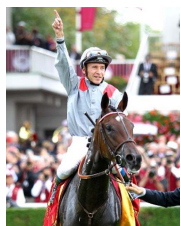

TREASURE TREVE

Wildly impressive against her own sex in the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Vermeille, Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}) took it to the colts and her elders yesterday in one of the all-time great performances in Longchamp's G1 Qatar Prix de

l'Arc de Triomphe. Thierry Jarnet was the beneficiary of Frankie Dettori's injury-enforced absence, but any rider would have been a mere passenger as the sensational 3-year-old filly outmaneuvered and outclassed some serious opponents. Always kept wide from a post position that would have killed the chances of a lesser talent, the bay, who was sent off the 48-10 second choice, tanked to the front on the home turn before opening up

for a ruthless five-length dismissal of one of the world's finest in **Orfevre (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}). "She is part of the family--a sister to me--and the way she won was incredible," commented trainer Criquelette Head-Maarek, who was celebrating a second success 34 years after Three Troikas (Fr) kickstarted her career in style. "She didn't have the best of races and had to race on the outside the whole way, but when horses are good, numbers at the start and the ground make no difference. I have been lucky to have trained some great fillies, but she is the best I have had by far. I had been thinking of retiring, but not now for sure." **Cont. p3**



EMOLLIENT LAST TO FIRST IN SPINSTER

BIG PERFORMANCES ON ARC UNDERCARD

While Treve's tour-de-force in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe will now doubt go down as one of the great renewals of the historic race, a few other females on the undercard refused to be overshadowed, in particular French sprint star **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Seeking her sixth Group 1 victory--and third straight in eight weeks--Moonlight Cloud was the subject of another masterful Thierry Jarnet ride, swooping down the center of the track in the dying strides of the race to annihilate a field of talented sprinters. Earlier on the card, **Dalkala** (Giant's Causeway) got her nose down just in time to earn her first Group 1 victory; **Maarek (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) made an explosive run from midpack to steal the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye, and **Altano (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) provided some compensation for trainer Andreas Wohler after Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) was forced out of the Arc with a fever with a victory in the G1 Prix du Cadran. Juveniles **Karakontie (Jpn)** (Bernstein) and **Indonesienne (Ire)** (Muhtathir {GB}) staked their claims for next year's classics with victories in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac, respectively. **Pages 5-12**

Once a race that favored the likes of Treve, the Arc had suffered from the lack of incentive to keep high-class distaffers in training, and only Urban Sea managed to break the male domination from the mid-eighties to late into the last decade. Once the European Pattern system was revamped to create a new agenda for fillies and mares, the door to this global showpiece was prized back open with its huge advantage of a combined outdated weight-for-age scale and sex allowance. Five years ago, Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar) showed that the colts' superiority could be at an end before

Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) and Solemia (Ire) (Poliglote {GB}) also stepped into the fray. Were it not for the excitement generated by the stellar performer Orfevre, Treve would have started much shorter to continue the trend after her emphatic defeat of the subsequent G1 Irish Oaks heroine Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly June 16, and comfortable dismissal of Wild Coco (Ger) (Shirocco {Ger}) in the G1 Prix Vermeille over this track and trip last time Sept. 15.

Her draw in 15 also sought to undermine the confidence her scintillating performances at this level had generated, and for the first mile of this steadily run contest the doubts grew. Pulling out wide even before an early bump with **Al Kazeem (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) meant that all hope of finding all-important cover had gone, she was eventually allowed to tank her way to the head of affairs at the end of the "false straight."

