THREE-PEAT FOR FLAT OUT?

When they line up for the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Saturday afternoon, Preston Racing's **Flat Out**

(Flatter) will have the chance to join elite company by winning his third consecutive renewal of the race. The 1 1/4-mile race is a 'Win and You're In' event for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Nov. 2.

"I think it's great a horse can participate in it

three times in a row," said Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott. "It's a testament to the horse's durability and class."

Last year, Flat Out became the 10th horse to take consecutive editions of the 1 1/4-mile Jockey Club Gold Cup, joining Kelso, who won five straight from 1960-64; Mad Hatter (1921-22), Dark Secret (1933-34), Nashua (1955-56), Shuvee (1970-71), Slew o'Gold (1983-84), Creme Fraiche (1986-87), Skip Away (1996-97) and Curlin (2007-08). Creme Fraiche finished fourth in his bid for a third victory in 1988, while Skip Away was third in his attempt at the hat trick in 1998.

A SIGHT TO BEHOLD

Reigning juvenile filly champ **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) has already fashioned a pretty impressive season thus far, having won three of five starts, including the Mar. 2 GI Las Virgenes S. and the GI Santa Anita Oaks Apr. 6. Facing arguably her toughest challenge yet, the Spendthrift Farm runner will have to contend with her elders for the first time in Saturday's GI Zenyatta S., a 'Win and You're In' event for the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Breaking from post 3, Beholder will be ridden by Hall of Fame jockey Gary Stevens. "Well, we'll run her on Saturday

and then point to the Breeders' Cup; more likely to the Distaff, unless we see something this weekend that makes us think we ought to go shorter into the seven-eighths race [BC Filly & Mare Sprint]." Stretched out to nine furlongs for the May 3 GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs, Beholder prompted an earnest pace and had to settle for second behind closer Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior), who went on to win the GI Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Alabama S. in her next two starts. Given a significant respite after her game effort in the Kentucky Oaks, Beholder returned to win over Del Mar's Polytrack in the one-mile Torrey Pines S. Sept. 1. When asked about the mid-season layoff, trainer Richard Mandella explained, "I've had my best luck in the Breeders' Cup doing that. Going back to Kotashaan [Fr, Darshaan {GB}], I ran him hard at Santa Anita in the winter and gave him the Hollywood summer meet off, and then prepped him with a race at Del Mar and the Oak Tree meet, and it worked out well." Kotashaan, who won five Grade I's in 1993, including the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, closed out the season with Champion Turf Horse and Horse of the Year honors. "I believe if you've got something as big as the Breeders' Cup to point at, you'd better take that into consideration that you can't keep them at the top of the game all year long," he said. "So that's the reason [for the break]." And where does Mandella hope to see his filly Saturday? "She's always trained from off the pace in the morning just, because I've known she's always had the natural speed that we didn't have to teach her that," he explained. "And when we ran in the Kentucky Oaks, we set off with the leader and she ran very well. I think she's very competitive. It takes a pretty fast horse to set a pace for her, but if that happened [in the Zenyatta], I have never seen any reason that she wouldn't sit off of one or a couple and still give it her best shot." **Field p4**

In addition to his Gold Cup scores, Flat Out--who is five for six over Belmont's main track, has collected victories in the 2011 and 2013 runnings of the GII Suburban H. in addition to the GIII Westchester S. earlier this season. He also finished third in the GI Metropolitan H. in May. "He seems to handle the track well, which definitely is part of it," said Mott, who will also be represented by **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate) in the Gold Cup. "I also think there probably are a lot of factors that go into it, including that he comes into form at this time of year." Flat Out, who will be accompanied by Junior Alvarado, was erratic in the stretch before finishing a close-up second to **Alpha** (Bernardini)--who drew the five hole this time--in the Aug. 31 GI Woodward.

