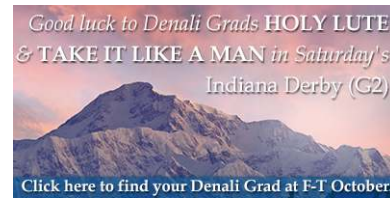

CLEARANCE HIGH AS ORBY STARTS STRONGLY

A cast of international buyers were lured to Ireland for Goffs' premier auction, the Orby Sale, and they ensured a rock-solid clearance rate of 89% for the 198 yearlings offered as business got underway on Wednesday. The 177 youngsters to have changed

hands led to an 11% increase in turnover to €15,484,000. A slight decline in average, by 3.5% on last year's opening session, saw the figure settle at €87,480, while the median also contracted marginally to €55,000 (from €57,000), a 3.5% decrease.

Dubai went head-to-head with Qatar in pursuit of the day's top offering (lot [198](#)), a €520,000 (\$706,491) filly from the late Gerry Oldham's Citadel Stud dispersal consigned by Brendan Hayes's Knocktoran Stud. As the youngster was by Darley's GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality), it was only fitting that she should fall into the hands of Dubaiian interests. Shadwell Estate Company eventually gained the upper hand after a determined challenge from Sheikh Fahad, whose agent David Redvers was the immediate underbidder on the second foal of the G3 Prix de Flore winner Albisola (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}).

Stephen Collins, who manages Sheikh Hamdan's Derrinstown Stud in County Kildare, signed the docket and paid tribute to the success of owner-breeder Oldham, who died in April.

"He developed some wonderful families," said Collins. "This filly is beautifully balanced with a lot of quality, and Raven's Pass is a very exciting young sire. We're delighted with her and will make a decision on who will train her at a later date."

The filly's family was already featured prominently earlier in the day when, just [seven lots](#) in to the morning's trade, an Acclamation (GB) colt out of Prix Imprudence winner Mahalia (Ire) (Danehill), the dam of Albisola, caught the attention of the Highclere Thoroughbred Racing team and was duly knocked down to John Warren for €310,000 (\$421,141). Another of Mahalia's offspring, the dual winner Tonnara (Ire) (Linamix {Fr}), has further boosted the family's appeal by producing G1 St James's Palace S. winner Most Improved (Ire), a son of Ballylinch Stud's Lawman (Fr); and the highly promising French-based juvenile Ectot (GB) (Hurricane Run {Ire}). **Cont. p3**

DETTORI OUT FOR SEASON, MISSES ARC

Frankie Dettori will miss the rest of this season, and the plum ride aboard the unbeaten **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}) in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, after fracturing his ankle in a fall at Nottingham yesterday. The rider was thrown from Eland Ally (GB) (Striking Ambition {GB}) on the way to the post for a five-furlong handicap at the Colwick Park track and landed awkwardly. The rider was aided to his feet by swift-acting paramedics, but he was unable to support his own weight. Initially thought to have sustained soft-tissue damage, X-rays later confirmed the break. Thierry Jarnet, who rode Treve to her first three victories, will renew his association with the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Vermeille victress. "It's bad news, not good news," the Italian's business manager Peter Burrell told *PA Sport*. "He was extremely disappointed on the telephone and did not want to discuss it much more than that. It's an extremely painful injury."

Jake and brother-in-law Harry Herbert, before adding that the colt is to be raced under the Highclere banner for a new venture, which was unveiled in the Bermuda *Sun* newspaper last month. The successful syndicators have teamed up with businessman Simon Scupham, who hopes that some of his fellow islanders will be encouraged to become involved in Bermuda Thoroughbred Racing (BTR).

"This is an opportunity for people in Bermuda with a passion for the sport to own a thoroughbred horse that

competes on the big stage," Scupham told the paper.

With two horses set to race for BTR under the guidance of Newmarket trainers John Gosden and Sir Michael Stoute, Warren added, "This colt looks like he could be a wonderful summer 2-year-old but with enough scope also to be a 3-year-old. He had the pedigree, looks and conformation--physically he was a stand-out specimen. I'm not sure yet who will train him."

