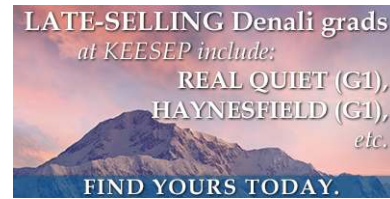

JEWEL TO HANG '10' IN UNDERWOOD

Coolmore and partners' **Atlantic Jewel (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) will try to stretch her career record to a perfect 10-from-10 when she faces a star-studded field in Saturday's G1 Underwood S. at Melbourne's Caulfield Racecourse. No fewer than 11 of Saturday's 14 contestants have won at the highest level, but none attracts the attention that Atlantic Jewel does. Winner of all seven starts at three, the A\$320,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling purchase has been flawless in two starts since returning from a 16-month absence, winning Caulfield's G1 Memsie S. first-up Aug. 31 prior to a 2 1/2-length success in the G2 Stocks S. at Moonee Valley last Saturday. The 5-year-old mare is quoted as low as \$1.45 (2-5) favorite ante-post and

is followed by **Puissance de Lune (Ire)** (Shamardal) at \$6.50 (11-2), though Glen Boss will need to work out a trip for that one from the widest barrier in 14. The 5-year-old, at or near the top of the market for the G1 Melbourne Cup Nov. 5, returned from a five-month absence to score impressively in the G2 P. B. Lawrence S. Aug. 17, causing his rider to compare him with the likes of the great Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert Sun {GB}). Only an amazing late rally from **Foreteller (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) denied Puissance de Lune a victory last time out in the G1 Makybe Diva S. at Flemington Sept. 7. The latter is no better than a 30-1 gamble at this point. **It's a Dundee (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) was a dual G1 Guineas winner in the Australasian fall and turned in a useful fourth-place effort behind Atlantic Jewel when fourth, beaten three lengths, in the Memsie. He should find this trip much more to his liking than the 1400 meters of his comeback test.

MOMENTUM CARRIES OVER TO BOOK FOUR

The Keeneland September Yearling Sale entered Book 4 Wednesday, and the momentum that has been evident over the course of the first eight days of the auction has clearly carried into the latter third of the event. A total of 311 yearlings found new homes Wednesday for a clearance rate of 87% and gross receipts of \$11,179,500. The average of \$35,947 represented a 31.9% gain over the corresponding session last year, while the \$27,000 median was 35% ahead of last year. The cumulative average and median improved on last year's figures by similar percentages, showing gains of 31.1% and 40%, respectively. Fully 13 horses realized final bids in excess of \$100,000 during Wednesday's session, compared to just five in 2012. **KEESEP cont. p3**

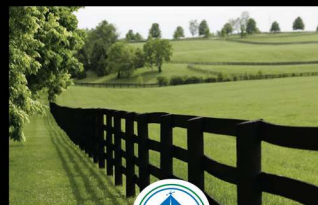

Bristol Shows Up in Elmont

Dance to Bristol (Speightstown), winner of seven consecutive races including a game score in the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga Aug. 23, is the marquee name in a field of nine for Saturday's GII Gallant Bloom H. at Belmont Park. But the Gallant Bloom is anything but a fait accompli for the Ollie Figgins III-trainee, as she faces off with a pair of rivals with formidable win streaks of their own. Godolphin's Dance Card (Tapit) rides a four-race skein into this race, but makes her first appearance since a four-length success in the GI Gazelle S. going two turns at Aqueduct last November. Cluster of Stars (Greeley's Galaxy) will have her fair share of backers as she looks to extend her streak to a half-dozen. The New York-bred is unraced since a breakthrough graded-stakes score in the GII Distaff H. Apr. 13.

