KEENELAND SEPTEMBER POWERS ON

Keeneland September's power-packed Book 1 concluded yesterday with impressive increases compared to combined Book 1 and 2 results from

2012. During four days of selling, 546 yearlings grossed \$153,385,000. The average rose 38.5% to \$280,925 and the median was up 38.3% to \$207,500. At this point in the 2012 auction, 655 head had sold for \$132,853,000. The average was \$202,829 and the median was \$150,000. The cumulative buy-back rate stands at

27%. It was 28.7% a year ago.


"Week one was a great success," confirmed Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell after the close of business Thursday. "The goal was to get as many quality horses on the grounds and the consignors successfully helped us accomplish that. The cream of North America's yearling crop was here and our goal is to get as many buyers on the grounds to go through them. We accomplished that. The success of the new format shows all the way through, with top-quality horses everyday. There was live spirited bidding everyday on all the horses and the buyers stayed from Monday through Thursday and that is all we can ask. There was a huge, diverse buying bench, both domestically and internationally, there were new buyers, old buyers, pinhookers, end users. You name the criteria of a buyer and they were here. All our goals were accomplished."

The 2012 total sale figure of seven million-dollar yearlings was surpassed during Wednesday's trading and was obliterated Thursday when a further five yearlings brought seven figures. A total of 18 horses has past the million-dollar threshold so far. Thursday's session was topped by a colt by War Front who brought a final bid of \$2.5 million from Coolmore's M.V. Magnier. The colt was consigned by Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm. O'Callaghan had purchased the colt for \$180,000 as a weanling last November. The yearling was the second horse to pass the \$2-million mark at the auction.

Amplifying the depth of the market, there were 15 individual buying groups among the 18 seven-figure yearlings. That includes three horses Stonestreet bought in partnership--one each with Regis, Gainesway and Spendthrift. Only M.V. Magnier purchased multiple seven-figure horses; the Coolmore partners have purchased four at that level.

After a pause in the action Friday, the Keeneland September resumes with Book 2 on Saturday at 10 a.m. Keeneland's Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson is optimistic the strong results will continue.

"People bid on a lot of horses today, but haven't gotten a lot of money spent over the last week," Robertson said. "They'll be here next week. You are always anxious about the next step, but everything bodes pretty well, we hope."

To the Front of the Class

Coolmore's M.V. Magnier had already signed for three seven-figure yearlings at the September sale when [hip 712](#) strode into the Keeneland sales ring Thursday, but

the striking son of War Front caused the biggest splash and, when the dust settled, Magnier was signing the ticket at a sales-topping \$2.5 million. Shadwell was underbidder on the sales-topping colt. The dark bay colt, purchased for \$180,000 as a Keeneland November weanling, is out of multiple stakes-placed Blading Gold Ring (During), a half-sister to Grade I stakes placed Emerald Gold (War Front) and from the family of Willa on the Move, Will's Way and Lady Reiko (Ire).

"He's a very nice horse, a good mover, and the lads liked him,"

Magnier commented. "We weren't expecting him to bring that much, but we're happy we got him."

The Coolmore operation currently has a pair of stars by hot sire War Front. Declaration of War has captured this term's G1 Queen Anne S. and G1 Juddmonte International, while juvenile War Command won the G2 Coventry S. and G2 Futurity S.

"We've been lucky with War Front this year with Declaration of War winning two of the highest-profile races in Europe this year and War Command looks like he'll be a top 2-year-old. He's been a lovely horse for us and hopefully this lad will do something along the same."

Magnier said the yearling would likely be heading for Ireland.

The \$2.5-million sale was a major pinhooking score for Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm. O'Callaghan, signing the ticket as Brittlynn Stables, purchased the colt for just \$180,000 as a weanling at last year's Keeneland November sale. The yearling was bred by Fred Hertrich, III and John D. Fielding. Hertich purchased Blading Gold Ring carrying this foal for \$165,000 out of the 2011 Keeneland November sale.

"He was a very strong horse, very correct and a great mover," O'Callaghan recalled Thursday.

"And I was a War Front believer right from the beginning. We paid, at the time, it was probably plenty of money for him--a lot of people would have thought it was too much money, but we bought him, we took a chance and we got lucky." **Cont. p4**

O'Callaghan admitted the yearling's final price tag exceeded expectations.

"You are always surprised at that kind of level; I would never have imagined that he'd bring that money, but we had a lot of interest. When you have Coolmore and the Arab outfits, whether it be Sheikh Hamdan or Sheikh Mohammed or the Qatari outfits, really eager to buy your horse, you know anything is possible. Our reserve was \$350,000, but we knew he would make a lot of money. We always try to set the reserve sensibly because we have to sell them. It exceeded all expectations for a great horse and we're delighted that he made such a price and we're very grateful to all the parties that bid on him, particularly Coolmore."

