IT'S A DUNDEEL TO ARROWFIELD

Five-time Australian Group 1 winner **It's A Dundee** (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}--Stareel {NZ}), by Zabeel {NZ} will retire to Arrowfield Stud in 2014 upon the completion of his racing career.

The 4-year-old, who on Saturday handed the previously undefeated champion mare Atlantic Jewel (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) her first defeat in the G1 Underwood S., swept last season's Australian 3-year-old Triple Crown of the G1 Randwick Guineas, G1 Rosehill Guineas and G1 Australian Derby. He also won last season's G1 Spring Champion S. for trainer Murray Baker, making him the first horse to win all four of Sydney's Group 1 open 3-year-old events.

"It's A Dundee's pedigree combines the brilliance and classic stamina of Sadler's Wells and Zabeel infused with the incomparable speed of Luskin Star to create a racehorse of superlative quality over a range of distances," said Arrowfield's Chairman John Messara. "It's A Dundee's Underwood success--his fifth Group 1 win--highlights both his weight-for-age class and the turn of foot he had previously demonstrated in his emphatic seven-length victory in the Rosehill Guineas. He is indeed the real deal."

Murray Anderson, It's A Dundee's breeder and part owner as part of the Transtasman Syndicate, added: "We're delighted that Arrowfield has agreed to stand It's A Dundee, because it secures his place on a major Australian stallion roster that will give him the opportunity he deserves."

Arrowfield has noted It's A Dundee will be syndicated at a later time.

ORB WORKS AT FAIR HILL

Stuart S. Janney III and Phipps Stable's GI Kentucky Derby hero **Orb** (Malibu Moon) breezed five furlongs in 1:01 flat yesterday morning as he prepares to face older horses for the first time in Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational S. at Belmont. "He looked very well and I was very pleased with him," said Hall of Fame trainer Shug McGaughey. Of why he has kept the homebred, most recently third in the GI Travers S. Aug. 24, at Fair Hill, the conditioner said, "He likes it there and he's done well there. I don't see any sense in bringing him out of there." Orb was expected to ship from Maryland today. Also working for McGaughey Monday were Saturday's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational contender **Boisterous** (Distorted Humor) (4f on the Belmont turf in :48.56) and next week's GI Champagne S. hopeful **Honor Code** (A.P. Indy) (5f in 1:01.54 over the Belmont main track). Of the latter, an impressive last-to-first debut winner at Saratoga Aug. 31, McGaughey said, "He worked very well with a good, solid five-eighths and galloped out strong."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Capo Bastone to Turf Sprint...

Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners's GI King's Bishop S. upsetter **Capo Bastone** (Street Boss) will train up to the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, it was announced Monday. "Historically, Capo Bastone has put forth his most brilliant performances with significant spacing

between his races, which is the reason we've opted not to provide the colt with a traditional prep race between the [Aug. 28] King's Bishop and the Breeders' Cup," Eclipse's President Aron Wellman said in a release. "As for determining which Breeders' Cup race to target, [trainer] Todd [Pletcher] and I put a lot of thought into it, as his versatility lends itself to various options. When we honed in on the race we thought would give Capo the best chance to win, the Turf Sprint made the most sense, despite the unconventional nature of running a horse in a Championship race over a surface he has never competed on previously."

While Capo Bastone has never run on grass, he earned the ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ for a fast-closing debut score on the Del Mar Polytrack last August while in the care of John Sadler. "Capo Bastone has breezed very well on the turf and the downhill layout of the hillside turf course at Santa Anita is absolutely a made-to-order design for his late-running style," Wellman added. "Although it's technically a 6 1/2-furlong race, due to its' configuration, the course plays much closer to a mile and come-from-behind elongated sprinters tend to be extremely effective in this race."

Joel Rosario, whose lone ride on Capo Bastone was a third in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, has committed to ride the sophomore in the Turf Sprint. Irad Ortiz, Jr. was aboard for the King's Bishop. "Irada (Ortiz) rode a flawless race in the King's Bishop. There is no disputing that and we are grateful for the spectacular ride he put up that day. However, the downhill turf course at Santa Anita is the most unique configuration of any race in America. Familiarity with the nuance of the circuit is absolutely critical for a jockey. Timing as to how to maneuver and when is emphasized beyond articulation. So, for this race, we thought it important to have a jockey who had plenty of prior big race experience over the course and Joel fit the bill."


Capo Bastone had his first published work since the King's Bishop Saturday, breezing four furlongs in company with MGISW stablemate Verrazano (More Than Ready) in :49.11.

Havana Heads Pletcher Worktab...