She joined the long-time leader **Joshua Tree (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Ocovango (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}) by the top of the home stretch. Still full of run as Orfevre and **Kizuna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) followed in her tracks, Treve was shaken up as the quarter pole arrived and within a few strides was gone, with Orfevre and the leading 3-year-old colts **Intello (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) and Kizuna left to look relatively ordinary. "She is just terrific," Head-Maarek commented. "Horses like this with such acceleration don't come around often and she is out of this world. She had the worst possible trip and had to quicken too early, but Thierry did well and you could see her class. I am very proud, as when Sheikh Joaan bought her he had said he wanted to win the Arc and I said I would do the best I could. After the Vermeille, it was getting closer and I have to thank Frankie [Dettori] for not being hard on her and using the whip then. Because of that, she was on top form today and so I feel sorry for him." Breeder Alec Head, who also trained Nuccio (Ity), Saint Crespin (GB), Ivanjica and Gold River (Fr) to win this between 1952 and 1981, added, "To breed this top-class filly, having been in the game for so long, makes this a wonderful moment for me and my family. She is amazing and so good it is frightening." Sheikh Joaan, whose input into the industry and sponsorship support of the Longchamp bonanza was rewarded with success on one of the biggest stages, was of a similar opinion. "There are no words that can describe it," he said while sitting in the traditional carriage that holds winning connections. "Hopefully, we can come back for the next couple of years." **Cont. p4**

Keeping It In the Family...

Treve descends from the accomplished Trillion (Hail to Reason), winner of the G1 Prix Ganay for breeder Nelson Bunker Hunt and partner Edward Stephenson. She went on to record four straight runner-up finishes against males in Grade I turf events in the U.S., and was honored with an Eclipse Award for her efforts.

Trillion outproduced herself in the form of Triptych (Riverman), a \$2.15-million yearling purchase at Keeneland July. That redoubtable runner became the first filly to win the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas for owner Alan Clore in 1985. She won 14 of 41 career starts, including five Group 1 events in 1987, and later sold for \$3.4-million during a dispersal of Clore's bloodstock interests. Triptych was killed in a paddock accident while carrying her first foal by Mr. Prospector.

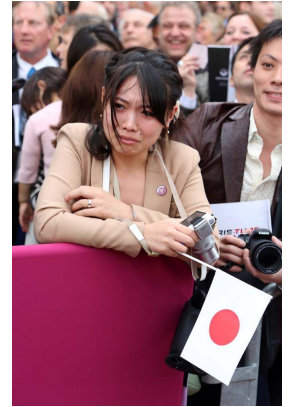
Trevillari, the Arc winner's second dam, was by Riverman out of Trillion's daughter Trevilla (Lyphard), and was trained by Criquelette Head-Maarek; her full-sister Treble was a Group 1 winner. Trevillari's best foal for the Head family was listed winner Tsigane (Fr) (Anabaa), and his full-sibling Trevisse produced listed winner Trois Rois (Fr) (Hernando {Fr}) prior to Treve.

Treve was retained by the Head family's Haras du Quesnay after RNA'ing for €22,000 at Arqana 24 months ago, and she has repaid them in spades.

The rangy bay captured her first three starts for the Heads, including the G1 Prix de Diane in June, before being purchased privately by Sheikh Joaan Al Thani of Qatar. Treve has a 2-year-old half-sister by Quesnay stallion Mr. Sidney (Storm Cat) and a yearling half-sister by fellow Quesnay inmate Fuisse (Fr) (Green Tune).

Orfevre Fever...

Unlike 12 months ago, when Orfevre looked unlucky not to break Japan's hoodoo in this race, the 5-year-old was put firmly in his place and connections were content to admit they were a clear second-best. "He ran his race, but there was nothing he could do against that winner," jockey Christophe Soumillon said. "He is a great champion and everybody knows his problems, but he is much better in his head and, although it is difficult to come back at six, we'll see. Today, Treve was just completely over the top."

Dalkala had been to this meeting last term and was successful on the Saturday card when making all in the G2 Prix de Royallieu over 1 9/16 miles, but she had her stamina stretched beyond its limit subsequently when off the board in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak back here later in October. Returning to be fourth in the G2 Prix d'Harcourt over this track and trip Apr. 7, the dark bay was sent to York to annex the G2 Middleton S. May 16 and that form received a boost the following month when the runner-up Ambivalent (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}) captured the G1 Pretty Polly S. Only

ninth back over a mile and a half for the June 23 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, the homebred was third under positive tactics in Deauville's G1 Prix Jean Romanet reverting to this trip when last seen Aug. 18 and had been freshened up for this below-par renewal.

