ANOTHER TOPPER FOR BAUMANN STABLES

Lane Seliger, sitting alongside advisor Dr. Naoya Yoshida, was forced to a session-topping \$1.3 million to secure a filly by Bernardini during Tuesday's second session of the Keeneland September Yearling sale. The bay ([hip 291](#)) is out of Pacific Spell and is therefore a half-sister to champion Proud Spell (Proud Citizen).

"She was highly recommended by our advisors, Dr. and Mrs. [Marie] Yoshida, and we are very pleased to have made the purchase," said Seliger after signing the seven-figure ticket in the name of his Baumann Stables. The retired Texas businessman, formerly president of Lake Steel, Ltd. in Amarillo, is still a relative newcomer to the sales scene, but it was the second time he paid

\$1.3 million for a horse at Keeneland. Seliger gave that sales-topping price for Grade I winner Nereid (Rock Hard Ten) at this year's Keeneland January sale.

"We're relatively new to the business," Seliger admitted. "We have a number of broodmares at Dr. and Mrs. Yoshida's Winchester Farm and a few other runners around the country with a number of trainers, including Ron Ellis, Graham Motion, Kellyn Gorder and Michael Matz."

Seliger said he was breeding both to race and sell and admitted his goals are "probably the same as everybody else's."

Of this newest equine acquisition, Seliger said, "The bloodline was very, very attractive and very deep and I think it will be well-supported in the future."

Asked if there were more yearlings on his shopping list, Seliger said, "This may be it. She might well be [the budget buster]. We'll see what comes up over the next couple of days." **Tuesday Topper cont. p3**

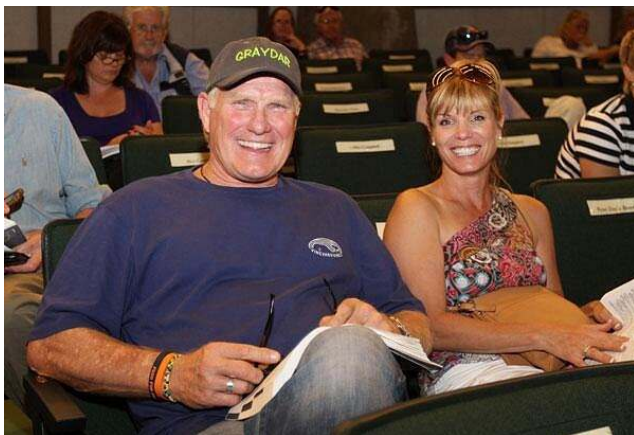
Puhich Goes Deep for Smart Strike Colt

Bernardini Filly Spells Topper for Airdrie...

Brereton Jones admitted it was a tough decision to send the half-sister to his champion Proud Spell through the sales ring yesterday at Keeneland.

“Of course it is [tough], but also this is a business,” Jones said after watching the filly sell for \$1.3 million. “Airdrie is not just raising horses for the fun of it with no concern about the bottom line. It’s a business for us. We love it as much or more than anyone in it, but we have to operate it as a business. And this is what we needed to do. I still have her mother, I still have access to her father, because he is alive and stands at Darley, if I want to go back to him, and he is a fabulous sire. So it just made sense to put some money in the bank and pay off some bills and build some fences.”

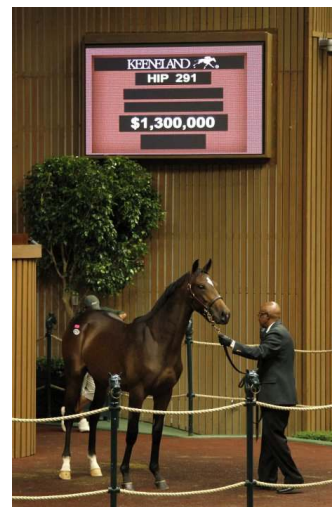

The yearling's price was no surprise to Jones, who knew he had something special in barn 48.

