ASTRONOMICAL TOPPER AT TATTS

Pulverizing a record that stood for less than 24 hours, Lodge Park Stud's Galileo (Ire) filly out of New Approach (Ire)'s half-sister Alluring Park (Ire) (Green Desert) became the most expensive yearling ever to grace a European sales ring when selling for 5-million guineas

(US\$8,375,707) to Sheikh Joaan Al Thani's Al Shaqab Racing. Her sales price was also the highest for a Thoroughbred of any age in Europe--eclipsing the 4.6-million guineas broodmare record of Magical Romance (GB) set in 2006--and established a new world record for a yearling filly.

Despite the star lot, the aggregate for the second session remained on par with last year at 24,916,000gns, but that was achieved through the sale of 110 yearlings, 30 fewer than on the corresponding day in 2012. The clearance rate of 75% represented a decline of 10%, but both average and median were up, by 27% and 24%, respectively, to 226,509gns and 140,000gns.

WAR FRONT TO STAND FOR \$150,000 IN 2014

Red hot sire War Front (Danzig) will stand the 2014 breeding season for \$150,000, Claiborne Farm announced Wednesday. He stood the 2013 season at \$80,000. The 11-year-old stallion had a breakout season in 2013 when he was represented by Group 1 winner Declaration of War and graded/group stakes winners Data Link, Summer Soiree, Departing, Lines of Battle, War Dancer, War Command, Bashart, Summer Front, Peace Preserver and Jack Milton.

His offspring were in demand at the Keeneland September sale, where he was represented by two seven-figure yearlings, including the \$2.5-million sales topper.

"He's had a remarkable year, having had two winners on the same day at Royal Ascot and having topped the Keeneland September sale, which was very special," commented Claiborne's Bernie Sams. "He bred 105 mares last year, and 104 the year before, but generally we try to keep his book somewhere around 95 to 100 mares."

War Front's son Data Link, winner of last year's GI Maker's 46 Mile, will begin his stud career next season at Claiborne for a fee of \$7,500.

The stud fees for Claiborne stallions Arch (Kris S.) and Blame (Arch) will remain the same in 2014.

"We left Arch at \$40,000 and Blame at \$30,000, and I think it's important to give people a break," Sams explained. "Arch had a very good year, and Blame's yearlings have been very well-received, but there's no sense in raising their fees to try to take advantage."

Astronomical Topper at Tatts (cont. from p1)

With sales-goers still chatting about the 3.6-million guineas paid by Coolmore for Newsells Park Stud's Galileo colt on the opening day of the sale, the ring filled once again as the bay full-sister to 2012 G1 Investec Oaks winner Was (Ire) was led in by Jennifer Rooney. The Lodge Park Stud employee has been on the end of the shank in each of the last three years at Tattersalls when first Was sold for 1.2-million guineas to Demi O'Byrne before another full-sister made 1.5-million guineas last year when also knocked down to Sheikh Joaan's agent Nicolas de Watrigant.

Auctioneer John O'Kelly opened with a request for 1-million guineas, but Ibrahim Araci set the ball rolling at half that amount, with Charlie Gordon-Watson joining him in the early exchanges. Unsurprisingly, Coolmore also joined the party as the asking price rose to 2.4-million guineas, but this time Magnier and his men had to stand down as the determined French agent ensured the prized filly followed her year-older sister into Qatari ownership.

"I don't know how to quantify her beauty--she's a magnificent specimen," said De Watrigant as he faced a press pack which seemed to have doubled in size from the previous day. "We bought her sister last year and we feel she's pretty special, so we didn't want to miss this one. She's got everything, but first of all, we bought her because she looks like a proper racehorse." De Watrigant confirmed that the filly will be sent to Andre Fabre. "Hopefull, she will be the new Treve," he said.

Reflecting on a rewarding year on the track for Sheikh Joaan's runners, culminating with Treve's victory in Sunday's G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, he added, "We've won three Group 1 races this year, and the achievement of Treve in the Arc has encouraged Sheikh Joaan to invest in more yearlings. The farm [Haras de Bouquetot] is now set up and we're ready to receive our first stallion, Style Vendome (Fr)."

