RABBLE RAISERS AT BELMONT

In the span of a half an hour, a pair of juveniles sporting names of malevolence took both of Belmont's Sunday features for 2-year-olds. **Miss Behaviour** (Jump Start) kicked off the card's graded action with a length victory over even-money choice **"TDN Rising Star"** **Sweet Whiskey** (Old Fashioned) in the GII Matron S., while **In Trouble** (Tiz Wonderful) remained undefeated with a score over favored **Corfu** (Malibu Moon) in the GII Futurity S. Sent off the third betting choice at 3-1, Miss Behaviour was pinched back slightly at the start, but recovered well to stalk Sweet Whiskey through

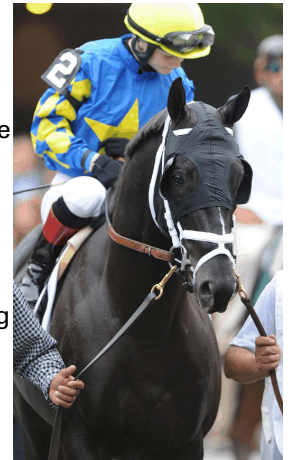
an opening quarter mile in :22.21. On even terms with that rival turning for home, Miss Behaviour held a comfortable three-length advantage over her pursuer at the head of the lane, and despite getting leg-weary late, had enough left in the tank to win by a length. "What a nice filly," said winning rider Garry Cruise. "I anticipated that Johnny [Velazquez, aboard Sweet Whiskey] would be making the speed; his horse is very talented. I was quite happy she set the pace the way she did. When I dropped her in to be competitive a little bit, she just came into gear and said, 'Let's go.' At that time, I could kind of sense that no one was going to jump on us, so I said, 'Let's finish this now.' She's been a 10 out of 10 so far, and today she was about an 11. She's just a privilege to ride." One race later, it appeared to be a case of deja vue. Another Todd Pletcher-trained juvenile, Corfu, was backed down to favoritism and jumped out to set the early pace, but once again had to settle for second behind another talented runner. In Trouble launched his career with a narrow score at the Spa Aug. 10, and was given a 5-2 chance to remain unbeaten. Content to let Corfu roll through opening splits of :22.09 and :44.75, In Trouble engaged the wilting leader in the stretch and pulled 2 1/4 lengths clear at the wire. "He broke really sharp, and I preferred to be outside dictating [the pace rather] than be inside and be under someone else who can force us," said winning rider Joe Rocco Jr. "It worked out when I saw I could get behind [Corfu] and get outside of him...So we had options. I didn't pull him back; I just didn't ask him any more. He was very gentle to rate and did it kindly." **Cont. p3**



In Trouble

SHANGHAI BOBBY RETIRED

Last season's juvenile champion **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday--Steelin', by Orientate) has been retired from racing and will stand stud at Coolmore America's Ashford Stud in Kentucky in 2014. The dark bay sustained an injury to a suspensory ligament when returning from a six-month respite in last Friday's Aljamin S. at Belmont Park. "While it is unfortunate that Shanghai Bobby won't be at Santa Anita [for the Breeders' Cup] again this year, we are delighted that he's coming to Ashford," said Dermot Ryan, manager of Ashford Stud. "Following [Coolmore stallions] Lookin At Lucky, Uncle Mo and Hansen, he is the fourth straight Eclipse Award-winning Juvenile to retire here." Trained by Todd Pletcher, Shanghai Bobby--bred by Stonehaven Steadings--won all five starts at two, including the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, GI Champagne S. and GII Hopeful S. en route to a 2-year-old championship. Runner up behind Itsmyluckyday (Lawyer Ron) in the Jan. 26 GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream, the \$105,000 Keeneland September purchase failed to fire when fifth in the nine-furlong GI Florida Derby Mar. 30 before heading to the sidelines. **Cont. p3**

British Prize Money Gets a Boost

“It's very disappointing as he ran really well off the layoff and we were hoping to go back to Santa Anita with him for the [GI] Breeders' Cup Sprint or the Dirt Mile,” said Pletcher. “He was a really great 2-year-old--undefeated in five starts over five different distances ranging from 4 1/2 furlongs to 1 1/16 miles. He displayed his brilliant speed in the Hopeful and Champagne and then showed tremendous courage to win the Breeders' Cup Juvenile.”