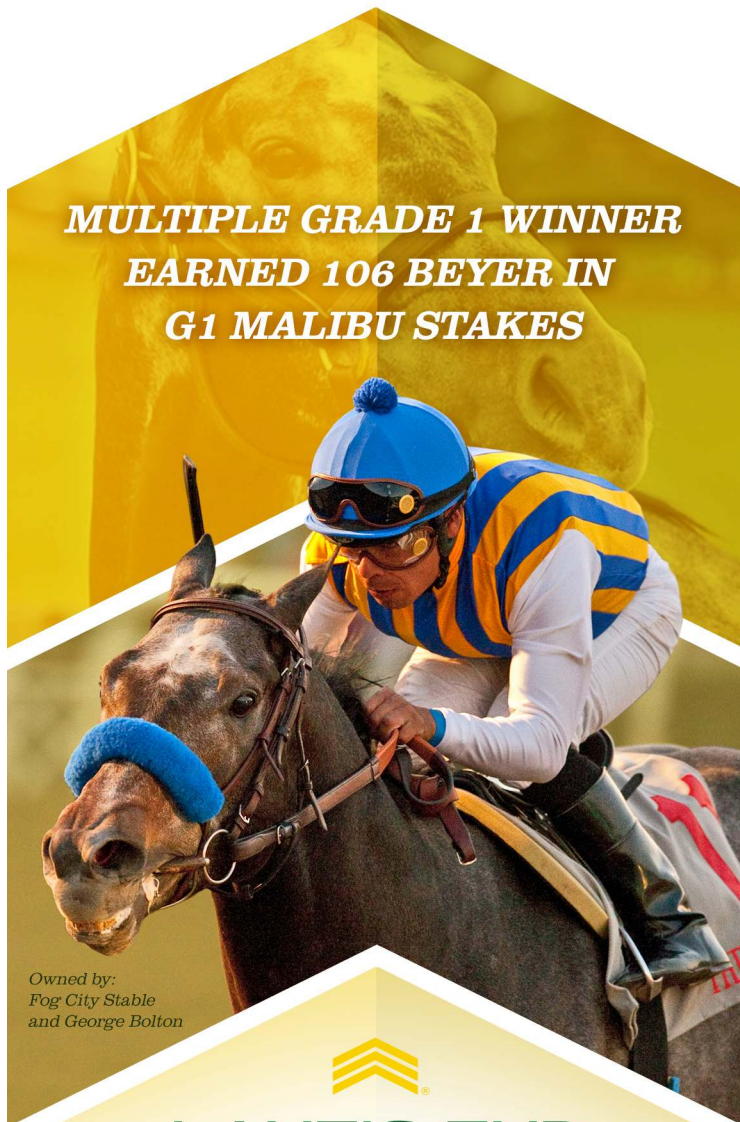
Warren also gave a vote of confidence to a first-crop son of Derrinstown Stud's Arcano (Ire) when buying lot [102](#), out of G2 Lowther S. runner-up Seraphina (Ire) (Pips Pride {GB}) for €115,000 (\$156,230). The colt represented a good pinhooking result for Ciaran 'Flash' Conroy of Glenvale Stud, who bought him in the same ring last November for €56,000. **Cont. p4**

A Henrythenavigator granddaughter of GI Hollywood Oaks winner Pattern Step (Nureyev) (lot [153](#)) and a Duke Of Marmalade (Ire) filly out of Italian Group 3 winner Palanca (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) were also added to Warren's list of purchases for the day at €190,000 (\$258,128) and €120,000 (\$163,042), respectively, and will likely be seen next at Highclere's popular yearling parade at the end of October. The last lot through the ring, another Henrythenavigator yearling, this time a colt out of the GIII Athenia H. winner Antoniette (Nicholas), also went the way of the Highclere buyer and brought the day to a highly respectable close when selling for €340,000 (\$461,953). Lot [219](#) is a half to dual Grade I winner Switch (Quiet American) from the extended female family of champion Mukaddamah.