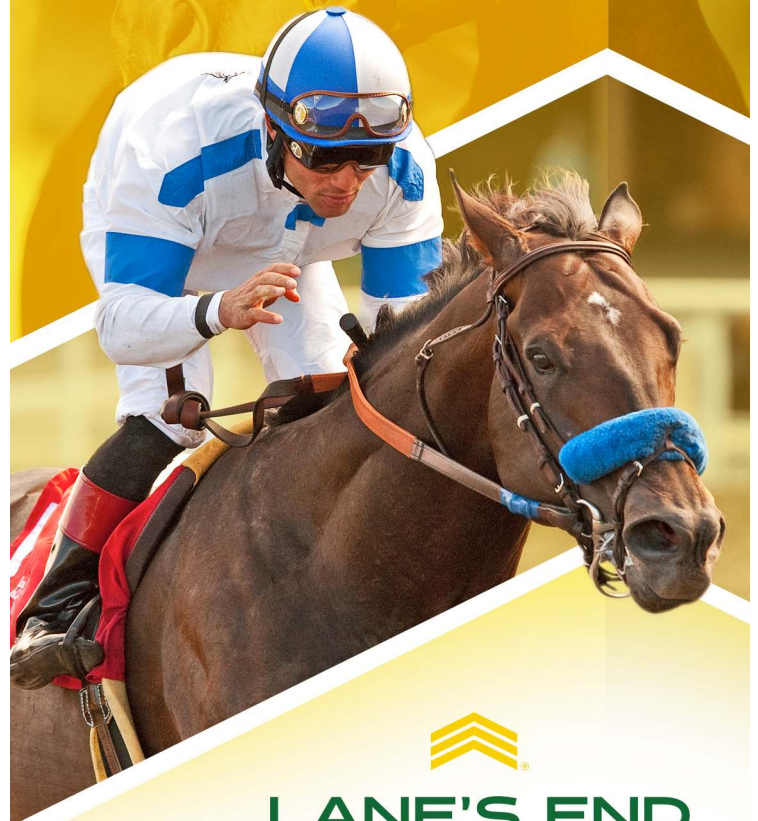
Al Shaqab Racing also bought Clare Castle Stud's Sea the Stars (Ire) colt out of Three Moons (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) (lot 184) for 380,000gns and the second of Carmel Stud's good pinhooks--an Exceed and Excel (Aus) colt--for 320,000gns. The son of the Zamindar mare had been bought for 110,000gns as a foal. Al Shaqab's total expenditure over the two days, for 16 yearlings, is 10,260,000gns.

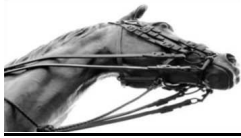

Alluring Prospect...

The Burns family's Lodge Park Stud has long been associated with top-class racehorses. Along with the Classic-winning sister to the top lot, Seamus Burns bred her close relation New Approach, yet another Epsom Classic winner and now a leading young sire for Sheikh Mohammed's Darley operation. Other members of the outstanding family include Coolmore's freshman sire Alfred Nobel (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) plus European champion filly Dazzling Park (Ire) (Warning {GB}). Few, if any, broodmares will have been responsible for three consecutive seven-figure yearlings, but Damian Burns admitted his family was not convinced that Alluring Park's yearling would follow her sisters to Tattersalls.

"It was a hard decision to sell her and it's still tough to know that she's not going to be around tomorrow, but her price makes that a little bit easier," he commented.

"We knew what we got for the last two fillies and we felt that she is an even better specimen, but you never know what's going to happen at that level. My youngest brother, Jamie, did most of the prep with her. He's not here today, as he's at college, but he did a great job."

Alluring Park, who was trained by Jim Bolger for Damian's father Seamus, is now 14 and has no foal this year, but is back in foal to Galileo. She is one of 12 broodmares at the Co. Kilkenny farm. An older brother Patrick Burns is also involved in the running of Lodge Park Stud, while yet another Burns boy, Ronan, runs Herbertstown Stud. "When we plan our matings, it's racehorses we're trying to breed and though this is a good result today, the real excitement for us is what she goes on to do on the track," Damian Burns added.

