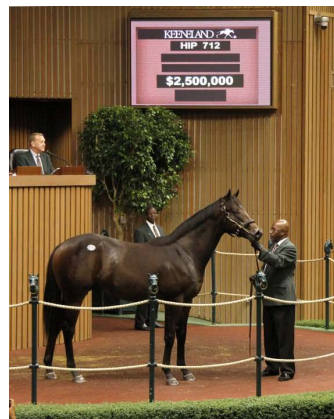

A SUPER SEPTEMBER DRAWS TO A CLOSE

Consignor James Keogh popped his head into the office of Geoffrey Russell on a gray, wet morning yesterday in Lexington, and thanked Keeneland's Director of Sales for his hospitality during the September Yearling Sale. "Amazing, amazing," Keogh said simply of the latest renewal of September, which concluded its 12-session run Saturday.

Keogh wasn't alone in his assessment. By most accounts, the reformatted 2013 September Sale, which included an expanded, four-day Book 1, was a huge success. When the final hammer fell yesterday afternoon, a total of 2,744 horses sold for \$280,491,300. That resulted in an average of \$102,220, up 17.1% from last year's sale. It is the highest average since 2006 and the third-highest September Sale average ever. The median was a record \$50,000, up 11.1% from 2012. The sale's cumulative RNA rate, from 683 horses bought back, was 19.9%, compared to 19.2% last year.

Last year, 2,516 horses sold for \$219,723,000, an average of \$87,330 and a median of \$45,000. The top priced was a \$1.65 million colt by Distorted Humor--Mushka.

Topping this year's September Sale was a Woods Edge-consigned colt by War Front--Blading Gold Ring (During) who was hammered down to Coolmore's M.V. Magnier for \$2.5 million. **Cont. p12**

honors with a thoroughly professional victory over **Moreno** (Ghostzapper), whom he had defeated in the GI Travers S. four weeks ago. **Cont. 4**

While Will Take Charge established himself as a legitimate Eclipse contender, the case is harder to make for Juddmonte Farms' **Close Hatches** (First Defence). Though a divisional championship is more than likely out of the question, Close Hatches has clearly established herself as the main threat to Princess of Sylmar and enhanced her reputation with a second consecutive win at the highest level Saturday. A ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ following a seven-length debut romp going seven furlongs at Gulfstream Jan. 26, the homebred took a two-turn allowance in Hallandale Mar. 10, then handed Princess of Sylmar her lone defeat of 2013 in the GII Gazelle S. at Aqueduct Apr. 6. Never really in it when 10th to that rival in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 3, she couldn't catch Midnight Lucky (Midnight Lute) and settled for second in the GI Acorn S. at Belmont May 27, and was last seen streaking away to take the GI Mother Goose S. by 7 1/4 lengths June 22. Favored in an eclectic field, Close Hatches was forced

into a wide run around the first turn, as GI Test S. winner Sweet Lulu dictated things early on in advance of My Happy Face (Tiz Wonderful), who tossed her head at the start and was urged along to force the issue. Three wide turning up the backside, Close Hatches was given a bit of rein by Mike Smith to make a line of three nearing the half-mile marker, and she and Sweet Lulu separated themselves from an off-the-bridle My Happy Face midway on the final bend. With Julien Leparoux hard at work to keep Sweet Lulu at the head of affairs, Smith sat relatively chilly on Close Hatches, sent her to the front a furlong and a half out and held sway late. Street Girl, awkwardly away, made an eye-catching run from the tail for a valuable Grade I placing.