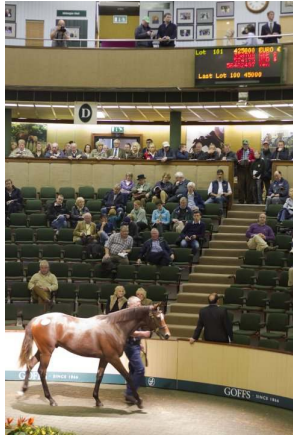

The Legend Continues...

Once again, it was Galileo (Ire) who dominated proceedings in Kildare and the giant of Co. Tipperary was responsible for four of the top nine colts including the leading light who headed the list at €425,000 (\$577,471). Out of 2005 G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas heroine Saoire (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), hip [101](#) from

Cahermorris Stables selling on behalf of Margaret Joyce became the third representative of that mare to enter the spotlight at this auction after her previous progeny sold for €475,000 and €550,000 in 2009 and 2010. The latter was the Coolmore acquisition named Requisition (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and he annexed the Listed Loughbrown S. and was placed third in the G3 Desmond S. last season. Buyer M V Magnier said, “He had a lot going for him--he was a lovely horse and we’ve

been lucky with this family.” The other pair of sons of the “heir apparent” to make a splash were Oaks Farm Stables’ hip [8](#), a half-brother to the multiple Group winner and Group 1-placed Major Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who has now entered the stallion ranks, and Marlhill House Stud’s hip [135](#), whose dam is a full-sibling of the 2005 GI Garden City Breeders’ Cup heroine Luas Line (Ire) (Danehill). The former, who is also a half-brother to the listed scorer Beachfire (GB) (Indian Haven {GB}), was knocked down to Jehan Malberbe’s Form Bloodstock for €280,000 (\$380,479), while the other was one of three high-profile purchases by Jamie McCalmont. Besides his €250,000 purchase of this colt, whose dam is also closely related to Godolphin’s stalwart middle-distance and staying performer Lost In the Moment (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), he also secured two other colts for €280,000 apiece by Coolmore sires past and present. First among them was a member of the first crop of Rip Van Winkle (Ire) from leading vendor Camas Park Stud. Hip [98](#) was one of the most notable pinhooking successes of the day’s trading, having cost just €55,000 at Goffs November prior to his half-sister Sign From Heaven (Ire) (Raven’s Pass) promoting his page with some smart form in Irish nurseries. The February-foaled bay is out of an unraced half-sister to the 1994 G1 July Cup hero Owington (GB) (Green Desert) and becomes the highest-priced offspring of his three-time Group 1 winning sire. Later on, McCalmont snapped up hip [190](#), a son of Montjeu (Ire) from the same draft who is a half-brother to the classy Danehill Dancer (Ire) duo of Callwood Dancer (Ire) and Contredanse (Ire). The next lot into the ring, one of his sons who is the first foal out of the 2010 G3 Blue Wind S. winner and G1 Pretty Polly S. third Akdarena (GB) (Hernando {Fr}) from Staffordstown Stud, sold to Peter and Ross Doyle for €250,000.



NTRA SEEKS SUPPORT FOR NATIONAL REFORMS

The NTRA this week sent a letter to racing commissions in 28 states urging them to adopt uniform national medication, penalty and laboratory accreditation reforms (Reforms). The letter was co-signed by 51 racing organizations and included 60 pages of exhibits outlining the Reforms in detail. [Click here](#) to view the letter, co-signatories and exhibits.

The Reforms were developed by the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTTC), the industry’s scientific advisory organization consisting of 25 major industry organizations, and the Association of Racing Commissioners International (RCI), the industry’s association of state regulatory bodies responsible for the integrity of racing. RCI voted to incorporate the Reforms into their official Model Rules earlier this year. Individual regulatory bodies must now move to adopt the Reforms in each racing jurisdiction.

Eight states, including Delaware, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia and West Virginia, have committed to implement the Reforms. Several other states are in the process of adopting these Reforms as well.

The NTRA urges all industry stakeholders to join us in our efforts to seek nationwide adoption of these important Reforms.

