## AUSTRALIA BANS ANABOLIC STEROIDS

The Australian Racing Board has announced that it will ban the use of anabolic steroids both in and out of competition. The new rule, which will be introduced Nov. 1 and become effective May 1, 2014, will allow six months for treated horses to be free of steroids. The ban will apply to all horses above six months of age while racing, training or spelling. Under current rules, Australian Thoroughbreds must be steroid free on race-day, but the medications are allowed out of competition. "The Australian Racing Board has adopted a zero-tolerance policy to the use of anabolic steroids in competition, training, and spelling, and will institute heavy penalties for breaches of the ban," ARB Chief Executive Peter McGauran said. "The ban on anabolic steroids goes far beyond any other racing jurisdiction outside of Europe and was decided by the ARB Board after lengthy consideration of veterinary and scientific advice and consultation with trainers' and owners' associations. Foremost in the board's consideration was the need for absolute integrity and public confidence in racing. Although the use of steroids has greatly diminished over the years to the point where they are rarely relied upon by trainers, the ARB believes it is in the best interests of the industry that they no longer be available for purposes other than as a therapeutic treatment for young foals." Paul Bittar, Chief Executive of the British Horseracing Authority, welcomed the news, and told *Racing Post*, "The Australian Racing Board's decision is very good news and represents a significant step towards our goal of seeing the use of anabolic steroids for racehorses banned across the globe. We will be submitting a paper outlining our position ahead of the IFHA conference in October and we look forward to the matter being discussed next month in Paris." Louis Romanet, Chairman of the International Federation of Horse Racing Authorities, was also supportive, stating, "I welcome and applaud this announcement by the ARB stating a total ban on the use of anabolic steroids both in and out of competition. The ARB is to be commended for this historical decision. Additionally, I look forward to further discussion on this matter among all IFHA members countries to further two key objectives of the IFHA--to coordinate and harmonize the rules of the member countries regarding breeding, racing and wagering and to ensure the quality and fairness of racing in the interest of both breeding and the public."

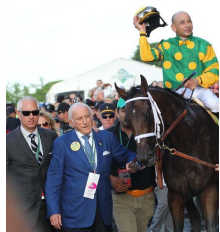

## KEENELAND SEPTEMBER Yearling Sale

Sept. 9-12 • 12 p.m.  
14-21st • 10 a.m.

### HIGHEST SEPTEMBER GROSS SINCE 2008

With five sessions remaining, the Keeneland September Yearling Sale has achieved its highest gross since 2008. The sale continued with a seventh session yesterday, and the momentum generated by Books 1 and 2 carried into the Book 3 opener to help push gross sales to \$236,874,000, from 1,408 horses sold. Last year, 2,516 horses sold for \$219,723,000; in 2008, the year the Great Recession hit, the gross was \$327,999,100.

With several big-name end users still active--Shadwell, Fox Hill Farms, the West stable's Ben Glass and Stonestreet Stables all signed for horses--and plenty of new faces buying, yesterday's session average of \$68,329 was up 52% from last year's corresponding session. The session median of \$57,000 was up 54.1%. In 2012, the average was \$44,963; the median was \$37,000.

The cumulative average at September now stands at \$168,235. That's up 33.5% from last year's average of \$125,998. The cumulative median of \$115,000 is up 43.8%.

The session RNA rate was a very healthy 19.6%; the cumulative RNA rate stands at 24.9%.

Topping the session was [hip 1949](#), a colt by Stormy Atlantic--Swanky Bubbles (Ascot Knight) who sold to Conquest Stables for \$330,000. Hill 'n' Dale Agency consigned. The next-highest-price came for [hip 1886](#), a filly by Afleet Alex--Rich Find (Exploit) who sold to Gainesway for \$320,000. Upson Downs Farm consigned the filly.

Last year's seventh session was topped by a \$280,000 Diva Style (Unbridled's Song), who was the lone horse on the day to clear the \$200,000 barrier. (Diva Style, a filly, is unraced but in training at Belmont Park.) In all, 19 horses in 2012 brought six figures.

By way of comparison, two horses sold for more than \$300,000 yesterday, and another six made more than \$200,000. In all, a whopping 62 brought six figures--more than three times as many as last year.

