Michael Tabor's **Leading Light (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) justified that support by providing Aidan O'Brien with a fourth renewal of the Doncaster Classic. Sent into a prominent second throughout the early stages by Joseph O'Brien, who had had to endure the disappointment of losing out on a Triple Crown last year with Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), the bay, who like the stable's Derby hero Ruler of the World (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), sports cheekpieces,

mastered **Galileo Rock (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) heading to the furlong pole and stayed on strongly to score by 1 1/4 lengths from the filly **Talent (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}). "He's quite lazy in his races, but is tough," his rider said. "He jumped a little bit slowly, so I gave him a kick to get him up there as I knew they weren't going to go much of a gallop. I knew if I didn't have to hit him until a furlong and a half out I would win. It goes a little bit towards making up for last year." **Cont. p3**

Unbeaten in eight starts since dropping a head decision to Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) in the GI Stephen Foster H. nearly 15 months ago, owner Morton Fink's reigning Horse of the Year **Wise Dan**

(Wiseman's Ferry) returns to the greater Toronto area to defend his title in today's GI Ricoh Woodbine Mile, a Breeders' Cup Challenge race for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 2. While last year's Woodbine Mile marked the fourth start of that campaign,

this year's test will be Wise Dan's fifth--and perhaps penultimate--appearance of 2013. The splashy chestnut denied Data Link (War Front) a repeat in the GI Maker's 46 Mile S. in his seasonal debut Apr. 12, then tried nine furlongs on the grass for the first time in the GI Turf Classic May 4, besting Optimizer (English Channel) by an easy 4 3/4 lengths. **Cont. p15**

RUN AWAY and HIDE



Starting out, it is hard to get enough mares to compete with the top commercial sires. Thus, it is difficult to rank very high on the sire lists where gross earnings are key. Nevertheless, on a per-horse basis, **RUN AWAY AND HIDE** looks promising.

One of the stable's backroom members at two, Leading Light gave no indication of what was to follow when starting out with an uneventful fourth of the five runners assembled for a mile maiden at the Galway festival in August won by the subsequent G3 Sandown Classic Trial victor Sugar Boy (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}).

Next seen getting up late to open his account over nine furlongs at Tipperary in October, the bay returned at three an entirely different proposition when ridden from the front in cheekpieces to register a seven-length defeat of the Listed winner Dibayani (Ire) (Shamardal) in a 10-furlong conditions event at Navan May 7. Taken to The Curragh 19 days later for the G3 Gallinule S. over that trip, he followed up despite running greenly in front and was able to defy a three-pound penalty in the G3 Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot

June 21. That marathon contest had yet to throw up a Leger winner, with Ballydoyle's Mahler (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) having gone close to completing the rare double when runner-up to Lucarno (Dynaformer) in the 2007 edition of this Classic. In the year that the two-mile contest was named in honor of the Late Sir Henry Cecil, Leading Light finally ended the hoodoo with a strong-staying effort on Town Moor.

Having missed his intended prep in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York last month, he was understandably rusty initially and his laziness meant that he had to be cajoled forward by Joseph O'Brien to race close to the early pace set by Godolphin's **Cap O'Rushes (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}). Once in a stalking second, he traveled sweetly and his rider began the winding-up process as Galileo Rock tried to gain first run on his outer approaching the quarter pole. That rival's slender advantage had disappeared by the time the hard-working Ballydoyle representative reached top gear with 1 1/2 furlongs to race, and he quickly established a clear lead that was too much for the Oaks heroine Talent to erode. "He was always a very solid horse and his form before Royal Ascot was all over a mile and a quarter, but the lads wanted him to go there and run in that race," Aidan O'Brien explained. "He has class and is just a good horse who is very versatile trip-wise. We'll talk about his next race next week, but he has the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 6] as an option." **Cont. p4**

Owner Derrick Smith and Aidan O'Brien were left to reflect on the disappointment of missing out 12 months ago with Camelot afterwards. His owner, who was employed by the sponsors Ladbrokes, said, "This makes it all the better and we get over those things. Camelot still had a great season and is a great horse, so we enjoyed all of that and although we were disappointed at the time we move on." His trainer added, "We are privileged to be in this position and this is great for Derrick after last year. We came here then expecting a big day and it just went the other way, so it's great to have this nice horse to follow that."

Her Talent Is Obvious...

Burying a dismal effort in the G1 Irish Oaks, **Talent (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}) was back showing all the verve which characterized her dazzling display in the May 31 Epsom Classic. Held up in last early by Jim Crowley, the chestnut made eye-catching progress through the field in the straight, and despite meeting slight interference passing the quarter pole, her trainer Ralph Beckett was offering no excuses afterwards. "Jim didn't feel that there was a hard-luck story," he commented. "He got tight for room at a crucial stage and lost a bit of momentum, but the winner has won well. I'm thrilled to bits and feel like I've won, as her run was so bad in Ireland. For her to do that is terrific. All being well, and if the ground comes up similar to today, she'll run at Ascot in the [Oct. 19] G2 British Champions Fillies and Mares S." David Wachman, whose early-morning walk of the track paid off as Galileo Rock was given the green light and subsequently managed a third consecutive Classic placing, was also taking defeat squarely on the chin. "He's a wonderful horse and he ran a blinder, but the winner was just too good on the day and the Oaks winner just did us for second," he said. "The ground is not ideal, but having said that, the winner won very well and the decision to run was probably right. We'll see how he comes out of this, but he's had a light enough campaign and we might travel him at the end of the year."

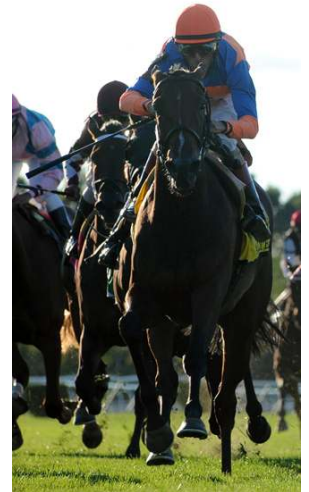

Owner Marty Schwartz and Chad Brown teamed with French import Samitar (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) to take the 2012 Garden City, and Alterite stamped herself as a filly for the future in this year's renewal in a race that was run to suit her European style. A listed winner at Craon last September for Jean-Claude Rouget, Alterite missed by a neck in third to Silasol (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac on Arc weekend and was snapped up by these connections following the victory of fellow import Zagora (Fr) (Green Tune) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Turf last November.