The War Front colt was the second seven-figure sale of the auction for Woods Edge. During Wednesday's session, Magnier went to \$1.4 million for a son of Galileo (Ire). Woods Edge also sold a daughter of Tapit-Evrobi for \$1 million late Thursday.

"We've had a great sale," O'Callaghan confirmed. "We got a great price for the Galileo and we've had a lot of solid sales. We've had a lot of nice horses and we've gotten well-paid for them in most cases, we certainly have nothing to complain about."

"The market is excellent," he continued. "We're having a great sale top to bottom really and there is just a lot of money around, a lot of new money signing expensive tickets that we haven't seen in the last few years. We've been a while waiting for it. It's been sluggish here the last four or five years and we've had to ride it out. It's really come back around for us."

Looking ahead to the sale's second week, O'Callaghan said, "There is probably a lot of money that hasn't been spent yet. A lot of people have really struggled to buy horses, so I really hope it carries on to the next round. We're not done yet, we're halfway there."

Solis Gets His Filly

Alex Solis had missed out on a few high-profile fillies this week at Keeneland, but the bloodstock agent came out on top Thursday when going to \$1.7 million for a Tiznow half-sister to Horse of the Year Havre de Grace. The dark bay filly ([hip 855](#)), out of Easter Bunnette (Carson City), was consigned by Mill Ridge Sales on behalf of her breeder Nancy Dillman.



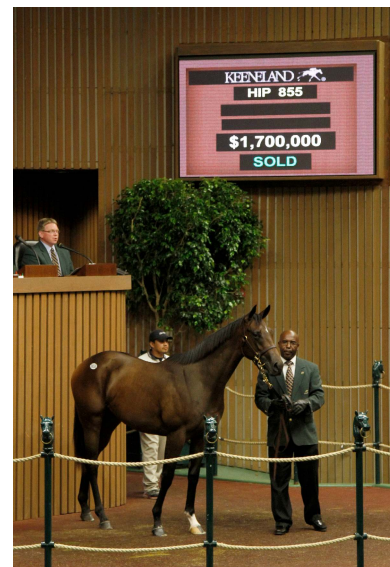

"She is a half to Havre de Grace, to begin with, then she is an excellent physical," Solis said of the yearling's attraction. "She's a beautiful filly. We saw her from the first day of showing, she's been here showing for five days and never got tired.

She has great action. She walked unbelievable." Solis was bidding on behalf of an unnamed New York-based client. Of the seven-figure price tag, Solis added, "This was at the end of the range we were hoping to pay. We would love to have had her for a million, so she is worth that, so it is ok. She was good value."

Among the fillies Solis was underbidder on this week was another daughter of Tiznow in [hip 446](#), who sold for \$1.75 million to Borges Torrealba Holdings. Goncalo Torrealba was underbidder to Solis on hip 855.

Solis acknowledged the Keeneland market has been competitive. "The market has really improved the last couple of years and everyone is looking for the same thing," he said. "Everyone is looking to buy pedigree and you have to spend real money. And you have new players. It's a very healthy market."

Dillman Rewarded Again

Nancy Dillman, wearing her lucky bracelet, a gold cuff with an image of Havre de Grace, was emotional but happy after the half-sister to the champion she bred sold for \$1.7 million Thursday. "She was a lovely filly, and the biggest question was whether I wanted to sell her," said Dillman. "But yesterday, the sale really started picking up, and we started getting a lot of scopes. I was comfortable that she was going to go to a good home, and that was the most important thing. I don't have any children, so my foals are my children."

Dillman said there are similarities between this filly

and her famous older sister, both physically and in temperament.

"She's not as big, but she has the same balance," Dillman explained. "Out in the field, when she was growing up, she had that same toughness. She was the leader of the pack. Not having very many mares, the colts and fillies run together [on my farm], and like 'Gracie,' she ruled the roost--the girls and the boys. I wish her new owners the best of luck, and if she's anything on the track like she is out in the field, she's gonna be tough."

Easter Bunnette has a Medaglia d'Oro weanling filly and is back in foal to the Darley sire. Yesterday's sale was Easter Bunnette's second seven-figure yearling. The mare's Bernardini colt, now named Brabbham, brought \$1.2 million from John Ferguson at the 2011 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale.

For Parke, Another 'Code' Breaker

Catherine Parke's Valkyre Stud consignment rang up another big transaction from the eminently likeable producer Ava Knowsthecode (Cryptoclearance), the 19-year-old mare whose offspring include the recent GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt S. winner **Justin Phillip** (First

Samurai), the graded winners **Keyed Entry** (Honour and Glory), **Algorithms** (Bernardini) and **Successful Mission** (Successful Appeal), and stakes winner **Alex's Allure** (Sky Classic). Yesterday, Parke offered a Tapit colt out of the mare, and came away with the session's third-highest price after Gainesway and Stonestreet teamed together to secure the attractive dark bay for

\$1.2 million. Parke was selling the horse, [hip 681](#), on behalf of breeder Pat Klussman's Oakbrook Farm. Gainesway stands Tapit.