Moments later, the same consignment were also responsible for one of his daughters who capped another red-letter day for the colossus when selling to Blandford Bloodstock for €280,000. Hip [208](#), who is a granddaughter of the high-class Alouette (GB) (Darshaan {GB}), is therefore from the immediate family of Alborada (GB) (Alzao) and all her talented throng. “It’s a very hard family to get into and I don’t think she was ridiculously expensive,” Tom Goff explained.

Sheikh Mohammed Snags Dubawi Filly...

Pat O’Kelly’s Kilcarn Stud offered five yearlings during the opening session, including the second-most expensive filly of the day (lot [176](#)), a daughter of Dubawi out of Watership Crystal (Ire) (Sadler’s Wells). Knocked down to Dick O’Gorman on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed, who stands her sire at his Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket, the filly was sold for €380,000 (\$516,326) and joins the Dubawi colt out of 1000 Guineas winner Speciosa (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) among the five yearlings bought for just over €1-million for the Dubaian ruler during the first day of the sale. Offered by Ballyhane Stud, Speciosa’s son (lot [129](#)) represented a decent pinhooking success for Joe Foley, who bought him for 75,000gns at Tattersalls’ December Foal Sale and sold him for €200,000 (\$271,751). **Cont. p6**

Kilcarn Stud also received €230,000 (\$312,536) for the Teofilo first foal of Quixotic (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), a sister to Cheveley Park Stud stallion Virtual (GB) and a 3/4-sister to Group 2-winning stallion Iceman (GB) (Polar Falcon). That colt (lot [77](#)) was bought by Hugo Merry, who explained, "He's been bought for Jim and Fitri Hay, who had a nice winner with Scotland (Ger) at Epsom on Saturday. He's a lovely quality horse and Dr. Hay and [racing manager] Alex Cole will decide who trains him."

Referring to the forthcoming October Sale at Tattersalls, Merry added, "Plenty of good horses always come out of this sale and once again there's a good mix of nice horses here and they could well end up looking good value by the end of next week."

That may well be the case, but a number of buyers commented on the strength of the grade throughout the first day, especially for fillies, with agent Grant Pritchard-Gordon remarking, "It feels like the old days."

In Form Again...

Form Bloodstock was responsible for last year's Orby topper when Jehan Malherbe signed for a Galileo colt at €800,000. The South African outfit was to the fore again on Wednesday with the €280,000 (\$380,479) purchase of lot [8](#), yet another son of Galileo. The Oaks Farm Stables-consigned colt is a half-brother to the talented miler Major Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), an admirably tough performer for Richard Hannon, whose best win came in the G2 Bet365 Mile at Sandown before his retirement to Terry Holdcroft's Bearstone Stud in 2010. Another half-sibling, Beach Fire (GB) (Indian Haven {GB}), landed the Listed Wolferton H. at Royal Ascot in the colours of Princess Haya of Jordan and recently won over hurdles for John Ferguson.

A bid of €280,000 was also required to claim lot [71](#), a daughter of Invincible Spirit (Ire) offered by the Irish National Stud from their Sadler's Wells mare Propaganda (Ire), a daughter of G1 Prix Vermeille winner Pearly Shells (GB) (Efisio {GB}). John Ferguson laid down a challenge to Ross Doyle, who ultimately prevailed on behalf of an unnamed client.

"She's a gorgeous filly--I thought she was a stand-out by a good stallion who keeps coming up with good horses year on year," Doyle said, adding that his purchase will be trained by Richard Hannon.

Ross and his father Peter are ever-busy buyers at the yearling sales, and among others on their list was an eye-catching grey daughter of freshman sire Zebedee (Ire), the G2 Flying Childers S. winner whom they also bought as a yearling for 70,000gns at Tattersalls. They went to €100,000 (\$135,886) to secure the filly (lot [44](#)), a half-sister to Baltic Knight (Ire) (Baltic King {GB}).

"We bought the filly on spec by our old friend Zebedee," said Doyle. "She's a good strong filly and a great mover--who knows, could lightning strike twice?"