“I really thought she would bring a million or better because she is that type of filly,” he said. “If you watched her up here--anyone who came up to the barn and had interest in her, and there were many--watched the way that she never got tired. Even with the heat, she never got exhausted. She always walked like a great athlete, with this great overstride. And she always looked at you with a bright eye. I know when Sheikh Hamdan came to look at her and he patted her, she looked over at Sheikh Hamdan and it was like a boy and a girl meeting each other for the first time.”

Racing in the colors of Jones's Airdrie Stud, Proud Spell won the 2008 GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Alabama S. before being named that year's champion sophomore filly. Shortly after her half-sister went through the Keeneland ring, Proud Spell's Bernardini yearling ([hip 333](#)) failed to sell at \$360,000. The 8-year-old mare is currently in foal to Airdrie's first-year sire Creative Cause. **More Toppers p5**

Business Brisk Tuesday at Keeneland...

The newly revamped Book 1 continued to produce strong results as the Keeneland September sale marched into its second day Tuesday. Through the first two days of the 12-day sale, 269 yearlings have grossed \$69,621,000. The cumulative average is \$258,814 and the median is \$200,000. While difficult to make accurate year-to-year comparisons with last year's one-session Book 1 and this year's four-session Book 1, comparing all of 2012's Books 1 and 2 with the first two days of 2013 reveals an average up 27.6% and a median up 33.3%.

"At the halfway mark of this new format, so far everything has worked very well," confirmed Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "The goal of the format was to get people on the sales grounds and out there looking at horses. Looking at the buyers' list, there is a huge cross-section of buyers and they are going out there and buying horses."

The buy-back rate, 30.48% during the sale's opening session Monday, fell to 25.67% Tuesday, for a cumulative 28.07%.

"I think the buyers, once they got their feet wet, it seemed like they worked pretty hard today," said Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson. "And the sellers seemed to have a gauge for the market that they didn't have Monday."

Tuesday's session was topped by a \$1.3-million daughter of Bernardini. The filly was purchased by Lane Seliger's Baumann Stables and was consigned by her breeder Brereton Jones's Airdrie Stud, which campaigned her half-sister, champion Proud Spell (Proud Citizen). The filly was one of four yearlings to bring seven figures during Tuesday's session, bringing the two-day total of million-dollar sales to eight. There were seven during the entire 2012 auction.

"As John Sikura said yesterday, there is a high demand for high-quality animals," Russell continued. "When they find that horse, they are willing to spend. At this point, we're very pleased. We hope the next two days will continue on the same way."

The Keeneland September sale continues Wednesday at 12 noon.

One In a Million...

Coolmore was back in the swing of things Tuesday and its bounty was highlighted by [hip 325](#), a colt by Tapit out of Pretty 'n Smart (Beau Genius) who brought \$1-million, the co-second-highest price of the afternoon. Stationed at their customary spot out at the back of the pavillion, the Coolmore team was headed by M.V. Magnier, who signed the ticket on the colt.

"The lads thought he was a very nice horse," said Magnier. "We're going to send him back to Ashford and decide what we're going to do with him and whether he is going to stay in America or go to Europe."

The colt represented the first seven-figure sale for his consignor, VanMeter Sales.

"We didn't think he was going to bring

that much, but we were obviously very happy with the price," said Tom VanMeter.

VanMeter, a longtime principal partner in Eaton Sales, launched VanMeter sales in the summer of 2011.

"For my partner Olin Gentry and I, we've had a tough couple of years and we're glad [Olin] is back," admitted VanMeter.

The Apr. 28 foal, bred under the banner of JKG Thoroughbreds, is a half brother to Grade III winners Heart Ashley (Lion Heart) and Ashley's Kitty (Tale of the Cat). Pretty 'n Smart, in foal to Harlans Holiday, was purchased for \$525,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November sale. Since then, the mare has produced a colt by Medaglia d'Oro in 2011 who brought \$490,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale last season.

"We liked him since last spring, but when he got over here, he just showed himself at the best that anybody could show," said VanMeter. "We showed him 200 times, he had 26 repository checks and 15 or 16 scopes. Through all of that, he just kept showing himself, always walking and fresh and he just did it all himself."

Hip 325 was the sole offering by VanMeter Sales during yesterday's second session. The operation also sold its only representative Monday, Hip 74, a filly by Giant's Causeway who brought \$260,000. Regarding Keeneland's new Book 1 format, VanMeter was pragmatic.

