ALTERITE INVADES FOR GARDEN CITY

Alterite (Fr) (Literato {Fr}) makes her first stateside appearance in today's G1 Garden City S. at Belmont, looking to give owner Martin Schwartz and trainer Chad Brown a second straight win in the event following the exploits of fellow French import Samitar (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}). A listed winner in the provinces at two, Alterite missed by a neck when third to Silasol (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) in last year's G1 Prix Marcel Bousac and called it a season. The bay returned to add the Listed Prix La Camargo in her seasonal debut Mar. 26, but was a troubled 10th to G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf heroine Flotilla (Fr) (Mizzen Mast) in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches next time out May 12. She atoned with a nose defeat at the hands of Silasol in a soft-ground renewal of the G1 Prix Saint-Alary May 26, but could do no better than a midfield sixth last time in the G1 Prix de Diane June 16. The more ease in the ground the better says Schwartz, and though the turf was labeled 'good' Friday, it was riding and playing more like yielding. **Emollient** (Empire Maker) overcame the 13 hole to win the G1 Ashland S. over the Keeneland Poly Apr. 6, but totally flopped in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. May 17. Trainer Bill Mott switched her to the grass and stretched her out to 10 panels for the G1 American Oaks at Hollywood July 13, and she proved easily best while failing to set the world on fire. "She'd run so well on the synthetic at Keeneland," said Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott of the decision to try turf in the American Oaks. "We'd worked her on the turf and that went extremely well. So we decided to try her away from dirt, since obviously that wasn't working out." **Discreet Marq** (Discreet Cat) is also coming off a trans-continental journey, having employed off-pace tactics to annex the G1 Del Mar Oaks Aug. 17. Prior to that, the Generazio homebred went coast-to-coast to take the GII Sands Point S. May 27 and the restricted Eventail S. July 4, and she could be closer to the speed this time around.

KNOWLEDGE IS POWER

John Gosden has come to master the demands of preparing a G1 St Leger winner, and is back at Doncaster today with another leading prospect for the 237th renewal in Khalid Abdullah's **Excess Knowledge (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}). Having produced the relative outsiders Arctic Cosmos (North Light {Ire}) and Masked Marvel (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) to upset more obvious candidates in two of the last three runnings of the oldest Classic, the wily veteran of the Newmarket training ranks has brought the Juddmonte homebred along steadily with an eye on this prize. Lightly campaigned as a juvenile, he had enough pace to muster a runner-up finish to Just the Judge (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) in Newbury's Listed Washington Singer S., but was always going to be better over middle distances this term. His first try at 12 furlongs saw him finish an unlucky second to **Cap O'Rushes (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}) in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 31, and he should be in his element on breeding over this extended trip. "He was making a nice run down the outside in the Gordon S. and there was horse wandering around in front of him every time we made a move," Gosden explained. "He flew at the finish, but was just beaten. I like him and, bred the way he is, the distance of a mile six and a half furlongs should be within his compass." **Cont. p3**

Between a Rock and a Soft Place...

David Wachman faces a nervous wait until his scheduled track inspection this morning, but every drop of rain that falls over Doncaster is a negative for his representative **Galileo Rock (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Michael O'Flynn's G1 Epsom Derby third, who was also runner-up in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh four weeks later, looks a doubtful starter as connections eye the Irish equivalent at The Curragh 24 hours later. "I'm going to walk the course around 5.30 a.m. on Saturday and we'll see where we are then," his trainer explained yesterday. "The horse is due to fly over at 7 a.m., so we'll be able to decide whether to put him on the plane or get him off."

Talent To Shine Through?...