Settled in fifth early by Christophe Soumillon tracking the prominently ridden Tasaday, Dalkala allowed that rival first run with a quarter mile remaining and ground her down in the very last stride as Thistle Bird finished strongly. "We kept her for this and last time she was ridden a bit too aggressively, so today with the ground the way it is we decided to hold her up and it made the difference," trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre said of the winner, who was providing His Highness The Aga Khan with an outright record of four Prix de l'Opera renewals. "I doubt she will run again, but you never know." Thistle Bird's trainer Roger Charlton added, "I'm so proud of her. James [Doyle] said if they had gone one stride faster she would have finished closer. She is retired now and we are very happy."

The winner's third dam Daltawa (Ire) (Miswaki) was represented by a memorable duo in the form of champion Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}), a Breeders' Cup winner and earner of over \$4.4 million; and Dalakhani (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}), a successful sire whose four Group 1 wins included the 2003 Arc. Daltaiyma, a full-sister to Daylami, managed to break her maiden before producing G3 Prix de la Grotte heroine Daltaya (Fr) (Anabaa). Daltaya's first foal is the Opera heroine. Her 3-year-old colt Dalilar (Dynaformer) is a winner, and she has a 2-year-old Mr. Greeley filly named Doulmera. Daltaya rejoined the Aga Khan's European broodmare band in time to foal a Medaglia d'Oro filly in April 2012, and produced an Authorized (Ire) filly in May.

With the home runner taking over 150 yards out, Maarek was galvanized by Declan McDonogh and conjured his familiar turbo-charged finish to get up in the shadow of the post. "They went very fast, but I got a lovely lead off the horse that was second and he's very, very game," McDonogh said. "He loves soft ground and came into his own on the last 100 metres. They've done a great job with him and he'll go back to Ascot with a great chance.

“He has a huge stride and had the perfect trip,” Pease continued. “I think we will put him away now for the season.”

Racing Manager Alan Cooper added, “This is an international story, as his dam, who is a granddaughter of Miesque, was born in Japan and so was he as his dam was sent there to visit Bago (Fr) in foal to Bernstein.” Karakontie’s third dam is the peerless Miesque, whose offspring Kingmambo (Mr. Prospector) and East of the Moon (Private Account) captured their respective one-mile Classics at the Bois de Boulogne course in the 1990s. Miesque’s Woodman filly Moon Is Up was a listed winner, but her Sunday Silence filly Sun Is Up failed to win when campaigned in France. The dark bay mare has done much better in the breeding shed, however. Her Mineshaft colt Bottega won the Listed Criterium du Languedoc, while her Lemon Drop Kid colt Sunday Sunrise also became a stakes winner at Zia Park. "She is a sweet filly who I have always liked and she was very impressive first time out," trainer Christophe Ferland commented. 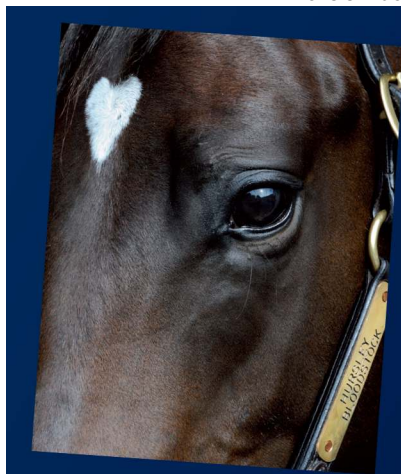

She is the dam of G1 Epsom Derby hero Generous (Ire) (Caerleon) and G1 Epsom Oaks winner Imagine (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), and her other descendants include multiple Group 1 winner Horatio Nelson (Ire) (Danehill). Ventura has a 3-year-old filly by Manduro (Ger) named Satin Box (Ire) and a yearling Montjeu (Ire) filly. She foaled a Makfi (GB) filly this past March.