"I like the new format," said VanMeter. "It provides strength to the whole first week. So, Monday should equal to Thursday, theoretically. I think it might have even been better today than yesterday."—CBoss

Malibu Moon Filly Joins Seven-Figure Parade...

A daughter of Malibu Moon, the final horse through the ring Tuesday at the Keeneland September sale, became the young auction's eighth seven-figure yearling when bringing \$1 million from bloodstock agent Hugo Merry, bidding on behalf of longtime client and fashion mogul Andrew Rosen. Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales on behalf of breeder Audrey "Tolie" Otto, the yearling is out of Shop Again (Wild Again).

Bloodstock agent Steve Young, sitting alongside Ramona Bass inside the pavilion, and Spendthrift Farm's B. Wayne Hughes were among the underbidders on the yearling. **Cont. p7**

Merry, standing out back with Rosen, admitted they were willing to bid higher to obtain the filly.

“To be honest, we heard all the people that were on this filly--and it seemed everyone was on her--so we thought we would have to pay a little more,” Merry said. “We were very happy to get her at that price. It’s a huge market and there is a shortage of these kind of fillies this week. We’ve been struggling to find really well-bred fillies that jump through all the hoops with the vetting, the conformation and the pedigree.”

Rosen has already enjoyed success with fillies purchased at the Keeneland September sale. He acquired Icon Project (Empire Maker) for \$775,000 out of the 2006 sale and First Passage (Giant’s Causeway) for \$1.2 million the following year. Icon Project went on to win the 2009 GI Personal Ensign S. and First Passage was victorious in the 2009 GIII Azalea S.

“We’ve bought a lot of nice fillies here over the years,” Merry said. “We’re just hoping this one is half as good as those.”

[Hip 438](#), out of stakes winner Shop Again (Wild Again), is a half-sister to Grade I winner Power Broker (Pulpit) and from the family of graded stakes winners Miss Shop (Deputy Minister) and Trappe Shot (Tapit). The mare was purchased by Nicoma on behalf of Otto’s Jamm, Ltd. for \$450,000 out of the 2007 Keeneland November sale.

“It’s fantastic; it’s such a gift to bring something up like that and she was an extraordinary filly bred by one of our dear friends,” Mill Ridge’s Headley Bell said while sharing celebratory hand shakes with Rosen. “Andrew Rosen is such a class act who loves racing, so it delights us in every way.”

Otto is a Missouri native who relocated to Lexington in 1993 and maintains a small commercial breeding operation. “She’s a longtime friend of the family; she was a partner with us on [1998 GI Kentucky Oaks winner] Keeper Hill,” Bell added.

Bell knew the filly was attracting interest from all the right areas prior to her arrival in the Keeneland sales ring late Tuesday. “When we had so much interest--we had 14 scopes--you don’t know where exactly it is going to fall, but we knew she was a special filly.”

Of the long wait until the end of Tuesday’s session, Bell said, “We didn’t mind because we could read the script and it was a good script.”

Bell acknowledged the market during the first two days of the Keeneland sale was competitive if you had the right individual.

“If you bring up the right horses, you’re going to be rewarded,” he said. “But it’s a select market and we’ve got a lot of horses on offer. The depth of buyers is good, but it can’t absorb everything, so you’ve got to know your product.”

Another Seven-Figure Star for Serenading...

Mike Puhich, the director of operations for the Washington State-based Pegasus Training and Equine Center, dug in to land yesterday's co-second-highest-priced horse, a colt by Smart Strike from the champion A.P. Indy mare Serenading, for an even \$1 million. Hill 'n' Dale Sales consigned the handsome colt as [hip 426](#), and was enjoying its second consecutive seven-figure sale out of Serenading. Last year at FTSAUG, a Street Cry (Ire) colt out of Serenading--the 9-year-old mare's first foal--sold to Darley's John Ferguson for \$1.2 million. Named Classic Devotion, the juvenile has not yet started.