Winner of the Listed Prix La Camargo at Saint-Cloud Mar. 26, Alterite was a troubled 10th to G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf winner Flotilla (Fr) (Mizzen Mast) in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches May 12, but showed she could stay further when falling short by the narrowest of margins to Silasol in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary May 26. She overraced in the G1 Prix de Diane June 16 and never landed a blow in sixth and was in receipt of Lasix for this U.S.

debut. New York-bred Discreet Marq, last-out winner of the G1 Del Mar Oaks, shot right to the lead and was allowed to set a very sedate pace from Summer of Fun (Include). John Velazquez was able to gain cover right off the heels of that one while keeping GI American Oaks winner Emollient (Empire Maker) pinned down to her inside as they raced into the backstretch. Discreet Marq had things very much her own way and took them around the final bend after six furlongs in 1:15.49, but Alterite was warming up to the task and drew closer while not being asked. Always the best bet to win a sprint to the wire, she was produced three wide at the head of the lane and out-quickened her rivals to the wire. "I'm very happy," said Schwartz. "She got beat three inches in the Saint Alary and was the only horse to run in all three legs of the French Triple Crown for fillies." Alterite is not yet nominated to the Breeders' Cup, though the Filly/Mare Turf remains a possibility, the winning owner said. The winner is also a candidate for the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland Oct. 12 or the G1 E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine Oct. 27.

FILLY SCHOOLS THE BOYS IN THE SUMMER

Trainer Mark Casse elected to scratch **My Conquestadory** (Artie Schiller) from the GII Natalma S. against her own sex in favor of this, and the decision paid major dividends, as the \$240,000 OBS March graduate ran away with the GII Summer S. With the victory she earns a spot in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 1.

My Conquestadory was bred by Paul Tackett, who claimed the filly's multiple stakes-placed dam for \$8,000 out of a race at Charles Town in January 2010. Tackett gave the filly a few months, then bred her to Artie Schiller late in the season, and the mare foaled Apr. 12, 2011. Tackett consigned her to last year's Keeneland September sale sold her to an outfit named Biltmore Mansion Racing for \$70,000. They turned the dark bay to Eisaman Equine to be prepared for the March sale and she breezed an eighth of a mile in :10 before being knocked down to Ernie Semersky and Dory Newell's Conquest Stables LLC.

My Conquestadory was put into steady training in May and shaped with promise over the Safe-Track at the Ocala Training Center and didn't miss a beat once transferred to trainer Mark Casse's Woodbine base. She fired a bullet five furlongs over the turf training track in 1:00 4/5 Aug. 21 and followed with a best-of-13 three furlongs from the gate in :36 1/5 Aug. 28 on the Polytrack and was made a 5-1 chance to open her account in the best possible way.

My Conquestadory jumped alertly and landed slightly better than midfield as **Tropic of Artie** (Artie Schiller) set the pace narrowly from **Phenomenalmoon** (Malibu Moon) and **Asserting Bear** (Bear's Kid). Asked to quicken rounding the turn, My Conquestadora loomed up three wide and soon had the front-runners at her mercy. Held together nicely by Eurico Rosa da Silva into the final furlong and a half, she shifted into yet another gear and came away to score very impressively.

"I didn't think about losing the race. It never came to my mind that she could be beat," said da Silva. "I had great confidence in her and the whole [Casse] team said how nice she is. of the ground, but still boasted an impressive winner in Outstrip. Having followed a debut win over Godolphin's subsequently successful True Story (GB) (Manduro {Ger}) going seven furlongs at Newmarket June 22, the grey was caught close home when runner-up to Toormore

(Ire) (Arakan) in the G2 Vintage S. over that trip at Goodwood last time July 31 and was a supplementary entry this week. Slowly away and then keen under restraint from Mickael Barzalona, the homebred was shuffled back to rear and his rider was at work passing halfway as The Grey Gatsby turned the screw up front. Eventually slipping into top gear when switched wide, he swooped on his market rival approaching the furlong pole and drew clear with just two smacks with the whip as he appeared to idle in daylight. "I wanted to give him the best experience we could, by dropping him in and getting him to relax," Barzalona said. "He quickened well and is a nice horse who will improve a lot for this race--he'll be a serious horse for next year." Trainer Charlie Appleby added, "I was very confident without being too confident coming into the race, as he was just touched off in the Vintage and Mickael said if he had known the horse had such a turn of foot he would have waited longer that day. We were always going to drop him in and ride him for that turn of foot. He is a nice horse and I thought he would handle the conditions today.

He added, "Going forward, we will look at the G1 Dewhurst S. [at Newmarket Oct. 12] or go to France for the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere [at Longchamp Oct. 6]. Those are the two options we have in place and we will see how the horse comes out of this race. He is a horse who will strengthen--I would like to see him do that and a mile will be his trip next year." The Grey Gatsby's trainer Kevin Ryan said of the runner-up, "We're delighted with that, given the fact that he's still a little inexperienced. He's improving with every run and it looked like he was going to get beaten for second at one point, but he keeps sticking his neck out. He's very genuine and was going on again at the end. He's in the Dewhurst and the [Oct. 26] G1 Racing Post Trophy back here at Doncaster, so we'll take a look at those two races and see how they pan out. There were no excuses with the ground as he needs a bit of juice in it, which should mean he has his conditions later on in the year. Time will tell whether he'll be a miler, but I suspect he may end up over a mile and a quarter as a three-year-old. We've got plenty to look forward to."

Donard and Michael Niall homebred Temeraine outran his 61-1 odds to finish fifth, beaten 3 3/4 lengths, in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 17, and was subsequently sent off the favorite here. Settling fourth about five lengths off the pace through the early stages under Gary Stevens, Temeraine began to make up ground climbing the hill down the backstretch, but appeared to be dropping away from the leaders on the final bend of the unorthodox undulating course. Runner-up in this track's G3 Sapphire S. over five furlongs June 29, Russian Soul was the game winner of the Listed Abergwaun S. over that trip three runs later at Tipperary Aug. 9 before finishing third in the G3 Flying Five S. back here 15 days after that outing. Showing early speed to grab the rail in the front rank, the bay was pushed along at the quarter pole and, although he was headed by Farmleigh House a furlong later, fought back to prevail in a gripping four-way photo finish.

