RIZ UP

Having already conquered the top level when taking the G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh, **Rizeena (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}) is back on home turf to add to her laurels in today's G1 Shadwell Fillies' Mile at Newmarket. Also successful in the G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot June 19 and third in the G1 Prix Morny, Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum's bay was able to hold her form admirably by upstaging the highly-talented duo of

Kiyoshi (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Tapestry (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Irish feature for juvenile fillies at the start of September.

Trainer Clive Brittain is hoping she can continue to justify his lofty opinion of her. "We felt that if the ground was good, good-to-soft, we would go for the Cheveley Park, but this mile is

going to suit her a lot better," he said. "She will stay, that is not going to be a problem. She's in great form at the moment and has done all the work I want her to do for the race. She's put on 24 kilos since she had her first race. This will be her 1000 Guineas trial--we will let her down a little bit and we will look after her during the winter. Like Sayyedati, Pebbles and all my good fillies, she will have a quiet training regime through the winter and then we will gather up speed for the April-May meeting." Godolphin's **Ihtimal (Ire)** (Shamardal) takes a well-trodden path for the organization, having annexed the G3 Sweet Solera S. on the July Course here Aug. 10 and G2 May Hill S. at Doncaster Sept. 13 as Saeed bin Suroor's previous winner White Moonstone (Dynaformer) had. "Ihtimal won nicely at Doncaster and came out of that Group 2 race sound and healthy," her trainer commented. "She is taking another step up in class, but she is in good form at the moment." The operation, looking for a fourth consecutive renewal, have also supplemented the unbeaten **Sound Reflection** (Street Cry {Ire}), a Charlie Appleby-trained daughter of the group scorer Echoes In Eternity (Ire) (Spinning World). She beat the promising Night Song (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in a seven-furlong conditions race on Kempton's Polytrack Sept. 6 and is certain to appreciate this extra trip. "She's a big, scopey filly and we thought that we would take a chance in a Group 1 race," Appleby said. "She is a filly for next season and whatever she does this year is a bonus, but she has won both her starts and I am hopeful that she will run a good race." Three from Ireland with claims are Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's July 18 G3 Silver Flash S. winner **Wonderfully (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and the Sept. 15 Listed Flame of Tara S. first and second **Avenue Gabriel (GB)** (Champs Elysees {GB}) and **Ballybacka Queen (Ire)** (Hurricane Run {Ire}). LEROIDESANIMAUX TO LANWADES STUD

Leroidesanimaux (Brz) (Candy Stripes--Dissemble {GB}, by Ahonoora {GB}), champion turf horse and sire of G1 Kentucky Derby and G1 Dubai World Cup winner Animal Kingdom, will relocate to Kirsten Rausing's Lanwades Stud in Newmarket, England. Leroidesanimaux has also sired Argentinian Group 1 winner Una Cabeza (Arg). He is represented by three additional Grade 2 winners, and the earners of more than \$16 million to date. "We are delighted and very proud to welcome 'Leroi' to Lanwades," said Rausing. "He represents the reintroduction of the Blushing Groom sire line to the UK and with his pedigree, toughness and durability, marvelous racing form on both turf and dirt over distances up to 1 1/2 miles, as well as his proven ability to sire world-class performers, he will be an immensely important addition to the European breeding industry. His pedigree makes him a suitable mate for mares by Galileo, Danehill and his sons, Mr. Prospector-line mares and others. It will be fascinating to breed him to daughters of Dansili. Leroi is the outcross stallion European breeders have been waiting for--and he is a proven stallion, too. We expect strong interest from mare owners throughout Europe." Leroidesanimaux stood at Stonewall Farm in Florida under the HallMarc Stallions banner in 2013 for an advertised fee of \$25,000. HallMarc's Marc Haisfield added, "We are excited to have Leroidesanimaux continue his stud career at the premier stallion operation of Lanwades Stud. European breeders will now have the opportunity to breed to this significant sire line again." A stud fee will be announced later.

BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

WELCOME RAIN

Having surrendered his unbeaten record in the G2 Hungerford S. at Newbury last time Aug. 17, Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Soft Falling Rain (SAf)** (National Assembly) bids to get back where he belongs in today's G2 Joel S. at Newmarket. The Feb. 14 G3 UAE 2000 Guineas and Mar. 30 G2 Godolphin Mile winner will need to deliver here if he is to live up to trainer Mike de Kock's lofty expectations. He will be tested by the 3-year-old **Montiridge (Ire)** (Ramonti {Fr}) from Richard Hannon's yard, and Mitaab Abdullah's recent acquisition can be excused a single below-par effort when returning a dirty scope following his latest fifth in the G3 Superior Mile at Haydock Sept. 7. Previously, he had won a brace of listed contests and the G3 Thoroughbred S. at Goodwood Aug. 2, and connections are keeping the faith. "Haydock was the first blip on Montiridge's record this summer and at least there was a valid reason," Hannon explained. "He had won three of his previous four races and was unlucky to be beaten at Royal Ascot [when second in the G3 Jersey S.], so fingers crossed he will show his Goodwood sparkle again." Middleham Park Racing's reliable veteran **Penitent (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) took this last year and enters his defence at the top of his game, having won Sandown's Listed Fortune S. on his favored heavy ground nine days ago.