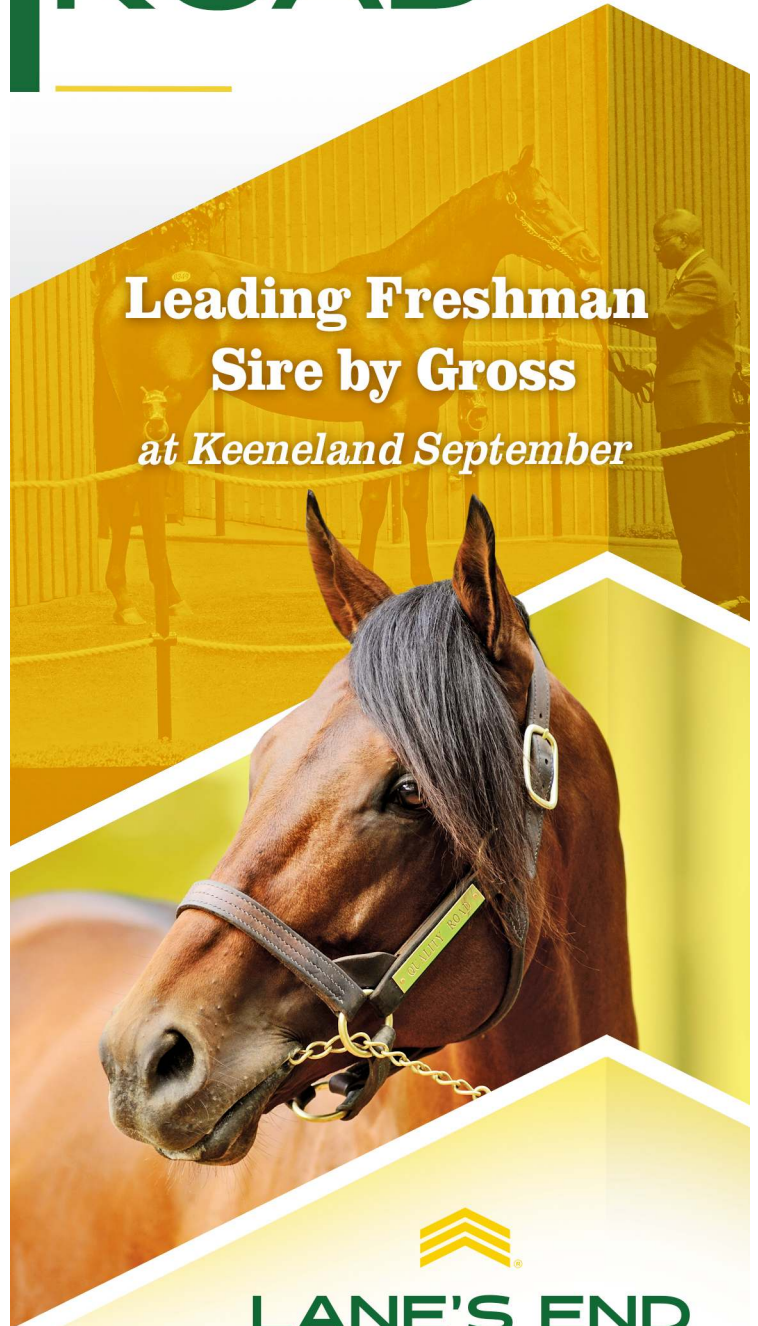
Kittens Abound...

Since July 1, owners Ken and Sarah Ramsey have won seven graded stakes on the grass, including a pair of Grade 1's with **Big Blue Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) and **Real Solution** (Kitten's Joy). In Saturday's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational, the duo--both trained by Chad Brown--will attempt to give their owners win number eight. Big Blue Kitten and Real Solution will join **Joes Blazing Aaron** (Graeme Hall)--trained by Mike Maker--to form a three-horse coupled entry installed as the 8-5 morning-line favorite for the 1 1/2-mile "Win and You're In" test for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 2. Big Blue Kitten, who breaks from post position three, seeks his third straight Grade I victory. His winning skein began with an off-the-pace score in the 11-furlong GI United Nations S. at Monmouth Park July 6 before adding a one-length win in the Aug. 17 GI Sword Dancer S. at Saratoga. Like the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic, the Sword Dancer is a 1 1/2-mile race. "He's finally getting those longer distances, and I think that, in combination with physically maturing, has him in top form, as long as the turf is firm," said Brown. "He's won two Grade I races in a row, so he should be a major player." Real Solution began his career in Italy, where he won a listed stakes in 2012 before being sent to Brown's barn over the winter. He was fourth in the GIII Fort Marcy S. at Belmont in May, third in the GI Woodford Reserve Manhattan H. in June, and finished second by a head after being bumped by first-place finisher The Apache (SAf) (Mogok) in the Aug. 17 GI Arlington Million. The stewards subsequently disqualified The Apache for interference. "We've always liked this horse," said Brown. "He's taken a little time to really find his stride, so to speak. He keeps improving with every race we run him, and it seems like he's sitting on another top effort. This horse has appreciated longer time with me, and he's still a relatively young horse. He hasn't been [1 1/2 miles], but with the way he was closing in the Million perhaps the distance won't bother him." Real Solution drew post 5 and will be ridden by Alan Garcia.

DAYJUR EUTHANIZED

European champion **Dayjur** (Danzig--Gold Beauty, Mr. Prospector) was euthanized at Shadwell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky yesterday due to the infirmities of old age. He was 26. "Dayjur was one great racehorse," said Rick Nichols, Shadwell Vice President. "He gave Sheikh Hamdan, and all of us at Shadwell, many great thrills, including his shadow-jumping antics [when disqualified from first in the 1990 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Belmont]. He was the cornerstone of our stallion operation, and he was a wonderful horse to be around. He will be deeply missed."

Bred by Georgia Hofmann in Kentucky, Dayjur was out of champion sprint mare Gold Beauty, making him a 3/4 brother to MGISW and bluehen mare Maplejinsky (Nijinsky II), the dam of Triple Tiara winner Sky Beauty (Rahy). Purchased as a yearling by Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum for \$1.65 million at the 1988 Keeneland July sale, the dark bay was turned over to Major Dick Hern, and under his tutelage, earned the titles of 1990 Horse of the Year, champion sprinter and 3-year-old in England, in addition to being named the highest rated sophomore colt in France at 5-7 furlongs. He won at the highest level in both France and England and appeared to be on his way to earning that distinction in America in the 1990 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but had to settle for second behind eventual champion Safely Kept after jumping a shadow in the stretch and losing by a neck. Dayjur retired to Shadwell Farm in 1991 with a record of 11-7-3-0 and earnings of \$750,550. At stud, he sired three champions and over 30 stakes winners.

