



POPE TAKES CHARGE AT KEENELAND

Whisper Hill Farm's Mandy Pope, who bought the \$10 million Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) last year at FTKNOV, could well have another sale topper on her hands after going to \$2.2 million for an Indian Charlie daughter of MGISW Take Charge Lady (Dehere) yesterday at Keeneland September. The filly, consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales as hip 541, is a half to recent GI Travers S. hero Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) and to last season's

GI Florida Derby winner Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy). The transaction highlighted a hugely successful third day of selling at September. The third session average of \$310,296 was up 19.9% from the combined average of the first two days of selling, while the median of \$240,000 was 20%.

Pope, who outlasted Spendthrift's B. Wayne Hughes to land the filly, has been building a powerhouse breeding and racing operation in recent years. In addition to Havre de Grace, she also purchased the \$4.2 million Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro) last fall at KEENOV, and confirmed her most recent purchase will ultimately join her broodmare band.

"She'll be a delight to have, and something to go along with Havre de Grace and Plum Pretty after she becomes a famous racehorse," Pope smiled. "She'll fit right in with those two. She's absolutely beautiful. She's from a stellar family, she's by Indian Charlie, who sired a wonderful filly in Indian Blessing, and we hope she follows in the footsteps of her daddy and her mother and her brothers."

The filly is the second seven-figure sales yearling from Take Charge Lady, the tough-as-nails racemare and Keeneland ace whose wins included the GI Ashland S. and two editions of the GI Spinster S. Her very first foal was the striking-but-starcrossed Charming (Seeking the Gold), a \$3.2 million KEESEP yearling in 2006 who suffered a career-ending injury shortly into her racing days.

"We were expecting right around \$2 million," Pope said of the Indian Charlie filly. "She was a standout; she was my pick of the sale."

Pope did her bidding out back alongside GoldMark Farm manager Todd Quast, who is advising her at September. She said the filly would ship to her Ocala-based Whisper Hill Farm and be broken there before continuing her career at nearby GoldMark. Asked if she had a trainer in mind, she said, "Heavens no--that's too far away. But we have a lot of trainers to choose from, and she'll have an excellent trainer."

Pope said the market at September has been strong. "Even the horses who weren't even on our list were selling very well," she said. "It's been a tough sale from a buyer's standpoint, and there are so many [horses] over several days that you can't possibly get to all the barns and see all the horses for each day. So I know we're missing some. I think Keeneland did a very good job of putting together a nice group of horses, and I commend them on that." Cont. p3

Pope maintains a broodmare band of about 25 at Whisper Hill, and has a racing stable of about 45 horses. She both sells and races, and she said the commercial breeder in her was encouraged by the sharp upswing in the market at September.

“But what I hope--and this is a very important thing going forward--is that stud farms don't get stupid and go crazy on stud fees now,” she said. “It seems like every time as a breeder we can get our head above water and get some nice horses and pay our stud fees, the market goes up and then it becomes insane again for the breeders.”

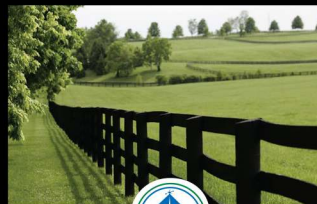
Big Sale for Hill 'n' Dale...

No consignor at September has sold more seven-figure horses than John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale, which has accounted for a quartet of \$1 million-plus transactions. That includes the sale-topping \$2.2 million Indian Charlie--Take Charge Lady filly, as well as yesterday's \$1.7 million Medaglia d'Oro--Supercharger colt. Hill 'n' Dale also sold Tuesday's \$1 million Smart Strike--Serenading colt and Monday's \$1.35-million daughter of Malibu Moon--Hollywood Story. “We thought we had break-out horses, and every horse sold and met our expectations,” Sikura said of his elite group. “And a few exceeded our expectations.”