One who will appreciate any more rain is James Rowsell and Mark Dixon's G1 Epsom Oaks winner **Talent (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}), who bids to get back on track following her subsequent flop in the G1 Irish Oaks on quick ground at The Curragh July 20. The form of her impressive success in the May 31 Classic received a late boost on Thursday when the third-placed The Lark (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) captured the "Fillies' St Leger", the G2 Park Hill S. and jockey Jim Crowley is hoping she can show her true worth as she bids to become the 42nd filly to win the Classic and the first since User Friendly (GB) in 1992. "Ireland was a bit of a farce, with the fast ground and the way the race was run," Crowley commented. **Cont. p4**

Crowley continued, "The trip is fine, I think, and the softer the ground, the better. We hacked in Ireland and it just didn't suit, so even if they go a normal pace, we'll be fine." Several fillies have attempted to beat the colts here in recent times, with the 15 to have undertaken the task since 1992 including the high-class Ramruma (Diesis {GB}), who was second in 1999, the Ralph Beckett-trained Look Here (GB) (Hernando {Fr}), third in 2008, and Snow Fairy (Ire) (Intikhab), fourth three years ago. However, some others such as Quiff (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Unsung Heroine (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) have gone close, and overall the distaff brigade have a fine record. "Look Here ran a very good race for us in the St Leger when she was third--I wasn't sure she got home and it was probably a very good Leger, won by Conduit," Beckett commented. "Talent is in good shape, but has not had the ideal preparation, as I was keen to run her in the Yorkshire Oaks, but the ground was too quick. I think she would be better with a run under her belt. She galloped at Kempton over a mile last week and we were pleased with the way it went. She doesn't knock herself out in her work. We have always felt she is a strong stayer and that the St Leger is the right race for her under the right conditions. She needs a bit of juice in the ground, not like the ground when she ran in the Irish Oaks."

Great Expectations?...

Brian Meehan is never short on confidence when pitching Mantonites into top company, and saddles an intriguing outsider in Raymond Tooth's **Great Hall (GB)** (Halling). While he has to improve markedly on his latest handicap win over 14 furlongs at Haydock July 4, the unexposed stayer will enjoy the cut in the ground and is partnered by Kieren Fallon, who still seeks a first winner of this Classic. "We have quite a few stayers in the yard this season," his trainer said. "He hung a bit left and hung a bit right and was green at Haydock last time, but he actually won with plenty in hand. It probably looked a bit more pressured than it was." Like Manton, Kingsclere is another establishment with an illustrious history, and Andrew Balding is hoping that Mick and Janice Mariscotti's **Havana Beat (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) can step up on his performances so far in 2012, which include a career-best third in the G3 Bahrain Trophy over 13 furlongs at Newmarket July 11. "He was unlucky in the Bahrain Trophy, as he got caught in a pocket and only finished up getting beaten two necks," he said. "If he had won the Bahrain Trophy and was going straight for the Leger he certainly wouldn't be a 33-1 shot. The Ladbrokes St Leger is a race I would love to win. There have been plenty of St Leger winners trained at Kingsclere, but none for a long time."

SAY WHAT?
What They're Saying at KEENSEP...

Bloodstock agent Anthony Stroud

It's been an incredibly strong sale and it's been quite a diverse sale--there are clients from all parts of the world here. And I think the format is good. It's a great help not starting until 12 and I think it's a good help finishing at 6 or 6:30. And I think having this day off is a good thing. It gives everyone time to catch up. I think all in all, Keeneland are to be congratulated because I think it works well.

(On buying American-breds)

I think America always produces a good horse. And it is still significant. I think there are some good horses here. War Front is an unbelievable stallion and there are many other stallions, like Kitten's Joy, that cross over [to Europe]. War Front crosses over there and Street Cry (Ire), Giant's Causeway and Speightstown. So I think there are horses that cover both territories.

Michael Herson, Gainesway

The reformatting and the combining of Book 1 and 2 was an essential necessity given the previous perception of Book 1 where buyers were discarding the book and moving right on into Book 2. That was further supported by the fact that consignors and, particularly the owners, didn't want their horses consigned in Book 1, which put pressure on Keeneland and the consignors. This is the perfect solution. It amalgamates Book 1 and 2.

The restructuring of the sales sessions with a later start at noon has allowed buyers the chance to look at essentially 900 yearlings through Book 1. It's raised the market significantly and it's alleviated the negativity towards Book 1 and it's altogether been a very positive move, in my opinion. The strength of Book 1 will have a waterfall-like effect in that it will drive up the market into Book 2 and consequently that strength in the market will continue on down the ranks. Keeneland has done a great job in previous years in attracting a broad and deep market for Books 2, 3 and 4 and we anticipate a whole new group of fresh faces to arrive in at the weekend and continue to elevate the horse sale.