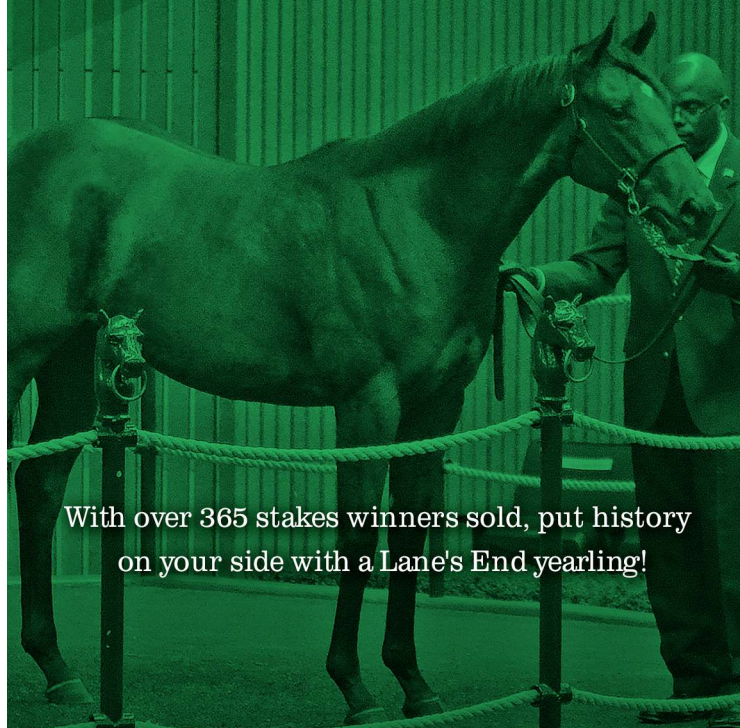

A 'Purr'-fect Ending to the Session...

Sent through the Keeneland Sales Pavilion just five horses prior to the finish of Wednesday's business, hip [2914](#), a New York-bred son of Kitten's Joy--Esther Got Even (Stephen Got Even) was hammered down to

Gatewood Bell's Cromwell Bloodstock, agent, for \$185,000 to lead the day's proceedings.

Technically, it was the colt's second visit to Lexington. He was in utero when he made his first trip through the ring, but was bought back by the mare's consignor Ramsey Farm on a bid of \$37,000. That decision reaped dividends for the Ramseys when the colt fetched \$100,000 from an entity called

Greendale Bloodstock as a short yearling at Keeneland January last winter. The Mar. 9 foal is out of a full-sister to the multiple stakes-placed Debbie Got Even and hails from the extended female family of the talented turf mare Via Borghese (Seattle Dancer). He is bred on a similar cross to GI Kentucky Oaks winner Plum Pretty.

A cleverly bred son of Darby Dan's Run Away and Hide led until deep into the evening at Keeneland. He was purchased by agent Kate Sheehan for \$175,000. Consigned by Robert S. West Jr.'s Waterford-Milford Farm and bred by West Jr. with Michael Riordan, hip [2665](#) is a son of the Distorted Humor mare No Dress Code, the dam of this colt's 3/4-sister Reneesgotzip (City Zip). That fleet Peter Miller trainee is in the midst of an outstanding season on the West Coast, having won a Del Mar allowance by 5 1/4 lengths July 18 ahead of a coast-to-coast victory in the GIII Rancho Bernardo H. Aug. 18. She is currently being pointed for the GI Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Sprint. It has also been a glorious year for the colt's sire, who has been represented by graded winners Alberts Hope, Are You Kidding Me and Mico Margarita. Hip 2665 made for a successful pinhook for his breeders after he was led out unsold on a bid of \$55,000 as a weanling from last year's Keeneland November Sale.

Adena Springs bred and consigned the day's dearest filly. Catalogued as hip [2884](#), the gray or roan is a daughter of Ghostzapper and is the second foal out of the multiple stakes-placed track-record setter Cozy Gains (Cozzene). She attracted a final bid of \$140,000 from trainer Bob Baffert, agent.

