### GREEN LIGHT FOR LEGER HERO

Aidan O'Brien yesterday confirmed that G1 St Leger winner **Leading Light (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) will be supplemented for Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp. Despite the presence of the G1 Epsom Derby hero **Ruler of the World (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Camelot (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Kingsbarns (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the line-up, Ballydoyle have opted to swell their ranks to four for the showpiece. "Leading Light, obviously, hasn't done a lot since Doncaster, as it's not that long ago, but everything he's done we've been happy with and I think we're going to supplement him," the conditioner explained. "Then, obviously, we'll get closer to the weekend and see what the ground is like, because Camelot would only run if it was good or better."

### KAZEEM PLEASURES IN SPIN

John Deer's **Al Kazeem (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is on course for Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp after delighting in a workout with his G1 Prix de l'Opera-bound stable companion **Thistle Bird (GB)** (Selkirk). Trainer Roger Charlton gave an upbeat bulletin on the 5-year-old, whose successes in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup, G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Eclipse S. have preceded defeats in the G1 Juddmonte International and G1 Irish Champion S. "They both worked well on Saturday morning over eight furlongs on our summer gallops, which are in fantastic condition," Charlton said. "Although Al Kazeem has had some tough races and on ground faster than he would have preferred, from what I can see he still retains his enthusiasm and his speed figures compared well on Saturday morning with his work before both the Prince of Wales's S. and the Eclipse. The Arc will be his seventh race of the season, but only his 15th race spread over four seasons. It is never an exact science to know whether a horse has gone over the top or about to produce another high-class performance, but the vibes are good."

### DATA LINK RETIRED TO CLAIBORNE FARM

Stuart Janney III hobbled **Data Link** (War Front-- Database, by Known Fact) has been retired and will enter stud at Claiborne Farm in 2014. His career highlights include a win in the 2012 GI Maker's 46 Mile, setting a course record in Monmouth's 1 1/8 mile GII Monmouth S. and a win in Betfair Hollywood Park's GII Citation S. Data Link retires with a lifetime record of 18-8-2-1 and earnings of \$831,335. "We are pleased to have Data Link at Claiborne," said farm representative Bernie Sams. "He was a very good, very consistent racehorse. He has an attractive pedigree, and it has no Mr. Prospector until the fifth generation. I think he will be a good outcross for a lot of breeders."

**MCGAUGHEY TCA's 2013 HONORED GUEST**

Claude R. "Shug" McGaughey III was the Honored Guest at the Thoroughbred Club of America's 82nd Annual Testimonial Sunday night in Lexington, which recognized the Hall of Famer's "distinguished service to the sport of racing."



The dinner, originally scheduled for a smaller venue at Keeneland, was moved to Keeneland's Entertainment Center because of overwhelming demand, prompting Ogden Mills "Dinny" Phipps, who introduced McGaughey, to quip, "If there were a few more tables here, this would have to be held at Rupp Arena."

McGaughey has long been one of racing's most popular and respected trainers. Born and raised in Lexington, he got his start as a hot walker for trainer David Carr. He became an assistant for the great horseman Frank Whiteley Jr., and later worked for Whiteley's son David.

A video reel at the dinner showed the stretch run of McGaughey's first Grade I victory, which came in the 1983 Spinster S. at Keeneland with John A. Bell III's Try Something New, who outgamed a filly named Dance Number to the wire.

Dance Number, ironically, was a Phipps Stable homebred, and a few years later, after being tabbed as the Phipps family's private trainer, McGaughey would train her son Rhythm to a 2-year-old championship.

The McGaughey/Phipps partnership would be a powerful one. Among others, McGaughey has trained for the Phipps the undefeated champion Personal Ensign, and further champions Easy Goer, Inside Information, Heavenly Prize, Storm Flag Flying and Smuggler. He also trained champion Queena, as well as the Hall of Fame inductee Lure.