Zoustar, second in his lone Group 1 attempt in the J.J. Atkins S. at Eagle Farm in June, went one better to record his first victory at the highest level here. Dropping out near the rear of the field from the widest-of-all 16 hole, Zoustar and Jim Cassidy were hung four to five wide throughout. The dark bay began to make up ground passing the 600 meter mark and responded with a strong turn of foot when asked in midstretch. He got up in time to deny Dissident, while Bull Point, last year's A\$960,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale topper, made an eye-catching move from way out of it to get up for third. Despite displaying greenness on debut at Canterbury in April, Zoustar made his first start a winning one, and went on to collect a Hawkesbury handicap a month later before adding the G2 BRC Sires' Produce S. at Doomben May 25. He first tasted defeat in the J.J. Atkins when completing an exacta for his ill-fated Champion First Season Sire June 8, and recorded his lone off-the-board finish when fourth in the G3 Run to the Rose S. off a near three month layoff Aug. 31. Sporting a shadow roll for the first time here, Zoustar proved to be amongst the best of his generation, and trainer Chris Waller is contemplating his charge's next target. "I guess I have to choose between the [G1] Coolmore [Stud S. at Flemington Nov. 2] and the [G1] Caulfield Guineas [at Caulfield Oct. 12]," Waller told Racenet.com.au. "I guess studs might have some input. I'm hoping he's attractive to studs now, obviously a 1200 meter Coolmore or a Caulfield Guineas is good, but you can always step up." Almost against his better judgment, trainer Charlie LoPresti accepted a 128-pound impost for the GII Firecracker H. at Churchill and Wise Dan scored by two lengths in what became an eventful running. Wise Dan exits a second straight win in the GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 10, when he carried 129 pounds to defeat King Kreesa (King Cugat) by 1 1/4 lengths. LoPresti expects his charge to be in his typical staking position in the race. "[Jockey] Johnny [Velazquez] won't let him go to the lead, he never does. He just tucks him in somewhere," said LoPresti, in search of a third consecutive Woodbine Mile. "All I need to tell him is that the horse is fit enough and ready to run." **Riding the River** (Wiseman's Ferry) looks to complete a somewhat unlikely exacta for his Pennsylvania-based sire. A decent fourth in last year's Mile, the bay annexed the GII King Edward S. over this course and distance June 23, but ballooned to seventh in defense of his title in the nine-furlong GII Nijinsky S. July 21. He returned to seven-eighths of a mile for the GII Play the King S. and rallied wide for a solid third behind **Dimension (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) and **Excaper** (Exchange Rate), and the flow of this race should work in his favor. The admirably consistent **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper) ships in for trainer Christophe Clement. The Live Oak homebred has won three of his five starts this season, including the GIII Appleton S. and GIII Red Bank S. ahead of a runner-up effort to Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) in the GI Shoemaker Mile at Hollywood June 29. Garrett Gomez, winner of this event in 2007 and 2009, will make the trip up from New York to ride.

ON TO GLORY

So close to pulling off a shock comeback win in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's **Olympic Glory (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}) returns to France today to try his hand in the G1 Qatar Prix du Moulin de Longchamp. Beaten just a short head by Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in that Deauville highlight Aug. 11, last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner showed his true colors there off a lengthy break having flopped in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains over this track and trip May 12. Richard Hannon also saddles Qatar Racing Limited & CSH's June 30 G1 Prix Jean Prat winner **Havana Gold (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}), who reverts to a mile having failed to see out the 10-furlong trip of the G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville last time Aug. 15. "Olympic Glory is a worthy favorite for the Moulin," Hannon said. "We were not surprised how well he ran in the Prix Jacques le Marois, because he had worked brilliantly in his final gallop and in another stride he might have caught Moonlight Cloud in what looked a hot renewal. He definitely looks the type of horse who comes into his own in the second half of the season, and we are lucky to have him and Toronado for the major mile races. He went so close at Deauville, so let's hope we can get the job done here. However, don't forget we also have Havana Gold, who would be a stable star for us in an ordinary year."

Hannon continued, “[Havana Gold] loves traveling and is as tough as teak, and he is more than capable of getting in the money.” Both the Poulains and Pouliches (French 2000 and 1000 Guineas) winners are in opposition, with the colts’ Classic hero **Style Vendome (Fr)** (Anabaa) and fillies’ equivalent scorer **Flotilla (Fr)** (Mizzen Mast) returning from breaks having finished off the board in the Prix Jean Prat and June 16 G1 Prix de Diane, respectively. Reverting to a mile is The Niarchos Family’s **“TDN Rising Star” Maxios (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}), who loves this venue as he proved when annexing the G1 Prix d’Ispahan over an extended nine furlongs May 26 prior to his latest sixth in the G1 Prince of Wales’s S. at Royal Ascot June 19. The owner-breeders’ Racing Manager Alan Cooper told *PA Sport*, “We’re dropping back to a mile, but hopefully he’ll put in a good performance. He has a lot of different options; we’ve been invited to the Cox Plate, and there’s the Champion S. at Ascot. We’ll wait and see what happens this weekend first.”

TREASURE TREVE

On a day at Longchamp which sees the strongest assembly of runners for the Arc trials in recent memory, the G1 Qatar Prix Vermeille takes center stage of the trio of preps, and the prestigious affair in its own right has a leading lady to match in **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}). Bought by Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani after her scintillating G1 Prix de Diane triumph at Chantilly June 16, the unbeaten talent received a significant subsequent boost when the four-lengths runner-up Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) took the Irish Oaks. “Everything has gone well since the Prix de Diane, she worked very well with Frankie Dettori on board two weeks ago,” trainer Criquelette Head-Maarek told *PA Sport*. “He liked her and said she has got a great turn of foot. If she wins, or runs well, we might then go for the Arc. It is raining here, but I don’t like to make excuses as I think a horse can win on every ground if they are good enough. She won on soft ground as a 2-year-old and I don’t think it will be too bad. She has a good draw in stall three. She’s a very easy filly to train, she’s like a little bicycle--you can put her anywhere you want.” Heading the older brigade is Khalid Abdullah’s **Romantica (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), who captured the G1 Prix Jean Romanet over 10 furlongs at Deauville last time Aug. 18, but whose only finish out of the frame was when ninth in this race two months ago.