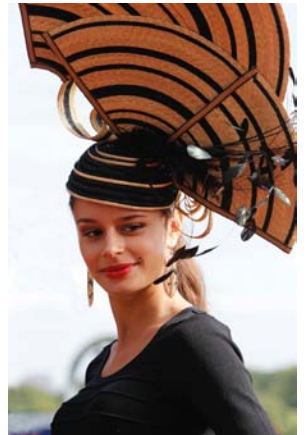

"They don't always do what you think they're going to do, but the good thing was she came with a big run," Mott continued. Mike went to the alternate plan and the only thing you could do and that's ride from where she broke and where she settled in. I guess we've got to do it their way once in a while."

The Spinster is a "Win and You're In" race for the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, but Mott was making no predictions on the classy filly's next start. "No plan at this point," he said. "We'll have to wait and talk to all the bosses and see."

Empire Maker, who stood at Juddmonte before being sold to Japanese interests, has owned this race as a sire in recent years. He has now accounted for four of the last five runnings, including In Lingerie ('12), Acoma ('10) and Mushka ('09).

Since winning the Ashland, Emollient was a well-beaten sixth in the May 17 GII Black Eyed Susan S. before taking the July 13 GI American Oaks in her turf debut. She was eighth over the Belmont lawn in the Sept. 14 GI Garden City S. in her most recent start.

Fellow Chad Brown trainee Shadow Banking completed the exacta and Brown followed up with Testa Rossi (Fr) winning the GIII Miss Grillo S. one race later. Brown also doubled up in the Pilgrim and Miss Grillo a year ago, with Noble Tune (Unbridled's Song) and Watsdachances (Ire) (Diamond Green {Fr}), respectively. "Second time out, we learned [Bobby's Kitten] was capable of leaving early and finishing," Brown said. "He has speed and can carry it, which makes him dangerous. Javier [Castellano] came out and worked him the other day and really liked the horse and accepted the mount on him. He said, 'I want to go out. I'm not going to worry what anybody else is doing. I'm going to ride my race. I'm real confident.' He rode that way." Brown added both of his Pilgrim runners could be headed to California. "I'm taking them both if they are healthy," he said.

Trainer Chad Brown's success with this type of runner is well documented and, following on the heels of her stablemate Bobby's Kitten's victory in the GIII Pilgrim S. a half hour earlier, Testa Rossi's backers were surely thrilled to get 5-1 on the French import receiving first time Lasix. Allowed to bide her time early under a patient Jose Lezcano, the chestnut spotted the field about 10 lengths early, with longshot Echale Salsita (Two Step Salsa) setting a tepid pace and Testa Rossi's favored stablemate, Granny Mc's Kitten (Kitten's Joy), sitting in a stalking position. Testa Rossi began to wind up rounding the turn, chasing the Kiaran McLaughlin entry of Sky Painter and Dancing House as they circled the field in tandem. It was the winner who was traveling best at that juncture, however, and after putting the entry behind her, she overtook her stablemate while four wide at the top of the stretch. Sky Painter re-rallied to give the chestnut a scare in the final strides, but it was in vain as Testa Rossi kept her nose in front. Narrowly beaten in her first two outings going five furlongs at Lyon-Parilly in France in the spring, Testa Rossi graduated when upped to six panels at that course June 2, and added a pair of conditions scores at Lyon-Parilly and Maisons-Laffitte June 15 and July 7. She had not been seen publicly since the latter seven furlong victory, and prepared for this reappearance with a Belmont work tab that was steady without being spectacular. "You never know until you run them," Brown mused after the race. "Her works were good--they weren't great. She's a good-looking horse, she's got good form and every week she seems to be improving. The idea was to go ahead and enter her, knowing she's on the improve. I wasn't concerned about the extra distance. I have a bunch of these fillies and I picked the two I thought would give me the best chance to win, and she was one of them." Of eventual fourth-place finisher Granny Mc's Kitten, who won the P G Johnson S. at Saratoga Aug. 28, Brown added: "Granny Mc's Kitten missed her last work. She had a great two days of training this week. In hindsight, it might have compromised her a bit. If she has the credentials to get into the Breeders' Cup, I sure would like to take her. Maybe she'll have smoother training going into that race."