As usual, trainer Todd Pletcher was busy Monday morning with several members of his juvenile troupe heading to Belmont's training track. Among those getting a tightener ahead of the Oct. 5 GI Champagne S. was ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Havana (Dunkirk), who graduated going 5 1/2 furlongs at Saratoga Aug. 23. A \$575,000 Barretts March purchase for John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, the grey

covered five furlongs in 1:00.85, the fastest of 17 moves at the distance yesterday.

"He's trained very well since his maiden win and he breezed well today, so we're looking forward to the Champagne," said Pletcher. "He's always been a very good work

horse, including when he worked :9 3/5 [the fastest 1/8th] at Barretts [this year]. But, he hasn't run since he won his maiden race on Aug. 23 and we're stretching him out to a mile in a Grade I race. While we don't want to overdo it, at the same time we want to make sure we do enough with him to have him ready to run a good race at a mile against what looks like some of the best 2-year-olds around."

Also campaigned by the Coolmore team, **Corfu** (Malibu Moon) was given a sharpener before an intended start in Sunday's GII Futurity S. Earning his badge by a half length going five panels at the Spa July 25, he nosed out Wired Bryan (Stormy Atlantic) in the GII Saratoga Special S. Aug. 11. In his latest start, the \$675,000 Barretts March juvenile purchase finished ninth in a muddy renewal of the Sept. 2 GI Hopeful S. The colt worked four panels in :48.63, the eighth-fastest of 55 at the distance Monday.

"It was very standard for him, which is generally a good breeze," said Pletcher. "He was in hand, against the bridle and I was very happy with him."

As for his lackluster effort in the Hopeful, Pletcher added, "It seems like he bounced out of the Hopeful in good order, and hopefully, we can put that race on a bad racetrack behind us and get back to the way he ran in his first two starts."

Heading the ladies was ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Sweet Whiskey** (Old Fashioned), who is expected to make her next start in Sunday's GII Matron S. The filly negotiated four furlongs over the training track in :49.69. It was the 30th-fastest of 55 at the distance.

"She is pretty fast, which is why we tried to slow her down [yesterday] morning," said Pletcher. "Since she just ran in the [GI Spinaway S.] not too long ago, and we didn't want her to overdo it before the race. We gave her a nice, easy half by herself and she did it well." Cont. p5

A \$300,000 OBSMAR purchase by Alto Racing, the bay kicked off her career with an impressive 5 1/4-length victory going 5 1/2 furlongs at the Spa Aug. 11 before coming home fourth--beaten 16 lengths--in the Sept. 1 Spinaway.

"She got a little warm in the paddock, which is not normal for her," revealed Pletcher. "Of course, it was run on a sloppy track and [jockey] John Velazquez did not seem to think she handled it that well. So we just put a line through it and regroup and try again."

Also among Pletcher juvenile fillies to take to the track Monday was Repole Stables' **Stopchargingmaria** (Tale of the Cat), who scored by 5 1/2 lengths at the Spa July 19, but had to settle for second--beaten 5 3/4 lengths--in a sloppy edition of the Spinaway. She is expected to make her next start in the Oct. 5 GI Frizette S.

Another ♀ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♀ which helped Pletcher earn his 10th Saratoga training title this summer, WinStar's **King Cyrus** (Bellamy Road) was given a spin over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track yesterday morning. The colt negotiated four furlongs in :49.46, the 20th-fastest of 70 at the distance Monday. A flashy 11-length winner in a seven furlong test at the Spa Aug. 5, he failed to handle the mud and came home a well-beaten eighth in his latest assailment in the Hopeful.

"We're keeping an eye on the GI Breeders' Futurity [at Keeneland Oct. 5], but we're also considering stepping back into an allowance race, possibly at Keeneland, so I'll talk to [WinStar's] Elliot Walden about that and come up with a firm plan," said Pletcher. "We're leaning towards taking a step back after the Hopeful and trying a two-turn allowance race."

Also working at the Spa, **Bashart** (War Front), a front-running winner in the Aug. 29 GII With Anticipation S., covered four panels in :49.90 over the Oklahoma track. It was the 29th fastest of 70 at the distance. The handsome bay was a credible third in his career bow going six panels on the Belmont sod July 12 before breaking through with a narrow win stretching to a mile and a sixteenth at Saratoga Aug. 18. According to Pletcher, the Rosedown Racing turfer is expected to make his next start in either the Oct. 6 GIII Pilgrim S. at Belmont or Keeneland's GIII Bourbon S. the same afternoon.

Fort Larned Works for Homecoming Classic...