Bidding out back, Gainesway's Michael Heron, standing alongside farm president Antony Beck and Stonestreet's Barbara Banke, outlasted the Coolmore partners, who were located just across the way. Standing with the Coolmore team was trainer Todd Pletcher, who trained both Keyed Entry and Algorithms.

Heron said Beck and Barbara would own the colt 50/50. Stonestreet owns a significant interest in the Gainesway stallion Afleet Alex.

"We think this is a great prospect," said Gainesway's Michael Heron. "He's got a class pedigree, he's a very strong horse, and is a terrific mover. We really liked him."

Gainesway doesn't typically shop at the top of the yearling market for colts with stallion pedigrees, but, "We've been going well of late, and we have a high regard for Tapit," said Heron. "Tapit has a number of young sons going to stud now with significant race records behind them, and we think this could be another prospect."

Heron said a trainer would be decided on at a later date.

It was the third seven-figure purchase that Stonestreet has made in partnership at September. Along with Spendthrift, it purchased the Medaglia d'Oro--Super Charger colt for \$1.7 million, and secured the Tapit--Successful Outlook colt for \$1.55 million.

"I have [been in partnerships] with George Bolton, and I prefer to have partners in colts that way if it works out, it is great for everyone and if it doesn't work out you share the pain," said Banke. "And I've had very good luck with partners." **Cont. p8**

For Parke, Another 'Code' Breaker cont.

It was the first seven-figure yearling from Ava Knowsthecode, who nonetheless has been a rock-sale sales producer. At the 2011 sale, her son Encode (Bernardini) made \$650,000. Justin Philip sold here for \$400,000; Successful Mission brought \$360,000; and Keyed Entry sold for \$145,000. Two other yearlings, Is It Safe (Yes It's True) and Code Variance (Awesome Again), made \$185,000 and \$130,000, respectively.

Algorithms, the star-crossed but talented colt who upset Hansen (Tapit) in the Gill Holy Bull S. in 2012, made \$170,000, a discounted price that probably reflected the fact that he refused to be scoped by vets prior to auction, an issue that, for the welfare of the horse, Parke admirably didn't push.

"He looks just like Justin Phillip," Parke said of the Tapit colt's family traits. "He's a little bit bigger and a little longer at this point in their lives."

In all, yearlings out of Ava Knowsthecode have grossed \$3,323,000.

It's impressive a Grade III-placed mare by an unheralded sire, who early on wasn't bred to the most fashionable sires, has become such an important mare, a fact that isn't lost on Parke. "I foaled and raised the mother and have raised the whole family," said Parke. "She's just an amazing mare."

Ava Knowsthecode has a Bernardini weanling colt and is back in foal to Giant's Causeway.

Parke said the sale was also rewarding in that it reflected the confidence buyers have in the horses she brings to the market. "We don't use any kind of medication, any kind of feed enhancers," she said. "Years ago, I think I probably had a lot of short sales, but I think it's the way to go. When you take an animal that's been raised on hay and oats and running hills and hand walking, you get an all-natural athlete."

The bloodstock agent was forced to \$1 million to secure [hip 846](#). The dark bay colt is out of multiple Grade I winner Dream Supreme (Seeking the Gold) and is a half-brother to Grade I winner and promising young sire Majestic Warrior (A.P. Indy) and three-quarter brother to stakes winner Evolutionist (El Prado {Ire}). He was consigned by Lane's End as agent for his breeder Kinsman Farm.

"I bought her for a racing partnership," Ingordo revealed. "They've been in operation for

about a year and they have some notable horses running, but I'll leave it at that."

Of the million-dollar yearling, Ingordo commented, "He's a big beautiful horse and he's going to improve. He looks like a Classic kind of horse and he's got the pedigree to go with the looks."

Ingordo described the Keeneland market as "extremely buoyant." He added, "We've done well overall in this part of the sale. We haven't gotten everything we wanted, but we're holding our own."

Another Homerun for SF & Woods Edge

SF Bloodstock and Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm continued their outstanding run yesterday at September. As selling was winding down, the two operations teamed on a Tapit full-sister to Grade I winner Tell a Kelly who went for an even \$1 million.

Representatives of Shadwell Farm, on the phone, outlasted a group led by Walnut Green's Mark Green, who sat under the press box. Woods Edge consigned the SF-bred filly, from the 16-year-old Evrobi (Tabasco Cat), as [hip 868](#). Tell a Kelly won the GI Darley Debutante S. in 2010.

