RECORD BREAKING FINALE AT GOFFS

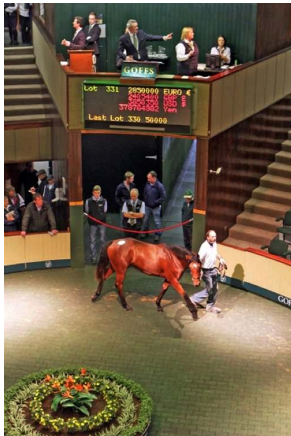
Bold bulletins in the build-up to the Goffs Orby Sale had promised a sale to remember, and those present in Kill to watch Al-Eile Stud's Montjeu (Ire) colt out of their champion Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) sell to Coolmore for €2.85-million won't forget the moment in a hurry. The topper--a modern-day record for a sales yearling in Ireland and the highest-priced yearling in the Northern hemisphere thus far this year--helped fuel a 45% increase in aggregate over this session last year (up to €34,745,500 from €27,189,500 last year), and a 28% increase over the two-day sale. The average for the entire sale settled just above the six-figure mark at €101,004 (up 12%), but was ahead by 28% on the second day to €116,427. The median decreased only

slightly overall at €57,000 (from €58,000).

When a horse is deemed to be worth such a sum, with the blood of two Classic winners flowing through his veins, he is entitled to be a little pleased with himself, and the son of the much-missed Montjeu, who was lost to the breeding world last March, bucked and scampered his way through his prolonged stay in the ring. As [lot 331](#)'s price soared, so did the number of people packed in to the auditorium to view the subject of the intense bidding duel, which saw Ross Doyle bow out at €2.8-million. After reaching that mark, auctioneer and Goffs' Chief Executive Henry Beeby enquired of Doyle's opponent, M.V. Magnier, "I suppose it's a bit cheeky to ask for three million?"

Beeby's wish wasn't quite granted, but God loves a trier, and his approach did elicit one final offer from Magnier, now chief bidder for the Coolmore team, with the hammer falling in his favor to a round of applause from previously hushed onlookers.

"He was a great mover and all the guys thought he was a good one--we've been lucky with [Montjeu] in the past," said Magnier with some understatement. Not only did Montjeu stand at Coolmore, but he has provided its racing arm at Ballydoyle with such wonderful colts as treble Classic winner Camelot (GB), St Nicholas Abbey (Ire), Fame And Glory (GB) and Scorpion (Ire), to name but a few. **Cont. p3**

She was fourth in Deauville's G3 Prix du Calvados Aug. 17, but bounced back in her stateside return after being bumped at the start over the Churchill turf Sept. 7. **Who's In Town** (Speightstown) will make her first start since hitting the line first in the GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga, but being placed fourth for interference Aug. 11. She enters off a strong worktab and is sure to be a presence early. **Designer Legs** (Graeme Hall), who was placed first in that same affair, enters off a fifth-place effort in the sloppy GI Spinaway S. Record Breaking Finale at Goffs (cont. from p1)

With just one reduced crop of foals to come, the death of the stallion responsible for four of the last nine Derby winners at Epsom will long be lamented.

"It was plenty of money to spend, but he's a well-bred horse and it's hard to get those good Montjeus--there aren't many left to come," Magnier continued. "God willing, we've got two good horses by him retiring for us next year--Camelot and St Nicholas Abbey."

Magnier was upbeat about the condition of six-time Group 1 winner St Nicholas Abbey, who is recovering from surgery in July on a fractured leg and subsequent colic complications.

"John Halley, Gerry Kelly and the team of vets have done an incredible job with him, and we're very grateful for that."

The Special One...

Micheal Ryan paid €340,000 for Finsceal Beo as a yearling at Goffs in 2005, and his investment was quickly repaid when the Jim Bolger-trained filly won on her 2-year-old debut the following April. Later that year she landed the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp and the G2 Rockfel S. at Newmarket. During a memorable Classic campaign, she came within a head of notching a hat-trick of 1000 Guineas wins--victory in the English version was followed by a near miss to Darjina (Fr) in France before a home-turf triumph at the Curragh. **Cont. p4**

"She's never let me down," said Ryan. "She's like a good wife--she never gives you any trouble!"