Reiley MacDonald, Eaton Sales

I thought the new format worked well. I think we had, certainly I had, too many horses in Book 1 that really shouldn't have been in Book 1. I would almost like to see them shorten it to three days and tighten up the standards to 250 a day for three days. Other than that, I thought it worked really well. I'm not sure how the buyers found it, but from our standpoint it seemed to go well.

(On the market)

The market is really good, it's just that if you are in the top half of the horses in Book 1, you get really good premium. If you are in the bottom half of horses in Book 1, you get forgotten. So there has not been a lot of depth to it. But the top has been phenomenal.

Craig Bendoroff, Denali Stud

I think the new format worked. They were buying \$1-million horses all the way to the end. We always said we don't have to find them for them, they'll find them. And we kept people here for four days, they're not flying in and flying out. They're not coming late. So I don't think there is any question the format worked. I've heard complaints that there is a lot of territory to cover, it's hard to see all the horses. Maybe there is a way to fix that, but I'm not sure there is. If you want to put 800 horses in front of them--only so many fit in a barn. Maybe we can do some things to make it easier for them to get around.

FILLY LOOKING 'READY' FOR NATALMA

The lone out-of-towner for today's GII Natalma S. at Woodbine, Klaravich Stable and William H. Lawrence's **Ready to Act** (More Than Ready), looks like the one they'll have to run down in a 'Win and You're In' event for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf Nov. 1. A \$200,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase, the gray filly was lightly regarded at 7-1 for her 5 1/2-furlong debut over the Saratoga turf July 22, but charged home from midpack to score by a half-length with a field-best 75 Beyer Speed Figure. She'll have to negotiate an extra 5/16ths of a mile this afternoon, but she has the license to do so, as her dam Always Auditioning (Mizzen Mast) is a full-sister to Mast Track, who won the GI Hollywood Gold Cup over 10 furlongs. Rajiv Maragh is in for the mount. WinStar sire Spring At Last accounted for the 2012 Natalma exacta of Spring Venture and Spring in the Air, and he is represented in this year's renewal by morning-line second favorite **Spring Likeacobra**. The gray filly tried black-type company on her debut in the July 6 My Dear S. and showed some early pace before drifting back to finish sixth. MATADOR OUT TO 'BULL'-Y SUMMER FOES

John C. Oxley's **Matador** (Malibu Moon) rates a longshot look in this afternoon's GII Summer S. presented by TVG at Woodbine, the winner of which will receive an all-expenses paid trip to Santa Anita for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Nov. 1. The Summer S. has accounted for a pair of winners on Championship Day since 2006. Dreaming of Anna (Rahy) beat the boys that year en route to a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, while Pluck (More Than Ready) parlayed a win in the 2010 Summer into Juvenile Turf success at Churchill Downs six weeks later. Ontario-bred Matador was the 3-1 second choice while debuting in the restricted Vandal S. sprinting over the local Polytrack Aug. 11, but was bothered at the start and crossed the line fourth, 3 1/4 lengths behind victorious favorite Go Greeley (Horse Greeley). He too is a candidate to take to this surface switch, as his female family includes GI Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Turf upsetter Shared Account (Pleasantly Perfect). **Tropic of Artie** (Artie Schiller) was unplaced behind Go Greeley in the July 20 Colin S., but with his GI Breeders' Cup Mile-winning sire on top and a mare by Dynaformer underneath, could have been expected to improve stepping onto the grass last time. It was a plan that nearly came to fruition, but for a last-stride lunge from **Asserting Bear** (Bear's Kid). Patrick Husbands, who returned from an injury Friday, takes over at the controls. **School On a Hill** (Student Council) lit up the Arlington tote to the tune of \$95 going a two-turn mile Aug. 22 and has since been purchased by Jim Covello, Millennium Farms and West Point Thoroughbreds. The bay, who is cross-entered in the Kentucky Downs Juvenile, has been turned over to Wayne Catalano.