EDDIE D. DAY AT SANTA ANITA

A full field of 14 horses will sprint down the hill as the GIII Eddie D. S. gets the 2013 Santa Anita fall meet off to a running start this afternoon. Mike McCarty's **Unbridled's Note** (Unbridled's Song) has never finished worse than second in three tries on the grass and took this race last season in his turf debut. That victory propelled him into 47-10 favoritism for the GI Breeders'

Cup Turf Sprint, and he led late only to be run down by the talented Mizdirection (Mizzen Mast). Unbridled's Note makes his first appearance since an eighth in the GII Churchill Downs S. over the main track May 4, and a positive performance here will see him take another shot at the Turf

Sprint in a little over four weeks. **Caracortado** (Cat Dreams) makes his first start in nearly 21 months and can earn a trip to Championship day should he run well. Winner of the GII Del Mar Mile in 2011, he was an even fifth behind Regally Ready (More Than Ready) in that year's Turf Sprint (then a Grade II) and was last seen besting that rival with a miraculous late run in the GIII Daytona S. in January 2012 ([video](#)). **Rock Me Baby** (Rock Hard Ten) has been admirably consistent in his career, with a .500 batting average and never out of the trifecta in his 10 outings. The Cal-bred twice fell a neck short of winning restricted black-type races, including the July 21 California Dreamin' H. at Del Mar, but bounced back to defeat open rivals in a one-mile allowance on the turf at the seaside oval July 17.

It's very disappointing for the whole yard, but we've got a good filly for next year. The G1 Prix Marcel Boussac is only a week away and that's too tight. She's a good size and will train on no problem and we'll start to let her down now."

AUSUS PREPARING FOR FINAL START

Shadwell Stable's **Ausus** (Invasor {Arg}) is gearing up for one more yet-to-be-determined spot before heading off to the breeding shed, trainer Danny Peitz reports. The homebred daughter of El Raabi (Fusaichi Pegasus), a three-time winner at three in 2012, has had a breakthrough season this term, posting an 8-1 upset in the GIII Modesty H. July 13 before an excellent third-place effort behind Dank (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in the GI Beverly D. S. Aug. 17. "She's doing okay," said Peitz. "I'm not really sure what we're going to do with her. The Breeders' Cup might be too ambitious. I've been thinking about the [GI E. P. Taylor S. at Woodbine Oct. 14] for her. I'm not positive." Ausus is also possible for a race at Keeneland, across Versailles Road and not far from her birthplace at Shadwell. "I backed off her a bit and thought she came out [of the Beverly D.] like she needed a little time between races and now I need to get another good work into her," Peitz added. "I gave her an easy half last week, and I'll give her a serious work here soon and have a better idea of which way we want to go. The race that does intrigue me is the Dowager S. at Keeneland [Oct. 20]. I've always wanted to run her a mile and a half. It doesn't make her worth any more, but I really think it would be nice to see her open up at that distance and maybe go out a winner back home in Kentucky. All I know is that after this year they are going to breed her in Europe and bring her back to Kentucky."

WHAT THE "BUZZ" IS REALLY ALL ABOUT

After watching the GII Pennsylvania Derby this weekend, where Will Take Charge once again got the better of Moreno, I felt even more compelled to write about the accusation and ongoing investigation of jockey Luis Saez using a buzzer during his winning ride in this summer's GI Travers S. A buzzer, better known in the business as a "battery" or "machine," is an outlawed battery-powered electrical shock device. This device is about the size of a Bic lighter or thumb drive and can be made with regular over-the-counter batteries such as (2) triple A's wrapped with copper wire with two extruding prongs all bound together with electrical tape. I am not an expert on machines, but I do consider myself an expert at race riding. Personally, I never have or ever thought once to use a machine, but I know a little more than most from my lifetime of experience in horse racing.

When I started my career, being around some of the smaller minor league tracks, I know that machines were not so uncommon. Like my father, I would never dare touch one and made a point to stay miles away from anything to do with them. They were certainly outlawed over 30 years ago as they are now, but still, they were around. At the meet where I started as an apprentice, machines were present. It was already halfway through when I arrived and I left that meet second leading rider, winning at a 19% clip, without a machine.

It wasn't unusual back then to have "shake downs," where racing officials would unexpectedly burst in the jocks room searching jockey's boxes (lockers) or hold a race up just as they had loaded into the gates, to pull a jockey off their horse in order to search them. Being caught with a machine, even if it was found sitting in your car, was enough to lose your license. The practices of having shakedown are now pretty much extinct--even at the smaller tracks--as the machine days have begun fading away since I started out over 30 years ago.

