Baffert--checking in third after pressing the pace. "He's the kind of horse who wants to run from the back, so that's what we were ready to do," said Leparoux of the winner. cast. St Nicholas Abbey seems more content, lying down several

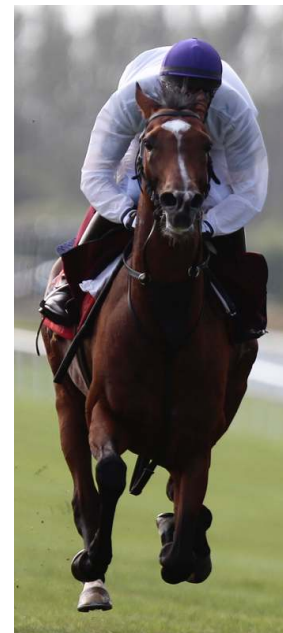
times a night to rest and his appetite is excellent, so he is

**Del Mar Futurity cont. from p1**

Tamarando arrived late on the scene to finish fourth going five panels against Cal-breds June 30, and improved to be second with another out-of-the-clouds rally at that same distance here July 21. He put it all together for a 2 1/4-length score over an additional sixteenth of a mile Aug. 18, earning a competitive 74 Beyer Speed Figure despite this being his first attempt against open company.

Settling into stride towards the back half of the field and in the three path early, the homebred lost his spot and was forced to wait briefly entering the turn. He continued a steady advance approaching the straight, but

still had plenty to do when they fanned out for the stretch drive. One of six or seven who still had a shot in midstretch, Tamarando seemed to find another gear when joined to his outside by Dance With Fate, and powered home to hold that foe safe.

“We loved this horse at seven furlongs,” said Hall of Fame trainer Jerry Hollendorfer. “I was thinking about running in the Cal-bred [I’m Smokin S. Monday at six furlongs], but we decided to go for the big moment. I guess I’m glad we did now. I’ve never won this race before, so it’s a special moment and a special horse.” Of the time it took Tamarando to round into form and break his maiden, Hollendorfer offered, “I don’t think

[the experience hurt] him. We wanted to win first time out, but we didn’t do that. He came back and won [third] time and now this, so he looks like a pretty good candidate to do something next year. I was a little disappointed that he was as far back early as he was, but apparently that’s the way he wants to run.”

The latter won the Real Good Deal S. over track and trip for these same connections Aug. 2. Tamarando has yearling and weanling half-brothers by Lucky Pulpit, who stands as property of the Williams’ at Harris Farm in California.

# RACETRACK ROUND-UP

## **Berkshire Poised for Champagne Test...**

[Jockey] Jim Crowley came last week to ride him and he worked very well last Saturday, so we couldn't be happier with him at home. He's a big, imposing horse now. My father wanted to give him time and I think it's the right thing to do, as we need to treat him like a good horse and run him when he's ready. The form of his race has worked out well and the encouraging thing about him is he loves his work and has a great attitude."

## **Kingsbarns to Join Declaration of War in Champion...**

**Kingsbarns (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is set to join stable companion **Declaration of War** (War Front) in Saturday's G1 Red Mills Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, trainer Aidan O'Brien announced yesterday. Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner will be making his belated return to action in the 10-furlong contest, where he will run alongside the G1 Juddmonte International hero as the Ballydoyle conditioner whittled his team down from six. "Kingsbarns has been coming along steadily and is ready to race," he told the *Racing Post*. "Declaration of War has not done a lot since York, but is in good form."

## **GISW Swagger Jack out for the Rest of the Year...**

Silverton Hill's **Swagger Jack** (Smart Strike--Lyrical Prayer, by The Minstrel), who had been pointing toward last weekend's G1 Forego H. at Saratoga, has been sidelined for the remainder

of the 2013 season. The winner of the Apr. 6 G1 Carter H. worked four furlongs in :49 3/5 at Gulfstream Park in preparation for the Forego, but exited that effort with an injury to his left hind leg.

### CRESRAN OFFERS HALF TO TIZ MIZ SUE

Carol Ricks's CresRan Racing LLC enjoyed its first Grade I victory when **Tiz Miz Sue** (Tiznow--Sue's Good News, by Woodman) charged home first in the May 27 GI Ogden Phipps H. and the operation, run by Ricks's grandson Ran Leonard, will offer a half-sister ([hip 516](#)) to that homebred multiple graded stakes winner during Wednesday's third session of the Keeneland September Yearling sale.

Leonard acknowledged it was a difficult decision to offer the filly, a daughter of Indian Charlie.

"It's extremely tough and what makes it a little tougher is Tiz Miz Sue and Sue's Good News and all of the horses are so important to my grandmother," Leonard said. "I joke often that she is going to outlive me--she is in perfect health and travels all over the place to watch them race--and I know if I sell one, it takes that away from her to a degree. And believe me, that is something that weighs heavily on me, but I also

know I have to make the right financial decision at least once in a while."

The origins of CresRan date back to the 1970s, when Ran Ricks, Jr. bought a horse named Breaker Breaker (Proud Clarion).