Al-Eile Stud in County Waterford is home to 17 broodmares, but is offering just this one yearling this season.

"If we'd got €1-million for him I'd have been delighted," Ryan added. "But he's a gorgeous horse and plenty of people liked him. He's like a good-looking woman--everyone would turn sideways to see him." Finsceal Beo also has a Galileo filly foal on the ground at Al-Eile Stud.

Modern Day Record...

Since Ireland adopted the Euro as currency in 2002, Goffs' record price for a yearling came six years ago when a filly by Sadler's Wells, subsequently named Jane Eyre (GB), was sold to Demi O'Byrne for €2.4 million. Earlier that season, Micheal Ryan's Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) had come within a whisker of registering a unique Classic treble, failing by a head to claim the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp.

However, the G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner's outstanding ability was not diminished and, after having the joint second-highest priced foal at this venue's 2011 November Sale with an €800,000 daughter of Sea the Stars (Ire), she smashed Ireland's modern record for a yearling when her Montjeu (Ire) colt from Ryan's Al-Eile Stud went the way of M V Magnier for €2.85 million.

Consigned as lot [331](#), the March-foaled bay spent a little over 12 minutes in the Kill complex ring as Henry Beeby conducted an intense bidding war between the Coolmore operative and Ross Doyle once offers rose above the €1-million mark. Agents Jamie McCalmont and Bobby O’Ryan were active during the early exchanges, but soon fell away. Ireland’s overall record yearling price remains the Ir£3.1million paid for the subsequently named Authaal (Shergar {Ire}) in 1984.

Gal Power...

Whereas it was the sons of Galileo (Ire) who made the most impact on day one, the second half of the Orby, which was notable for the overwhelmingly strong trade in fillies, featured three blue-blooded members of that sex by the Coolmore giant. On a day when Coolmore demonstrated their considerable buying power, M V Magnier was on hand to pay €680,000 for lot [354](#), the coveted member of the Ballylinch Stud draft who is a half-sister to Lord Shanakill (Speightstown).

He was notable not only for his successes in the G1 Prix Jean Prat, G2 Lennox S. and G2 Mill Reef S., but also for his placings in the G1 Dewhurst S., G1 Lockinge S., G1 St James’s Palace S. and G1 Prix Morny, and he now stands at the Irish National Stud.

Aside from the obvious immediate appeal of the pedigree, the page also includes the high-class performers Spanish Fern (El Gran Senor), Heatseeker (Ire) (Giant’s Causeway) and Haafhd (GB), whose dam is none other than Al Bahathri. Magnier saw off one of racing’s newest powerhouse characters in Sheikh Fahad, who was standing with David

Redvers. They had better luck with another of Galileo’s well-connected daughters from Barronstown Stud. Lot [245](#) is a half not only to the talented triple group scorer and Classic-placed Carribean Sunset (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}), but also to Balldyoyle’s current classy but quirky performer Snow Queen (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}). Her second dam is the top-class runner and producer Queen To Conquer, responsible for so many notable German performers through her champion daughter Quebrada (Ire) (Devil’s Bag).

Described as a “collector’s item” by the auctioneer, she was wanted by Tom Goff and BBA Ireland’s Adrian Nicoll, but ultimately both had to cry enough as Sheikh Fahad stretched them by bidding at €480,000. The filly was one of 15 purchases by Sheikh Fahad at the sale.

The third high-profile daughter of the exceptional sire was Triermore Stud's lot [292](#), a March-foaled bay who is a 3/4-sister and half to the former Barry Hills-trained pattern-race scorers in Above Average (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) and Sent from Heaven (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}), respectively.

The latter was fourth in the 2010 G1 1000 Guineas near the end of the legendary trainer's career and it was his son Charlie who prevailed with a bid of €295,000.

Magnier also signed for a daughter of Fastnet Rock (Aus) from Seamus Burns' Lodge Park Stud for €420,000. Hip [335](#) is a descendant of the great Meon Valley flagbearer Reprocolor (GB), who is also connected to black-type performers, being a half to the listed-winning and group-placed Flashing Colour (Ger) (Pivotal {GB}) and Tha'ir (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}).

Look Beyond The Page...