Having proved a revelation when reverting to seven furlongs in the G2 Hungerford S. at Newbury last time Aug. 17, Princess Haya of Jordan's **Gregorian (Ire)** (Clodovil {Ire}) stays at that trip for today's G2 Park S. at Doncaster. Never far from the best over a mile, the John Gosden trainee was placed three times at the top level over that trip before brushing aside the previously unbeaten Soft Falling Rain (SAf) (National Assembly) in a

"It was on the soft side when he won the G3 Diomed S. at Epsom on Oaks Day, and it was on the easy side when he was a length third in last year's G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot, so he's got a lot going for him." When Gregorian was third in the G1 Queen Anne S. at this year's Royal meeting June 18, Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Aljamaaheer (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) was a half-length ahead in second. Subsequently successful in the G2 Summer Mile at Ascot July 13, he was disappointing when only eighth in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 11 when the Roger Varian stable was under a cloud. "Aljamaaheer looks great and has been in terrific form at home," his trainer commented. "I would love to run him at Doncaster. I think the flat, sharp seven furlongs would be right up his street. On paper, he looks to have a very good chance. My only concern would be if the ground deteriorates any more." In a strong renewal of this race which can sometimes offer below-par fare, Eddie Lynam sends across the 3-year-old filly **Viztoria (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}), and she will relish the underfoot conditions. Successful in The Curragh's G3 Athasi S. over this trip May 6, she was a creditable sixth when the ground rode too fast for her in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot when last seen June 21.

Building on third placings in the G2 Yorkshire Cup over 14 furlongs and G2 Henry II S. over an extended two-mile trip at Sandown last May, the bay upstaged High Jinx when capturing the G2 Lonsdale Cup before following up at the expense of the same rival in this race 12 months ago. to Ed Dunlop for his 7-year-old campaign, he was only sixth in the latest renewal of the Henry II, run now as a Group 3, May 30. He beat only one rival in the June 20 G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot before showing some old spark when third in the Lonsdale Cup at York Aug. 23. Switched off early by Ryan Moore with just Repeater behind, he tracked his old adversary High Jinx initially before letting that rival slip away as James Doyle took him close to the pace at the end of the back straight. High Jinx was in front at the top of the stretch, but Times Up was full of run in behind and gently encroached on the action as Colour Vision (Fr) (Rainbow Quest) emerged as a real threat on their outside.

As that rival faded out of it, Times Up was sent into the lead passing the quarter pole and, despite veering right in the clear, was firmly in command in the run to the line. "It was a real messy race and I had to go when I did or I would have been stopped," Moore said. "I was just trying to save him when he got there, but he dug deep when I asked him." For his trainer, the result was a satisfying end to a frustrating period since he had taken over the handling of one of his father's finest horses in the last years of his esteemed career. "Finally we've achieved something with the horse, as I trained him very badly for one reason or another, so this is a great day and I'm very proud," he said. "He was going very well in the spring and working unbelievably with all my good mile-and-a-half horses, and showed so much speed I wanted to run in the G2 Jockey Club S., but then he got an infection in his hind leg which manifested into something quite serious. He was off for a while and was never really sparkling and pulled too hard in the Ascot Gold Cup, so we gave up and started again. York was his first run of the year as far as we were concerned, and he had thrived since. He likes going this way around, but there are not many races left so maybe we'll take him to Dubai for the staying race there on Dubai World Cup night. That could be a consideration, as he's very fresh and the track and ground would suit." High Jinx's trainer James Fanshawe is keen to return to Longchamp in an attempt to go one better than when second in the G1 Prix du Cadran Oct. 6.

"He's run really well after a long absence and he's entitled to improve for that," he said. "We've had to be disciplined with him as he's not had his ground all year and needs a bit of cut in the ground. We'll more than likely head to the Prix du Cadran now and that sort of trip will suit him well."