When I arrived in New York to continue my apprentice campaign, machines were nowhere to be found and there was absolutely no interest or appeal for them among the New York jockey colony. Gladly, I never had any adjustments to make.

The idea of Saez using a machine in a Grade I event is mind boggling, with not only thousands of people watching, officials, and in house coverage, but there were also NBC high definition cameras everywhere. There is no on/off switch on a machine and those extruding prongs sticking out of one side are live

voltage and jockeys do not have pockets. There are very few options and none of them are fool proof for a jockey trying to hide a machine. For a jockey to get from the jock's room, walk through the crowd on the most crowded day at the Saratoga meet, likely signing some kids' autographs on the way to the paddock, then shaking hands, meeting your connections in the paddock, then out to the track to ride your race, after the race, un-saddling, back through the crowd and to the jocks room, with the prongs still containing live voltage would be the greatest trick of all time. The risk of it presenting itself or for something to go wrong is too great; the best machine riders that ever lived, even the great magician David Copperfield, would not try such a stunt on a day like that. The risk Saez would have taken using a machine that, had he been caught, would have banned him for life from ever riding in New York and likely at any other track in America again, and would be to risk throwing his entire career away.

Another important fact about a jockey carrying a machine is that it compromises your ability to ride. Even some of the greatest machine riders would not attempt to switch sticks back in the day. Imagine playing a game of tennis, swinging a tennis racquet and trying to hold a machine with live voltage in your hand at the same time. When you throw a machine into the equation of race riding, your ability to ride--using our hands, driving and pushing forward, using your whip and reins, swinging your whip and switching it from one hand to another--all while guiding 1000 pounds of race horse, is severely compromised.

I felt Saez rode a masterful race and should be credited for such. It's highly unlikely that Saez was carrying a machine, and if he was, he would be the first to be able to do so that effectively. Carrying a machine does not allow you to ride with such form and style. He was driving on this horse as they hit the far turn, going to the whip both right-handed and left. How could he have done this? Why did he not just use only the machine if it works so well? And if he were carrying one, why wait so long and so late in the race to use it? A machine is not something you can reach down and just pull out of your pocket; it has to be in your hand before you leave the gates.

Lastly, and perhaps most importantly, why do we assume machines make horses run faster? I am no scientist, but a whip "stings," a feeling that resonates throughout the body for more than a few seconds. An electrical shock "stuns" the nervous system, basically paralyzing and shutting down the nervous system and muscle controls as fast as you can say zap. When a police officer has to taser someone, they drop to the ground paralyzed from the voltage--they don't run faster.

The mentality that a jockey using a machine can make a horse run faster than a jockey using their arms, voice and whip is way overrated and out of proportion. Saez showed great athletic ability driving Will Take Charge to victory. Let's give credit to the horse and jockey for this win, not a couple of triple A batteries. It's time to put this to rest.

USTA Withdraws From RMTC:

The Executive Committee of the United States Trotting Association has voted unanimously to reject the model medication rules proposed by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) and separately voted to withdraw its membership from the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium with immediate effect. "We have carefully considered the RCI proposals and have come to the conclusion that the physical characteristics of the breeds are significantly different. Trying to fit them together makes little sense," said USTA President Phil Langley.

"We believe both breeds, Standardbreds and Thoroughbreds, will benefit from having rules concentrated solely on their needs. Many safeguards now in use in harness racing would never be acceptable to the more high-strung Thoroughbreds, including Lasix barns, two- to four-hour paddock times and racing on a weekly basis," added Langley. "On the other hand, both the frequency that Standardbreds race and the lack of catastrophic breakdowns in harness racing make the utilization of some therapeutic medications much different between the breeds." The USTA stated that it supports a uniform medication policy, but believes such rules must be customized for each breed. "We want to make it very clear the USTA supports uniform rules," said Langley, "but we strongly believe they should be by breed. Things like blood doping, out-of-competition testing, EPO and Shock Wave Therapy are high on the list of USTA research projects." In response to the move, RMTC Chairman Alex Waldrop said: "We are disappointed with the decision by the USTA to reject the RCI model rules and withdraw from the RMTC. The USTA was among the 24 organizations that actively participated in a multi-year scientific research program that led the horse racing industry to the establishment of uniform national model rules for medication, penalties and testing. In particular, the USTA objected to RMTC recommendations for the use of clenbuterol and corticosteroids, but these recommendations are the result of scientific research and ensure these medications cannot be abused in any way. The scientific research, as well as current regulations in California, Pennsylvania, Minnesota and other multi-breed jurisdictions, demonstrate that the uniform rules recommended by the RMTC and adopted by the RCI are the most effective way to ensure the safety of all race horses and the integrity of the sport, regardless of breed. The RMTC will not deviate from this path for any reasons not supported by the science."