Another of this season's first-season stallions in whom the Doyles were involved at an early stage is Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {GB}), who was selected at the DBS Breeze-up Sale for 30,000gns. He went on to win 11 of his 24 starts, including three Group 1 races, and is now standing at Highclere Stud. The father-and-son team went to €190,000 (\$258,183) for lot [176](#), the Paco Boy colt from the family of the German champion Silvano (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}), now a leading light at Maine Chance Farms in South Africa.

O Brother, Where Art Thou?...

Tinnakill House's brother to young stallion and Group 1 winner Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal), lot [177](#), is now under the ownership of Dr. Philip Brown, who has Montjeu filly Prairie Ranger (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in training with Andrew Balding and who purchased the colt for €260,000 (\$353,289) through bloodstock agent Johnny McKeever after some rigorous study of genetics with Stephen Harrison.

"Dr Brown is very keen on pedigree research, and this colt scored very highly on [Stephen Harrison's] genetic system," explained McKeever. "I then match that up with what I like when I see the horses. Being a brother to a Group 1 winner, there's an extra element to this colt. If we were lucky enough to win a Group race with him he could be a really nice stallion prospect."

In addition to his celebrated full brother, lot 177 is a half-brother to Wana Doo (Grand Slam), the dam of top miler and G1 Sussex S. winner Toronado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}).

Big Good Bob...

The merits of Irish National Stud-based sire Big Bad Bob (Ire) (Bob Back) have been trumpeted in these pages by Bill Oppenheim, and Cristina Patino's homebred stallion recorded another noteworthy success on Wednesday. His daughter out of the Desert King (Ire) mare Sovana (Ire) (lot [176](#)), another of the Citadel Stud dispersal, this time offered by Kildaragh Stud, sold for €230,000 (\$312,525) to become the most expensive yearling for her sire. The successful buyer was the Niarchos family's racing manager Alan Cooper, who confirmed that she is to race in the name of their Flaxman Stables Ireland Ltd.

"We're delighted to have gotten her," he commented. "She comes from a very good breeder, the late Mr. Oldham, and will be trained by Jessie Harrington."

Harrington has already enjoyed success with the offspring of Big Bad Bob, having trained his joint-top-rated performer, Bible Belt (Ire), winner of the G3 Dance Design S. in 2011, and Bible Belt's year-older brother Bob Le Beau (Ire), a listed winner who was twice placed in Group 3 contests.

Lot [98](#), a son of Coolmore freshman Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), was another to have turned a good profit on his foal sales price, increasing in value from €55,000 last November to €280,000 on Wednesday when put back through the ring under the Camas Park Stud banner. Out of Sahara Sky (Ire) (Danehill), an unraced 3/4-sister to top sprinter Owington (GB) (Green Desert), the colt is the most expensive yearling by his sire to date, the previous high of €240,000 having been recorded at Arqana's August Sale.

Rip Van Winkle, a treble Group 1 winner, has 14 yearlings slated to sell over the two days of the Orby auction with five having changed hands during the first session for an average of €83,800 (\$113,867).

The second and final session of the Goffs Orby Sale begins today at 10 a.m. local time. Full results can be found at www.goffs.com.

Last But Not Least...

The final yearling through the ring was a well-connected son of Henrythenavigator offered by Flash Conroy's Glenvale Stud and he kept the fires burning to the very end before the battle was won by John Warren at €340,000 (\$461,953). Having also purchased this year's G1 Phoenix S. winner Sudirman, who rates as probably the best of the sire's progeny to race so far, he was in no mood for buckling despite pressure from David Redvers. Hip [219](#) is out of the the Graded-Stakes scorer Antoniette (Nicholas), making him a half-brother to the 2010 GI La Brea S. and 2011 GI Santa Monica S. scorer Switch (Quiet American), who sold for \$4.3 million to Moyglare Stud Farm in November. After revealing that he had been purchased for the same partnership as Sudirman, Warren said, "He was very similar to him--I'm very keen on the sire."

Doyles on the Boil...