Added Starlight Racing co-managing partner Jack Wolf, “We're disappointed as we were looking forward to him returning to top level competition following his win in the Aljamin S. This horse has taken us on a great adventure, from his undefeated 2-year-old campaign and Eclipse Award, to his successful return at three. We are proud to have owned this special horse. [Coolmore has] been a tremendous a partner and we've had a lot of fun together. Standing him at Ashford gives him a great chance to succeed as a stallion. We wish him the best as he begins his new career at Ashford.”

Trainer Tony Dutrow, who admitted yesterday that the Futurity has been in the cards since his colt's debut win at the Spa Aug. 10, indicated the colt will not be pointed toward the Nov. 3 GII Nashua S. at Aqueduct. “It shows you a lot,” said Dutrow of yesterday's performance. “This was the second race of his life and he was able to relax and give up the lead and finish up against quality horses. I think that's a big statement for him.” Ahead of yesterday's test, Dutrow had only one piece of advice to offer Rocco Jr., who also accompanied the bay in his career debut.

"I just told Joe that we've worked with him a lot in the gate. He's a rough horse in the gate. We've worked with him a lot, and I think that's the only thing you've got to pay attention to."

Dutrow continued, "Having done this a long time, I was looking forward to today. I was feeling that we have a talented horse and I'm not surprised at what I saw. I wasn't predicting this, but I'm not surprised. He's pretty good."

Of the beaten favorite Corfu, trainer Todd Pletcher added, "He kind of stumbled leaving there. The ground broke away from him a little bit and it took him a minute to get his legs back underneath him, but he finished up pretty well. Second-best. A very solid effort. We were pleased with his try." John Velazquez, who was aboard the runner-up, added, "He got out fast. The problem was the first eighth of a mile I had to use him to clear the other horse and then I came up a little bit short down the lane. It was a very good effort, very good."

Miss Behaviour kicked off her career with a 2 1/2-length win against fellow Pennsylvania bred at Parx July 22 and was a well-supported to make it two straight and she did just that in her latest start in Monmouth's Sorority S. Sept. 1. Yesterday's victory represented the first graded win for her trainer Phil Schoenthal, a former assistant to Mark Shuman.

"In this game, you learn to temper your expectations," said Schoenthal, who was also collecting his first win in the Empire State. "I didn't expect her to go to the front like that and open up. When she moved to the lead at the three-eighths pole, I said to myself, 'Don't run out of trainer, don't run out of trainer.' I'm sure we'll try her at two turns at some point, but she's a sprinter right now."

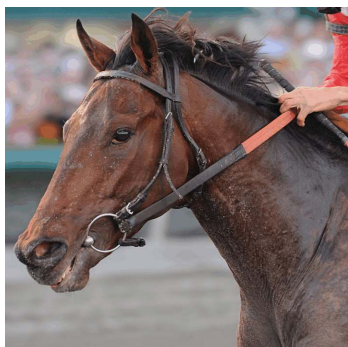
As for the runner-up, Sweet Whiskey was making her first start since finishing a well-beaten fourth in a sloppy renewal of the Sept. 1 GI Spinaway S. The Alto Racing runner appeared poised to return to the form that propelled her to an impressive 5 1/4-length debut score at Saratoga Aug. 11, but had to play the bridesmaid.

"She actually put in a good run," offered Sweet Whiskey's partner John Velazquez. "The winner passed us on the turn and I thought I'd better save some horse to fight for second, and she actually put in a good fight for second and came back a little bit. The track is kind of slow; they're not finishing good, either. They can go fast, but they're not finishing. I was afraid she was going to go the whole time and not have anything to fight with. That horse came to us at the three-eighths pole and I said, 'I can't move that soon.' We were going fast enough. She ended up holding on for second, very nice."

'No Excuses' for Orb in Jockey Club Gold Cup

GI Kentucky Derby winner **Orb** (Malibu Moon) exited his last-place effort in Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in fine form, according to trainer Shug McGaughey's assistant Buzz Tenney. "Orb seemed to come back fine," Tenney said. "He cooled out fine, and we put him on the van and sent him back to Fair Hill [Training Center in Maryland Saturday] night. Really no excuses we could see." Tenney continued, "He looked great, I thought, coming out of Fair Hill. Going over [to saddle for the

'Greek', 'Delta' & Flat Out Fine After Belmont Efforts

Ron the Greek (Full Mandate), Royal Delta (Empire Maker) and Flat Out (Flatter) appeared no worse for wear following their respective efforts on Belmont's