Also from the Andre Fabre stable is Godolphin’s **Tasaday** (Nayef), who built on third and fourth placings in the May 12 G1 Poule d’Essai des Pouliches and Prix de Diane, respectively, when scoring decisively over 10 furlongs at Deauville in both the July 27 G3 Prix de Psyche and Aug. 20 G2 Prix de la Nonette. Third in the Diane, the Wertheimers’ **Silasol (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) reserves her best for this circuit, as she showed when winning the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac in October and G1 Prix Saint-Alary May 26, and may have needed her first run off a break when fourth in the G2 Prix Guillaume d’Ornano at Deauville last time Aug. 15. Two overseas raiders who have major claims are Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith’s Irish and Yorkshire Oaks runner-up **Venus de Milo (Ire)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) and K I Farm Corporation’s **Wild Coco (Ger)** (Shirocco {Ger}), who has looked bound for this level for some time and flaunted her natural talent when recording an easy comeback win in Goodwood’s G3 Lillie Langtry S. over 14 furlongs at the start of August.

HEAVYWEIGHT BOUT

With Galileo Rock (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) running at Doncaster yesterday, the G1 GAIN Irish St Leger has no 3-year-olds in the line-up for once, and it will be left to the older brigade to duke it out for the spoils at The Curragh. Very little separates the majority of the field, with Godolphin’s **Ahzeemah (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) adding some intrigue from Britain having won the G2 Lonsdale Cup at York last time Aug. 23. Unexposed over this extended trip, the 4-year-old had previously finished runner-up to last year’s Irish Leger third Brown Panther (GB) (Shirocco {Ger}) in the Aug. 1 G2 Goodwood Cup, and his task has been made easier with the late withdrawal of that opponent. “I was very pleased with Ahzeemah’s win at York, and he is in good form at the moment,” trainer Saed bin Suroor commented. “He’s a very tough horse who always tries his hardest. A mile and six furlongs will suit him, and he heads to Ireland with a good chance.” Last year’s winner **Royal Diamond (Ire)** (King’s Best) looked to have met his match this summer when comprehensively beaten by **Ernest Hemingway (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in both the G3 Curragh Cup over this track and trip June 30 and G3 Ballyroan S. over 12 furlongs at Leopardstown Aug. 8, but took advantage of that rival’s flop when gaining a timely revenge in the G3 Irish St Leger Trial back over this course and distance last time Aug. 24.

Trainer and rider Johnny Murtagh, who has been in a rich vein of form in the saddle in 2013, has opted to come back here rather than have a tilt at next month's Caulfield Cup. He said, "He's in good form and came out of the last race very well. He won it last year on good to yielding and I don't think it's going to be soft. It's a much tougher race than last year and there are better horses in it, but I'm probably more happy with this lad this year. We got together and decided we'd give him another shot at the Irish St Leger. To do it two years in a row would be great. It was a big decision and I hope we've made the right one now. If all goes well, he'll be going to Melbourne. He's got two weeks of quarantine before he leaves and two weeks quarantine out there and then nine days before the race." Also in the mix is Ronnie Arculli's 2011 Irish Leger third **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who warmed up for this with a fine second in the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. over an extended 13 furlongs at Newbury last time Aug. 17, and Dr Ronan Lambe's unexposed filly **Pale Mimosa (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}). Dermot Weld has adopted the patient approach with her over the summer, and his wait for anything other than fast ground could pay off as she comes into this fresh having not raced since winning on her seasonal bow in the Listed Saval Beg S. over this trip at Leopardstown June 7. **Field p25**

Stella Perdomo's **Forte Dei Marmi (GB)** (Selkirk) looks to have a significant class advantage over six others in today's GI Northern Dancer Turf S., a course-and-distance prep for the GI Canadian International S. next month. Third to Wigmore Hall (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in this event last year and third in the International, Forte Dei Marmi was bankrupt in three tries south of the border, including a ninth in the GII Dixie S. at Pimlico May 18. Connections regrouped, sent the veteran back to Canada, and the results were immediate, as he defeated **Perfect Timber** (Perfect Soul {Ire}) by 6 1/4 lengths in the GIII Singspiel S. July 7 and followed with a 2 1/4-length defeat of **Hampstead Heath** (Macho Uno) in the GII Sky Classic S. Aug. 18. **Stormy Len** (Harlan's Holiday) ships up from New York and faces his elders as he tries 12 furlongs for the first time in his career. Winner of a 1 1/4-mile allowance over the Belmont turf June 27, the dark bay colt missed by a head and a nose to Infinite Magic (More Than Ready) and Admiral Kitten (Kitten's Joy), respectively, in the GIII American Derby July 13 and exits a 1 1/4-length defeat to the latter in the GI Secretariat S. at Arlington Aug. 17. His female family is replete with stayers, and he looms an interesting entrant today.

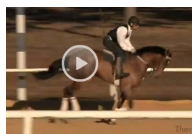

ALWAYS WANTING MORE

Richard Hannon may be nearing his retirement, but the insatiable appetite of the veteran trainer has never been more in evidence than in recent years. He brings one of his best 2-year-olds to The Curragh today in **Toormore (Ire)** (Arakan) to contest the G1 Goffs Vincent O'Brien National S. Having beaten the impressive subsequent winner and highly-regarded Ertijaal (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) on debut over six furlongs at Leicester May 28, Middleham Park Racing's bay gave yesterday's G2 Champagne S. winner Outstrip (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) a headstart and a beating in the G2 Vintage S. over this trip at Goodwood last time July 31. "We walked off the stand after Toormore won the Vintage S. at Goodwood declaring 'one more race and that's it for the season', and we think this is the right route to take," Hannon said. "Obviously, no Group 1 is a gimme, but Toormore, who has had a break since Goodwood, gave Hughesie a good enough feel on Wednesday morning to convince us that Ireland is the right place to go. The timing is right and, while we respect the opposition, there is nothing in there to make us think we cannot win. He has improved physically since Goodwood and that race also sharpened him up mentally, so we are looking forward to the step up from Group 2 company." For all of Toormore's potential, Fitri Hay and Susan Magnier's **Sudirman** (Henrythenavigator) holds the aces on form, having annexed the June 29 G2 Railway S. and Aug. 11 G1 Phoenix S. over six furlongs at this track. Trainer David Wachman has been waiting to step him up to this trip and told *PA Sport*, "He's in good form and we always thought seven furlongs would be more his thing than six. I don't know much about Richard Hannon's horse, so we'll just have to see what happens on the day. We're happy with our horse and I think the trip will suit him well." Aidan O'Brien has won this eight times with some of his best, and it is notable that of his trio, which features the July 20 G3 Anglesey S. winner and Aug. 24 G2 Gimcrack S. runner-up **Wilshire Boulevard (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), his son Joseph has opted to ride **Giovanni Boldini** (War Front). Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's beau ideal was only seen for the first time a week ago, and was notably green when winning a conditions race over this trip on Dundalk's Polytrack, so his inclusion in this line-up speaks volumes for the regard in which he is held.