"My grandfather always had a passion for going to the races," Leonard explained. "He bought his first horse with a friend or two in 1976. He ended up buying quite a bit on his own. His first trainer and good friend was J.J. Pletcher, Todd's father, of course. He and J.J. were in business together until the early to mid-1980s. At that time, Steve Hobby was our farm trainer and was training all the farm horses and my grandfather and

J.J. were kind of going different directions and split. Steve went to the racetrack and became our private trainer for my grandfather's horses for a number of years before he started to have other clients. That is how my granddad and my grandmom got into the business."

As the couple's oldest grandson, Leonard spent many summers working for his grandfather.

"When I turned 14, I had a job every summer and had to learn all different aspects of his businesses, which were oil and gas, and then also the farm and the horses," Leonard recalled.

“My grandfather passed away in December of 1996 and I was a 20-year-old college junior who was playing basketball and was going to be a basketball coach, I thought,” the Oklahoma native continued. “When he passed away, they designated me to get rid of all the horses.”

When it was pointed out to him that he might not have done the best job of selling the horses, Leonard laughed, “No, I didn’t do a great job, but the reason I didn’t do a great job was because my grandmother pretty quickly told me, ‘I love this and as long as economically we can do it, I’d like to have some of them around. It gives me something to do.’”

Under Leonard’s guidance, the operation was cut down from 25 broodmares and 60 horses to its current size of six broodmares, split between Kentucky and Oklahoma, and seven horses in training. The stable reemerged as CresRan Racing LLC.

Leonard spent the next several years learning the ins and outs of the breeding industry and putting together a business model.

“I had some phenomenal teachers,” he said. “Steve Hobby is one of my best friends and has been a phenomenal mentor and has taught me and my grandmother a lot. John and Barbara Smicklas from here in Oklahoma, who have been prominent breeders and were partners with my granddad on a few horses, they’ve taught me a lot. Mike Shannon out in Lexington, who still acts as our agent a lot and I go work the sales with--they all taught me a lot over the course of three, four, five years, as I was learning what to do and how to do it. By the beginning of 2000-2001 we had a good number and a good business plan and we were able to execute that with the plan of trying to buy one or two fillies a year in the \$35,000 to \$75,000 range and hopefully getting some potential broodmares.”

Among the first group of fillies CresRan purchased was Sue’s Good News (Woodman), who was a \$45,000 Keeneland September yearling buy in 2001, and Feisty Princess (Indian Charlie), who was a \$40,000 Keeneland November purchase in 2000. Both would go on to be stakes winners and stakes producers.

Feisty Princess’s second foal, bred by CresRan, was stakes winner Tiger Cat Lilly (Tale of the Cat). In foal to Daaher, the mare sold for \$55,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November sale. Her Daaher filly, Gypsy Robin, became a two-time graded stakes winner and was second in last year’s GI Test S. She also added yesterday’s CERF S. at Del Mar.

Sue’s Good News won the 2003 GIII Singapore Plate S. at Arlington Park and earned over \$200,000. Her second foal was Tiz Miz Sue, who, in addition to the Ogden Phipps, won two renewals of the GIII Azeri S. and earned over \$1 million before being retired to the CresRan broodmare band in August.

## NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



### INCENTIVES ARE STRONG FOR BUSINESS INVESTMENT

The American Taxpayer Relief Act reinstated 50 percent bonus depreciation and increased the expense allowance to \$500,000 for 2013. Both incentive programs could have important implications for purchasers of horses, farm equipment and most other depreciable property. Below is a summary of these incentives:

**Bonus Depreciation** - allows taxpayers to write off 50 percent of the cost of new qualified depreciable property if the property is purchased and placed in service before 1/1/2014. Property is considered new if its original use commences with the taxpayer. Yearlings, for example, may qualify for this incentive.

**Expense Allowance** - allows taxpayers to write off the cost of new or used qualified depreciable property, up to \$500,000, if the property is purchased and placed in service before 1/1/2014. The expense allowance is reduced dollar for dollar once qualified investments exceed \$2 million. In addition to yearlings, broodmares may qualify for this incentive.

The \$500,000 expense allowance and 50 percent bonus depreciation may be used together in some situations. For more information on how to best apply these incentives to your business, [download this investment incentive flyer](#) and consult a tax professional.

“The whole ride she took us on for four years was amazing,” Leonard said of Tiz Miz Sue. “Her last race at Belmont--where I personally had never been, we’d run horses there before, but I hadn’t been there--and just the amazing history of the place and to hold on to my grandma as we’re leading Tiz Miz Sue into the winner’s circle after winning a Grade I, I can’t imagine anything better than that. I’ve said it a lot, I might get lucky enough to have a horse as good as Tiz Miz Sue again, but the odds are against me, and there will never be one like her again for us. She means so much to us.”

Leonard admitted it was extra special watching a horse like Tiz Miz Sue who traces back to CresRan's beginnings have such success on the track.

"Maybe it is a bit of an ego thing, but I take a lot of pride in that we bred Tiz Miz Sue," he confirmed. "We bought the mare on a very reasonable budget as a yearling and our agent Mike Shannon, along with Steve Hobby, saw some things that could be improved pretty quickly and they did and then the first time the saddle was ever put on her, we got phone calls immediately, 'We have a racehorse here.' That was 2001 when we bought her and here we are in 2013 and we have been along for every step of the way."