This spring, McGaughey got his first GI Kentucky Derby winner with the Phipps Stable and Stuart Janney's Orb (Malibu Moon). Janney is the cousin of Dinny Phipps and is another prominent client for McGaughey, and for whom McGaughey saddled the GI Travers S. winner Coronado's Quest.

"In short, the affiliation with the Phipps family, with their familiar black and red silks, and the Janney family, with their white and red silks, has been one of the highlights of my life, and I know I wouldn't be here tonight without them," McGaughey said. "It is impossible to tell you how happy I was for Dinny, Stuart and their families when Orb won the Kentucky Derby. If those so called 'Gods of Racing' do exist, they sure got it right this year. I can't think of anyone more deserving."

McGaughey's speech was infused with both humor and sentiment. The 62-year-old noted that the most common question from people just learning he's a horse trainer is, "Have you won the Kentucky Derby?"

McGaughey said, "I must have answered that question hundreds, if not thousands, of times before May 4th. And the answer was always the same, 'No.'"

He laughed, "Believe it or not, not one person has asked me that question since Orb won. But I'm sure someone will...and I'll be glad to tell them *all* about it."

McGaughey said the Derby is still a blur to him, but that he's been overwhelmed by the response from friends, family and fans, and said the day left many indelible memories.

"My sons, standing in the winner's circle, had tears running down their faces--a sight I had never seen before--just because they were happy for their Dad," recalled McGaughey about his sons Chip and Reeve.



His love of horses, and the love of the animal shared by many on the backstretch, McGaughey said, was ideally depicted in a photo taken this spring during Orb's Triple Crown run. Projected above McGaughey, the photo

was of exercise rider Jenn Patterson, "sitting in the stall one morning, with Orb's head in her lap," explained McGaughey.

McGaughey took time to thank his staff, in particular longtime assistants Buzzy Tenney and Robbie Medina, as well as his family--Chip and Reeve, his wife Alison, his sister Mary, and his mother, "who has always been my biggest fan."

He thanked the many owners who supported him along the way, including Bwamazon Farm's Bill O'Neill; Doc and Betsy Lavin; Mjaka Stable's Henry and Jane Meyer; Emory Hamilton; Andrew Rosen; Mr. and Mrs. John Bell; and Helen Alexander, D.D. Matz and Mrs. Groves.

But it was the Janneys--"Stuart and his wife Lynn"--and the Phippses--"Mr. Phipps, Dinny, Ande, Lily, Daisy, Ogden, and Sam"--who got special mention.

"There's never a day that goes by that I don't enjoy Stuart's phone calls or visits," said McGaughey. "His knowledge and enthusiasm of the Thoroughbred industry knows no bounds."

Of Dinny Phipps, McGaughey said, "He has been a close friend for many years and I'm grateful to him, not only for what he has done for me, personally and professionally, but for all that he does for this industry in his own quiet way. No one is more passionate about the health and welfare of this sport, and few people spend the time and effort he does on a daily basis to improve it. I think we should all thank both Stuart and Dinny for what they are trying to achieve."

McGaughey largely steered clear of the most divisive issues facing racing today, not mentioning Lasix by name, for instance. But he reaffirmed his support for medication uniformity and more robust testing in the U.S.

"I am not a pharmacist or a vet, and I don't want to get into the benefits and drawbacks of particular medications or drugs," he said. "But it sure seems clear to me that we need uniform medication policies; we need labs that all have the same drug-testing capabilities, and we must have greater surveillance on big race days." **Cont. p6**

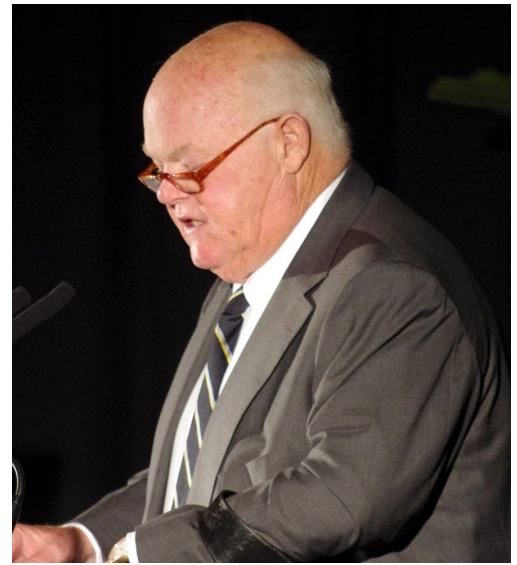

McGaughey concluded the night by saying he feels he's come full circle from the days he spent as a young man at Keeneland.