Paying tribute to the team at Lodge Park Stud, which has prepared 14 yearlings for this year's sales, Damian's mother Patricia added, "There's Richard, Paul, PJ and Ihor back at home and they all work very hard indeed." As the Lodge Park team celebrated, Julian Dollar of Newsells Park Stud, vendor of the 3.6-million guineas colt on Tuesday, strode over to shake Damian's hand, saying, "Congratulations, we enjoyed holding the record for a few hours, but I'm really pleased for you."

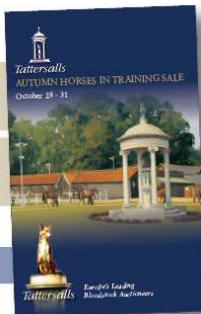

Another Millionaire...

Early in the second session, Angus Gold was pushed into seven figures when pledging 1.1 million guineas for [lot 180](#), a brother to Arcano (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), who won the G1 Prix Morny in the colors of Sheikh Hamdan colours and now stands at his Derrinstown Stud in Ireland.

"It is a family we know very well, and one Sheikh Hamdan has always followed as he selected Arcano himself after he won the July S.," said Gold of the Coruff Stud-bred and -consigned son of the Daylami (Ire) mare Tariysha (Ire). "Arcano was a very good 2-year-old, but he unfortunately got hurt. The Medicean half-brother [El Muqbil (Ire)] was better than the page shows, and the full-sister also got hurt, but she is a beautiful filly. This was a bonny horse by a very good stallion, and he looks a bit scopier than Arcano, who is a very neat horse."

Referring to the first crop of the colt's brother, he added, "We've got some lovely yearlings by Arcano at the farm and I've seen some nice ones here too. Sons of Oasis Dream are already looking very good, so let's hope this one can run. This is a tough market, we were under-bidder five times yesterday, but this was the one Sheikh Hamdan really wanted."

The colt, whose family also includes the good sprinters Gilt Edge Girl (GB) and Godfrey Street (GB), was also an object of desire for M. V. Magnier, the eventual under-bidder, and Grant Pritchard-Gordon, sitting with Russian owner Alexander Nezhnets. Gold was back in action quickly, signing for the following lot ([lot 181](#)), Tinnakill House's Teofilo colt out of Tasha's Dream (Woodman), for 250,000gns. Later purchases also included first-crop sons of the Shadwell-bred Classic winner Makfi (Ire) and Arcano, each bought for 300,000gns, and a 400,000gns daughter of another freshman, Lope De Vega (Ire).

Dream Scenario...

Three of the top four yearlings sold on Wednesday were sons of Oasis Dream (GB), putting the Juddmonte stallion in second position behind Galileo on the auction's sires' list. Two went the way of Sheikh Mohammed's team. [Lot 262](#), the first foal of Craig

Bennett's listed winner Annabelle's Charm (Indian Ridge {GB}) realised 625,000gns through The Castlebridge Consignment. The sheikh's advisor John Ferguson was back for more later when signing for Barronstown Stud's son of Briolette ([lot 302](#)), a half-sister to Pilsudski (Ire) who is already the

dam of two winners by Danehill Dancer (Ire). Sheikh Mohammed's spending spree continued Wednesday with another 13 yearlings added to Tuesday's tally of 19 for a total outlay of 8,005,000gns.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



STATES LIKELY TO LEAD EXPANSION OF INTERNET GAMING

Federal bills to expand online casino gaming have not gained traction in Congress, leaving it to state legislatures to decide whether to allow their citizens to bet on casino games online. This was the message delivered by NTRA president and CEO Alex Waldrop at the International Simulcast Conference earlier this week.

Numerous federal bills to expand Internet gaming have failed to move through Congress for the past several sessions. This is despite a 2011 Department of Justice (DOJ) opinion that opened the door for a potential explosion of online gaming at the state level. It was widely believed that the potential for expansion at the state level would spur Congress to preempt state online gaming efforts by passing its own comprehensive online gaming bill.