He continued, “I think there's optimism in the market, and there's a lot of participation. The people here are finding the good horses and spending their money when they land on the same ones. There's a lot of competition, and the prices are reflecting that.”

Tiznow Filly Breaks Out...

Fireworks started early during Wednesday's third session of the Keeneland September sale with Goncalo Torrealba coming out on top at \$1.75 million after a protracted bidding duel for a daughter of Tiznow ([hip 446](#)). Torrealba, sitting alongside Three Chimneys' Robert Clay in a back row of the sales pavilion, saw off determined bidding from Bridlewood Farm's George Isaacs to add the half-sister to champion sprinter and leading sire Speightstown (Gone West) to his family's Borges Torrealba Holdings. The yearling was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency on behalf of her breeder, Aaron and Marie Jones.

"We really liked her," Torrealba chuckled after signing the ticket on the filly. "She comes from a stallion pedigree family and that's what we are trying to do."

The Borges Torrealba family has been a major presence in the sales ring since announcing it was partnering with Three Chimneys last November. Torrealba admitted yesterday that he is already looking forward to the yearling joining the broodmare band at the Midway nursery. **Cont. p5**

“We’re looking forward to having her at Three Chimneys when her racing career is over,” he confirmed.

The two partners also teamed up to purchase the sales topper at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, paying \$1.225 million for a daughter of Dynaformer. Still, Torrealba acknowledged Wednesday’s \$1.75-million price tag was more than he expected to pay for the bay yearling.

“You are always surprised [by the price], you always want to buy them for less, but everyone is trying to buy them for less,” he said. “We overpaid for her, according to our evaluation, but we really wanted her.”

Bloodstock agent Alex Solis was among the underbidders on the Tiznow filly, but it was Isaacs, sitting alongside the press box, who bid up until the \$1.7-million mark before shaking his head no, smiling and walking out of the pavilion.

Torrealba was quickly back in action later in the session, buying a daughter of Indian Charlie out of Smart Surprise (Smart Strike) ([Hip 463](#)) from the Hill ‘n’ Dale consignment for \$625,000. The family also purchased a daughter of Unbridled’s Song ([hip 225](#)) for \$460,000 during Tuesday’s session.

Aaron and Marie Jones have enjoyed plenty of success selling out of their mare Silken Cat (Storm Cat), who raced in Marie Jones’s name and was Canada’s champion juvenile filly in 1995. The mare’s first foal was Speightstown, who sold for \$2 million at the

1999 Keeneland July sale. Hip 446 was the mare’s fifth million-dollar yearling.

“We knew she was a great filly, but we didn’t really realize she was going to bring that much money,” admitted Taylor Made’s Duncan Taylor. “Getting \$1.5 million in this market looked like it was life and death, so for one to bring \$1.75 million is amazing. But she is so gorgeous and from such a good family, foals out of her are going to bring a ton if she runs like she looks. It looks like she could be one of those blue hens.”

"I think there is a market for one of those that looks the part and has the breeding to go with it," Taylor said. "There were eight that have brought a million in the first two days and there were seven different buyers for those eight horses. There are a lot of people with money and, if you've got a good horse, they are willing to pay."

Still, Taylor added, "We sell quite a few horses, so basically, we're feeling the pain in some spots and we're feeling the jubilation in others. It's not like it's blowing it out of the water, like it might appear. This filly sold great and we've had some other really good sales, but I think buyers who came in for all four days are smart to be here, because I think there are some horses that are selling reasonably."

Keeneland Gets a Charge...a Super Charge...

Just eight hips after teaming with Regis Farm to acquire a son of Tapit, Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stables partnered with B.

Wayne Hughes's Spendthrift Farm to purchase a half-brother to GI Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver (Maria's Mon) for \$1.7 million ([hip 523](#)). The colt, by Medaglia d'Oro out of Supercharger (A.P. Indy), was consigned by John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales. Sikura purchased both mare and foal privately from WinStar Farm last summer.