A maiden winner and runner-up in the Springboard Mile at Remington Park in four juvenile starts, Will Take Charge promptly sprung a 12-1 upset in the Smarty Jones S. at Oaklawn Jan. 21, but ballooned to sixth behind Super Ninety Nine (Pulpit) in the GIII Southwest S. Feb. 18. He atoned for that effort by returning \$58 to his backers when accounting for stablemate Oxbow (Awesome Again) in the GII Rebel S. and trained straight up to the GI Kentucky Derby. A respectable eighth when bothered by a weakening Verrazano (More Than Ready) in the "Run for the Roses," he was a well-beaten seventh behind Oxbow in the GI Preakness S. May 17 and 10th to Palace Malice in the Belmont June 8. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas made the decision to take the blinkers off Will Take Charge in the GII Jim Dandy S. July 27, and it seemed to do the trick, as he finished off his race well and was a length behind Palace Malice at the wire. That effort suggested that the 10th furlong of the Travers could be the key to success, but, let go at an overlaid 9-1, he pegged back Moreno in the final couple of strides for a breakthrough victory. He entered the Pennsylvania with a renewed reputation as the 'buzz' horse (pun intended), and he came through with flying colors.

With no one terribly interested to take the early initiative, it was California invader Fury Kapcori (Tiznow) who took them under the line for the first time, tracked inside by the expected pacesetter Moreno and an unusually close Romansh (Bernardini). Speak Logistics (High Cotton), narrowly runner-up in Parx's GIII Smarty Jones S.

Sept. 2, and Will Take Charge comprised the second flight of horses, followed by Transparent (Bernardini), a head-strong Battier and the late-running Java's War (War Pass). Moreno was firmly in front turning up the backside, but

he was forced to go reasonably hard on the engine through a half in :46.74 and three-quarters in 1:10.41. Moreno was still going well up front and cornered in front, but it was Battier who came with a huge four-wide sweep and looked the main danger to the leader. But as Moreno drifted away from the inside when popped the question, Luis Saez took immediate advantage, sending Will Take Charge right on through and on to a compelling victory.

The bettors understandably went for Dance to Bristol, winner of seven consecutive race, including the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga Aug. 23, but it was Cluster of Stars who emerged with an unblemished record in her six career starts. A debut winner in February 2012, Cluster of Stars was off just over 11 months, but returned with a 6 1/4-length allowance victory over the Aqueduct inner Jan. 13. While those two starts came in restricted company, she defeated an in-form Nicole H. (Mr. Greeley) in the Feb. 2 Correction H., then decimated an open second-level allowance field by 9 1/4 lengths Mar. 14. Pounded down to 1-5 for the GI Distaff H. Apr. 13, the bay was floated wide in upper stretch, but boxed back gamely to retain her unbeaten streak. Drawn on the fence for this first-

up effort, Cluster of Stars headed them off after the opening 110 yards and was promptly taken well in hand by her jockey Javier Castellano as they clicked off an opening quarter in a sharp :22.16. Dance to Bristol rolled up four wide while under little encouragement rounding the far turn, and Xavier Perez took a look over his left shoulder, thinking he had the pacesetter right where he wanted her.

But Cluster of Stars repelled the challenge just as quickly and was ridden out to a clear-cut victory. Dance to Victory, who gave the winner four pounds, did well to hold second from Dance Card, who was off slowly and rallied well in her first appearance since taking the 2012 GI Gazelle S. "Breaking out of the gate, this filly had a lot of speed, but she was able to relax," said Castellano. "I had a lot of confidence in her. I know she's a very classy filly and we've had success together in the past. I wasn't worried about the layoff; the combination of the speed holding today and drawing the rail was an advantage for me today." The winner is not yet nominated to the Breeders' Cup and would have to be supplemented if connections decide on the Filly/Mare Sprint.



Trakus Fact: Cluster of Stars traveled a total of 4331 ft. in the 6 1/2-furlong affair. Runner-up Dance to Bristol covered 32 feet more than the winner, while slow-starting third-place finisher Dance Card ran 40 feet more than Cluster of Stars. That's a ground-loss differential of 3 3/4 lengths for Dance to Bristol and 4 3/4 lengths for Dance Card. One length equals approximately 8 1/2 feet.