"She's a lovely Tapit filly--she looks like a race horse in her own right--and she's a full-sister to Tell a Kelly to boot," said O'Callaghan. "It seems to be there's no limitations with these kinds of horses. Be it Tapit or War Front or Medaglia d'Oro, if they look the part and they're by those kind of sires, there are no limitations. We put her in there at not even a third of that [her reserve]. But they just went head-to-head there from about \$450,000 on, and we thank Mark Reid and his group. And thank God for Shadwell, they really made a great day for us [Shadwell was underbidder on the \$2.5 million War Front that Woods Edge consigned]. We knew they liked a lot of our horses; they were up there many times, and Sheikh Hamdan was there this morning himself." **Cont. p10**

Asked about the market at the close of Book 1, O'Callaghan said, "I can't say it was anything but outstanding. Certainly for me. But I think most people would say it's a great sale. The industry has struggled so much the last three or four years, to get those million-dollar horses is terrific. They've come every 10 minutes this week, it seems. It's a pleasant scenario for everyone."

O'Callaghan believes the upswing at September can be pegged to a renewed confidence in the American economy. "When the economy turned, all these people were still very wealthy, but they maybe didn't feel as wealthy, or they conducted themselves in a much more conservative manner," he said. "But in the end, people love horses. As long as that's the case, we'll have a product they want. We need to continue to make things better for the owners, the guys who are spending all this money. Our livelihoods are on their dime."

The filly was the third seven-figure horse of the sale bred by SF, following the \$1.4 million Galileo (Ire) half to Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and the \$1.1 million Unbridled's Song son of GISW Irish Smoke (Smoke Glacken). Woods Edge consigned the former; Bedouin Bloodstock the latter.

Greathouse Secures Bevy of Classy Fillies

Glencrest Farm's John Greathouse partnered with Phase II Thoroughbreds to land a trio of attractive filly prospects yesterday at September. They included:

- \$775,000 Smart Strike--Clay's Rocket (American Chance) filly from Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud ([hip 779](#)). The filly is out of a MSP half to GISW Adieu (El Corredor) and three other stakes winners, and has produced MSW & MGSP Laurie's Rocket (Bluegrass Cat) and SW Greeley's Rocket (Mr. Greeley);
- \$725,000 Malibu Moon--Caroni (Rubiano) filly from Warrendale Sales, agent for Hargus and Sandra Sexton and Silver Fern Farm ([hip 742](#)). The filly is a half to SW and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies runner-up Beautician (Dehere) and SW Bella Castani (Big Brown);
- \$180,000 Smart Strike--Awe That (Boundary) filly from Lane's End, agent ([hip 683](#)). The filly is a full-sister to MGSW Bel Air Beauty.

On day one of the sale, Greathouse also purchased [hip 86](#), a Medaglia d'Oro daughter of Glencrest's outstanding running Honey Ryder (Lasting Approval), for \$250,000. She was consigned by Adena, which purchased Honey Ryder from Glencrest for \$1.75 million in 2008.

"We've spent money before, but not this kind of money," laughed Greathouse, who declined to name the principal of Phase II while crediting the gentleman with the aggressive bidding. "I don't know that we would have spent this money if he wasn't here in person. I would start the bidding, and he would kind of pick it up and go with it." **Cont. p11**

Greathouse said the purchases would be part of a group of 20-25 that they will purchase at September. The plan is to send the horses to be broken at Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stable near Ocala, and then go on to the 2-year-old in training sales with the majority. Greathouse said the yearling price tags of some of the horses, however, might preclude the juvenile sales.

Greathouse was plenty familiar with the pedigree of the \$775,000 Smart Strike filly. Glencrest bred Clay's Rocket and sold her as a yearling in 2002 for \$67,000. Glencrest also bred her half-sister Adieu, winner of the GI Frizette S., GII Spinaway S. and GII Delaware Oaks.

"So we're quite familiar with that line," said Greathouse. "I didn't think she'd bring that kind of money. But once you get up there, you get off the motor or you stay on. He stayed on."

Greathouse continued, "The Smart Strikes can be a little on the small side, but she isn't. She has enough size and she's a good, correct filly."

Greathouse said he was especially fond of the Malibu Moon filly, not least of which because she reminded him of Glencrest's stellar-but-ill-fated MGISW Devil May Care, another by the sire.

"I really liked the Malibu Moon filly; not that I didn't like the Smart Strike, but they're different kind of fillies, and the Malibu Moon really reminded me of Devil May Care," he said.

Greathouse said including the blue-blooded fillies in the business plan "doesn't mean they can run, but if they can, we both know what they're worth," he said.

At Fasig-Tipton's inaugural Summer Selected Sale of Horses of Racing Age, Greathouse and Phase II purchased the third-highest-priced horse on the day, the \$370,000 Holiday Soiree (Harlan's Holiday). The 4-year-old filly came right back to win the Shine Again S. at Saratoga Aug. 5 for new trainer Todd Pletcher. She goes next in the GII Gallant Bloom H. at Belmont Sept. 21.