Banke admitted the yearling's sire was a draw. "We had the best Medaglia d'Oro ever [in Rachel Alexandra] and this one reminded me of [Horse of the Year] Curlin."

Banke and Hughes have already had success racing together. The two racing and breeding powerhouses teamed up with multiple graded stakes winners Tiz Wonderful (Tiznow) and Dominus (Smart Strike). Both stallions now stand Spendthrift.

"We had very good luck together and he makes a very good partner--he was a very close friend of my husband Jess [Jackson]," Banke explained.

The seven-figure yearling is out of a sister to Grade I winner Girolamo and graded stakes winners Daydreaming and Accelerator. In addition to Super Saver, who won the Derby for WinStar in 2010, Supercharger has also produced graded stakes winner Brethren (Distorted Humor) and multiple stakes winner Lisa T. (Awesome Again). Her now

3-year-old colt by Medaglia d'Oro sold for \$1.2 million at the 2011 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. She produced a colt by Tiznow in 2011 and another colt by the two-time GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner

this year. She was bred to Distorted Humor this spring.

"He is very athletic, a great mover with a super pedigree," Banke said. "If he makes a couple of good graded stakes starts, he'll make a wonderful stallion."

Asked if the price was about what the two operations expected to pay, Banke said, "Yes," just as Hughes said, "We paid too much."

The seven-figure sale continued the exceptional September results for Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale, but the result was not unexpected.

"I thought he was any kind of horse with any kind of pedigree, so anything could happen," Sikura said. "I thought he was the kind of horse that could top the sale--and he almost did. He is a beautiful horse. He had it all--pedigree, looks the part, by the right sire, two-turn horse--everything that you could want with a horse that could break out and you could make a lot of money with, and be valuable at the conclusion of his racing career."

Despite the strong result at Keeneland, WinStar's Elliott Walden said there were no regrets in selling Supercharger and her Medaglia d'Oro foal last summer.

"John paid a lot for the package, so he deserves everything he gets," Walden said Wednesday. "We treat this as a business and it was a tough decision [to sell], but we're charged with making a profit, so all of our horses are for sale. This is evidence of that."

Walden said Supercharger's Medaglia d'Oro colt was always a standout.

"He was always a very classy colt," Walden confirmed. "John bought him while he was still on the mare and we weaned him a month or so later and then sent him on. He was very, very classy, just like the rest of her foals. He's grown up very well and we're proud of him."

How Sweet It Is...

With the sale solidly past the halfway marker, Wednesday's action was already in high gear by the time [Hip 515](#), a colt by Tapit, strode into the ring. Briskly up to the \$1-million point, bidding slowed to \$25,000 increments once past the seven figure mark. Following a protracted battle, it was the tandem of Nat Rea's Regis Farms and Stonestreet Stables that landed the prize at \$1.55 million. The Apr. 10 half-brother to GI Test S. heroine Sweet Lulu (Mr. Greeley) was consigned by her breeder, Gainesway.

"Absolutely," affirmed Gainesway's Michael Heron when asked if the price tag was expected. "This was anticipated. He was a very good yearling and he showed himself tremendously well. He has the conformation of a superstar. He has all the top attributes to be a top racehorse. All the major buyers were after him. He is a very special colt."

Also among those thinking the grey colt was special was Regis Racing Manager Richard Hogan.

"If he runs on the track, hopefully, we can stand him," said Hogan. "He has a very good pedigree. He is a brother to a Grade I winner and is by Tapit, and Tapit speaks for himself. This colt has a lot of his sire in him. His head and type. This colt has a catlike walk, he is so light on his feet. I thought he was probably the best physical I had seen at the sale. He's all racehorse. I'm glad we got him."