Janis Whitham's **Fort Larned** (E Dubai), prepping in Saturday evening's inaugural Homecoming Classic at Churchill Downs for a title defense in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, worked five panels under the Twin Spires in 1:02.40 (27/40) Monday. "I wasn't looking for anything sharp--I didn't want to break any records," trainer Ian Wilkes said. "It's the way he did it. He relaxed early and [rider Brian Hernandez Jr.] let him punch. The horse is ready. He finished up good, got home good and galloped out strong. We're ready to go." An explosive 6 1/4-length winner over a strong field in the track-and-trip GI Stephen Foster H. June 15, the homebred was most recently fifth in Saratoga's GI Whitney H. Aug. 3. In a year in which the older handicap division has been particularly strong, Wilkes is already thinking about the tough his charge will be faced with at Santa Anita in just over a month.

"Someone said the other day that this is probably the strongest Breeders' Cup [Classic] that we've seen in a long time," Wilkes said. "That's the way it's shaping up. You want everyone to stay sound and get there in good form. It's going to be a tremendous race."

Also working for the Homecoming Classic Monday was Zayat Stables colorbearer **Prayer for Relief** (Jump Start). The Steve Asmussen trainee, who most recently annexed Remington Park's Governor's Cup Aug. 17, covered four panels at Churchill in an easy :50.20 (42/66). Rounding out the field is **Pool Play** (Silver Deputy), **Windswept** (Arch), **Golden Ticket** (Speightstown), **Worldly** (A.P. Indy) and **Agent Di Nozzo** (Ghostzapper).

The Zayat Stables-owned pair of **Justin Phillip** (First Samurai) and **Fast Bullet** (Speightstown) each worked Monday morning for their respective trainers. Justin Phillip, stabled with Steve Asmussen's Belmont Park string, breezed four panels in an easy :50.12 (49/69) as he eyes a start in Saturday's GI Vosburgh Invitational. A winner of the GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga two back Aug. 4, the 5-year-old comes off a third-place run in the GI Forego S. Aug. 31. Fast Bullet, meanwhile, worked the same distance for conditioner D. Wayne Lukas in :50.66 (49/66) at Churchill Downs. The  **"TDN Rising Star"**  bested Justin Phillip earlier this year in Belmont's June 2 GI True North H., but was seventh in the Forego after transferring from Bob Baffert to Lukas. "Justin Phillip breezed very well," offered Racing Manager Justin Zayat. "He is ready for the Vosburgh. Fast Bullet also breezed very well. Coach was very happy with him. We don't have any race right now [planned for him]. We will know more in a couple weeks."

Fabre Has Four in Mind for Arc...

Andre Fabre yesterday highlighted his quartet of protagonists for next Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, with **Intello (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) confirmed a definite runner. Successful in Saturday's G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange over 10 furlongs at that venue, the Wertheimers' G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero will lead the charge to provide the multiple champion trainer with an eighth edition. Also in the mix are Khalid Abdullah's G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), Prince Faisal's **Ocovango (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}) and Godolphin's Listed Prix Turenne scorer **Penglai Pavilion** (Monsun {Ger}). "Flintshire will run if it is good, Penglai Pavilion will run too, with Ocovango we are watching the weather as he likes it softer and of course Intello will run," Fabre told *PA Sport*. "Intello was not impressive at the weekend, but I didn't want him to be. All I wanted was for him to have a nice, confident race. I don't like my horses to be impressive in their trials. I think all of them deserve to run, but you wouldn't say any of them are the favorites. The one with the class is Intello." Intello, who has yet to race beyond the 1 5/16-mile trip of the Chantilly Classic, remains an unknown regarding the exacting 12 furlongs of the Arc, and Fabre is in the dark as to whether he will stay. "Obviously there is a question mark about his stamina, but class brings stamina," he added. "They either stay or they don't. I'm sure some pedigree experts will tell me he won't stay, but we will find out."

LADY CECIL TO CONTINUE AT WARREN PLACE

Lady Cecil ended speculation as to the future of Warren Place yesterday by declaring that she will continue to be at the helm of the famous Newmarket establishment. Having been granted an emergency licence by the British Horseracing Authority in June following the death of her husband Sir Henry Cecil, she has sent out 31 winners including the G2 Ribblesdale S. scorer Riposte (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and boasts a strike-rate of 24%. Speaking on her late husband's website, she commented. "I have spoken to our owners and our staff and confirmed that it is my intention to carry on as trainer at Warren Place. I have also talked to the British Horseracing Authority about plans to continue and have signed up to complete the training licence modules through the winter. It is too early to discuss stable string plans for next year and, in terms of our numbers, the yearling sales at Tattersalls are likely to have a bearing." **Cont. p8**