Puhich said he was buying for a partnership headed by Dr. Mark Dedomenico--the preeminent heart surgeon who owns Pegasus and whose previous runners have included the champion filly Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) and recent GI Del Mar Debutante winner She's A Tiger (Tale of the Cat). Puhich did his bidding from out back alongside trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, and said the 2011 Hall of Fame inductee would both own a piece of and train the Smart Strike colt.

"He's just a really classy, gorgeous horse," said Puhich. "He's by a top stallion. We fell in love with him and decided we'd try to get him. Jerry will probably stay in for a piece, and that's the type of horse he wants. We're excited about it. John Sikura looks after Blind Luck for us, and he highly recommended the horse, so we felt pretty comfortable."

The colt will now head to Pegasus to be broken, Puhich said.

The colt represents the third generation of a family that's been very good to Hill 'n' Dale's John and Glenn Sikura, who raced his second dam, Daijin (Deputy Minister), to pair of Woodbine stakes wins and a third-place try in the 1995 GI Test S. "When you sell a horse at the highest end of the market and it's multi-generational, it's extra special," said John Sikura. "That's not to say it's not very rewarding selling for other people, but when you've foaled, raced and planned the matings on these horses, it's a different perspective--you have an emotional connection."

Sikura said the colt was a star from the beginning. "We've always loved the horse," he said. "He moves great, he's got great athleticism, and he's got the

perfect disposition. He's got a pretty head and eye, and never went through a gangly phase. He's a medium-sized horse with great balance and width. And he looked so great coming up to the ring today--it's the best we've brought

a horse into the ring in a long time. He was very alert and focused."

Asked about expectations, Sikura said, "You're in the wrong business if you're not happy to sell a horse for a million dollars. But I actually thought that was the minimum the horse would make, and there would be the possibility that there would be four or five guys in at that level. But Jerry Hollendorfer is a Hall of Fame trainer and a fantastic horseman, and he's had great success and a great strike rate. He doesn't usually spend a million dollars buying yearlings, and it shows how much he thought of this horse. He told me he thought it was the best horse he's seen at the sale--he loved him, but he didn't think he'd be able to afford him. It's great for Jerry to be able to train a horse like that."

Hill 'n' Dale looks to have another star offering today in the form of [Hip 523](#), a Medaglia d'Oro half-brother to GI Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver (Maria's Mon).

Son of Ready's Gal Brings \$850,000...

The second-highest price for a colt yesterday was the \$850,000 a son of Distorted Humor--Ready's Gal (More Than Ready) made on the bid of Shadwell Estate Company. Lane's End consigned the half-brother on behalf of breeder Don Adam's Courtlandt Farm as [Hip 360](#). "We're very happy with the way he sold--he's a very nice colt," said Lane's End's Bill Farish.

The colt's dam was one of the early standouts for her sire. From More Than Ready's first crop, she won the GII Canadian S. at Woodbine and a trio of Grade III events in the U.S. She also ran second in the GI Frizette S. at two. Courtlandt acquired the mare as a broodmare prospect for \$750,000 at the 2006 Fasig-Tipton November Sale, and enjoyed immediate success with her, as her first foal was ♀ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♀ and GIII Derby Trial S. winner Machen--a full-brother to the colt who sold yesterday.

At this sale a year ago, an Unbridled's Song colt out of Ready's Gal made \$200,000.

"He's done a little of both [racing and selling], but he's probably selling a little more than he was," Farish said of Adam.

The transaction was another success at September for Lane's End, which is the sale's leading consignor by a wide margin. Through the end of selling Tuesday, Lane's End had sold 34 horses for \$9,410,000, an average of \$276,765. Lane's End's other notable sales included:

- \$540,000 colt by Eskendereya--Quiet Action ([hip 347](#))
- \$500,000 colt by Candy Ride (Arg)--Mini Sermon ([hip 217](#))
- \$500,000 filly by Smart Strike--Mystery Trip ([hip 262](#))

Farish said September's been a solid sale so far. "I haven't look at the RNA's today, but it seems strong," he said. "But like any select sale, it's going to be spotty in parts."

Venosa Strikes Early...