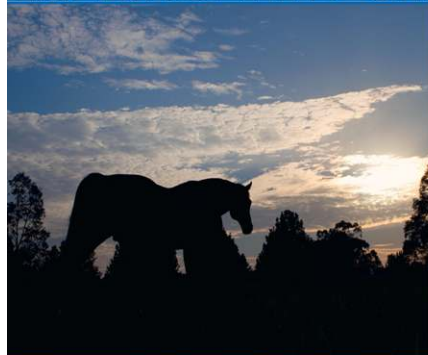

The gray, full of energy in the paddock, was disregarded at 23-1 in his stakes debut. He saved ground off the leaders under jockey Channing Hill, left the pine nearing the quarter pole and, switched five wide, gobbled up the Polytrack before surging clear in the final strides. Bashart edged Bon Accord for place honors. "When he turned for home, he got clear right there, and I thought we had a big shot," explained winning trainer Wayne Catalano.

"I had two horses in the race," Catalano continued. "I was watching the one horse [School On a Hill] down on the rail. He was bottle-necked in there. I was hoping he'd get a little room, then all of a sudden here comes Poker Player on the outside getting clear running, and here we are." Hill added, "He got a little jumbled down the backside and into the turn, but he really matured even from the last race at Kentucky Downs into today. He really found himself and when I took him out I knew that we were going to be really tough to beat. He was still a little green, but he was absolutely professional getting to the wire." The Bourbon, automatically downgraded when it came off the turf, lost its "Win and You're In" designation for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, but Catalano said he expected connections to make the trip to California regardless. "[Owner] Mr. [Gary] West and [racing manager] Benny Glass--we'll talk it over, but I'm sure they'll want to go to the Breeders' Cup." It's been a huge weekend for WinStar sires. Artie Schiller got the Grade I double care of the Alcibiades and Breeders' Futurity, while Harlan's Holiday got his own juvenile stakes double on Sunday with this horse and GIII Grey S. winner Ami's Holiday.

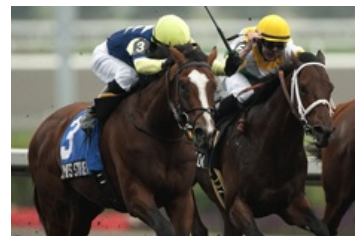

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

HAVANA FINE AFTER CHAMPAGNE WIN

Coolmore's **Havana** (Dunkirk) exited his victory in Saturday's GI Champagne S. in good order and is now on target for the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, according to trainer Todd Pletcher. "Havana showed us what we were hoping to see," Pletcher said. "It was a challenge for sure going from a 5 1/2-furlong maiden to a Grade I going a mile. We're very satisfied with his performance. He earned his way to the next stop." Pletcher added that **Stopchargingmaria** (Tale of the Cat), third in Saturday's GI Frizette S. would stay on the east coast for her next start. "Stopchargingmaria ran well," Pletcher said. "She was third best on the day with no apparent excuse. She will go on to the [Nov. 3 GIII] Tempted [at Aqueduct Racetrack]."

Shug McGaughey said that **Honor Code** (A.P. Indy), a late-closing second in the Champagne would likely skip the Breeders' Cup. "I'll watch him and see," McGaughey said of the **TDN Rising Star**, who is owned by Lane's End Racing and Dell Ridge Farm.