"Starting on these grounds back in the early 70's, making \$40 a week as a hot walker, to standing here tonight," he said. "If I say so myself, it's been quite a journey. But one thing I want everyone to know: we're not done yet. There's going to be many more great Saturday afternoons and, hopefully, we'll get the opportunity to win the Kentucky Derby again, so we can start that adventure once more."

McGaughey concluded, "For me personally, standing up here tonight, in front of my family and this crowd, and knowing that next year my name will be on the bottom of this program, means more to me than anyone will ever know. I feel like the luckiest man on Earth."

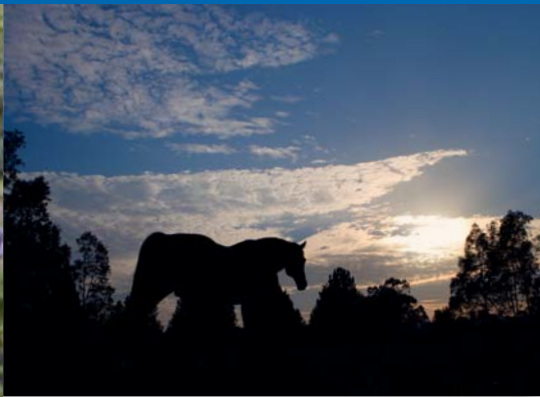

## TATTERSALLS EXTENDS IRISH 2000 GUINEAS SPONSORSHIP

Tattersalls is to sponsor the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas for the next three years, it was announced yesterday. The Newmarket-based auction house, which sponsored the Irish Classic for the first time this year, has agreed to extend its association with the race from 2014 to 2016, and has the option to continue for a further two years beyond that. Tattersalls will continue to sponsor the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup, a race it has supported for the past 30 years and one of the longest continuous sponsorships on the Irish racing calendar. "Tattersalls has enjoyed Group 1 sponsorship at the Curragh for a very long time and the three-year sponsorship of the Tattersalls Irish 2000 Guineas and Tattersalls Gold Cup demonstrates our deep and long-term commitment to Irish racing and breeding," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "The two races are amongst the great races in the European racing calendar and will be the highlights of the Tattersalls global sponsorship portfolio." The Curragh's Paul Hensey added, "Tattersalls have been wonderful supporters of the Curragh and we are very grateful to them for their continued sponsorship. Their long term commitment will ensure we can work closely with their team to formulate a strategy to ensure we continue to attract the very best horses in Europe to compete in both races and to boost attendances over both days of the [Guineas Spring Racing] Festival."

## WALKER SEALS WARREN PLACE MOVE

Newmarket-based conditioner Ed Walker is to move from his current base at Grange Stables, on the town's Hamilton Road, after agreeing terms with Lady Cecil over the lease of part of the Warren Place complex from December onwards. "It is not the first time that we have leased yards out at Warren Place," commented Lady Cecil. "Such arrangements have worked well in the past. We are happy to have made this agreement with Ed and wish him the best of luck with his horses at Warren Place."

Walker added, "I am delighted and privileged to have this opportunity to train from Warren Place. It is steeped in history and perfectly located as it is isolated yet within a stone's throw of Newmarket's top-class [Warren Hill and Long Hill] gallops. It will be great for me to get back to the 'Bury Side' of Newmarket, which I am a lot more familiar with. I spent my first two seasons training from St Gatien at the foot of Warren Hill and prior to that I was assistant to Luca Cumani for four years. So, I am looking forward to returning to that side of Newmarket."