The most experienced member of this field with 20 previous starts to his credit, City of Weston overcame late traffic trouble and was along in the waning strides to take down this rich purse. After defeating decidedly easier Florida rivals in the restricted Sophomore S. at Tampa Apr. 6 and in the Big Drama S. at Calder three weeks later, City of Weston was an even fourth to Zee Bros (Brother Derek) in Pimlico's Chick Lang S. May 18. A return trip to the Sunshine State proved fruitless, as

the gray was a distant third in the Unbridled S. at Calder June 8. He never landed a blow when sixth of seven in the Gill Carry Back S. July 6, and was exiting an improved runner-up effort in the Aug. 5 Hard Spun S. at Delaware Park. City of Weston jumped on terms and showed

enough early speed to land just in behind the generous early pace set by Woodbine raider Black Hornet from Gill Jersey Shore S. hero Rainbow Heir (Wildcat Heir) and the heavily bet Majestic Hussar (Majestic Warrior). Scrubbed on while saving ground into the stretch, he was crying out for racing room as he attempted to split Black Hornet and Rainbow Heir approaching the eighth pole, then was steered down to the fence in the final 50 yards and knifed through for the victory. A debut third in a key maiden over the Keeneland Polytrack Apr. 12, Sky Girl was an impressive 4 1/2-length graduate in a seven-furlong test over this main track May 3 while carrying the silks of former owner Jay Em Ess Stable.

Looking to make it three-for-three in Louisville in a field cannibalized by the Charles Town Oaks, Sky Girl was perhaps a half-step slow to begin, but that might have worked in her favor, as she settled in fourth behind the leading trio. Traveling on the muscle and waiting for her cue as they reached the head of the lane, Sky Girl had a clear shot at the inside entering the final furlong, and though she needed a few strides to fully commit to the idea, was driven out by Corey Lanerie to an ultimately comfortable success. "I was hoping to come around--I thought the rail was a little bit dead--but it was getting late in the race and (inside) looked like my only option," Lanerie said. "I didn't want to wait too long. She's got a big future, I think."

This event was pegged as the iron test for the previously unbeaten champion mare Atlantic Jewel, and in the end it took a change of tactics and a Triple Crown champion to dethrone Australian racing's newest Queen. It's A Dundee stormed onto the

Australian racing scene last season, sweeping four Group 1s, beginning with Randwick's Spring Champion S. last October and culminating in the triple of the Randwick Guineas, Rosehill Guineas and Australian Derby. He rounded out his 3-year-old campaign with a second-place finish to Reliable Man (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Randwick Apr. 27. Perhaps slightly flat when fourth behind Atlantic Jewel first-up in the

G1 Memsie S. Aug. 31 in that rival's first outing in 16 months, It's A Dundee showed none of that rust here. In an uncharacteristic move, Atlantic Jewel broke on top and found herself alone on the lead. Jockey James McDonald, aboard It's A Dundee, soon made the decision to keep the favorite within his sights and adopted a change in tactics himself aboard the 4-year-old, moving up on the outside to stalk her through the opening stages while eventual third placer Dear Demi was tucked in on the rail in third. As the pace quickened turning for home the two champions were deadlocked in battle, and it remained that way until It's A Dundee put his head in front in the shadow of the wire. "He's a different horse this prep. I loved how he just positioned up on the pace," jockey James McDonald told *Breednet.com.au*. "It was a dog-fight. I could see [Atlantic Jewel] picking up the speed and I knew my horse would sustain a real good run to the line, so I thought I'd put it to her 400 meters from home and make it a real test for her. Full credit to both horses, they battled it out really well." Winning trainer Murray Baker told *Breednet.com.au*, "We thought he had improved vastly over the past couple of weeks, but we didn't think we could beat Atlantic Jewel at 1800 meters. It was a special race, they are both very good horses."

Streama, winner of the 2012 Australian Oaks, continued her love affair with Randwick Racecourse, winning her third Group 1 event at the Sydney track here. Attempting to win for the first time since taking Caulfield's G2 Tristarc S. last October, Streama stalked the front-running Veyron while racing wide through the early stages. Tackling that rival with 100 meters to race, the bay held off a strong late run from last year's G1 Australian Oaks winner Royal Descent. Ever-consistent, Streama has been off the board just six times in 26 career outings. She earned her first Group 1 crown in the October 2011 Flight S. at Randwick, and the following spring added the Australian Oaks. Somewhat luckless last season, Streama placed in three Group 1s following her Tristarc victory, including the G1 Tattersalls Tiara at Eagle Farm June 22, and was most recently second to Veyron in the G2 Warwick S. Aug. 24. Because she raced throughout the Australian winter, when most top level horses take a spell, trainer Guy Walter noted Streama would target the Oct. 5 G1 Epsom H. at her beloved Randwick before taking a break.