TITLE SHOT

Newmarket's G3 Somerville Tattersall S. is often a significant staging post for classy juveniles, and today's edition sees an unbeaten Godolphin representative in **Silent Bullet (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) take aim. The homebred was successful over this trip at Haydock July 20 and Aug. 9, and trainer Saeed bin Suroor is looking forward to seeing him tested against better company here. "It is so far so good with him, in his last piece of work he worked well and I'm happy with him," bin Suroor said. "He is in good form, this is another step up so we will see how he goes." Another unexposed participant is Qatar Racing and Essafinaat's **God Willing (GB)** (Arch), who scored over this distance on debut at Newbury Aug. 16. "It's a bit of a quicker rise than we would ideally like, I think, but it's on our doorstep and it's part of a learning curve with him," trainer Ed Dunlop told *PA Sport*. "Like a lot of horses he had a bit of a dirty throat, which held him up, but he is a nice, big colt and anything he can do this year is a bonus."

"We're not quite sure where we're going with him, so we'll see how it goes." Julie Wood's **Championship (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) is on a comeback mission, having flopped when 14th of 15 behind War Command (War Front) in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 18. "Championship looked smart when winning first time out at Newbury, but he then came back jarred up after disappointing in the Coventry S. at Royal Ascot," trainer Richard Hannon said. "However, his enforced break has done him good, because he looks magnificent and has been moving better than he has ever done and, though it is a step up in class, he deserves a crack at a group race. I hope the ground has not dried up too much, but win or lose, he will be a lovely horse for next year."

TATTS LOOKS TO EXTEND RECORD RUN

After a handful of years of recession and correction, the global yearling sales market is once again on the rise, and nowhere was that more apparent than at last year's Tattersalls October Yearling Sale Book 1. With

the second smallest catalogue on offer since the sale has been conducted in its current format, Book 1 was building on a highly successful 2011 edition, where a record turnover of 51,634,000gns was established for a European yearling auction. Last year, a record gross for a day's selling at Book 1 was set

on day one and smashed each day thereafter, culminating in a new record gross of 68,102,500gns and the most expensive yearling sold at auction anywhere in the world in 2012, a Galileo (Ire) 3/4-brother to G1 Epsom Derby winner Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who was hammered down to Sheikh Fahad Al-Thani for 2.5-million guineas.

"The last two renewals of Book 1 and the October Yearling Sale have way exceeded expectations; not just ours, but I think everyone else's," said Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George. "So they're a hard act to follow, but equally, it's another exceptional catalogue for Book 1 this year. We feel that all the right ingredients are in place again."

This year's Book 1, set for Oct. 8-10 at Newmarket's Park Paddocks, has attracted 513 individuals, down from 577 last year. The October Sale will continue with four days of Book 2 Oct. 14-17, and a single session Book 3 Oct. 18.

Flipping through the pages of Book 1, buyers will find the half- or full-siblings to 46 Group 1 and Classic winners, and more than 250 Group and Listed winners. Some of the features on pedigree include [lot 407](#), a Galileo 3/4-brother to Authorized who is also a full to last year's sale topper; [lot 253](#), a Galileo full-sister to G1 Epsom Oaks winner Was (Ire), herself a 1.2-million gns purchase at Book 1 in 2010; [lot 67](#), a Sea The Stars (Ire) half-brother to G1 Epsom Derby winner Motivator (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}); [lot 209](#), a first-crop Lope De Vega (Ire) half-sister to G1 Sussex S. winner Toronado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}); [lot 42](#), an Acclamation (GB) half-brother to multiple Classic winner Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley); [lot 405](#), a half-sister to G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Power (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) by Galileo; [lot 197](#), a Shamardal half-brother to multiple Group 1 winner The Fugue (GB) (Dansili {GB}), and a Galileo full-sister to G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Roderic O'Connor (Ire).

The first foals out of Group 1-winning mares Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) ([lot 354](#), by Oasis Dream {GB}) and Lahaleeb (Ire) (Redback {GB}) ([lot 489](#)), by Galileo) will also be offered.

"I think the key to Book 1 is that it isn't just 513 fancy pedigrees," George noted. "These are some very, very smart individuals to match the world-class pedigrees, and that's what gets the leading buyers from throughout the world back to the sale year-on-year from Europe, the Gulf region, Japan, America, and Australia. That's what keeps them coming back. They find that combination of pedigree and conformation that makes it such a good sale."

All of the current top 15 sires standing in Britain and Ireland are represented in Book 1, headed by world leader Galileo--who sired the top six priced lots in last year's Book 1 and seven of the top 10 priced lots--with 47. He is followed by Invincible Spirit (Ire) with 28, Exceed and Excel (Aus) with 24, Teofilo (Ire) with 19, Shamardal with 18, Montjeu (Ire) and New Approach (Ire) with 17 each, Danehill Dancer (Ire) with 16, Oasis Dream (GB) and Dansili (GB) with 15 each, Acclamation (GB) and Pivotal (GB) with 14 apiece, and Dubawi with 10.

"One of the most exciting aspects of the sale, and also the whole European scene, is the quality of the stallions that are represented in the catalogues, and in particular in Book 1," George noted. "When you have 47 yearlings by a stallion the caliber of Galileo, who is the undisputed number 1 sire in the world, it's a major indication of quality. There are 130 in Book 1 by the current top six stallions in Britain and Ireland. These stallions are the very best in the world at the moment, and I think that's improved the profiles of the buyers we've had at Book 1 the last few years."