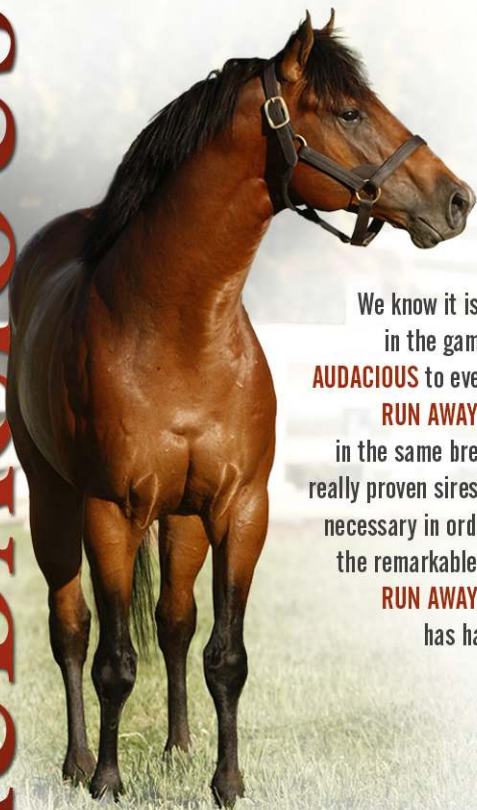

AL KAZEEM TO ROYAL STUDS IN '14

Three-time Group 1 winner **Al Kazeem (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}--Kazeem {GB}, by Darshaan {GB}) will begin his stud career next season at the Royal Studs in Sandringham, according to *Racing Post*. The 5-year-old, trained by Roger Charlton on behalf of owner/breeder John Deer, has won this year's G1 Prince of Wales's S., G1 Eclipse S. and G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup.

"The Queen is thrilled to have acquired such an important, high-class stallion for the Royal Studs," the Queen's bloodstock and racing adviser John Warren told *Racing Post*. "Al Kazeem is an outstanding individual and, being by Dubawi out of a Darshaan mare, he should be an extremely appealing prospect to breeders."

Al Kazeem will be the first addition to the Royal Studs roster since Motivator (GB) joined the stud in 2005.

"I'm thrilled that Al Kazeem will be standing at the Royal Studs, which is the perfect home for such a magnificent horse," Deer said. "No doubt he'll be a wonderful asset for breeders and I'm thrilled he's been secured to stand in this country."

On the board in 13 of 14 starts to date, Al Kazeem has won seven times and has earned \$1,559,368. He is currently being pointed for a tilt at the Oct. 6 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

PLANTEUR HAS BREEDERS' CUP AIM

Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's dual G1 Dubai World Cup third **Planteur (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) has the Nov. 2 G1 Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita as his goal, according to trainer Marco Botti. The 6-year-old bay, who also ran second in the May 26 G1 Prix d'Ispahan, garnered the Aug. 24 G3 Winter Hill S. at Windsor and will tackle the Oct. 5 G2 Prix Dollar before his California objective. "Planteur did it well at Windsor," Botti commented. "It was just what he needed and will have boosted his confidence. We've had to look after him this season as the ground hasn't been suitable for most of the year and he needs a bit of cut. He will run in the Prix Dollar at Longchamp and then he'll go for the Breeders' Cup Classic. He handles Polytrack, but the dirt will be a different question."

TDN Q&A

In Part 2 of the TDN's Q&A series with Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby, the TDN's Kelsey Riley catches up with Beeby about Goffs' two new sales for 2014--The London Sale and the Champions Sale--as well as how Goffs has developed its business strategies in recent years. ([Click here](#) for Part 1 of the series).

KR: Last week you announced that Goffs will stage for the first time in 2014 the Champions Sale Sept. 13 at Leopardstown to coincide with the new Irish Champions weekend. Why do you think this type of sale will fit well with this festival?

