

LANTERN SET TO SHINE AT KEENELAND

Green Lantern Stables, well-known for having campaigned the likes of multiple grades stakes winner Gotta Have Her (Royal Academy); homebred and GI Maker's Mark S. heroine Karelian (Bertrando); champion and multiple Group 1 heroine Irridescence (SAf) (Caesour); and G1SW Gypsy Warning (SAf) (Mogok) (the latter two in partnership with Team Valor), offers up a quartet of yearlings--bred solely or in partnership--in Book 1 of this year's Keeneland September sale. Green Lantern, which has sold previously through a variety of consignors,

presents all three of this season's youngsters which are solely owned and bred by the farm through the Paramount Sales agency.

Heading Green Lantern's Book 1 consignment is [Hip 111](#), a colt by Medaglia d'Oro out of South African champion 3-year-old Irridescence, a two-time Group 1 winner in her native land as well runner-up in the G1 Falmouth S. in England and the GI Beverly D. S. at in the United States. Green Lantern held a 50% stake in the full-sister to the dual the Group 1-winning Perfect Promise (SAf), and she was campaigned in conjunction with Team Valor International following her win in the G1 South African Classic in 2005 before being purchased outright at the conclusion of her racing career. Irridescence's first foal, Exothermic (Empire Maker), won his first two starts [at Gulfstream at two and three], but subsequently encountered a couple of minor setbacks. According to Green Lantern's Richard Masson, that 4-year-old is back in training with Kentucky-based Rusty Arnold and is likely to reappear at Keeneland this fall. The 12-year-old mare's 2011 foal, Hay Oats and Water (Dynaformer), is currently in training at Fair Hill for Team Valor and the mare currently has a Smart Strike colt by her side.

"Almost every foal she has had has looked like her," confirmed Masson. "She was brilliant at middle distances and she won a Grade [Group] Is on a number of continents. She's doesn't really look like an typical American horse-stocky and sprinter-looking. She is much more Classic looking and doesn't really bulk up. Her offspring are a little lighter, but as a result, they train very forwardly and they seem to appear to run all day." **Cont. p3**

LUNE VS. MOON

Early Melbourne Cup favorite **Puissance De Lune (Ire)** (Shamardal) takes his next step towards the A\$6-million race in tomorrow's G1 Makybe Diva S. over 1600m at Flemington. The 6-year-old, who concluded last season with three straight victories, picked up right where he left off Aug. 17, going last-to-first to win Caulfield's G2 P.B. Lawrence S. in style. The grey, whom jockey Glen Boss has declared as good as three-time G1 Melbourne Cup winner Makybe Diva (GB) and dual G1 Cox Plate scorer So You Think (NZ), is 3-for-3 second up. Taking on the favorite will be a trio of newcomers from Europe, headed by the ever-reliable **Sea Moon (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}). Off the board just twice in 10 outings, the former Sir Michael Stoute charge tangled with the best in Europe at both middle and long distances. Second to St. Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Turf, Sea Moon bested recent American St. Leger winner Dandino (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in last year's Tapster S. at Goodwood, followed by a defeat of 2011 Melbourne Cup winner Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}) in Royal Ascot's G2 Hardwicke S. Sea Moon has not been seen since finishing eighth in a very boggy G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe last October, and thus faces a lengthy layoff in his first outing for trainer Robert Hickmott. G1 German Derby winner **Waldpark (Ger)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is an intriguing contender. **Cont. p6**

Regarding the choice to send his highly-prized mare to the son of El Prado (Ire), Masson explained, "We thought Medaglia would fit her from a physical standpoint, but we also thought the cross would work quite well. In fact, this colt looks very much like Exothermic did as a yearling."

Masson is also ready to ride the recent success of stallion Malibu Moon, responsible for this season's GI Kentucky Derby and GI Florida Derby hero Orb.



**Hip 48 - Malibu Moon -
Gold Rush Queen**

Among those representing Spendthrift's resident sire in Book 1 are a pair of fillies bred by Green Lantern--[Hip 48](#) and [Hip 165](#). The former is out of Gold Rush Queen (Seeking the Gold), already responsible for a pair of stakes winners and graded performers by A.P. Indy--Ender's Shadow and Ender's Sister.

"This Malibu Moon [Hip 48] is every bit as good looking as the first two A.P. Indy's we've had," affirmed Masson.