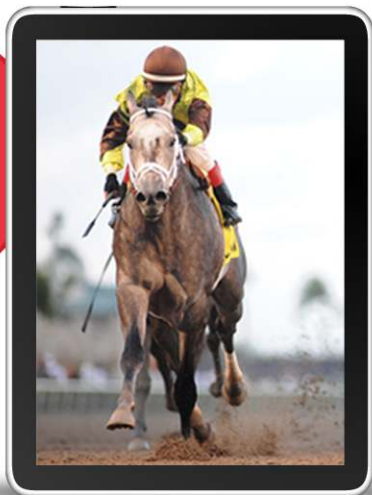

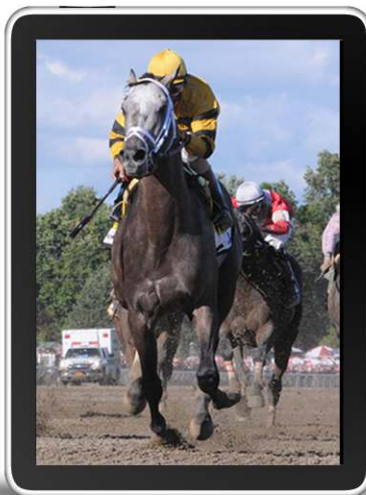

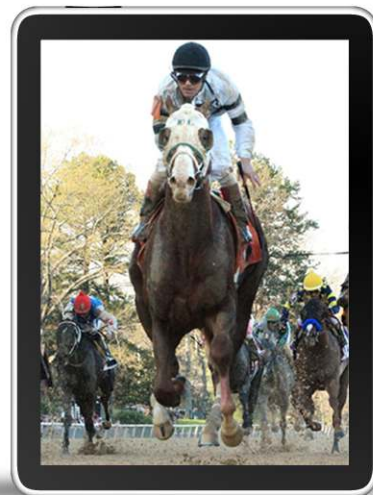

"She's got a good turn of foot, so we were very worried about the ground and only let her take her chance after the first race, but it's probably not as bad as we feared," he said. "She'll run in the G1 Fillies' Mile [at Newmarket Sept. 17] next. She is from the same family as Balanchine, so I think she'll go a mile and a quarter next year but that will be tops for her. She'll be given a 1000 Guineas preparation." Of the runner-up, Crisford added, "She's run up to her best, we're very pleased with her but she's been beaten by the better filly on the day. However, we might look at the Fillies' Mile for her as well."

The trainer's wife Hetta, who was on duty with Olly at the Keeneland Sales, commented, "We have always thought a lot of him and he's had some bad runs, so people have said he's a bit of a monkey but I'm delighted he's shown his true colors today. He's been working like a demon at home and bounced back from that run at York, where he tried to break the land-speed record and slept for two days afterwards." Jockey Jim Crowley added, "We dropped him in today, because we'd been blitzing him off and it worked out really well. I managed to get him anchored and it was a nice pace and the ground was okay for him. I was following the right horse and she gave me a nice tow into the race. He can be a bit temperamental, but early on we thought a lot of him and it's good that he has proven himself today." Wind Fire's trainer David Brown is looking at the G3 Cornwallis S. at Ascot Oct. 5, but she has another more ambitious alternative. "The Cornwallis is always an option, as is the [Sept. 21 G3 Firth of Clyde S.] up at Ayr, but we may even run her in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye [at Longchamp Oct. 6]. She's got enough speed for that and I wouldn't be afraid of running her there."

JOCKEY CLUB RELEASES 2012 STATISTICS

Edited Press Release

The Jockey Club reported that 2,392 stallions covered 37,908 mares in North America during 2012, according to statistics compiled through Sept. 9, 2013. These breedings have resulted in 22,001 live foals in 2013 being reported to The Jockey Club on Live Foal Reports.

The Jockey Club estimates that the number of live foals reported so far is approximately 90% complete. The reporting of live foals in 2013 is down 2.2% from last year at this time when The Jockey Club had received reports for 22,500 live foals of 2012.

In addition, The Jockey Club had also received 2,891 No Foal Reports for the 2013 foaling season. Ultimately, the 2013 registered foal crop is projected to reach 23,000.

The number of stallions declined 8.7% from the 2,620 reported for 2011 at this time last year, while the number of mares bred decreased 4.8% from the 39,838 reported for 2011.

Matt Iuliano, The Jockey Club's executive vice president and executive director, stated that the breeding statistics are not a measurement of the live foals born in each state or province, but are a count of live foals by conception area, regardless of where the foals were born. He also reiterated that the statistics should not be taken to represent the final fertility record of any single stallion or conception area.