RACE FOR THE PREIS

Today's G1 Preis von Europa at Cologne already looked a weak affair before the news came through yesterday that the G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern winner **Seismos (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) had been scratched due to traces of a prohibited cortisone treatment remaining in his system. That leaves a crew of nearly-horses who need to improve to get to the level of the proven top-level performer **Meandre (Fr)** (Slickly {Fr}). At times high-class for his former trainer Andre Fabre, the 2011 G1 Grand Prix de Paris hero had registered a brace of further wins in that category last summer in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin at Hoppegarten before finishing third in the G1 Hong Kong Vase in December. Only third in the most recent renewal of the Grosser Preis von Berlin July 21, the bay filled that spot behind Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden at the beginning of this month, and a repeat of that effort should be enough to return him to the winner's spot. Sunrace Stables' 2011 G1 Rheinland-Pokal and 2012 G1 Gran Premio di Milano winner **Earl of Tinsdal (Ger)** (Black Sam Bellamy {Ire}) has spent more than a year languishing in the shadows of his contemporaries, and did not look to be going forwards when a latest second in the G3 Preis der Sparkassen Finanzgruppe over 10 furlongs at Baden-Baden Aug. 24.

THE BIZ-NESS

Italian racing has had little to shout about so far in 2013, but one bright spot has been the achievements of its homegrown star **Biz the Nurse (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}), and that potential class act is back from a break in today's G2 Premio Federico Tesio at the San Siro. After leading home a Stefano Botti one-two-three in commanding style in the G2 Derby Italiano over this trip at the Capannelle May 19, Scuderia Aleali's bay repeated that feat for the barn in the G1 Gran Premio di Milano over an extra panel here June 9. Both the second and third **Wild Wolf (Ire)** (Rail Link {GB}) and **Romantic Wave (Ire)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) meet their stable companion on 13 pounds better terms here due to the vagaries of the weight-for-age scale and this race's penalty system. Also from the Botti yard is Dioscuri Srl's **Pattaya (Ity)** (Philomatheia), who finished third in the G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica over 10 furlongs of the Capannelle circuit May 12 prior to winning the nine-furlong G3 Premio del Giubileo here June 30.

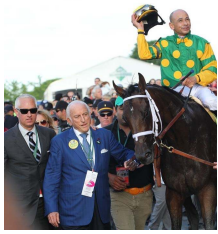

"It was an excellent sale from start to finish," Russell enthused. "The magic of the September sale is that it gathers momentum through the sale. We had a very good Book 1, and that set the table for the rest of the sale. It got people interested in and excited about the market, and that carried over until the last day. We're very happy."

Keeneland's Associate Director of Sales Tom Thornbury echoed those sentiments. "It's been remarkably good," said Thornbury. "The change in format kept people here the first week, and really got a good buzz going in the pavilion. If you couldn't get one bought in Book 1, you could stay and take your best swing in Book 2. And it went on and on, to where on the second-to-last day of the sale, where expectations aren't that great, we were still selling horses well and had a huge crowd out back. Throughout the final week, the average and median was up each day. We never expected it to be that strong."

He said the credit ultimately goes to the breeders. "The biggest thing is that breeders brought us a lot of good stock," Thornbury commented.

One of the most marked upswings at Keeneland occurred at the top end. Some of the more relevant stats include:

- 18 horses brought \$1 million or more, compared to 7 in 2012
- 60 horses brought \$500,000 or more, compared to 42 in 2012
- 403 horses brought \$200,000 or more, compared to 299 in 2012

The trickle-down effect was evident throughout, said Woods Edge's Peter O'Callaghan. "The depth of buyers is the encouraging factor of the sale, particularly as the sale [went] on," O'Callaghan said. "I really think, comparatively, that every day [was] stronger [than the previous]. If you [were] trying to buy what once was a \$15,000 or \$20,000 horse here, you [were] really struggling, because they [brought] \$35,000 to \$50,000. Just the amount of people bidding on your horses is really great to see. We've been waiting for it for a while."