**Conquest Comes Away with \$330,000 Colt...**

Ernie Semersky and Dory Newell's Conquest Stables got a big boost this weekend when the unraced 2-year-old filly My Conquestadory (Artie Schiller) beat the boys in the \$205,000 GII TVG Summer S. at Woodbine, a victory that punched her "Win and You're In" ticket to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Santa Anita. The man that selected the filly and trains her, Mark Casse, was back to work yesterday for the upstart operation, pegging down the session-topping Stormy Atlantic colt for \$330,000. The Ontario-bred colt is a half to Bubbles to the Top (Bold Executive) and is from the family of MGISW Schossberg. Hill 'n' Dale Sales consigned him as [hip 1949](#).

Buying for the first time in earnest this spring, Conquest was one of the leading buyers at the juvenile-in-training sales, and has continued to figure prominently on the sales sheets at the yearling sales. Conquest bought three horses for \$820,000 at FTKJUL and, after skipping FTSAUG and OBSAUG, has purchased six thus far at KEESEP for a total of a \$1,130,000. The Stormy Atlantic colt was Conquest's priciest KEESEP purchase.

Casse has done exceptionally well for Conquest thus far. According to brisnet.com, Conquest has six juveniles to race this year. Three have already broken their maidens... in stakes company. In addition to My Conquestadory, Conquest Whiplash (Hear No Evil) won the \$150,000 Victoria S. in her own debut in June, while Conquest Titan (Birdstone) graduated in his second career start when dominating the \$125,000 Swynford S. by 5 1/4 lengths Aug. 24. All three wins came at Woodbine.

"Knock on wood, we've done well so far," said Casse. "I don't think Ernie does anything slow, so he and Dory went out and put their money up and bought some horses, and luckily it's worked out okay."

Casse confirmed My Conquestadory will likely start next in the GI Alcibiades S. here at Keeneland Oct. 4. Conquest Titan is targeting the GIII Grey S. a Woodbine Oct. 6. Casse is hoping to make the Breeders' Cup with both. He's taking his time, meanwhile, with Conquest Whiplash, who tired as the favorite in her latest.

**Session Topper for Josham...**

Yesterday's \$330,000 Stormy Atlantic topper, from the 11-year-old Ascot Knight mare Swanky Bubbles, was bred by Ted Burnett's Josham Farms. The Canadian-based businessman was on hand to watch the colt sell.

"He's very muscular, correct, and looked like he'd be an early 2-year-old," Burnett assessed. "He vetted absolutely clean, and his scope was A+. Everything about him was attractive, and he was very classy."

Burnett purchased dam Swanky Bubbles as a yearling for about \$68,000 at the 2003 FTCSEP sale. She didn't earn black-type for him, but was a hard-knocking check-getter who banked nearly \$75,000. Her true worth, though, has come in the breeding shed.

Burnett sold her first foal, Bubbles to the Top, for about \$70,000 at the 2009 ONTSEP sale, and she's gone on to place in three stakes and earn over \$275,000. Swanky Bubbles's second foal sadly died in a training accident; this colt was her third. The mare has an Old Forester filly on the ground and is back in foal to Zensational. "And she'll go back to Stormy Atlantic next year," said Burnett. **Cont. p6**

Burnett is the president of his family's Burnac Corporation, a one-man trucking company 60 years ago that grew into massive Toronto-based corporation whose interests include commercial real estate and food distribution.

A lawyer by education, Burnett maintains a broodmare band of about 20, generally split between John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale operation in Kentucky and Yvonne Schwabe's Persley Den Farms in Canada. Schwabe, who was all smiles after yesterday's sale, raised the Stormy Atlantic colt.

Josham is primarily a commercial operation. "We'll race what we can't sell," Burnett explained. "And we'll buy the odd filly at the yearling sales and try to get some black-type, and then put her in the broodmare band. We're always culling and improving."

**For Upson Downs, Mare's Been a Rich Find...**

Gainesway's Antony Beck saw off a challenge from bloodstock agent Lincoln Collins to land the session's top-priced filly, an Afleet Alex half-sister to the good 3-year-old filly Broken Spell (Broken Vow), for \$320,000. The filly was produced by the stakes winner Rich Find (Exploit), a half-sister to the dam of the brilliant but ill-fated GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song). It's the extended family of Belong to Me (Danzig).

The filly was consigned by the Rankin family's Upson Downs Farms, based in Goshen, Kentucky. She sold as [hip 1886](#).