## ST NICHOLAS ABBEY PROGRESSES

**St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) continues to please in his recovery from his potentially life-threatening pastern fracture and severe colic bout. Derrick Smith's six-times Group 1 winner was injured towards the end of July as he prepared for the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. and had contracted colic soon after before a pin in his cannon bone had to be repaired. A tweet from Coolmore Monday afternoon read, "The surgeons at Fethard Equine Hospital couldn't be happier with St Nicholas Abbey's progress to date. Recently fitted with a lighter and less restrictive cast, he is more mobile and is putting more confident weight on the injured leg. St Nicholas Abbey's appetite is good and he continues to gain weight. His blood work remains stable and his medication has been much reduced."

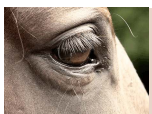

In the parallel worlds of horse-racing and breeding which exist in the U.S. and Europe, there are areas where there is currently no common ground. I was reminded of this by some of last week's results, which included important victories by Tiznow's stallion son Tiz Wonderful, a Grade I double by Macho Uno and Grade I successes for A.P. Indy's stallion sons Majestic Warrior, Mineshaft and Full Mandate, plus Grade II wins for two other sons in Jump Start and Indygo Shiner.

I'm sure that none of these trends would have caused as much as a raised eyebrow in the U.S. but I guess the reaction would be very different over in Europe.

As Bill Oppenheim wrote in his letter of Sept. 16, today's Europeans don't recognize most of the American sires, nor the dam's sides of the pages.

Tiznow, of course, enjoyed a magnificent time at the September Yearling sale, with daughters selling for \$1,750,000 and \$1,700,000. This pair helped boost his average to \$317,432, with 44 yearlings sold, and his median of \$245,000 compared well with his 2011 fee of \$75,000.

However, the demand for his yearlings seemed to be very largely domestic, which isn't too surprising. To the end

of 2012 the Win-Star stallion had cumulative figures of 16 runners in Britain and Ireland, for a cumulative AEI of 0.33. He has yet to sire a stakes winner in Europe, so Europeans could be forgiven for ignoring his stallion sons. This will eventually lead to more blank looks as they pore over future catalog pages, as the *Blood-Horse* Stallion Register includes entries for no fewer than seven stallion sons of Tiznow in Kentucky, including American Lion, Colonel John, Gemologist, Tiz Wonderful, Tizdejavu and Tizway.

## Beldame: Princess of Sylmar upsets Royal Delta

In a finish more surprising for its ease than its result, the 3-year-old Princess of Sylmar glided past two-time champion Royal Delta in midstretch to win Saturday's Grade 1, \$400,000 Beldame Invitational by two lengths at Belmont Park. It was 6¾ lengths farther back to Centring in third.

In becoming the first 3-year-old filly to win the Beldame since 2002 - seven 3-year-olds had since tried and failed - Princess of Sylmar won her fourth consecutive Grade 1 race. The win should end any discussion of who will be the champion 3-year-old filly, as Princess of Sylmar also won the Kentucky Oaks, Coaching Club American Oaks, and Alabama.

Perhaps I should point out that Tizbud--a full brother to Tiznow--is the sire of the got turf distaffer Tiz Flirtatious, who has shone on California's turf courses, while Colonel John's first Graded winner, the 2-year-old filly Concave, earned her win on all-weather.

It is a similar story with Macho Uno, who had had only three runners, and one winner, in Britain or Ireland to the end of last year. Macho Uno's sire Holy Bull was another whose charms eluded the British and Irish, as he had had a total of only eight runners up to the same date.

The road to success on European turf for A.P. Indy's stallion sons has been made all the tougher by their sire's failure to excel in Europe. Only two of the champion sire's sons--Admiral's Cruise and Mingun--enjoyed group success in Europe--and then only at Group 3 level. Consequently Bernardini is the only son of A.P. Indy to have managed to sire more than one group winner in Europe, with help from Darley. Pulpit is the only other American son with a European Group winner, this being his German Group 3 sprint winner Govinda.