A daughter of the multiple graded stakes winner and millionairess Fit for a Queen (Fit to Fight), Gold Rush Queen was a private purchase for Green Lantern in the latter part of the 90s and has been paying dividends for the operation ever since.


"We bought her privately and she was carrying a foal by Deputy Minister [in 1998-99]," recalled Masson. "We sold that first foal [for \$350,000 at KEEJUL in 2000], we kept the next two, both by A.P. Indy, and had some good luck with them [Ender's Shadow and Ender's Sister]."

After losing a foal by A.P. Indy because of MRLS on a 2001 cover, Masson offered the mare back in foal to the Lane's End pensioner at the 2006 Keeneland November sale in 2006, but she was bought back for \$950,000.

"We have pretty much sold out of her ever since," said Masson. "We ended up keeping the mare out of Giant's Causeway [Shadow Giant, a 2005 foal] and sold the next two by A.P. Indy [both brought \$425,000 at Keeneland September in 2007 and 2008, respectively]."

Green Lantern retains Ender's Sister and has also kept a couple of her offspring, including a colt by Indian Charlie named A. P. Indian. A six-length winner in his juvenile debut at Delaware while under the care of Tony Dutrow, the colt was turned out for a time at Green Lantern, but has since returned to trainer Rusty Arnold and is entered today at Churchill Downs.

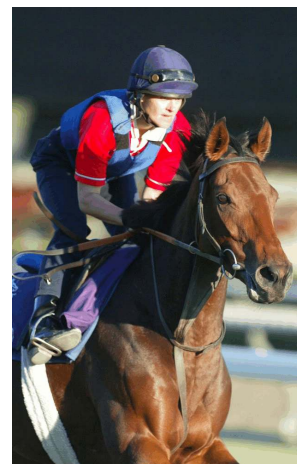

Also among the 12 yearlings by Malibu Moon on offer in Book 1 is Hip 165, a filly out of London Bid (Rainbow Quest), a daughter of English highweight 3-year-old and 4-year-old filly Islington (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). The G1 Yorkshire Oaks and two-time G1 Nassau S. winner also annexed the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf in 2003.

"He is a very good, sound source of A.P. Indy and Seattle Slew, so he fits very well with mares that have Mr. Prospector blood and he might actually add a little bit of soundness and distance as well," said Masson of Malibu Moon. "We've seen a lot of good ones by him. When we went to him [in 2011], he was known more as a filly sire, because many of his best runners were fillies. But we are very happy to see him get some very nice colts as well. We always thought there shouldn't be a significant difference with him. We love him. He's a solid, proven stallion that is the kind of sire that should be well supported and heavily used by people who want to breed a good horse." **Cont. p4**

In foal to Street Cry (Ire), London Bid was purchased for \$600,000 at the 2009 Keeneland November sale. In 2011, she produced a filly by Dynaformer and has a son of Street Cry by her side this season. She is currently in foal to Hard Spun.

“For the right mare, we’ll pay more if we have to,” said Masson. When asked about London Bid’s healthy purchase price “She was a material purchase for us, as a daughter of Islington. At the time, we were looking for some type of European outcross that we could work with. We thought she was the best available candidate and she is just getting started as a broodmare. She is throwing horses that all look the part, so we’re very happy with her so far.”

The mare’s first foal, Telic, was injured in his first career start this past April, but is poised to return to training, as soon as next week.

“She has great size, great architecture and very attractive,” said Masson of the Mar. 7 foal. “Her full brother Telic is very much the same way.”

Rounding out Green Lanterns consignment is [Hip 41](#), a daughter of Indian Charlie which was co-bred with Ian Banwell’s St George Farm. Offered by Lane’s End, the Jan. 25 foal is out of Gingham and Lace (Kris S.), a half-sister to Emptythetill (Holy Bull), the dam of Indian Charlie’s dual Grade III winner Conveyance.

When asked about who is expected to shine in this year’s small but select group, Masson was pragmatic.