Upson Downs's history with the mare goes back 11 years. Along with partner Joseph Fowler and a few other minor partners, they purchased Rich Find for \$52,000 as a KEESEP yearling. The partnership, racing under the banner of Fowler's Shadowfax Stable, sent the filly to trainer Greg Foley and enjoyed some success. Rich Find won five times and earned \$145,000, with her victories including the Oliver S. at Indiana Downs in 2004.

Rich Find was just beginning her next career as a broodmare when, in 2008, her pedigree got a huge boost when close relative Eight Belles won the GI Fantasy S. and ran second to Big Brown (Boundary) in the Derby (she suffered a fatal breakdown shortly after the wire).

Rich Find proved she herself could get a Grade I-caliber horse in the form of her third foal, Broken Spell, who ran second in last year's GI Darley Alcibiades S. and more recently ran second in the My Princess Jess S. at Saratoga. Upson Downs sold Broken Spell for \$85,000 as a KEESEP yearling in 2011; she later brought \$175,000 as a juvenile-in-training.

Upson Downs patriarch Alex Rankin said it's been fun watching the family develop over the past decade. "That's the business we're in," he said. "You hope you can improve the family."

Asked about the decision to breed to Afleet Alex--who stands at Gainesway--Rankin explained, "We thought it was a good cross, and at that time, he was a sire who was getting all kinds of runners at different levels of the game. He's cooled off a little now, but he's a very solid sire."

Rankin said the filly was a standout on the sales grounds. "She's got a big walk, great size and a great temperament," he said. "She's very classy, and she looks like she might be a two-turn horse that could have a chance at winning some really nice races. That's what the buyers really liked about her, that she might be a two-turn horse that could possibly get them to the Classic-type races."

When Rankin's son Hunter came over to inform him that it was Antony Beck who signed the winning slip, Alex Rankin laughed and said, "He's in the same barn as us--so he kept seeing her come out! But listen, you never know when they're going to break out like that, and that was really fun."

# TDN **Q&A**

## BILL FARISH, BREEDERS' CUP BOARD CHAIRMAN

Serving as the chairman of the Breeders' Cup board of directors can be a tough, contentious, sometimes thankless job. No one knows this better than Lane's End's Bill Farish, who spent five years in the position between 2006-11. Before stepping down, Farish oversaw some of the biggest changes in Breeders' Cup history, including the shift to a two-day format in 2007. Farish was succeeded by Tom Ludt, who held the chairmanship until this past April, when he was named senior vice president of the Stronach Group and announced he wouldn't seek reappointment.

In August, Farish, who had remained as a Breeders' Cup director, was once again elected as chairman, and has begun a two-year term that puts him back in one of the most visible positions in Thoroughbred racing.

It also puts him right in the middle of some of racing's biggest battles, namely the fight between pro- and anti-Lasix advocates. The Breeders' Cup took criticism earlier this year when it announced that, in a rollback from a plan to ban Lasix in all 2013 Breeders' Cup races, it would once again extend the ban only to juvenile races--the policy in place in 2012. Oliver Tait, Darley's chief operating officer, resigned from the Breeders' Cup board in protest.

The issue arose again in August when the Breeders' Cup, in response to heavy pressure from horsemen's groups, announced that all horses running in the 2014 Breeders' Cup races, to be held for the third-straight year at Santa Anita, will be allowed to run on the anti-bleeding medication. That was after California horsemen threatened to withhold approval for the simulcasting of the event. An op-ed in the British newspaper *The Guardian* called the decision "spineless."

That Santa Anita will host the Breeders' Cup for three straight years, and five times in seven years, has also drawn criticism, particularly from East Coast-based owners and trainers who fear it gives California horsemen too much of a home-field

advantage. **Cont. p10**

All isn't gloom and doom, however. The Breeders' Cup drew near-universal praise when, in March, it decided to award travel allowances to all participants shipping from outside of California for this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships at Santa Anita Nov. 1-2. Owners of horses shipping from outside of North America to the Championships will receive a \$40,000 travel allowance, and owners of domestic horses shipping to California will receive a \$10,000 travel allowance. In addition, the Breeders' Cup reduced entry fees for its Championships races from 3% to 2% of the purse.

With all this on the table, Farish has a challenging job ahead of him. Earlier this week, he sat down with the TDN's Lucas Marquardt to talk about those challenges, and said he's ready to roll up his sleeves and get to work.