Lukas Goes Back to the Well

Keeneland has been very kind to trainer D. Wayne Lukas over the years. Through the last three decades, Lukas has snapped up several stalwarts from the venue, including GI Kentucky heroine Winning Colors, GI Preakness S. winner Tank's Prospect and Breeders' Cup scorers Life's Magic, Sachahuista, Spain and Timber Country. This season, the Hall of Famer has been basking in the light of a pair of September alums Preakness winner Oxbow (Awesome Again) and Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song), victorious in last month's GI Travers S. Ready to add to his long list of stars, Lukas closed out Thursday's final Book 1 session with a trio of purchases, headed by [Hip 720](#), a colt by Medaglia d'Oro. Extending to \$700,000 for the bay, Lukas signed for the colt on behalf of Willis Horton, who currently campaigns Will Take Charge.

"I thought he would bring a little less," admitted Lukas. "I thought he would bring somewhere between \$500,000-\$600,000. I just spoke to [Fox Hill Farm's] Rick Porter and he said he loved him too. All the horsemen were on that horse."

Offered by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Aaron and Marie Jones, the Mar. 7 foal is out of stakes winner Bonnie Blue Flag (Mineshaft), runner up in the GI Test S. and third in the GI Prioress S. The 6-year-old mare is a half-sister to the dual Grade I-winning turf mare Diamondrella (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}).

"I've never had anything by Medaglia d'Oro," said Lukas. "I just loved the colt as an individual. I thought he had great movement, walk and great look. The mare is very nice and he just had a great page, so I thought he was the complete package."

Regarding the Darley stallion whose offspring averaged \$449,444 for 18 sold in Book 1, Lukas indicated that he tried earlier in the week to buy one by that stallion, but failed to land Hip 523, a colt out of Supercharger and a half brother to Super Saver, despite extending to \$1.3 million. That colt was knocked down for \$1.7 million and went to the new partnership of Spendthrift and Stonestreet farms.

"They ran me right out of the building," said Lukas. "But I think this colt is more typical of the sire than that other one [Hip 523]."

During Thursday's session, Lukas also secured [Hip 758](#) a Giant's Causeway filly for Horton. The Feb. 7 foal is out of Charming (Seeking the Gold), a daughter of MGISW Take Charge Lady and a half-sister to GI Florida Derby hero Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy) and Will Take Charge, also campaigned by Horton.

"She's a typey little filly," said Lukas. "I told [Horton] I thought he had more to gain than anybody by having the family, so he jumped right in. He feels if Will Take Charge takes off and she runs well, the residual value will hold together very well."

On behalf of Horton, Lukas also purchased [Hip 725](#), a colt by Tale of the Cat. The May 4 foal is out of stakes winner Buddha Lady (Buddha). **Cont. p12**

"Willis Horton was with me [previously] and drifted away a little bit, but he came back," said Lukas, explaining the temporary departure. "Will Take Charge came up [at the 2011 KEESEP sale] and he knew I was the underbidder on him, so he jumped in and gave him back to me to train."

During Wednesday's session, Lukas purchased a pair of yearlings for longtime clients Robert Baker and William Mack, who also campaign Strong Mandate (Tiznow), runaway winner of the Sept. 2 GI Hopeful S. The purchases were led by [Hip 557](#), a colt by Speightstown out of SP Theycallmeladyluck (Dixie Union), who was secured for \$500,000. Also during the third session, Lukas gave \$450,000 to grab [Hip 633](#), a colt by Malibu Moon out of GSW Wow Me Free (Menifee). Consigned by Mulholland Springs, the Feb. 27 is from the family of Canadian Horse of the Year Alywow.

"Bob Baker and Bill Mack have been with me for over 20 years," said Lukas. "Of course, we had horses like [Grade I winners] Proud Citizen, Grand Slam and more recently, Dublin and Strong Mandate. They have been wonderful partners and great to train for. I hope we can get another one here."

Of his longtime owners, Horton, Mack and Baker, Lukas added, "Having this success with these guys has been very gratifying for me. I feel it's extra special that I've been able to have this luck with the people that had been that good to me."

As for the overall health of the market observed at Keeneland this week, Lukas said, "I think it's been a very competitive sale from the beginning. The horses I picked from the start and thought I would get into trouble with, I did. The market is so strong right now for the good ones. I think the buyers have been getting more sophisticated in recent years as far as trying to buy pedigree and conformation. Of course, it you used to be that page made all the difference and now it's both. And for those that have both, there is a lot of money out there for them."

Lukas's Grade I Team Update

D. Wayne Lukas enjoyed a banner Saratoga meeting this season, taking the marquee events for both the juvenile and sophomore divisions. He took the Aug. 24 GI Travers S. with Willis Horton's Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) before annexing the Sept. 2 GI Hopeful S. with Strong Mandate. The former was a \$425,000 Keeneland September buy in 2011, while the latter bought \$200,000 at the venue the following year.

"Strong Mandate is going to the [one-mile GI Foxwoods] Champagne [S. at Belmont Oct. 5]," confirmed Lukas. "I was considering sending him to that race in California [GI Frontrunner S. at 1 1/16 miles Sept. 28], because it's two turns and that's were the Breeders' Cup is. But I like the extra week, and I just think it's better spacing, since I ran him back quickly at Saratoga. The spacing is better between [the Champagne] and the [GI] Breeders' Cup [Juvenile]."