When the presses rolled on the Orby catalogue, the Galileo mare Galistic (Ire) had produced two runners, neither of whom had troubled the judge. Come sales time, however, the story was markedly different. Her 3-year-old Duke Of Marmalade (Ire) filly Guinnevre (Ire) is now a listed winner in Germany while 2-year-old Hala Hala (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) boasts two victories.

Such timely updates conspired to ensure that Galistic's third foal, a filly by Acclamation (Ire) ([lot 341](#)), sold for a mouth-watering €580,000--a handsome improvement on the 42,000gns paid for her during the foal sales by Timmy Hyde of Camas Park Stud.

Successful purchaser Ross Doyle would not divulge the name of the owner for whom the filly will race but

it was no surprise to hear him confirm that she would be trained by Richard Hannon. He said, "She's a very nice filly with a big update. She was the stand-out filly of the sale and she's out of a mare by Galileo, who's going to be a fantastic broodmare sire."

Peter and Ross Doyle played a major part in the success of the 2013 Orby Sale, signing for 22 yearlings to the tune of €2,913,000 for a range of clients, including the Middleham Park Racing syndicate which races

G1 National S. winner **Toormore (Ire) (Arakan)**.

Thursday's more expensive purchases also included Tinnakill House's daughter of Invincible Spirit (Ire) ([Lot 372](#)) at €320,000. The filly's dam Idilic Calm (Ire) (Indian Ridge {GB}) has already produced the group/graded winners Calming Influence (Ire) (King's Best) and Steel Light (Stravinsky), and was bought by Dermot Cantillon seven years ago for €70,000. She is a granddaughter of the Moyglare Stud matron Grenzen, whose descendants include G1 2000 Guineas winner Refuse To Bend (Ire) and his G1 Melbourne Cup-winning half-brother Media Puzzle.

Another Acclamation to make a splash was [lot 318](#), a €210,000 Hong Kong Jockey Club purchase from Rathbarry. Also the subject of a significant update in the past 12 months, the February-foaled colt is a half to last month's Ayr Gold Cup hero Highland Colori (Ire) (Le Vie Dei Colori {GB}) as well as being closely related to the Group 3-winning and Group 1-placed sprinter Genki (Ire) (Shinko Forest {Ire}). "Hong Kong is all about speed and this horse fit the bill, especially being by Acclamation," Mark Richards of the Hong Kong Jockey Club commented.

Iffraaj's Way With The Fillies...

Shadwell Estate Company had been involved in the top lot on the opening day of the sale when going to €520,000 for a daughter of Raven's Pass, and another filly by a Darley sire also went their way following the purchase of [lot 345](#) at €500,000. Two Group 1-winning fillies for Iffraaj this season--Rizeena (Ire) and Chriselliam (Ire)--have done wonders to boost the appeal of the son of Zafonic, and Sheikh Hamdan will be hoping that his March-born filly out of dual winner Give A Whistle (Ire) (Mujadil {GB}) will be capable of following their fine example. Her pedigree certainly gives cause for optimism: from seven runners her dam has produced six winners, four of which have garnered black-type, including La Habra S. heroine Pasar Silbano (Ire) (Elnadim), who recorded her Grade III win for Three Chimneys Racing and Jim Cassidy after being sold with four victories under her belt from the stable of Ger Lyons. Pasar Silbano's full-sister Come To Heel (Ire) is another to have provided a major update since the publication of the catalogue with a listed victory in August plus a good fourth-place finish in the G1 Cheveley Park S. All told, Shadwell parted with €1.29 at Goffs for four yearlings.

Classic Pretensions...

G1 Irish Oaks winner Chicquita is set to appear in the Goffs November Sale as part of the hugely anticipated Paulyn Dispersal, but the family of her Classic pursuer, Venus de Milo (Ire) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}), who finished just a half-length behind her at the Curragh, gained further prominence on Thursday when that filly's Dalakhani (Ire) half-sister, [lot 378](#), sold for €380,000 to trainer David Wachman.

It's a dynasty that has more than just recent generations to its credit. The filly's dam, Inchmahome (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) is a half-sister to Inchinor (GB) and won for her breeder Anthony Oppenheimer, who sold her for 145,000gns at Tattersalls in 2008. Another of her half-siblings is Ingozi (GB), the dam of GI E.P. Taylor S. winner Miss Keller (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}).