**TDN: Congratulations on being named chairman of the Breeders' Cup once again. The board has had a tumultuous year, with several resignations, a delayed site announcement and controversy over the Lasix reversal. Tell us why you decided to take on this responsibility again, at this particular time.**

**BF:** When Tom [Ludt] took over two years ago, he said, 'Bill! Why didn't you warn me about this?' And so I'm really the crazy one going back in, knowing what I'm getting myself into. But it's a very exciting time. We're well-positioned to do some very exciting things for the sport. Any time an organization takes on big issues, there are going to be differing opinions, and the Breeders' Cup is certainly an area that attracts different views. The key for us, for me, is to build consensus, and I think that's what I did best the first time around, and I hope I can do it again.

**TDN: There have been a lot of changes to this year's event, but let's first talk about the similarities. We're back at Santa Anita. Why was that decision reached?**

**BF:** Obviously, it's drawn a fair amount of interest from people. Site selection is a big decision we have to make, and there are a lot of things that go into that--weather, amenities, hotel availability, competing events locally and nationally, television windows, actual date availability in that market, and the economic viability of the tracks in the markets we're looking at.

One of the positives about Santa Anita is that there have been a lot of capital improvements there; they continue to upgrade their facilities. Being in California, we can also have the [GI Breeders' Cup] Classic in prime time, and our network partner [NBC] is quite happy to be running the Classic in prime time on national television. There are a lot things that came together to make Santa Anita the obvious choice for *those* years. But we'll continue to look at different venues in 2015 and beyond.

**TDN: The Breeders' Cup has found itself a flashpoint of criticism due to its Lasix reversal, much of it coming from overseas. Looking back, would you do anything differently? And what's your opinion on the decision?**

**BF:** Right now there are some people thinking long-term, and some people thinking short-term.

We need to get those two together, and it's a great time for the Breeders' Cup to tackle these issues. It's too bad we have them, but I think we're in a unique position of leadership in the industry to address them. We have an outstanding management team and staff, and they're going to help lead us through that. We would like nothing more than to achieve medication uniformity, both nationally and internationally. Ideally, we would like to hold our event under the same rules as other major international events, but in this country, horsemen's organizations have an effective veto, given by the Interstate Horseracing Act.

We were in a very difficult spot. Everyone likes to call it a reversal, but the writing was on the wall. There are some things we can do by house rules, and others we can't. It's easy for people to say we were 'spineless,' but you have to look at the facts. We've always taken a leadership role in issues of safety and integrity, and we will continue to advocate those view in the hopes of convincing horsemen of the long-term vision of running medication-free.

**TDN: Recently, Ireland announced it would join Britain in staging a fall Champions Day. International festivals are growing in strength and number. How do you feel about the Breeders' Cup's position in the marketplace, and what are you doing to make sure you remain competitive?**

**BF:** I think the more opportunities for owners who have top horses to run for big purses at big events the better, both internationally and in this country. We're happy there are more big events out there. We think we're well-positioned with 14 races worth \$27 million in purses and awards this year. We think we have a good spot on the calendar, late in the year. But we have to do things to compete with those events, and that's why we have some new things in 2013.

### **Baffert Nabs another Lookin At Lucky...**

Sitting along side client **Bernie Schiappa**, Baffert was on hand at Keeneland yesterday to secure, a filly by five-time Grade 1 winner out of Elissa Beethoven (GB) (Royal Academy), for **\$320,000**. That was the top price paid for a filly Sunday.

"She reminds of Lookin At Lucky--she's a very elegant filly and she looks like she'll go two turns," said Baffert. "We've seen a bunch from the sire we like"

Earlier in the sale, Baffert bought another Lookin At Lucky on Schiappa's behalf, a half-brother to GSW Western Smoke (Smoke Glacken) and GSP A Shin Harbor (Cozzene) who went for **\$490,000**--the top-priced Lookin At Lucky of the sale.

"They all seem to have great minds--and he had a real great mind," Baffert added. "He's throwing a lot of class. We'll have a lot of home bred's out of really nice mares, too, so we're excited."

We have the across-the-board travel awards, and that's something the people I've talked to, both nationally and internationally, are very happy about. Having a \$40,000 stipend to come from Europe and a \$10,000 stipend to come from the U.S. is attractive. I haven't talked to anyone specifically who has said 'I won't come without it,' but I have talked to a number of people who have said it sure makes the decision easier.