"I'm not real inclined to go to the Breeders' Cup with him. Obviously I'll talk to Mr. [Will] Farish and see what they want to do. As I've said before, I'd sure like to have a nice horse for next year. You've got the [GII Nov. 30] Remsen going 1 1/8 miles going around two turns. I'm sure not ruling out the [Nov. 3 GII] Nashua and the Remsen, or maybe just the Remsen."

McGaughey, who could be represented in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf by **Point of Entry** (Dynaformer), said plans for GI Kentucky Derby winner **Orb** (Malibu Moon) are up in the air after his eighth-place effort in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. "It's been about a week, so I'll probably try to work him in the next week and see where he is. I don't know what I'm going to do with him, if I do anything. I'll let him tell me. If it's time to stop, we'll stop. But the [Nov. 30 GI] Cigar Mile could be a very good possibility."

GI Frizette S. winner **Artemis Agrotera** (Roman Ruler) will head to Santa Anita for the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. "We're going [to the Breeders' Cup] until she tells us 'No,'" said trainer Mike Hushion. "It's as simple as that. I'd probably go out [to Santa Anita] the Monday or Tuesday before and do all of the work here and just go out there and gallop for a couple of days. She was a little strong in the paddock yesterday, so we'll get out there and do some schooling."

Artemis Agrotera will likely face Frizette runner-up **Sweet Reason** (Street Sense), who overcame an awkward start and was closing at the finish Saturday. "As long as she's OK and she's 100%, bounces back good and looks like she's ready to go again, that's what we'll point for," said trainer Leah Gyarmati.

On to BC for Wise Dan...

Trainer Charlie LoPresti confirmed yesterday that reigning Horse of the Year **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) will aim to defend his title in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, despite a runner-up finish to **Silver Max** (Badge of Silver) in Keeneland's rained-off GII Shadwell Turf Mile Saturday.

"Those were not ideal conditions yesterday," LoPresti said. "I was a little disappointed that he lost, but he never stopped trying and was gaining on the winner." Seeking his 10th-straight win and a title defense Saturday, the Mort Fink homebred was hung wide throughout on a Polytrack surface that had taken some 1 1/2 inches of rain in a two-hour span, forcing the race to be run over 8 1/2 furlongs as opposed to a mile on the grass. "I looked at the Trakus [stats] after the race and it showed he ran [41] feet farther than the winner," LoPresti noted. "That computes to losing about [4.8] lengths." LoPresti said he expects to ship Wise Dan out to Santa Anita around Oct. 29, similar to the timing he employed before the chestnut scored by 1 1/2 lengths as the chalk there last year.

We Miss Artie Plans Undecided...

A next start for GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity winner **We Miss Artie** (Artie Schiller) remains undecided, reported Todd Pletcher assistant Byron Hughes yesterday. While the Ken and Sarah Ramsey colorbearer earned an automatic berth into the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile with his win over the Keeneland Polytrack Saturday, he is also being considered for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.

In other Breeders' Futurity news, conditioner Ken McPeck said he too will wait to see how third-place finisher **Arctic Slope** (Van Nistelrooy) exited his effort before deciding whether or not to move on to Arcadia. "Any time you can run third in a race like that you have to be happy," offered McPeck, who shipped Arctic Slope back to his Churchill Downs base Sunday.

Trainer Mark Casse said that fifth-place finisher Conquest Titan (Birdstone) would aim for the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs Nov. 30.

Groupie Doll Still BC-Bound...

Trainer and co-owner/breeder Buff Bradley said Sunday that defending GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint winner **Groupie Doll** (Bowman's Band) will continue on to Arcadia despite a third-place run at 1-2 odds in Keeneland's GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. Saturday. "She's tired, but she had to run the whole way yesterday," Bradley said of the 5-year-old, who was coming off a victory in the Sept. 9 GII Presque Isle Masters S. in just her second outing of the year. "That was not her typical race yesterday. Usually she is just getting started the first quarter of a mile, but yesterday she was in against a couple of Polytrack professionals [in top two finishers **Judy the Beauty** {Ghostzapper} and **Gypsy Robin** {Daaher}]." He added, "I was more concerned about yesterday's race than the Breeders' Cup. Six furlongs is not her best distance and I think she is better on dirt. She shows brilliance on the dirt and, on the Polytrack, she has run some good races and won a Grade I and a Grade II there." Bradley expects to work his charge Oct. 19 before shipping her to California three days later.