Ocala-based bloodstock agent Steve Venosa got into the fray at Keeneland September with a pair of rapid-fire purchases early in Tuesday's second session of the 12-day auction.

Venosa first secured [hip 232](#), a colt by Tiznow out of Grade I winner Mistical Plan (Game Plan), for \$410,000. He was back in action with the very next hip through the ring when going to \$400,000 for [hip 234](#), a colt by Distorted Humor out of Modesty Blaise (A.P. Indy) from the family of Aldebaran and Good Journey.

"We came here targeting colts--we are looking for athletic individuals who look like runners," Venosa explained. "We felt that they were probably the two best colts that we really liked. They are athletic, very sound horses that were built well with very deep pedigrees. They were the horses that we felt strongly about, so that's why we bought them."

Plans for the two yearlings are fluid, but Venosa stressed the importance of striking when quality opportunities present themselves in the current market.

"All year, the sales have been pretty strong and I really think that if you see a horse in there that you like, you better be tied on and be able to just go in there and buy them," Venosa said. "And those two are two that we felt strongly about going in, so the price wasn't an issue."

Lane Sells Causeway Colt for \$550,000...

Consignor Beau Lane continues to have success with offspring of the 13-year-old Unbridled's Song mare Rebridled Dreams. A year after selling a Malibu Moon filly from the mare for \$375,000, Lane yesterday sold her Giant's Causeway yearling colt for \$550,000 to Northwest Stud.

The colt, [hip 365](#), was bred by the Chicago-based Coffeepot Stables, the nom de course of Robert

Cummings and Annette Bacola and longtime clients of Lane's.

"I'm really proud this horse brought that kind of money, and I really wish Bob could have been here today," said Lane.

"Unfortunately he had business, but that was a really good sale."

Rebridled Dreams is the dam of two stakes winners from four to race, including the 2011 GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity winner J. B.'s Thunder (Thunder Gulch); and MSW & MGSP Doncaster Rover (War Chant), an earner of nearly \$350,000.

"We've had this mare from the beginning, and she's been really nice," said Lane. "That Malibu Moon filly we sold last year could really be a star. Mr. [Gary] West bought her, and she's shown a lot [in training]. Things are really moving in that family. This pedigree could someday really be a stallion's pedigree." **Cont. p12**

Lane had just two horses selling during Keeneland's Book 1. During Monday's opening session, he bought back a colt by War Front--Julie From Dixie (Dixie Union) ([hip 123](#)) for \$240,000, but got the horse sold for around that amount shortly thereafter.

Lane reportedly has a number of nice offerings in the coming days at Keeneland. On Sunday, he'll send [hip 1318](#), a colt by Stroll--Frillery (Glitterman) through he ring. "He's a really, really nice horse," said Lane. Other standouts include [hip 1444](#), a Fusaichi Pegasus filly from the stakes-producing Parading Lady (Storm Cat), a daughter of champion Sacahuista (Raja Baba); and [hip 1368](#), a War Front half-brother to GISP She's Got the Beat (Sultry Song) "who's a monster," said Lane.

Jewel of the Nile...

Taylor Made stallion Eskendreya (Giant's Causeway--Aldebaran Light, Seattle Slew), who entered stud in 2011, has enjoyed a robust start to his second career, and the initial two days at Keeneland underscored the point. Leading the sire's representatives at the conclusion of Tuesday was [Hip 347](#), a colt out of stakes winning and graded placed Quiet Action (Forest Wildcat). The Mar. 25 foal, who went to Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stables for \$540,000, was the seventh highest priced colt of yesterday's session.

"He's one of the best Eskendreya's I've seen and I own the stallion, so I'm very happy to have a horse by him to race," said Banke, who's husband, the late Jess Jackson, purchased the colt at the conclusion of his racing career. "He's very attractive and well balanced. I think he looks just like his sire and maybe even a little prettier around the head."

"I thought he would bring over \$400,000," admitted Banke when asked about the purchase price.

"Eskendreya was one of my husband's [Jess Jackson] last, big purchases," said Banke. "With his breeding and conformation, we thought he would do well as a sire."