The lack of federal legislative progress can be traced to opposition from several sources including state legislatures who want the power to tax and regulate online gaming in their states. To date, only Nevada, Delaware and New Jersey have legalized intrastate online gaming.

Waldrop assured the group that the NTRA's top legislative priority remains the preservation of horse racing's unique right to conduct interstate advance deposit wagering online.

Brigid's Boomers...

The progeny of the Irish River (Ire) mare Brigid have long proved popular at the sales, with two selling for seven figures here at Tattersalls. In 2007, Charlie Gordon-Watson paid 2.5-million guineas for her daughter by Sadler's Wells (Ire), and four years later the same agent spent 1.7-million guineas on another daughter, this time by Galileo (Ire). At Keeneland in 2001, Bill Farish paid \$1.4 million for Brigid's Sadler's Wells daughter Sequoyah, winner of the G1 Moyglare Stud S. Brigid's 2005 foal didn't sell in the ring, but later named Listen (Ire), won the G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot.

Her latest Galileo daughter didn't quite hit those heights, but still sold for 600,000gns to South African Jehan Malherbe of Form Bloodstock. He couldn't reveal for whom he bought her, or where she might be trained, but said, "It's a lovely family, and she's by the best sire in the world. When you buy a Galileo, you've got a chance of buying a great horse."

[Lot 307](#), a Danehill Dancer (Ire) filly out of the Group 3-winning Galileo (Ire) mare Cabaret (Ire), joins the formidable Flaxman Stables operation after Alan Cooper paid 525,000gns on behalf of the Niarchos Family.

"She's a lovely individual from a lovely family and goes to David Wachman, who trains [Group 2 winner] Duntle (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) for us," said Cooper. "Let's hope she can run!"

Class Excelling...

John Magnier missed out on Arcano's brother, but consecutive lots cost the Coolmore boss a total of 650,000gns when a first-crop son of Rip Van Winkle (Ire) ([lot 235](#)) out of the dual-winning Danehill mare Yaria (Ire) consigned by Camas Park Stud was knocked down for 300,000gns, followed by a 350,000gns daughter of Danehill Dancer (Ire). The latter ([lot 236](#)), whose dam Yummy Mummy (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) is a sister to multiple Group 1 winner Fame and Glory (GB), was another good sale for Andreas Jacobs' Newsells Park Stud, which remains on top of the vendors' list with nine yearlings sold for a total of 5,673,000gns.

A total of 10 Exceed and Excel (Aus) yearlings have sold so far at Tattersalls for an average of 221,000gns, with the most expensive of these also going to Magnier. He paid 600,000gns for Glenvale Stud's [lot 282](#), a son of Aymara (GB) (Darshaan {Ire}). The latter is the dam of Byrama (GB), who won the GI Vanity H. at Hollywood Park in June. Magnier, of course, stands Excelebration (Ire), a Group 1-winning son of Darley's Exceed and Excel, at Coolmore, having bought the horse during his 3-year-old season. John Ferguson has bought three Exceed And Excels, giving a top price of 220,000gns for a colt out of Pickle (GB) from the consignment by New England Stud.

Japanese Attraction...

The Duke of Roxburghe's great filly Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}) famously was never presented for sale owing to a pair of crooked front legs. Her unusual conformation didn't stop her from excelling on the track in the colors of her breeder when trained by Mark Johnston, for whom she won five Group 1 races, including two Classics. Now the dam of four winners and a listed place-getter, Attraction's son by Montjeu (Ire) ([lot 279](#)) aroused the interest of J S Company of Japan, who went to 450,000gns to buy the colt from Floors Stud. He is to be trained by Yoshito Yahagi, who confirmed that in one way at least he is not his mother's son.

"He has fantastic conformation and a very good pedigree," he explained. "Let's hope he also has the talent displayed by his illustrious parents."