STALLION NEWS

NORTH LIGHT TO LANWADES

North Light (Ire) (Danehill--Sought Out {Ire}, by Rainbow Quest) will be relocated to Lanwades Stud in Newmarket, it was announced yesterday. Bred by Ballymacoll Stud and raced in their famed silks by Sir Michael Stoute, he captured the G2 Dante S. prior to adding the G1 Epsom Derby in 2004 and finished that season as the country's champion 3-year-old colt. Initially retired to Adena Springs, he has sired the 2010 G1 St Leger winner Arctic Cosmos and the multiple graded stakes scorer Chips All In, as well as the smart Go Forth North, Celtic New Year and Battleground, and was named Champion Turf Sire of Canada in 2012. "The relocation of North Light to England is in keeping with Adena Springs' long-term goal as a developer of top-class international stallions," commented Adena Springs' Andy Stronach. "I believe this move will have a positive impact for European breeders by making available a superbly bred horse that has a proven track record as a stallion. He has the ability to sire runners on all surfaces, but most importantly he sired an English Classic winner in his first crop." Kirsten Rausing, owner and general manager of Lanwades Stud, added, "We welcome the addition of Derby winner North Light to our stallion roster. A proven stallion, having already produced group and graded stakes winners on three continents, including St Leger winner and Champion 3-year-old stayer Arctic Cosmos, North Light should greatly appeal to European breeders. He is outstanding value at a fee of £6,000 Oct. 1 Special Live Foal terms." The announcement of North Light's relocation comes just weeks after it was revealed that Leroidesanimaux (Brz) (Candy Stripes) would relocate from Florida to Lanwades in 2014.

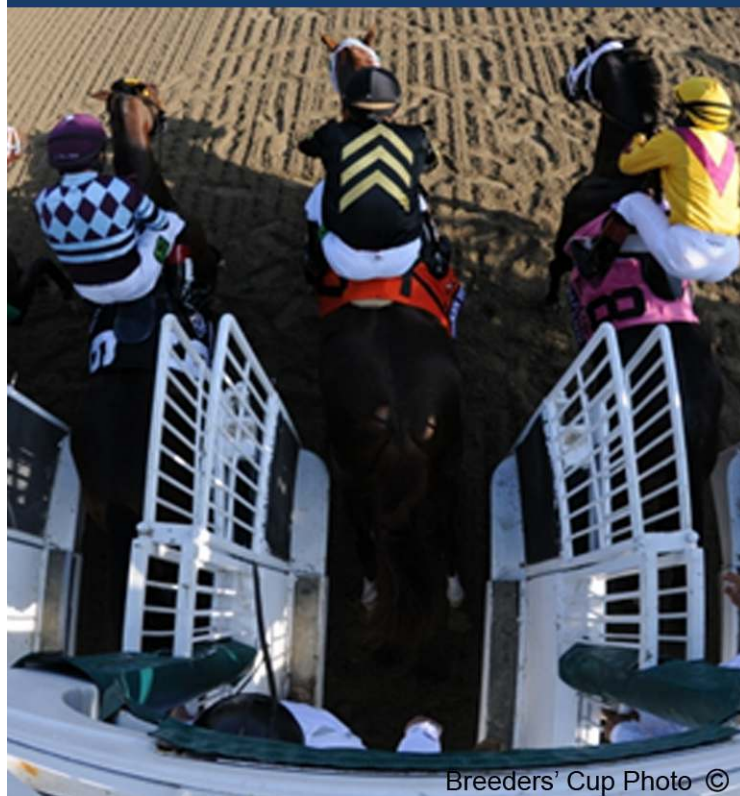

F-T OFFERS 279 AT SPA'S FALL MIXED SALE

Following a buoyant market over the summer at the yearling sales, Fasig-Tipton now turns it's attention to breeding and racing stock with its Fall Mixed & Horses of Racing Age sale in Saratoga Springs, New York. The sales company has catalogued 279 offerings for today's single-session sale, including 110 weanlings and 103