Successful Outlook (Orientate), who sold as a yearling for \$95,000 Keeneland September and subsequently was purchased privately by Gainesway, kicked off her career with Steve Asmussen. She was an impressive maiden winner at Belmont October 2006 before winning the one-mile GIII Tempted S. at Aqueduct. She was third when suffering injury in the nine furlong GII Demoiselle S. and was retired.

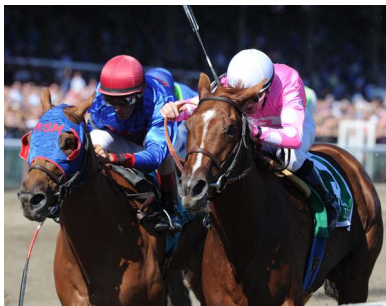
"The mare could really run," said Heron. "She is the type of mare that can get you this type of horse. She already did it with Sweet Lulu."

As for the colt's half-sister, Heron added, "We're grateful to trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, who trains this colt's half-sister Sweet Lulu, who won the GI Test S. She is heading for the [GI] Cotillion S. [at Parx Sept. 21]."

Standing at Gainseway, Tapit was represented by another \$1-million yearling at this year's September sale with [Hip 325](#), who was snapped up by Coolmore Tuesday.

"I see a lot of Tapit in this colt," said Heron. "Given that he is a colt, that is what I like to see. This colt has tremendous potential. The pedigree is there, as well as the athleticism. He thinks he's somebody special and hopefully down the road he'd join Tapit and Tapizar at Gainseway. You never know."

Also among Regis Farms' purchases at Keeneland over the first two days was [Hip 110](#), a colt by Unbridled's Song out of Irish Smoke (Smoke Glacken) who brought \$1.1 million, and [Hip 18](#), a Candy Ride (Arg) colt out of Flying Dixie (Dixieland Band) who was secured for \$700,000. Both colts passed through the ring during Monday's opening session.

"The buyers find the horses where ever they are," said Hogan. "I can't speak for everybody else, but we are getting what we want. Obviously, the nice horses you have to reach for, but we get what we want. I'd rather do that then settle on ones that are not as good."

Putting the 'SF' Into Seven Figure...

For the second time at Keeneland September, a horse bred by SF Bloodstock elicited a seven-figure bid after [Hip 496](#), a Galileo (Ire) half-brother to European champion Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), was hammered down to the Coolmore partners for \$1.4 million. M.V. Magnier signed for the dark bay, who was sold by Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm. On Monday, Bedouin Bloodstock sold an SF-bred Unbridled's Song--Irish Smoke colt for \$1.1 million. SF is an international breeding syndicate whose members include Gavin Murphy, Neil Bowden and Henry Field.

The colt was produced by the 18-year-old Starlight Dreams (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), who is also the dam of Grade III winner Genuine Devotion (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) and the G1 Moyglare S. runner-up Famous (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Coolmore associate Derek Smith owned the latter, and joined Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor as the owners of Mastercraftsman, named Europe's top 2-year-old in 2008 after winning the G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S.

"For us, the horse was a standout as a physical," said M.V. Magnier. "The added attraction is that he is by Galileo, and as a bonus, he is a half to Mastercraftsman, a young stallion by Danehill Dancer who has a group winner and four stakes horses among his 16 winners with his first runners this year."

Mastercraftsman stood the 2013 season at Coolmore in Ireland for a fee of €12,500. Mastercraftsman's daughter Amazing Maria (Ire) recently won the G3 Prestige S. at Goodwood Aug. 24, while son The Great Gatsby (Ire) just missed by a neck when second in the G3 Acomb S. at York Aug. 21.

Yesterday's Galileo colt is the highest-priced horse ever sold by Woods Edge, which cleared the seven-figure mark for the first time last year with an Empire Maker--Lu Ravi colt who sold to Japan's Big Red Farm for \$1.1 million.

O'Callaghan said the Galileo colt did all the heavy lifting himself. "He was an easy horse to sell," he said. "He's a beautifully bred, beautiful individual who's a lovely mover. The people we were hoping would like him liked him, and they bid accordingly. We're delighted [Coolmore] got him."