While the first season cast is unlikely to create the buzz that Sea The Stars did last year, it is nonetheless a highly respectable group, including G1 Prix Morny winner Arcano (Ire), dual G1 King's Stand S. winner Equiano (Fr), dual French Classic winner Lope De Vega (Ire), G1 2000 Guineas winner Makfi (GB), multiple Group 1 winning sprinter Paco Boy (Ire), multiple Group 1 winner Rip Van Winkle (Ire) and G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Vale of York (Ire). American-based first-season sires Blame and Lookin at Lucky are also represented by one yearling apiece.

"The first-crop sires this year are very exciting, and the strength and depth amongst the top-end European stallions is probably unprecedented in the last 50 years or so," George added.

The historic success of Book 1 graduates doesn't hurt, either. Since 2004, the sale has been responsible for 15 winners of 18 UK and Irish Classics, including Camelot, a 525,000gns purchase in 2010, who took down the rare Derby/Guineas double before adding the G1 Irish Derby; and this year's G1 St. Leger victor Leading Light (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), a 520,000gns buy in 2011. The sale has been responsible for 22 winners of 35 Group 1 races between 2011 and 2013. Some of those standouts include St. Nicholas Abbey (Ire), Rewilding (GB), Society Rock (Ire), Power and Joshua Tree (Ire), as well as U.S. Grade I winners Together (Ire) and Laughing (Ire). Sudirman became the first Group 1 winner from last year's draft when taking The Curragh's G1 Phoenix S. in August.

This year alone, Book 1 has been represented by six Group 1 winners of eight races, 48 Group and Listed winners, 57 2-year-old winners, 100 Group and Listed-placed horses, and 919 total winners.

Value Seekers Rejoice...

As evidenced by 2010 graduates Camelot and Was, that year's highest-priced colt and filly, respectively, it is far from uncommon for Book 1 toppers to go on to Group 1 glory. However, the sale also has a proven track record of turning out top-level performers at bargain prices. Between 2011 and 2013, Book 1 has produced 57 Group or Listed winners of 96 races that cost 100,000 guineas or less.

"Book 1 of the October Yearling Sale has produced the winners of the Derby, Oaks, 2000 Guineas, Irish Derby, Irish 2000 Guineas and Irish 1000 Guineas, in the last 15 months, at prices ranging from 39,000 guineas to 1.2 million guineas," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "It is the consistent combination of Classic quality at all levels of the market that sets Book 1 above all other European yearling sales."

Samitar (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who was purchased for 39,000gns in 2010 by Gill Richardson from her breeder Norman Court Stud, won Royal Ascot's G3 Albany S. in her second

outing as a 2-year-old for owner Martin Schwartz. She went on to add the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas before rerouting to the U.S., where she took last year's G1 Garden City S. at Belmont. Dual Group 1-winning sprinter Society Rock was picked out of Book 1 for 75,000gns in 2008 by BBA Ireland, while G1 Canadian International winner Sarah Lynx (Ire) cost 60,000, and dual American Grade I winner Dubawi Heights (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) cost 72,000 the same year. Mark Johnston picked up Godolphin's eventual G1 Gold Cup winner Colour Vision (Fr) (Rainbow Quest) for 100,000gns in 2009 and, more recently, this year's G1 Prix Jean Prat winner Havana Gold (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) cost Amanda Skiffington 80,000gns in 2010.

"I think it's very important that you get outstanding performers at all levels of the market," George said. "It's very important that year after year, Book 1 of the October Yearling Sale produces a higher percentage of Group winners than any other sale in Europe. That's as it should be--it is the premier yearling sale in Europe. Last year was an outstanding example, where you had the sale topper winning the Oaks--that was Was--and Camelot was the highest-priced colt in the sale. That's the profile of horse you want to see winning at the highest level, and they do on a regular basis. But equally, Group 1 winner Havana Gold cost 80,000gns at Book 1. It's equally important that the sale produces horses of that sort of quality at that sort of price. Book 2 has a fantastic reputation for producing very high-class animals in the middle market."

Number Two No More...

Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale Book 2 recorded encouraging results when stretched out to four sessions last year, and that format will be adopted once again this year. While the average of 39,390gns was down marginally from 39,818gns in 2011, the aggregate was up to 31,039,000gns, making it the second highest-grossing European yearling sale of the year, second only to Book 1. George noted it was a high volume of sales entries that caused the push out to four days, a fact that reflects the resurgence of the British and Irish bloodstock markets.

"We originally had in mind three days for Book 1 and three days for Book 2, but weight in numbers meant that we've had to add a day to Book 2, so it'll be exactly the same format as last year, with marginally fewer numbers overall," he explained. "I think it reflects the strength of the October Yearling Sale over the past few years, and that's why people want to sell their best yearlings here."

Book 2 has developed a reputation as a goldmine for value purchases, and that has never been more apparent than this year, with six of last year's graduates already successful at Group level. The list includes Rizeena (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}), who was scooped up by Rabbah Bloodstock for 50,000gns. Now racing in the colors of Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum, the bay filly took Royal Ascot's G2 Queen Mary S. in June and recently added the G1 Moyglare Stud S. Qatar Racing's Kiyoshi (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), an 80,000gns Book 2 purchase, was the impressive winner of Royal Ascot's G3 Albany S. and Lucky Kristale (GB) (Lucky Story), a 22,000gns buy, has put together back-to-back Group 2 wins.