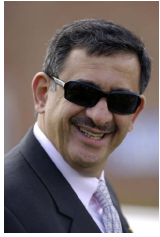

Nerses also signed for a grey son of Henrythenavigator (lot [314](#)) out of an Unbridled's Song half-sister to Lear Spear (Lear Fan) at €150,000.

Freshman watch...

Established sires dominated the top of the stallion tables for the sale, but of the first-season sires with representatives in the catalogue, Highclere Stud's **Paco Boy (Ire)** received a warm reception from buyers with four yearlings selling for an average of €86,000 and top price of €190,000. **Fast Company**, who started his second career at Rathasker Stud at a fee of €5,000, had six yearlings change hands for a respectable average of €75,833 and high of €150,000. Coolmore's **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** had strong numerical representation, with all 12 of his yearlings offered selling for an average price of €64,167. The best-seller among them was knocked down for €280,000. All seven yearlings by **Zebedee (Ire)** changed hands for an average of €48,286.

Hard Work Rewarded...

Morning line favorite **Gentlemen's Bet** (Half Ours) enters off three impressive efforts. He was victorious in an optional claimer at Churchill May 17 before taking the Iowa Sprint H. at Prairie Meadows June 28 and was solid third behind Justin Phillip (First Samurai) in the Spa's GI Vaderbilt H. Aug. 4. He has never raced on a synthetic track. Presque Isle Mile winner **Hogy** (Offlee Wild) is expected to scratch and instead run in tomorrow's GI Shadwell Turf Mile.

VOLEUSE DE COEURS DEAL CONFIRMED

Australian bloodstock agent Paul Moroney has confirmed a deal has been sealed for Lady Chryss O'Reilly's six-length G1 Irish St Leger victress **Voleuse de Coeurs (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}), who will now point to the Nov. 5 G1 Emirates Melbourne Cup. Having failed in initial attempts to secure the 4-year-old bay, Moroney revealed the purchase, for a seven-figure sum on behalf of Ting Kong Chen's Sun International Group, will be conditioned by his Flemington-based brother Mike Moroney. "We had the deal done, but just had a little hiccup 24 hours before so we had to sit and watch her win [the Irish St Leger], which was a bit hard to take," Mike Moroney, who won the 2000 renewal of the Cup with Brew (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}), told *racenet.com.au*. "Paul originally identified her as a prospect last year and we have been tracking her since. We've had a few hurdles in our way, but we've managed to get her and we are all very pleased. Paul rang [last weekend] and said we had another chance to put a deal together. The price had naturally increased and that made it difficult for us, but Paul has done the deal with Mr Ting Kong Chen and she will race for him in the Melbourne Cup. She is a Group 1 winner with upside, and that is what the market values, these type of winning mares today. She handles all types of going and is not just a wet tracker. She has won on good ground, so should not have any problems that way once she gets here." Voleuse de Coeurs is currently observing quarantine conditions at Side Hill Stud in Newmarket and is slated to fly to Australia Oct. 16.

At the same time, **Camelot (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), **Yellow and Green (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}), **Manndawi (Fr)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) and **Kingsbarns (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) were taken out of the Longchamp showpiece. With Joseph O'Brien unable to make the 123-pound weight set for G1 Epsom Derby hero **Ruler of the World (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and G1 St Leger winner **Leading Light**, Gerald Mosse, who prevailed aboard Saumarez (GB) in 1990, has been engaged to partner the latter. "I'm extremely happy to have got the ride," commented Mosse. "I put my services forward for the ride some time ago when I learned that my intended mount, Chicquita, was to be sold by her owner and would not be running. They rang me back and I'm very grateful. I have ridden for Mr O'Brien before, but not in the Arc. I would not have a worry about the ground if it turned soft. The ground was just on the soft side of good today, but we are expecting rain tonight. **Leading Light** looks extremely strong and solid, and that is just what you need to win an Arc. I've won the race before and it would be good to put my name back up there among the winners again. He gets a three-kilogram allowance as a 3-year-old, which is very helpful, and I'm very happy to be riding him. He comes from a top stable and looks to have a good chance.