Asked if he was typical of what the sire throws, O'Callaghan said, "I'm not a Galileo expert, but he had a Galileo head on him, and he's a very balanced, nimble sort of horse. The best Galileos I've seen have all been very good movers, and he was a wonderful mover."

In a stat that might fall under the "who cares" category, Starlight Dreams has now had offspring sell in five different countries. In addition to England, France, Ireland and the U.S., she had a yearling sell in Japan last year. S F Bloodstock offered her 2011 colt Orion Heart (Ire) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) at the JRA Select Sale, where he realized a bid of ¥40,000,000 (US\$493,828). The mare, who now resides at Woods Edge, has a Distorted Humor weanling colt and is back in foal to Speightstown.

Woods Edge has seven more cataloged for today, including [Hip 868](#), a full-sister to Grade I winner Tell a Kelly. "They've gotten plenty of action and plenty of vetting, and I think they'll sell well," O'Callaghan said of his Day 4 horses. "They might not be in the range of this horse, but they're very well regarded."

A Breakthrough Session at September...

In what could fairly be called one of the liveliest sessions at Keeneland September in years, numbers surged forward in Lexington amid a series of positive indicators. Many of those indicators revealed a rise in the very highest levels of the market. That is, the very best are bringing more.

Keeneland sold its second-highest-priced yearling in five years--behind 2010's \$4.2-million Mr. Besilu (A.P. Indy)--in the form of the \$2.2-million Indian Charlie--Take Charge Lady filly. In total, five horses made seven figures yesterday. That was the same total that last year's condensed, single-session Book 1 produced, but while last year's group totaled \$6.1 million, yesterday's quintet grossed \$8.6 million.

September can now boast of 13 seven-figure yearlings, compared to seven a year ago. By way of comparison, there were three in 2010, four in 2009, and 18 in 2008--the year the Great Recession hit.

As mentioned, the reformatted September Sale makes year-over-year comparisons hard, but looking at current figures versus last year's combined Books 1-2 totals offers a useful yardstick. Last year, the average after Books 1-2 was \$202,829. The median was \$150,000. After the last three days of selling, the average stands at \$276,017 (up 36.1%) and the median at \$200,000 (up 33.3%).

Keeneland officials said Wednesday's spike, at least in relation to Monday and Tuesday, was more likely due to the way the catalog is put together, rather than a heating up of the market. "I think it's just the alphabet," said Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell, referencing the fact the catalog is assembled by dam's name. "If these horse had sold on Monday, they would have brought the same amount as they brought today."

Added Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson, "We had a lot of good horses today. There were some big pedigrees and great individuals, and when a horse does it all, it brings it all."

Russell and Robertson agreed one of the biggest strengths of the sale continues to be the depth of buyers. "We've even been getting comments from buyers that they haven't bought yet, and that's good--we like to hear that," said Russell. "We've got one more day of Book 1, and we hope to continue the trend."

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ...AT THE SALES

Bloodstock Agent Mike Ryan

"It started off strong and has gotten stronger as the days have gone on. There seemed to be a lot of new money here and so many new people I had never seen. There is a great energy here. Whatever you think a horse is worth, you better forget last year's values because you'll probably be outside 30-35% of that. It's great because we had five hard years and breeders now have a chance to make a profit.

There are a lot of good horses. When I was looking around the farms, I was seeing big, strong horses and the crop was very good. With so much rain this summer, there was great growth in the grass and it was very rich and the horses benefitted from it.

There is a great appetite for the right horse. If you have what they want, you get paid. They're tough enough on the vet work, but you've heard it a million times, if they clear all the fences, people step up and go to what ever their comfort zone.

I was able to get what I wanted the first two days, but I didn't get anything [Wednesday]. It's competitive, you just have to raise the bar now because the market has had a big resurgence. The 2-year-old sales were also great this year. But this is not going to stop. I think it will continue to be strong through Book 2 and 3, for sure. It's good, but it's selective, and it should be. You get what you pay for."