Peter and Ross Doyle were busy throughout the session and, following early successes, were on the mark at €280,000 when securing the Irish National Stud's daughter of Invincible Spirit (Ire). Hip [71](#), a March-foaled bay, is out of Propaganda (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) who is a winning daughter of the 2002 G1 Prix Vermeille victress Pearly Shells (GB) (Efisio {GB}) and who cost 450,000 guineas herself as a Tattersalls October yearling in 2005. She had been purchased for €100,000, carrying this filly, at Arqana's 2011 December Sale and her latest offspring will join the Richard Hannon stable. The father-and-son combination also prevailed at €190,000 for Kildaragh Stud's hip [124](#), a bay colt from the first crop of Paco Boy (Ire), a sire who the Doyles purchased for 30,000 guineas as a 2007 Doncaster April breezer. He is out of a winning half-sister to the prolific Group 1 winners Silvano (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) and Sabiango (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}). Selling continues today at 10am. Cross Traffic Out of Classic Picture...

GoldMark Farm's **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song), hero of the GI Whitney Invitational H. Aug. 3, sustained a minor shin injury when a well-beaten seventh in last Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Park. The gray never got involved after stumbling badly at the start. "It is very unfortunate for this to happen at this time of the year because this will prevent him from competing in the GI Breeder's Cup Classic,"

said Todd Quast, GoldMark Farm's General Manager. "We will bring him back to GoldMark to evaluate him and based on those findings make decisions regarding his future." Trained by Todd Pletcher, the **"TDN Rising Star"** was a heartbreaking second in both the GIII Westchester S. and GI Met Mile H. earlier this year at Belmont.

Johnny V. to Ride Palace Malice in Classic...

Dogwood Stable's **Palace Malice** (Curlin), a respectable second while facing older horses for the first time in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 28, will be ridden by John Velazquez in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Nov. 2, it was announced. The GI Belmont S. hero's regular rider Mike Smith has already agreed to partner Game On Dude (Awesome Again) in the big one. "Mike Smith predictably will reunite with Game on Dude, probable Classic favorite, and his mount in five previous graded stakes victories," Dogwood's Cot Campbell said. "We are sorry to lose him, as he has won the Belmont S. and the [GII] Jim Dandy, and was recently a good second on Palace Malice in the Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Park. But we are overjoyed to get another Hall of Fame rider in Johnny V. He'll fit him like a glove."

'Brujo' Earns Spot in Dirt Mile...

Team Valor International and Richard Santulli's **Brujo de Olleros** (Wild Event--Hit Oil {Brz}, by Roy), a strong second with a wide trip in the GII Kelso H. at Belmont Park Sept. 28, will make his next start in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. A Group 1 winner and track record holder at a mile on dirt in Uruguay, the chestnut is trained by Rick Mettee. "Losing ground and momentum took away from his closing punch, but he still dug in very hard," Team Valor CEO Barry Irwin commented. "This horse is legit and he proved it [in the Kelso]. Great training job by Mr. Rick Mettee!"

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Gyarmati Has 'Reason' To Smile...

Former jockey Leah Gyarmati has had a career-changing 2013 season courtesy of Treadway Racing Stable's **Sweet Reason** (Street Sense), and the year could get that much better when the bay goes postward as the one to beat in Saturday's GI Frizette S. at Belmont Park.

Bred by Brent and Beth Harris as a foal share with Darley, the bay, a half-sister to GSW & GISP Don't Forget Gil (Kafwain) fetched \$185,000 as a Keeneland September yearling last fall, and did her early training at Crupi's New Castle Farm before shipping to New York in early May. The conditioner admits that her filly didn't exactly set the world on fire at first.

"She does everything you want her to do, exactly the way you want her to do it, but she wasn't a standout," Gyarmati said in a national teleconference Tuesday. "She does everything you ask her--nothing more, nothing less. I thought she was a really good filly [early on] based on her attitude and her temper, but she never really came out and showed anything."

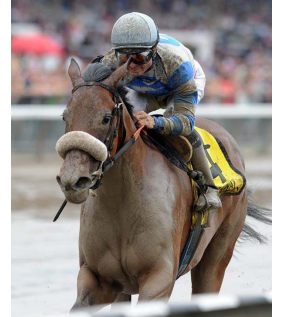
Until her career debut, that is.

Sweet Reason was entered for a 5 1/2-furlong test originally scheduled for the turf at Saratoga Aug. 9, but was contested over a sloppy main track.