Another Japanese buyer, Koji Maeda, was also in action on Wednesday. The winning owner of his country's Derby this year with Kizuna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who later won the G2 Prix Niel and finished fourth in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, bought a Dansili (GB) half-sister to Alessandro Volta (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) for 300,000gns. From the family of group winners Caspar Netscher (GB) and Poet (GB), which stretches right back to the Meon Valley Stud foundation mare Reprocolor, the filly represented the top price for the Weinfeld family's Hampshire farm at the sale.

Meon Valley also sold a pair of colts for 240,000gns-- a Raven's Pass grandson of Group 1 winner One So Wonderful (GB) on Tuesday to John Ferguson, and a New Approach colt out of Kayf Tara and Opera House's half-sister Colorado Dawn (GB) (Fantastic Light) to Charlie Gordon-Watson.

Gone But Not Forgotten...

The sole entry in the catalogue by the outstanding Monsun (Ger), sire of great horses such as Shirocco (Ger), Manduro (Ger) and more recently Novellist (Ire), made 300,000gns. Bought by John Ferguson, the colt ([lot 122](#)) is out of the listed winner Wells Present (Ger) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}). Peter Stanley's New England Stud consigned him for owner Baron Georg Von Ullman, who owned Monsun until his death a year ago. "He's a beautiful colt, very athletic, a stand-out," Stanley offered. "Monsun was a stallion I adored and we sent Ouija Board [his brother Lord Derby's multiple Group 1-winning racemare] to him hoping to get a filly." Unfortunately Ouija Board (GB) produced a colt, Aegaeus (GB), but he is the winner of two races. She has a Dubawi foal, but Stanley said she is likely to be sent back to Galileo, who was responsible for her best performer to date, Australia (GB). The 2-year-old colt won the G3 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Trial S. in Ireland in September, and the Aidan O'Brien trainee is an early fancy for next season's Classic races.

Freshman Sire Update...

Dubawi's son Makfi (GB) tops the first-season sires' table so far, with eight of his offspring selling for an average of 130,000gns. Two colts shared top billing at 300,000gns. Shadwell bought a chestnut son of Wedding Gown (GB) (Dubai Destination) from the family of Queen Elizabeth II S. winner Poet's Voice (GB), while John Warren signed for a bay out of the Salse daughter Mill Guineas. Early on the first day Tony Nerses spent 230,000gns on a son of the Montjeu (Ire) mare Maidin Maith (Ire).

David Redvers, who stands Makfi at his Tweenhills Stud for a fee of £25,000, said, "I'm delighted with the way they are selling. For a first-season sire to sell a yearling for 300,000gns is fantastic. It's a great return for breeders and I can't wait to see them run. My only regret is that I don't have a big enough budget to buy them myself."

Through the first two days of the sale, four yearlings by Ballylinch Stud's Lope De Vega (Ire) have sold for an average of 182,500gns. The standout was the 400,000gns paid by Shadwell for a daughter of the Galileo (Ire) mare Starry Messenger.

David Redvers shelled out 400,000gns for Grangecon Stud's son of another first-season sire, Rip Van Winkle (Ire), out of the Group 3 winner Steel Princess (Ire) (Danehill), who has already produced GI Canadian International S. winner Sarah Lynx (Ire). The six by three-time Group 1 winner Rip Van Winkle (Ire) have sold for an average of 168,333gns.

"I've got four 2-year-olds going to the Breeders' Cup," the winner's owner and breeder Ken Ramsey said after the victory. "I've got Bobby's Kitten, who won the GIII Pilgrim S. up at Belmont. I've got [GIII Miss Grillo S. winner] Granny Mc's Kitten. Kitten Kaboodle's going, and I've got one more: [GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity winner] We Miss Artie, who's not a 'Kitten.'"