ROCK SOLID?

Despite his serious accomplishments already, there is a sense that the major tests lay ahead for Khalid Abdullah's **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) and he heads to Longchamp today to prep for the Arc in the G2 Qatar Prix Niel. Successful in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris over this track and trip July 13, the homebred was impressive in that contest, but the form appears dubious at present, and that race can be less than competitive for its grade. Taking him on is Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's G1 Epsom Derby winner **Ruler of the World (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), but he is another who may be flattered by winning a weak renewal of a prestigious race. He has not been seen since trailing in fifth in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh June 29, but if he is back on his best form, he is closely matched with Flintshire on a line through Prince Faisal's **Ocovango (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}). "He's in good form and is ready, having had a nice break," trainer Aidan O'Brien said. "He has handled cut in the ground and we'd like to get him out provided the ground isn't bad." Ocovango was virtually the same distance behind both colts when fifth at Epsom and third in the Grand Prix de Paris and met trouble on both occasions, but it may be that Andre Fabre, whose 10 winners of this longstanding trial for the autumn showpiece include the subsequent Arc heros Trempolino, Subotica (Fr), Carnegie (Ire), Sagamix (Fr), Hurricane Run (Ire) and Rail Link (GB), has something of more interest in **Triple Threat (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}). Team Valor and Gary Barber's homebred seems to have overcome his issues with the stalls and brushed aside **Pilote (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}) in the 10-furlong G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte July 21. That form was boosted when the runner-up was second fiddle again behind another Fabre trainee in **Vancouverite (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) in Deauville's G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano also over that trip Aug. 15. In an unusually deep renewal of this contest, it is impossible to ignore Shinji Maeda's **Kizuna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}). Prepared by Shozo Sasaki for this project since winning the May 26 G1 Tokyo Yushun, he will be fulfilling a personal dream for Yutaka Take if he can better his sire's effort in the main event in three weeks' time. "He's where he should be for a trial, I'd say at about 85%," Sasaki commented. "I'm looking forward to seeing how well he can do. The Arc almost always favors 3-year-olds. Kizuna is mentally strong and can handle all the difficulties that go along with racing overseas."

ORFEVRE FEVER

Widely considered to be unlucky not to have won last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, **Orfevre (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}) is back at Longchamp to begin putting matters right as he warms up for his latest tilt at that feature in today's G2 Qatar Prix Foy. Runner-up in the Nov. 25 G1 Japan Cup and successful in the G2 Sankei Osaka Hai S. at Hanshin Mar. 31, Sunday Racing's wildly talented but wayward performer has not enjoyed a perfect build-up, as he has bled at home and recently suffered a kick to his nose by his work companion. "Last year, he acclimatized to his surroundings immediately and this year is the same," Yasutoshi Ikee explained. "He remembered it all himself and found the environment familiar. He's a year older and he's more powerful. After the Osaka Hai, things weren't easy but I see his movement and how his heart and lungs are now and there are no problems. We had a lot of trouble this year but, going into a trial, I'd say he's in relatively good shape." One interesting rival to overcome as he bids for back-to-back renewals is **Camelot (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who was almost retired after his second straight defeat in 2013 when fourth in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 19. Derrick Smith, Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's colt, who almost landed a Triple Crown on this weekend 12 months ago, has been given another chance to redeem his reputation, which was dented initially by a seventh placing in the Arc, that preceded a serious bout of colic. Having reportedly taken a long time to recover from that life-threatening attack, he has a clean sheet to work from now but it remains to be seen whether his 3-year-old exploits took place against a crop of limited ability. "The plan is to run, but we're not going to run him in bad ground," trainer Aidan O'Brien warned yesterday. "We're going to go over and walk it first and make the decision." Pearl Bloodstock's reliable **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}) returns from a holiday, having chased home the subsequent G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. and G1 Grosser Preis von Baden hero Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) in the June 23 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. "It was a good run last time, especially with the way Novellist won at Ascot, and I'm hoping he can run well on Sunday," trainer Mikel Delzangles told *PA Sport*. "After that, we will know which way we go next, if we go to the Arc or if we go back to Australia."

Runner-up to the top-class Duntle (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the G2 Duke of Cambridge S. over a testing mile at Royal Ascot June 19, she filled the same spot behind Gifted Girl (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}) in the Listed Pipalong S. July 9, and that form was franked when the winner returned to finish second in the Beverly D. Well-beaten when third in the Listed Lyric S. at York July 26, she exits a dead-heat success in the G3 Atalanta S. Aug. 31. **Moment of Majesty** (Saint Liam) needs to run faster than she has of late, but a projected above-par pace could enhance her exotics chances. Seventh in this test 12 months ago, the 6-year-old returns to the grass off a third, beaten a neck, in the Aug. 25 Belle Mahone S. over the Polytrack.

Unbeaten since joining the ranks at Ballydoyle, he should be able to extend that sequence against a collection of largely-exposed rivals here. One who could emerge as a threat is Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Fort Knox (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who has to rebound from two disappointing efforts, having annexed the Apr. 14 G3 Leopardstown 2,000 Guineas Trial. "I thought we were going to have a good year with him, because in recent years the ground has been nothing but soft in Ireland, but we've had to wait," trainer and jockey Johnny Murtagh said. "He's in good form and did a good piece of work the other day. He's very fit and very well and his preparation has gone well. He's progressed from earlier in the year and is more mature." 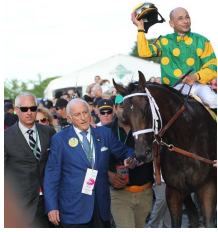

NO SLOW DOWN DURING BOOK 2 OPENER

Spurred by a whopping 51 horses that sold for \$200,000 or more, yesterday's fifth session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale--the first of two days of Book 2--produced another round of sparkling figures. When comparing session-to-session figures (session five in 2012, comprised of hips 1,048-1,463, versus session five in 2013, comprised of hips 867-1299), the average soared 44.7%, from \$87,132 to \$126,100. The boost in median was even more impressive, jumping 60.7%, from \$70,000 to \$112,500. The RNA rate was perhaps a touch above normal, checking in at 27.5%.

One of the most encouraging signs for Keeneland officials was the continued depth of the market. Bob LaPenta's Whitehorse Stables was the session's leading buyer, with six purchased for \$1,835,000 (\$305,833 average), while Florida horseman Nick de Meric acquired eight horses for \$1,150,000 (\$143,750 average). But there were at least 44 other separate buying groups who purchases grossed \$250,000 or more yesterday.