“They all look the part,” Masson said. “You never know until you put them in competition and know what they’re all about. But they all have the background, they have the pedigree to be able to succeed at the highest level and all physically appear to have the tools to compete at the highest levels. So, we’re hopeful that more than one of these will be well received.”--Christina Bossinakis

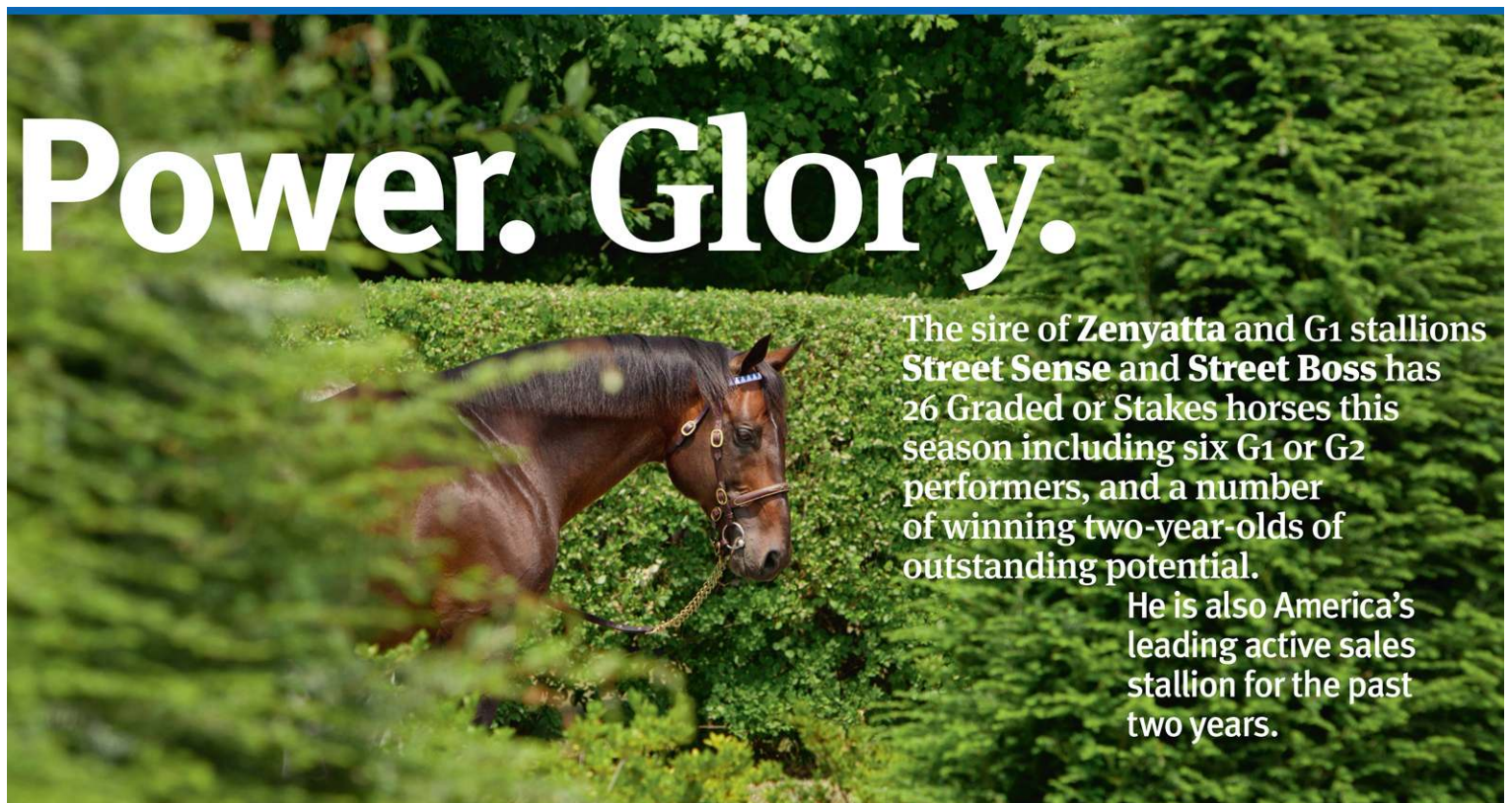

Freedman told *racingandsports.com.au*: "He's made good, solid improvement throughout his preparation. He'll probably find the mile a little sharp on Saturday, but as long as I see him finishing the race off strongly or doing a bit towards the end, I'll be happy enough." Rounding out the new imports contingent is 2011 G1 St. Leger winner **Masked Marvel (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}). RACETRACK ROUND-UP