HB: There are a few reasons. First of all, we have a good example of how it works. With our National Hunt hat on, we've held a sale for the last three years in tandem with the Punchestown National Hunt Festival, which has quickly become a market leader. It's only had 20-25 horses in it, but it has the highest average of any comparable sale in Britain or Ireland, and has really taken off and was a market leader straight away. We've been looking for a way to improve our flat horses-in-training offer. We're very engaged with and excited about the Irish Champions weekend, which we've supported from the outset. We'll be

sponsoring a Group 1 contest that weekend in the Goffs Vincent O'Brien National S., and we're excited by the fact that the intention is to bring a truly international audience into Ireland for Irish Champions weekend. Leopardstown is Dublin's racecourse, we know there are going to be a lot of events on both Saturday and Sunday, and we thought if we worked with Leopardstown we could put on a boutique, very concise, quality horses-in-training sale. The goal would be to maybe have one or two horses within that number who would have engagements to run over the weekend. We're not talking about a huge sale, we're talking about maybe 25-30 horses, an hour of selling leading into racing. We think it will be an extra selling point for Champions weekend, for Leopardstown in particular, and it will be something that will be interesting to the race-going public. We've had a very good reaction from potential vendors and purchasers; people have talked about it already and we're quite excited by it.

KR: What is your aim for quality of horse for the Champions Sale?

HB: We're aiming very high. We're looking at a sale that might average €100,000. Our National Hunt sale at Punchestown averaged over €90,000, so we're looking for similar quality, and we'll be quite selective about what ends up in the sale. It'll be short, sharp, boutique, and we intend to put on a really good show.

KR: Goffs also last month announced the June 2014 debut of the London Sale on the eve of Royal Ascot. How will this horses-in-training sale differ from the Champions Sale?

HB: It's a slightly different time of year. It's a development and evolution of the Ready-to-Run sale we've held at Kempton since 2007, which we felt needed a bit of a make over. So we won't be holding that sale this year. The London Sale is going to take advantage of a number of things. First, it will have some breeze-up horses, and those 2-year-olds will work at Kempton probably two or three days prior to selling. There's been a lot of talk about whether a sale should be held in central London. Cont. p8

A truly international audience descends on London on the eve of Royal Ascot. My belief is that the first day of Royal Ascot is one of the best days of flat racing of the year anywhere in the world, so it gets an absolutely huge audience internationally. The day before the meeting people come in and stay in London, and we think we can put on a really smart sale of both 2-year-olds in training and some horses with form. Again, the intention will be to have horses with engagements and entries during the Royal Meeting. We've already spoken with the BHA about being sure that we can transfer ownership straight away so that if someone buys a horse on Monday with an engagement at Royal Ascot, it can run in the new colors and the new ownership at the Royal Meeting. Again, it will be held in central London, probably over a champagne reception, and we'll be working with both Kempton and Royal Ascot to ensure it gets a high profile. It really is something quite special and a little bit different. We want to make it an occasion. Again, we want it to be short and sharp; we're not looking for big numbers, we're looking to maybe sell for a couple hours maximum, probably 30-40 breeze-up horses and maybe 10-20 horses with form.

KR: Is it a purposeful strategy that both of your newest sales are anchored to major racing events?

HB: It's certainly done on purpose. It's different with the horses with form as opposed to the yearling and breeding stock sales. The latter take place on site and they're a big gathering of that year's crop. These events are to take advantage of the unique atmosphere surrounding two particular racing events. We call them boutique sales because they're going to be small and selective, and we're going to make sure they hit a certain standard. So those are exciting to people coming in, and they're really an add-on to the main event, which is the racing. It's to enhance what is being offered at those race meetings, and take advantage of the people that are coming anyway.

KR: When making the decision to introduce a new sale, what type of market research to you undertake to determine the demand for the sale?

HB: We have success in that area already in that we have the Puchestown sale. We see that at certain times of the year there are significant numbers of good form horses selling either at public auction or privately, and we believe we can take advantage of that. We've spoken to a number of trainers and breeze-up consignors about the London sale and gotten support from all of those. So we're quite confident we can put on a really good show and get support with the horses. We really think it'll be a great success.