Fillies with attractive pedigrees remained hot commodities at September, and the session was led by a Tapit half-sister to SW Aquapazza (Stormy Atlantic) who sold to Whitehorse for \$475,000. The filly was offered as [hip 1103](#) by Gainesway, which sold four of the session's top eight horses and was the day's leading consignor, with 25 sold for \$4,840,000 (\$193,600 average). Five of the top seven prices on the day were realized by fillies, including a pair from Gainesway that traced back to the Broodmare of the Year Courtly Dee (Never Bend).

"Things are very good," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "The sale continued on as we hope and anticipated. The format of Book 1 left a lot of buyers unable to fulfill their orders, and they came out swinging today. It was solid all the way through. The [rise in] median was quite dramatic, which shows the money is being spread around to everybody. That's something we like. We'll try to do it again tomorrow."

Book 2's second session gets underway this morning at 10:00. For results, catalog and outs, visit www.keeneland.com.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

TAPIT FILLY FOR LAPENTA

Bob LaPenta's Whitehorse Stables went to \$475,000 to secure a daughter of leading sire Tapit ([hip 1103](#)) during Saturday's first session of Keeneland September's Book 2. The gray filly, consigned by her breeder Gainesway, was Whitehorse's ninth purchase of the sale and its most expensive. She is out of Seeinsbelieven (Carson City) and is a half to stakes-winner Aquapazza (Stormy Atlantic).

"She is a nice filly with a very solid pedigree and she has a chance to make that pedigree even better," commented LaPenta's racing manager John Panagot. "Out of a Carson City mare, she looks like she has a chance to run early and win early. She is a great physical. She looks like a real runner, a real athlete, with a great walk."

The filly will spend the winter in Ocala with Niall Brennan before joining Chad Brown's stable next year.

Panagot previously worked for trainer Graham Motion and has been with LaPenta since April 2012.

"After college, I worked for the Saratoga Special newspaper during the meet with Sean and Joe Clancy," the 27-year-old explained. "I met Graham there. I worked for Graham for about 3 1/2 years as a stable manager, finding races for their horses and reading the condition book for them and booking jockeys. Obviously, we won the GI Kentucky Derby at Graham's with Animal Kingdom and I got a little exposure and I was lucky enough to meet Mr. LaPenta and he offered me a job to be his racing manager."

Of the 10 yearlings LaPenta has bought so far at Keeneland September, two have been fillies. In addition to the Tapit filly, Whitehorse paid \$420,000 ([hip 1245](#)) and \$400,000 for a pair of colts by Tiznow ([hip 239](#)); and \$385,000 for a son of Medaglia d'Oro ([hip 386](#)).

"We want to expand the stable a little bit," Panagot explained. "We're mainly looking for colts, but the idea is 1 1/4-mile dirt horses, Classic-style horses with the pedigree to go that far. Which is what he's always done. He's a prominent guy in the game and he's had a lot of luck with that angle and there are certain stallions he's had luck with, too, so we're sticking with them."

LaPenta has often re-offered his yearling purchases at the 2-year-old sales, but Panagot said the plan is to race this year's yearling purchases.

"We're not going to pinhook this year," he said. "These horses are all going to run. We're in it for the action. He's a sportsman and we're going to try to get our name in the entries a little bit more."

Gaineway's Tapit has been represented by four seven-figure yearlings at the five-day old Keeneland September sale. During Saturday's session of the auction, the Lexington nursery offered three homebred yearlings by its star stallion. Leading the way was a gray filly out of Seeinsbelieven (Carson City) who brought a final bid of \$475,000 from Bob LaPenta's Whitehorse Stables. Gaineway purchased Seeinsbelieven for \$270,000 out of the 2008 Keeneland November sale. The yearling's full-brother was purchased for \$425,000 out of this sale in 2011.

"She's a gray Tapit to come off the farm, the same as [Grade I winners] Zazu and Careless Jewel," said Gaineway's Michael Herson. "This filly was bred on a similar cross to that of Zazu, being out of a Mr. Prospector-line mare. So she has strong female family behind her. She got very popular at the barn and scoped in the area of 10 times and she started to really catch people's eyes. She showed very well. We are delighted with the price and hope she emulates those other Gaineway graduates and becomes a noted runner."

Also Saturday, a colt by Tapit out of Livin Lovin (Birdstone) ([hip 978](#)), who was purchased by Gainesway for \$225,000 at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton November sale, brought \$250,000 from Energy Solutions. A filly by the stallion out of Sindy with an S (Broken Vow) ([hip 1121](#)), who was a \$250,000 purchase at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton November sale, sold for \$250,000 to Mersad Metanovic Bloodstock.

Seeinsbelieven and Livin Lovin both produced Tapit foals this past spring, while Sindy with an S has a 2-year-old Tapit colt named I'll Wrap It Up who was recently third on debut at Del Mar. She had a Giant's Causeway colt this spring.

Hernon admitted the trio were purchased with Tapit in mind. Asked what the farm looked for when buying mares for the stallion, Hernon said, "You'd like to buy graded stakes runners, if possible, they are harder to come by now, and mares that are going to physically suit him. You'd like mares from the Mr. Prospector, Fappiano male line or the Storm Cat line, particularly, but Tapit is such a versatile stallion, he's produced quality runners and stakes winners from many different stallion lines. But having black-type up close is important--having a mare who has the ability to race at a good level and gain her own black-type. He stands now at a fee that demands quality and that's what we look to bring to him."

Through five sessions, Tapit has had 36 yearlings sell for \$15,280,000, an average of \$424,444 and a median of \$317,500.

"I think Tapit has really now emerged as a serious force and this sale has supported that," Hernon continued. "It is very gratifying, having brought him along from the beginning at \$15,000, and all credit to Tapit himself. He made it initially, he had a champion in his first crop, he was a leading freshman and juvenile sire and he has just continued on at a relentless pace, producing graded stakes winners and improving his mares very significantly to the point that the mares are now coming to his court."

Gainesway also had success Saturday selling on behalf of clients. [Hip 1204](#), a filly by Broken Vow out of Amelia (Dixieland Band) elicited a final bid of \$435,000 from a representative of Borges Torrealba Holdings. The yearling is a half to graded stakes winner Kindergarden Kid (Dynaformer) and Grade I placed He's Had Enough (Tapit). Gainesway consigned the yearling on behalf of her breeders Helen Alexander, Helen Groves and Dorothy Matz. Bluewater's Mike Levy signed the ticket at \$380,000 on behalf of GEM Stables for [hip 1209](#), a daughter of Harlan's Holiday out of Antics (Unbridled). Gainesway consigned on behalf of breeders Helen Alexander and Helen Groves. The yearling is a half-sister to French stakes-placed Going Day (Daylami).