That shouldn't detract from A.P. Indy's fine record as a sire of sires in his native USA. Thanks to the truly admirable Princess of Sylmar, Majestic Warrior is the sixteenth son of the former Lane's End star to have been represented by an American Grade I winner. His predecessors are Pulpit, Malibu Moon, Bernardini, Stephen Got Even, Congrats, Mineshaft, Old Trieste, Golden Missile, Aptitude, Jump Start, Full Mandate, Indygo Shiner, Flatter, Master Command and Suave.

I hardly need add that the most successful of these A.P. Indy stallion sons are mainly representatives of the A.P. Indy-Mr Prospector nick which produced five Grade I winners, five Grade II winners and five Grade III winners from 102 starters. These graded winners include Pulpit, Congrats and Mineshaft but not Malibu Moon, whose career was cut short after only two starts, or Flatter, whose best effort was a third at Grade II level. In taking the Hopeful S. in 2007 Majestic Warrior became one of several GI winners sired by A.P. Indy from grand-daughters of Mr Prospector, his dam being Seeking The Gold's fast Grade I-winning daughter Dream Supreme.

Majestic Warrior also has a fast Grade I winner as his second dam, in the Ballerina S. winner Spinning Round, so his pedigree has admirable depth to it. Although his racing career petered out, his bloodlines are of sufficient quality that no-one should be surprised that he has sired a first-crop filly of Princess of Sylmar's calibre.

Interestingly, his second dam Spinning Round was a daughter of Dixieland Band, who also crops up in the pedigrees of some of the other recent Grade I winners by A.P. Indy's sons. Bond Holder, the progressive Mineshaft colt who took the GI Fronrunner S., has a second dam by Dixieland Band, and so does Ron The Greek, the Full Mandate 6-year-old who triumphed in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. What's more, Princess of Sylmar has a second line of Dixieland Band through her second dam Golden Wave Band, creating 4x3 inbreeding.

The other notable duplication in Princess of Sylmar's pedigree is 4x4 to Mr Prospector. Again it is no surprise to find this, as quite a few of the important winners sired by representatives of the A.P. Indy-Mr Prospector nick have a second line of Mr Prospector. Good examples are Malibu Moon's top winners Orb, Declan's Moon, Devil May Care and Malibu Prayer, Congrats' speedy daughter Turbulent Descent and Mineshaft's CCA Oaks winner It's Tricky. Arguably most important of all is Pulpit's highly effective stallion son Tapit. All of these are inbred 3x4 to Mr Prospector (with It's Tricky's inbreeding being 3x4x4).

Another common denominator in Princess of Sylmar's pedigree is the presence of Storm Cat as the grandsire of her dam Storm Dixie. Other grand-daughters of Storm Cat have produced the GI winners Turbulent Descent, It's Tricky, Eden's Moon, Mi Sueno, Wickedly Perfect and Ice Box to stallions sired by A.P. Indy from Mr Prospector mares. You will also find Storm Cat in the pedigrees of Majestic Warrior's Graded-placed winners Cameo Appearance, Drum Roll and Macha, so he is sure to be a popular choice next year for breeders with grand-daughters of Storm Cat.

**QUALITY ROAD COLT TOPS FALL YEARLINGS**

The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearling Sale posted strong returns yesterday, boasting significant year-over-year increases in average and median during the one-day event. Out of the 390 yearlings catalogued for the sale, 289 sold for a gross of \$7,469,900. The resulting average of \$25,847 was up 15.7% from last year, while the median jumped up 41.7% to \$17,000.

