoisted on shoulders or sitting on the railing watching the field thunder by. The day flies by quickly, and soon it is time for the Grosser Preis. Novellist comes last into the parade ring, yet the colt is unfazed by the packed ring and the crowd standing five deep around the outside. He canters down under regular jockey Eduardo Pedroza looking like a real star, and 2400 meters later he returns as one.

It was not as impressive as his G1 King George victory, but it was a victory nonetheless. In the challenging conditions, Novellist was forced to take the lead early on. Seismos (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) and Meandre (Fr) (Slickly {Fr}) both loomed late, but the colt fought back to become the first horse to win three Breeders' Cup Challenge Races in one year. He will now follow in Danedream's footsteps as he prepares to take on the world's best in the Arc five weeks from now.

The Grosser Preis is over for another year; a record 16,900 people attended, surprisingly slightly more than came to see Danedream win last year, but perhaps one should not be surprised. The racing at Baden-Baden is of a high quality, the atmosphere is incredible, and who can say no to a pint of cold beer and a glass of bubbly.

Juveniles who run big figures first out almost always regress at second asking, and the Michael Yates-owned and trained runner was asked to return off less than a month's rest and with a change in scenery. I also think his Saratoga Special performance was better than it looked. He didn't seem to be loving being down inside early, but came with a mild wide bid behind horses who ran one-two all the way around the track. Perhaps he'll end up needing a bit more time between his last start and this one, but I think there's a good enough chance that Lunarwarfare could cycle back up to his top or better, which makes him a major contender. **Wager: \$61 Win on #7 Lunarwarfare.**

Racing in traffic thereafter, All in Blue made a decent middle move while three-wide to reach contention on the far turn, but ran out of gas in deep stretch to finish a well-beaten fourth behind likely favorite Wired Bryan. He's had three solid works since, and the Starlight colorbearer should really appreciate the added spacing between races this time around. Received a nice confidence boost from his connections after bypassing Sunday's scratched-down GIII Sapling S. at Monmouth in favor of this much tougher assignment. The meet's leading rider gets off to ride stablemate King Cyrus, but it certainly can't hurt picking up Irad, who teamed up with this barn for a 28-1 shocker in the King's Bishop. 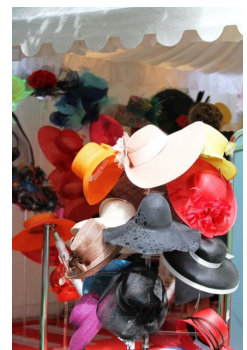

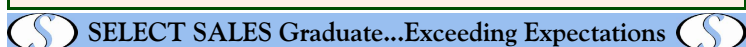

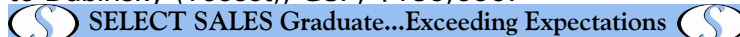