Keeneland September coverage cont.

Colonel John Kin Brings \$420,000...

The top price for a colt yesterday came for [hip 1245](#), a Tiznow colt from the family of that sire's Grade I-winning son--and now prominent sire--Colonel John who was hammered down for \$420,000. Like the session-topping Tapit filly, the colt was purchased by Bob LaPenta's Whitehorse Stables. The colt was produced by the 11-year-old Caroline's Gold (Touch Gold), a Grade III-placed half-sister to Colonel John, the 2008 GI Travers S. and GI Santa Anita S. winner. Colonel John is currently ranked second on the first-crop sire list by earnings, with his juveniles including the California Grade II winner Concave.

The colt was consigned by Taylor Made Sales on behalf of WinStar Farm, the operation that campaigned and now stands Colonel John. Asked if yesterday's colt reminded him of that one, WinStar's Elliott Walden commented, "Yeah, he does," said Walden. "He's very classy. And then you have what Colonel John's staring at you in the face." It was a good day of selling for WinStar in general. Kenny Troutt's organization also sold [hip 949](#), a filly by Medaglia d'Oro--Jump On In (Jump Start), for \$340,000 to Hill 'n' Dale's Donato Lanni. On the buying side, WinStar's acquisitions yesterday included [hip 1265](#), a colt by Mineshaft--Court of Appeal (Deputy Minister), who sold for \$400,000. Bluewater Sales offered the half-sibling to Grade II winner Authenticity (Quiet American). "It's been a good horse sale," said Walden.

Full-Sis to Afleet Alex Brings \$400,000...

The 19-year-old mare Maggy Hawk (Hawkster) has shown a particular affinity for Northern Afleet. She's been sent to the Taylor Made stallion twice and produced two stakes winners, including the brilliant dual Classic winner and champion 3-year-old colt Afleet Alex. She also produced SW & MGSP Unforgettable Max. In addition, one of her daughters, the 14-year-old Jolie Hawk (Mister Jolie), has visited Northern Afleet three times, and produced a pair of stakes horses, including the fast MSW & GSP Cash's Girl, an earner of \$320,000.

So after being bred to pricier stallions like Storm Cat, Awesome Again and Unbridled's Song in recent years, Maggy Hawk was returned to Northern Afleet in 2011, a mating that produced yesterday's standout [hip 984](#), a daughter who sold to Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm for \$400,000.

The filly was consigned by Three Chimneys Sales, on behalf of Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings.

"When the mare's been sent to Northern Afleet, she's produced a racehorse," said Pope. "Both of those have been colts, so let's hope it's not just Northern Afleet colts she does well with. But that's why I liked her; she's a full to two very good horses. She has the same physique as Afleet Alex, though she's smaller and lighter boned. But she looks very much like the sire and like Afleet Alex."

It was actually the second filly out of Maggy Hawk that Pope has purchased. In 2009, she purchased a Storm Cat filly out of the mare named Divine Diamond for \$300,000. Divine Diamond is now part of Pope's broodmare band at the Ocala-based Whisper Hill.

"This filly's already on her way to Florida, and hopefully she'll become a racehorse and join the broodmare band, too," said Pope.

Pope indicated she was close to being done shopping at Keeneland, and would spend the next few days visiting her mares and foals at Taylor Made and Timber Town Stud. The latter is home to her big 2012 purchases: the \$10 million Horse of the Year Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) and the \$4.2 million Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro). Havre de Grace is in foal to Tapit; Plum Pretty was bred to Distorted Humor.

Busy Day for Red-Hot Donegal Racing...

Donegal Racing's Jerry Crawford was a busy man yesterday at Keeneland. The racing syndicate's managing partner signed for five colts, pushing Donegal's September total to eight. They were:

- \$290,000 colt by Lemon Drop Kid--Panthera (Storm Cat) from Gainesway ([hip 1035](#)). A half-brother to SW Anegada (Arch), the colt is a grandson of Queena (Mr. Prospector) and was produced by a half to GISW Brahms (Danzig), GSW La Reina (A.P. Indy) and SW Olympic (Danzig). Bred by Emory Hamilton.
- \$250,000 colt by Malibu Moon--Instant Coverage (Storm Cat) from Taylor Made Sales Agency ([hip 938](#)). Out of a half to GSP Talullah Lula (Old Trieste), he hails from the family of Jump Start and Miswaki. Bred by WinStar Farm.
- \$200,000 colt by Awesome Again--Zaraffa (Mizzen Mast) from Bacarri Bloodstock ([hip 1194](#)). The colt's out of a winning daughter of GSW Out of Reach (GB) (Warning {GB}), and was representing a smart pinhook for Chris Baccari, who purchased him for \$62,000 last year at KEENOV.
- \$120,000 colt by Curlin--Medomak (Awesome Again) from Three Chimneys Sales ([hip 992](#)). Produced by a half to GSW Coal Play (Mineshaft), he's from the family of GISW Serra Lake (Seattle Slew), MGSW Cappuchino (Capote), etc. Bred by Glencrest Farm, he was making his second trip to the Keeneland ring after being purchased by \$48,000 as a weanling by Chesapeake Bloodstock last year.
- \$100,000 colt by Kitten's Joy--Virginia Reel (Gone West) from Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency ([hip 992](#)).

Earlier in the sale, Crawford also signed for two colts by Giant's Causeway, for \$260,000 and \$125,000, respectively, and a Harlan's Holiday colt for \$260,000. In all, Donegal's outlay has been \$1,245,000.

While it's unlikely the Donegal team paid for the horses straight from their winnings from last week's GIII Iroquois S. at Churchill, they at very least paid for shipping expenses...for the next few years. Donegal and trainer Dale Romans teamed to send out the Iroquois 1-2, comprised of the rank outsiders **Cleburne** (Dixie Union) and **Smart Cover** (Any Given Saturday). Cleburne, at 34-1, beat the 26-1 Smart Cover by a neck, keying a \$500 exacta. The \$2 trifecta paid \$4,256.80. Moreover, it gave Cleburne 10 points and Smart Cover 4 on the Road to the 2014 Kentucky Derby qualifying system.