Saturday's final session was led by a Hold Me Back colt who was purchased by Joe Novogratz for \$65,000. Consigned by Scott Mallory, agent, as [hip 3669](#), the colt was produced by MSP Living Fully (Wolf Power {Arg}). This is Hold Me Back's first crop. The WinStar stallion won the GI Lane's End S. and ran second in the GI Travers S. and GI Toyota Blue Grass S.

Saturday's session saw 195 horses sell for \$2,913,200, an average of \$14,939. The median was \$11,000. There was no corresponding session during last year's sale.

International buyers were especially active in the final days at September, a credit, Russell said, to the International Development Program Keeneland launched in 2000 that's now overseen by Will Mayer.

"One consignor said to me he went into the Limestone Cafe, for a cup of coffee on Wednesday and didn't recognize a single person in there," laughed Russell. "The program is something we've worked on every day and is something we're very proud of, and we've reaped the rewards. During the down days in 2009 and 2010, it was the safety net of the industry. Now, it's helping with some of the later books.

All sales companies like to claim they have the widest, deepest and most global buying bench, but Keeneland proves it year after year. From early in the sale, we had Qataris, Russians, Europeans, Japanese, Koreans, South Americans, Panamanians, South Africans, Australians...you name it."

Russell said it was too early to say whether Keeneland would continue to tweak the September format, but it was clear

sale officials feel they've found a winning formula. "Our goal [with the expanded Book 1] was to make sure that people had time to look at all the horses, and that we didn't have any slipping through the cracks," he said. "I think we achieved that."

Russell said, more than anything, the 2013 September Sale found a crucial equilibrium that can be tough to achieve. "Consignors are making money," he said. "Breeders are making money. Buyers are getting good value. It's not a silly market. Buyers will stretch a little bit, but they ultimately have a limit on what they'll pay. It was a very fair sale." **KEESEP Toppers p13**

And the Leaders Are...

For the ninth time in the last 11 years, Taylor Made Sales Agency concluded as September's leading consignor by gross, with 254 horses sold for \$31,313,500 (\$123,281 average). Taylor Made's top-priced lot was a Tiznow half-sister to Speightstown who sold to Borges Torrealba/TCF for \$1.75 million.

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Shadwell Estate Company was September's leading buyer by gross. Representatives of the international stable purchased 27 horses for \$11.6 million, an average of \$429,630. Interestingly, given its status as the sale's leading buyer, Shadwell signed for only one seven-figure horse, the \$1 million Tapit--Evrobi filly. However, Shadwell was the underbidder on several top lots, including the sale-topping \$2.5 million War Front--Blading Gold Ring colt.

It was the third time in the last four years Shadwell was September's leading buyer. In 2012, it landed 17 horses for \$8.25 million (\$485,294 average), including the sale-topping \$1.65 million Heyaarat (Distorted Humor). In 2010, Shadwell bought 22 horses for \$8,230,000 (\$374,091 average).

"The resiliency of this industry is remarkable," said Keeneland's Geoffrey Russell. "Last year we had seven million-dollar horses, and each was bought by an individual [buying group]. This year, we had 18 that brought more than a million dollars from 15 individual buyers. That's incredible. The fact that it's spread out means that people are willing to step up, and maybe it means that they've noticed that Sheikh Mohammed has stepped back."

While Sheikh Hamdan upped his September buying, his brother, Darley's Sheikh Mohammed, was relatively quiet. Darley rep John Ferguson purchased nine horses for \$2,775,000 (\$308,333). That's not insignificant money, and it's well above the \$895,000 Ferguson spent last year for just four horses (\$223,750). But of course it pales in comparison to, say, the more than \$59.9 million Sheikh Mohammed spent in 2006 for 34 horses (\$1,763,088 average). Back then, it was hard for many to imagine a yearling market not dominated by Sheikh Mohammed, and even as recently as 2011, Ferguson was the sale's leading buyer, with 36 bought for \$8,870,000 (\$246,389 average). But it's now been four years since Sheikh Mohammed bought a horse for seven figures at September, and the market has adapted incredibly well to Sheikh Mohammed's decreased participation.