We also have reduced entry fees this year; we cut 33% off, from 3% to 2% of the purses. So those are two big steps I think are responses to the international competition, and I think it's good for horsemen all around.

**TDN:** One of the things you seem to be focusing on is a better owner experience. What is on tap for this year, and how will those aspects of enhanced experience continue to grow?

**BF:** No question. It really is one of the things I wanted to address seven years ago. It wasn't a bad participant experience, but we had issues like jockeys not getting a parking space--things that should be well down the list of 'taken care of.' Addressing the overall experience of everybody was a top priority. In 2010, we put together the Enhanced Experience Committee. Roy Jackson, with his baseball experience, and [TDN publisher Barry Weisbord], with his experience and energy, led that effort for us, and I think we've seen a lot of good things come from that. The Breakfast Marquee was very popular, and it will be back this year. The Taste of the World event has been popular. And the winner's enclosure afterwards is really drastically improved. We want the owners of all the horses, including the also-rans, to feel like, 'Hey, we've got to get back there with a horse. That's where we want to be.' And I think we're getting very close to that.

**TDN:** While all racing events like to focus on the celebrities who attend them, the Breeders' Cup seems to take it one step further, working to get those celebrities to help introduce the sport to the public in a broader fashion. Tell us about the Ambassador Program, which was launched last year.

**BF:** The Ambassador Program has really harnessed the excitement you see from people in this sport. When you have a celebrity that has a much greater reach than you or I do, and they have success in the way that Bobby Flay has, or Jim Rome has, it can be a great benefit. I don't know how many people heard the show where [Jim and Bobby talked](#) about the thrill of winning a Breeders' Cup race, but it was just infectious. There's no way it can't get people's attention. Or when Joe Torre won the Pacific Classic [as a co-owner of Game On Dude]. His comments after the race were phenomenal. That's what we're trying to harness, those celebrities that already have the passion. And those guys seem very willing to do that, and have been a tremendous help so far. **Cont. p13**

**TDN: Do you expect Breeders' Cup sponsors to embrace a more integrated role in the event in the future?**

**BF:** It's a key program our new chief marketing and revenue officer Drew Sheinman is focusing on. It's not just getting sponsors, but building a comprehensive global marketing platform for the Breeders' Cup, which incorporates, in addition to world class racing, highly developed elements of broadcast, social media, fashion, luxury and lifestyle, which enhance our event into a captivating international brand. In regards to sponsors, specifically, we want to engage 'best in class' sponsors that will really help with our overall mission, and leveraging their marketing expertise with our sport, choosing partners based on quality over quantity. We want partners who will not only be there the week of the event, but year-round to help promote the sport as well as their product. We think Drew, and his team, are doing a great job of executing this plan, we are excited about our future.

**TDN: At The Round Table this summer, The Jockey Club announced the Fox Sports initiative to get more racing on TV. What are your plans to deliver those viewers through those fall preps and into the Breeders' Cup programming?**

**BF:** The Jockey Club has done a lot of great work trying to promote the sport in the last few years, and we're working with them all the time. We'll continue to do that and try to get more racing on television. We've got some news that will come out in the next couple weeks that we're excited about that will continue that. We certainly want to get as many Breeders' Cup preps on television as possible. We've seen how effective the 'Win and You're In' program is--it's exciting-- and promoting that through television and through digital media is definitely something we'll continue.

**TDN: The Breeders' Cup is an event built on fees from foals and stallions. The foal crop is half of what it was just a few years ago, and there are fewer stallions creating those foals. What does this mean to revenue? How do you replace those fees?**

**BF:** It's a great question. It's had a tremendous effect on revenue. In 1995, we had close to \$20 million in stallion and foal nominations, and we paid \$10 million out in purses. This year, we'll have roughly \$12 million in stallion and foal nominations, and we'll pay \$27 million in purses. So from a nominator's standpoint, you're certainly getting more bang for the buck. We continue to have 95% of stallions that stand for \$5,000 or more nominate to the program. Foal nominations have stayed pretty constant--about 50% of foals in any given year are nominated. We dropped the foal nomination to \$400 if you nominate online, which 85% of people do now. So really, they're paying a little less, and we're performing a lot better in terms of nominations fees to purses and awards.

**TDN:** Under your last tenure, you took the Breeders' Cup from one to two days and from eight to 15 races with \$25 million in purses. What do you want to try to accomplish as chairman this time around, and do you have any similarly bold ideas?