in-foal mares. Additionally, there are 59 horses of racing age and/or broodmare prospects cataloged this year. "Given the very positive momentum for New York-Breds we all enjoyed at the sales in August, it is no surprise that the Mixed Sale catalogue has such depth and diversity," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "Pinhookers will be looking for weanlings to bring back to Saratoga in 2014 and breeders seeking to participate in the New York breeding program will find some quality pedigrees among the mares and broodmare prospects." Held for the first time in 2012, this season's Fall Mixed sale sports a slightly bigger catalog. Fasig Tipton offered 254 last term. "Last year, this sale was an added response to the increase in activity in New York," said Browning. "From a breeding perspective, it became viable to have a mixed sale in Saratoga and it had not been viable before. We've seen dramatic growth in the yearling market with New York bred both in terms of quantity and certainly quality and we would expect those trends to continue in the upcoming years." As for the individuals making up this season's catalog, Browning added, "I think the catalog has definitely moved forward. I think the overall covering sires stronger this year than they were last year. I also think the sire power in the weanlings is stronger than last year. I think that's expected, based upon the strength of the sale last year and based on the positive things that have happened in New York in the breeding program." Despite the fact that the racehorse segment of the industry hasn't appeared to experience the same degree of growth as other areas of the market, Browning believes it remains a relevant addition to the overall sales' market. "These are more useful type horses rather than 'high end' race horses," said Browning. "The racehorse segment of the July sale was very active and there will be a lot of activity on racehorses at Saratoga. I think that's to be expected, but there won't be a dramatic change there. From the breeding perspective, people certainly have more confidence. If you're a breeder, looking to become a breeder or even to expand your numbers a little bit. Chances are people have had more success in 2013 than they've had in the last five years. Hopefully, an increase in confidence will translate into an increase in cash flow/capital that would allow them to reinvest and feel positive about building for the future."

Following a solid debut in 2012, Browning feels the strength of the current market in addition to the flowering New York breeding and racing industry will grant the sale wings once again for its latest renewal.

"From seeing past results, people gained confidence to bring a quality mare or weanling to Saratoga, and they know that the format and the time of the year works," asserted Browning. "They know it's a professional sale that they will be well treated and well compensated for bringing a good horse."

CASH LUCK SCOOPS KRANJI MILE

Northwest Racing Stable's **Cash Luck (Aus)** (Bradbury's Luck {Aus}) gave trainer David Kok his first domestic group race success when taking the Sin-G1 Kranji Mile--the first leg of the Singapore Triple Crown--at Kranji Racecourse yesterday. With the one-length victory, Cash Luck recorded his second straight win. The 5-year-old broke a 19-month losing streak with a tally in the Kranji S. over this distance here a month ago. Sitting an ideal early trip on the heels of the leader on the fence, jockey Danny Beasley had a handful of horse by the time the field turned into the straight. Steering his mount off the rail at the top of the lane, Beasley got an immediate response. Cash Luck charged to the lead in midstretch and finished a length the better of City Lad (Elusive City) in a hand ride ([VIDEO](#)). "This is a dream come true, as I don't get many chances in group races," said Kok. "I'm very happy and excited I've won my first Group 1 race." Kok was reluctant to commit Cash Luck to the Sin-G1 Raffles Cup, the second leg of the Triple Crown, Oct. 27, but noted the Sin-G1 Singapore Gold Cup, the third leg Nov. 17, was on the agenda.