Topping all returns was a colt by the young stallion Quality Road, who fetched \$250,000 from Dr. Gerald Bortolazzo's Bortolazzo Stables. The Mar. 3 foal, who is a half to GSP Nathan's H Q (Yonaguska) from the family of multiple graded stakes winners Tasha's Miracle (Harlan's Holiday), Concorde Point (Tapit), and A Penny Is A Penny (Temperance Hill), was consigned to the sale by CandyLand, Agent IV. Herb and Ellen Moelis's CandyLand Farm, based in Delaware, has been perennially among the leading consignors at this sale, and was also responsible for the sale topper in 2008. Monday's topper was bred in Kentucky by Classic Thoroughbred XII, and qualifies for the Delaware Certified Thoroughbred Program.

The second-highest price paid was \$175,000 for a Tiz Wonderful colt. Aiken-based horsewoman Cary Frommer took home the Dark Hollow, agent-consigned half-brother to MSW Mystic Love (Not For Love). Third overall and top among fillies was a daughter of Stormy Atlantic consigned by Paramount Sales, Agent IX. Matthew Schera scooped up the granddaughter of GI Ballerina S. winner Shine Again (Wild Again) for \$150,000.

**NYRA UNVEILS TRAKUS; PLANS TO INTRODUCE MORE FEATURES**

On Friday, Sept. 21, the New York Racing Association introduced Trakus wireless tracking technology at Belmont Park. Already receiving strong positive feedback on its implementation of Trakus data as part of its video product and as a handicapping tool on its website ([www.nyra.com/trakus](http://www.nyra.com/trakus)), NYRA also plans to incorporate the system at Aqueduct and Saratoga while continuing to introduce additional features.


"It's been great--the reception has been incredible from our fans," said NYRA Vice President of Corporate Development David O'Rourke of the response to Trakus at Belmont park so far. "Everyone's been very happy with the product."

When asked what went into NYRA's decision to add Trakus, O'Rourke said, "The decision was two-fold. One was to improve on our video presentation of the sport. And the second was the data that's in the background--the more and more tracks that get onto the Trakus system, the more data is aggregated. It's already a valuable tool to handicappers, but once we get a critical mass of tracks participating, it'll be even more so."

With Big Sandy's unique configuration as the only 1 1/2-mile dirt track in America, Trakus's wireless system lends itself particularly well to following races via chicklets on the bottom of the screen as well as analyzing trip data available online.

"It is incredibly exciting to be tracking races at historic Belmont Park," offered Pat Cummings, Business Manager and Director of Racing Information at Trakus. "Given the size of the racing surfaces, Trakus helps bring added perspective to in-race positions, and should really assist bettors in following their wagers. The far turn on dirt is so long, thus the opportunity for ground loss is significant. This yields great opportunities to analyze the data."

O'Rourke expects that NYRA will make Trakus data from Aqueduct available to the public approximately a week after the Ozone Park oval opens Nov. 1. Trakus graphics and data will be available at the start of the 2014 Saratoga meet.

With differing track configurations, seasonal considerations and racing products, O'Rourke believes that the presentation of racing at each NYRA venue will benefit from Trakus for specific reasons.

"First off, Belmont is massive," confirmed O'Rourke. "Even if you're there live, it's very difficult to see the action on the backside. So, I'd say that probably one of the biggest benefits at Belmont is just that it helps compensate for its sheer size." He continued, "At Aqueduct, while it's more of a standard-sized track than Belmont is, you have inclement weather in the winter. So, I think Trakus will help in that aspect. Finally, at Saratoga, given that it's the premiere track and premiere signal in the country, we felt that we needed to offer the premiere visuals as well."

In addition to the chicklet display and online 'T-Charts,' NYRA will continue to unveil additional Trakus data-powered features as time goes on.

"We wanted to start simple," explained O'Rourke. "We've integrated it with our graphics and it's been pretty seamless so far. The next step will be to offer a distance traveled slate at the end of the race. That should go live very soon. And as we go forward, we're just going to leverage all the other aspects that Trakus has. For instance, there's a specific graphical feed we can do that's just chicklets--we may offer that for mobile devices. There's the overhead shot--the blimp shot--I'd like to offer that for replays. Just little by little, we'll add everything that exists now and work with Trakus to create a few new things."