**BF:** I don't know if there's anything that bold in the works [laughs]. That expansion was a response to creating more opportunities for owners and breeders, and I think it's been successful. We think maybe we overstepped with the 15 races, and we dropped back to 14 [eliminating the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint]. It's a small change, but we don't want to cannibalize our races. We'll continue to look at the races we have. We'll also continue to put more emphasis on marketing partners, and on how we're putting the product out. Technology is still developing, and we'll continue to look at how we can use it. We're very excited about being on prime time and network TV.

**TDN:** What is so special about this event?

**BF:** That's an easy one--it represents the best of the best. The best breeding, the best racing, the best customer experience. It can be tough to move around because of all the people, but if you take the time and go around the racetrack at the Breeders' Cup, to see what is happening is pretty amazing. But there's always room for improvement, and we have some exciting new things coming. We'll continue to try and make it the best of the best.

## TRIBUTES PAID TO SIR HENRY CECIL

Many of the great and good of the flat racing scene were in attendance at the memorial service to celebrate the life of Sir Henry Cecil at a packed Ely Cathedral yesterday afternoon. One of the late training legend's favorite pieces of architecture, the venue was chosen by his widow, Lady Jane, to host the public service which followed the private family funeral held at St Agnes Church in Newmarket in June. Also there were racing heavyweights Martin Pipe, Sir Robert Ogden, Lady Howard de Walden and Maria Niarchos, British Horseracing Authority Chief Executive Paul Bittar, Simon Crisford and Clare Balding.

Heading the congregation of staff members were longstanding stalwarts Frank Conlon and Paddy Rudkin, while Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe paid his own tribute.

"If you were asked to paint a mural of the lifetime of Sir Henry Cecil, how on earth would you start this masterpiece?" Grimthorpe said. "To know Henry, you'd have to understand his closest friends were his horses. His maxim was 'to feel our way, and let the horses tell us.' Perhaps Henry's greatest friend was Frankel, with apologies to all the others. Like all great friendships, neither would be the same without the other. He was a completely unique human being, whose legacy is recognized by all those here and by the millions around the world who loved him without even having had the good fortune to meet him."

Cecil's son Jake spoke of the connection the public felt with his father.

"Everyone was treated with the utmost respect by dad," he reflected. "He would find the time to share his personality with whoever crossed his path. They stood by him when he was knocked down and applauded him when he stood back up. They knew he was the embodiment of honesty."

The hour-long service included hymns and recordings of Cecil's interviews and concluded with a Scots Guards piper arranged by his step-brother Arthur Boyd-Rochfort. Two grandchildren, Olivia and Jack Mackenzie, also gave readings, with Olivia saying, "You never gave up and that's something we'll never forget about you. You were the bravest person ever."

## SIR HENRY CECIL REMEMBERED

After a bleak, wet weekend, the sun returned to Newmarket on Monday, rising from behind the hill atop which sits Warren Place, home to Sir Henry Cecil for almost four decades until his death June 11. His

racehorses have continued the season in fine form under the guidance of his wife, Lady Jane Cecil, and as they filed out from the rear of Warren Place to the training grounds below, the riders would have been able to see on the distant horizon Ely Cathedral, where on Monday afternoon some 900 members of the horse racing community

gathered to commemorate the extraordinary life of their former boss.

Lord Grimthorpe, who, through his role as racing manager for Khalid Abdullah, was a confidant of the trainer, gave a moving eulogy, outlining Cecil's sensitive approach to horsemanship which, over a 44-year career, yielded 114 Group 1 winners, 36 Classics and 75 winners at his most beloved meeting, Royal Ascot.

Leading the service, Reverend Canon David Pritchard said, "We recall the high regard in which [Henry Cecil] was held as one of the greatest trainers in history. We acknowledge his unique talent in getting the best from the horses in his care and his personal courage in the face of adversity."

Personal recollections and readings were also given by Cecil's sons Noel and Jake and grandchildren Olivia and Jack Mackenzie, along with Alan Cooper, racing manager for the Niarchos family, for whom Cecil trained the 2007 Oaks winner Light Shift.