Eskendreya, purchased by Zayat Stables for \$250,000 at Keeneland September in 2008, was an impressive 7 1/4-length winner for trainer Todd Pletcher in only his second career start in an off-the-turf renewal of the Pilgrim S.

"He was a horse that we thought wanted to go long, so when we had him up at Saratoga, we started him off first time going a mile and a sixteenth on the turf, because we felt like two turns was what he was looking for," explained Pletcher. "He really impressed us after his second start in the Pilgrim as a maiden off the turf and the way he ran that day was very impressive. The way he galloped out afterwards was like 'wow,' that was a pretty serious move for a 2-year-old."

In his juvenile finale, he failed to land a blow when off-the-board in his synthetic debut in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Back in the winner's circle after a workmanlike score in a Gulfstream allowance the following January, the chestnut bounded home an easy 8 1/2-length winner in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Favored for his Kentucky Derby prep in the GI Wood Memorial, the colt made short work of his rivals and galloped home a 9 3/4-length winner. The early favorite for the Run for the Roses, the colt was scratched Derby week due to injury and retired to Taylor Made Stallions.

"I've been very impressed with how racy they look," said Pletcher. "They all look precocious and that they will have some speed. I've been very very happen with the ones I've seen so far."

During Monday's opening session, Pletcher went up to \$240,000 to secure [Hip 69](#), a daughter of the stallion and out of Helena's Secret (Five Star Day). From the family of Street Cry (Ire), the filly, who was consigned by Brookdale Sales, was purchased on behalf of Let's Go Stables.

"She looks like she should have some early speed," said Pletcher of the acquisition. "We were impressed by her overall physique, great walk and very attractive."

The trainer, who just bagged his 10th training title at the recently concluded Saratoga meeting, added, "His babies look like they will have speed and he could go long, so that's what you're looking for."

Also dipping into the till for a yearling by the first season sire Monday, agent Steve Young paid \$370,000 for [Hip 125](#), a colt out of Kamaal (Irgun) from the Clarkland Farm draft.

"He's by a first-year sire, and this horse stands on his own merit," said Young. "He was probably one of the five best-looking horses that were out there on the first day. Both his sire and broodmare sire both won the [GI] Wood [Memorial]. [Eskendereya] was one of the best 3-year-olds that was out there in the last 15 years and could basically do anything. There was a lot to like about this colt."

Over the course of the first two sessions, a total of seven yearlings were offered, with six finding buyers at an average of \$244,166.

"He gets some very nice looking horses and he appears to be off to a very good start at stud," said Young. —CBoss

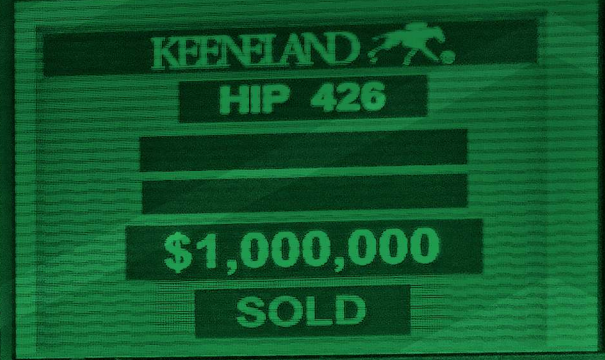

Coming into this test the least experienced in the line-up with just a 7 1/2-furlong conditions success to her name at Deauville Aug. 4, **Lesstalk In Paris** had flaunted her natural talent on that occasion and was able to translate that to this sphere to maintain her perfect tally in style.

Keen early in the hands of Ioritz Mendizabal, the strong-traveling bay eventually settled in the slipstream of stable companion and leader **Lacarolina (Fr)** (Charge d'Affaires {GB}) racing under cover against the rail. Allowing the even-money favorite **Straight Thinking** first run on her outer inside the final quarter, once freed from her pocket she was able to brush that rival aside with 100 meters remaining en route to a comfortable score. In doing so, she emulated the win of her dam **Top Toss (Ire)** (Linamix {Fr}) in this race six years ago. "She won easily first time, but you never know how they will do when you throw them into a big race," commented conditioner **Jean-Claude Rouget**, who bought the winner's **Azamour (Ire)** half-brother for the same owner for €155,000 at last month's Arqana Yearling Sale. "We won't commit to the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac [at Longchamp Oct. 6] yet, as we'll see how she comes out of this. It is a nice race to win and therefore tempting, but we could turn her out for the winter and train her with the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches in mind."