Trainer Ron Ellis

"It's a really hot and followed a several horses up there and I couldn't even get a bid in, because they just went by me so fast. I was glad that I was able to buy a War Front [Hip 605] for \$200,000. But I think that was the exception more than the rule. I have been talking to some pretty big buyers that are having big problems buying horses as well. Samantha Siegel got one today, overall, she's been having trouble getting what she wants. I've had to go a lot farther than I thought, but they are a nice group of horses, but the prices are legitimately strong because the horseflesh is good."

"I like the new format, but I like getting up at 12:00 and sleeping in [laughing]. Seriously, I think it helps because if you're hanging out here all day, it does give you a chance to go back and see the horses in the morning. They seem to be getting over at a time when you can head out and get some dinner at a reasonable hour. So I think it really works, especially for these higher prices."

LARK IN THE PARK

This year's G1 Epsom Oaks form has taken a couple of knocks, but **The Lark (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) bids to provide the May 31 Classic with a boost today in the G2 Park Hill S. at Doncaster. Known as the "Fillies' St Leger," this contest over the extended 14-furlong trip of the upcoming Classic looks an ideal opportunity for Lady Bamford's homebred given the way that she has stayed on over a mile and a half when third at Epsom and fifth in the G2 Prix de Malleret at Saint-Cloud June 23. Given too much to do in a tactical affair on the latter occasion, she has enjoyed a mid-summer break subsequently with trainer Michael Bell eyeing softer ground. He is hoping that she will get more suitable conditions here. "She is obviously at home with cut in the ground," he told *PA Sport*. "Her dam stayed well, so we've got to be hopeful she'll get the trip, and she looks in good order at home. We're keen to run and she will as long as I'm happy with the ground. One of the least-exposed of the older brigade is the Aug. 4 Listed Chalice S. winner **Seal of Approval (GB)** (Authorized {Ire}), who is another going beyond 12 furlongs for the first time having looked more than capable of getting that trip in that Newbury contest. Trainer James Fanshawe told the *Racing and Football Outlook*, "Despite missing her juvenile campaign and not having run very often, she is pretty useful. I felt she was worth trying in listed company and she proved me right when taking the Chalice. That was a lovely run, particularly as the ground was quick enough for her."

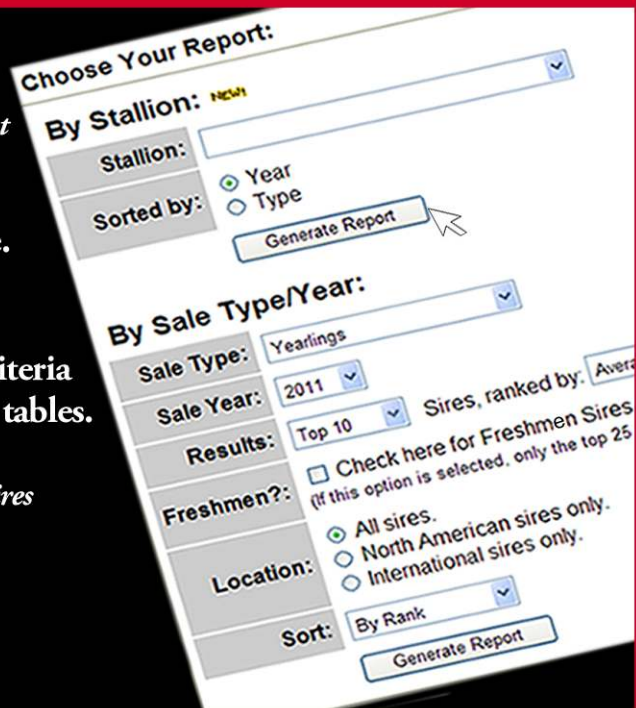