A large number of Cecil's 80 fellow Newmarket trainers paid their respects to the man whose absence on Newmarket Heath is still keenly felt, while among those to have traveled from farther afield included his old sparring partner John Dunlop, who retired only last year, and two of Cecil's former assistants, David Lanigan and Harry Dunlop, both of whom now train in Lambourn. Jockeys in attendance included Frankel's regular partner Tom Queally, who is still stable jockey at Warren Place, and his predecessors in that role, Ted Durcan and Richard Quinn.

Following a private funeral in June, Sir Henry Cecil was laid to rest in Aberdeenshire at Crathes Castle, the ancestral seat of his mother's family. His Scottish roots were commemorated in poignant fashion at the close of the memorial service by the plaintive sound of a lone piper passing through the vast, centuries-old cathedral.

## RACETRACK ROUND-UP

### Treve OK...

Trainer Crique Head-Maarek yesterday provided a positive bulletin following the success of **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}) in Sunday's G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp. Impressive when extending her unbeaten record in the 12-furlong contest, Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's acquisition will now be supplemented for the Oct. 6 G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. "She looks perfectly fine, has eaten everything up and is perfect," she told *PA Sport*. "We are now on the way to the Arc with her." Reflecting on her performance, she added, "I am always very relaxed when she runs. I think Treve was probably more nervous than her trainer at Longchamp. She was fantastic and showed her tremendous turn of foot to everyone. We have obviously got to watch the other horses very carefully. Orfevre looked wonderful in the Prix Foy, and the other Japanese horse was also very good in his trial. We had the best time of all the races at Longchamp over that distance, though, so that might be very important. She has won on soft and on good ground, so I would not be concerned about what it will be like on Arc day. She will have a few days of rest now and then it is back to work."

The European racing and breeding worlds received two reminders over the weekend--not that any were needed--regarding the severity of the body blow they suffered with the death of Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) at the comparatively early age of 16 early last year. We were also amply reminded of the potency of the Montjeu/Mr. Prospector combination.

At Doncaster, his determined son Leading Light improved his record to five wins from six starts when he provided Montjeu with his third victory in the St Leger--the race which last year narrowly denied Montjeu's son Camelot of the most desirable of achievements, the Triple Crown. Leading Light's win helps cement Montjeu's reputation as one of the most effective Classic sires of the modern era. In the space of nine years, his tally in the British Classics has risen to eight. In addition to Camelot's successes in the 2,000 Guineas and Derby, he has also enjoyed Derby success with Motivator, Authorized and Pour Moi, while Leading Light's predecessors in the St Leger were Scorpion and Masked Marvel.

Montjeu also gave us three winners of the Irish Derby, while another two sons won the Grand Prix de Paris, arguably France's nearest equivalent to the Derby, and two more landed the AJC Australian Derby. This year saw his quirky daughter Chicquita take the Irish Oaks.

To put Montjeu's British tally into context, the all-conquering Galileo has five English Classic victories to his name from eight crops of 3-year-olds (Sixties Icon, New Approach, Frankel, Was and Ruler of the World). It is also worth remembering that Montjeu's crops were often a good deal smaller than those by his paternal half-brother. **Cont. p18**

Leading Light has something in common with Motivator in that both were sired by Montjeu from daughters of Gone West. It was Motivator's turn to shine the day after the St Leger, when his exciting daughter Treve did her Arc prospects no harm by adding the G1 Prix Vermeille to her unbeaten run.

Glance down Montjeu's long list of important winners and you will see that many of them are out of daughters of major mile-and-a-half winners, such as Darshaan, Shirley Heights, Surumu, Saumarez and Law Society. Clearly he didn't need a speedily bred mare to strike it rich, but in an industry where stamina is often seriously undervalued--indeed scorned--breeders were bound to try to inject an element of speed.

The emergence of Motivator from Montjeu's first crop inevitably planted the seed that Montjeu would benefit greatly from mares by sons of Mr. Prospector. And indeed he has. He has now sired five Group 1 winners from mares by four sons of Mr. Prospector--Gone West (Motivator and Leading Light), Kingmambo (Camelot), Woodman and Distant View. He also has group winners out of daughters of Forty Niner and Machiavellian, as well as listed winners out of mares by Miswaki and Seeking The Gold. Pour Moi, another of his Derby winners, has a Conquistador Cielo mare as his second dam.

It is also well worth highlighting Montjeu's record with mares by Gone West's outstanding 2,000 Guineas winner Zafonic. He has 15 foals out of Zafonic's daughters, of which 11 have started and nine have won. Three of them--the top-class Papal Bull and the fillies Maria Royal and Pacifique--all won at Group level. For good measure the Irish Oaks winner Chicquita has a second dam by Zafonic.