Saturday card. Ron the Greek burst away to a 6 3/4-length win over GI Belmont S. hero Palace Malice (Curlin) in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, while defending GI Beldame champion Royal Delta was second behind the leading sophomore filly candidate Princess of Sylmar (Majestic

Warrior). "There wouldn't have been many horses who would have beaten [Ron the Greek] yesterday," said Mott. "He might have fired his best shot right there. I'm not [going to be] disappointed if he doesn't fire that one back." As for Royal Delta, who won the last two renewals of the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, Mott added, "She looks great. I'm not sure she ran her best race [Saturday]. She might have a better one in her than that. I'm pretty sure she does. I think her last two were better than that, so hopefully, she'll come back next time and give us a good one." Third as the 5-2 choice in the Gold Cup, Flat Out won the previous two renewals of the race in 2011 and 2012. "It was good," said Mott. "Maybe not his 'A' race, but it was a very good race. Steady. That's the kind of race that you can go to the Breeders' Cup with and maybe have a little bit more confidence that you haven't overdone it."

According to Mott, Ron the Greek, Flat Out, and Royal Delta all appear to be headed to the Breeders' Cup in November at Santa Anita, with Ron the Greek and Flat Out targeting the Classic. Mott indicated he will discuss with Royal Delta's owner Ben Leon about whether Royal Delta will compete against males in the Classic or instead target females in the Distaff. The trio will continue training in New York for the time being.

Pletcher Team In Fine Fettle

Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior), who defeated two-time champion Royal Delta (Empire Maker) in Saturday's GI Beldame, exited her two-length victory in fine form, according to trainer Todd Pletcher yesterday. "Any time you take a 3-year-old and run against older horses for the first time and you're able to win, it's a great achievement," said Trainer Todd Pletcher. "When the horse that you beat is Royal Delta, it's an even greater accomplishment. It further enhanced Princess of Sylmar's reputation and took what everyone recognized as a remarkable 3-year-old season to another level.

He continued, "We've been blessed with quite a few good fillies, but certainly her 3-year-old season stacks up pretty well with anyone's."

Bred in Pennsylvania by Ed Stanco, Princess of Sylmar provided an upset victory in the May 3 GI Kentucky Oaks before romping by six lengths in the July 20 GI TVG Coaching Club American Oaks. She was a 2 1/2-length winner in her latest start in the GI Alabama S. Aug. 17.

"She's what makes racing such a great sport," said Pletcher. "You take a guy [Stanco] that literally breeds his first mare and gets Princess of Sylmar, who's able to compete with all of the biggest horses in the country, and compete against and beat a filly that cost \$8.5 million. It's what's cool about the game, that one from modest beginnings can beat a mare of that caliber."

Pletcher indicated the decision would not be made immediately on whether Princess of Sylmar would be supplemented to the Nov. 1 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

"With the way [Saturday's] races are positioned--five weeks out from the Breeders' Cup--it gives us time to sort out how everyone is doing and how everyone came out of the races," Pletcher explained.

"Hopefully, we can sit back and let them tell us what the right decision is."

Also exiting Belmont's Super Saturday card in good order, **Graydar** (Unbridled's Song) returned from a six-month layoff to take the GII Kelso H., a 'Win and You're In' event to the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

"He broke a step slow but was able to position himself quickly," said Pletcher. "With five weeks and hopefully a good, steady series of breezes leading up to the [Dirt] Mile, I think he has room to improve."

Pletcher, who was represented by a trio of runners in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, indicated everyone emerged from the 10-furlong test in good shape. Heading the group with a runner-up effort was Palace Malice, ahead of fourth-place finisher **Vitoria Olimpica (Brz)** (Northern Afleet) and GI Whitney Invitational H. hero **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song), who came home a lack-luster seventh after a disastrous start.

"He kind of did a spread-eagle coming out of the gate; remarkably, he did not grab himself or pull a shoe," said Pletcher of the ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆. "His chances were eliminated at the beginning, so you just have to draw a line through it and stick with the original plan, which right now would be the [Nov. 2 GI] Breeders' Cup Classic."

He added, "With Vitoria Olimpica, for only his third start in the United States, it was a very good race, and we're very, very pleased with Palace Malice. [Palace Malice] showed up and ran a very good race. Being a May foal, there's more to come, I hope."