Kentucky annually leads all states and provinces in terms of Thoroughbred breeding activity. Kentucky-based stallions accounted for 41.1% of the mares reported bred in North America in 2012 and 48.8% of the live foals reported for 2013.

The 15,569 mares reported bred to 249 Kentucky stallions in 2012 have produced 10,726 live foals, a 2.1% decrease on the 10,960 Kentucky-sired live foals of 2012 reported at this time last year. The number of mares reported bred to Kentucky stallions in 2012 declined 2.2% against the 15,918 reported for 2011 at this time last year.

Among the 10 states and provinces in which stallions covered at least 1,000 mares in 2012, only Florida and New York stallions produced more live foals in 2013 than in 2012 as reported at this time last year. The following table shows the 10 states and provinces, ranked by number of state/province-sired live foals of 2013 reported through Sept. 9, 2013.

The statistics include 322 progeny of stallions standing in North America but foaled abroad, as reported by foreign stud book authorities at the time of publication. In this category, 103 live foals by North American stallions were reported from Republic of Korea, 60 from Great Britain, and 42 from Ireland. Remaining countries on the list are Philippines, 23; Japan, 19; Mexico, 17; Brazil, 13; France, 11; Jamaica, 10; Argentina, 5; India, 5; Thailand, 5; Qatar, 3; Chile, 2; Dominican Republic, 2; Ecuador, 1; Sweden, 1.

The report also includes 75 mares bred to 30 stallions in North America on Southern Hemisphere time. The majority of these mares have not foaled.

Wedding Toast Heads to Turnback the Alarm....

Newly minted ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Wedding Toast (Street Sense) will get the opportunity to try her hand at some black-type in the GIII Turnback the Alarm S. Oct. 26. This decision comes after the Darley homebred's 14 1/2-length romp in a Belmont allowance Sept. 11.

"We did expect her to run well, but even we were surprised at that," said Art Magnuson, assistant to trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "She's a very nice filly. Javier, as expected, couldn't say enough about her, and she's mentally acting better and better."

All of Wedding Toast's starts have been against older horses. In her latest win she faced the likes of graded stakes placed Cue the Moon (Malibu Moon). She also faced older horses in her debut at Belmont June 19, where she finished second, and her graduation at Saratoga July 29.

"It's exciting to have a filly like that in the barn, it really is, and we don't take it for granted," Magnuson said. "You just try to keep them happy. I was happy to see when I came in [the next] morning how happy she was and that she ate all her dinner, so we can give Kiaran and Jimmy a good report."



Hopeful Hero Fires Pre-Champagne Bullet.

GI Hopeful S. hero **Strong Mandate** (Tiznow) fired a bullet at Churchill Downs yesterday in his first work since that 9 3/4-length score Sept. 2.

He breezed four furlongs in :47.40 and tied for the fastest of 44 at that distance. He galloped out five furlongs in 1:00.20 which was almost a full second faster than the five-furlong bullet yesterday.

"I don't time them, but when he went by me I thought it looked like a good little maintenance work and it was just about what we wanted," D. Wayne Lukas said. "Then when I rode by the clocker on my saddle horse and was told he went [forty] seven-and-two, I was really surprised."

This work was a tune-up for the colt's next start in the GI Champagne S. at Belmont Oct. 2.

"I don't know if I've had one like him for a long time," Lukas said. "It's the same thing when he runs. You think he's just in a high lope, like he was in the Hopeful. Next thing you know he's up in :47-and-two."

Strong Mandate is likely to work a few more times at Churchill before heading to Belmont for the Champagne, according to Lukas.

SEVEN SIRES TOP \$400K AVERAGE

Though there are still a few logistical issues to tweak, there was pretty much universal agreement among buyers, consignors, and sales company officials that Keeneland's new four-day Week 1 format has been a real winner. It's been over 20 years since the September Sale started to become so strong that the July sale was under threat, and nearly a decade ago it was completely cannibalized by September. Then, the September Sale began to cannibalize its own Book 1, to the point where that format became unsustainable. This year, the new 'Week 1' format, with 875 yearlings spread over four days, proved the right answer, at least for the foreseeable future. Virtually the same clearance rate from the catalogues (62.4% this year, 62.6% last year) was achieved, and even though 16% fewer yearlings were catalogued in the first week compared to last year, gross sales were up by over \$20 million (15%), and the average leapt by almost 39%, from \$202,829 last year to a whopping \$280,925 this week.