According to Lukas, Willis Horton's Will Take Charge will go to the GI Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 21 and then go straight to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

While the aforementioned pair of runners would make for a great season for most trainers, Lukas landed a rare 'trifecta,' taking the GI Preakness S. with Calumet farm's Oxbow (Awesome Again) earlier this spring. Runner up in the June 8 GI Belmont S., the \$250,000 Keeneland September buy exited a fourth in the July 28 GI Haskell Invitational with an injury and has been on the sidelines since.

"Oxbow is through for the season," confirmed Lukas. "[Calumet] will make a decision an economic decision whether they should bring him back and try and enhance his value or whether he will just go to stud. He's been pretty damn popular, so they may decide to just start breeding him. There has been a lot of interest whether he's going to stand or not and I think he will book very well."—CBossinakis

One of the notebook brigade's dark horses to follow in 2013, The Lark returned to finish third behind the eventual G1 Nassau S. winner Winsili (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in the Listed Swettenham Stud Fillies' Trial S. over an inadequate 10-furlong trip at Newbury May 17 before running third despite meeting traffic in the May 31 G1 Epsom Oaks. Held up too far off the pace when fifth in the 12-furlong G2 Prix de Malleret at Saint-Cloud when last seen June 23, the homebred relished this increase in distance to register an easy first black-type success in this "Fillies' St Leger". Held up with only two behind early by a confident Jamie Spencer, the chestnut cruised into contention as Phiz was committed on the front end passing the quarter pole. Seal of Approval (GB) (Authorized {Ire}) fell to her inside shortly after and The Lark was never out of second gear to dominate the final furlong. "She didn't really have to do much, as she was better than those and was always going to win," her jockey commented. Trainer Michael Bell, who trained the immediate relatives of the winner including Sariska (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), added, "That was like Sariska in the Irish Oaks, the way she cruised up there and had the race in control. This is a good filly and she is very talented, but the key is cut in the ground. She was a bit unlucky in the Oaks, as she got checked and Saint-Cloud was a disaster tactically. She should get better next year and hopefully we'll get the [softer] ground she needs at Ascot on Champions' Day, as the [Oct. 19] G1 Fillies and Mares S. is the plan. She is also in the G2 Prix de Royallieu [at Longchamp Oct. 5]."

Runner-up in the G2 Rockfel S. over seven furlongs at Newmarket in October, Nargys flopped in her Classic prep when last in the G3 Nell Gwyn S. back over that track and trip Apr. 17 and had only managed to land a blow in one of her last four starts when fourth in the Listed Sandringham H. over a mile at Royal Ascot June 19. Not fitted with the visor that had been on when tried unsuccessfully over six furlongs at Pontefract in the Listed Flying Fillies' S. last time Aug. 18, the bay traveled strongly in rear of the tightly-packed group racing up the center of the track throughout the early stages. Pushed through to lead passing the furlong marker, she quickly asserted for a belated first black-type success. "It was very comfortable--she traveled really good, loved the ground and took me there very easily," jockey Andrea Atzeni commented. "She has always been a nice filly, but a few things hadn't gone right and probably lost a little bit of confidence. I probably got there a bit too soon, but she won well."

BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

LIGHT LEADS LEGER ELEVEN

Tomorrow's G1 Ladbrokes St Leger has attracted a field of 11, with Joseph O'Brien opting for G3 Queen's Vase winner **Leading Light (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) of the Ballydoyle duo. Not seen since extending his sequence in that June 21 two-mile Royal Ascot contest, Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's progressive colt had previously annexed the G3 Gallinule S. at The Curragh May 26 and is the choice over stable companion **Foundry (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). He comes into this on the back of a return second behind Telescope (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in York's G2 Great Voltigeur S. over 12 furlongs Aug. 21 and is partnered by Ryan Moore. Of the seven St Leger winners to be trained in Ireland, six have been housed at Ballydoyle, and this race has held its level of importance for the current regime at Rosegreen. "He had only gone as far as a mile and a quarter before the Queen's Vase, but he got the trip well at Ascot," Aidan O'Brien, who is seeking a fourth edition, said earlier this week of Leading Light. "We thought of going to the Voltigeur with him, but he was not 100% and so we gave him a couple of weeks off. We have been very happy with him over the last three weeks though and we always thought that Doncaster would suit him. He has not disappointed us yet, travels well and always finds plenty off the bridle. We were delighted with Foundry's run last time in the Great Voltigeur at York. **Cont. p16**