Breeders' Cup Plans for Brown Squad

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's homebreds **Big Blue Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) and **Real Solution** (Kitten's Joy) will make their next start in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita, according to trainer Chad Brown Sunday morning. The stablemates ran against each other for the first time in Saturday's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational at Belmont, with Big Blue Kitten finishing a nose behind winner Little Mike (Spanish Steps) and Real Solution another length back in third.

"They came out of the race good, so far," confirmed Brown. "I thought they both ran very well, and so did the winner. We were just on the wrong end of the bob this time. It happens. I thought we were in front just before the wire and after the wire, but on the wire [Big Blue Kitten] was on the wrong end of it, but to a good horse."

All three horses are expected to meet up again in the 12-furlong Turf, a race Little Mike won last year.

"If they stay healthy and they train well, I plan on taking them both out there," said Brown. "Hopefully, we get good, cozy draws. Both of these horses have proven now that they are among the top long-distance grass horses in this country. We'll look for the rematch out at Santa Anita."

Heading into the Joe Hirsch, Big Blue Kitten annexed the GI United Nations at Monmouth Park in July followed by GI Sword Dancer Invitational last month at Saratoga.

"I thought Big Blue Kitten had a good, ground-saving trip, other than the fact that he had to pause momentarily turning for home, which probably cost him the win," said Brown. "Up to then he did save a lot of ground and had clear sailing, but that's turf racing. I thought Joe did a good job making a split-second decision to get himself out of trouble. It was only a momentary pause, but anytime you lose by an inch you probably can say it cost us." Brown indicated Real Solution, who was elevated to the win via disqualification in the Aug. 17 GI Arlington Million, finished a close-up third Saturday. "Real Solution's trip I was a little more concerned with, because he was so wide the whole way," said Brown. "He only got beat a length for the whole thing, and he had to run farther than a length for how wide he was. You're going to have to go around horses at some point, but I felt watching the head-on [replay] that he was quite wide the entire way going a mile and a half. I really needed to see if he could go a mile and a half to go on to the Breeders' Cup. Only getting beat a length going that wide, he earned his right to go out there." Brown is also considering the Breeders' Cup for **Easter Gift** (Hard Spun), who was fifth in the GII Kelso Invitational H. Earlier this year, the colt strung together three consecutive wins, including the Mountainview H. in June at Penn National. "Easter Gift had a bad trip," said Brown. "He had a bad post, and he's not crazy about running on the inside of horses. I don't think [Hall of Fame jockey] Mike [Smith] had any choice. Several times he tried to get him off the rail, and there was just nowhere to go. It's more or less a non-effort. The horse looks like he really didn't run much this morning. I don't know what I'll do. I wouldn't rule out taking that horse out to the [GI BC] Dirt Mile. He's the kind of horse that has a big race in him, I think. He's run a couple numbers already that would make him competitive if he runs his very best race going a mile on the dirt." Also for Brown Saturday, **Last Gunfighter** (First Samurai) finished fifth in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. "I'm never happy when I finish fifth in a race, but I would say I'm not disappointed with his effort. He gave me as good a race as he possibly could," said Brown. "It was a tough race and he didn't disgrace himself any. We'll just regroup with him. I have no plans for him yet."

Fort Larned Exits Homecoming in Good Shape

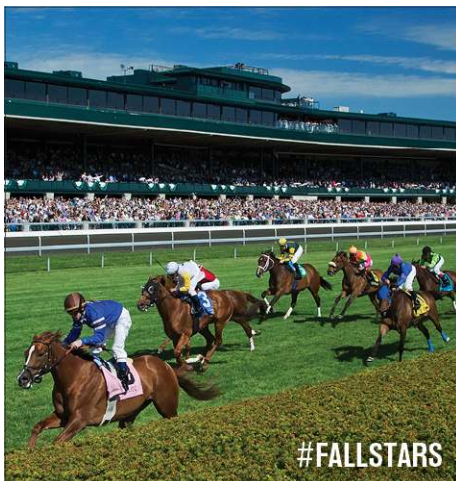
Fort Larned (E Dubai) impressed going gate-to-wire in Churchill Downs' inaugural Homecoming Classic on Saturday in his quest to defend his title in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in November. The Ian Wilkes trainee, who was fifth in the GI Whitney at Saratoga Aug. 3, was originally being aimed at the Aug. 31 GI Woodward S. there, but ended up skipping the contest. "The horse needed the race," Wilkes said of the weekend victory. "He got everything out of it that I wanted from it, because we had to miss a little bit of training with that muscle issue early on after the Woodward. He just wasn't 100%. But he looked bright and alert this morning and he got a lot out of the race, so that was good."