There were only 76 stallions with yearlings catalogued in Book 1, of which 38--exactly half--had four or more yearlings sell. For comparison, there are still another 3,033 yearlings catalogued, by 239 different stallions, beginning today for an eight-day run in the new Books 2-5. Twelve of the 38 sires with four or more listed sales in Book 1 returned averages above the sale average of \$280,925, and seven of those 12 averaged over \$400,000, emphasizing the fact that, Galileo aside, there is now quite a bit of parity among the top-level American sires. War Front and Bernardini, with their first crop now 5-year-olds, are the sires with the youngest runners among the 12; all of the others have at least 7-year-olds of racing age in 2013, emphasizing the concentration on proven, rather than unproven, sires which has been a feature of the fallout from the 2008 World Economic Meltdown.

World number one **Galileo** (Coolmore, IR) had seven yearlings catalogued in Week 1, of which five sold for an average of \$523,000, making him Week 1's leading sire on average. Six other Kentucky sires returned averages over \$400,000, and regardless of how many yearlings they still have to sell, which will inevitably result in falls in average, their Book 1 achievements are very impressive. Leading the way among the Kentucky sires was Claiborne's **War Front**, who looks more and more like he must be a clone of his own sire, Danzig. From 35 yearlings catalogued, 34 went through the ring (a 3% withdrawal rate, compared with 16% for the week), of which 27 were sold for an average of \$475,370 (figures from www.keeneland.com), including the \$2.5 million sale-topper and one other of the 18 seven-figure yearlings sold during the week. Gainesway's **Tapit**, who led the way with four seven-figure yearlings, edged out Darley's **Medaglia d'Oro**, who had three seven-figure yearlings, for third spot: Tapit had 31 yearlings sell (49 catalogued, 39 through the ring), for an average of \$451,452; 'Medaglia' had 18 sell (34 catalogued, 30 offered), for an average of \$449,444. You can see from the number of withdrawals and not-solds even for these two top sires that not every yearling by any of these sires is a 'slam-dunk'; but the ones the buyers do like, they are willing to spend big money for.

WinStar's **Distorted Humor** had 18 yearlings (34 catalogued, 32 offered) average \$417,500 to rank fifth by average, with Airdrie's late **Indian Charlie** sixth, with 15 Book 1 yearlings (29 catalogued, 24 offered) averaging \$405,000, headlined by Wednesday's session-topping \$2.2-million filly out of Take Charge Lady. According to yesterday's (p. 22) TDN Instatistics table, that takes the total for his last crop of yearlings so far this year to 21 sold, for an average of \$389,581. WinStar's **Tiznow**, whose Strong Mandate scored a timely win in the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga earlier this month, had 28 sell in Book 1 (36 catalogued, 34 offered), for an average of \$401,964, and including \$1.75 million and \$1.7 million half-sisters to Speightstown and Havre de Grace, no less.

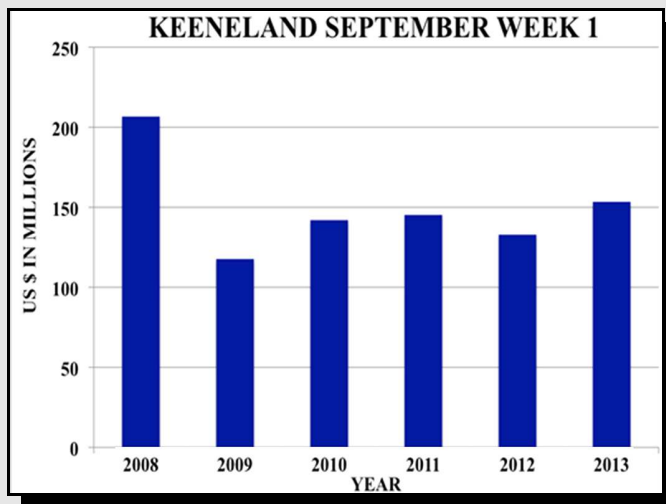
Five other sires with four or more sold beat the sales average of \$280,925. Darley's **Street Cry** had 12 sell (17 catalogued, 13 offered) for an average of \$358,333. He just edged out Spendthrift's **Malibu Moon**, who had 27 sell (49 catalogued, 39 offered), for an average of \$355,370, including two millionaires. He'll be 17 next year, and his stud career has come a long, long way since he kicked off as a 3-year-old (covered in 2000, first foals 2001) at the Pons Brothers' Country Life Farm in Maryland, for just \$3,000. He's a pretty good bet to command a six-figure fee, or awfully close to it, next year, having stood for \$70,000 the last two years, and for \$60,000 in 2011, when these yearlings were conceived. **Cont.**