"It was spectacular for a lot of reasons," said Crawford during a break in the action yesterday. "First, the odds were outrageously generous. Second, as soon as Churchill Downs announced the Derby points schedule for this year, and we saw the Iroquois as the first points race, we picked races for three of our horses based on that race. So we sent Cleburne and Smart Cover around a route of ground on the grass to really leg them up. They're both dirt horses, but both were good enough to prevail on the turf [in respective maiden wins]. But, you don't get good speed figures at Ellis, no matter what, and so even though they were really the only two coming off wins around two turns, they were completely overlooked. That made the night more exciting and more fun; when people leave with pockets stuffed with \$100 bills, they tend to get a little jazzed up. And then, of course, to be the first horse to arguably qualify for the 2014 Derby is tremendously exciting."

Getting to the Derby is the stated goal of Donegal Racing, which calls its annual partnerships Derby Dreams. Donegal's horses generally fit a profile. They are colts by sires proven to get two-turn runners, or, if the sire tends to throw more speed, the horses hail from stouter female families.

"They won't be on our list unless they have one or both qualifications--ideally both," said Crawford. "Smart Cover, for instance, is easily a 1 1/4-mile horse. With Cleburne, he's bred well enough for the distance, but then has the cardio to go along with it. We think both will get better as the distances get longer."

At the sales, Crawford personally goes through the catalog to create a "long list" of prospects. "I've created an algorithm that measures our view of a horse who will have the quality and the stamina to be successful in the Classic races," he said.

Then the rest of the Donegal team steps in. It includes Crawford's son Conor Crawford, a participant in the Darley Flying Start program, and another Flying Starter who acts as Donegal's Chief Operation Officer, Conor Foley. Bloodstock agent Jim Hatchet offers advice. Dr. John Garrity handles Donegal's vet work, while EQB's Patti Miller does heart scans.

Frank Smith, who owns and operates the Ellore Training Center in Ellore, South Carolina, which breaks and trains all of Donegal's horses, is also an integral team member. Finally, once a short list is created, Dale Romans comes in for the final evaluation.

It's all part of a system that has seen Donegal place third in two of the last four Derbys: with **Dullahan** (Even the Score) in 2012 and **Paddy O'Prado** (El Prado {Ire}) in 2010.

"Our strike rate has been through the roof," said Crawford. "I think this compliments our entire team. It takes a plan, and a team to execute it, and I think we have both."

Much of Donegal's success has come with Keeneland September grads. Book 2 coverboy Dullahan was a \$250,000 purchase here in 2010. Paddy O'Prado was a \$105,000 buy two years earlier. Cleburne cost \$310,000 a year ago. (Smart Cover, meanwhile, was a savvy \$35,000 FTKJUL pick-up.)

Crawford said he's been impressed with offerings at the current September renewal.

"The quality of the stock has been sensational," he said. "I'm really, really excited for American breeders, consignors and sales companies. There's been a lot of unfair criticism of the American breeding industry, particularly from some malcontents overseas—including a columnist from the *TDN*--and they've been proven incredibly wrong by the results of this sale and particularly by the strong participation of international buyers. It's hats off to American breeders. They produce a terrific product, and the results of this sale prove it."

As for what's next, Crawford said that Smart Cover will start next in the GI Breeders' Futurity S. here at Keeneland Oct. 5, while Cleburne will train up to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile S. at Santa Anita.

"We asked a lot of him in the Iroquois, because that was only his second career race, and it came only three weeks after his first," Crawford said of Cleburne. "So I think going easy with him is the right way to go. He'll stay in Kentucky until a week before the Breeders' Cup."

Crawford also left open the option of not going to the Breeders' Cup at all. Not because his horses might not be ready, but because of how the track played last year during the Championships.

"Last year, it was horribly unfair, and if it's as speed-favoring as it was in 2012, we won't go," he asserted. "But they've done work to the track, and I'm hopeful that it will be a fairer surface. It was embarrassing last year. I have to say, I won a lot of money betting on Fort Larned because of that! But still..."

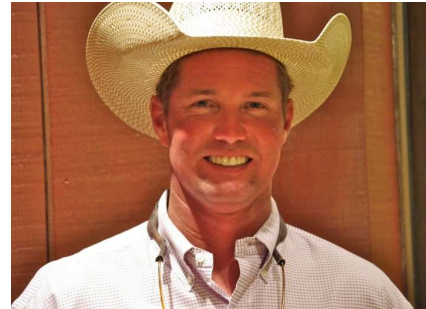
Other juveniles from Donegal's latest crop include **Culprit** (Street Sense), a \$70,000 KEESEP buy who ran third in his seven-furlong debut at Churchill Sept. 7; and **Oogeley Eye** (Afleet Alex), another \$70,000 KEESEP purchase who rallied from well back to finish second in a six-furlong Churchill maiden on Friday.

Crawford said Donegal will continue to shop through today's Book 2 finale before calling it a day.

Pinhooking Score for Stoney Lane...

It was a long wait for Stoney Lane Farm's Stuart Turlington, but [hip 1265](#) made it worthwhile, selling late in Saturday's session of the Keeneland September sale for \$400,000 to the bid of Maverick Racing. Turlington had purchased the colt by Mineshaft for \$50,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale.

"We thought he would sell well, but we didn't think it would be that big," Turlington admitted. "We had some

big updates and he was just a nice horse, but we didn't think it would go that good."

The bay colt, consigned by Bluewater Sales, is out of Court of Appeal (Deputy Minister) and is a half-brother to Authenticity (Quiet American), recently runner-up in this

summer's GI Ogden Phipps H. and GI Personal Ensign H.

Asked what he liked about the bay colt as a weanling, Turlington explained, "I thought he had a lot of scope and he was a pretty kind of horse. He was a great mover with a nice walk."

Turlington grew up going to horse sales with his father in North Carolina.

"I've been doing this since I was a kid with my dad," he said. "I was always going to the sales with my dad, we did a bunch of Maryland, Timonium sales, when we were in North Carolina."

Turlington purchased Stoney Lane Farm near Lexington to ship mares to foal in the Bluegrass while he was still living in North Carolina. He came for what was supposed to be a brief stay 13 years ago and has been here ever since.

"We had a guy quit one day back in 2000, so I came out just for a couple months and I've been here for 13 years. I love it here," Turlington said.

Stoney Lane Farm no longer has broodmares and primarily pinhooks weanlings to yearlings. Turlington estimated the operation will look to pinhook 10 to 12 youngsters a year.

"We do some 2-year-old sales and some racing," he added.

Still beaming from his success, Turlington said, "Days like today are great."

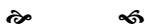