As for the Breeders' Cup Classic, Wilkes said "Everything has to go right now. Everything has to be perfect, timing has to be right, everything has to be spot-on. You can't make any mistakes now going to the Breeders' Cup."

Honor Code Ready for Champagne

Honor Code (A.P. Indy), who gained **"TDN Rising Star"** status in his impressive Spa debut Aug. 31, worked a half mile in :47.99 (5/38) over the Belmont main track Sunday in preparation for a start in Saturday's GI Champagne S. "He's all set up for Saturday unless something jumps up in between," trainer Shug McGaughey's assistante Buzz Tenney said. Honor Code's victory, in which he rallied from 22 1/2 lengths behind over a sloppy track, was flattered by next-out wins by both the second and third place finishers. Runner-up Misconnect (Unbridled's Song) graduated at Belmont Saturday and third-place finisher Purple Sky (Pulpit) won at Churchill Downs. "So, maybe that's going to come back and be a key maiden race," said Tenney.

Much water had passed under the bridge since Shamalgan was third for his initial trainer Arslangirej Savujev in the 2010 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp in May 2010, but he maintained an admirable level of consistency without suggesting he was about to gain a first win at this level. Highlights during the interim period included a win in the G2 Oettingen-Rennen at Baden-Baden in September 2011 and a runner-up finish for the Xavier Nakkachdjii yard in the G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot at Longchamp last June before his switch to Xavier Thomas-Demeaulte for his current campaign. Registering another black-type success in the Listed Grand Prix de Bordeaux at Bordeaux-le-Bouscat May 25, the chestnut was third in the July 17 G3 Grand Prix de Vichy over 10 furlongs and seventh in the G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood last time Aug. 24. "We wanted him to drop in and relax and finish out here and he's a nice horse with a big future. We jumped and went even before quickening up from the four and there was no hiding place for anyone. He hasn't done anything wrong yet and he has a great pedigree. He gets a mile and has plenty of pace, but hasn't run for a while and got a bit tired with me in the last half furlong so hopefully he can progress. He's very big and is quite a raw horse still, so I think he'll improve with racing." Aidan O'Brien added, "He was still a bit green today and if all goes to plan, he will go to Doncaster for the [Oct. 26] G1 Racing Post Trophy. Indy Point was settled in a ground-saving sixth in the early going as Slim Shadey (GB) (Val Royal {Fr}) rushed up to take the lead from the outside, while carving out splits of :23.76 and :47.31. Moving smoothly under jockey Gary Stevens down the backstretch, Indy Point steadily improved his position as he was drawn off the rail approaching the quarter pole and kicked on with authority rounding the home turn. With a head of steam late, he hit the front midstretch and was 1 1/4-lengths clear of Vagabond Shoes (Ire) at the wire. Lucayan (Fr) rounded out the trifecta. Indy Point, victorious in the G1 Estrellas Juvenile in 2012, annexed two more Group 1 wins in his native Argentina before being transplanted in the United States. Campaigned stateside by Gus-May-Fer--the nom de course of Felipe Lovisi--the chestnut launched his campaign with a win in the one-mile Wickerr S. over the Del Mar lawn July 24 before being shipped cross country for the Aug. 17 G1 Arlington Million. Favored in the 10-furlong test, the 4-year-old finished a well-beaten 13th after clipping heels in the early going. "We didn't make it up [the explanation of Indy Point almost clipping heels, costing him any chance of winning the Arlington Million]," said winning trainer Richard Mandella. "We called it as we saw it, and he trained well or I wouldn't have run him [in the John Henry]. He ran like did at Del Mar. It was terrific." Added Lovisi's racing manager, John Fulton, "After what happened in Chicago, it's great to be back on track. We always had confidence in this horse.