George Strawbridge's highly impressive G1 Prix de la Foret winner **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) will bypass a second trip to California for the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile and will instead make her next appearance in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin Dec. 8, trainer Freddy Head told *TDN* sister publication *Jour de Galop* late Tuesday. "Moonlight Cloud is very well," Head told *JDG*. "She came out of her race well. She is magnificent. She will not run in the Breeders' Cup. She will go to Hong Kong to run in the [G1] Hong Kong Mile." The long-term plans for Moonlight Cloud have yet to be decided. "Mr. Strawbridge has not decided about the future, whether she will run again or go to stud." Moonlight Cloud, who had shown her best form over straight or one-turn courses, was a 4-1 chance against Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in last year's Mile, but was never a factor, finishing eighth of nine. Her Foret success was the fourth in as many tries this year and added to her victories in the G2 Prix de la Porta Maillot in July, the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest Aug. 4 and the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois a week later. No foreign-based horse has won the Hong Kong Mile since Hat Trick (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) in 2005. Top 3-year-old filly Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}) is owned by Hong Kong-based owner Ben Keswick and is expected to race at the International meeting, though she could opt for the G1 Hong Kong Cup.

The stars of the two-day event were the 26 ex-racehorses who performed in various disciplines on the Pimlico homestretch. "The horses spoke for themselves," said Steuart Pittman, founder and president of the Retired Racehorse Training Project. "They truly are the smartest, most elegant, most trainable and most loyal breed of any horse." Trainers had the summer and early fall to develop new skills for the retired racehorses' second careers. "What these animals learned to do in just a few months was extraordinary," Pittman continued. "My hat is off to the trainers, to the horses, to the amazing team of volunteers, and to the Maryland Jockey Club for welcoming us to Pimlico with open arms and very large hearts." GOOD FRIDAY BONANZA UNVEILED

Arena Racing Company announced yesterday a £1-million card on Lingfield's Polytrack on Good Friday 2014, which will be known as the All-Weather Championships Finals Day, and will be the richest of its kind to be held in Europe. With the British Horseracing Authority agreeing to the introduction of racing on the traditional blank day in the calendar, the high-profile meeting Apr. 18 will form part of a new one-year deal between the ruling body and Lingfield's owners ARC. It will not be part of the move to introduce contractually binding prize money contributions from racecourses, which Arena has currently not committed to. Paul Bittar, chief executive of the BHA, said, "I am pleased that we have been able to agree terms with ARC, although it is unfortunate that ARC felt unable to sign up to the three-year prize-money agreement developed by the Horsemen's Group and BHA. We considered it in the best interests of the sport and its participants to secure a commitment to prize-money in 2014 from ARC. This agreement will deliver a substantial increase in ARC's contribution for 2014, an amount at least equal to what they would have made under a prize-money agreement, while also delivering ARC certainty over plans for their all-weather programme and Good Friday. We welcome ARC's ambitious plans for staging this valuable fixture at Lingfield Park and, together with Great British Racing, we look forward to working with them to make the day a success for racing from all perspectives." Tony Kelly, managing director of ARC, added, "We are pleased to confirm our ongoing commitment to prize-money in a deal which brings benefits to the Horsemen, the BHA and ourselves. ARC's contribution to prize-money rose by 18% in 2013 and will increase by a further 24% in 2014. The terms of our agreement with BHA means we can plan ahead for 2014 with much greater certainty. We have exciting plans for the all-weather programme and the clarity we now have with regard to fixture numbers will enable us to fulfill our commitments to increasing prize-money." **DWYER WINS FIGHT AGAINST BAN**

Jockey Martin Dwyer learned yesterday that the British Horseracing Authority would not reciprocate a controversial 56-day ban handed out during a spell in India. The one-time Epsom Derby-winning rider picked up the suspension at Mahalaxmi in February before learning that it had been increased to eight months by the Royal Western India Turf Club. It was later returned to the initial 56 days on a second appeal. "I'm pleased and relieved it's all over, because it has dragged on for eight months," he told *PA Sport*. "I fought it the whole way and I'm pleased I've come out the right side. I've said exactly the same thing on the day of the race, the day after and every day since that I didn't do anything wrong. I think my time in India has probably come to a close--I probably wouldn't be welcomed back there anyway. It's sad in a way because I've had some great times there." The BHA's Director of Raceday Operations and Regulation Jamie Stier said, "It was the BHA's view that there were a number of areas during the process which fell short of being demonstrably fair and were not in accordance with the principles of natural justice. We will be sharing with the RWITC the concerns the BHA set out to the disciplinary panel."