“That was his first run of the season, and he was still running for experience, so we were delighted with how forward he was. He has had three weeks since York and is in good form. You would hope that the extra trip at Doncaster will be within his compass. He is a big, long-striding, good-moving horse and came home very well at York.” One who could miss the race is Michael O’Flynn’s **Galileo Rock (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), with trainer David Wachman warning that ground conditions have to improve in the run-up. “Galileo Rock will be declared for the G1 Irish St Leger and a decision on which race to go for will be delayed until Friday evening,” he said. “I want very much to run Galileo Rock in the Ladbrokes St Leger because of its prestige, prize-money and the fact it is confined to 3-year-olds.” Godolphin declared their trio of six-day entries, with William Buick called up for the ride on the G1 Epsom Derby runner-up and G2 Dante S. winner **Libertarian (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}) after John Gosden withdrew Feel Like Dancing (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). “It’s a fantastic ride to have, he’s been a good horse for me and it’s nice to ride for Godolphin in such a nice race,” the rider commented. Mickael Barzalona will be on July 31 G3 Gordon S. winner **Cap O’Rushes (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}), while Silvestre de Sousa will renew his partnership with the Voltigeur third **Secret Number (GB)** (Raven’s Pass). The latter’s five-time Leger-winning trainer Saeed bin Suroor is hoping for a bold run as he bids to join Mat Dawson, John Porter, Cecil Boyd-Rochfort and Dick Hern on six winners. “He’s doing really well and has been working really well,” he said. “I’ve always liked him, but he was a bit weak in the past and improves from every race. The ground will suit him--he will be fine with it.” A win for any of the three in the royal blue would make Godolphin jointly the most successful operation in the Classic’s history, matching the exploits of the ninth Duke of Hamilton in the late 18th and early 19th Century.

UP FOR THE CUP

Having provided his retiring former trainer John Dunlop with an emotive send-off in last year's G2 Doncaster Cup, **Times Up (GB)** (Olden Times {GB}) is back on Town Moor today to bid for back-to-back renewals for 'The Master of Arundel's son Ed. Slower to come to hand this term, the 7-year-old was only third in the G2 Lonsdale Cup that he also annexed in 2012 when last seen at York's Ebor meeting Aug. 23, but his conditioner believes there is more to come. "It sounds bizarre as we're in September now, but it feels almost like this is his second run of the season," Ed Dunlop told *PA Sport*. "He had some problems and we weren't happy with him, but he ran well at York and he looks in very good form. He has won races on fast ground and softer ground, the only thing he wouldn't want is if it went too soft." James Fanshawe re-opposes with **High Jinx (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), who was second to Times Up in both the Lonsdale and Doncaster Cups last term before filling the same spot in the G1 Prix du Cadran at Longchamp in October. Dry conditions have meant that he has been restricted to a sole outing so far this season, when fourth in the G3 Henry II S. at Sandown May 30, and he will appreciate this easier surface. Godolphin's 2012 G1 Ascot Gold Cup hero **Colour Vision (Fr)** (Rainbow Quest) has to arrest a slump of late, but was fourth in the most recent edition of the Royal Ascot highlight June 20.

Racing Manager Simon Crisford is not confident. "He has been training well, but we would like to have seen the ground quicker, as it will turn into a real test," he said.

A WELL-TRODDEN PATH

Godolphin have won the last three renewals of the G2 May Hill S. at Doncaster and return today with a filly who fits the right formula in **Ihtimal (Ire)** (Shamardal). Like two of her predecessors--White Moonstone (Dynaformer) and Certify (Elusive Quality)--the Saeed bin Suroor-trained homebred captured Newmarket's G3 Sweet Solera S. en route and she looked set for bigger things in that Aug. 10 seven-furlong contest. "Ihtimal is a top filly, who tries very hard, and I was really happy with her win at Newmarket," her trainer commented. "She has been working nicely and the step up to a mile should be no problem. I am hopeful of another good effort from her."

Also in the royal blue is the Charlie Appleby-trained **Majeyda** (Street Cry {Ire}), who booked her ticket with a neck defeat of Shadwell's re-opposing subsequent G3 Prestige S. runner-up **Qawaasem (Ire)** (Shamardal) in Sandown's Listed Star S. over seven furlongs July 25. "I was very pleased with Majeyda's victory at Sandown and she had a little break afterwards," Appleby said. "I feel that she will appreciate stepping up to a mile and should run a big race." An unexposed type who could be anything is Poilin Good's **Lustrous (GB)** (Champs Elysees {GB}), who scored on debut for Richard Hannon in a seven-furlong maiden at Salisbury eight days ago. "Lustrous was impressive when winning her maiden, but that was on fast ground so we don't know how she would cope if it gets any softer come the May Hill," her conditioner warned yesterday.