"He's never run a bad race. After his debut in this country, we wanted to go [to Chicago for the Arlington Million]. He was favored and he deserved to be, as we've seen today, but after what happened it puts a little fear in your heart. The horse has trained fantastic since then, and

when I got here I thought 'this horse could not be better.' It's like they say in Argentina 'Diez puntos!' or '10 points' meaning you can't get any better. Richard had him ready, Gary knows this horse now, and we're on

our way. Regarding the Argentine runner's immediate future, Fulton said, "He's eligible for Breeders' Cup. I knew this horse was training like the real deal so I talked with Felipe [Lovisi] and told him we have to nominate before he runs, so he put the money on the table with good confidence and faith in the horse and now it's proven to have been a wise decision, so he'll go in the Breeders' Cup Turf. With the kind of race he ran today and the way he relaxed--he's run further than a mile and half. He won the Derby in Argentina that was a mile and nine-sixteenths, so the distance will be no problem."

With Departing (War Front), recent winner of the GII West Virginia Derby at Mountaineer Aug. 3 and GII Super Derby at Louisiana Downs Sept. 7 in the field, it was quite easy to overlook the impressive record of Broadway Empire. The gelding romped by over a pole lengths on debut in a maiden optional claimer at Turf Paradise Mar. 18. He finished second behind Let Em Shine (Songandaprayer) in the Came Home S. over the Betfair Hollywood Park synthetic May 11 and weakened to sixth stretching out in the GIII Affirmed H. there June 2. Back on the dirt next out, he took Northlands' Ky Alta H. by 7 1/4 lengths July 6 and won the 1 3/8 mile Canadian Derby in the slop at that venue Aug. 17. Attempting to keep his record perfect over dirt in this one, the second choice broke on top and set the early pace. He remained firmly in command throughout and cruised down the stretch to bolster his winning margin. Departing, the pick at 1-5, rated about four wide off the pace early. He moved up to make a bid on the turn, but didn't have nearly enough to catch Broadway Empire and faded to fourth.

The Lord Kanaloa train keeps on rolling, as Japan's reigning champion sprinter was along late to turn the tables on Hakusan Moon and successfully defend his title in the Sprinters' S. at Nakayama. Following his 3/4-length victory 12 months ago, Lord Kanaloa made history, becoming the first horse from his country to take down the G1 Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin. He kicked off 2013 with popular victories in the G3 Hankyu Hai Feb. 24 and in the G1 Takamat-sunomiya Kinen Mar. 24, then deftly handled the stretch out to 1600 meters to post a neck success in the G1 Yasuda Kinen in Tokyo June 2. He was first off the freshening in the Sept. 8 G2 Centaur S. at Hanshin and just failed to catch front-running Hakusan Moon. The latter was back to his best game, jumping fastest and quickly taking control of the race with Lord Kanaloa midfield. But once the champ found racing room in the lane, he steadily pegged back the pacesetter for a comfortable score.

British Prize Money Boosted by New Deal...

British racing is due to receive a much-needed prize money injection in 2014 after it was announced that 27 racecourses had agreed to a new initiative to provide minimum contributions. With the Horsemen's Group and the British Horseracing Authority combining to create Prize Money Agreements which transform the current system of discretionary payments into a contractual commitment, the total purse is expected to be swelled by £5 million. Philip Freedman, chairman of the Horsemen's Group, said, "These are landmark agreements for the sport and we view their introduction as a welcome first step towards delivering improved returns for horsemen. Until now, a racecourse's contribution to prize money has been totally discretionary and even though racecourse revenues have grown significantly in recent years, it has been left to them to decide how much should be passed on to the participants. We hope that they represent the start of a new era of collaboration and trust between the sport's key stakeholders. These contractual commitments will lock in the amounts that racecourses are currently investing in prize money and, for some, require significant increases. Racecourses will also contribute, as a minimum, an agreed share of future growth from the sale of rights for betting. I am delighted that 12 independent tracks with varying business models, ranging from Ascot to Ffos Las and including all Scottish racecourses, as well as the Jockey Club's tracks, have recognised the importance in working with the Horsemen's Group and the BHA to strengthen the relationships between the industry's stakeholders and to create a partnership approach to developing racing's revenue streams. Should all courses sign agreements, this would increase racecourses' contribution to prize money by around £5 million in 2014. While this would obviously be a positive development, nobody should be in any doubt that there is still much to be done before British Racing offers levels of prize money that adequately finances an industry into which owners inject nearly £500 million every year. We view these agreements and the principles they establish as an important stage in a journey that will also require working with the government, Levy Board and bookmakers to provide a fair return to the people without whom racing cannot take place." Those tracks to have signed up so far include Newmarket and Ascot, while the Horsemen's Group represents owners, breeders, trainers, jockeys and stable staff.