NTRA CALLS FOR UNIFORM DRUG REFORM

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association sent a letter to all pari-mutuel regulators encouraging them to adopt uniform reforms regarding changes to medication regulation, enforcement, and testing. (Click here to [view](#) letter)

The letter specified reforms that have been developed by the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium, such as the adoption of medication guideline, a multiple violator penalty system, and participation in lab accreditation assurance programs.

The Association of Racing Commissioners International (RCI), the industry's association of state regulatory bodies that govern the integrity of racing, voted to incorporate these reforms into their Model Rules. Individual regulatory bodies now have to move to adopt the reforms in each jurisdiction.

Delaware, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia have agreed to implement these reforms at the start of their 2014 seasons. Several other states are in the process of doing the same.

"Nationwide adoption of these reforms is essential to safeguarding horses and riders and providing uniformity to fans and participants alike," wrote Alex Waldrop, President and CEO of the NTRA and newly elected Chairman of the RMTC. "If you have not done so already, we urge you to commit to the reforms and move expeditiously to adopt all aspects of the reforms."

BLACK CAVIAR HORSE OF THE YEAR AGAIN

Undefeated Australian sprinter **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) claimed her third consecutive Horse of the Year title in that country at the 2012/13 Australian Racehorse of the Year awards yesterday. The winner of 25 races, including 15 Group 1s, Black Caviar becomes just the second horse, in addition to fellow Hall of Famer Sunline (NZ), to earn three Horse of the Year titles. She also claimed Champion Sprinter honors, and beat her younger brother, four-time Group 1 winner **All Too Hard (Aus)** (Casino Prince {Aus}), in both categories. All Too Hard, who entered stud this season at Vinery Australia, earned his time in the spotlight by scooping Champion 3-Year-Old honors over the likes of **Pierro (Aus)** and **It's a Dundeel (NZ)**. Black Caviar was retired after a victory in the G1 T J Smith S. Apr. 13, and was recently covered by Australia's 2012/13 Champion Sire Exceed and Excel (Aus), though she is not yet in foal, co-owner Neil Werrett announced Thursday.

Sydney Sale Sets Australasian Record:

Yesterday's inaugural Inglis Sydney Ready 2 Race Sale set a record average price of A\$76,742 for breeze-up sales in Australasia. At the end of the day, 148 lots went through the ring from 195 catalogued, bringing a total of A\$6,983,500. The median was A\$60,000, while the clearance rate finished at 62% (91 sold). The highest price of the sale, A\$310,000, was paid for the 3-year-old Distorted Demand (Aus) (Red Ransom-Twisted Heart {Aus}), by Distorted Humor). Purchased by Sydney trainer Mauro Poletti from the draft of Carinya Lodge, the half-brother to Malaysian star Speed Baby (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) was the last horse through the ring as [Lot 195](#). The colt has yet to race, but won a Rosehill barrier trial Aug. 5.

The top juvenile price of A\$280,000 was shared by [Lot 88](#) and [Lot 165](#). The former, a son of Exceed and Excel (Aus), was scooped up by Hong Kong agent George Moore from the Woodside Park Stud consignment. He is out of a half-sister to stakes winner Chester County (Aus), as well as the dam of Group 1 winner Ruud Awakening (Aus) (Bernardini). Lot 165, a New Zealand-bred son of High Chaparral (Ire), was purchased by Sydney trainer David Vandyke from Beatson Stables. He is out of Group 1-placed Tick By (Aus), a daughter of multiple group winner Klokka (Aus) (Marscay {Aus}).

Singapore trainer Patrick Moore was the leading buyer, signing for six lots for A\$740,000, and Muskoka Farm was the leading vendor, selling all six offerings for A\$595,000. Buyers from Singapore, Hong Kong, Macau, Malaysia, South Africa, the U.S. and Australia were on hand for the new sale.

"We've had wonderful support from leading vendors in Australia and New Zealand, and are well placed to take this sale to greater heights next year," said Inglis Managing Director Mark Webster. "I'm also thrilled with the quality and diversity of the buying bench who have supported this sale, with both local and international buyers getting behind this new select sale format. The only downside was the clearance rate at the fall of hammer, something we will aim to improve in the coming days and next year by being even more selective when assembling the catalogue."

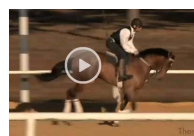