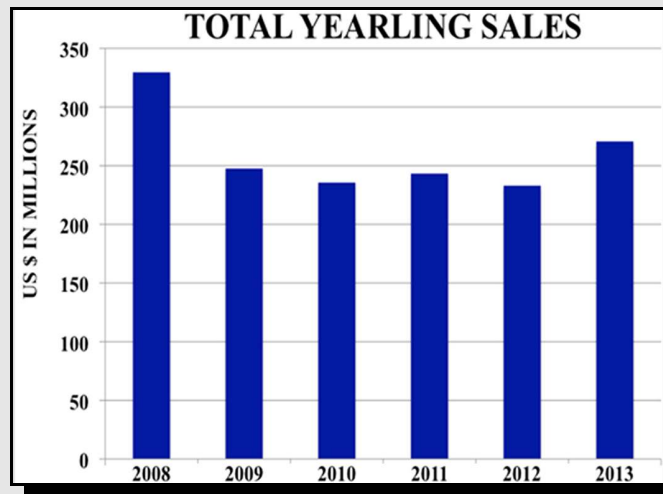

Darley's **Bernardini** averaged \$346,571 for 14 sold (28 catalogued, 20 offered), including a \$1.3-million half-sister to Proud Spell; Lane's End's **Smart Strike** had 20 sell (36 catalogued, 27 through the ring), for an average of \$320,250, including a \$1-million colt out of Canadian champion Serenading; and Three Chimneys' late, great **Dynaformer** had seven sell (eight catalogued, all eight through the ring), for an average of \$286,429.

Five stallions with first-crop yearlings in 2013 were among the 38 with four or more sold in Book 1, and all five averaged in a \$30,000 range between \$192,000-\$222,000. Claiborne's **Blame** had 19 sell (of 26 catalogued, 22 offered), for an average of \$221,579. WinStar's **Super Saver** had just four catalogued in Book 1, but all four sold, averaging a healthy \$218,750. Taylor Made's **Eskendereya** had a very good sale, with 12 averaging \$215,833 (16 catalogued, 14 offered). Ashford's **Lookin at Lucky** had a big day Thursday, and ended the week with seven sold (13 catalogued, nine offered), for an average of \$195,000; and Lane's End's **Quality Road** had 13 sell (17 catalogued, 15 offered), for an average of \$192,308. All five of these, plus, of course, most of the other sires with Book 1 yearlings, have many more coming up in the next eight days, and their averages are sure to fall some, at least. But a snapshot of the Book 1 results gives breeders a really good idea of the levels they can shoot for when breeding to what is now a wide cross-section of America's very respectable list of 'Book 1' sires. As far as what to expect for the rest of the sale: last year, there were 2,557 yearlings catalogued in the sale's second week, of which 1,861 sold (almost 73% of those catalogued), grossing \$86,928,500, and averaging \$46,711. This year, there are 3,033 yearlings catalogued the rest of the way (19% more; interestingly, there were 19% fewer in Week 1). If the clearance rate from the catalogue can again beat 70%, the whole sale could end up with gross revenues upwards of \$275 million, which would be a 25% gain (\$55-million) from last year.

Liason's most recent win came in the GII Mervyn Leroy H. three back May 4 and was third in the Harry Brubaker S. at Del Mar last out Aug. 31. He is trained by Bob Baffert for Arnold Zetcher.