FIVE FACE DAN IN WOODBINE MILE

Morton Fink's reigning Horse of the Year **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) has drawn post four of six for his attempted title defense in Sunday's GI Ricoh Woodbine Mile, a "Win and You're In Event" for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 2. The 2-5 morning-line favorite will start as the 124-pound highweight under regular rider John Velazquez. He was last seen annexing Saratoga's GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 10 for his eighth-straight victory. Second choice on the morning line at 4-1 in Live Oak homebred **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper), a back-to-back Grade III winner at this trip earlier in the year who was last seen finishing second to Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) in Betfair Hollywood Park's GI Shoemaker Mile H. June 29 and who scratched out of the Fourstardave due to the good ground. "We're obviously looking for firm turf with him, regardless of the competition," said Christophe Lorieul, trainer Christophe Clement's long-time assistant. "We think he's a very good horse, but he's a lot more effective on firm turf. He's fit. He's run good races off long layoffs. He's also a little bit better in the cooler climate. I'm not sure we can beat Wise Dan. Wise Dan is a very good horse. But we'll take him on and see what happens. Our horse is doing very well." The forecast for Etobicoke over the weekend calls for little to no precipitation. The Woodbine Mile's \$1-million purse has attracted just one European invader this year in the form of Qatar Racing's **Trade Storm (GB)** (Trade Fair {GB}). Winner of Meydan's G2 Zabeel Mile in March, the David Simcock trainee was most recently third in Goodwood's G2 Celebration Mile Aug. 24.

MENTOR CANE INJURED, EUTHANIZED

Mr. & Mrs. Jerry Moss's promising GI King's Bishop S. runner-up **Mentor Cane** (Mizzen Mast--Vixana, by Gone West) suffered a right hind lateral condylar and a comminuted right-hind P1 fracture, according to Dr. Anthony Verderosa, chief examining veterinarian for the New York Racing Association. The injury was suffered in a Thursday morning workout at Belmont Park and was the colt had to be euthanized. Edgar Prado was aboard for the move, but was uninjured in the incident. A homebred son of Vixana, Mentor Cane placed in two starts in California to begin his career, but aired by five lengths in his New York debut at Belmont Park July 6, covering 6 1/2 furlongs in a sparkling 1:15 1/5. Given a shot at graded-stakes company off that effort, he set a swift pace in the GI Amsterdam S. at Saratoga July 28, but drifted out badly nearing the stretch and did well to be fourth. Forced through taxing early fractions in the King's Bishop last time, he streaked past the eighth pole four lengths in front and looked home free, only to be run down by Capo Bastone (Street Boss).

WESTERN WINTER DIES

Western Winter (Gone West--Chilly Hostess, by Vice Regent), arguably the best stallion in South African history, died yesterday after breaking a leg following colic surgery. The 21-year-old, who stood at Mike Rattray's Lammerskraal Stud near Cape Town throughout his stud career, was South Africa's Leading Freshman Sire of 2001 and Champion General Sire in 2003, 2005 and 2006. He is the all-time leading sire in the country by prize money earned, with almost R105 million (*US\$ 10.6 million*), and has produced 20 Grade 1 winners, more than any other stallion in South African history. He is responsible for 13% stakes winners to runners, including back-to-back Horses of the Year Yard-Arm (SAf) and Winter Solstice (SAf) in 2004 and 2005, as well as 2-Year-Old Champion Argonaut (SAf), and Champion Sprinter What A Winter (SAf).

A \$200,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase in 1993, Western Winter raced in the U.S. and was trained by Mohammed Moubarak for Buckram Oak Farm. He won Hialeah's Joseph M. Farrell S. in his third outing in 1995 and went on to be four times graded placed, including near misses to Langfuhr in the 1997 GI Carter H. and GI Met Mile.

Western Winter took up stud duties at Lammerskraal later that year, and he is currently the sire of 76 stakes winners.

Maryland Breeder and Owner Incentives In Place for Laurel Fall Meet:

The new Maryland-bred breeder and owner program will begin with the start of Laurel Park's Fall meet Sept. 19. The Maryland Racing Commission approved incentives for Maryland owners and breeders last spring. The program will provide incentives to breed horses in the state with increased bonuses for Maryland-bred horses based on the state-bred programs already implemented in New York, Pennsylvania and West Virginia. There will be a 30% breeder bonus payout for Maryland-bred horses who finish in the money and a 10% stallion bonus. Maryland-owned horses will receive a 17.5% bonus for finishing in the top three. These incentives will remain at the same rate until 2015 at which time the breeder and owner bonuses will increase to 30% the top three finishers. "The goal of this program is to bring Maryland racing and breeding back to its pre-eminent position on the national stage, and to provide the incentives to breed, own, and race Maryland-bred horses," explained Bruce Quade, Chairman of the MRC. "This program provides the economic basis and stability for horsemen in Maryland as well as attracting national investment in the Maryland racing and breeding industry. The Governor and the General Assembly, through their continued support for Maryland racing and breeding, have given us the tools to permit the Maryland-bred program to flourish to the benefit of all Marylanders. Just think of the farmland that will be preserved by these measures. The combination of this breeding initiative together with the 10-year agreement between the horsemen and the track earlier this year provides the stability and the economic incentives for Maryland horse racing and breeding to thrive."