A Million Reasons to Buy...

Prize money is arguably the greatest challenge facing British racing, and with the Tattersalls Millions race series, Tattersalls has crafted a scheme that gives owners the opportunity to race for large purses, and also keeps buyers coming back to Book 1 for more.

Tattersalls Millions is a series of six races for 2- and 3-year-olds worth £1.3 million. The races range from six to 10 furlongs, and are restricted to Book 1 graduates. The first set of four 2-year-old races takes place in September and October, highlighted by the £500,000 Tattersalls Millions 2YO Trophy, Europe's richest juvenile race. The additional two 3-year-old races take place in late April at Newmarket's Craven Meeting, headed by the £200,000 Tattersalls Millions 3YO Trophy.

The majority of the Millions winners since 2010 have been in the 30,000gns to 100,000 gns price range, and George said he believes the series is a success because it has encouraged the buyers in this bracket to return to the sale year after year.

"The key to it is that the profile of the winners of these races seems to be those up to the 100,000gns bracket," he said. "It's very encouraging to see owners come to Book 1 year after year with the view to buying horses in that middle market of Book 1 to target these races. We strongly believe it's added a new dimension to the sale. It gives people an opportunity to run for big prize money, and it's very important to put these races on to attract people at all levels of the market to what is an elite sale."

One buyer who has successfully employed this strategy is Julie Wood, who last year campaigned two of the series' winners under trainer Richard Hannon: Rougemont (Ire), a 70,000gns purchase who took the Tattersalls Millions 3YO Trophy, and Victrix Ludorum (Ire), who cost 75,000gns and doubled up in the Fillies' Median Auction S. and the 2YO Fillies' Trophy.

"I'm a great supporter of this type of race," Wood noted. "I think it's a nice incentive. When you're at the sale, you have it in the back of your mind that you're trying to buy a nice horse to be a Group performer, but at the same time if it can fit the profile of these races, it's a good achievement. Over the years we've bought some very nice horses from Tattersalls, and we've been fortunate that they've made it to the races and I've had them the following year and the year after, and we've won several [Millions races]."

Americans Invade Park Paddocks...

Park Paddocks has played host to buyers from across the globe at the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale in recent years, and not lost amongst the crowd have been American agents David Ingordo and Gatewood Bell, who have both been involved with several purchases that have already begun to earn their keep on the track.

Ingordo, working on behalf of Waratah Thoroughbreds' Paul Fudge, purchased eight youngsters from Book 1 last year, including a colt by Arch for 200,000gns. Now named Archean and trained in France by Andre Fabre, the colt won first out at Deauville Aug. 23, and was second Sept. 23 in a Chantilly conditions event under a penalty.

"That was the first one we bought out of Tatts last year," Ingordo noted. "It was our first runner and our first winner. That was very exciting. That was for Mr. Fudge, who is an international sportsman. We bought plenty of them there and they're all very nice. We've got some other ones we're pretty fond of."

Ingordo noted that Americans shopping at the European sales may be a way of bringing back some of the pedigrees that were lost when the reverse was the norm some 30 years ago.

"They have a tremendous sire selection there," he said. "It's an expensive sale, but it's a good way to reintroduce some of those bloodlines to America. It's sort of a reverse pioneering. The Europeans came over here in the 70s and 80s and bought those horses and brought them back, and now it's time for us to go and bring some of them back to America."

Bell, who purchased two fillies out of Book 1 for owner-breeder Everett Dobson in 2011, echoed Ingordo's sentiments.

"We had the idea to go over there and try to get some yearlings by the six or seven top sires, to bring some of that blood back to America, and hopefully they'd be good enough to keep in [Dobson's] broodmare band," Bell explained.

Cavetto (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), a now 3-year-old filly Bell purchased for Dobson for 100,000gns, broke her maiden at first asking on the turf at Saratoga for Christophe Clement Aug. 16. Bell described her as “a nice filly who just needed some time.”

Ingordo, who has been attending the October Yearling Sale “for the last three or four years,” said he is impressed by the way the horses are turned out there. “The horses over there are very well-prepared,” he said. “The breeders and consignors do an excellent job presenting really good stock.”

Ingordo noted that last year was his first big foray into the British market, and said he will be returning to the October Yearling Sale this year.

“You dip your toe in, then you dip your foot in, and now we’re open to diving in,” he said.

Bell, who also picked out the winner and stakes-placed Newfound Zapper (Ghostzapper) for trainer Wesley Ward for 65,000gns two years ago, said he also plans to return this year, and is looking for more clients to shop for. “I’ll definitely be going back this year,” he confirmed. “I’m trying to find some people to come up with that same plan again, to bring some new blood back [to America] or even keep them over there for a year or two to race, then bring them back as 3- or 4-year-olds. Since that filly won at Saratoga--she won pretty impressively--hopefully Mr. Dobson will come back and try again.”

Watership Down Has a Winning Tune...

Any consignor sending a colt by one of the world's elite sires out of a three-time Group 1 winner to the sales is entitled to feel confident of achieving a thoroughly profitable outcome, but when that star mare happens to be Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}), her offspring have quite a reputation to maintain.