"She never really wowed you with her breezes in the morning, and between the owner and me, we thought the turf might be something she'd be good at, and Alex [Solis], who worked her a couple of times, thought she would handle it too," said Gyarmati, explaining the rationale for entering the turf race. "Because she didn't have any breezes that would knock your socks off and because turf races are sometimes easier, that's where we thought we'd try her and see what happens."

Gyarmati had few instructions for Solis, other than to let her make a run and 'hopefully pick up a check.' To say she did more would be an understatement of monumental proportions. Sweet Reason was a remote last and didn't look to be getting over the ground whatsoever for the opening three furlongs, but exploded approaching the stretch and whipped her rivals by better than a half-dozen lengths ([video](#)). That performance earned her a place in the gate for the seven-furlong GI Spinaway S. Sept. 1, also on a rain-affected track. Sent off at odds of 5-2, Sweet Reason fell well back in the opening quarter mile, but found her best stride on the turn and powered home to score by 5 3/4 lengths ([video](#)).

She'll add an extra eighth of a mile for Saturday's Frizette, but neither the prospect of a dry strip nor the stretchout in distance is of particular concern to Gyarmati. **Cont. p12**

"I think she will be just as effective on a fast track," she offered. "Maybe she isn't the same horse on a dry track, but I think she'll handle it fine. I'm not at all concerned about the trip. I feel very confident in this filly. Her numbers are very good and she gives you 100%."

In preparation for Saturday's test, Sweet Reason worked a bullet four furlongs in :47.89 over the Belmont main track.

"She went very easy around the turn--I think she went :25 for the first quarter--then she came home really well," Gyarmati explained. "I just wanted to get her running down the lane and get her to know that when they get to the stretch, it's time to start running. [Alex] just showed her the whip, and she knew he meant it and she took off and galloped out really well too. It was probably one of the more impressive works she's had for me, but she isn't a morning glory."

Gyarmati feels that Sweet Reason can earn a trip to California for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies without necessarily winning this weekend.

"I'm not saying I'm going to beat everybody, but I know she's going to give it her all," she commented. "That's all I can ask for, I think she's as nice as anyone else." --*Alan Carasso*

Lucky Nine Thriving Down Under...

Top Hong Kong sprinter **Lucky Nine (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is progressing nicely at the Werribee International Horse Centre just outside of Melbourne as he prepares to launch a two-race Australian campaign in the A\$1-

million G1 Manikato S. at Moonee Valley Oct. 25. The 6-year-old, last seen winning the G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint at Kranji May 19, was visited by trainer Caspar Fownes. "I went down to see him over the weekend and I'm happy with him, he's doing very well down there," he explained. "I can now start to get him race fit--the

horses there that he'll be facing have been running so are already race fit. That has to be in their favour, so hopefully I can arrange for a barrier trial to be put on for him, maybe on the Tuesday after he comes out of quarantine--that's what I'm working on. [Regular rider] Brett [Prebble] galloped him Monday morning and he was pleased--he says the horse feels thicker under him. I've been sprinting him for a while now so he's looking more muscular." Lucky Nine is programmed for a start in the G1 Patinack Farm Classic up the Flemington straight 1200-meter course Nov. 9 following the Manikato, where he could meet up with last Friday's G1 Moir S. victress Samaready (Aus) (More Than Ready). "The filly that looks to be the main threat, Samaready, she won by four lengths the other day, so that's good, it puts the focus on her," said Fownes. "There's a two-week gap between the races and that's ideal for him. I'll have him as fit as I can have him first up without taxing him and he'll be there to run his race, then we'll have him race hardened for the second race."