However, don't be misled into thinking that these Mr. Prospector mares have succeeded in producing a speedier type of Montjeu. Motivator stayed well enough to win the Derby, as did Camelot, and Motivator's very talented brother Macarthur won the G2 Hardwicke S. over a mile and a half. The Group 1 winner with a Woodman dam was Frozen Fire, winner of the Irish Derby, while Distant View's contribution was Speed Gifted, a Group 1 winner over 1 5/8 miles in Australia.

Other stakes winners from this Montjeu/Mr.

Prospector alliance include Pacifique, whose group success came over 1 7/8 miles; Jump For You, a listed winner over a similar distance; and Biographer, a listed winner over 1 3/4 miles.

This underlines the scale of Camelot's achievement in winning the 2,000 Guineas over a mile, before he took the Derby much more impressively. Camelot, of course, followed Motivator, Authorized and St Nicholas Abbey as Montjeu's fourth winner of the Racing Post Trophy--a record which acts as a vivid reminder that the ability to stay pretty well at three can still go hand in hand with first-rate 2-year-old ability.

Leading Light is an even more pronounced example of the way Montjeu's stamina tends to dominate. Aidan O'Brien wasn't afraid to try this 520,000gns purchase over two miles in the G3 Queen's Vase in June and Leading Light justified the gamble by staying on strongly to record his fourth successive victory. It will be interesting to see how he fares when his connections try to prove that he also possesses enough speed to be equally effective at around a mile and a half.

Leading Light ought to be able to drop successfully down the distance scale. He is, after all, out of Dance Parade, whose first notable triumph came in the Queen Mary S., Britain's first major test for fast and precocious juvenile fillies. Her speed was again evident when she landed the G3 Fred Darling S. at three and also when she was transferred across the Atlantic. Two of her American graded stakes victories (all gained on turf) included two over 6 1/2 furlongs and the GII Buena Vista H. over a mile.

Dance Parade started her broodmare career in the U.S. before being transferred back to England, where she realised 320,000gns at Tattersalls' 2005 December Sales. A previous visit to Montjeu resulted in Warwick Avenue, a fairly useful performer over a mile and a quarter. Leading Light's second dam River Jig is also the second dam of Toysome, whose finest win came in the G1 Prix de la Foret over seven furlongs.

Leading Light's family traces back to Monarchy, a sister to the remarkable Round Table, so there can be no complaints about the quality of his female line.

With St Nicholas Abbey, Chicquita and Leading Light all scoring at the highest level this year, there will surely be no shortage of interest in the sizeable team of Montjeu yearlings which will shortly be coming under the hammer at Goffs and Tattersalls. They include colts out of the classic winners Attraction and Finsceal Beo.

I will also be keeping a close eye on some of the Montjeu 2-year-olds which have recently recorded their first victories, such as Andre Fabre's Gallante, winner of a usually hot newcomers' race at Longchamp; and Aidan O'Brien's Carlo Bugatti. Perhaps it's not just coincidence that these two are out of grand-daughters of Mr. Prospector, with Gallante having a dam by Machiavellian and Carlo Bugatti a Kingmambo mare.

**Automatic NYS Series Eligibility for 2015 Foals:**

New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. announced yesterday that, starting with 2015 foal crop, all foals by stallions nominated to the New York Stallion Stakes Series will automatically be eligible without paying any nomination fee. Stallions must still be nominated to the series by mid-February for the stallion's advertised stud fee or \$2,500 (whichever is higher). There will be no change to the nomination process for any series already in motion (through Series 2016/2014 foals). "This is a terrific way to increase participation in the New York Stallion Series races and everybody wins--stallion owners, breeders, owners and the racetrack operator," said Jeffrey Cannizzo, Executive Director of the New York Breeders, Inc. "All the progeny of a stallion will automatically be eligible. Nobody falls through the cracks because a breeder or buyer forgot to nominate a foal, and there will be a bigger pool of horses to draw from when the races come up, which will make for a better series." Cannizzo continued, "Breeders and owners should be aware of exactly when this change takes place. Current horses of racing age, 2-year-olds, yearlings, weanlings and foals in utero are subject to the former rules and must be nominated individually. The new system only takes effect beginning the foals conceived during the 2014 breeding season."