Leonard said CresRan is breeding primarily to race, but will sell some foals as yearlings.

"Ideally we have three to four babies a year and can put one or two of them in the sale," Leonard explained. "Our general philosophy, which I am saying this and yet what we're doing here is the opposite, but generally we sell the boys and keep the girls. When Sue's Good News foaled a filly on the ground this year, a full-sister to Tiz Miz Sue, I said, 'Ok, let's go ahead and put the [Indian Charlie] yearling in the sale. Particularly since we knew we had a chance that she would be one of the hot horses there and see if we could get lucky.'"

Sue's Good News's yearling filly, who is part of the Paramount Sales consignment, does remind Leonard of her famous sister, as well as her 5-year-old full-sister, Sue's Sweet Sioux.

"She is a big, strong filly," Leonard said. "She does look a lot like her full-sister, Sue's Sweet Sioux, who was actually a very talented filly who had a few little injuries that kind of interrupted her campaign and didn't allow her to reach her full potential. But she actually looks a little bit more like her, but does share some qualities with Tiz Miz Sue for sure."

In addition to her weanling filly by Tiznow, Sue's Good News was bred to GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Blame last spring. Sue's Sweet Sioux is currently in foal to Colonel John--"trying to keep the Tiznow thing going--he's been good to us," Leonard explained. And, while no final plans have been made for Tiz Miz Sue, Leonard said, "You can probably pick out the usual suspects that will cross well with her, but I'll just say it is very nice to have options when you have a quality mare like her."

Leonard regularly attends the sales, but he'll have extra company at the September sale.

"My grandmother actually just told me today that she thinks she'll come out to the sale," Leonard said. "She usually doesn't because she doesn't want to sell any of them. But I think her and her cousin, who is about 10 years younger than her and is one of her best buddies, I think they are going to drive out and go see the babies at the farm and our horses at Churchill, then come over to the sale."

Still Leonard has one concern.

"I've made the request that maybe she shouldn't be on the sales grounds when the horse is actually being sold. I'm not worried that she is going to start bidding, but what I'm worried about is that, if the horse sells, I'm going to get hit over the head with her purse. I've made it pretty clear when the horse sells, she is going to be in Frankfort or somewhere." --*Jessica Martini*

“Yeah,” I said, “and I know someone who was hit by lightning. But the odds against coming out with a profit by playing the lottery are steeper than the odds against getting hit by lightning.”

Overhyped lotteries continue to attract the attention of the media, thereby seducing more gullible folk into thoughtless gambling whose satisfaction lasts as long as it takes to scratch off a number. On the other hand, you can bet the horse races studiously and make a profit at the end of the year and even at the end of the decade... that is if you do your homework, read the past performances, and engage in the analytical thinking required to interpret the data.

When I make this point, I risk being ridiculed. Not only do talk show hosts and newspaper reporters refuse to consider the possibility of successful horse race betting, but even some race track owners think I'm nuts, and then they go on to scorn the very people who put money into their handle.

Well now, thanks to *Thoroughbred Daily News (TDN)*, I can prove my assertion: you can beat the races! Mainly, *TDN* covers the world of racing from every angle, including breeding and owning horses. But it also publishes a horse-selecting competition between its two resident handicapping experts, Brian DiDonato and Steve Sherack. Steve and Brian are given mythical bankrolls at the beginning of a race meeting or in the period running up to the Kentucky Derby, and then go head-to-head by making public choices before the day's races. *TDN* readers not only receive these choices before the races are run but they get to read the thoughtful rationale behind the selections. **Cont. p12**

They are not touting horses. They give reasons, you read their rationale, and then decide if you agree enough to make your own wager.

The bankroll bottom line is tallied after each of their wagers. Most public handicappers would prefer not to be scrutinized in such a way.

Both DiDonato and Sherack invariably come out with a significant profit at the end of the meet, and their return on investment would be the envy of the most aggressive hedge fund operators.

For example, Saratoga is known as one of the toughest race meets to beat and yet these two students of the game have been profitable in the two annual Saratoga meetings that have transpired since the TDN has run this competition.

Sherack and DiDonato get to wisely choose their bets, not selecting races where the investment looks too daunting. That's part of the skill, knowing when to get on or stay out. Their counterpart at the *Troy Record* (not far from Saratoga), Nick Kling, is obligated to pick a horse for every single race. Any serious player knows that making a profit requires betting selectively, and yet Nick's newspaper column has often ended a meet with a profit.

In other words, you may not be able to beat a particular race, but you can beat the races in the long run.

So here is my proposal. For every newspaper column inch and TV slot dedicated to lotteries, there should be at least an equal amount of space and time set aside for horse race handicapping. The public deserves an intellectually challenging alternative to the ubiquitous lotteries that diminish the value of the human mind.

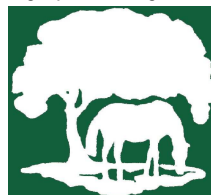
**CLOSING DAY THOUGHTS FROM TOP DEL MAR TRAINERS:**