NEW ZEALAND BANS ANABOLIC STEROIDS

Officials at New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing (NZTR) have announced that the use of anabolic steroids on horses in and out of competition will be banned, effective May 1, 2014. The new ban will apply to horses over six months of age. The current rules of racing in the country prohibit anabolic steroids on racedays only. There will be a zero-tolerance approach taken on anabolic steroids, according the NZTR Chief Executive Greg Purcell. "While the use of anabolic steroids has not been a major problem in New Zealand, it was important we take a clear and definitive position in the interests of integrity and public perceptions of thoroughbred racing in New Zealand," he commented. "There's no place for performance-enhancing drugs in our sport and this is testament to our commitment." In considering the ban NZTR consulted with its Veterinary Advisor, the Equine Veterinary Association, Trainers' Association, Breeders' Association, New Zealand Bloodstock, Harness Racing Trainers' and Drivers, and Standardbred Breeders and taken into account that some countries will ban anabolic steroids from birth to retirement. Last month, the Australian Racing Board announced its own ban on anabolic steroids, both in and out of competition.

SHEIKH MOHAMMED CALLS FOR INTERNAL INQUIRY

Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum has drafted in the former Head of the Metropolitan Police Lord Stevens to conduct an internal inquiry in the wake of this year's scandals. The move comes in response to the recent discovery of unlicensed veterinary products at Darley's Moorley Farm which serves as a base for endurance horses. While unrelated to the racing and breeding side of the operation, the seizure of the products both on the premises and from a Dubai Royal Air Wing Flight followed on the heels of the well-publicized Mahmood Al Zarooni anabolic steroid fiasco. Lord Stevens, who was prompted to lead the investigation by Princess Haya, said in a statement, "I have been asked by His Highness Sheikh Mohammed to oversee an internal inquiry that will examine organisational structures, internal communication and veterinary practices at all of the major components of Sheikh Mohammed's equestrian properties and operations, including Darley, Godolphin, Meydan and Janah, the equine flight company. We will look into events surrounding the seizures at Stansted and Moorley Farm, including the chain of custody for the medications in question and their intended purpose. We will also look beyond those specific events for a wide-ranging assessment of veterinary procedures and practices to determine whether they are in support of horse welfare and in keeping with all applicable laws and regulations. **Cont. p13**

Sheikh Mohammed is adamant that any evidence of violations of law or regulation in any jurisdiction should be shared with the appropriate authorities. Our primary focus is on preventing any future systemic failures. We will identify best practices and develop protocols and procedures to streamline and improve management and operations. Following my meeting with Princess Haya on Tuesday, I have begun assembling a team of experts for this task. At this earlier stage, it is difficult to predict when we will complete this project, but our work will undoubtedly extend into the new year. We have agreed that we will not wait until the inquiry is finished to suggest any improvements that should be implemented more quickly.”

MEANDE REGAINS EUROPA WIN

Meandre (Fr) (Slickly {Fr}) was yesterday reinstated as the winner of the G1 Preis von Europa following his controversial disqualification by the Cologne stewards. Judged to have interfered with the fourth-placed Earl of Tinsdal (Ger) (Black Sam Bellamy {Ire}) along with the runner-up Empoli (Ger) (Halling) in the Sept. 22 12-furlong feature, the Chechen President Ramzan Kadyrov’s 5-year-old, who is set to be supplemented for the G1 Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe today, had been demoted to third initially before trainer Arslangirej Savujev appealed the verdict. The turnaround means that Vif Monsieur (Ger) (Doyen {Ire}) has been demoted to second behind Meandre, with Empoli left in fourth as a result of being judged to be the main cause of the interference.

Following the early defection of Bridgehampton (Bernardini) and the gate scratch of favored Lighthouse Bay (Speightstown), this already compact field was whittled down to three. Heavily favored Maracuya jumped out to take a short early lead over Baby J as Profitiza trailed far behind through early splits of :22.73 and :46.17. Hitting the stretch just over a length in front, Maracuya began to weaken in the final sixteenth, giving Baby J the opening she needed to get up for a narrow score. Baby J was third in the GII Schuylerville S. before finishing runner-up in the GII Matron S. for Rick Dutrow Jr. at two. A winner for her new trainer Pat Reynolds in her seasonal debut in the Belmont sloop in a \$75,000 optional claimer May 8, she returned against allowance foes to finish third June 14, but bounced back to take the GIII Victory Ride S. June 29. Given some time off following that effort, Baby J showed speed early but wilted to eighth in her latest trip to the post in the Aug. 24 GI Test S.