Dar Re Mi's dam, the outstanding broodmare Darara (Ire) (Top Ville {GB}), still holds the record for having produced the most expensive yearling ever sold at auction in Europe, her son by Sadler's Wells, initially named Diaghilev and later River Dancer, having changed hands for 3.4 million gns at Tattersalls' Houghton Sale in 2000. Furthermore, Darara's three other yearlings to have been offered for sale - Kilimanjaro (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}), Rhagaas (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Rewilding (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) - each sold for 500,000gns at Tattersalls.

So Dar Re Mi's first foal, who is entered as [lot 354](#) for Book 1 of the forthcoming October Sale, is carrying a burden of expectation but he has done nothing so far to disappoint his breeders, Lord and Lady Lloyd-Webber of Watership Down Stud. “Dar Re Mi's colt has been really well balanced ever since he was born,” says Watership Down's manager of 21 years, Simon Marsh. “He's developed really well and we're extremely pleased with him. I hope other people will feel the same way.”

Currently in foal to arguably the most talked-about Thoroughbred on the planet, Frankel (GB), Dar Re Mi has a Dubawi (Ire) filly foal on the ground this year who could well end up carrying her breeders' colors, which were borne with such distinction by her mother.

Dar Re Mi retired during the 2010 season with top-flight wins in the Yorkshire Oaks, Pretty Polly S. and the Dubai Sheema Classic to her name, but the Lloyd-Webbers didn't have to wait too long for another homegrown star to come along. Having come home a winner from her sole juvenile appearance, the regard in which The Fugue (GB) (Dansili {GB}) was held by champion trainer John Gosden was evident when she lined up for the 1,000 Guineas on her second start. She managed a fourth-place finish in the Classic before landing the Group 3 Tattersalls Musidora S. and finishing third in the G1 Oaks at Epsom en route to her first Group 1 success in last year's Nassau S. However, had it not been for a perceived flaw at the October Sale of 2010, she may not have been carrying the Lloyd-Webbers' silks at all, as Marsh recalls.

"When we took The Fugue to the sale she wasn't being well received because she has small feet. She was a good mover but I didn't feel she was going to sell as well as she should have done so I withdrew her the night before she was due to go through the ring. Thank God they criticized her!"

This time around, Watership Down will offer her half-brother by Shamardal (Giant's Causeway), but their dam Twyla Tharp no longer resides in the stud's broodmare band, having been sold for 1.7 millions gns at Tattersalls' December Sale last year.

"Twyla Tharp's Shamardal colt is a very nice horse. In my opinion, he's the best the mare has ever produced," says Marsh.

The small matter of The Fugue having added another

two Group 1 victories to her tally this year won't hurt his prospects either, and further glory could yet follow for his illustrious half-sibling.

"It's fantastic that The Fugue's done what she's done, but we'd always believed she was this good," says Marsh. "We'll look at the ground with regards to the Arc and if we have a dry couple of weeks she could take her chance. Otherwise she'll go straight to the Breeders' Cup and then we'll see what we'll do after that. Instinctively for the Lloyd-Webbers, their point of view would be to keep her in training next year. At the end of the day it's just so much fun to have a horse like her."

With Twyla Tharp a high-profile sale for the stud last season, the team was quick to reinvest and picked up the Barathea (Ire) mare Claba Di San Jore (Ire), carrying to Dubawi, at the same auction for 575,000gns. With that Dubawi foal now gamboling around the paddocks, the stud will offer her Shamardal half-brother on behalf of his breeders at the October Sale ([lot 326](#)). The colt is a brother to Derby Italiano and Group 1 winner Crackerjack King (Ire) and half-brother to fellow Group 1 winners Jakkalberry (Ire) (Storming Home {GB}) and Awelmarduk (Ire) (Almutawakel {GB}).

"The mare has never done anything wrong. She's produced winner after winner. She had a Dubawi filly this year and is back in foal to Dubawi."

Another of Watership Down's clients represented among its 22-strong Book 1 draft is Grangecon Stud, whose reputation has been enhanced on the track this year by the exploits of the Dubawi colt Universal (Ire), a Group winner three times through the spring and summer for Mark Johnston, but whose season has sadly been curtailed by injury.

Marsh says, "We're consigning a Dark Angel (Ire) half-brother to Universal ([lot 225](#)) for Grangecon Stud. They are very good breeders who have produced plenty of good horses over the years. Dark Angel has had a really good year with Lethal Force (Ire), and so has Universal, and this is a really strong colt."

Breeding Capital's Pivotal (GB) filly out of Arabian Mirage (GB) ([lot 268](#)), a half-sister to Group winners Al Shemali (GB) and Tungsten Strike, is another to be given the thumbs-up by the manager and is described as "not over-big, a lovely filly", while The Fugue's family is represented again through a New Approach daughter of Danehill Dreamer (Danehill), an unraced half-sister to Twyla Tharp.

"Of course this is a really good cross, as we know," says Marsh. "Shadwell bought her Nayef colt, Madeed (GB), for 40,000gns last year and he has won a Goodwood maiden since the catalogue was printed and his trainer thinks quite a lot of him."

Of course no top-class draft is complete without a Galileo filly, and Watership Down will offer a half-sister by the champion sire to dual Group 1 winner Lillie Langtry (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) ([lot 443](#)) on behalf of her breeder, Bjorn Nielsen, who boards 11 mares at the stud on the Berkshire/Hampshire borders and its sister farm, Kiltinan Castle Stud in Ireland.