Over the past few years, a remark heard often from consignors is that "the target has gotten smaller" for buyers, meaning that buyers had become less forgiving of conformational flaws and veterinary issues. With a reduced number of yearlings on the market and an increase of buyers, some think the target got slightly larger in the past two weeks. "During the first week, people were still very critical, and vetting was very tough," said Paramount Sales's Pat Costello. "But during the second week, they were a bit more forgiving. We had two that went through in the last few days that both had significant vet issues, and they went into the ring without reserves. One brought \$25,000, the other brought \$30,000."

Not So Quiet On the 'Front'...

If there was a "breakthrough sire" award at September, it would undoubtedly go to Claiborne's **War Front** (Danzig). The 11-year-old, whose oldest runners are now five, entered September boasting a sterling 2013 record. He was a top five sire by progeny earnings, and sported no fewer than 10 graded/group winners on the year--from 116 runners.

It isn't just that War Front's progeny are winning stakes--it is where, on what surfaces, and over what distances. In America, his runners include Departing, recent winner of the nine-furlong GII Super Derby on dirt, as well as the Grade II-winning grass performers Bashart and War Dancer. In Europe, War Front's horses include the GI Queen Anne S. winner Declaration of War, who recently proved his effectiveness over 10 1/2 furlongs in the G1 Juddmonte International S.

The versatility of War Front's offspring means they are hugely appealing to international buyers, and that demand helped push the value his stock through the ceiling at September. He was, behind Tapit, the sale's second-leading sire by gross and average, with 35 horses selling for \$14,057,000--an average of \$401,629.

War Front's meteoric rise as a commercial sire is best judged by looking back at past sales results. In 2009, the year his first yearlings sold, he saw 42 yearlings sell for an average of \$34,055. Of those, only three sold for six figures, led by two that brought \$180,000, including the future Grade II winner Soldat.

A year later, 34 War Front yearlings sold for an average of \$38,542. Five brought six figures. By 2011, his runners were making themselves known on the track, and his 20 yearlings that sold averaged \$202,244. Last year, his average jumped to \$230,724 from 32 yearlings sold, and he was represented by his first seven-figure yearling, the recent maiden winner Mosler, a \$1.05 million KEESEP grad. Four others made more than \$300,000.

By comparison, War Front's 2013 yearlings have dwarfed those figures. At September alone, he was represented by two seven-figure horses, the \$2.5 million topper out of Blading Gold Ring, and a \$1 million colt from the family of Departing. Coolmore's M.V. Magnier signed for both. Another five of those horses made more than \$500,000. Including results from Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga sale, a total of 21 War Front yearlings have sold for more than \$300,000 this year--more than four times as many as in 2012. The 43 War Front yearlings that have sold this year (from 52 on offer) have averaged \$385,279.

By comparison, War Front's 2013 yearlings have dwarfed those figures. At September alone, he was represented by two seven-figure horses, the \$2.5 million topper out of Blading Gold Ring, and a \$1 million colt from the family of Departing. Coolmore's M.V. Magnier signed for both. Another five of those horses made more than \$500,000. The 43 War Front yearlings that have sold this year (from 52 on offer) have averaged \$385,279.

That average is especially impressive because it was achieved by mares bred on a \$15,000 fee, meaning that those War Front yearlings selling at September largely didn't sport the same pedigree power as many others. To wit, from the 27 War Front yearlings to sell out of Keeneland's Book 1, only two were out of stakes-winning dams. Another two were half-siblings to stakes winners. The rest didn't have a stakes win under the first dam. Going a bit deeper, only eight of the 27 (30%) had a Grade I winner anywhere under the second dam. And yet those horses averaged \$475,000 and sold for a median of \$360,000.

These numbers speak to the respect accorded to War Front by buyers, and to the commercial promise his yearlings could have in the coming years.