KR: How has the international bloodstock sales industry changed in recent years? Are you seeing a shift in demand in the type of sale buyers want to shop at, or the kind of horses people are looking for?

HB: In the last couple years the focus has been very much on quality. Pre-2008, I think certainly in Britain and Ireland, we had an over production issue where supply was starting to outstrip demand. That wasn't being addressed, but the downturn certainly addressed it dramatically. So there's a focus on real quality. At Goffs we've also focused on relative quality. We cut the sales that weren't returning good results for either ourselves or our clients to focus on relative quality at all levels of the market. We've been very careful not to be elitist, not to cut out any particular section of the market, but to make sure we produce concise catalogues relative to buyer demand. So we didn't flood our catalogues. We cut a number of them back, we cut a number of days out, and I think there's been a real focus on quality at the top of the market. The commercial middle market has strengthened in the last couple years in particular. We still see at the bottom of the market that it's very hard work there. So a focus on quality is the way the market is going at the moment, at all levels.

KR: What is your perception of the American market and the format of the sale after attending Keeneland September last week?

HB: The American market seems as vibrant as I can remember for some time. There appears to be depth and strength at all levels of the September sale so far, and I think Keeneland have got the format 100% correct. The statistics speak for themselves, but what they don't reveal is the real buzz that was very evident from the first lot as well as the diversity of buyers Keeneland attracted.

KR: Goffs has implemented a number of changes and developments in recent years, from merging with DBS in 2007 to adding a variety of new sales. Are there any more significant changes on the horizon?

HB: What we're looking to do both with Goffs and DBS is focus on relative quality, provide as broad a possible service as we can to our vendors and potential vendors, and at Goffs to the Irish breeders and at DBS the breeders of England. We want to be there to serve everybody, and then provide hospitality and a service to potential buyers from all over the world that is quite unique. We promote Goffs as the gateway to the world for Irish breeders. We had buyers from 30 different countries in Goffs last year. We'd like to expand that as much as we can. A great coup for us over the past few weeks is to land the Paulyn dispersal that will be conducted in the middle of our November sale. We had

to compete with our competitors to secure that dispersal, and Mr. Makin, when he was asked why he'd gone to Goffs, he said he liked our can-do attitude. And I hope and believe he recognized the very proactive nature that I talked about of the Goffs team. The fact that we're absolutely passionate about what we do, the fact that we'll go that extra mile

and do whatever we can to ensure that the vendor and purchaser is very well looked after, and that we'll look after every single person as well as we can. We've got a small but very passionate team, and I've often said that our team's passion for the industry and what we do borders on obsession. That's not such a bad thing. We live and we breathe it, we're passionate about what we do. We're not changing the world, we're only selling horses, but in that world of selling horses, you won't find anyone as proactive or as passionate as we are. Whether we're going to evolve or introduce anything else, we're always looking at new ideas and suggestions. We'd never say never to any idea that anybody will have, and that's where things like the Champions Sale and the London Sale have come from. They won't be the biggest, but they'll be different.

By the same token, we recognize that we're in a traditional industry, so we put on what is a traditional yearling sale and breeding stock sale to ensure that the industry is well catered for.

I hope that our Orby sale, and then our November sale, and particularly the Paulyn Sale within the November sale, will demonstrate to Irish breeders in particular that there really is no need to go anywhere else with their quality stock. And to overseas buyers, we will be selling on a regular basis some of the best horses that they'll find anywhere in the world. Irish horses are the pinnacle at the moment; they're winning all over the world and we are the showcase for Irish horses. We also will have a small number of horses coming to the Orby sale from the UK, reversing what would be seen as the traditional theme, and we're going to look to develop that over the next few years. Every sale has unique buyers, but we would have as many as anyone else. We don't rest while there's still work to be done, and there will always be work to be done.

FEDERAL COURT NIXES NJ SPORTS BETTING

A court of Federal appeals shot down New Jersey’s attempt to legalize sports betting in Philadelphia Tuesday afternoon. Following a 2-1 decision, judges for the Third Circuit upheld a 1992 federal law barring sports betting in the state.