"She's a late foal but out of a Darshaan mare [Hoity Toity], so again this is a very good cross, and her half-brother, Count of Limonade (Ire), won a Listed race earlier this year," says Marsh.

Other highlights of the consignment include two more yearlings by Oasis Dream out of Group 1-winning mares--a "good-moving, straightforward" filly out of Prix Vermeille winner Sweet Stream (Ity) (Shantou), who sells as [lot 177](#), and a colt out of the Lordship Stud-bred Oaks winner Love Divine (GB) (Diesis), who is already the dam of a Classic winner in Sixties Icon (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). Marsh admits to be looking forward to offering a daughter of America's sire of the moment, War Front (Danzig). "She's a very strong filly and we're very excited about her given how well offspring of the sire sold at Keeneland."

Selling as [lot 358](#), the War Front filly is out of the Unbridled's Song mare Dawn Chorus and represents a cross which has already produced the Group 1 Hong Kong Classic Mile winner Sweet Orange.

Andreas Putsch of Haras de Saint-Pair in Normandy has entrusted Watership Down Stud with his Invincible Spirit (Ire) colt out of Celebre Vadala (Fr) (Peintre Celebre) ([lot 317](#)), a half-sister to dual Group 1 winner Valixir (Fr) and from the family of G1 Breeders' Cup Mile winner Val Royal (Fr).

"He has a really good page but is a very late foal [May 20]. However, he's improving all the time and I think he'll be well received," says Marsh, who stresses the importance of having a good team of staff when it comes to ensuring the yearlings reach the sale in peak condition. "Terry Doherty, who's been with us for 20 years, does such a good job prepping these horses for the sale. The pressure is on to have them all ready for one day. It's not like racing when there could be another race in a few weeks' time. It's an extremely skilled and difficult thing to do and we're very fortunate to have Terry. Getting these horses ready for the sale and breeding horses like The Fugue takes an enormous amount of work and dedication from a large team of people who are here at the stud giving their all come rain or shine."

RECORD SALES TOPPER IN LOUISIANA

A chestnut son of Awesome Again out of Clear Sailing (Empire Maker) topped the 2013 Breeders Sales Company of Louisiana Yearling Sale and set a new sale record when sold for \$210,000. The yearling was bred by Coteau Grove Farms LLC, consigned by Pelican State Thoroughbreds and was purchased by Evelyn Benoit's Brittlyn Stables LLC.

The transaction brought together two of the more formidable Thoroughbred operations in the state of Louisiana. Clear Sailing was bred by Overbrook Farm and was produced by Steady Course (Old Trieste), a winning 3/4-sister to GSW and productive sire Jump Start (A.P. Indy). Clear Sailing made a single start in the colors of her breeder at two, finishing third in a Churchill maiden in June 2008, but went missing and was part of the dispersal of the Overbrook breeding and racing stock at Keeneland November in the fall of 2009. Coteau Grove, a then-fledgling operation owned by Keith and Ginger Myers, were the successful bidders on the sophomore filly, and it didn't take long for her to repay some of that investment, as she graduated impressively at the Fair Grounds for trainer Glenn Delahoussaye about six weeks after the sale. She proceeded to win her next two outings, including the 2010 Pelleteri S. and was an allowance winner at Evangeline Downs later that season before retiring to stud. The Awesome Again colt is her first foal. Brittlyn Stables has been a fixture on the Louisiana racing scene for years and campaigned the popular Star Guitar (Quiet American) to 24 wins from his 30 career starts and earnings in excess of \$1.7 million.

"We had lots of new traffic this year," said Daren English, Sales Director for the Breeders Sales Company of Louisiana. "Buyers showed up from Kentucky, Florida, Texas, Oklahoma, Missouri, and more. We worked hard to make sure that our consignors had a good audience for the sale."

There were 202 yearlings cataloged and 140 sold at an average price of \$14,288 and total gross of \$2,000,300.

All accredited Louisiana-breds sold here are eligible for Bayou State Bonus. Also there are three Louisiana races for colts and three for fillies offering bonus incentives if the winners were graduates of this sale.

"This sale is an indication of the popularity of Louisiana breds and a credit to our breeders," said Roger Heitzmann, Secretary/Treasurer for the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association. "We had a big audience at the sale and online through our webcast. The sales staff did a great job organizing and running the sale. This had been one of our best sales."

GII Adirondack S. heroine Designer Legs (Graeme Hall), who is currently being pointed at the Breeders' Cup, is a graduate of last year's sale.

Cibelli Suspended for 60 Days:

The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering suspended trainer Jane Cibelli for 60-days for the administration of a race-day nerve block to Raven Train (Silver Train). Neither Cibelli nor her employees will be permitted to rent stall space for the remainder of the meet and no entries will be accepted from her from any location. Dr. Orlando Paraliticcini was also suspended for 90-days for administering the block and will not be allowed to practice veterinary medicine on the Tampa Bay Downs grounds for the 2013-2014 meet. The FDPMW's consent order stated that normally they would have pursued a longer sentence, but did not due to the lack of physical evidence. The consent order stated that: "In this case, however, the syringe that was used to administer the block to the horse was not recovered by track security. A blood sample was taken from the horse, but a nerve block administered in this fashion is not likely to (and did not) produce a positive test. Not having the ability to test the syringe to positively identify the drug sarapin required the Division to secure the cooperation of Dr. Paraliticcini identify the medication in order to proceed with prosecution of trainer Cibelli."