The sale's leading sire was Gainesway's Tapit, with 38 horses sold for \$15,670,000 (\$412,368), including an impressive four who reached the seven-figure plateau. Those yearlings included a \$1.55 million half-sister to GISW and yesterday's GI Cotillion S. runner-up Sweet Lulu (Mr. Greeley); a \$1.2 million half to GISW Justin Phillip (First Samurai), et al; a \$1 million half-brother to the graded winners Heart Ashley (Lion Heart) and Ashley's Kitty (Tale of the Cat); and a \$1 million full-sister to GISW Tell a Kelly.

"The stallions that helped lead this sale, War Front and Tapit, got their the hard way," said Keeneland's Geoffrey Russell. "They started out with low stud fees, and their progeny have put them in the places where they are today."

Panamanian Family Busy at September...

One buying group still around on the last day at September was the Panamanian family of Alberto "Droopy" Paz-Rodriguez. Rodriguez is Panama's premier trainer and one of the world's leading conditioners by wins--the Hall of Famer is closing in on a staggering 6,000 victories. He's also a longtime Keeneland clients. "I've been coming here since 1968," Rodriguez said.

Shopping at Keeneland with three of his sons, Alberto Jr., Luigi and Juan Carlos, Rodriguez and the members of his group signed for no fewer than 27 horses at September, primarily in the \$10-20,000 range. Most or all of their buys will now ship to either Panama or South America. **Cont. p16**

The Rodriguezes shop for themselves and several outside clients, including Panama's leading stud farm Haras Cerro Punta, which stands, among others, Concerto, sire of the very good young stallion Bellamy Road. The men under several names, including J. C. Farm, which secured 11 horses for \$193,500 (\$17,591 average). The purchases lean heavily toward colts, and toward stout, two-turn pedigrees. Among J. C. Farm's acquisitions are colts by Awesome Again, Blame, Lemon Drop Kid, Pleasantly Perfect, Mineshaft and Stephen Got Even.

"Stephen Got Even is a horse that's worked well in Panama," said Juan Carlos, pointing to the page of [hip 3495](#), a colt by the Lane's End sire who went for \$15,000. "The track in Panama [Hipodromo Presidente Remon] is very deep, and those horses with two-turn pedigrees like his tend to do very well down there."

Panama's tropical climate leaves the track susceptible to torrential downpours, and finding horses that can handle the mud is another consideration. "We've found that sires like Broken Vow do very well there because of that," added Alberto Jr., who also trains at Hipodromo Presidente Remon.

Because of budget constraints, the Rodriguezes must be forgiving about certain issues. "Since we don't pinhook, and since we're training a lot of them ourselves, we can take a chance with some of those [with vet issues]," Juan Carlos, a bloodstock agent, explained.

Like many at September, the Rodriguezes found the competition at September "brutal," laughed Alberto Jr. "It's been very tough in there."

The men said they weren't the only Panamanians at the sale. "There must be 30 more here," said Alberto Jr.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Gold Cup Duo Head Pletcher Saturday Workers...

GI Whitney H. hero **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song) and GI Belmont S. winner **Palace Malice** (Curlin) were two of the more prominent names on the Belmont worktab Saturday morning as they prepare for next Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup on Long Island. Unraced since successfully stretching out to nine panels for the Whitney, Cross Traffic breezed five furlongs in 1:00.52 in the company of **Graydar** (Unbridled's Song), who is penciled in for a start in the GII Kelso H. the same afternoon. Graydar has won three straight races, including the GI Donn H. Feb. 9 and the GII New Orleans H. Mar. 30. "I thought Cross Traffic and Graydar worked very well," Pletcher stated. "It's the third consecutive breeze they've had together. It served them both well. In company, they stay more focused without overdoing it. We wanted to make sure we got a good solid work into both of them. One of them is coming off a significant layoff and the other hasn't run since the Whitney, and I think we got what we were looking for."