“We will continue to fight this injustice by either appealing to the U.S. Supreme Court or to the entire Court of Appeals,” said State Sen. Raymond Lesniak in a statement Tuesday.

Nevada, Delaware, Montana and Oregon are the only four states in the U.S. allowed to offer some form of legalized sports wagering. A sports betting referendum was passed in New Jersey in 2011, and then in January of last year, Gov. Christie signed a law which would enable sports betting to be offered in Atlantic City casinos and the state’s horse racing tracks. Several of the major sports leagues—including the NFL and NCAA—opposed the law, stating that the advent of legalized betting in the state would undermine the integrity of athletic competition.

“In the dissent, the judge agrees with New Jersey’s central argument—that the law is unconstitutional since it prevents sports betting in New Jersey against the wishes of its own elected officials and citizens,” Colin Reed, a spokesman for the governor, said in a statement Tuesday. “This makes the issue all the more appropriate to be decided by the U.S. Supreme Court. Two years ago, the people of New Jersey voted overwhelmingly to bring sports betting to New Jersey, and the governor agrees with his constituents. There’s no reason it should be limited to only a handful of states. It’s a fundamental issue of fairness.”

MD JOINS EASTERN STATES MED POLICY

The Maryland Racing Commission joined seven other Eastern states in adopting uniform medication and drug testing rules, according to the *Baltimore Sun* Tuesday. The new regulations, which are set to take effect Jan. 1, 2014, call for the ban of all race day medications, except for Lasix. Under the new guidelines, the anti-bleeding medication can only be administered by a third-party veterinarian who reports it to the racing commission. Additionally, Maryland has banned ‘adjunct’ anti-bleeding medications. Maryland had been one of the three remaining states in the country where that type of medications had been allowed.

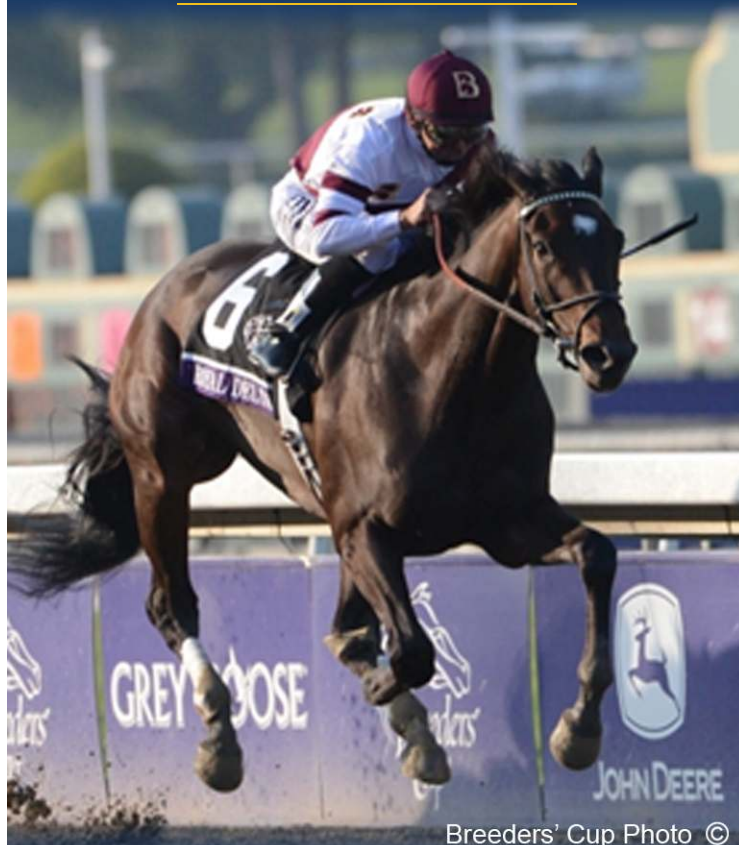