SO MANY WAYS RETIRED, SOLD TO JAPAN

Grade I winner **So Many Ways** (Sightseeing--Happy Scene, by Dehere) has been retired from racing and sold by owner Maggi Moss to Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm in Japan. A \$22,000 Fasig-Tipton October yearling, the bay annexed the first three starts of her career last year as a juvenile, including Saratoga's GI Spinaway S. last August. Transferred from conditioner Tony Dutrow to Tom Amoss earlier this season, So Many Ways annexed Churchill's GIII Eight Belles S. at Churchill in May and finished off her career with a decisive tally in Saturday's \$400,000 Charles Town Oaks. She retires with a career record of 10-5-0-2 and earnings of \$717,148.

So Many Ways cont.

"I am grateful to Jim Schenck of Lexington, Kentucky for discovering this filly, and to Franklin Smith of Elloree, South Carolina for developing her," said Moss in a release. "I would also like to thank Tony Dutrow for the irreplaceable memories of her wins at Saratoga, and the amazing job he did with her. I am grateful for the exceptional job Tom Amoss did this year in understanding her and loving her as much as I did in her gutsy and amazing wins in 2013. Most of all, it is not her tenaciousness or athleticism that I will remember, but her kind and almost human personality, that made this decision so difficult. I am confident that her new home with Mr. Yoshida, alongside Azeri, Zazu, Musical Romance and other great mares, that she will be amongst royalty and taken care of in the same loving and wonderful environment. Albeit, a very difficult decision, I know she will be loved as much as we all loved her and live a life fit for the queen that she is."

RICHARD LAND: MESSAGE TO NYRA OR ITS PRIVATE SUCCESSORS

That message would be: Do not waste another dollar marketing the racing product to "families" or "casual fans."

Next week at Monmouth, there will be lunch trucks and craft brewers on the grounds. Apparently there is a mini golf course/putting range adjacent to the track now. About seven minutes from the main entrance at Monmouth is Seven Presidents State Park, a very serene and beautiful beach, especially at this time of year. The restaurants and taverns in Monmouth County have always been friendly to your correspondent. Drive about 20 minutes from the track out on Rt. 537, pull your vehicle over, watch the Thoroughbreds frolicking in the fields, maybe go to one of the local farm stands and get some excellent Jersey corn or tomatoes. Within about 30 miles of Monmouth's gates, there are any number of golf courses which are open to the public and quite playable.

I could write a chamber of commerce friendly paragraph, like the one above, about Saratoga. Monmouth County and Saratoga Springs are family

friendly places, and I might say that with the amount of memories I've accumulated in both of these spots, I always feel like I am among family there, even when alone.

But what about Aqueduct and Belmont, where the majority of NYRA racing is conducted? Yeah, sure, family comes to mind at these places. The Manson family. The Addams family. The five traditional NYC organized crime families.

The fan base is not at the track where the races are being run anymore. The fan base is at other tracks and OTBs and living room downs-like facilities all over the country, all over the world. In none of these places does NYRA have any kind of exclusive, however. If I drove to the Meadowlands or Winners in Bayonne, or just dropped my butt on the comfy couch at Living Room Downs, I might have a choice of what, 10 or 12 tracks running at the same time as NYRA. NYRA is wasting any money they spend to get fannies in the seats at the NYRA facilities, yet they are doing nothing to make loyal customers out of the tens of thousands of people who are wagering remotely each day.

Let me repeat: Without any marketing effort on the part of NYRA, tens of thousands of people are attending simulcast facilities, OTBs, and logging on for one purpose: to bet on horse racing. The idea is for NYRA to improve its racing product and its image so that folks like Fairmount's regular Saturday crew over in Collinsville want to bet most, if not all, of their bankroll on the NYRA product. **Cont. p10**

Stop catering to a group of insiders who have continued to devalue the breed by operating a self serving program built on restricted races.

It should not be so difficult to be an industry leader in an industry which is in such a state of disarray, so dysfunctional.

If Ward, June, Wally and the Beaver wander into Belmont or Aqueduct, hell, show 'em a good time, but they are not the future of racing. The future of racing will be heading to simulcast facilities, and firing up the hardware at Living Room Downs.... TODAY. Could somebody please do anything to improve something TODAY, rather than whining about political uncertainty and how racing is going to be wiped out by casinos?

G1 Kentucky Derby and G1 Dubai World Cup winner **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}--Dalia {Ger}, by Acatenango {Ger}) has had six mares scanned in foal, according to Arrowfield Stud in Australia.