AL IN THE MIX WITH RAIN FORECAST

Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) looks likely to be in the line-up for tomorrow's G1 Red Mills Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown after the weather forecast shifted to suggest heavy rain could arrive in time for the 5-year-old. Trainer Roger Charlton had been looking at Sunday's G2 Prix Foy at Longchamp for John Deer's triple Group 1 winner, but opted to leave him in the Irish feature after potential storms entered the equation. Leopardstown's Clerk of the Course Lorcan Wyer said yesterday, "We're not sure exactly how much, but the forecasters are saying that from Friday midnight through to the early part of Saturday we are maybe looking at 15 or 20 millimeters of rain. We are good-to-firm at the moment and I think the whole team has produced gorgeous racing ground. We stopped watering on Tuesday, given the rain coming in and on Friday night in advance of the rain it may be quicker than ideal for some horses, so we are playing poker a little bit at the moment. If it comes, it will be over a sustained period of time, and the track is in fabulous condition and well able to take that volume of rain. I'd say it may be no worse than yielding or good-to-soft, but that's an estimated guess."

AN OWNER'S PERSPECTIVE ON AFTERCARE & THE TAA

There is no question that the issue of Thoroughbred aftercare is a critical one. As participants in the Thoroughbred industry, every single one of us derives some form of utility from horses. For most of us, being around Thoroughbreds is our vocation and our avocation. With the thrills and enjoyment these horses bring to us, we have a responsibility to ensure their well-being after their racing careers are over. At Let's Go, we are committed to taking care of our equine athletes both on and off the track, and of primary concern as owners is that our horses are safe when they leave our care. Having viable aftercare options available helps us resolve this concern--and this is precisely what the recently formed Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance (TAA) has mobilized to do.

The TAA addresses aftercare in a pragmatic manner, with the mission of serving as both an accrediting body for aftercare facilities that care for Thoroughbreds following the conclusion of their racing careers and a fundraising body to support these approved facilities. The TAA fund-raising concept is simple --they plan to collect a small, fair share from transactions at every touch point in the horse's life. Success has been gradual--a significant representation of stallion owners has committed the equivalent of 1/4 of a stallion season to the TAA; The Jockey Club has raised registration fees by \$25 with all the added revenue going to the TAA; Barretts, Fasig-Tipton, Keeneland and OBS will enable participants at their auctions to automatically contribute .05% of all transactions to the TAA and the sales companies will match. In the coming months, it is expected that other levels of fund-raising successes will take place--at racetracks, with veterinarians, owners, trainers, and jockeys.

As owners, the value and importance of the TAA is twofold. First, it greatly simplifies the aftercare process. Through accreditation of qualified facilities, the TAA essentially provides a "one stop shop" for aftercare--they have already done the legwork to establish a network of aftercare organizations that provide a uniform level of care for our retired Thoroughbreds. This relieves some pressure from us, as we can feel confident that these facilities are providing care that meets our criteria and we are covering our bases. Cont. p9

Further, through minimal contributions across multiple touchpoints, the funding to support these facilities is greatly simplified as well.

Second, the TAA provides us with peace of mind that our goal of keeping our horses safe is being met. The TAA thoroughly vets each aftercare organization, and each must meet a rigorous Code of Standards in order to obtain accreditation. Because of these detailed requirements, we can feel confident that the horses at these facilities are cared for and safe. Additionally, because the TAA also raises funds to support these facilities, there is a mechanism in place to ensure this level of care is sustained.

Our industry faces no shortage of problems, but aftercare is one where we have an opportunity to come together to tackle it in a cohesive, unified manner. Through its accrediting and funding model, the TAA takes a burden off of our shoulders, providing viable options and financial support to help to ensure the safety and well-being of these animals that are the lifeblood of our sport. But the only way the TAA can be successful is if, in the long term, the entire industry participates. You can do your part by supporting the TAA at the upcoming sales - .05% represents only \$25 on a \$50,000 sale. This adds up to a lot of money over the course of the calendar year and, the TAA is doing its best to utilize existing industry resources to ensure that the vast majority of money raised goes back to the horses. By sharing the burden across the entire industry, we can help to provide a better life after the races to these horses that give so much to us. *Bryan Sullivan is co-Managing Member of Let's Go Stables.