VRC Adopts Model Medication Policy:

Edited Press Release

The Virginia Racing Commission unanimously adopted the Racing Commission International (RCI) Model Medication Rules, which set uniform thresholds for a determined list of controlled therapeutic medications. The rules become effective Jan. 1, 2014.

"I commend Chairman Stuart Siegel and fellow commissions as well as Executive Director Bernard Hettel for advancing these reforms in a timely manner," said President of Racing Commissioners International Ed Martin. "Racing commissions across the country are moving to implement the new Model Medication Rules and many hope to have them in place by Jan. 1, 2014. This is yet another positive step for an industry that has been wrestling with these issues for years."

Virginia is one of several Eastern States that have adopted the reformed RCI Model Medication Rules as "The Mid-Atlantic Initiative" and had committed earlier this year to moving the reforms forward. Virginia also incorporated by reference the new RCI Penalty Guidelines that provide for a "point system" to track medication violations in order to assist commissions in determining whether an additional enhancement is appropriate for licensees with multiple violations of the medication rules.

Coolmore's staying sensation Yeats (Ire) was responsible for the leading purchase at the latest renewal of Tattersalls Ireland's September Yearling Sale when one of his sons sold for €180,000 during yesterday's second and final session. From the Castlebridge Consignment, who had boasted the previous day's top two lots, hip [566](#) was purchased,

like the opening session's topper, by Lily Corporation. As on Tuesday, it was bloodstock agent Ananios Antoniadis who secured the April foal, who shares his second dam with the Classic hero and sire Sixties Icon (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). Antoniadis was acting again for Konstantin Zgar. "He is a lovely horse and we were looking for a

middle-distance type," Antoniadis said after seeing off Ronan Griffin, Norman Williamson, Harold Kirk and Jim Ryan for the highest-priced yearling at this auction since 2006. Torard House's hip [543](#), a son of Dark Angel (Ire) who is out of a half to the pattern-race sprinter Proud Native (Ire) (Imp Society), led the way earlier in the day when providing a handsome return on his €12,000 GOFNOV tag, selling to trainer Ger Lyons for €55,000. Another Irish conditioner in the headlines was Willie McCreery, who made a successful foray to Britain to annexe Friday's Listed Harry Rosebery S. at Ayr with Hurryupharriet (Ire) (Camacho {GB}), a €10,000 graduate of last year's November Sale at this venue. The Newbridge-based conditioner played up his winning percentage yesterday when going to €52,000 for Grove Stud's hip [393](#), a son of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) and the 2005 G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial victress Crystal View (Ire) (Imperial Ballet {Ire}). The bay is the second produce of his dam and a half-brother to the stakes-winning 2011 G2 Goldene Peitsche third Clairvoyance (Ire) (Shamardal). Also selling for that price were colts by Iffraaj (GB) and Exceed and Excel (Aus), who were snapped up by Lyons and Con Marnane, respectively. The former, who formed part of Taroka Stud's draft, is a son of the listed performer Dance of Light (Sadler's Wells), who has produced the smart 2-year-old Dancealot (GB) (Lawman {Fr}) and sold as hip [403](#). The Exceed and Excel was from Johnstown House Stud, and hip [527](#), who is out of a sister to the stakes-winning Jade Quest (Ire) (Rainbow Quest) and therefore connected to Jade Hunter, was the apple of the Bansha House supremo's eye. "We've been lucky with the sire and the plan, all being well, will probably be to go to the Craven Sale," Marnane explained after outbidding Eddie O'Leary. "I thought he was the nicest horse at the sale."

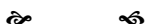
FLYING SPUR COLT TOPS HIT FINALE A colt by Flying Spur (Aus) attracted a final bid of A\$220,000 (US\$206,209) to top Wednesday's second and final session of the Magic Millions Gold Coast Horses-In-Training Sale. The Aug. 9 foal, catalogued as hip [162](#), was consigned by Kenmore Lodge as agent

and was purchased by Hong Kong-based businessman Ting Kong Cheng, the owner of Australia's Eliza Park International. The bay, who breezed furlong in :10.71 during the under-tack preview, is a son of Rock On Bye (Aus) (Octagonal {NZ}), a five-

time winner at the races and a half-sister to MSW & G1SP Zero Rock (Aus) (Danzero {Aus}). It is also the extended female family of New Zealand champion juvenile San Luis (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}). "He's a colt we really liked," Mr. Cheng said, adding that his purchase would remain in Australia to race. "He is by a very successful sire and our team thought he was very athletic." Singapore's Premier Racing Partnerships was the name on the docket for hip [210](#), a Mellum Park-consigned son of dual-hemisphere stallion Henrythenavigator.



The bay colt is the third foal from Tevez (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}), whose dam Imperatrice (NZ) (Kashani) was third in the G1 Sires' Produce S. at Ellerslie in 1999. A total of 149 horses were reported as sold for gross receipts of nearly A\$6.4 million (US\$5,993,029) for an average of A\$42,809 (US\$40,087). The clearance rate rounded out at 62.3%, a figure expected to rise as more sales are completed over the coming days.

"Among the results are some exceptional individual sales and those vendors should be congratulated," Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox reported. "We were very happy with the cross section of the buying bench. The market was very polarised. If you had the right product there was great competition. Obviously we're very disappointed with the clearance rate, however the average price was up on last year and that is a positive."