Live Oak Plantation's **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper) was slated to face Wise Dan in the Fourstardave, but was scratched by trainer Christophe Clement due to the ease in the ground. The Frenchman will be looking for faster going when he sends the grey gelding north of the border for the Mile. "We're looking for firm turf with him, regardless of the competition," said Clement's long-time assistant trainer, Christophe Lorieul. "We think he's a very good horse, but he's a lot more effective on firm turf. I'm not sure we can beat Wise Dan. Wise Dan is a very good horse. But we'll take him on and see what happens. Our horse is doing very well." Za Approval took the GIII Appleton S. Mar. 30 and added the GIII Red Bank S. May 18. He was last seen running second to top Californian miler Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) in the GI Shoemaker Mile at Hollywood Park June 29.

"In recent years we have listened to feedback from Irish trainers as we look at ways to develop our flat Horses In Training Sale. We believe that the Goffs Champions Sale is a huge step in the right direction as it allows trainers to showcase the best of Irish to an international audience on home soil." Leopardstown Chief Executive Pat Keogh added, "We are delighted to host this great innovation. Sales on racedays are proving very popular and the Goffs Champions Sale will add another exciting dimension to Irish Champions Weekend 2014."

Wise Dan Tunes Up at Keeneland...

Morton Fink's reigning Horse of the Year **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) put the finishing touches on his preparations for a defense of his title in Sunday's GI Ricoh Woodbine Mile by working a half-mile over the Polytrack in a smooth :48.20. The flashy chestnut carries an eight-race winning streak into the weekend, including the GII Firecracker H. under 128 pounds June 29 and the GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 10, where he was saddled with 129 pounds. Trainer Charlie LoPresti is already looking forward to 2014, and says no more handicaps. "I think his [Wise Dan] toughest race this year was at Churchill in the Firecracker," said LoPresti. "For as little money as he ran for he had to carry the top weight of 128 pounds on a tough [yielding] course." He continued, "If I had it to do all over again, I probably would have brought him to Canada and run him in the [GII] King Edward [S.]. It was for more money and it wasn't a handicap race, so I'm going to reconsider what I do with him next year. I don't want to put weight on him if I don't have to. The race [at Woodbine] is a \$200,000 race as opposed to \$150,000, without having to carry all the weight."

UNAUTHORIZED MEDICINES SEIZED AT SHEIKH'S STUD Part of the estate owned by Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum has been the subject of a seizure of 124 medical products which are not approved for use on horses in Britain, it was announced yesterday. The haul of unnamed products were discovered at Moorley Farm East, which houses the Maktoum family's endurance horses, by officials from the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) on behalf of the Veterinary Medicines Directorate, the agency responsible for issues concerning the use and manufacture of veterinary medicines in Britain. There is no suggestion that the medicines were intended for use in the thoroughbred side of the operation, something which was confirmed by Dalham Hall Stud Director Liam O'Rourke yesterday. "There's no connection with the thoroughbred operation," he stated. The seizure notice, which was issued under regulation 41 of Veterinary Medicines Regulations and posted on the VMD website, read, "Moorley Farm East, Newmarket. 124 veterinary medicinal products were seized because they were not authorised in the UK and had not been imported into the UK in accordance with the regulations. These medicines, in varying quantities, were to be used on horses and included injectables, anaesthetics, anti-inflammatories and antibiotics." The British Horseracing Authority (BHA) spokesman Robin Mounsey commented, "The property in question is not licensed by the BHA and we understand it isn't part of Darley's racing operation."

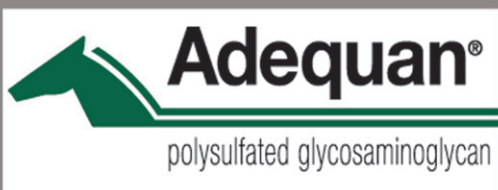