Palace Malice, victorious in the GII Jim Dandy S. prior to a troubled passage when fourth in the GI Travers S. Aug. 24, went on his own and covered four furlongs in :49.29, according to Equibase clockers. "I thought Palace Malice's was more of the standard we've seen from him," Pletcher said. "It was a good steady breeze with a very strong gallop out. He went willingly on his own, in hand, and we were very, very pleased with it. He looked well this morning and judging by his race in the Belmont, he likes it here." **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) turned in his first published workout since faltering when seventh as the favorite in the Travers, going an easy half-mile in :49.10. He will train up to the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, according to Pletcher. A pair of distaffers from the barn also appeared on the worktab. **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior), who bypassed her peers in Saturday's GI Cotillion S. at Parx in favor of next weekend's GI Beldame S., went four furlongs in company with **Authenticity** (Quiet American), also a candidate for the Belmont race, but also under consideration for Santa Anita's GI Zenyatta S. "I thought Princess of Sylmar went very well, as usual, and once again, they made good mates," said Pletcher.

Brown Set for Busy Saturday...

Trainer Chad Brown will have his work cut out for him on the weekend, as he saddles Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Big Blue Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) and **Real Solution** (Kitten's Joy) in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational and **Last Gunfighter** (First Samurai) in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. The Ramsey duo, exiting victories in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. and the GI Arlington Million (via DQ), respectively, breezed five-eighths of a mile on the grass, with Real Solution clocked in 1:02.38, one one-hundredth of a second faster than his stable companion. "I'm planning on running them both," said Brown. "It's not ideal, but we're just going to have to go with it. I didn't want to run them together until the Breeders' Cup, but my hands are a bit tied. Hopefully, one of them wins. The timing of the race should set them up for the Breeders' Cup, and with not having to ship for your race right before the Breeders' Cup, perhaps it won't be as hard of a race on them." Last Gunfighter has racked up an imposing bankroll while winning seven of his eight starts since being transferred to the Brown stable, including a head success in the Gill Philip H. Iselin S. at Monmouth Park Aug. 18. However, he was no match for the likes of fellow Gold Cup aspirant Flat Out (Flatter) when runner-up in the Gill Suburban H. July 6, and he'll need to step it up to be a factor in the race. "He's been a very consistent horse," the conditioner offered. "He's going to need to come with his career-best race. He's not Grade 1 tested, but he's been a very consistent horse at the level he's been running. He's going to have to take a big step forward, I think."

CHINA STAGES INTERNATIONAL RACEDAY

The China Equine Cultural Festival, an event co-hosted by the China Horse Club, yesterday staged the first internationally recognized card of racing in Hohhot, Inner Mongolia. The event played host to a number of international racing figures, including stewards, racing officials, veterinarians, trainers, sponsors, vendors and media from all corners of the globe. The event received support from the Singapore Turf Club, Irish Turf Club, France Galop, the Macau Jockey Club, and

Arena Racing, and those in attendance included Louis Romanet, President of the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities; John Warren, Bloodstock Advisor to The Queen; Mark Webster, Managing Director of Inglis; Antony Thompson, Chairman of AusHorse, and Rogers Beasley, Vice President of Racing at Keeneland.

The eight-race card featured four races for local Thoroughbred and four for imported Thoroughbreds, of which 39 were brought into the country and auctioned to local owners last week. The winner of the feature event, the US\$163,389 National Breeders Cup, was the now China Horse Club-owned **Beat of the Drum (Ire)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}). Jockey Joao Moreira, who recently made history when riding eight winners on a card at Kranji in Singapore, was one of a handful of international riders at the event, and he won the France Galop Gold Cup aboard **Surrealist (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}). The other winners were **Nassau (Aus)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) in the Longines Mile, and **Outpost (Ire)** (Giant's Causeway).

"The response to the CECF Race Meeting has been tremendous," said Mr. Teo Ah Khing, chairman of the China Horse Club. "It is an important step for China and the emergence of a Thoroughbred industry here. Our friends from other Thoroughbred regions have provided fantastic support, and we thank them for it."

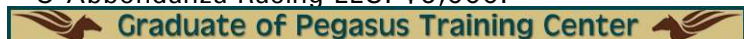
